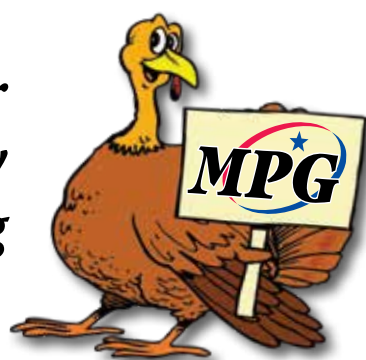

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Sacramentan Riley Stair's 1970 Pontiac Trans Am won the Saturday, November 14th Hot Wheels Legends Tour finale and it will now be made into a Hot Wheels diecast car to be sold worldwide. Stair competed against 8 other tour stop winners (and a Mobil One Fan Favorite winner, and 4 foreign winners) for the right to have his Pontiac immortalized at Jay Leno's Garage in Burbank, California.

His car was voted the top car by

four of the six judges, including Snoop Dogg and Hot Wheels Senior Design Manager, Brian Benedict. It wasn't something that the humble Stair saw happening, but he said excitedly "It feels great!"

"To be honest, I didn't think I would win," said Stair. "I was reserved to the fact that to get to that point was all that I needed. I'm ecstatic that my nephew is going to be able to play with a copy of the car I built."

Stair got the car bug from his father. "Growing up, I just gravitated to it," said Stair. "Because of my Dad, I was always around cool older cars."

So why did a 20-something decide to go with an older car? "It was what I knew," he said. "It's from a time period when cars were more pure and honest."

He bought the car in Chico from a Craigslist ad, and it had been sitting, not running for 8-10 years. Challenge accepted, "I picked out the car and started out to build something start to finish, and really pushed myself and my skills. I really tested myself with this car."

## Providing Shelter and Much More

From Sacramento County

There's no simple solution; homelessness is a complex issue. Every individual is different and needs their own unique approach.

Through its initiatives and its array of services, Sacramento County is finding more ways to help those who need a place to live as well as to break the cycle of chronic homelessness.

"People are not just being sheltered," explains Cindy Cavanaugh, Sacramento County's Director of Homeless Initiatives. "They're moving towards ending their homelessness."

During these unprecedented times, Sacramento County is working hard to help people experiencing homelessness. COVID-19 adds another layer of complexity.

"COVID has been a challenge, but we were able to respond on a county-wide basis," Cavanaugh says. "Working with our partners, we added nearly 600 shelter units for those most at risk, provided necessary supplies and sanitation to those living outside, and did proactive testing as well. We are now working on services and rehousing those we've brought inside."

Before the pandemic, Sacramento County already was experiencing an uptick in homelessness. According to the 2019 Sacramento City/County Continuum of Care Point-in-Time Count, an estimated 5,570 people are experiencing homelessness in Sacramento County on any given night – a 19% increase since 2017.

About 70% are unsheltered. Of those 5,570 individuals, 12% are children and 8% are transitional-aged youth, ages 18 to 24. While the county has seen an increase in homelessness overall, the number of people experiencing chronic homelessness decreased, including a 7% drop of those unsheltered. According to the study, about 36 out of every 10,000 Sacramento County residents are experiencing homelessness.

Many of the existing County services and efforts aimed at combating homelessness are not visible or well understood – particularly to those not using them.

"The system of homeless services and support has very few designated points of entry. Navigating the system can be challenging," says Homeless Services Program Manager Julie Field in the County's Department of Human Assistance. "We have worked to streamline the 'front door' and minimize

## Great Wall of Susan Completed at Ancil Hoffman Park

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - A decorative fence has replaced almost a mile of battered chain-link in Ancil Hoffman Park. An eyesore to many visitors, the old barrier separated the park golf course from Tarshes Drive for decades.

Susan Peters – who ends her 16 year tenure as County Supervisor next month – commissioned new construction as one of her final beautification projects for District 3. Totalling nearly \$146,000, the cost was funded partly by the Regional Parks Golf fund but mostly by a discretionary allowance that enables Supervisors to assist chosen projects. "I've been wanting to get this done for 30 years," Peters said. "To me, it's a great enhancement. The fence style doesn't stand out like it's new; it looks like it belongs in this beautiful park."

