A Chip off the Old Block

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Staged in Carmichael, Sacramento Fine Arts Center's annual Magnum Opus exhibition featured 70 artists and works ranging from watercolors to a three-dimensional city-scape. Stacey Gregory's "Tech... tech... tech... Boom," an urban diorama in mixed media, won Best of Show for the Salinas artist.

Exhibiting for the first time in the international show's 32 years, Rio Linda sculptor Stephan Bouska won praise from judge Steve Memering. Bouska fashioned friend Alexis Pavlantos' portrait from Tuscan

marble that was quarried where Michaelangelo procured stone. "It's sculpted from a block that came to the States in the 1980s," said Bouska (38). "The original piece weighed about 2000 pounds. I guess you could call this bust a chip of the old block."

A stonemason by day, Bouska gained sculpting skills at the Academy of Art University in San Francisco. He has worked all over the world and his "personal masterpiece," a life-size female nude called Tullee, won Best of Show in a San Francisco exhibition. This piece is now on loan to USA's biggest figurative sculpture expo, at Brookgreen Gardens (South Carolina). He

chiseled the Alexis bust during more than 100 hours of studio labor. "It's hard and dirty work," observed the sculptor. "You can injure yourself with flying chips and when you start with a 180-pound marble block, you really must be able to lift."

Putting a \$1745 price tag on the bust, he did not expect it to sell in Carmichael. "The cost is a big commitment for an exhibition like this," Bouska considered. "I like to sell my work, but exposure's just as valuable. I'm also quite happy to take Alexis home with me."

County Program Helps with Emergency Rent and Utilities

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento launches \$95.6 million Phase 2 of Emergency Rental Assistance Program to pay past due rent and utilities for renters and landlords impacted by COVID-19. Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency will accept online applications for Phase 2 of the Sacramento Emergency Rental Assistance (SERA 2) Program under a new round of federal and state funds to help low income renters in the city and county catch up on past due rent and utility payments due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Applications will be accepted Feb. 25 through March 19. Landlords can apply for assistance on behalf of their tenants and tenants may also apply on their own behalf.

To be eligible for the assistance, applicants must be renting housing in the City or County of Sacramento; have household gross annual income at or below low-income limits ranging from \$48,350 for a household of one to \$91,150 for a household of 8; and must have at least one household member that is unemployed, or has experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or has experienced a financial hardship due to COVID-19. Eligible applicants must also demonstrate a risk of being unhoused or housing instability. Applicants may use the funds for back rent and/or utility bills in arrears from April 1, 2020 through March 1, 2021. Families that applied for the previous round of SERA assistance last fall may apply for the second round of funding.

The city was awarded \$31.6 million from the U.S. Department of the Treasury and state funding from SB 91 for emergency rent assistance. The county will apply a total federal and state allocation of \$64 million in emergency rental assistance the SERA 2 Program. Federal and state guidelines require all of the funds to be spent by the end of this year. More details, plus an information flyer in multiple languages are available at www.shra.org/sera ★

Open Up SJUSD Protests at Sit-In

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - San Juan Unified school students, parents and supporters held a Sit-In Protest joining the movement Open Up SJUSD on February 23, 2021. Assembling at several district schools, including the SJUS District Office on Walnut Avenue in Carmichael, the groups demanded the still unavailable in-person learning option under COVID.

Sit-In participant Tammy Shade demonstrated with her two boys and said it had been quite the challenge "constantly dealing with kids all day for almost a year now". She says her sixth grader gets really tired of "watching a screen the whole school day". The boy is a very social child and was really looking forward to all the band music,

physical education and diversity of classes offered at middle schools.

UC Davis graduate, and father of two district students, Ken Firl joined the movement concerned that "it would take years to academically catch up after this." He said, "Most

teachers would be here, but the main problem is the unions."

The Open Up SJUSD Sit-In Protest came in between two scheduled clinics which vaccinated thousands of district employees in the last weekends of February.

An agreement reached in November 2020 by the employee-represented unions and the district that once in the red tier teachers would return to in-person teaching, whether or not all are vaccinated, has had no effect

DA and Police Chief Announce EDD Fraud and Assault Weapons Arrests

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On January 14th, 2021, the Sacramento Police Department North Gang Enforcement Team executed a search warrant at an apartment located on Quay Court, which is located in the Greenhaven-area. During service of the warrant, officers contacted the 25-year-old James Smith and his girlfriend, 21-year old Chyna Hill.

