CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Heine Roikjer has gone from selling shelves to stocking shelves. The Danish-born businessman retired from a 27 year career with the IKEA furniture empire to become a grocer and is now serving customers in a gleaming new Carmichael supermarket.

Roikjer (54) began retail experience by helping in his dad's Copenhagen convenience store. Before Ikea, he sold clothing. He opened a Jeddah (Saudi Arabia) store for the Swedish company and later launched IKEA in Sacramento. "My family and I were happy in California, so we decided to stay," he says. "When I retired two years ago, it seemed too soon for me to not work. Several friends had positive experiences with the Grocery

Outlet organization, so I got into their training program. And now, here I am with my own store."

Because his Marconi Avenue premises had sat vacant for several years and had become an eyesore, the store is hailed as good news by neighboring businesses and residents. The market adds 30 new jobs to the local economy and Roikjer's daughter Karla (12) and son Konrad (18) also work part-time for dad. His Iranian-born wife Ramona is a dentist but -- to support the new venture -- the doctor closed surgery for two days to pitch in for the opening. "She cashiered and helped in the office," says her husband. "It's a family business and I couldn't have managed

without my family." Opening at 7 am, Roikjer began his new career among a steady stream of shoppers. "In four hours, we had nearly 300 people through the doors," he reports. "I was encouraged by lots of smiles and people welcoming me to the area." In line with the Grocery Outlet corporation's policy of giving back, a show of philanthropy accompanied the grand opening. The grocer donated \$1000 to Carmichael

San Juan Unified Issues Reduced Delay for COVID-19

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - More progress in Sacramento County's steady march to the red tier of the state's COVID-19 risk assessment with the adjusted case rate falling to 12 per 100,000 residents and the testing positivity rate, adjusted for equity, at 6.6 percent. This puts the testing positivity marker in the range needed for the County to advance to the red tier once case rates fall further.

San Juan Unified announces reduced delay once red tier reached and sets April 5 as latest date to return grades TK-6 to in-person learning

This week, district officials announced that a new agreement had been reached with the San Juan Teachers Association providing for the option to return to in-person learning in a hybrid format for all grade levels once Sacramento County has been in the red tier for five days. A previous agreement had provided for a 14-day waiting period in the red tier in alignment with health guidance in effect when the prior agreement was made. The new agreement also sets April 5 as the date for grades TK through 5 and self-contained 6th grade classrooms to offer the option to return to in-person learning. Early childhood education programs will offer a return to in-person learning no later than April 12.

Students in 6th grade classrooms at K-8 schools and middle schools that switch classes throughout the day cannot be offered the option to return to in-person learning until Sacramento County is in the red tier.

According to the new update:

If Sacramento County enters the Red Tier on March 16, then Early Childhood Education (infant/toddler and preschool) return to in person on... **April 5**; K-5 and Self-Contained 6th grade return to in-person on... **March 22**; and Departmentalized 6th Grade, Grades 7-12 and Special Education Centers return to in-person on... **March 22**.

If Sacramento County enters the Red Tier on March 23, then Early Childhood Education (infant/toddler and preschool) return to in person on... **April 12**; K-5 and Self-Contained 6th grade return to in-person on... **April 5**; and Departmentalized 6th Grade, Grades 7-12 and Special Education Centers

DA: Let's All Remember the Victims of Crime

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announces the "2021: Year for Victims" campaign to recognize victims of crime and ensure that they are not forgotten by the criminal justice system, legislators, public officials, the media or the community.

