Bocce Games Begin

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Through the dedication of a Carmichael woman and her family, two bocce courts will soon be open in Carmichael Park. Sideline benches will carry an engraved wish from the late Shirley Pennington Simi: My famiglia (family) and friends – you were the most important part of my life. Enjoy Bocce!

The \$165,000 project cost was met mainly through Carmichael Park District funding and a \$60,000 contribution from the Carmichael Parks Foundation. But it was a dying wish – and a bequest contained Shirley Pennington Simi's estate – that first got the ball rolling.

A daughter of Tuscan immigrants, Shirley loved all things Italian. She died at the age of 75 in 2018, having long lobbied for the Mediterranean sport to be among Carmichael Park activities. "Mom was a 4 foot 8 inch, 85-pound powerhouse", recalls her daughter, Teri O'Sullivan. "She was so proud of her cultural heritage and bocce

was part of that." Due to Shirley's \$5000 legacy, her passion lives after her. Local bocce enthusiasts should be playing ball before Christmas.

Shirley's daughter and son, Todd Pennington, spearheaded private fundraising to augment their mother's gift. A 2019 celebration at Carmichael's Italian Cultural Center garnered donations with Tuscan food, music and bocce demonstrations by special Olympics athletes.

Court construction began this summer. Slowed slightly by material shortages during the COVID crisis, the new amenity boasts synthetic surfaced lanes that allow all-weather play. Curbing and wide pathways border the courts. Bench seats will allow observer comfort and newly-seeded turf will blend the addition into park landscaping. The facility meets ADA stipulations and is wheelchair accessible. Removal of barriers and a ceremonial "first roll" awaits Sacramento COVID status reaching Orange or Yellow level. "I wish mom could be here for the opening," says her daughter. "I know she'd be clapping her hands and saying bravo, mia

famiglia!"

Many park visitors have voiced support for the project. "People can't wait for us to take down the fences and let them play," reports project manager James Perry. "By public enthusiasm, I judge these courts will be a favorite park amenity."

Although the park Master Plan originally allowed for four courts, funding has so far enabled only two. More will likely follow: "It's like a field of dreams," says James Perry. "You build it and people will come. With the community behind us, there's no limit to what can be achieved in our parks."

Project sponsors include: Carmichael Parks Foundation, the Shirley Simi Memorial Fund, Paul Pennington, Teri O'Sullivan, Todd Pennington, Millicent Lalanne and the Italian Cultural Center. Many Pennington and Simi family friends also made donations.

Carmichael Park is located at 5750 Grant Avenue. The new courts are located near the reserve's North Avenue entrance. Learn more about CRPD amenities at www.carmichaelpark.com ★

His Mission to Sniff Out Pests and Disease

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - To protect against possible crop contamination from the interstate and international shipping of fruits, vegetables and plants, tight controls have been established among trading partners for product inspection and certification. But for those who do not follow the rules, California has K9 detectors on the front-line, and Sacramento County has a new pup on the block.

Like most of the Agricultural Detector K9's in California, "Kemul" was rescued from an animal shelter and given a very important job: to protect the California economy and environment from devastating agricultural pests.

Kemul's handler is Michelle King, who worked hard for the opportunity to become a K9 Handler. After a few years of excellent performance as an Inspector for the Sacramento County Department of Agriculture Pest Exclusion program, she landed this very exclusive role.

King's first task was to attend a 10-week course at the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) National Detector Dog Training Center, where she was matched up with Kernul, who was certified through AKC Canine Partners as a "Canine Good Citizen."

"Kemul had a personality that was very sweet and sensitive, and possessed a very strong drive for treats," said King. "He was a perfect match for me, and together we excelled at everything we were challenged with."

When the team returned to Sacramento at the beginning of November 2019, they began their on-the-job training. Kernul's first few months were spent memorizing the scents of target items such as nursery plants, flowers, bulbs, seeds, roots and a large variety of fruits and vegetables. Michelle worked on strengthened relationships with parcel shipping facilities and strategized the best places to intercept contraband.

The two are now an expert team; one of 13 Agricultural Detector K9 pairs in California. Almost daily, the unit discovers unmarked packages containing non-native pests and diseases, harmful to our environment and agricultural systems. The good news is that Kernul has a nose for this type of work! When he's not working, he likes to snuggle, swim, jog and play ball. ★

Congregation Raffles SUV for Fundraiser

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - With its fall festival cancelled due to COVID regulations, Our Lady of the Rosary Maronite Catholic Church is among many local non-profits forced to think outside the collection box. Home of worship for scores of Middle Eastern Christian families, the church is raffling a 2020 Chevrolet Equinox (value approximately \$28,000). Second prize is \$5000 in cash. Anyone may participate, at \$100 a chance. Sales are limited to 500 tickets and drawing will occur December 19.