Already dubbed "The Great Wall of Susan" the barrier is six feet high for much of its 4000 foot length. Remaining portions are two feet lower, allowing comfortable leaps for

deer migrating from the golf course to the Effie Yeaw Nature Preserve. "The movement of animals was an important design consideration," explained Regional Parks Director Liz Bellas. "One of the best things about visiting Ancil Hoffman is seeing wildlife in its natural habitat."

Indeed, the 170-acre reserve (acquired for the American River Parkway in 1960) is famed for critter inhabitants. Barred only from the Main Event restaurant, wild animals enjoy right of way on park roads

and throughout the 18-hole golf course. By night, raccoons and bunnies scurry over tees. Foxes and bobcats prowls the greens. A nonchalant coyote visits so regularly that golfers time their drives to avoid the canine they call "Wiley." River otters come inland for autumn feasting on Carmichael Creek crawfish. Bucks lock antlers on the fairways and in spring, does birth their Bambis in bunkers.

The new fence was designed with a break at San Lorenzo Way. The gap allows deer and turkey

and throughout the 18-hole golf course. By night, raccoons and bunnies scurry over tees. Foxes and bobcats prowls the greens. A nonchalant coyote visits so regularly that golfers time their drives to avoid the canine they call "Wiley." River otters come inland for autumn feasting on Carmichael Creek crawfish. Bucks lock antlers on the fairways and in spring, does birth their Bambis in bunkers.

Even in its 6 ft. segments, the barricade can be cleared by adult deer. To prevent in-flight injuries, upper bars are picket-free. "We've seen some horrific wounds caused by spear-topped fences some residents have built nearby," reports a park hiker. "It's a relief that the County thought about wildlife safety when designing the new barrier."

Ancil Hoffman Park is located at 6700 Tarshes Drive, Carmichael. ★



# How Risky was that Napa Party Gavin Newsom Attended?

Just how risky was the birthday party that Gov. Gavin Newsom attended at a ritzy Napa Valley restaurant?

According to a modeling tool, if held today, there's an 11 to 12% chance – odds of about one in nine – that one of the dinner guests was infected with the coronavirus.

The COVID-19 risk map, developed by Georgia Institute of Technology researchers, has been peer-reviewed and published in the highly esteemed science journal Nature. Using data on infections in each county, it calculates the risk that at least one afflicted attendee will be at an event of various sizes.

Based on current Napa County infections, the model calculates a 12% likelihood that one guest at an event of 10 people would have COVID-19. Using Sacramento County, where many of the guests were from, gives it an 11% chance.

The Nov. 6 dinner attended by at least 12 people was celebrating the birthday of lobbyist Jason Kinney, a close friend of Newsom's, according to the San Francisco Chronicle, which first reported the story Nov. 13. Newsom and his wife joined members of several other households at the event – including two California Medical Association executives – despite his administration urging against private gatherings of more than three households.

Probability aside, many epidemiologists agree that

dining out poses a high risk of infection, given that it places strangers in close proximity for extended periods, often without masks.

Studies appear to bear out the conclusion that the party at Michelin-starred French Laundry in Yountville put its guests at significant risk.

On the date of the party, Napa County reported 32 new cases of COVID-19, 286 active cases, 2,181 confirmed cases, 16 confirmed deaths and 1,879 recoveries. The total has since risen to 2,623 cases.

Newsom publicly

apologized for attending the dinner, saying he should have practiced what he preached. The same day, he announced tight new restrictions to combat a fall surge of the virus, including the closure of most nonessential businesses, restaurants, bars and places of worship. On Thursday, Newsom tacked on a month-long curfew shutting down non-essential work and gatherings from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. for 94% of the state's population.

There is some dispute as to whether the meal took place outdoors – Newsom said



Monday that it was an outdoor restaurant, but photos published Tuesday by Fox LA appear to show a private dining room with at least three walls and a sliding glass door. Napa County was in the “orange” tier of the state's reopening guidelines at the time, meaning some indoor

dining was permitted. Dr. Anthony Fauci, the nation's top infectious disease expert, told MSNBC in September that restaurants should be closed to indoor diners. “When you have restaurants, indoors, in a situation where you have a high degree of infection in

the community, you're not wearing masks, that's a problem,” he said.

In a peer-reviewed study published in Nature this month, Stanford researchers used mobility data to show that a few super-spreader events at points of interest – including restaurants – account for the vast majority of COVID-19 infections. Rather than full-scale lockdowns, the researchers recommend restricting occupancy at those high-risk locations.