The campaign will be rolled-out on a local, state and national level and led, in part, by a coalition representing the voices of

victims and survivors. Called "Voices for Victims," the coalition consists of members who have their own personal experience with the criminal justice system and have demonstrated a steadfast commitment to achieving justice for themselves or a loved one. It also includes community leaders who advocate for victims of violent crime. Coalition members are: Dr. Nicole Clavo - People v. Lindsey; Karen Johnson - People v. Dunn; Melissa Oliver Storz - People v. Bracamontes; Bob Canady - People v. Hronis and Bertsch; Nicole W. - Mother of Sexual Assault Victim; Keith Dobson & Tamra Dobson - Parents of DV Murder Victim; Paduacee Vue - People v. Vang; Tammy Johnson - People v. White; Roberta Sanchez - People v. Sanchez; Kristie Kiefer - Victims of Crime Case Manager, CASH; Rhonda Campbell

- Victim Services Specialist, MADD/People v. Winnett; Rachelle Ditmore - Co-Founder, City of Refuge; Joyce Bilyeu - Director of Client Services, Family Justice Center; Misty Foster - Chapter Leader, Sacramento Chapter of Parents of Murdered Children (POMC); Mervin Brookins - Co-Founder & CEO, Brother to Brother; Nina Acosta - Program Manager, District Attorney Victim Witness Program.

The coalition's mission is to ensure that in the pursuit of criminal justice reform the survivors are not forgotten, and the voices of victims are heard. Members serve as liaisons and advocates for victims by sharing their personal stories and supporting legislation, enforcement, funding and resources that will help victims obtain justice.

The website www.VoicesforVictims.org was created to provide more

information about the coalition and its members as well as videos and resources.

Other components of the campaign will include a broad, coordinated social media campaign and an online book highlighting "Profiles in Courage." These profiles will shine a spotlight on the long journey victims, survivors and advocates must travel in obtaining justice.

DA Anne Marie Schubert states, "As District Attorney, I strongly support measured criminal justice reforms that reduce recidivism and enhance public safety. However, improvements to the system can be accomplished without wholesale abandonment of victims or their right to be heard. Through this coalition, we hope to ensure that when public safety policy decisions are being made, the voices of victims will neither be silenced nor ignored." ★

New Study Finds SacRT's Fare-Free for Youth Program Succeeds

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A new study released by the University of Texas, which evaluated the Sacramento Regional Transit District's (SacRT) "RydeFreeRT" fare-free transit for youth program, found the innovative program achieved multiple key goals to increase transit ridership and school attendance.

In Sep. 2019, SacRT launched the RydeFreeRT program, which provides fare-free transit for youth in grades TK through 12. With RydeFreeRT, students and youth can ride the entire SacRT transit network for free.

The program is a result of SacRT Board Director and Sacramento City Councilmember Jay Schenirer's effort to combat chronic absenteeism in schools and support young people's overall success. The City of Sacramento made a \$1 million investment in the initiative, signaling its continued efforts to increase positive outcomes for Sacramento youth. The program was extended for a second year through Sep. 30, 2021, and the City has committed to continue its investment annually.

The study, "RydeFreeRT Evaluation Study:

User Demographics, Attitudes, and Impacts on Travel Behavior," was funded by Sutter Health. Every three years, Sutter Health conducts Community Health Needs Assessments to determine the unique needs and challenges for each community Sutter serves. Sutter's investments with the study directly connect to the priority area of basic needs, which includes supporting access to education, food security, housing and economic security.

Researchers at the University of Texas at Austin administered and analyzed 5,600 student surveys before and after several months of the program's implementation.

Key findings from the study include:

Increased Ridership - The study found a statistically significant increase in the share of students who reported using SacRT to get to and from school, as well as a corresponding statistically significant decrease in the share of students reporting traveling to and from school in an automobile.*

**This finding is in contrast to prior transportation research showing that, when fares are decreased or eliminated, new transit riders tend to be pulled from slower modes such as walking and cycling, demonstrating that the program has potential to create a new*

generation of public transit riders.

More Access - Students who reported using SacRT also reported that they can more easily access important non-school destinations because of the RydeFreeRT program.

Afterschool Transportation - Many students who did not ride SacRT regularly to get to school reported they are using public transit more to get to afterschool and non-school activities because of the RydeFreeRT program.

The RydeFreeRT program was well received, pre-COVID-19, by February 2020, student ridership increased by 127%. Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, students took advantage of the fare-free program as SacRT provided more than 1 million rides in 2020.