An eight-year tradition, the church's October American Lebanese and Middle Eastern Festival,

has been a high point for thousands of supporters. Central to celebrations is the landmark statue of Mary and infant Jesus in Our Lady of the Rosary's street front. Music, dancing and feasting continue during the two-day religious and cultural event, which raises funds for church endeavors and facility maintenance.

The congregation is part of the Maronite movement – named for a Fourth-Century Syrian missionary beautified as Saint Maron. Maron's followers established one of the earliest Middle Eastern Christian Churches. Modern Maronites have more than 80 congregations and many missions in the United States. Composed

mainly of Lebanese immigrants, the Sacramento community bought a former Carmichael wedding chapel in 2011 and began services in English, Arabic and Aramaic. Christian Arabic speaking families from Syria, Palestine, Iraq and Jordan are also part of the community.

"We were sad to cancel our October festival," says church spokesperson Carolyn Aboubechara. "It was our major fundraiser. We've had to come up with something to fill the gap, and we hope the car raffle does that. It will also give some lucky person a wonderful Christmas gift."

A Call to Action

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Playmakers Organization is a local non-profit that serves at-risk kids and kids with developmental differences. Playmakers founder Greg Roeszler (known as Coach Roz) started the organization in 2009 with the goal of using inclusive sports to coach character and leadership, while also providing kids with mentoring and academic support.

Coach Roz mentored Folsom local Jordan Richards—who now plays safety for the Baltimore Ravens—when he played youth football in the region. Richards joined Playmakers to give kids the same opportunities he received. And he introduced Coach Roz to Harrison Phillips—now defensive tackle with the Buffalo Bills—when Phillips was a freshman football player at Stanford in 2015. Phillips and Roz quickly formed a friendship, and Phillips became a Playmaker as well.

Together, Roz and Phillips wrote a book about their journey and their plans to take Playmakers nationwide—Beyond Coaching: Building Character and Leadership.

Coach Roz has previously written two books about the Playmakers method. His first book, Coaching Character and Leadership: A Playbook for Parents, focused on how a single parent can partner with a coach to positively affect their child's behavior and help them develop character. The second book, Coaching for a Bigger Win: A Playbook for Coaches, taught coaches how to expand their influence to be a positive presence in the lives of the kids they coach.

This new book builds on that foundation with the goal of creating a “national fraternity of Playmakers coaches all working under the umbrella of coaching character,” said Roz, who sees the book as a call to action. It's written as an introduction to the coaching clinics they plan to host across the country, with coaches as “the catalyst of a systemic change.” Roz writes: “We could use the most effective laboratory invented (the field of play) to make life changes in our society. We could be treating each other better, respectfully. We could be developing

character-based, empathic, understanding leaders who would put our society in a better place.”

Beyond Coaching also “speaks more directly to helping at-risk kids and kids with developmental differences and the

need to relationally connect to those kids and their families,” said Roz. He explained that 70% of such kids don't have a father in their lives, and “they are more on an island than other kids.” He affirmed that reaching out and supporting kids in need is “inclusive and it's the right thing to do.” If a coach can teach his young athletes about character, compassion, and the importance of service to others, “everybody wins,” said Roz.

It was Phillips' idea that they write the book together to detail their journey and motivate others to join their mission. In the book, Phillips explains that he wanted to write a book “about the amazing things we are learning through the children we work with.”

For Phillips, “the dream is to work with thousands and thousands of children with developmental differences and special needs, bringing them nothing but joy, new experiences, inclusion, friendship, and teaching them to pay it forward.”

Roz explained that “coaches around the country have a voice and platform to communicate character and values at a level far beyond their comprehension.” But in youth sports, Roz sees far too much value put on winning the game: “That's the wrong message. ... The right message is teaching fun of the game, love of the game, and respect for each other.” Coaching character is a “greater and more impactful message,” said Roz.

Phillips writes, “I want to be that supportive, reassuring voice to kids to help spark them to live the life they deserve! The world gets out of the way for people who know where they are going. I want to help them take the first step.”

In the truest sense, the book Roz and Phillips have written is about love—love of football, love for the kids, and the love, admiration, and respect they have for each other. Playmakers is about “teaching them to love the game and love each other,” said Roz, and the goal of the book is to motivate coaches to reinvent their coaching style to show kids how to become not just good athletes, but good people.

