Change Service Requested

School's Out Forever?



Want to know why the majority of California schools might not reopen anytime soon? Image courtesy Pixabay

The first deadline Gov. Gavin Newsom set in his \$2 billion plan to reopen California's schools will come and go Monday (February 1st) without the necessary support from the Legislature, signaling the proposal has all but stalled.

The governor's proposal aimed to incentivize school districts to reopen their campuses by paying out grants of \$450 to \$700 per student to schools that developed safety plans for in-person instruction by Monday and opened doors to the state's youngest students by Feb. 16.

But that proposal capsized under a wave of criticism and now the

governor, lawmakers, school district leaders and teachers unions have limited time to figure out a solution before bringing kids back on campuses for this academic year becomes moot.

Criticism for Newsom's proposal stemmed from the state's largest school districts, teachers unions and legislators who called it unworkable and unlikely to nudge open classroom doors for the millions of California students still learning remotely.

Among the issues raised had been the plan's tight deadlines to receive full funding, the stringent testing requirements attached to the grants – which could have cost districts more than the grants were worth – and, for some legislators, the lack of emphasis

and coordination Newsom's proposal placed on prioritizing vaccines for teachers and school staff.

Newsom's staff said in legislative hearings this month that the plan's deadlines were based on a sense of urgency and the high stakes behind a school year that could end entirely remotely for the majority of California's 6.1 million students.

Jessica Holmes, a Department of Finance analyst, told lawmakers at a Jan. 21 hearing that it would be "very unlikely" that school campuses would reopen this school year if schools haven't yet done so by April.

"If we're in distance learning at the end of this school year, what does it mean for next school year, and that

County Shares Winter Response for Homeless

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County is in the midst of a challenge it has not seen before. Between severe weather events, a continued public health pandemic and housing instability, the challenges of responding to the needs of the homeless population are greater than ever.

The County continues to adapt and respond in real time and develop and operate ongoing programs and services that deliver real and permanent change.

For many years, the Sacramento County Department of Human Assistance (DHA) has run a motel voucher program for persons experiencing homelessness that are particularly vulnerable due to age, illness, injury or other highly vulnerable situations such as families with children. The program provides them with short motel stays in a moment of crisis, coupled with ongoing supportive services.

In an effort to increase sheltering capacity over the winter months, the Continuum of Care (CoC) Board approved up to \$600k in additional funding in December to expand the motel voucher program into a weather-related response. Approximately 60 additional motel rooms are now available for a minimum of three nights or longer during extended weather events.

This approach offers several advantages to warming centers: (1) It relies on outreach partners to identify unsheltered people who would not otherwise be reached; (2) It offers several days of stay (compared to an overnight stay at a warming center); (3) It allows people to shelter with pets and partners and in privacy, which is critical during COVID-19; (4) It coordinates transportation for unsheltered people to the motels.

The following criteria will trigger a weather-related response: (1) Nighttime lows of 37 degrees or lower for two or more days within a five-day span; or (2) Rain for two or more consecutive days (forecast 60% or more); or (3) One day or night of rain combined with nighttime lows of 32 degrees or lower.

Because of the existing infrastructure already in place, DHA was able to activate this critical effort in advance of Tuesday's big storm and bring people into shelter in just a few days. The County will continue these efforts for upcoming storms.

DHA is working to expand capacity at its existing homeless shelter for increased weather respite response.

Sacramento County Operations Plan (EO), operated out of County Office of Emergency Services has Severe Weather Guidance to use in

Winter Storms Wallop

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The recent storms packed a real wallop to the Sacramento region. Both PG&E and SMUD were both scrambling to restore services to thousands of homes.

PG&E reports that crews have restored nearly all customers who lost electricity following a powerful "atmospheric river" weather system that battered the company's service area with days of record-breaking rain, snow and wind.

About 98 percent of the nearly 944,000 customers who lost power during the storm had their power restored. The remainder of customers are primarily located in hard-hit areas where roads remain closed due to heavy snowfall, debris flows, or other damage. PG&E will continue to work to gain access to these customers and restore power as safely and as quickly as possible.

Since midnight on Tuesday, Jan. 26, through Saturday, Jan 30, more

than 944,000 PG&E customers lost power due to heavy wind, rain and snow. PG&E found more than 1,500 instances of damaged infrastructure where equipment needs to be replaced or repaired, including 365 broken poles and 1,417 spans of wire.