"We saw a huge jump in student ridership when we launched the fare-free transit program, proving there is a real need to get students to school and other activities throughout the region," said SacRT General Manager/CEO Henry Li. "We are excited to see so many students take advantage of the program and hope to keep them as life-long transit riders."

"RydeFreeRT has clearly had a

positive impact on Sacramento youth," said Sacramento Councilmember Jay Schenirer. "This program has multiple 'bottom lines,' including helping to combat climate change. It's rare to find a public program that has a ripple effect like this one."

"A lack of access to basic services is among the top health indicators affecting disadvantaged communities. Unfortunately for many that includes barriers getting to school and other life-enriching activities for young people," said Keri Thomas, vice president of external affairs for Sutter Health Valley Area. "The data shows that when we lower barriers, we can help make a difference in changing that trajectory."

With distance learning and many community-based institutions temporarily closed to the public due to the pandemic, SacRT continues to find creative ways to communicate about the RydeFreeRT program by partnering with school districts and local organizations. In 2021, SacRT will expand outreach efforts to reach limited English speaking populations as well as disadvantaged communities.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - You can now visit 21 library locations with limited occupancy. The public will be able to visit and browse any of the reopened locations to browse for up to one hour.

Patrons can continue to use curbside service at most locations and make one-hour computer appointments at select locations.

Which locations are open to the public?

Some 21 locations are open for browsing as of February 9: Arcade, Arden-Dimick, Belle Cooleedge, Carmichael, Colonial Heights, Elk Grove, Fair Oaks, Martin Luther King, Jr., North Highlands-Antelope, North Natomas, Rancho Cordova, Rio Linda, Robbie Waters Pocket-Greenhaven, Southgate, South Natomas, Sylvan Oaks, Valley Hi-North Laguna

and Walnut Grove.

Curbside service at select locations continues to be available Tuesdays through Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

One-hour computer appointments at select locations continues to be available by calling (916) 264-2920.

Appointment times at most locations are 10:30 a.m. / noon / 2 p.m. / 3:30 p.m. / 5 p.m. *Special hours for seniors and those with chronic conditions or who are immunocompromised are available on Wednesdays from 9 to 10 a.m.;*

Patrons can return items curbside at most locations during regular hours of operations.

24-hour book drops are available every day at 17 locations.

Ella K. McClatchy and Orangevale remain closed.

Are face coverings required?

Yes. All patrons and staff must wear CDC recommended masks,

which are required at all times. If you cannot wear a face-covering during your visit, you are welcome to use our curbside service.

What safety measures are in place at the library?

Public health and safety are our priorities. Please be advised that a few things have changed to help reduce contact and slow the spread of COVID-19. We have implemented the following safety measures:

Face coverings are required at all times for anyone two years or older; We are practicing social distancing - observe all signage and markers; Libraries will have limited occupancy and seating to ensure proper social distancing; Library visits are limited to one hour per patron; Hand-sanitizing stations are provided for use prior to entry, and frequent handwashing is encouraged; Staff conduct daily health checks; High-touch surfaces will

be disinfected regularly.

Please keep yourself and others safe by:

Staying home if you're experiencing symptoms of any illness; Wearing a face covering that covers your nose and mouth, which is required for all patrons two years or older; Washing or sanitizing your hands frequently; Maintaining at least six feet of distance from staff and other patrons; Respecting social distancing guidelines and limiting your visit to one hour; Following the instructions of the library and security staff.

Are there limits on the number of people allowed into the building?

Yes. Our occupancy is limited to ensure that all can maintain social distancing following public health orders. Thank you for your patience.

How do I return items?

Patrons can return library

materials during our hours of operation in designated bins. Book drops are also available at select locations. Returned items will be placed in quarantine for 24 hours and will not be checked in immediately. Items may take up to a week to be removed from your account.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Convened by the Carmichael Recreation and Park District, a recent town hall sought public input in shaping a 2021 park Master Plan. More than 170 participants tuned into the February 25 meeting via Zoom and voted on issues relating to park development. Many were able to address the meeting.