Dr. LaMar Hasbrouck, a public health expert and physician, said that models cannot fully reflect an individual's risk because “risk is relative, and cumulative.” Still, he noted the indirect risk to the public posed by the optics of Newsom attending the dinner.

“Optics can really pose an indirect risk, because it can convert or translate into non-adherence,” he said.

Hasbrouck said Newsom should have modeled different behavior by leaving the dinner.

“In any leadership role, certainly if you're touching on public health or you're touching on public policy, you really have to have a higher standard,” he said. “You have to make some of those compromises because you're trying to lead by example.”

confusion for persons trying to change their course."

As the largest provider of social services, Sacramento County offers an array of programs and services aimed at helping individuals and families experiencing homelessness to regain health, income and permanent housing stability. Its sheltering network includes long-established local shelters, dozens of individual homes as well as more than 200 residential units on the Mather campus in Rancho Cordova.

"We've heavily invested in rehousing," Cavanaugh says. "County departments across the spectrum – from public defender to family services, behavioral health to human assistance – are finding new ways to help people leave homelessness more quickly, stabilize and rebuild their lives. This not only serves the individual, but the community at large."

### Homelessness Response

Sacramento County Department of Human Assistance provides a robust multi-departmental response to homelessness from immediate crisis response services to rehousing, and longer-term stabilizing services that help individuals transition to permanent housing stability.

Eduardo Ameneyro, DHA Homeless Services Division Manager says, "Just through DHA alone, we have more than tripled our homelessness budget and have created a foundation of flexible services and programs that can expand as resources are secured. Increased collaboration among local partners ensures we can cast the widest array of services and serve persons who would otherwise not have received services."

CalWORKs Housing Support Program (HSP): Supports CalWORKs recipients experiencing homelessness with obtaining permanent housing.

Includes assistance with move-in costs and limited-term rental subsidies.

Family Homelessness Response and Shelter System: Works to reduce barriers to accessing emergency shelter for families experiencing homelessness by: centralizing registration via an electronic portal; allowing pets; expanding the definition of a family; removing restrictive funding; and removing time limits.

Mather Community Campus: Provides shelter and transitional housing programs for single adults, families with minor dependent children and Former Foster Care Youth including: Shelter for up to 140 single adults; Transitional Housing for up to 25 families; and Transitional Housing for up to 58 Former Foster Youth with 10 additional units provided off-campus.

Flexible Supportive Rehousing Program: Provides intensive case management and permanent housing services to 250 frequent users of County jail and Behavioral Health Services

Flexible Housing Pool: Provides limited-term intensive case management services and housing services for persons and families experiencing homelessness. Participants of this program are referred in through collaboration with county Departments, local cities, the Continuum of Care and Outreach Navigation services.

Homeless Prevention and Intervention Services for Transition Age Youth: Provides prevention, diversion and intervention services for youth aged 18-24 years who are homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness.

Full-Service Rehousing Shelter: Provides shelter, case management and rehousing assistance for up to 115 persons experiencing homelessness, based on referrals.

North A Street Shelter: Provides outreach and shelter services for 80 individuals in the River District.

Return to Residency: A bus ticket is provided for persons newly arriving in Sacramento County, faced with homelessness and no means of support. The destination must be the person's verified place of residency where housing and ongoing support have been confirmed.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Due to COVID restrictions, St. John the Evangelist School's annual craft blow-out -- "A Holiday Show of Hands" -- will continue as a virtual event this year.

# Wine Grape Remains Biggest Cash Crop in Sacramento County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - During her presentation of the 2019 Sacramento County Crop and Livestock Report at the Nov. 17 Board of Supervisors meeting, Agriculture Commissioner, Chris Flores reported that the gross value of all agricultural products in Sacramento County was a little more than \$460 million in 2019. The number represents the gross production value of all agricultural commodities and does not reflect actual profits or losses.

Wine grapes were once again the county's leading cash crop, with a value of \$175 million, even though harvested acreage, tonnage and price per ton were less last year than previous years. Wine grapes alone accounted for 38 percent of total production value of crops and livestock.

Milk remains the second-highest cash value commodity, at \$52.3 million.

The most exported Sacramento County produced crop was pears. Some 5.4 million pounds were exported to 6 countries, including Canada, Ecuador, French Polynesia, Guatemala and Mexico.

