Healing Conversation

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - With racial tensions dominating much of the news, the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce last week sponsored an on-screen town hall intended as a “Healing conversation.” The event offered the mike to women who discussed the challenges of being African American moms and business professionals in predominantly white communities.

The featured speaker for the event

was Dr. Felicia Haecker, a decorated US Air Force veteran of three Middle East deployments. The Carmichael resident is now CEO of Dog Tag Divas, an organization that supports women veterans. She is also a professor at Brandman University, (Roseville) where she teaches Organizational Leadership.

“Ten days from now, the inequities of our US system won’t be solved,” Haecker told an on-line audience of more than 5000. “But because we’re here tonight with the intention to listening might mean we’ll see change

ten years from now. Change could all start with the conversation we’re having tonight.”

Haecker is married to a Federal investigator who is Austrian-Italian. Their bi-racial children attend St John the Evangelist Catholic School in Carmichael. She said she and fellow speakers were not taking part in the town hall to benefit themselves. “We’re here for our children,” she said. “And for all children – so the futures they all deserve will be a reality.”

Haecker has experienced racism

Licenses for Drivers 70 and Older are Extended

California Department of Motor Vehicles

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Motor Vehicles is providing an automatic one-year extension to Californians age 70 and older with a noncommercial driver license with an expiration date between March 1 and December 31, 2020. This action delays the requirement for this population to visit a DMV office during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The DMV previously provided 120-day extensions to senior drivers with noncommercial licenses expiring in March through July. While the new extensions are automatic, drivers will not receive a new card or paper extension in the mail. As an option, drivers can request a free temporary paper extension online beginning July 15 through DMV’s Virtual Field Office to document the extension, though it is not needed to drive. Californians with a suspended license are not eligible.

California law requires drivers age 70 and older to visit a DMV field office to renew their license but give the DMV authority to issue extensions. The DMV has alerted California law enforcement of the extensions. The TSA accepts driver licenses for a year after the expiration date.

Commercial licenses, including those for drivers 70 and older, expiring between March and September are extended through September 30, 2020, to align with federal guidelines.

The one-year extension for senior drivers is the latest action to help Californians avoid or delay a DMV office visit during the COVID-19 pandemic. The DMV has issued extensions for expiring driver licenses and permits, expanded eligibility to renew a driver license or identification card online or by mail, and created new digital options for transactions that previously required an in-person office visit. The DMV continues to streamline its processes to limit the time customers spend at an office. Customers are encouraged to fill out the online application and upload their documents before they come to the office. The DMV is also contemplating other ways to safely serve seniors.

Summary of California Driver License extensions:

Age 70 & older (noncommercial) expiring between March-December of 2020 – Extended one year from original expiration date; Age 69 & younger (noncommercial) expiring March – July 2020 – Extended until July 31, 2021 (renew online or by mail); Commercial (all ages) expiring

Jewish Food Fest Goes Drive-by

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The 43rd annual food festival at Carmichael’s Congregation Beth Shalom promises fine Jewish cooking on Sunday, August 30. Due to COVID restrictions, all food must this year be preordered and taken away.

“These are non-traditional times,” says festival organizer Lydia Inghram. “We didn’t want to cancel our fundraiser. So we’re offering traditional delicacies for safe pickup. We hope loyal customers will support this format. Our volunteers will wear masks and gloves as they bring food to cars. Customers should wear masks, too.”

Food must be pre-ordered on line by August 20. Menu options appear at www.cbshalom.org

Classic lox and bagels – served with cream cheese and capers – is an all-time event favorite. Packaged deals include corned beef and pastrami sandwiches. Meats, chopped liver and herring may be purchased for home meal preparation. Matzo ball soup, stuffed cabbage rolls and

chopped liver are available in frozen packages. An Israeli salad medley is a vegan option. Strudel, baklava, coffee cakes and babka are among desserts. Bakery offerings include specialty breads.

While much of the menu is prepared locally, other options are shipped from famous Jewish delis in Oakland and Brooklyn. Gourmet kosher pickles come from the Sonoma Brinery. August 30

pick-ups will start at 9 am and continue till 3pm.