At the peak of the restoration effort, more than 450 crews were working to assess and repair damage

and restore power as safely and as quickly as possible for customers.

Based on 30 years of weather data, PG&E meteorologists describe January's storm as the strongest since 2011 and say that it caused the highest two-day and three-day outage totals since 2010.

SMUD has been preparing for the winter storms rolling into the area with rainy and very windy

conditions and sustained winds. They have a full-service Contact Center ready to answer customer calls reporting outages, while SMUD line repair crews, troubleshooters and other field personnel are ready to restore power to customers who may experience storm-related outages.

Looming Tax Tsunami Requires Immediate Action to Protect Unemployed

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California Senate Republicans are concerned about the looming tax tsunami facing unsuspecting and unemployed Californians stemming from mismanagement and fraud in the state's Unemployment Insurance program. Senate Republicans delivered a letter to Governor Newsom urging him to take immediate action to help those innocent victims.

Californians will begin receiving 1099-G tax forms summarizing their taxable earnings from unemployment benefits. Not only will the tax bill come as a shock to recipients, there is a distinct possibility many victims of fraud will be left on the hook for taxes on money never received. The Employment Development Department (EDD) has struggled to do even the slightest thing right during the pandemic and to think this agency could straighten this out on its own prior to tax day is unfathomable.

By the end of 2020, EDD had paid out \$10.4 billion in benefits to claimants whose identities were unverified and that figure could climb as high as \$30 billion. This resulted in frozen bank accounts, stalled benefit payments and a variety of other problems each of our offices has been tirelessly working to help these individuals with over the last ten months.

The Auditor's report last week underscored Californians' worst nightmare by pointing out the potential problems with regard to tax liability. Without immediate action by the Governor and our federal representatives, innocent people will be left to fight the IRS over tax liabilities for benefits they never received.

Senate Republicans share the auditor's concerns, and want to ensure the Newsom Administration is taking every action possible to enact the auditor's recommendation to promptly assist victims of identity theft and help them avoid tax liabilities for unreceived benefits. April 15 is just a few months away and Republicans are rightfully concerned the agency will be unable to effectively address this new challenge.

... As we enter the tax filing season, many Californians will be surprised to learn that they have tax liabilities for UI benefits that were fraudulently claimed in their name. This is because 1099-G forms will soon be arriving in the mailboxes of taxpayers who were victims of identity fraud. Even more concerning is that there will be victims of identity fraud who will have no idea why they even received one of these forms until after they file taxes. This is because EDD is generally going

to mail the 1099-G to the most recent addresses of record, which are the ones the bad actors used to obtain UI benefits.

The State Auditor shares our concern for the tax liabilities for victims of this identity theft and recommends that EDD should prepare to assist victims of identity theft to ensure that they receive prompt assistance and avoid tax liabilities for benefits they never received. Specifically, the auditor recommends that EDD must prepare to respond to victims of identity theft who receive incorrect tax forms, and should, by mid-February 2021, provide information on its website and set up a separate email box for such individuals to contact EDD and receive prompt resolution. We wholeheartedly agree with this recommendation, but remain skeptical about the agency's ability to do it effectively, if at all. Our offices are currently hearing from the same amount of constituents as we did last spring, who are seeking help from EDD because of problems with identity verification, backlogged claims, and frozen accounts. ...

Last week, Senate Republicans requested legislative leadership for an immediate oversight hearing to discuss ways to implement the State Auditor's recommendations. An oversight hearing was held on Wednesday, February 3 with the Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC) and the Assembly Insurance Committee. ★

Mystery Brings Unlikely Departments Together

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - This past December, a routine storm drain clearing led to an inter-departmental collaboration to identify the remains of a missing local man.

On Dec. 8, 2020, Sacramento County Department of Water Resources (DWR) employees were clearing a storm drain near Gordon Drive in Sacramento. While unclogging their vacuum machine, the crew manually pulled what was thought to be a stick out of the muck that clogged the machine only to find a shoe attached. It turned out to be a human leg bone and foot. DWR crews stopped work and notified the Sheriff's Department.

"Water Resources works regularly with law enforcement. Our staff teams up with deputies throughout the year as we clean up drainage culverts and water pipes because we run into homeless camps. We ask for the deputies' assistance to make sure nobody is harmed by our machines," said Water Resources Director, Michael Peterson. "So when our crews came across human remains, while shaken up by their discovery, they kept their cool and knew to call the Sheriff's Office for assistance."

