## Desmond Wins Supervisor Race

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - After a long, nail-biter of a vote count, former CHP Chief Rich Desmond was last week declared winner of the Sacramento District 3 Board of Supervisors race. Though several thousand ballots were still to be tallied, his lead over SMUD director Gregg Fishman had inched toward 2500 votes last Friday night. At that point Desmond received a call from his rival. “Gregg congratulated me and suggested I enroll for the California Counties’ New Supervisor

Orientation Course,” says the winner. “I was grateful he called. It’s a wonderful tradition of our democracy that winning and losing candidates pledge to work together.”

The 2019/20 campaign – including counting processes – exhausted candidates, staff and families. “Everyone was worn out,” says the Supervisor-Elect. “It was an unusually long campaign -- almost a year and a half being unsure what our futures held.” Even after polls closed, the candidates endured ten more days on tenterhooks. Early election night scores had Fishman more than 2500 votes ahead. By next morning, a refreshed tally

shrunk Fishman’s lead to less than 1400.

To escape the tension, Desmond and his wife Lisa left the youngest of their five kids with family and took a train to Denver. From there, they flew to Cabo San Lucas, Mexico. “We just needed time to decompress and focus on each other,” explains Desmond. “By the time we got home to Carmichael, the gap between Gregg and I had not just closed – I’d flipped the lead and was 467 votes ahead. At that point, I started to realize that if the trend continued, I might win.”

By November 13 (ironically, Black Friday) victory seemed assured. Fishman’s

telephone concession confirmed the prognosis. “I hardly got any sleep that night,” Desmond recalls. “I was too busy responding to calls from people congratulating me. A huge load had been lifted from my shoulders. At last I knew the direction my life would take for the next four years.”

Victory came against tough odds. His rival’s candidacy was financially assisted by the Democratic Party and had endorsement from Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg. Supervisor (board chair) Phil Serna, Congressman Ami Bera and Assemblyman Ken

## Alternatives to 9-1-1 for Mental Health Response

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Sacramento County Behavioral Health Services is seeking community input on alternatives to calling 911 in a behavioral health or quality of life crisis. The public is invited to provide comments sharing their thoughts and suggestions in this online survey. The survey will be available online through Friday, Nov. 13.

The Alternatives to 911 pilot program stemmed from a Board of Supervisors discussion in September budget hearings. District Two Supervisor Patrick Kennedy directed Health Services staff to propose alternatives to law enforcement responses to quality of life issues that can be better addressed by mental health professionals.

“It’s important to develop a more appropriate and robust system for

care for individuals in crisis,” said Kennedy. “We need to meet the needs of people outside of the criminal justice system and take a public health approach to their quality of life issues, both in the moment of

crisis and long term.”

The goal of the program is to increase mental health response to calls for service; decrease law enforcement need to respond to mental health distress, crisis or other quality of life issues;

decrease unnecessary emergency department visits and psychiatric hospitalizations; and decrease relapse into crisis by linking to ongoing outpatient mental health services.

“The direction from the Board was very clear on this pilot program: to minimize law enforcement involvement and provide greater efficacy while responding to mental health crises in the community,” said District One Supervisor and Board Chair Phil Serna. “It is important to get input from the community and develop a program based on that feedback, and I encourage people to provide their thoughts on the matter.”

County staff will continue to obtain community input through December, review and analyze proposed models, assess cost and provide a proposal for a pilot program to the Board of Supervisors in February 2021. ★

# California State Parks Experience Goes Virtual for K-12 Students

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The school field trip to California State Parks is being reimagined thanks to a new partnership between California State Parks, Parks California, and Computer-Using Educators (CUE). California is home to some of the country's most unique and precious cultural, natural, and historic resources, and a new passPORTS online adventure will help make it possible for students from across the state to experience them.