The 2019 Crop and Livestock report includes a 50-year lookback of the County's agricultural history. In 1969, the most valuable commodity was cattle and calves. Fruits and nuts comprised only 11.5 percent of all agricultural products grown in Sacramento County 50

years ago. In 2019, fruits and nuts made up nearly half of the county's bounty, at 46.2%.

Every year, the value of specific commodities rises or falls based on weather, supply and demand, and market forces. In 2019, almonds, sweet corn and honey/pollination services (among other crops) experienced increases, while aquaculture, cattle and calves, and cherries (among others) experienced downturns. Cherries alone lost more than \$6 million in value because of damage caused by late spring rainstorms.

The 2019 Crop and Livestock report can be found in Sacramento County libraries and on the Sacramento County Agricultural Commissioner's website.

Top 10 Agricultural Commodities in 2019: Wine grape, milk, nursery stock, poultry, pears, aquaculture (fish, crustaceans, mollusks and aquatic plants), cattle and calves, hay (alfalfa), rice, and field corn (corn grown to feed livestock). ★

## Ask Toni

### Medicare Rule ... No One Remembers!

Dear Toni,

Just a quick note to say that my mother had to go into the hospital this week. Has the flu, a urinary tract infection and pneumonia. She had slipped and

bumped her head, but no concussion. Very weak, so we are asking that she be placed into rehab/skilled nursing to build her strength backup.

She changed from her company retirement Medicare Advantage PPO plan this summer to her new Medicare Supplement Plan G. I know that the Medicare Supplement pays if Original Medicare pays.

I cannot remember specifics about a Medicare rule you wrote regarding skilled nursing. I know the inpatient/outpatient rules have changed. Please explain what her options can be? Do not want my mother to pay more than she must.

Hi, Tom:

The Medicare rule is explained in the Medicare & You handbook titled, "Am I an inpatient or outpatient?" Learn how a hospital stay does not always mean you are an inpatient and may have to pay more or all your skilled nursing facility care.

This Medicare Outpatient Observation Notice (MOON) went into effect a few years ago and applies to those with an Original Medicare hospital stay. It does not apply to those with Medicare Advantage plans. Medicare Advantage plans have different rules regarding rehab/skilled nursing stays.

The MOON rule is explained with more detail in the Medicare & You handbook and most who are enrolled in Original Medicare may have missed this information. The handbook states .... "Staying overnight in a hospital doesn't always mean you're an inpatient. You only become an inpatient when a hospital formally admits you as an inpatient, after a doctor orders it. You're still an outpatient if you haven't been formally admitted as an inpatient, even if you're getting emergency department services, observation services, outpatient surgery, lab tests, or X-rays. You

or a family member should always ask if you're an inpatient or an outpatient each day during your stay, since it affects what you pay and can affect whether you'll qualify for Part A coverage in a skilled nursing facility."

America needs to be aware that a family member who is having a hospital stay is provided the MOON (Medicare Outpatient Observation Notice) in written form that is signed and dated with an oral explanation from the facility no later than 36 hours from the time the Medicare patient begins receiving outpatient observation services. This time limit is considered the new two midnight stay observation policy.

Tom...this means that you should have received the MOON (Medicare Outpatient Observation Notice) within 36 hours that your mother entered the hospital.

Below is what you, your family members or caregivers need to know when having a hospital stay:

1. Remember the MOON rule applies to those on "Original Medicare" and not Medicare Advantage plans, as Medicare Advantage Plans have their own rules and options regarding inpatient/outpatient services.
2. Discuss the hospital procedure with your physician/surgeon regarding whether this will be an inpatient or outpatient stay.
3. Remember you only become an inpatient once the hospital, not your doctor, "formally admits" you or your family member with a doctor's order.
4. You or a family member should ask every day if you or your loved one is an "inpatient or an outpatient."

Not enrolled in a Medicare Prescription Drug Part D plan and the hospital stay falls in "Under Observation" or MOON, you may also have to pay for the drugs administered because the outpatient stay is under Part B which does not cover prescriptions given orally.

## Proposition 13's Defeat a Victory for California's Future

As the media focuses overwhelmingly on the drawn-out presidential election, we shouldn't ignore the defeat of Prop. 13, a massively consequential outcome for Californians. Even in this most liberal state, where sales taxes, income taxes and gas taxes march ever upward, Prop. 13's loss shows that Prop. 13 taxpayer protections remain important, popular, and necessary.