When Sheriff's Office detectives responded to the scene, they discovered what appeared to be an additional bone in the storm drain. Detectives contacted the Sacramento Coroner's Office to assist with further evaluation of the remains.

Deputies and a Forensic Pathologist from the Coroner's Office responded to the scene. The leg bone and an additional bone found in the storm drain were determined to be human. Coroner personnel also searched a second area of the storm drain and discovered even more bones. The bones were

retrieved by Coroner personnel and were found to be an almost complete human skeleton.

In addition to the skeletal remains, a debit type card with no name printed on it was also recovered. The debit card company was contacted by the Sheriff's Office and it was learned that the card belonged to a male subject that had been reported missing. The male subject was last seen in November of 2018.

After seeing news reports of remains being found in the area of Stockton Blvd and Gordon Drive, the family of the missing male contacted the Sacramento County Coroner's Office to see if the bones found in the storm drain could belong to their missing relative.

The brother and daughter of the missing person provided DNA samples to the Sacramento County Coroner's Office. The Coroner's Office ran the DNA samples provided by the family and a sample from the remains using their ANDE Rapid DNA instrument. The Coroner's office was able to confirm that the remains belong to the missing male subject, and this case came to a close.

"While my team often works with the Sheriff's Office, we don't usually work with Water Resources, so this was a unique experience for us," said Kim Gin, Sacramento County Coroner. "This was a great example of County employees, that don't usually work together, coming together to identify this local man and bring some closure to his family."

The Sacramento County Coroner's Office has 73 active "John Doe" and "Jane Doe" cases dating back to 1975, and they need your help to identify them.  emergency kit and store in an accessible place. Be sure to include a fully charged cell phone and/or laptop and battery banks; flashlights; battery operated clock; extra batteries; manual can opener; supply of bottled water; a battery-operated radio for news reports.

If the power goes out check to see if the lights are out in neighboring homes. If so, it's likely a larger

outage; Report the outage at SMUD.org/outages; Call SMUD's toll free outage line at 1-888-456-SMUD (7683).

If stormy weather knocks down a power line stay away and call SMUD at 1-888-456-SMUD (7683) or 911 immediately; Assume the line is "energized" and stay away and warn others to do the same; Do not remove fallen tree limbs or other debris from

power lines. Tree limbs and other objects can conduct electricity that can shock anyone coming in contact with them.

SMUD prioritizes where crews will be sent during a storm: (1) Public safety hazards (power lines down, poles down); (2) Hospitals and critical flood control pumps; (3) Areas with large numbers of customers out of power; (4) Scattered, smaller outages. ★

is a very big fear and concern that we have," Holmes said.

The governor and the Legislature are negotiating the plan behind closed doors, but a key issue affecting whether more school campuses will reopen this semester seems to depend on whether teachers will receive priority access for vaccination.

The California Teachers Association, which wields significant influence at the Capitol, wrote in a letter to the governor Wednesday calling for teachers to be vaccinated before reopening campuses. Teachers unions have also opposed allowing schools to reopen if their counties remain in the state's purple tier – which the state currently allows for elementary schools.

When Newsom first introduced his proposal Dec. 30, the state included a rationale for it, noting low risks of transmitting the coronavirus through in-person instruction, especially for elementary grades, if paired with rigorous safety protocols. Researchers with the Centers for Disease Control found little evidence of transmission through in-class instruction in an article published this week, though cautioned that other school-related events such as indoor sports practices could result in higher transmission of the virus.

While some school districts, such as Long Beach, have begun to vaccinate some educators, the picture is muddled from county to county, with some prioritizing Californians 65 and older for the limited doses received so far.

Last fall, local school superintendents, school boards and labor unions in some districts, such as San Francisco, put forth requirements for reopening campuses that exceeded those of the state's, prompting a group of Democratic lawmakers to introduce legislation that would mandate when schools should safely reopen.

Gov. Gavin Newsom spoke candidly about the prospects for physically reopening California's K-12 schools in a Thursday conversation with school superintendents.

In a candid conversation with superintendents Thursday reported by Politico, Newsom expected his plan would change as his office negotiates with the Legislature, and said requiring all educators be vaccinated before reopening

schools would likely mean campuses staying closed.

"If everybody has to be vaccinated, we might as well just tell people the truth: there will be no in-person instruction in the state of California," Newsom told the superintendents.