Master plans are revised every ten years and are typically molded by public forums. With gatherings nixed by COVID, the District resorted to virtual format and hired landscaping specialists Gates+Associates to facilitate the event.

From a population of more than 64,000 people, 150 might not seem a great pool of input. But consultant Linda Gates felt the response encouraging. "We assume these people represent a profile of Carmichael population," she explained. "We've already done an online survey with 750 responses; we've also had focus group meetings. We see consistent themes emerging."

The two-hour meeting polled participants on a wide range of concepts, including:

Splash park versus municipal pool; Shade structures construction; Pathway improvement; All-abilities playgrounds; Funding all the above.

Participants submitted suggestions; some asked to speak. Carmichael resident Brenda Beers Mock noted that 1100 people brought canines to the off-leash dog park every week. She and others felt the District showed insufficient interest in improving the enclosure. Discussion got heated re pickleball. Outdoor facilities are proposed for the trending sport, but CRPD's indoor courts remain in lockdown and enthusiasts are in a pickle over lost playing opportunities. Cardinal Oaks Park vandalism concerned homeowners near this reserve. Playing field conditions

at La Sierra Community Center fields dismayed soccer fans; one speaker called the turf "better suited to horses than kids." Carmichael Park tennis court surfaces were also critiqued.

Skateboarding was a hot topic. Though the District's skate park was shuttered in 2013, skaters remain many and vocal. Former CRPD employee and skating activist Bob Kerr lobbied for the District to reestablish the facility. "I'm grateful the forum let us talk about how important it is to local kids," he said. "Skate boarding's an Olympic sport now. We hope the new Master Plan will bring back our park and programs."

Conveners explained that money -- or the lack of it -- was the root of most district problems. A 2016 lawsuit exploited loopholes to overturn CRPD funding through tax assessment. When polled on financial options, two thirds of the town hall audience voted to revisit the assessment route. "That's encouraging," said District Administrator Mike Blondino. "In the past year, people have come to really appreciate parks and it's great so many at the town hall were willing to assess themselves to help pay for improvements."

Facilitator Linda Gates noted a spirit of appreciation for the District's efforts during difficult times. "Many people asked how they could help" she said. "Carmichael is clearly a community that cares."

Based in views garnered from the Zoom event -- and a previous online survey and focus groups -- CRPD will draft Master Plan recommendations within two months. More public outreach will occur this summer. 2021's revised plan is expected to be finalized before fall.

Gallagher Introduces Bill to Protect Free Speech on Social Media

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman James Gallagher (R-Yuba City), along with coauthor Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin), announced AB 1114, which would define social media platforms as "public forums", essentially applying the First Amendment protections to social media platforms.

AB 1114 would prevent social media platforms such as Facebook, YouTube or Twitter from removing or manipulating any content unless it was unprotected

speech under the First Amendment. Platforms would still be able to remove content such as pornography, incitements to violence or obscenities.

Gallagher said, "Social Media platforms are today's version of a public square. User's speech on these platforms should be protected under the First Amendment just like it would if they were speaking in a public space. Canceling people and views, in addition to being Orwellian, is contributing to further polarization in our politics today".





Death rates were 10 times higher in countries such as the US where at least 50 percent of the total population is overweight, according to a World Health Organization-backed study released Thursday by the World Obesity Federation. For the report, researchers examined mortality data from Johns Hopkins University and the WHO Global Health Observatory data that showed a total of 2.2 million of the 2.5 million deaths worldwide were in countries with high levels of obesity.

As of March 3, only 56 of Georgia's 159 counties have provided ballot transfer form data to *The Georgia Star News*. The number of absentee by mail ballots delivered to registrars in those 56 counties total only 195,309, or 32.5 percent, of the estimated 600,000 absentee vote by mail ballots deposited in drop boxes and delivered to county registrars and counted in Georgia's 2020 presidential election.