Once again, Prop. 13's deep roots proved tough to tear out. Prop. 13 was the latest of many attempts to dismantle the state's most famous taxpayer reform. Prop. 13 would have eliminated a key business property protection by subjecting these properties to reassessments at least every three years, exposing them to massive tax increases far above the 2-percent cap guaranteed by Prop. 13.

It would have gutted the agricultural industry by requiring reassessments of barns, silos, processing facilities, mature fruit and nut trees, and other property that currently falls under Prop.

13's protections. Small business owners with "triple net" leases, already reeling from COVID, would have faced a wave of property tax increases as they look to rebound.

California's business climate is already terrible – it's earned CEO Magazine's worst place to do business "honor" for a decade straight – and Prop. 13 would have certainly made it worse. But besides avoiding the direct damage Prop. 13 would have inflicted on business, its election day defeat is important for the precedent it continues.

Prop. 13 is the single most important tax law in California and must be defended completely. Voters sent yet another signal that it cannot be weakened. It can't be torn down piece-by-piece. It can't be carved up for special exemptions supposedly aimed only at big business.

Voters know that once Prop. 13 suffers a single chip in its exterior then the entire pillar is primed for collapse. This time it was big (and small) businesses in the crosshairs, but next election cycle it will be homes worth more than \$2 million, then homes worth \$1 million, then assessments every 20 years, then they will be coming after YOUR home. A Prop. 13 patchwork of gradually shrinking exclusions would soon exist only as a memory.

I've spent nearly two decades in public service as a taxpayer advocate and champion of Prop. 13. The law is a savior for over-taxed Californians. It's saved

homeowners and business property owners billions over the past 42 years and provided them with a stable, predictable bill every year, allowing for planning and budgeting and eliminating the tax spikes the led to closed store fronts and seniors losing their homes in the 1970s. Prop. 13's enduring effectiveness is what makes it a constant target.

A check on taxes is also a boon for the economy. Defeating Prop. 13 will keep more than \$11 billion a year out of government slush funds and in the pockets of business owners who can use it to expand, invest, and hire more employees. That is critical as California businesses scramble to stay alive and rebuild out of the pandemic.

To create a vibrant post-COVID economy, we must be partners in prosperity with our private sector. Defeating Prop. 13 stops our tax climate from getting worse and everyone interested in a thriving California economy should celebrate its loss, for now, but be ready to defend Prop. 13 again in 2022.

## Newsom Displays Hypocritical Arrogance

Gov. Gavin Newsom wasn't born to wealth and privilege but as a youngster he was enveloped in it as the surrogate son of billionaire Gordon Getty.

Later, Getty's personal trust fund – managed by Newsom's father – provided initial financing for business ventures that made Newsom wealthy enough to segue into a political career as a protégé of San Francisco's fabled political mastermind, Willie Brown.

Getty and Brown personify San Francisco's unique culture, one that not only tolerates raffish personal behavior but celebrates it, which is why Newsom's political career didn't suffer when, as mayor, he had an affair with his campaign manager's wife. It would have been a career-buster almost anywhere else.

When Newsom became governor two years ago, after a stint as lieutenant governor under Jerry Brown, he brought his bubble of wealth and privilege with him to Sacramento. He and his "first partner," Jennifer Siebel, shunned the state's Victorian governor's mansion that Brown had renovated, moved into a multi-million-dollar home in the suburbs and enrolled their children in a tony private school.

Newsom tries, in his public appearances, to associate himself with the lives of ordinary Californians and talks a lot about closing yawning economic gaps. Nevertheless, he still comes across as someone unbound by the usual conventions.

That attitude became jarringly apparent last week when the San Francisco Chronicle revealed that although Newsom had publicly beseeched Californians to avoid social gatherings to battle COVID-19, he attended a birthday party at the very expensive French Laundry restaurant in Napa for a long-time advisor, lobbyist Jason Kinney.

At first, Newsom's office insisted that no social distancing rules were broken, which might have been technically true. Belatedly, however, Newsom recognized that to Californians who are sacrificing social lives, family contacts and often their jobs to fight the pandemic, it was what political types call "bad optics."

On Monday, he said "I made a bad mistake... I want to apologize to you, because I need to preach and practice, not just preach and not practice... We're all human, we all fall short sometimes."

The French Laundry incident came just days after Newsom revealed that his children were back in classes at their private school while millions of other California kids are confined to homebound classes via the Internet. It's the sort of hypocritical arrogance that drives voters up the wall.