Democratic Assemblyman Patrick O'Donnell, chair of the Assembly Education Committee, said state and local officials should better coordinate access to the vaccine for California's educators. Schools should offer in-person instruction if teachers receive the vaccine, O'Donnell said.

"The governor's keeping his own staff at home, but then he tells teachers they need to go back into the classroom without vaccination? That's not right," O'Donnell said. "Let me be blunt: the path to getting our schools reopened is to vaccinate our teachers, and I'm confident the governor will help us achieve our goal."

The governor remains under immense pressure to act on schools. Parents frustrated with how the state and local districts have handled reopenings throughout the pandemic have begun grassroots organizing, and the issue could fuel a long-shot recall effort.

Newsom's reopening plan also included new guidance that has had a ripple effect on schools that have already reopened. Some districts in San Diego and Placer counties have scaled back plans to expand their in-person instruction offerings to students and families, citing updated guidance that puts firmer restrictions on spacing students' desks.

This week, the Roseville Joint Union High School District in the Sacramento suburbs decided to revert to a hybrid model for some of its high schools instead of remaining in a 5-day week in person as it had planned when campuses first opened Jan. 5.

"It's infuriating. Parents are fed up," said Jonathan Zachreson, a Roseville parent of three attending schools in the elementary and high school districts. "It looks like these politicians are incentivizing reopening schools, but in reality the plans they come up with do the exact opposite."

 the event of severe weather situations that require emergency response for local governments, non-governmental organizations and other agencies in preparing and coordinating response efforts.

This criteria is a guide to trigger an emergency response on a countywide scale but does not limit cities within the county from

opening a warming center under any conditions they see fit and offers material support when they do. The Sacramento County Office of Emergency Services helps support such efforts with food, water, blankets and COVID-19 safety guidance provided by the County Public Health officer.

In anticipation of a weather event, the County

organizes a call that includes each city and special districts to ensure seamless collaboration and consistent messaging.

In addition, DHA has an eligibility specialist on location to connect people to mainstream services such as cash, food and medical benefits.

State Lifts Suspensions of Half a Million Driver's Licenses

More than 400,000 Californians had their driver's licenses reinstated last month after an appeals court ruled that the state was illegally penalizing people who failed to appear in court on costly traffic tickets.

The lawsuit was part of a broader, ongoing effort by legal advocacy organizations to roll back California's traffic fines and court fees, which they contend disproportionately impact low-income residents and communities of color.

More than three million traffic infraction citations are issued in California every year, averaging between \$600 and \$700 each.

California has among the highest traffic ticket penalties in the country due to a litany of state and county add-on fees. A ticket for running a red light – which has a base fine of \$100 – actually costs nearly \$500 because of state and local fees, and more than \$800 if the driver misses a deadline to pay or appear in court.

The ruling “limits this blunt instrument of punishing people for not taking care of traffic tickets when in reality, for many Californians, traffic tickets are simply too expensive to take care of,” said Rebecca Miller, senior attorney at the Western Center on Law and Poverty, one of the organizations that sued the Department of Motor Vehicles.

“Like any state in the country, we have over-policing of lower-income and black and brown communities in California.”

Several Bay Area residents sued the DMV in 2016 when their licenses were suspended after they failed to pay a traffic ticket or appear in court. Last June, a three-judge panel in the First Appellate District ruled in their favor, deciding that the state inappropriately suspended the licenses of drivers without formal notices from traffic courts that their failure to appear was willful.

As a result, the DMV lifted suspensions on 555,000 driver's licenses. Because some had additional suspensions for other reasons, about 426,000 motorists were eligible to have their licenses reinstated, according to the DMV.

Legal aid groups – the Western Center on Law and Poverty, Bay Area Legal Aid, the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights of the San Francisco Bay Area and the East Bay Community Law Center – represented the plaintiffs.

The lead plaintiff, Guillermo Hernandez, of Richmond, had been ticketed in 2013 for not updating his driver's license information and driving without a valid registration, court records show.

Hernandez said he tried to go to court to take care of the ticket but was told twice that clerks couldn't find it in the system. It was only later when he tried to renew his license that he discovered there was a hold on it for more than \$900 in fines and fees.

“At that time I just didn't have the money. I didn't have work. That's a lot of money... How am I going to pay it?” he said, speaking in Spanish.