The new pilot program, passPORTS, will use a blended access approach that combines quality teaching practices with the latest technology to reduce barriers to park access. Using videoconference technology and web resources, the Parks Online Resources for Teachers and Students (PORTS) program introduces K-12 students to live State Park Interpreters, allowing them to connect their classroom studies within the context of California's state park system. "We are excited to embark on a new partnership with Parks California and CUE to provide deep and meaningful digital learning experiences for K12 students and invite them for an in-person class visit to our parks, recreation areas, natural reserves, and culturally important places when the time is right for schools," Brad Krey, PORTS Program Manager said. Geoff Kish, Vice President of Programs at Parks California said, "passPORTS is an exceptional opportunity for kids to connect with and learn about California's State Parks from the comfort of their home. Programs like this play an important role in making state parks accessible for all people, regardless of where they live."

This enhanced initiative builds on 15 years of successful PORTS programs with a new combination of digital instructional materials for use in the classroom, as well as in-park use, and provides funding to school districts to cover bus and transportation costs, giving students their passPORTS to the Parks. "We believe parks provide deep and meaningful interdisciplinary learning experiences for students regardless of physical, social, cultural, economic circumstance, or ability," said Scott Shepherd, Parks Access Coordinator, California State Parks. "Our work will not only increase equitable access to parks for all California citizens, but

in turn mobilize a new generation to play, learn, serve, and share in California State Parks."

The goal of the passPORTS program is to provide more students with access to California State Parks through a blended access approach, using both online learning adventures now and in-person field trips once COVID-19 restrictions are lifted. "The Parks offer interdisciplinary learning opportunities which afford schools a wide variety of curriculum engagement. California State Parks encourages students to learn more about nature, science, and history," said Scott Shepherd. "These experiences not only support learning but also build respect for the natural environment and our diverse history and helps students to develop their understanding of California's unique resources."

Shepherd says, "Naturally, we want students, as well as their teachers and parents, to discover that our parks are learning laboratories, as well as places for environmental awareness, advocacy, and stewardship. But, we also want them to discover that these are places to enjoy the wonder of our state. Through collaboration with California State Parks and the K12 community, we aim to develop both sustainable and equitable access for the next generation of park visitors and champions."

# Remembered Forever Desmond Wins Supervisor Race

*Down-sized Service Recalls Vietnam Heroes*

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Normally an occasion for big crowds, Carmichael's Veterans Day tradition continued in much abbreviated format last week. Commemorations took place at the Vietnam Monument in Koobs Nature Area on Engle Road. One of the first Californian monuments to the Vietnam War, the site was first dedicated in 1973, in recognition of La Sierra High School graduates who died in Vietnam conflicts. The preserve is named for Earl (Jack) Koobs, a La Sierra science teacher who helped establish it.

November 11 tributes conformed to COVID assembly restrictions, with just over 20 guests (including a Boy Scout color guard) included. Others were turned away at the gate but were able to watch the ceremony live-streamed. Reverend Kathleen Marie – a sister of memorial honoree Thomas Pigg – thanked veterans for freedoms enjoyed today. The La Sierra alumna was a teenager when she learned her 21-year-old brother had fallen. “We come to hallow memories,” she said, “and to make sure (those who died) are remembered forever. The benches here may not be filled today, but our hearts are filled.”

Iraq War veteran Matt Cecatto spoke on

the value of remembrance. “Respect for our veterans goes back to this country’s inception,” said the Purple Heart recipient. “To parents and brothers and sisters who can’t be here today, I promise these heroes will not be forgotten. Serving the military is the highest effort anyone can give to their nation.” Cecatto also lauded frontline workers in the current COVID emergency. “In bleak times, you’ve stood up,” he said. “I thank you. Our flag flies brighter because of the people like you.”

Carmichael rock singer Todd Morgan led the depleted throng in George M. Cohan’s “You’re a grand Old Flag” and “My Country ‘Tis of Thee.” Korean War veteran Bill Fellers (90) played Taps, echoed by Boy Scout bugler Edward Stach (14). With the ringing of a bell, the 15 heroes immortalized by a Koobs Nature area plaque were named.

The honorees are: Robert D. Anderson, Mark W. Burchard, Robert S. Bynes, Jerry Cowsert, Kenneth R. Escott, Gary R. Field, Herbert Frenzell, Frank Thornburg, Ralph Guarienti, Larry H. Morford, Thomas C. Pigg, Randall B. Rainville, Kim Richins, Jeffrey Tharaldson and Robert A. Willis.

