COVID-19 **Vaccination** Status in **Sac County**

Press Release by Sacramento County **Public Health**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Public Health (SCPH) continues to create and refine its vaccine rollout action plan as conditions evolve. Currently, SCPH is vaccinating identified worker groups, primary frontline healthcare and first responders, in the Phase 1a: Tiers 1 - 3 with the limited vaccine allocations coming weekly from the State.

Outside of the doses that the State has sent to Hospitals/Multi-County Entities (MCEs), to date, SCPH has been allocated 10,500 doses of Moderna and 5,850 doses of Pfizer vaccines. So far, all but 1,235 of those doses have been administered to doctors, nurses, healthcare staff, correctional health staff, firefighters, EMTs. paramedics, long-term care facilities or given to other providers.

While demand far exceeds allocation, we are hopeful that allocations will drastically increase in the near future and we can envelop those residents 65 years old and older who are approved for vaccination, as well as other Phase 1b groups.

SCPH has 975 doses allocated for the week of Jan. 18. MCEs such as hospitals have also been provided a small allocation. Due to the limited amount, Sacramento County will not be able to accommodate all requests for vaccination between the continued need in Phase 1a frontline workers, as well as the addition of those who are 65 years old and older. We are also coming quickly upon the timeframe for the second dose for all our original vaccine recipients, which further limits our availability to bring in new recipients.

"We request patience as we work to navigate the rapidly changing landscape of vaccination best practices and availability," said Sacramento County Public Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye. "We are working closely with health care providers, frontline employers and dozens of other public and private entities to ensure that anyone eligible and interested in the vaccine can receive it as soon as possible. We are closer than ever to COVID-19 immunizations for everyone who wants them, but we are not there yet."

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County approaches the homeless crisis as an engagement on a multitude of fronts, constantly fortifying and resupplying, and employing an arsenal of proven tactics. But the issues are multilayered and deeply complex, with no "one size fits all" fix.

"Pathways into homelessness are interrelated with issues such as mental health, poverty and the lack of affordable housing," said Cindy Cavanaugh, the County's Director of Homeless Initiatives.

Conversely, escaping homelessness "requires collaborative contributions across government, and private and community partners," she said. It's this network of partnerships that Forward partners with helps "improve our overall system response."



Sacramento Steps Forward partners with the community to achieve data-driven outcomes through collaborative planning and coordinating the community's goal to end homelessness.

partners is Sacramento Steps Forward (SSF), the federally designated lead agency for Sacramento Continuum of Care. SSF coordinates housing and services for the homeless in Sacramento.

"Sacramento Steps the community to achieve data-driven outcomes One of the County's through collaborative

planning and coordinating the community's goal to end homelessness," said CEO Lisa Bates. "We help support the work of other agencies that have their boots on the ground. Collaboration requires us to honestly study our performance and build continuous learning, while being as adaptable and nim-

This approach is to connect those individuals and families to rehousing providers as quickly as possible, and to "provide additional support to programs and clients on their pathway to permanent housing" said Bates. "We play to our strengths and we're always stronger when we're united."

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All Taxpayers Now Eligible for Identity Protection PINS

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG) - The Internal Revenue Service expanded the Identity Protection PIN Opt-In Program to all taxpayers who can verify their identities.

The Identity Protection PIN (IP PIN) is a six-digit code known only to the taxpayer and to the IRS. It helps prevent identity thieves from filing fraudulent tax returns using a taxpayers' personally identifiable information.

"This is a way to, in essence, lock your tax account, and the IP PIN serves as the key to opening that account," said IRS Commissioner Chuck Rettig. "Electronic returns that do not contain the correct IP PIN will be rejected, and paper returns will go through additional scrutiny for fraud."

The IRS launched the IP PIN program nearly a decade ago to protect confirmed identity theft victims from ongoing tax-related fraud. In recent years, the IRS expanded the program to specific states where taxpayers could voluntarily opt into the IP PIN program. Now, the voluntary program is going nationwide.