As Kevin Faulconer,

the outgoing mayor of San Diego and a potential Newsom challenger in 2022 tweeted, "His kids can learn in person. But yours can't. He can celebrate birthday parties. But you can't. He can dine on a \$350 meal at one California's fanciest restaurants during the worst recession in generations. But you definitely can't. Can you believe this? I can't."

The incident also earned Newsom a tongue-lashing about "layers of bad judgment" in the Sacramento Bee, a newspaper that shares the governor's liberal political leanings.

"He just handed more ammunition to Republican leaders who have decried the state's emergency shutdowns of restaurants, gyms and churches," the Bee editorial said. "If the governor can eat out with friends – and if his children can attend their expensive school – why must everyone else sacrifice?"

"Two years into his first term, and nine months into the COVID-19 pandemic, Newsom still can't get his act together. If Newsom can't get his head into the game, perhaps he should make this governor thing a one-term affair and leave the job open for someone with a desire to lead."

Consider what Faulconer and the Bee said as the opening salvoes of the 2022 campaign for governor. If Newsom continues to ooze hypocritical privilege, his first term could be his last.

## Property Owners Covering Delayed Rent Payments

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Rob Lapsley, president of the California Business Roundtable, issued the following statement in response to a recent study by the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia that shows an estimated 24,000 renters statewide are behind on their rent, totaling nearly \$1.7 billion in missed rent payments since the pandemic began:

"The Federal Reserve study is clearly defining the economic sacrifices made by private property owners that have allowed renters to stay in their homes, helping to prevent homelessness—all with little to no support from the state or federal government. This new report magnifies the urgent need to provide assistance that gives relief to property owners and tenants affected by COVID-related economic hardships.

"At the same time, the Legislature's short-term eviction protections are expiring early next year. We cannot afford to prolong the crisis for property owners and tenants, especially as the governor toggles counties between COVID-mitigation tiers and its related impacts on the workforce. We look forward to working with the governor and Legislature to jointly address financial support for housing and small business recovery immediately."

The California Business Roundtable was one of the main proponents of AB 1482 (Chiu-Grayson), which enacted a balanced approach to modernizing the state's rental housing laws to increase protections for tenants while also encouraging the construction of new affordable housing. The Roundtable also took a neutral position on AB 3088, the current rental housing eviction freeze set to expire on February 1, 2021. ★

## 2021 Fishing Licenses and Related Items Now Available for Sale

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California anglers can now purchase 2021 fishing licenses and related items directly through the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) website or authorized license agents. (Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, license sales counters at CDFW offices remain temporarily closed to the public.)

The cost of a 2021 annual resident fishing license has been set at \$52.66, while a one-day license will cost \$17.02.

For the first time, anglers have the option to sign up for auto-renewal of their annual sport fishing licenses, report cards and validations.

"More than a million anglers purchase annual licenses to fish California waters and for many of them, this will be a welcome

feature," said Josh Morgan, chief of CDFW's License and Revenue Branch. "Signing up for auto-renewal helps ensure that you won't end up on the water with an expired license."

Anglers must enroll in the auto-renewal program through CDFW's online sales website. License agents cannot enroll customers in the auto-renewal program, but customers who make purchases in person from license agents can go online later and enroll themselves.

Not all CDFW products for sale are eligible for auto-renewal at this time, although the feature will be expanded to other items in the future. For more information and a complete list of items available for auto-renewal, please refer to the Frequently Asked Questions about auto-renewal on CDFW's website.

## Recycling Competition Awards \$140,000 to California Schools

## CHP Focused on Eliminating Distracted Driving

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Distracted driving can be a life-changing choice resulting in crashes and the deaths of thousands of people every year in the United States. Driven to make a difference, the California Highway Patrol (CHP) has implemented a yearlong *Adult Distracted Drivers* grant designed to keep California roads safe through education and enforcement.

CHP officers throughout the state will host in-person presentations and use Web-based or virtual platforms to conduct distracted driving traffic safety presentations. In addition, the CHP will conduct several distracted driving enforcement operations through September 30, 2021.

"Distracted driving continues to be a serious issue on our roadway, and it is entirely avoidable," CHP Commissioner Warren Stanley said. "With the support of this grant, we can implement lifesaving efforts throughout California that will raise awareness and hopefully change

dangerous behavior behind the wheel." Multitasking behind the wheel places extra demands on the driver, which can have tragic consequences.