After Finding Shredded Ballots in the Dumpster Earlier Today, a Mysterious Fire Breaks Out at Maricopa County Official's Farm | 06 March 2021 | The Arizona Maricopa County Board of Supervisors (MCBOS) on Wednesday loaded its 2020 Election ballots on a truck for delivery to the Arizona Senate. As we've reported previously, after being subpoenaed by the Arizona Senate and then suing the senate to prevent a senate audit of their 2020 election results, the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors (MCBOS) agreed to have an audit if they could pick the auditors.

YouTube Deletes All Copies of President Trump's CPAC Speech, Suspends RSBN for Two Weeks | 04 March 2021 | YouTube has deleted all copies of President Trump's speech to CPAC given last Sunday in Orlando and has suspended the account of Right Side Broadcasting Network for two weeks as apparent punishment for live streaming the speech in which Trump reiterated his belief the 2020 presidential election was stolen from him. YouTube took down videos from mainstream outlets including the U.K. Independent which had over one million views as well as Fox, Fox Business, ABC News and the U.K. Sun. A search of YouTube that earlier this week showed several channels with archived live streams of the speech now shows all archived live streams have been taken down.

People more concerned about violence in cities than Capitol riot - Poll | 04 March 2021 | A poll shows that a majority of U.S. voters are more concerned about the violence that took place in cities over the summer than the Jan. 6 Capitol riot. The most recent Harvard-Harris poll found that 55% of registered voters see violence in cities as more concerning, while 45% said the Capitol riot was more concerning. The poll also found that 71% of voters view antifa as a domestic terrorist group, with 29% of respondents disagreeing with that characterization. ★

Another Chance to Act on Housing

When he was running for governor three years ago, Gavin Newsom promised, rather absurdly, that he would spearhead a drive to build 3.5 million new housing units by 2025.

It was absurd because it would require California to escalate new construction from about 100,000 units a year to 500,000, which would be financially and physically impossible.

Once elected, Newsom backed away from that pledge, calling it "aspirational," but he did attempt, a year ago, to once again focus attention on the state's housing crisis by devoting nearly all of his State of the State address to it and the closely related homelessness issue.

Within weeks, however, his attention shifted to the COVID-19 pandemic and housing went on the Capitol's back burner.

Meanwhile, California's housing shortage has gotten significantly worse. This month, Newsom's Department of Finance revealed that just 102,800 residential building permits were issued in 2020, down 8.8% from 2019's total, which itself was a 3.8% drop from 2018.

Not only is overall construction headed the wrong

way, but all of last year's decline was in apartments and other forms of multi-family housing where shortages are the worst. Moreover, when housing lost to fires, old age and other causes is included in the equation, the net gain last year was only about 75,000 units, under half of the state's official yearly goal.

The cold fact that housing construction is headed the wrong way, and that housing shortages and high housing costs are feeding a high poverty rate and pushing employers and workers out of the state doesn't seem to be having much effect on the Capitol.

Newsom and other politicians talk a good game, but don't back up their words with action. What happened, or didn't happen, to last year's major housing bill is a telling example.

The measure, carried by Senate President Pro Tem Toni Atkins, was a modest stab at the housing issue's biggest roadblock – the not-in-my-backyard attitudes in local communities. The bill would have made it easier to build duplexes and other low-impact multi-family projects on lots zoned for single-family homes.

Atkins' measure cleared the Senate easily and had enough votes to pass the Assembly. However, due to conflict between Atkins and Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon over legislative procedures, it was held in the Assembly on the last night of the session until just minutes before the midnight deadline, leaving too little time for a final Senate vote.

Newsom could have intervened in the petty squabble to get the bill to his desk, but didn't, for reasons best known to himself.

The Legislature is back in session and its leaders and Newsom have another opportunity to match their words on the housing shortage with action – or not.