About the IP PIN Opt-In

Here are a few key things to know about the IP PIN Opt-In program: This is a voluntary program. You must pass a rigorous identity verification process. Spouses and dependents are eligible for an IP PIN if they can verify their identities. An IP PIN is valid for a calendar year. You must obtain a new IP PIN each filing season. The online IP PIN tool is offline between November and mid-January each year. Correct IP PINs must be entered on electronic and paper tax returns to avoid rejections and delays. Never share your IP PIN with anyone but your trusted tax provider. The IRS will never call, text or email requesting



your IP PIN. Beware of scams to steal your IP PIN. There currently is no opt-out option but the IRS is working on one for 2022.

How to get an IP PIN

Taxpayers who want an IP PIN for 2021 should go to IRS.gov/ IPPIN and use the Get an IP PIN tool. This online process will require taxpayers to verify their identities using the Secure Access authentication process if they do not already have an IRS account. See IRS.gov/SecureAccess for what information you need to be successful. There is no need to file a Form 14039, an Identity Theft Affidavit, to opt into the program

Once taxpayers have authenticated their identities, their 2021 IP PIN immediately will be revealed to them. Once in the program, this PIN must be used when prompted by electronic tax returns or entered by hand near the signature line on paper tax returns.

All taxpayers are encouraged to first use the online IP PIN tool to obtain their IP PIN. Taxpayers who cannot verify their identities online do have options.

Taxpayers whose adjusted gross income is \$72,000 or less may complete Form 15227, Application for an Identity

Number, and mail or fax to the IRS. An IRS customer service representative will contact the taxpayer and verify their identities by phone. Taxpayers should have their prior year tax return at hand for the verification process.

Taxpayers who verify their identities through this process will have an IP PIN mailed to them the following tax year. This is for security reasons. Once in the program, the IP PIN will be mailed to these taxpayers each year.

Taxpayers who cannot verify their identities online or by phone and who are ineligible for file Form 15227 can contact the IRS and make an appointment at a Taxpayer Assistance Center to verify their identities in person. Taxpavers should bring two forms of identification, including one government-issued picture identification.

Taxpayers who verify their identities through the in-person process will have an IP PIN mailed to them within three weeks. Once in the program, the IP PIN will be mailed to these taxpayers each year.

No change for confirmed identity theft victims

Taxpayers who are confirmed identity theft victims or who have filed an identity theft affidavit because of suspected stolen members of the criminal identity refund fraud will automatically receive an IP PIN via mail once their cases are resolved. Current tax-related identity theft victims who have been receiving IP PINs via mail will experience no change.

The IRS also encourages tax professionals and employers to share information with taxpayers about the availability of the IP PIN. Tax professionals and employers can print or email Publication 5367 or share IRS Protection Personal Identification social media/e-poster products. ★

Officer Involved Shooting at Cal Expo

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - At 10:07 p.m. on January 18, 2021, Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Deputies saw an occupied vehicle in a parking lot near Arden Way and Avondale Avenue that matched the description of a vehicle involved in a burglary series. Deputies initiated contact with the single occupant of the vehicle and were able to identify the subject as being on active parole. The suband fled in his vehicle when deputies attempted to search the vehicle. A short pursuit ensued that terminated inside of the Cal Expo Complex located at 1600 Exposition Boulevard. The suspect vehicle became disabled after striking a curb and came to rest near a chainlink fence. Multiple patrol units gathered at the termination point to assist the tives and Crime Scene initial deputies. Deputies gave several commands for the suspect to exit his vehicle and he refused.

Deputies deployed lesslethal "bean bag" rounds into the suspect vehicle's back window in an attempt to see inside. A K-9 handler deployed his K-9 into the back window of the vehicle at which time several shots were fired from within the vehicle. Two deputies and the canine were struck by the suspect's gunfire. The wounded officers were transported by deputies in patrol units to an area hospital. Deputy Adam Gibson, a 31-yearold, 6 year veteran of the department, was project became uncooperative nounced deceased at the hospital. A second deputy was stabilized and transported to a trauma center for further treatment. K-9 Riley also died at the scene. K-9 Riley was 5 years old and had been inservice with our office for 3 years. Fire arrived and pronounced the sole occupant of the suspect vehicle deceased at the scene.