On average, there are more than 20,000 drivers in California involved in a crash every year where inattention is a factor. "These statistics are likely much higher and are often under-reported to law enforcement since motorists do not always admit to driving distracted," Commissioner Stanley added.

While there are many forms of inattention, cell phones continue to be the main source of diversion. Using a handheld cell phone while driving is not only a violation of the vehicle code, it is also an unsafe activity behind the wheel. Drivers should only use a phone when necessary and in a hands-free mode.

## Be Water-Wise This Winter

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Here are some helpful tips to help you be water-wise this fall and winter.

1) Check the soil moisture level before you run the sprinklers. Research shows that there is a lot of uncertainty about knowing when and how much to water plants. This is especially true as the weather transitions from fall to winter. The weather is still pretty dry, but the days are cooler and shorter, so your yard doesn't need as much water as it did in summer.

The best way to tell if you need to water is by checking the soil moisture level first with a moisture meter, screwdriver or small shovel, before turning on the sprinklers.

2) Start dialing back the run times on your sprinkler system. Remember to turn sprinklers off completely when rain is in the forecast.

3) Upgrade your sprinkler timer by installing a weather-based model.

WaterSense-labeled weather-based sprinkler timers use local weather conditions to precisely time how long a sprinkler runs. Many of them can even be monitored from a smart phone.

4) Add a layer of mulch around plants and trees. Mulch helps moderate soil temperature, reduce evaporation, and even controls weeds.

**Pennsylvania congressman claims state's mail-in ballots are unconstitutional - suit** | 21 Nov 2020 | Congressman Mike Kelly of Pennsylvania, one of President Trump's top House allies, filed a lawsuit Saturday aimed at throwing out 2.6 million mail-in votes in his home state – claiming the state law allowing them is unconstitutional. Meanwhile, Republicans in Michigan are attempting to delay that state's scheduled Monday certification, days after a dramatic battle over the election results in Detroit's Wayne County drew Trump's attention. The Kelly lawsuit seeks to halt the certification of the results of the Nov. 3 election in the Keystone State, The Philadelphia Inquirer reported. Joe Biden's 81,000-vote victory (sic) in Pennsylvania is set to be officially declared on Monday. The case parallels a Friday filing by the Trump campaign itself that asked a federal court to halt statewide certification so that 1.5 million mail-in ballots in seven disputed Pennsylvania counties can be examined for evidence of the fraud and irregularities that Trump insists occurred there.

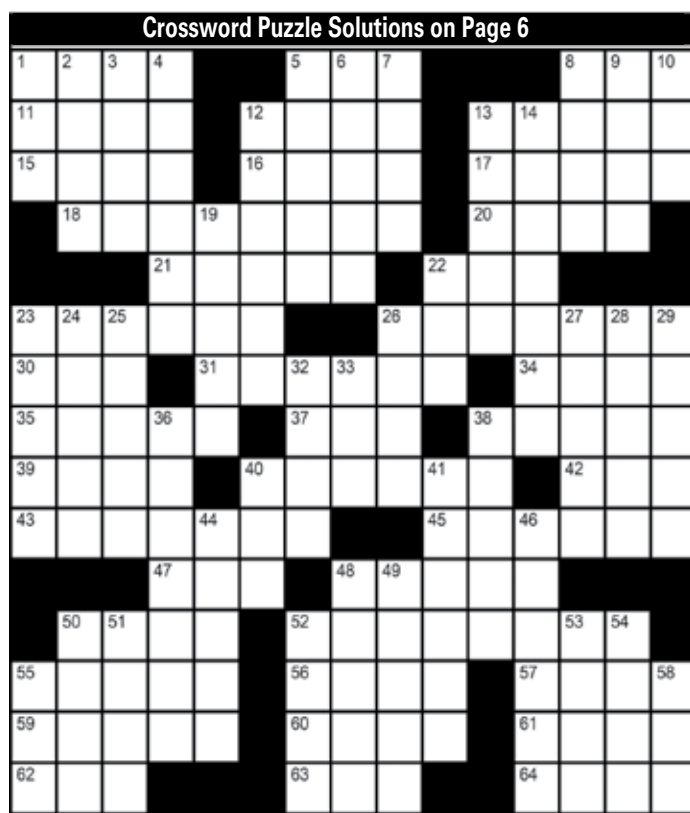

One involved possible votes that were not counted, the other ballots that appeared to be requested by someone other than a registered voter. "I estimate that the number of ballots that were either requested by someone other than the registered Republican or requested and returned but not counted range from 89,397 to 98,801," Miller said in the sworn statement provided to Just the News. ★