Atkins has introduced a new version of her failed bill, now known as Senate Bill 9, and others have proposed measures to speed up construction, most notably a four-bill package by Sen. Scott Wiener. The San Francisco Democrat has emerged as the Legislature's leading housing advocate with a willingness to challenge the reluctance of many cities to build their fare share of low- and moderate-income housing.

The most important of the four is Senate Bill 478, which would neutralize local ordinances that effectively prevent construction of multi-family projects on land zoned for them by imposing unworkable land-to-building ratios.

The Atkins and Wiener bills challenge local governments' much-cherished powers over land use, which is the most contentious but most important piece of the housing conundrum. They also will test the willingness of California's political leadership to do something more than talk about the crisis.

Pandemic Hardship Relief to Californians

(MPG) - On February 17, Governor Newsom, Senate President pro Tempore Toni G. Atkins and Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon announced that they have reached an agreement on a package of immediate actions that will speed needed relief to individuals, families and businesses suffering the most significant economic hardship from the COVID-19 Recession.

Direct Relief to Individuals and Families: The agreement incorporates the Governor's Golden State Stimulus plan to assist California households that have borne the disproportionate economic burden of the COVID-19 Recession – those with incomes below \$30,000, as well as those unfairly excluded from previous federal stimulus payments. The agreement broadens this initial plan and now provides direct relief to more

lower-income Californians through a \$600 one-time grant to households enrolled in the CalWORKS program and recipients of SSI/SSP and Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI). **Immediate Relief for Small Businesses Quadrupled:** The agreement reflects a four-fold increase – from \$500 million to more than \$2 billion – for grants up to \$25,000 for small businesses impacted by the pandemic, and also allocates \$50 million for cultural institutions. **Fee Waivers for Most Impacted Licensees:** The agreement provides for two years of fee relief for roughly 59,000 restaurants and bars licensed through the state's Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control that can range annually from \$455 to \$1,235. The agreement also reflects fee relief for more than 600,000 barbering and cosmetology individuals and businesses licensed through the Department of Consumer Affairs. ★

State Announces Changes to when Counties can reach the Red Tier

The state's COVID-19 risk assessment system places each county on a colored tier based on their COVID-19 case rate per 100,000 residents and the testing positivity rate. To reach the red tier, counties currently must have fewer than 7 cases per 100,000 residents and a testing positivity rate less than 8.0 percent.

On Wednesday, March 3, Governor Gavin Newsom announced plans to adjust the case rate requirements for the red tier once the state has been able to provide 2 million doses of COVID-19 vaccine to residents in the state's most

disadvantaged zip codes. Once that marker has been reached, expected in the coming weeks, counties will only need to have a case rate of 10 per 100,000 or less to move to the red tier if they also meet the testing positivity requirement of 8 percent or less.

This development could potentially speed up when Sacramento County reaches the red tier. District staff will continue to monitor developments.

Vaccinations Continue at Strong Pace

San Juan Unified hosted a second COVID-19 vaccination clinic in partnership with Dignity Health, UC Davis Health, and Sacramento County Public Health last weekend. Approximately 2,700 individuals were able to receive their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine at the event with the majority of those being educators.

Unfortunately, vaccine supplies are not available to offer a third clinic this weekend. Additional events will be held as supplies allow.

Football, Water Polo, Baseball and more Set to Play

With the COVID-19 case rate falling below 14 per 100,000 residents in Sacramento County, additional sports are now authorized to not only engage in conditioning and practices but also competitions.

Sports considered outdoor high contact sports (football and water polo) require weekly COVID-19 testing of all student athletes and coaches. The district will be providing this testing at no cost to help ensure the safety of our student athletes and coaches.

Following state health directives to maintain physical distancing efforts, only a limited number of immediate family members will be allowed in attendance at athletic events. ★





Sex Offender Sentenced to Life

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On February 26, 2021, the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle sentenced Tajmal Sharrieff to 595 years to life in prison. On December 7, 2020, a jury convicted Sharrieff of seven counts of committing a lewd act on a child. It was also found true that Sharrieff has three prior strike convictions.