Homicide detec-Investigators responded to the scene and began interviewing witnesses and processing evidence. This

investigation is still in its early stages and information is still developing. No further information is available at this time.

Deputy Gibson leaves behind his wife Rachel Gibson, 9-month-old child, his parents Doug and Sandee Gibson and several siblings. Deputy Gibson served in the United States Marine Corps and did two tours in Afghanistan. Since joining the department in 2014 he has worked in corrections, patrol and most recently a canine handler. Deputy Gibson received the Sheriff's Office Bronze Star for Bravery and a Major Incident Ribbon

The wounded deputy is 43 years old, a 13 year veteran of the department and remains hospitalized in serious, but stable

The Officer-Involved Shooting investigation will be conducted by the Sheriff's Professional Standards Division, which is standard practice for any officer-involved shooting. The Sacramento Police Department Homicide Division will investigate the remainder of the incident. Independent review of the officer-involved shooting will be conducted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office and the Inspector General.

Officer Involved Shooting Ranger Way and Rampart Drive

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - A little before 8:15 p.m. on January 15, 2021, members of the Sacramento County Sheriff's Gang Suppression Unit (GSU) were conducting a follow-up investigation regarding a possible gang-related shooting in the southern region of Sacramento County. During the investigation, evidence gathered led detectives to a location in Carmichael near Ranger Way and Rampart Drive.

Detectives located a vehicle connected to the investigation, occupied by at least two subjects. Gang Detectives attempted to contact the occupants of the vehicle. At some point during the contact, multiple shots were fired striking one detective and the suspect. Fire personnel responded; however, upon arrival, they pronounced the suspect deceased at the scene. The wounded detective was transported from the scene to an area hospital for treatment.

Multiple regional agencies assisted and established a perimeter of the surrounding area. Neighboring residents were advised to stay inside. After several hours of searching, the tactical teams were unable to locate any additional subjects involved in the incident.

Homicide detectives and Crime Scene Investigators responded to the scene and began interviewing witnesses and processing evidence. This investigation is still in its early stages and information is still developing.

The wounded detective remains hospitalized in serious, but stable condition and is expected to survive. The detective is 47 years old and a 15-year veteran of the Sheriff's Office. The detective has held several assignments within the Sheriff's Office including his current assignment in the Gang Suppression Unit.

The other occupant of the vehicle during the time of the incident was arrested and later booked at Sacramento County Main Jail on felony charges unrelated to this incident.


The investigation into the incident will be conducted by the Sheriff's Homicide Bureau and Professional Standards Division, which is standard practice for any officer-involved shooting that occurs in the Sheriff's Office's jurisdiction. Independent review of the officer-involved shooting will be conducted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office and the Inspector General. In accordance with the Sheriff's Office's policies and procedures, the other detective involved in the shooting will be placed on paid administrative leave pending the investigation.

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Scrambling for Shots California Vaccine Chaos Amid Mixed Messaging

The chaos and confusion many Californians experienced this week in their search for a COVID-19 vaccine only intensified as Gov. Gavin Newsom revealed that the state would not receive an additional supply of doses it was counting on to accelerate vaccination.

Newsom said he, like other governors, expected about 50 million doses to be released from storage by the feds in the next few days. "And then we read, as everybody else, that they have reneged or ... are unable to deliver on that." he said at a news conference unveiling a new mass vaccination site at Dodger Stadium.

The governor said he does expect there to be enough vaccine for Californians who already have received their first shot and need the required second dose. But the state needs to verify the supply it will be given, he said.

Federal officials had promised states an expanded supply of vaccine and demanded they start vaccinating people 65 and older and those with documented preexisting conditions to speed the slow pace of immunizations nationwide.