Coolley urged voters in Fishman’s favor. The Sacramento Bee, SMUD board directors, some Sacramento City Council members and many labor organizations promoted his campaign.

Though Desmond ran as an Independent, he was championed by Democrat Assemblyman Jim Cooper, Sacramento District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert and by numerous public safety agencies. His supporters raised almost \$750,000 to fund primary and runoff campaigns. “The majority of our donors gave small amounts – \$10 or \$20 or less,” says Desmond. “The success of our fundraising shows I had broad support from ordinary people who cared.”

Desmond’s passion for the area where he grew up (he’s now raising kids in his old family home) was ignited when Supervisor Susan Peters decided to step down. “I found I cared deeply about who would be our next leader,” he recalls. “I decided I had the experience to address problems that were getting worse here. I felt I could make a difference.”

District 3 encompasses Carmichael and largely-unincorporated areas of Arden Arcade, Fair Oaks, Foothill Farms, North Highlands and a sliver of East Sacramento. Its supervisors have been female since Sandy Smoley’s historic 1972 election. With Peters’ retirement, District 4 Supervisor Sue Frost will be a lone lady on the five-person Board. “It’s important to have a balance,” considers Desmond. ★

“Susan Peters would have loved to have a woman succeed her. I couldn’t meet that one criterion, but she took time to get to know me. We began having regular meetings and I learned about county issues. Once I’d made the decision to run, her insight was invaluable. One thing Susan told me was not to be discouraged by criticism. She told me if I worked I hard with an open heart and mind, I would succeed. Susan’s done much more for the District than many people realize. But she and I agree that after 16 years, it’s good to pass the torch.”

With less than two months still to serve, Peters last week applauded her protégé’s success. “Rich worked so hard to win this race,” she approved. “I know he’ll approach his new position with openness and thoughtfulness. The Third District has got itself a winner.”

Desmond takes his Board seat undaunted by the prospect of grueling repeat-campaigns. He claims his ambition was never political. “As a CHP Officer, as an attorney, a junior sports coach, a Parkway and community volunteer and as a parent, all I’ve wanted was to help and serve people,” he explains. “If I do a good job on the Board and get re-elected in four years, that’s terrific. But I won’t be driven by the need for voter popularity – that’s a problem with too many politicians – I’ll be driven to make decisions that are best for the community. And then voters can make their choice.”

**Federal Election Commission Chair Calls Election 'Illegitimate' Due to Voter Fraud – 'The law is not being followed, making this an illegitimate election.'** | 12 Nov 2020 | Trey Trainor, the Chairman of the Federal Election, stated during an appearance on Newsmax this Thursday that he “does believe there's voter fraud taking place,” and confirmed that the refusal to allow poll watchers to observe the ballot counting process - among numerous other irregularities - does indeed constitute an “illegitimate election.” “I do believe that there is voter fraud taking place in these places,” Trainor said. “Otherwise they would allow the observers to go in.” “When you have claims of 10,000 people who don't live in the state of Nevada having voted in Nevada, when you have the video showing where people are either duplicating a spoiled ballot right there, or they're in the process of just marking a ballot that came in blank for a voter, that's a process that needs to be observed by election observers,” Trainor said. The FEC Chairman added that poll observers are legally allowed to be present during the counting of ballots, and if they are refused entry to a place where the vote is being tabulated then “the law is not being followed, making this an illegitimate election.”

**Michigan Witness: GOP Poll Challengers Were Assaulted at TCF Center trying to Protect the Vote – GOP challengers were prevented from seeing ballots –Witness says: 'The most crooked thing I've ever seen'** | 12 Nov 2020 | Absentee ballots from Wayne County/Detroit were supposed to be counted by 8:00 PM on election night last week, but a 3:30 AM delivery of what witnesses have described as 50-61 boxes of ballots puts into doubt the validity of the surprising election results. That surprise brought a commanding Trump lead of 300,000 votes for Michigan's 16 electoral votes into a 120,000 vote deficit after votes from Wayne County were counted. Ann Rudisill went down to the counting area after hearing that a large batch of suspicious ballots had arrived in the middle of the night. Rudisill noticed a total lack of security at the TCF Center when she entered. “There was no sign in sheet. There was nothing. Maybe a hundred of us walked in there.” She described poll challengers as being purposefully prevented from being able to review the ballots as they were being counted on Wednesday, the day after the election, by poll workers and Democrat Poll Challengers. “I was completely unable to see the ballots.”