The event’s popular craft-vending, music and kids’ games are on hold this year. “We hope we can bring all our festivities back in 2021,” says Lydia Inghram. “For 2020, it’s all about the food and being safe.”

Caring for Pets During Hot Weather

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Every year, Sacramento County residents do their best to keep cool during the summer heat. Failing to keep cool in extreme temperatures can cause adverse health effects for residents—both human and animal.

Unlike humans, cats and dogs cannot sweat to keep cool; they cool their bodies off through panting and the pads of their feet. As a pet owner, it's important to take measures to keep them cool during the high temperatures.

Here are some tips for keeping your pet safe from the heat:

Never leave your pet in a parked car: Even cracking a window won't protect your pets. It is against the law in California and could be punishable by a fine or imprisonment. A car can reach 120 degrees in just minutes; even if the windows are slightly open the car can still reach 102 degrees. A dog's normal temperature is 101.5 degrees; at 120 degrees your pet can suffer from heat exhaustion and die and at 107 degrees brain damage occurs. Check out this video on how hot it gets in cars;

Avoid extreme heat: When temperatures get above the 90s, take your pet inside. For outdoor pets, be sure to provide them with plenty of fresh, cold water in a tip-proof water dish and shade for them to cool down;

Don't exercise with your pets when it is too hot: Older and certain long-haired dogs can be particularly susceptible to heat, and hot asphalt can burn their paws. Exercise in

the early morning or cool evenings and make sure both of you have plenty of water.

Use sunscreen: Pets get sunburned just like people, and if your pet has light skin or fur, they can be particularly susceptible to a painful burn, and even skin cancer. Use sunscreen on sensitive areas, such as ears or nose to make sure your pets are protected.

Secure your dog during transport: Make sure your dog is secured safely in your vehicle. Cross-tethering your dog with a rope or containing them via kennel in the bed of your truck will help prevent the dog from falling or jumping from the vehicle. Also, please note that truck beds can get hot when exposed to the sun and that can severely burn dog footpads. Transporting animals on a public highway or public roadway without properly securing them could be punishable by a fine.

Be your pet's lifeguard: While swimming can help pets get exercise without overheating, always supervise pets when swimming either in a pool or in waterways. Dogs can get tired swimming, particularly in rivers where they have to fight against currents. To avoid drowning, make sure they wear life jackets and keep them out of the water when flows are high.

If pets have been exposed to high temperatures ... Be alert for signs of heat stress including heavy panting, glazed eyes, a rapid pulse, unsteadiness, staggering gait, vomiting, or a deep red or purple tongue.

Immediately move your pet to the shade to gradually lower their temperature. Apply cool (not cold) water to the pet, and provide lukewarm or cool water to drink. Take your pet to a veterinary hospital immediately. It could save their life.

Bera-Led SAFE Act Passes House Foreign Affairs Committee

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - The House Foreign Affairs Committee passed Congressman Ami Bera's (D-CA) Securing America From Epidemics (SAFE) Act, which would authorize U.S. participation in the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI), a public-private partnership developing vaccines for coronavirus and other highly infectious pathogens.

"I'm honored that the

House Foreign Affairs Committee passed the SAFE Act. It is critically important that we join international efforts to defeat COVID-19," said Rep. Bera, Chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Subcommittee on Asia, the Pacific, and Nonproliferation. "The Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations is helping to lead those efforts by funding several vaccine candidates. I believe in American ingenuity but we need to take a portfolio approach to vaccine development. There's no guarantee that a U.S. backed vaccine will be developed first and or be effective for all Americans. By joining CEPI, we will help ensure that we have access to vaccines the international community is developing. We also know that until this virus is defeated around the world, we will

not be safe here at home. Our world and our economies are simply too interconnected."

The SAFE Act was also included in Health and Economic Recovery Omnibus Emergency Solutions (HEROES) Act, which passed the House of Representatives in May 2020.