But a national stockpile of vaccines held back for necessary second doses appears to have been depleted, meaning that states won't get the amount of vaccine they were counting on to dramatically ramp up mass vaccination campaigns,

Newsom last week announced an audacious goal of immunizing 1 million people in 10 days, under mounting political pressure over the state's slow vaccine rollout. But at least 450,000 people would need to receive shots today to fulfill that goal. The state is on pace to achieve it, Newsom said, adding that there is a lag in the state's data reporting.

The state's public health agency reported 42,655 new cases and 637 deaths as a more infectious "U.K." coronavirus variant spreads across California and nationwide. About 32 cases of the variant have been reported in California, more than any other state, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

California continues its winter surge - the worst since the pandemic started. About 13% of tests are coming back positive, although hospitalizations are beginning to decrease slightly, according to the latest state data.

Leah Russin, co-founder of the advocacy group Vaccinate California, empathized with local public health officials who, she said, have been asked to roll out mass vaccination campaigns at the same time as they're battling the worst surge of the pandemic. But Californians deserve better, she said.

"It feels like some decisions have been made that haven't been thoroughly explained and they may increase inequity or confusion. Neither of those things are good at a time when we're fighting against extraordinary mistrust of government," said Leah Russin, co-founder of Vaccinate California.

"We have to be exceedingly transparent and do it fast, without mistakes. I know I'm asking us to be amazing, but we have





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Budget Priorities: Reopen Schools, Help Small Businesses and Fix EDD

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Governor Gavin Newsom unveiled his \$ 227.2 billion budget proposal. The state is unexpectedly receiving between \$15* billion to \$26** billion in additional one-time revenue. Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama), Vice Chair of the Senate Budget & Fiscal Review Committee, issued the following statement:

"This one-time money must be spent on one-time expenses to help those most harmed by COVID-19 - children, momand-pop shops and those struggling with joblessness. The state continues to face ongoing budget deficits despite the current unexpected revenue.

"Children are not learning. They have not seen the inside of a classroom for eight months. Many are failing and facing mental health challenges. Parents are at their wit's end trying to work and provide for their children's instruction.

"Children's learning and health must

come first. Schools must open safely regardless of the demands of the adults involved. There is no equity when private schools are open, and public schools are not. The vast majority of families cannot afford to have independent child care or arrange for pods with private tutors.

"Millions of Californians are jobless. Countless small businesses have permanently closed including 40,000 restaurants, and many more are on the brink of closing.

"EDD must be fixed to ensure that Californians receive the help they need.

"California must be a state that enables entrepreneurs and businesses to create jobs for our people."

Children's Home, Stanford while the pandemic has brought extraordinary challenges to delivering homeless services, it has resulted in "an unprecedented collaborative Use response that scaled new interventions in outreach and rehousing services."

For instance, the Sacramento COVID-19 Response Team provided services to more than 1.000 individuals, more than half over age 55 and a quarter of whom had never before received services from the homeless system.

While the Response Team's first phase "was about saving lives and ensuring safety, we have now shifted the focus from temporary to permanent solutions," Cavanaugh says. That includes housing.

Draft Climate Action Plan Available in February

By Laurie Slothower, Sacramento County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - County staff is hard at work on a Communitywide Climate Action Plan (CAP) that aims to significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions and prepare the county for climate-related impacts for decades to come.

The Sacramento County Office of Planning and Environmental Review expects the draft CAP will be available for public review sometime in February. A virtual public meeting is also in the works. You can be among the first to see it by signing up for email or text alerts.

Climate change is expected to affect the region in a variety of ways: Hotter temperatures and more extreme heat events; increased wildfire risks; unpredictable rainfall and flood; reduced snowpack and impacts to the water supply, among others.

As proposed, the Communitywide Climate Action Plan will serve as a policy and technical document that determines greenhouse gas reduction targets and proposes measures to reach those reductions.