The investigation led to the discovery of several illegally possessed assault weapons with extended magazines, handguns, and

\$1,100 in cash.

Officers also located 15 Employment Development Department (EDD) debit cards with various names on them and a red notebook. In the notebook, officers located a list of 55 different individual profiles with names, dates of birth, social security numbers, usernames, and passwords associated with EDD accounts.

An examination of the EDD accounts revealed that Hill and Smith received over \$550,000 in fraudulent EDD funds.

On February 19, 2021, Sacramento Police Department SWAT team and Sacramento

District Attorney's Office Investigators arrested Hill and Smith. They were charged with two counts of being in possession of assault weapons, 23 counts

of unemployment insurance fraud, 13 counts of possession of stolen property, and one count of possessing identifying information with the intent to defraud more than

10 persons. Smith was also charged with two counts of possessing firearms as a felon and one count of possessing ammunition as a felon.

Police Department is committed to protecting our community and reducing gun violence."

"Unfortunately, the circumstances of this arrest, as shocking as they might be, do not represent an outlier in EDD fraud investigations. Law enforcement personnel are frequently discovering EDD fraud associated with violent criminal activity as well as drugs and weapons offenses. In some cases, it is clear that the EDD fraud is providing a direct catalyst for the violence or funding the means to carry it out," said District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert. ★

Ancil Hoffman Golf Course Wins CGCOA Award

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County's very own Ancil Hoffman Golf Course, which is owned by the Department of Regional Parks and operated in partnership with CourseCo, was recently named the winner of the 2020 California Golf Course Owners Association (CGCOA) Community Environmental Award.

"CGCOA's criteria for the Community Environmental Award includes preserving coveted resources such as water and electricity; implementing environmentally smart programs; maintaining a recycling program throughout the property; creating safe, natural habitats for birds and other animals that occupy the course; and increasing citizen awareness of the role played by golf courses as friends of the environment," said Marc Connerly, Executive Director of the CGCOA. "For this year's award, leadership and activities related to the responsible management of the pandemic were added to the award criteria."

Regional Parks, CourseCo and Ancil Hoffman staff were recognized for their leadership during the COVID-19 pandemic, including the development and quick implementation of safety protocols that allowed golf courses to remain open. These same safety protocols have been modeled by golf courses across the nation.

"We wanted to make sure that our residents were able to safely enjoy our courses

during the COVID-19 pandemic," said Greg Bliet, Golf Division Manager. "We developed and implemented protocols and staff training to ensure a safe and healthy environment for our employees and golfers, and have been able to continuously remain open during the pandemic."

Safety protocols implemented at Ancil Hoffman and other County courses include:

Check-in for golf is in designated areas and limited to one guest at a time

Play is limited to individual play – no tournaments or leagues; Golf carts are limited to one rider per cart; We

ask that all guests pay with credit card; Pens for credit card signature are sanitized between uses; All practice areas are either temporarily closed or reduced to 50% capacity – please call ahead to check;

Doors are propped open; Ball washers have been removed from the course; Rakes have been removed from golf course bunkers (we recommend playing as ground under repair); Cups have been set to reduce touch points – please leave flags in place and do not touch; No shared equipment including golf clubs, every player must have their own set of clubs; Cleaning of all

surfaces has been increased to a minimum of 4 to 6 times per day;

All employees wear masks when in buildings or interacting with customers; All employees at all point of sale locations wear gloves; All employees have received significant training on sanitary and safety standards; A designated Safety Ambassador is on duty at all times.

Golf carts are fully disinfected between uses; Range balls are fully disinfected between uses; Range baskets are fully disinfected between uses; Garbage cans lids are removed or touched. ★

County Partners with School to Reuse Lawnmowers

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - A partnership between the Sacramento County Department of Waste Management and Recycling Department and Will Rogers Middle School is giving new life to discarded lawnmowers while helping students get hands-on training in engine repair.

Since 2019, the North Area Recovery Station (NARS) has allowed Will Rogers Middle School instructor Ken MacPherson to take discarded gasoline lawnmowers to use in the school's class on bicycle and small gas engine repair. The class gives mechanically-minded students a jumpstart on auto shop classes offered in high school.

Small gas engines are a little pricey, and students have a tendency to lose parts. One day while visiting NARS, MacPherson noticed customers dropping off old gas-powered mowers. Inspiration struck.

MacPherson approached NARS workers, who supported his idea of using discarded mowers. As part

of the agreement, the school is required to document the donation, release the county from liability, and prohibit students from selling the engines.