Residential Wood Burning Restrictions Start November

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Check Before You Burn starts on Sunday, November 1, and runs through February. During this time, the Sac Metro Air District will restrict or prohibit burning any solid fuel, including wood, pellets or manufactured firelogs, on days when fine particle pollution (PM2.5) is forecast to be high. The law applies to residents and businesses in Sacramento County and the cities of Citrus Heights, Elk Grove, Folsom, Galt, Isleton, Rancho Cordova and Sacramento. These residents and businesses are required to check the daily burn status before using a wood burning fireplace or other wood burning device to make sure it's legal to burn.

Wood burning causes over 50 percent of the winter air pollution in Sacramento County. Fine particle pollution poses a serious health threat, and everyone breathes unhealthy air when weather conditions trap pollution close to the ground. Wood smoke, much like the smoke from the wildfires that have been plaguing California, contains invisible particles that are small enough to enter the bloodstream. It is especially harmful for children, older adults and anyone with a pre-existing heart

or lung condition. Breathing wood smoke increases the risk of asthma, heart attack, stroke and many other health problems.

How to Check Before You Burn: Download the free Sacramento Region Air Quality app. Visit www.AirQuality.org. Follow on Twitter @AQMD. Call 1-877-NO-BURN-5 (1-877-662-8765). Sign up to get a daily Air Alert email at www.SpareTheAir.com - input your Sacramento County zip code and check the "Daily Air Quality Forecast" box.

Exemptions: If wood burning is your sole source of heat, or if you have received an approved financial hardship waiver from the Sac Metro Air District, you may use your wood burning device on Stage 1 or Stage 2 No Burn days. Both the sole source exemption request form and hardship waiver are available at www.AirQuality.org or by calling 1-800-880-9025. Those with EPA-certified fireplace inserts, wood stoves or pellet stoves may use them on Stage 1 days provided the devices do not emit visible smoke.

To file an air quality complaint, visit www.AirQuality.org/Residents/Complaints or call 1-800-880-9025. First time violations will result in a \$50 fine or the option to pass a wood smoke awareness exam. Subsequent violations are higher. ★

If Trump concedes election, Republicans will 'never' elect another president | 08 Nov 2020 | Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-S.C.) warned that President Trump should not concede defeat in the 2020 presidential election in part because Republicans will "never" be able to elect another president from their party again. "If Republicans don't challenge and change the U.S. election system, there will never be another Republican president elected again," Graham said Sunday on Fox News. "President Trump should not concede. We're down to less – 10,000 votes in Georgia. He's going to win North Carolina. We have gone from 93,000 votes to less than 20,000 votes in Arizona, where more – more votes to be counted." Every major news network and The Associated Press on Saturday projected Joe Biden as the winner of the 2020 race for the White House. Trump has said he will not concede, alleging widespread voter fraud led to tens of thousands of illegal ballots being cast against him.

Rep. Doug Collins to lead Trump campaign's Georgia recount effort | 08 Nov 2020 | Georgia Rep. Doug Collins – who just lost his bid for a Senate seat – will lead the Trump campaign's recount effort in the state that was too close to call. The move was announced Sunday night and the recount in The Peach State will begin when "the canvassing has concluded," according to President Trump's campaign. "Republicans stand by the ideal that every eligible voter should be able to vote legally and have it be counted," Collins said in a statement. Collins and the Trump campaign both claimed that ballots were "improperly harvested" in Georgia.

The *New York Times*, CBS News, and ABC News all reported the development Friday afternoon as the Trump campaign continues to wage legal battles in key battleground states over concerns of voter fraud and inadequate observation of ballot counting in the November 3rd election.

Candace Owens targets Facebook 3rd-party fact-checkers with lawsuit | 06 Nov 2020 | Conservative activist Candace Owens said Thursday that she plans to sue Facebook's third-party fact-checkers over perceived censorship of her social media posts. "It is time to fact-check the fact-checkers," Owens said in a video posted to her Twitter account. "I'm going to put these suckers through discovery and figure out what the relationship is that they have with Facebook." Owens gave an example of an instance that she alleged crossed the line. "Quite literally a doctor gave his opinion about COVID-19, which I shared, and Facebook issued a strike on my account because they said only information that they agree with about COVID-19...was acceptable," she said.

Supreme Court Orders Pennsylvania to Separate Late-Arriving Ballots – Alito orders that 'all such ballots, if counted, be counted separately' | 07 Nov 2020 | U.S. Supreme Court Justice Samuel Alito late Friday ordered Pennsylvania election officials to segregate and separately count ballots that arrived after Election Day. Alito granted a request by the state's Republican party to separate mail-in ballots received between 8 p.m. Nov. 3 and 5 p.m. Nov. 6 from those that arrived by 8p.m. Nov. 3, in accordance with state guidance. He ordered that those segregated ballots must be kept "in a secure, safe and sealed container separate from other voted ballots." The justice, however, did not order the counties to stop counting but instead ordered "all such ballots, if counted, be counted separately." Alito also directed any responses to the application by 2 p.m. Nov. 7. The Republican Party of Pennsylvania had filed a request earlier on Friday asking the court for an order to log, segregate, and not take any actions over mail-in ballots received after Election Day.