Rep. Bera has been a leader in Congress on global health security and the COVID-19 pandemic. He chaired the first congressional hearing on the coronavirus on February 5th, sounded the alarm after the Trump Administration disbanded the global health security office in the National Security Council in 2018, and is a member on the CSIS Commission on Strengthening America's Health Security, which in November 2019 made a series of recommendations to prevent pandemics. ★

Mysterious Unsolicited Seed Shipments from China

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Recently, the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) has become aware of a number of reports regarding "mysterious and unsolicited seeds from China and other parts of Asia." The seed packages, often labeled as jewelry, toys, etc., are being shipped to homeowners throughout the U.S., including Sacramento County. The CDFA is communicating with the United States Department of Agriculture to determine any necessary actions for shipments received in California. In the meantime, the Department of Agriculture is instructing residents not to open, plant, or dispose of any unsolicited seed packets received, but to contact the office.

"It is unlawful for any person to ship, deliver, transport, or sell any agricultural or vegetable seed within this state that is not in compliance with the California Seed Law. Our seed law protects the environment and the agricultural industry in California from

seeds that may be contaminated by pests or diseases. Taking steps to prevent their introduction is the most effective method of reducing the risk of invasive species infestations," said Chris Flores, Sacramento County Agricultural Commissioner.

We encourage recipients of these seeds to contact the office at 916-875-6603 for arrangements to collect, isolate and properly store the seed. Those who have planted the seeds should contact the department for additional direction.

March - September 2020 - Extended to September 30, 2020; Learners permits expiring March-August 2020 - Extending six months or to a date 24 months from the date of application.

DMV field office employees are assisting customers with appointments at the specific office or with limited transactions that require an in-person visit. Last month, offices began offering additional services, including vehicle

inspections and behind-the-wheel drive tests. The DMV continues to recommend that customers use its online services, expanded virtual services and other service channels to complete transactions, including eligible driver license and vehicle registration renewals. Customers can use the Service Advisor on the DMV website to learn their options to complete DMV tasks. Visit WWW.DMV.CA.GOV for more info. ★

in Carmichael. When the law officer's wife was accused by a stranger (in a supermarket parking lot) of being anti-police, she calmly pointed out her car's pro-police sticker and wished her accuser a nice day. But she was recently brought to tears by kindness. "I was running one morning and a woman came out of her house and told me: 'I see you, and you matter to me.' I broke down. It was

a small action but it meant the world to me. We all need to start seeing each other for what we really are. The USA is a beautiful tapestry made up from all these beautiful cultural threads. If we don't acknowledge them all, we're missing the point. If we learn about one another, we can appreciate and move forward together."

"I am hoping Carmichael can be a beacon," she said. "We can

show the rest of the nation what's possible through recognizing and reaching out to all members of our community and including everyone in the fold."

Senate Republicans Respond to California Democrats' Economic Stimulus Plan

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Governor's mandated shutdown has left more than six million Californians unemployed and shuttered businesses. Senate Republican Leader Shannon Grove (R-Bakersfield) released the following statement after the Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC) announcing the cancellation of a crucial hearing on August 11, that would have been an opportunity to audit the Employment Development Department (EDD).

Last month, legislative Republicans asked JLAC to audit the EDD after unemployed individuals shared their horror stories about the state agency, including cases of clerical errors that resulted in

Signed by Republican members from both the Assembly and Senate, the letter to JLAC is a bicameral effort to demand answers from EDD.

Most are completely stressed out because they know that one wrong move can jeopardize their 401K that they worked so hard for and is all they have left for their retirement days.

Below are a few facts explaining what every American should know regarding their Medicare:

1) Enroll on time: The only way Medicare is automatic for those turning 65 is when one is already receiving their Social Security check. If you are not receiving your Social Security check and not working full time with true company benefits from either you or your

spouse's work, then you will want to enroll in Medicare Parts A and B via online at www.socialsecurity.gov/ medicareonly. Those working full-time with true company benefits or are covered under their spouse's benefits may want to delay enrolling in Medicare Parts A and B until they finally retire or happen to be laid off from their current employment.