Pre-COVID, students in a classroom could perform basic diagnostic tests, drain oil and gas from the engines, and give them a good pressure wash. Given the restrictions of the pandemic, MacPherson prepares the mowers for students to work on at home and schedules a pickup date for parents and students to come to the school. They choose the engine they will work on for the semester.

"There's a lot you can learn from a small gasoline engine. It's like a 3-D puzzle, with oil," said MacPherson. "And if they can make it work, they can use the engine to build anything they want."

For Waste Management and Recycling, it's another example of how employees go the extra mile to support the community and reduce and reuse items that would have otherwise ended up in the landfill. And in this case, it also provides an opportunity to partner with a school and educate students. ★

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Mira Loma High School graduate Alexandra Huynh has advanced to the National Youth Poet Laureate

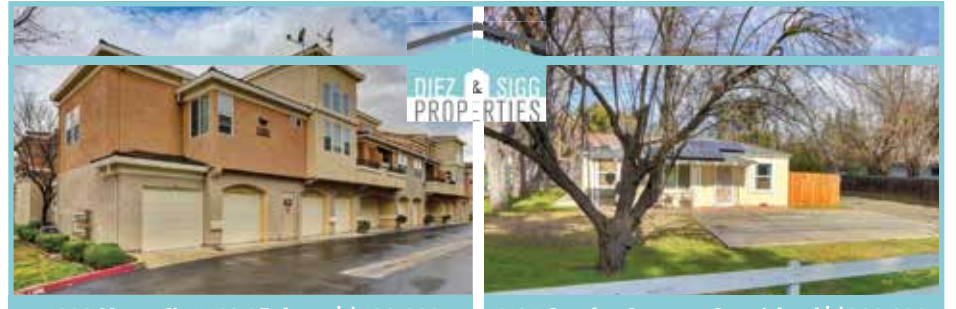
Program as a finalist after recently being named the Youth Poet Laureate Western Ambassador in regional competition.

Felony Assault Weapons Charges for Mission Avenue Incident

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - At 1:53 a.m. on Thursday, February 25, 2021, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Communications Center received a call from a male subject in the 1400 block of Mission Avenue in Sacramento County. The male stated that the people who were in his house to repair a gas leak were instead eating his food and he had them at gunpoint. Moments later dispatch heard a single gunshot; the subject then stated he shot someone. Deputies arrived at the residence and with assistance from dispatch, calmed the subject and convinced him to walk out of the residence where deputies detained him without incident.

Deputies entered the home to search for a victim(s) but found no one else in the residence. It was evident that a shot had been fired inside and a gun was located. The subject and sole occupant of the house at the time of the incident was identified as Bradley Imre Bodai (38). Bodai was showing signs of a mental health crisis. Due to Bodai's acute state of mental health, a Gun Violence Restraining Order was sought and signed by a judge at approximately 5:58 a.m. A search of the residence revealed a massive cache of guns, ammunition, weaponry hardware and ballistic safety equipment. A large gun safe contained what appeared to be 3 sticks of dynamite with a charge timer which

prompted an evacuation order of a half mile radius affecting 1800 residences. Sacramento Sheriff's Office Explosive Ordinance Detail (EOD), Special Investigative Intelligence Bureau (SIIB) as well as the FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force, State DOJ and Alcohol-Tobacco-Firearms (ATF) converged on the scene to assist with the evacuation and search for and inventory of the firearms.

The dynamite turned out to be an authentic looking imitation. Approximately 30,000 AK-47 rounds, 5,000 AR-15 rounds and tens of thousands of semi-automatic handgun rounds were recovered. In addition to 21 semiautomatic handguns, 4 revolvers, 18 rifles and 3 shotguns, investigators found 3 Polish Made Grenade Launchers, many

armor piercing rounds, fire-arm silencers, equipment to manufacture firearm silencers and an array of ballistic safety equipment. Some of the weapons had been modified to be considered an assault rifle under California Penal Code. All of the items seized are being held as evidence in the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Property Warehouse.

Initially Bodai was booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail on a single misdemeanor charge of Discharge of a Firearm in a Grossly Negligent Manner and placed on a mental health hold. He has since been add-booked with 19 felony charges of Possession of an Assault Weapon and is being held on \$250,000 Bail. At this time, no further suspects are outstanding. No further information is available. ★

Pandemic Relief Package has a Downside

The immense drop in state revenue that Gov. Gavin Newsom and legislators anticipated last year when COVID-19 struck the state never materialized.