Two 'Bomb Threats' Force Trump Supporters to Move Locations of Detroit Rally; Detroit Police Arrest Trump Unity Bridge Driver, Falsely Accuse Him of Having Two Outstanding Warrants | 06 Nov 2020 | WalkAway founder Brandon Straka and other local Michigan grassroots groups organized a rally to show their support for President Trump in front of the TCF Center in Detroit, where the process of 'counting' absentee ballots took place for the past 3 days. Shortly after Trump supporters arrived, they were told by Detroit Police that they had to leave because there was a bomb threat at the TCF Center. The group moved to the Detroit City Hall, where they reorganized and began to show their support for President Trump when they were told to move AGAIN because there was another bomb threat... Avid Trump supporter Scott Hagerstrom was with Rob Cortis, when he arrested. Hagerstrom told us that although the police told them there was a bomb threat at Detroit City Hall, none of the workers inside City Hall were being evacuated.

Fixed 'computer glitch' turns losing Republican into a winner in Oakland County | 06 Nov 2020 | (MI) A 'computer error' led election officials in Oakland County to hand an upset victory Wednesday to a Democrat, only to switch the win back to an incumbent Republican a day later. In Oakland County's 15th County Commission District – representing Rochester and Rochester Hills – the initial count gave a 104-vote margin to the Democrat, Melanie Hartman, amounting to a razor-thin majority of 50.08%. That stunned the incumbent, Adam Kochenderfer, giving him a sure sense that he'd lost in a district long deemed a Republican stronghold. "Apparently, there was a technical glitch in Rochester Hills. And so I actually ended up winning by a little over 1,100 votes," said a chuckling Kochenderfer. The margin was 1,127 votes, to be exact. That gave him a 51.67% share of the total (with 48.23% going to his opponent, Hartman).

GOP Claims Software Error Switched 6,000 Republican Votes to Democratic, Used in 47 Michigan Counties | 06 Nov 2020 | Republican National Committee Chairwoman Ronna McDaniel and other GOP officials said the fight over the presidential election isn't over, saying that 47 counties in Michigan may have used software that was detected to have allocated votes to Democrat Joe Biden instead of President Donald Trump in one county. "In Antrim County, ballots were counted for Democrats that were meant for Republicans causing a 6,000-vote swing against our candidates," Michigan GOP Chairwoman Laura Cox said in a news conference Friday. "The county clerk came forward and said tabulating software glitched and caused a miscalculation of the votes." Cox added: "Since then, we have now discovered that 47 counties use this same software in the same capacity. Antrim County had to hand count all of the ballots, and these counties that use this software needs to closely examine their results for similar discrepancies."

New blacklist of 'Trump sycophants' inspired by AOC being compiled | 06 Nov 2020 | At the behest of 'squad' member and New York Congresswoman Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D), a blacklist of "Trump sycophants" – entitled "The Trump Accountability Project" – is archiving the names of individuals who "elected, served, funded, supported, and represented" President Donald Trump. "Is anyone archiving these Trump sycophants for when they try to downplay or deny their complicity in the future? I foresee decent probability of many deleted Tweets, writings, photos in the future," the US representative tweeted Friday afternoon. "Yes, we are," answered former Obama administration staffer Michael Simon, citing the Trump Accountability Project. "Every Administration staffer, campaign staffer, bundler, lawyer who represented them – everyone." On the website's landing page, it urges users that "[w]e must never forget those who helped further the Trump agenda." The site is a self-described "permanent record" of those who elected the president, including Trump campaign staffers, Republican National Committee members, and affiliated PACs in 2016 or 2020.

Nevada Republican Party sends criminal referral to DOJ alleging thousands of cases of voter fraud | 05 Nov 2020 | The Nevada Republican Party announced Thursday evening that it has sent a criminal referral to U.S. Attorney General William Barr with allegations that the state had 3,602 cases of voter fraud. The criminal complaint comes as news outlets have yet to announce a projected winner in the race between President Trump and Democratic nominee Joe Biden, with the Trump campaign and the GOP having already filed multiple unsuccessful legal challenges in the Southwestern state. "Our lawyers just sent a criminal referral to AG Barr regarding at least 3,062 instances of voter fraud," the Nevada Republican Party wrote in a tweet. "We expect that number to grow substantially. Thousands of individuals have been identified who appear to have violated the law by casting ballots after they moved from NV." ★

Defendant Convicted of First-Degree Murder, Attempted Voluntary Manslaughter

CASE: Akeim McFadden
 (Case #20FE003314)
PROSECUTOR: Principal Criminal Attorney Thomas Asker, Homicide Unit

Akeim McFadden was convicted by a jury of the first-degree murder of George Nixon. McFadden was also convicted of attempted voluntary manslaughter and two counts of being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury found true use of firearm and use of a firearm causing death allegations. The Court also found that McFadden has a 2016 prior strike conviction for spousal battery and personally inflicting great bodily injury.