**Pennsylvania court: Secretary of state lacked authority to change deadline 2 days before Election – Judge ruled ballots that were previously set aside should not be counted** | 12 Nov 2020 | A Pennsylvania judge ruled in favor of the Trump campaign Thursday, ordering that the state may not count ballots where the voters needed to provide proof of identification and failed to do so by Nov. 9. State law said that voters have until six days after the election – this year that was Nov. 9 – to cure problems regarding a lack of proof of identification. After the Pennsylvania Supreme Court ruled that mail-in ballots could be accepted three days after Election Day, Pennsylvania Secretary of State Kathy Boockvar submitted guidance that said proof of identification could be provided up until Nov. 12, which is six days from the ballot acceptance deadline. That guidance was issued two days before Election Day. “(T)he Court concludes that Respondent Kathy Boockvar, in her official capacity as Secretary of the Commonwealth, lacked statutory authority to issue the November 1, 2020, guidance to Respondents County Boards of Elections insofar as that guidance purported to change the deadline...for certain electors to verify proof of identification,” Judge Mary Hannah Leavitt said in a court order.

**Trump Lawsuit Alleges Rampant Violations at Detroit Vote Counting Center** | 11 Nov 2020 | President Donald Trump's reelection campaign sued Michigan in federal court late on Nov. 10, alleging pervasive violations of election laws at a vote-counting center in Detroit. The lawsuit is accompanied by 234 pages of sworn witness affidavits which describe how Republican poll challengers were prevented from having adequate access to observe the counting process in violation of Michigan's election code. The witnesses detail a battery of problems with the handling, processing, and counting of the votes, including instances in which election officials ignored their challenges.

**Analysis of Election Night Data From All States Show Millions of Votes Either Switched From President to Biden or Were Lost - Using Dominion and Other Systems** | 10 Nov 2020 | Tonight we have obtained an unaudited analysis of data available for all the states looking for system glitches and other oddities in vote counts related to the Presidential race only. Last night we reported on another so called system 'glitch,' this time in a county in Wisconsin. Evidence was provided to us that showed that the vote totals for Rock County appeared to be switched between President Trump and Joe Biden. 9,516 votes were eliminated from President Trump and moved to Joe Biden. This 19,032 vote difference when corrected would eliminate Biden's lead in Wisconsin. ★

## Caring for the COVID-19 Caregiver Advocated by Navy PA

**BREMERTON, WA (MPG)** - As the effort to help stop the spread of COVID-19 continues, a Navy physician assistant (PA) from Sacramento, California, and a Elk Grove High School 1999 graduate, is also supporting care for COVID-19 caregiver's health, wellness and resilience needs.

For Lt. Jeffrey E. Osborn assigned to Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command (NMRTC) Bremerton's, the ongoing pandemic outbreak has him helping maintain the warfighting capability of commands in the third largest fleet concentration, as well as provide resources for the command's healthcare workers.

“The current pandemic has caused massive social upheaval and levels of stress only comparable to multiple deployments,” said Osborn, who has taken the lead to chair NMRTC Bremerton's Provider Wellness/Impaired Provider Prevention Program. “People are having difficulty finding child care and balancing work, parental duties and even fulfilling the role of teachers.”

According to Osborn, attached to NMRTC Bremerton's Branch Health Clinic Bangor, the goal of the program is to ensure patient safety while acting as an advocate for credentialed healthcare providers.

“As with all functions at the hospital, our number one goal is always improving patient safety,” Osborn said. “In this care prevention, early identification, treatment and rehabilitation of possibly

impaired healthcare providers is the focus.”

The program is a Defense Health Agency requirement and is comprised of multiple professions such as credentialed provider, mental health and nursing staff representative(s).

There's a number of services that can be provided, including mental health, substance abuse rehabilitation referrals, even help with work schedule issues for someone struggling with significant life events.