Instead, high-income Californians who are the basic source of the state's ongoing tax income continued to work and prosper and what was originally described as a \$54 billion budget deficit morphed into multi-billion-dollar windfalls.

Last week, Newsom and legislative leaders agreed to spend an extra \$9.6 billion on pandemic relief, mostly in direct aid to lower-income workers and their families and small businesses which have suffered the most in the pandemic-induced recession.

"As we continue to fight the pandemic and recover, I'm grateful for the Legislature's partnership to provide urgent relief and support for California families and small businesses where it's needed most," Newsom said in a statement. "From child care, relief for small business owners, direct cash support to individuals, financial aid for community college students and more, these actions are critical for millions of Californians who embody the resilience of the California spirit."

The centerpiece of the relief package, which is certain to receive rapid legislative approval, is more than 5 million payments, mostly for \$600, to those who qualify by their low incomes, including undocumented immigrants who cannot receive federal relief checks.

It's obviously good news that the state budget dodged the revenue bullet, thus providing the wherewithal to help those who are hurting the most.

However, there's no such thing as a free lunch and the expanded version of "Golden State Stimulus," which Newsom first proposed with his budget in January, could have adverse long-term consequences.

Although the fiscal meltdown didn't occur and revenues surged unexpectedly, Newsom's budget and the Legislature's budget analyst, Gabe Petek, both see serious deficits in the years ahead as spending already locked into law outpaces anticipated revenues – even with economic recovery.

"Under its own revenue forecast, the administration also anticipates the state would face operating deficits if the Legislature adopted the governor's budget proposals," Petek says in his analysis. "Specifically, these deficits would grow from \$7.6 billion in 2022-23 to \$11.3 billion in 2024-25."

The relief package that Newsom and legislative leaders want to enact is not supposed to be permanent, but rather one-time or short-term until the pandemic is tamed and the economy swings upward. In theory, as businesses reopen and begin earning

profits and as workers are called back to their jobs, the need for direct aid will vanish.

However, temporary government benefits have a way of morphing into permanent entitlements and advocates for those receiving the aid may see it as a pathway to long-sought structural changes of fiscal and economic policy to close California's very wide income and wealth disparities.

Whether one likes or dislikes the possibility of those changes, there's no question that they would carry very large price tags on top of the budget deficits already on the horizon.

Universal single-payer health care, universal early childhood education, guaranteed family incomes, vastly expanded services to the homeless and other items on progressive political agendas would cost tens of billions of dollars. Thus, they would require hefty increases of taxes on Californians who already are carrying one of the nation's highest taxation burdens.

On one hand, Newsom has publicly endorsed some of those costly new entitlements. But on the other, he has opposed the new income or wealth taxes that some left-leaning legislators have proposed to finance them, clearly fearing that new taxes would escalate migrations of employers and high-income taxpayers to other states.

Record Gun Sales in California, Nationally and 39 States

LOS ANGELES, CA (MPG) - During times of unrest in America, gun sales have historically spiked, and a new study analyzing 20 years of data shows the pandemic in 2020 led to a record-breaking year for gun sales in Alabama, nationally and in 39 states.

California ranks third for overall gun sales, but it comes near the bottom after adjusting for its large population. Nationally, a record 23 million guns were sold in 2020, a 60% increase from 2019.

SafeHome.org today released a study: Guns in the U.S.: 20 Years of State and Federal Data using data from 2000 through October 2020 from the FBI, U.S. Census Bureau, CDC, among others.

The unprecedented spike in 2020 can be attributed to the worst pandemic since 1918, and social and political unrest, not seen since the 1960's and the Civil War,

respectively. It also marks the continuation of a 20-year trend of more guns in America.

Key Findings in California:

California ranks in the top 15 for both total gun sales and per capita sales in 2020; 2020 Total Sales: 548,598(3rd); 2020 Per Capita Sales: 0.127(15th); 2000-2020 Total Sales Change: 64%(46th); 2000-2020 Per Capita Sales Change: 15% (48th)

Key National Findings:

Gun sales in 2020 increased by 158% from gun sales in 2000; Since 2000, gun sales have risen in every state, the majority increasing by triple digits; 25 states had record sales months in 2020 –16 of them in March when coronavirus lockdowns began; 16 states had record sales months in December 2012, the month of the Sandy Hook shooting, and six states in December 2015, the month of the San Bernardino shooting.

The source of parent frustration, that not all counties, school districts or private schools are under the same phase restrictions, added to what is a serious learning loss and harmful effects to the mental well-being of their children.