Hernandez had to cut back on his work buying and selling secondhand goods around the area. “I was afraid they would grab

me and make me pay more money for tickets,” he said.

Hernandez said he's glad he saw the lawsuit through the appeals court even after his attorney helped him get onto a repayment plan and get his license back before the case concluded.

“I feel really proud that I did something for society,” he said.

The appellate opinion is somewhat narrow and technical: By law the DMV is supposed to suspend a license if it receives a notice from a traffic court that a driver “willfully” violated a written promise to appear in court, according to the opinion. The DMV argued that when it receives notices a driver failed to appear in court that indicates that the actions were willful. The trial court agreed, but the Appeals Court found that the DMV needed a more formal notice that a driver broke the law.

The DMV said in a statement to CalMatters that from now on it “will only impose a (failure to appear) suspension based upon misdemeanor (failure to appear) notifications submitted by the courts.”

But attorneys involved in the case said it's too soon to tell how the case will affect license suspensions going forward.

Fees Tacked onto Traffic Fines

Economic justice advocates and some government officials are examining court fines and fees as part of a national reckoning over racial disparities in the justice system. A growing body of data suggests black and brown drivers are more likely to be pulled over than white motorists, and they often face staggering bills for traffic tickets.

That's because state and local governments have tacked on numerous fees that have nothing to do with traffic violations, said Martin Hoshino, the state Judicial Council's administrative director, who served on a national task force regarding fines, fees and bail practices.

“It became unnerving to think that courts had been turned into revenue centers, and judicial officers were in this really awkward position of perhaps knowing they were imposing a fine or fee for which their court operation was benefiting. I think that's wrong,” Hoshino said.

Records and interviews show fees in criminal court, including for traffic violations, have funded an array of services and projects in California, including court construction, DNA collection, emergency medical

air transport and sunken vessel recovery off the coast.

“When you put all of the decisions together and look at it holistically 30 years later, you find out you've created a regressive, harmful, at times self-defeating revenue system because you're pushing people into debt traps,” Hoshino said.

In addition, “you're not able to collect the debt,” he said. Uncollected debt on court fines and fees doubled over the past decade to roughly \$10 billion in California.

Stacey Kmetz knows about the burden of traffic ticket debt. The San Jose resident, who was out of work and sleeping on a friend's couch, got a nearly \$900 ticket in Marin County for driving without proof of insurance.

“I was really stuck. I asked everybody I knew for help,” Kmetz said.

When she didn't appear in traffic court by the date on her citation, her license was suspended. Kmetz ultimately went to court and got a \$78-a-month payment plan, records show. But the court did not notify the DMV to lift the suspension.

“I pleaded to have that license so I could pay my bills and look for work,” she said. “I was working with two temp agencies who wanted nothing to do with me when I explained the situation.”

Legal Aid attorneys stepped in and got the court to recall the failure-to-appear notification. Kmetz was able to get her license back in October after six months without it.

“It was terrible. The anxiety of the whole dilemma...it was awful,” she said, adding that she's since used her license to work as a driver for some delivery apps.

Pilot Program To Avoid Court Appearances

Lawmakers and court officials have taken some recent steps: They have eliminated license suspensions for failing to pay traffic tickets and developed payment plans.

The court system also developed a pilot project that makes it easier for low-income motorists to request a traffic ticket fee reduction. A website called MyCitations allows motorists to request a reduction online. The courts can consider a driver's income and other information on their ability to pay before deciding whether to lower a penalty.

The virtual ticket system was created so that motorists wouldn't have to appear in person at a courthouse if they wanted to get

their ticket debt reduced.

Many Californians can't afford a day off work to plead their case to a judge. But when they don't pay and don't show up at court, the fines increase, their licenses can be suspended and if they are caught driving on a suspended license, they face criminal charges.

“It's the criminalization of poverty,” said Asher Waite-Jones, staff attorney and clinical supervisor at the East Bay Community Law Center.

The pilot project includes seven counties. Tulare, Shasta and Ventura counties launched the first year, San Francisco and Santa Clara counties are in year two and Fresno and Monterey counties are launching now.

From April 2019 through Nov. 2020, nearly 7,000 drivers requested a fine and fee reduction through the pilot program. More than 85 percent of those drivers reported incomes below the poverty line and their debt was an average of 447 days outstanding, according to a recent report on the project the Judicial Council prepared for the legislature. Three quarters of the requests were approved; the penalty was reduced an average of \$347 per ticket, according to the report.