On June 24, 2019, Akeim McFadden shot the victim in the stomach at point blank range over a bicycle in Rancho Cordova. Paramedics transported the victim to UC Davis Medical Center, where he survived his injury. On November 19, 2019, McFadden shot and killed George Nixon while Mr. Nixon was asleep in a tent in the backyard of a Rancho Cordova residence. The District Attorney's Crime Lab matched casings found at the crime scene to casings found at the June 24th crime scene.

McFadden faces a maximum sentence of 98 years and 8 months to life in prison. Sentencing is set for December 11, 2020, at 9:30 a.m. in Department 10 before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle.

Defendant Convicted of First-Degree Murder in Rio Linda Shooting

CASE: Joshua Imber
 (Case #17FE018232)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Timothy Carr, Homicide Unit

The Honorable James Arguelles sentenced Edward Thomas to 11 years and 8 months in state prison. On September 16, 2020, a jury convicted Thomas of two counts of elder abuse with great bodily injury enhancements and two counts of battery causing serious bodily injury.

On November 30, 2019, Edward Thomas attacked his elderly 72-year-old sister and 94-year-old mother. The attack occurred when his sister asked him to keep marijuana smoke from wafting

through the house. Both victims were taken to the UCD Medical Center and treated for significant injuries. One victim suffered a broken nose, fractured orbital bone, scalp hematoma, wounds to her head requiring 20 staples, fractured ribs, fractured fingers on both hands, and multiple human bite marks to her face, arms, hands, and chest. The second victim suffered bleeding between her skull and her scalp, human bite marks to her face and arm, lacerations to her face requiring extensive suturing, and a fractured rib.

Child Sex Offender Convicted of Sexually Assaulting Two Sisters

DATE: November 6, 2020
CASE: Anthony Dougherty
 (Case #18FE000503)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney TeriAnn Grimes, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

Anthony Dougherty was convicted by a jury of two counts of forcible rape and one count of lewd act upon a child with a multiple victim enhancement. The Court found that Dougherty has two prior 2001 strike convictions for lewd and lascivious act upon a child.

The two victims are sisters who were raised by their grandmother. When one of the sisters was 14 years old, she took a job working for Dougherty, who was a family member. When the two were working alone, Dougherty forcibly raped her. Dougherty forcibly raped her again when she was 15 years old. When the victim disclosed the sexual assaults to her sister, her sister confided that Dougherty also tried to "get at her" and put his hand up her shirt. She was able to fight Dougherty off and had not previously told anyone what happened. But, both girls reported the incidents when learning about the other. Dougherty previously molested a different child on multiple occasions in 2001.

Dougherty faces a maximum sentence of 240 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for December 11, 2020, at 10:00 a.m. in Department 10 before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle. ★

What you need to know about accessing DMV services online

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the DMV is prioritizing customer and employee safety and increasing the number of transactions that can be completed without a visit to a DMV field office. The DMV has several channels to better serve customers, including self-service options online or at DMV kiosks, the ability to complete transactions online or over the phone with help from a DMV representative, or via a DMV business partner so that customers can "visit" the DMV by other means. Q: HOW CAN I RENEW MY EXPIRING VEHICLE REGISTRATION?

Most online registration services are self-serve, meaning you can complete them on your own from start to finish. Customers can avoid a trip to a DMV office by visiting dmv.ca.gov and clicking on "Vehicle Registration" at the top of the page.

Additionally, for even greater convenience, DMV customers can visit a DMV Now kiosk to complete their vehicle registration renewal instantly, including printing tags on the spot. With hundreds of locations throughout the state, customers can also use a DMV Now kiosk to submit proof of insurance, receive a driver or vehicle record, and much more. SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol (CHP) congratulates its 77 new officers who were sworn in today during an unprecedented socially distant graduation ceremony at the CHP Academy. The graduating class begins their new career with more hands-on experience than any class in Academy history.

As concerns of the COVID-19 pandemic intensified, the CHP closed its live-in Academy in West Sacramento on March 20, 2020. All cadets were sent home and assigned to work in CHP Area offices located as close to their residences as practicable. Prior to leaving, the seven women and 70 men of Cadet Training Class (CTC) III-19, who started October 21, 2019, had completed 23 weeks of their 29-week training at the Academy.