“We act as a voice of advocacy for staff. Our program provides routine information on building resiliency with a goal of prevention of impairment,” stated Osborn, adding that the program routinely reaches out to the medical community with discussions and briefs on a regular basis, such as sharing during new provider orientation and during the occasional medical staff meetings. “Additionally,

we focus on early identification and treatment always with the goal of rehabilitation and return to clinical duties.” “Now more than ever it is critical that we work together as peers to provide support and feel comfortable checking in with each other to make sure that none of us are struggling in silence,” Osborn stressed. “Medical providers in particular tend to downplay their own problems trying to focus on providing care. It is up to us to look out for each other.”

As Navy Medicine continues to respond to the pandemic's lingering impact physical, mental and emotional impacts with a ready medical force ensuring there's a medical ready force, the added responsibilities have led to concerns about burn-out and complacency.

“Healthcare workers are especially impacted by this as they fill a critical role on the front lines of addressing the

pandemic,” stated Osborn. “This has put increased stress on our staff as they work to provide critical care to our community while accepting increased risk of exposure and the fear of potentially spreading of the virus to family and friends.”

For Osborn, the path to his current position has been based more on the journey than the actual destination. Although the Pacific Northwest has made a lasting positive impression.

“I enjoy my time as a Navy provider. The job has unique challenges and opportunities that my civilian peers never get to experience. As someone who has been active duty with a long break in between periods of service, I can safely say that there is no place that has a similar sense of community and camaraderie as the military. The friendships and experiences will truly last a lifetime,” exclaimed Osborn,

noting that being able to engage in operational medicine – whether in the field or at sea – offers unique challenges in distinctive settings unlike any typical hospital and clinic environment.

Navy Medicine has taken Osborn far afield, across the Pacific and Indian Oceans, from the arid African coastline of Djibouti to the tropical jungles of Sri Lanka. He also deployed in support of Combined Joint Task Force – Operation Inherent Resolve and provided an array of medical care to joint and Coalition service members in Iraq and Syria.

Yet well before his current role, Osborn joined the Army after graduating in 1999 from Elk Grove High School. He served as an airborne infantryman for four years, then diligently worked as an emergency medical technician and earned his Bachelors of Science degree in Medical Microbiology from

University of California, Davis. He followed up by graduating from Touro University California with a dual Master of Public Health and Master of PA studies in 2013. He joined the Navy as a direct accession soon after.

“While in PA school I spent a considerable amount of time trying to decide where to practice and the kind of patient population to treat,” Osborn related. “I wanted to serve again after an almost 10 years break. I spoke with medical recruiters from all the military branches and was impressed with the chief hospital corpsman that I worked with. I was interested in the large scope of Navy Medicine encompassing both the blues side as well as the green side working with sailors and Marines.”

As a physician assistant, Osborn works hand-in-hand with supervising physicians and surgeons, and is proficient in areas such as emergency medicine and family practice, along with handling primary care issues and overseeing other members of the medical team such as hospital corpsmen. Working with those hospital corpsmen is the best part of his job.

“The PA profession was born out of the hospital corpsman rate,” said Osborn. “Many current corpsmen and medics are the future of the PA community. Corpsmen are the first link in the chain of survival following trauma or injury in operational environments.”

Osborn's role as a Navy PA is also part of that chain of survival, from training corpsmen to providing care to those in need with the Provider Wellness/ Impaired Provider Prevention Program. ★

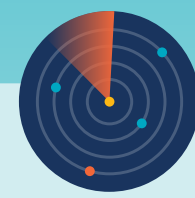

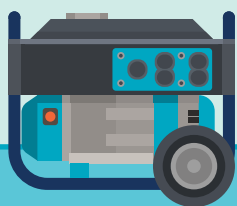

# More High-Dollar Ballot Measures in 2022

Much has been said and written about the hundreds of millions of dollars spent for and against the dozen statewide measures on this month's ballot.

Big money? Yes, but it was really just chicken feed, because the stakes in those ballot battles were infinitely greater.

Take, for instance, Proposition 15, a battle between a union-led coalition that proposed the measure, and a business coalition. Had Proposition 15 passed, it would have generated roughly \$10 billion a year for schools and local governments. That's about 66 times as much as the one-time spending for and against the measure.