The governor's current budget proposal includes money to bring the pilot system statewide. Ongoing funding would increase to \$58.4 million by 2024-25.

“It's been really important during the pandemic

because it gives people a way to request a discount without going into traffic court,” said Anne Stuhldreher, director of the financial justice project in the San Francisco treasurer's office. “We should be able to hold people accountable without putting them in financial distress.”

Stuhldreher and legal service attorneys suggest a better fix is doing away with many of the fees. Last year, lawmakers eliminated a number of fees levied in criminal court. Advocates are pushing them to do the same with traffic tickets.

When courts do reduce a driver's ticket penalty, the amount varies, depending on the court and judge; the reduction can be 50 percent in some courts and 80 percent in others.

“Fifty percent is not necessarily meaningful to many of my clients who are homeless or completely destitute,” said Waite-Jones, the East Bay Community Law Center attorney.

The court system administrator, Hoshino, recommends more substantial changes from lawmakers.

But he also worries about how California will make up the revenue for vital services if the fees are slashed. The state collected \$1.4 billion in court fines and fees – all cases, not just traffic-related – in 2018-19.

“If you're going to remove \$1.4 billion for state and local programs, you're either going to end up abolishing those programs or you're going to have to find alternatives,” Hoshino said. ★

How Long Will California Economy Languish?

As COVID-19 began surging through California a year ago, Gov. Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency and ordered widespread restrictions on personal and economic activity to curb infection rates.

His actions immediately triggered a severe economic recession. California had been enjoying record-low unemployment just before the shutdown, 3.9% of the labor force, but within weeks the jobless rate quickly shot up to a record-high 16.4% as employers laid off workers.

Initially, there was a fingers-crossed hope that the recession would be what economists call a “V” – a deep plunge followed by an equally rapid recovery. However, as the public health crisis and the recession continued, it became apparent that it would be a “U” – a steep decline that reaches bottom, eventually followed by a gradual recovery.

Employment actually rebounded somewhat during summer and autumn months as Newsom loosened economic controls, although certain sectors such as tourism and travel continued to lag.

However, when infection rates, hospitalizations and deaths shot upward again late in the year – thanks, probably, to too

many holiday gatherings – Newsom clamped down again, businesses closed and joblessness again increased.

The state’s official unemployment rate – the percentage of the labor force not working – edged upward in December to 9% but when those who dropped out of the labor force or were involuntarily working part-time are included, the real rate is more like 15%.

Even without that adjustment, 9% is still very high and, according to the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, the third highest of any state. Only tourism-dependent Nevada and Hawaii are higher, with South Dakota and Nebraska at other end of the scale at 3%.

Overall, California has lost 1.5 million jobs in the last year of pandemic and economic turmoil, leaving a salient question hanging in the air: How long will California’s pandemic-induced recession continue?

The answer depends on two unpredictable factors – when and if vaccinations can tame COVID-19 and whether President Joe Biden and Congress pump additional billions, or even trillions, of borrowed dollars into the nation’s economy.

Newsom’s proposed 2021-22 budget projects, “Businesses are expected to continue to operate at limited capacity into 2021. Increased automation and a shift to online retailing will lead to permanent job declines in leisure and hospitality, retail, and other services.”

The budget also implies that the bottom of the “U” will continue for some time, saying, “Nonfarm

employment for California is projected to recover to pre-pandemic levels in 2025.”

The millions of Californians affected by the pandemic’s economic fallout are understandably worried about their futures and their angst is one of the drivers of a petition campaign aimed at recalling Newsom.

Whether from concern for his constituents or worries about a recall, Newsom is proposing “a broad-based recovery package to support businesses, individuals and job creation both during the pandemic and as the state recovers. It totals \$14 billion, including \$3.5 billion in immediate relief for individuals and small businesses disproportionately impacted by the pandemic.”

While Newsom wants fast action from the Legislature, its fiscal advisor, Gabe Petek, wants a more deliberate and skeptical approach, noting that “unlike the federal government – which can run a deficit to pay for fiscal stimulus – the state must balance fiscal stimulus with other one-time and on-going spending priorities.”

In other words, a dollar spent on Newsom’s economic recovery plan is a dollar that can’t be spent on something else – unless, of course, the governor and legislators are also willing to raise taxes. As the pandemic, the recession and the recall campaign evolve, big state stimulus expenditures will be one of the year’s more interesting issues.