Parent attendee Michelle Amiot said her kids transferred to Placer County schools but is aware of the Sacramento County situation. Amiot says she knows a lot of students from volunteer coaching girls basketball in Citrus Heights

Kingswood K-8, and believes "many would not be failing this year at Mesa Verde and San Juan High Schools."

Jeff Ratchford is concerned with his third and fourth graders at Deterding Elementary in Carmichael. He said, "With all the glitches last year was just a waste of time. If the school doesn't open on its own, I'll pull my kids off and send them off to St. John's. We all look at teachers as heroes... and I see teachers shopping and doing things outside, but not for the education of our kids. They need to show some more courage." ★

Three Strikes for Bald Eagle

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The bald eagle found dying near Folsom's Johnny Cash Trail last month had a three-strike run-in with urban influences. While its flesh showed minor traces of two rodenticides, the great raptor was not poisoned to death. Neither was the angler's hook found in its system fatal.

A California Department Fish and Wildlife analysis last week concluded the eagle – an otherwise healthy young adult with good muscle and fat distribution – died of “massive trauma and blood loss” after some sort of violent impact. The male bird was discovered huddled against tree roots and later transported to a Folsom vet clinic, where he died.

When one of a protected species – and America's iconic national symbol – dies through human influences, federal and corporate agencies react. The eagle's remains were necropsied at the California Fish and Wildlife Investigations Laboratory in Rancho Cordova. Tissue samples were sent for further analysis in a UC Davis lab. While the nature of the fatal accident might never be proven, a Fish and Wildlife scientist theorized the bird might have collided with power lines, then plummeted to earth. Either the collision or the fall – through trees and branches – fractured sternum and keel bones. The bird's stomach was empty, so it had likely been hunting in the nearby American River.

For the couple that found

the fallen icon, a Sunday walk turned into an afternoon of heartbreak. Danny De Lange and girlfriend Sydney Frank explored a mud track near the Johnny Cash Trail. Their steps followed a creek near Folsom Prison fence line. Above was a thick canopy of branches and – rising with the ravine slope – a dozen power cables. The hikers found the bald eagle in the throes of a tragedy that saddened nature lovers everywhere.

“My girlfriend warned me not to turn quickly, recalls De Lange. “She'd seen a bald eagle behind me. I expected it to be in a tree but when I looked, it was leaning on the roots of an oak. I could see blood

on the side of its head. Its eyes were open and it was breathing. It seemed in pain and unable to move.”

“Our gut reaction was emotional. Here was the embodiment of our nation, helpless.” Using cell phones, the couple contacted the police and animal agencies. “To our frustration, no one we called could come to pick up an eagle,” says De Lange. A nurse assistant, he judged the raptor in bad shape. “A couple of times, we heard him cough and gag. I knew that could indicate internal bleeding. We stayed with him for more than two hours, talking to him and trying to keep him awake. We kept our distance and did not touch him. We took

a photo only because we knew he was a protected bird. We felt some sort of evidence might be needed.”

As darkness fell, US Fish and Wildlife biologist Jennifer Brown arrived with a transport carrier. Animal rescue expert Ben Nuckolls came minutes later. “I was struck by how beautiful the eagle was,” says Jennifer Brown. “My biggest impulse was to get him help.” Anticipating a struggle, she first gloved up. “But when I lifted him, there was just no fight left in him.” Brown drove her fragile passenger to a Folsom veterinarian; he died 30 minutes after arrival.

“When you're working in animal rescues, you steel yourself for the worst,” she

says. “His chances were slim but I still had hopes. When I heard he passed away, I was very sad. Especially with an eagle – its species has such an amazing recovery story from near extinction. I knew he was a young adult. He hadn't had a chance to live a full life.”

Transmission lines along the American River supply the power grid from Folsom and Nimbus dams. SMUD, PG&E and WAPA (Western Area Power Administration) maintain cables that pass over the Johnny Cash Trail and adjacent areas. PG&E offers this statement: “At PG&E safety is our most important priority, and we work closely with wildlife

organizations to protect all endangered species. With respect to the incident near the Johnny Cash trail, our team is investigating the circumstances, however there are no definitive results at this time.”

Footnote: Rare in Sacramento County, bald eagles have established a presence on Lake Folsom and on American River stretches over the last 12 years. At least six nests are documented in this vicinity. The deceased male is possibly from a Folsom Lake family. Necropsy examination revealed the raptor had recently engaged in breeding. Although eagles mate for life, widowed adults can eventually continue breeding with another partner. ★