Other than the scale, there was nothing unusual this year about the lopsided risk-reward aspect of major ballot measures, and it will fuel another round of conflicts two years hence. There are at least four high-dollar ballot measures headed for the 2022 ballot:

**MICRA** – In 1975, Jerry Brown signed the Medical Injury Compensation Reform Act or MICRA, placing a \$250,000 cap on damages for what were called “pain and suffering” in medical malpractice lawsuits.

Consumer advocates and

personal injury lawyers have attempted numerous times in the Legislature to modify the law, contending that it protects bad medical care providers and short-changes their innocent patients. Providers and their insurers have turned back each challenge, saying that removing the cap would raise medical costs.

A measure already qualified for the 2022 ballot would adjust the cap for inflation retroactively to 1975, probably increasing it to well over \$1 million, and eliminate it for “catastrophic injuries.” The outcome could have multi-billion-dollar impacts and thus will mean multi-million-dollar campaigns.

**PLASTICS** – A certain-to-qualify measure would reduce or eliminate single-use plastic packaging through regulation and a tax.

California recycler Recology is the chief sponsor of the initiative, which would continue a crusade, also supported by environmental groups, that stalled in the Legislature thanks to fierce lobbying by a packaging industry coalition led by South Carolina-based Novolex.

As the battle shifts to the ballot, the Recology group will portray plastic packaging, particularly items used for takeout food, as environmental despoilers. The industry will counter that using plastic packaging is cleaner than the alternatives, particularly during a pandemic.

**SPORTS WAGERING** – Another virtually certain 2022 ballot measure also continues a contentious issue the Legislature failed to resolve – whether

legal sports wagering should come to California and if so, who should benefit.

A legislative measure would have given Indian tribal casinos and some horse racing tracks authority to take bets on sporting events, but the politically powerful casinos opposed it because it would also have sanctioned new forms of gambling in non-tribal card rooms, impinging on the tribes' monopoly.

A tribal coalition's pending ballot measure mirrors the failed legislation except for its card room enhancements. It's uncertain whether the card rooms will try to mount an opposition drive but billions of gambling dollars will hinge on the outcome.

**FLAVORED TOBACCO** – Despite stalling on other issues, the Legislature did pass a ban on flavored tobacco products, which have been criticized as luring young men and women into tobacco use.

“It will be a point of deep pride and personal privilege as a father of four and as someone who's had many, many family members die at the hands of the tobacco industry to sign that bill,” Gov. Gavin Newsom said.

The legislation was a defeat for the tobacco industry, which is fighting back with a referendum that would repeal the new law, just as this year's Proposition 25, sponsored by the bail bond industry, erased a law that eliminated cash bail for criminal defendants.

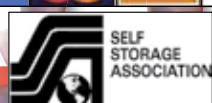

# Temperatures Dip - Cold Weather Tips

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - While winter is still a few weeks away, these weather conditions are definitely giving us a taste of winter-like temperatures for a couple of days this week. It's a great time to review cold weather tips:

**For inside the home:** Check on elderly family members, friends or neighbors. Seniors and those with serious medical conditions are at risk. Check on community members that might be vulnerable to ensure they are safely keeping warm; Heat your home safely - carbon monoxide is a silent killer. It is not OK to heat the inside of your home with any kind of BBQ, propane heater, or any other fuel-fired equipment due to the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. Only

use heaters installed with your home and those designed to be used indoors. Make sure that your natural gas furnaces and other appliances are in good, clean working order; **Bring your pets inside when temperatures start to dip near freezing.** Make sure dogs and cats have a warm, draft-free place indoors with a dry mat or blanket that they can lie on. on and call a plumber. You can defrost your pipes using a hairdryer on a low setting, working your way slowly from the faucet to where your pipe enters the wall. County residents who need to have their water turned off in order to make repairs to their lines can go online or call 311 (or 916-875-4311 if calling from out of the area); **Ensure proper drainage by scooping up leaves and debris.** Keeping storm drains clear can prevent street flooding and black ice from forming;