During the six months spent working in CHP Area offices throughout the state, cadets had an unprecedented opportunity to observe a wide variety of activities and tasks, enhancing their classroom work. On ride-alongs with officers, they experienced a CHP officer's shift in the field and learned firsthand how to complete crash reports and assist the public. They also learned the administrative side of the job - filing reports, answering the phone, and performing general tasks that may be unfamiliar to many officers. On September

14, 2020, all members of CTC III-19 who left in March returned to the Academy for their final weeks of training with enhanced health and safety protocols.

"We are all so proud of this class," CHP Commissioner Warren Stanley said. "These cadets faced the uncertainty of the pandemic with resolve and returned to the Academy energized about their new careers, benefiting from a wealth of real-life experience that no other cadets have had."

At the CHP Academy, cadet training starts with nobility in policing, leadership, professionalism and ethics, and cultural diversity. Training also includes mental illness response and crisis intervention techniques. Cadet instruction covers patrol operations, crash investigation, first aid, and the arrest of suspected violators, including those who drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs. The cadets also receive training in traffic control, report writing, recovery of stolen vehicles, assisting the motoring public, issuing citations, emergency scene management, and knowledge of various codes including the Vehicle Code, Penal Code, and Health and Safety Code.

Upon graduation, the cadets are assigned to CHP Area offices throughout the state.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

How Long will Newsom have One-Man Rule?

California has been a one-party state for the last decade, with Democratic governors and supermajorities in both legislative houses doing pretty much as they pleased without paying any attention to the relative handful of Republican legislators.

However, one-party rule gave way to one-man rule eight months ago when Gov. Gavin Newsom declared an emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic, thus empowering himself to govern by decree and suspend any laws that stood in his way.

Democratic legislators were fully complicit, even suspending their proceedings and abandoning Sacramento for months. Eventually, however, even they chafed a bit at Newsom's seeming endless string of emergency orders.

In effect, some of those orders essentially made new law and while Democratic lawmakers stood by, two Republican legislators, Kevin Kiley and James Gallagher, filed suit, alleging that Newsom had gone too far.

Last week, Sutter County Superior Court Judge Sarah Heckman sided with the Republicans, declaring that Newsom's order changing procedures for the

November election, including a mandate that every voter be sent a mail ballot, crossed the line.

Although the Legislature later ratified the election changes, Heckman wrote that it was still important to place limits on a governor's powers under the California Emergency Services Act. Heckman indicated that in her final ruling, she would permanently enjoin Newsom from issuing any order "which amends, alters, or changes existing statutory law or makes new statutory law or legislative policy."

"The doctrine of the separation of powers prohibits any of the three branches of government exercising the complete power constitutionally vested in another or exercising power in a way which undermines the authority and independence of another," Heckman, who was elected in 2012, wrote.

The law empowering a governor to declare an emergency and suspend laws that impeded a rapid response was clearly aimed at some immediate catastrophe such as a flood, an earthquake or a riot. It envisioned something like then-Gov. Pete Wilson's suspension of contract bidding laws to quickly rebuild a major freeway after the 1994 Northridge Earthquake.

COVID-19 required a rapid response, but it's also something that could last, in one form or another, for years. Conceivably, Newsom could continue governing under his emergency decree for the remainder of his first four-year term.

Even before pandemic struck, Newsom was prone to sidestepping laws that could impede whatever he

might want to do. He boasts, for instance, of ignoring state law when, as mayor of San Francisco, he unilaterally authorized same-sex marriages. More recently, he declared that there would be no executions of murderers during his governorship even though California's death penalty is still law — one that voters refused to repeal just four years ago.

Newsom claims moral imperative as justification for his acts, but if elected officials ignore laws they don't happen to like or find inconvenient, they undermine the concept of governance under law and encourage disrespect for legal authority. Ironically, this is the same governor who demands that 40 million Californians obey his pandemic decrees, such as shutting down small businesses.

Judge Heckman's order will certainly be appealed and the issue will probably wind up in the state Supreme Court. Newsom press secretary Jesse Melgar said Newsom and his advisers "strongly disagree" with "specific limitations" on the governor's emergency authority.

Meanwhile, it's time for the entire Legislature, not just Kiley and Gallagher, to reassert its co-equal authority rather than allowing Newsom to operate indefinitely as a one-man band.

The law that gives Newsom the authority to declare an emergency also allows the Legislature, on its own, to end such an order.

Ask Toni

Group Health Insurance ... Who Pays First with Medicare?



Toni King

Toni,

I am 67 and have group health insurance through my current employer. I have talked with friends, my company HR, and my insurance agent.