"Our goal is to have an implementable community-wide plan that provides meaningful and equitable climate action, enhances resiliency and provides a transparent and public path for future plan performance and adaptive management," said Principal Planner Todd Smith.

Following public review, staff hopes to get the revised plan before the Board of Supervisors by the summer of 2021.

The Board of Supervisors adopted the Climate Action Plan - Government Operations in 2012. This plan covered Sacramento County measures to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, including converting the county's light-duty vehicles fleet to hydrogen or hybrid fuel cell (electric) vehicles.

Presentations from past public workshops and Board of Supervisors meetings that give examples of some of the concepts under consideration are available on the Planning and Environmental Review

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U.S. forces choppered into Syria 24 hours after new commander-in-chief takes power | 22 Jan 2021 | A large convoy of U.S. military personnel headed into Syria on Thursday along with hundreds of troops some 24 hours after President [sic] Joe Biden took office and took on his commander-in-chief role, foreign media reported. Citing Syrian state news agency SANA, i24 News reported that a convoy of about 40 trucks and armored vehicles "entered northeastern Syria" on Thursday supported by helicopters. The convoy entered the country from Iraq via the al-Waleed crossing "to bring arms and logistical equipment to bases in Hasakeh and Deir Ezzor provinces," i23 News stated. And while "other local media" noted that such resupply convoys are not uncommon, SANA's report added that an additional 200 U.S. troops were choppered into the Hasakeh province as well.

The clip continues: "The greatest threat facing America today comes from within: radical extreme conservatives, also known as domestic terrorists. They're hidden among us, disguised behind regular jobs. They are your children's teachers. They work at supermarkets, malls, doctor's offices, and many are police officers and soldiers." The video, which has received over 3.5 million views since, then claims that the president will begin a civil war once out of office and that ordinary citizens must "fight back." ..."We have to fight back," the clip continues. "In this new war, the battlefield has changes. Computers can be more valuable than guns. And this is what we need now more than ever: an army of citizen detectives."

Gov. Gavin Newsom's new budget, unveiled this month, warns that California, already hit by devastating wildfires in recent years, is in grave danger.

"In 2020, 9,000 wildfires burned over 4 million acres across the state, more than the 2017 and 2018 fire seasons combined and significantly higher than the most recent five-year average of acres burned," the budget says in proposing new firefighting expenditures. "Hotter, drier We have seen only scant conditions in the state's forests, driven by climate change and the consequences of a century-old legacy of fire suppression, have generated unparalleled fuel conditions that pandemic and economic result in significant wildfire risk."

> The situation is a reminder that although pandemic and recession dominate Californians' consciousness now, with good reason, older threats still must be confronted.

With climate change, even normal levels of precipitation will be more in the form of rain and less in the form of snow, thus reducing that natural reservoir. Therefore, we must, in addition to pursuing water-saving and reuse strategies, create more storage.

Traditionally, storage has meant building dams to hold back and store river flows, such as Shasta Dam on the Sacramento River and Oroville Dam on the Feather River. There are proposals to continue that approach, such as raising Shasta to increase storage capacity or building Temperance Flat on the San Joaquin River.

However, such projects generate so much opposition due to their effects on river flows and wildlife habitat that they have only tiny chances of becoming reality.

Restoring much-depleted aquifers in the San Joaquin Valley is a more politically acceptable option, as is constructing more off-stream storage like the 63-year-old San Luis Reservoir in the Pacheco Pass. A San Luis-like project called Sites Reservoir seems to be gaining traction after sitting on the shelf for decades.

Sites, on the west side of Glenn and Colusa counties, would store excess flows on the Sacramento River from winter rains and then release water back into the Sacramento as needed. Recently reduced in scope and cost, it has received planning funds in the most recent pandemic relief and economic stimulus packages passed by Congress.

Once COVID-19 is behind us, if it ever is, we need to move quickly to prevent the ecological, economic and human disasters that prolonged drought would wrought.