**On the road:** When raining, reduce your vehicle speed. Wet roads increase the distance and time needed to stop your vehicle. Be extra cautious on roads, bridges and overpasses when temperatures are 32 degrees or below due to black ice - slow down and give

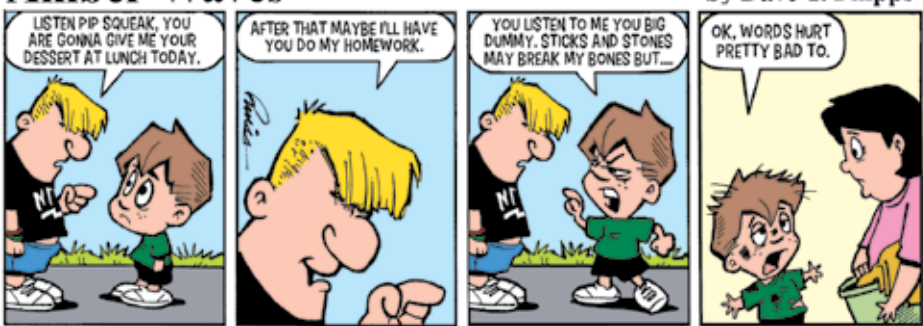

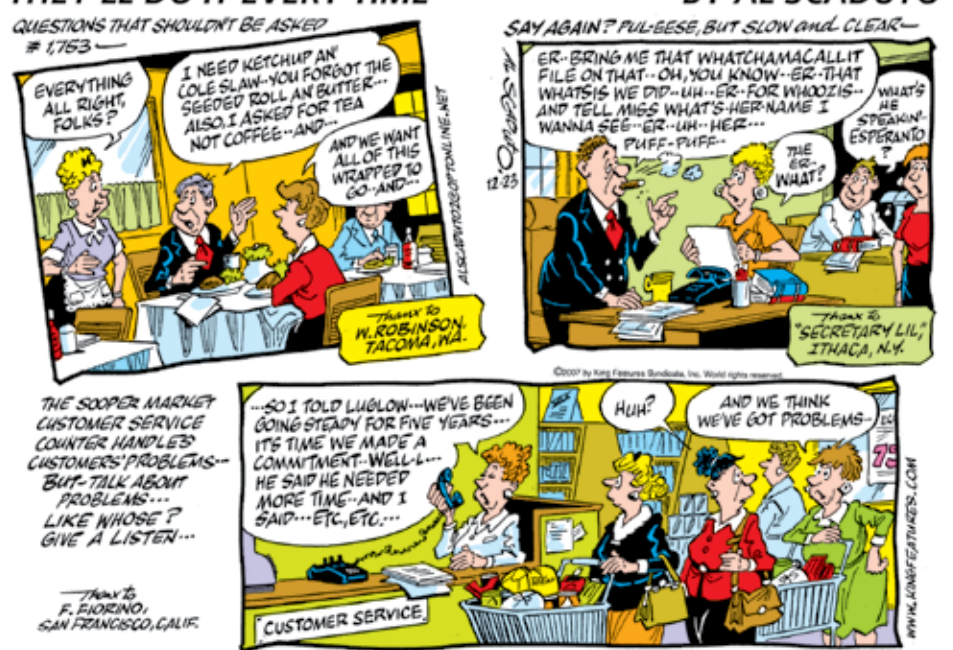

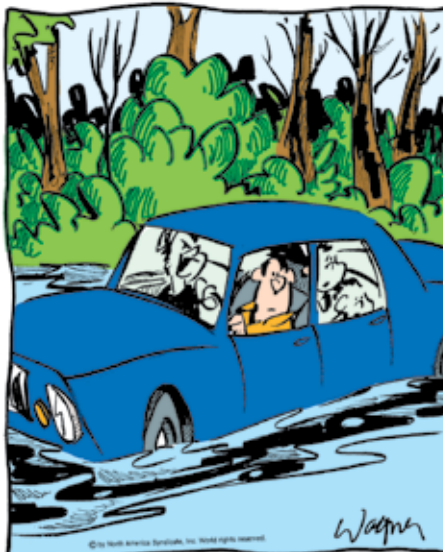