I am receiving answers from "I don't know" to "I'm not sure but I think ...". My company health insurance has a \$2,500 deductible. If I have a medical claim and I have Medicare Part A and my employer medical insurance, who will pay the claim first and how much will I have to pay? Also, should I have enrolled in Medicare Part B since I am still working?

I have just started following your Medicare column in our local paper and am finding you are answering problems, I never knew I could have. Thank You so much. ~ Roxanne, New Orleans

Roxanne,

Let's start with discussing enrolling in Medicare Part B when working with an employer group health plan. On page 22 of the 2018 Medicare & You handbook, it discusses "Should I Get Part B" with employer or union coverage and states... "If you or your spouse is still working, and you have health coverage through that employer or union, contact your employer or union benefits administrator to find out how your coverage works with Medicare ... It might be to your advantage to delay Part B enrollment."

To answer about enrolling in Medicare Part B, it is optional because when you leave your or your spouse's employer group health plan, then you can enroll in Medicare Part B with a Special Enrollment Period.

Now let's talk about who will pay your claim first and this depends on how many employees are on your company's group health plan:

1. **Your employer has 20 or more employees.** Your group health plan will generally be primary. Should your group health plan not pay all the bill, you may need to ask the health

care provider or your doctor to send the remainder of the bill to Medicare if you are enrolled in Medicare Parts A and/or B for secondary payment. Should there be any cost your health insurance or Medicare didn't cover, you will have to pay the balance.

Your employer has 20 or more employees. The employer must offer their employees 65 and older the same health benefits, under the same conditions that the company offers employees under 65. If the employer offers coverage to under 65 employees' spouses, the employers must offer over 65 employees' spouses the same coverage.

Medicare will generally pay second if the following applies:

- If your employer joins forces with other employers or employer organizations i.e., unions, to sponsor a multi-employer plan (group health plan). Sometimes employers with less than 100 employees will band together to form a multi-employer plan. Medicare pays second.

2. **Your employer has less than 20 employees.** Medicare pays first.

3. **You and Retiree Insurance** (insurance from your or your spouse's former employer): Medicare pays first.

Always verify with your Human Resources if the Insurance Company will pay first when the employees or employees' spouses are over 65 and on company health benefits. One thing to know is that if you should go outside your employer's network, it is possible that neither the company's plan nor Medicare will pay.

River City Food Bank executive director Amanda McCarthy said, "the partnership here with the Episcopal Diocese has been really ideal since this area is practically a grocery store desert... and we make sure that at least 50 percent of what we provide is fresh produce." She said residents, and especially refugees, without means for transportation, greatly benefit from the food bank's presence there.

Mike Wiley board of director and past president of River City Food Bank said they are very honored to receive the California Legislature Assembly Certificate of Recognition from the 8th District Assemblyman. "This is the first time since its founding in 1968 that we have received the Nonprofit of the Year recognition," he said.

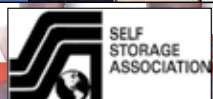

Now Available: IRS Form 1040-X

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - Marking a major milestone in tax administration, the Internal Revenue Service announced that taxpayers can now submit Form 1040-X electronically with commercial tax-filing software.

As IRS e-filing has grown during the past 30 years, the 1040-X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return, has been one of the last major individual tax forms that needed to be paper filed. The announcement follows years of effort by the IRS, and the enhancement allows taxpayers to quickly electronically correct previously filed tax returns while minimizing errors.

"The ability to file the Form 1040-X electronically has been an important long-term goal of the IRS e-file

initiative for many years," said Sunita Lough, IRS Deputy Commissioner for Services and Enforcement. "Given the details needed on the form, there have been numerous challenges to add this form to the e-file family. Our IT and business operation teams worked hard with the nation's tax industry to make this change possible. This is another success for IRS modernization efforts. The addition helps taxpayers have a quicker, easier way to file amended returns, and it streamlines work for the IRS and the entire tax community."

Making the 1040-X an electronically filed form has been a goal for the tax software and tax professional industry for years. It's been a continuing recommendation from the Internal Revenue Service Advisory Council (IRSAC) and Electronic Tax Administration Advisory

Committee (ETAAC).

Currently, taxpayers must mail a completed Form 1040-X to the IRS for processing. The new electronic option allows the IRS to receive amended returns faster while minimizing errors normally associated with manually completing the form.

"Adding the 1040-X to the e-filing portfolio provides a better experience for the taxpayer, all around. It makes submitting an amended return easier and it allows our employees to process it in a more efficient way," said Ken Corbin, the IRS Wage and Investment commissioner and head of the division responsible for processing these returns.