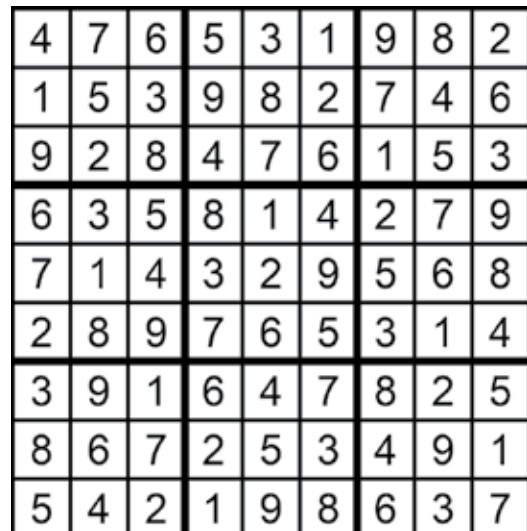

# Let's Talk Meth

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Just like the opioid crisis, methamphetamine (meth) is highly addictive and continues to be a serious issue across the country and for Sacramento County. Through planning and far-reaching collaboration, in May 2019, the Sacramento County Division of Behavioral Health Services, Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services launched the Sacramento County Methamphetamine Coalition to identify and implement community-wide initiatives that help reduce the devastating consequences of meth use, its effects on the person and on the community.

In an effort that will continue the conversation about meth and offer education, resources and support to any person in need, Sacramento County Division of Behavioral Health Services, Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services is excited to announce the launch of the Let's Talk Meth digital outreach campaign.

The Let's Talk Meth website provides information on a variety of treatment programs that matches different needs and connects people with others who have begun a journey of recovery.

"We are so excited to launch the Let's Talk Meth campaign," said Sacramento County Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services Division Manager, Lori Miller. "This resource will be so helpful for those searching for lasting recovery and will connect you to licensed and certified substance use treatment providers in Sacramento County. We know the journey to take back your life and reconnect with friends and family is a hard process but it is possible and you do not have to do it alone."

Getting Substance Use Treatment

Every person has different needs when it comes to substance use treatment. It is important to be referred to the appropriate level of care. Sacramento County offers a full continuum of care based on the American Society of Addiction Medicine to make sure the right treatment is provided.

To qualify for any Sacramento County treatment and recovery program, an assessment is required. This means speaking with a care professional who uses standardized guidelines to ask questions that help

determine the level of treatment you need.

Your care professional will: Help you determine exactly what kind of treatment would best suit your needs; Match you with a treatment service within Sacramento county; Tailor the treatment available to your exact needs; Refer you to other support services, self-help groups and resources

How do I know if I will qualify?

Any person 12 years or older living in Sacramento County who is experiencing substance use problems is eligible and able to receive treatment. You can talk to a care professional about funding eligibility.

Please contact 1-888-881-4881 to request services and for accommodation needs and information on how to request auxiliary aids and services, including provision of materials in alternative formats at no cost. Bilingual/bicultural staff or interpreters will be provided at no cost to participants.

The Meth Coalition is a collaboration of stakeholders and meets quarterly with representatives from public health, law enforcement, and judiciary, education, treatment and prevention agencies, as well as members of the community who have been impacted by meth.

The goals of the Coalition

are: Determine the nature and extent of the meth use on its impact across county systems; Raise awareness and understand the impact of meth use on service systems and the community; Review data from different systems in relation to meth to determine key points of impact; Explore options and opportunities for increased treatment and service capacity; Develop and recommend cross-system, data-driven strategies and response to this problem; Provide updates to the strategic plan.

*About the Sacramento County Methamphetamine Coalition: In 2019-20, the coalition held six meetings to present the Strategic Plan and discuss county and statewide impacts of methamphetamine use on local systems, including Individuals Experiencing Homelessness, Health, Criminal Justice, Law Enforcement and Emergency Response, and Child Welfare. Attendance represented 135 entities from both the public and private sectors! These meetings led to the creation of five different county-led subcommittees: Enforcement, Engaging the Medical Community, Prevention and Treatment, Public Education and Media, and Special Populations. Future coalition meetings will inform and administer action steps in the landmark Sacramento County Methamphetamine Coalition strategic plan. ★*