Sharrieff was found guilty of rape by means of force and assault with intent to commit a felony in Sonoma County and was sentenced to prison in 1982. In those two separate sexual attacks, Sharrieff victimized strangers. In one case, he approached a 13-year-old victim while he was wearing a mask. He threatened to kill her, dragged her down a driveway and raped her. Sharrieff threatened to rape her anally if she did not orally copulate him,

so the victim complied. In the other case, Sharrieff wore a mask when he approached a 19-year-old victim and told her not to make a sound or he would kill her. He ordered her to orally copulate him. When the victim refused, Sharrieff began choking her and she started to lose consciousness.

In 1986 in Sacramento County, Sharrieff removed a screen from an apartment window and climbed into a woman's bedroom while she slept. When she awoke, Sharrieff covered her mouth and told her to be quiet. When the victim managed to scream, Sharrieff fled.

In 2016, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office investigated a report that a 15-year-old male had been sexually abused by his mother's acquaintance, Sharrieff, approximately seven years prior. The victim gave a statement to law enforcement and testified at trial regarding the numerous sexual acts he was made to endure by Sharrieff. ★



SMUD Extends Suspension Of Power Shutoffs

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and growing economic challenges, SMUD announced it will extend the suspension of disconnecting power due to non-payment for residential and commercial customers through June 30, 2021, at the earliest.

“We stand by our community during these tough times,” said SMUD CEO and General Manager Paul Lau. “This prolonged pandemic has put a strain on our local economy and we’re committed to ensuring that ALL customers have safe and reliable power as we work through these unprecedented times.”

The suspension of power disconnection due to non-payment began March 13,

2020 and will last through June 30, 2021, at the earliest, as SMUD continues to monitor the evolving situation.

Customers who are behind on payment will still owe SMUD for service, they will just not lose power at this time. Customers are encouraged to contact SMUD to make payment arrangements or to enquire about energy assistance rates and other programs.

Since March, SMUD has suspended power shutoffs for non-payment and late fees, as well as adjusted its low-income rate so more people can qualify. SMUD is also offering flexible payment arrangement options.

In the midst of this COVID-19 pandemic, SMUD has taken a number of actions to keep its employees and the

community safe. As an essential service provider, SMUD is proactively minimizing risk to employees to ensure reliable electric service and is asking the public to abide by the social distancing guidelines and not approach work crews. First 5 Sacramento Approves Funding

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The First 5 Sacramento Commission unanimously approved more than \$40 million in funding for contracts that will begin July 2021. Funding over a three-year period is for critical prevention and early intervention programs that will serve young children and their families in Sacramento County. Funding was allocated specifically to: Prevent African American Child Deaths; Strengthen Families/Decrease Child Maltreatment and Trauma; Improve School Readiness; Build Quality Child Care Settings; Increase Breastfeeding.

A list of agencies approved for funding can be found on the First 5 Sacramento website.

As stewards of Proposition 10 tobacco tax public funds, First 5s across the state work toward three primary goals: 1) to ensure children receive the best start in life; 2) that parents and caregivers have the tools they need to help their children be successful, life-long learners; and 3) that systems serving children are streamlined and efficient.

“For more than 20 years, First 5 Sacramento has invested considerably in a variety of early intervention and preventive programs serving children and families,” said First District Supervisor and Chair of the First 5 Sacramento Commission Phil Serna. “These programs provide parents and caregivers the necessary tools to ensure children achieve their greatest potential and succeed in life.”

Research shows that 90% of a child’s brain develops in the first five years and what parents and caregivers do during these years to support their child’s growth will have a meaningful impact throughout life. Based on this research, California voters passed Proposition 10 in 1998, a tobacco tax, to support programs for expectant parents and children ages 0-5. In the last year, First 5 Sacramento distributed approximately \$11 million a year in Prop 10 revenues to programs and services that meet local needs in Sacramento County.