For the initial phase, only tax year 2019 Forms 1040 and 1040-SR returns can be amended electronically. Additional improvements are planned for the future. ★

\$1 Million in Grants Available for Area Nonprofits

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The County Board of Supervisors will provide \$1 million through the 2020 TOT Grant Program to support nonprofit organizations located in Sacramento County that carry out community-based programs and/or services in the areas of economic and workforce development, arts and culture, community development, or health and human services. The County began setting aside funding for this purpose in 2017.

Grants will be allocated through a competitive process and applicants must meet eligibility and funding requirements. Applications will be accepted online beginning Nov. 6 through the County's Office of Budget and Debt Management with a deadline of Dec. 7, 2020.

Funding for the TOT Grant Program will come from County Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) revenues. Transient Occupancy Taxes are levied on guests who occupy rooms in hotels, motels and other temporary lodging accommodations in the unincorporated area of the County.

TOT Grant Program Application Dates & Details: Deadline – December 7, 2020, 5 p.m. Grant Application Period: November 6 – December 7, 2020. All applications and documentation requested in the announcement must be submitted by 5 p.m. on December 7, 2020. Online Applications Only: All applications are only accepted electronically, apply online beginning November 6, duplicated and incomplete applications will be disqualified, applicants will receive electronic

receipt notification upon submission.

Grant Program and Application Virtual Workshop: Nov. 9, 2020. The workshop includes a review of the following:

- grant program and review process, application including what the Evaluation Panel looks for, timeline and submission information, and frequently asked questions.

- Grant Application Review Period: Nov. 6 – Dec. 7, 2020: County staff will review applications for completeness and compliance with minimum eligibility requirements. Applicants will be notified electronically if proposals do not meet the minimum qualifications and moved to the evaluation process. January/February 2021: Subject Area Expert Panel Application Review: Subject area experts will review, evaluate, and rank qualifying applications.

- Grantee Award Approval: March 2021. Grant Program Hearing Notification: Applicants will receive a second electronic notification of schedule for the Board of Supervisors Hearing where recommended award selections will be made.

The Board of Supervisors will make the final determination and approval for all TOT Grant Program recipients.

Budget & Debt Management will notify applicants of funding selections within 5 business days of Board Hearing approval. All notifications will be made electronically.

Budget & Debt Management will draft and administer agreements between the County and grantees.

Finding the Founder, History Talk Available Online

Special for Carmichael Times

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - A talk highlighting recently-discovered photographs of colony founder Daniel Webster Carmichael may now be viewed online by history buffs. In her capacity as a volunteer community historian, Carmichael Times photojournalist Susan Maxwell Skinner recently presented a Webinar program for the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce. More than 650 people have watched the feature from their homes. Skinner – who found the “new” material in Minden, Nevada – added a commentary on Dan Carmichael's life and times to her presentation. Highlights include images of the entrepreneur/civic leader at leisure in his Sacramento homes.

The Chamber has made the talk available through a Facebook link. “Little was previously known about Daniel's private life,” explains the presenter. “In his day, the guy was a larger-than-life Sacramento personality. He came west from Georgia as a teenager, with barely a dollar. His good looks and Georgian charm opened doors. Before long, “Bud” Carmichael was a public official, a millionaire oilman and Sacramento benefactor. Newspaper cartoonists portrayed him as a glamorous figure strolling downtown with a rosebud in his lapel. Daniel's story is a Victorian romance of rags-to-riches -- then back to rags again.”

Maxwell Skinner discovered the photos in possession of Sally Rubio, the great niece of Carmichael's wife Myrtle. The historian declared her long journey to Minden worth every mile. “I was able to photograph and carefully restore many wonderful old pictures to viewable condition,” she says. “Despite his high profile, Daniel remains a man of mystery to modern Carmichaelites. We knew he'd discovered oil near Bakersfield and made a fortune. He developed residential city neighborhoods and did million-dollar property deals in the Bay Area and Sacramento. He founded the Sacramento Chamber of Commerce and the city's first professional real estate organization. Daniel modestly gave his name to the colony he carved out from land near the American River.

“He was elected Sacramento Commissioner and served as the city's mayor. He flashed a gold-topped cane and gold watch and his advertising gimmicks were legendary. He built two gorgeous homes and his wife dripped diamonds. But his disappearance from society before the great Depression -- and the penurious circumstances of his final years -- were largely unexplained.”

Maxwell Skinner's talk answers some of the mysteries. The old family photographs also show how a turn-of-the-century celebrity lived. “We see a happy Bud Carmichael in his homes and gardens, cavorting with friends and family,” says the speaker. “These snapshots show the man behind the boutonniere. They are also captivating vignettes of posh early Sacramento.”