2) Different Parts to Medicare...Parts A, B, C & D: Medicare Parts A and B cover hospital, medical and provider expenses. SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The state's leading small-business association minced no words in slamming Gov. Gavin Newsom's announcement that he would not use his authority to suspend a scheduled Jan. 1, 2021 increase in the state's minimum-wage rate.

"It has to be asked if the governor even cares about small business," said John Kabateck, California state director for NFIB. "Small businesses in California are dying, so what is the Golden State doing to stanch the flow of the carnage? It hits them with increased costs in paid family leave programs, increased workers' compensation premiums via rebuttable presumption, zero fixes to a deeply flawed independent contractor law, and now a scheduled increase in minimum wages. "It's as if they are expecting the COVID-19 crisis to vanish tomorrow," he said. "As someone whose job it is to support the opening and sustaining of small businesses, I never thought I'd be advising small-business owners to do neither. You don't have your state government in your corner."

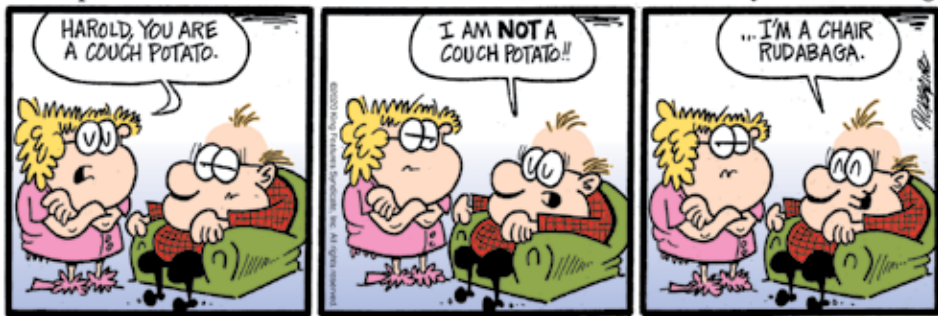

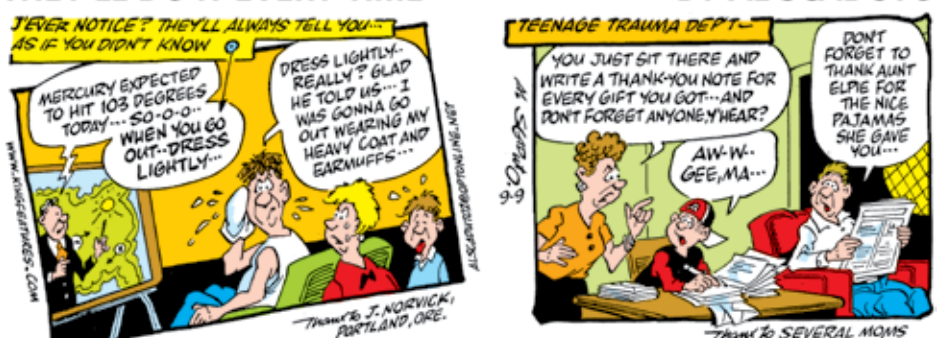

Game Plots Cruel Vengeance in *The Last of Us Part 2*

A friend and I watched the recent extended gameplay trailer of *The Last of Us Part 2*, a post-apocalyptic tale of a young girl's revenge and follow-up to the jaw-droppingly brilliant *The Last of Us*. Ellie, the game's 19-year-old protagonist, was attempting to sneak through a hostile camp when she came across an enemy blocking her path. She whipped out a silenced pistol and landed a perfect shot on the enemy's head, an action we've seen millions of times before in every adventure game under the sun. But this time, we saw something we never had: a nearby enemy, on seeing her comrade suddenly crumple, screams "Charlotte!"

"They have names" was our shocked take-away. We would soon learn that this wasn't a one-off moment. Enemies crying out in pain, mourning their companions in the midst of battle, even attack dogs whimpering at the corpses of their masters, is all standard fare for *The Last of Us Part 2*. It was unpleasantly surprising; as gamers, we're used to seeing the enemies we take down as empty shells of living people. Apart from their grunts, we are never

supposed to acknowledge that our targets feel pain.

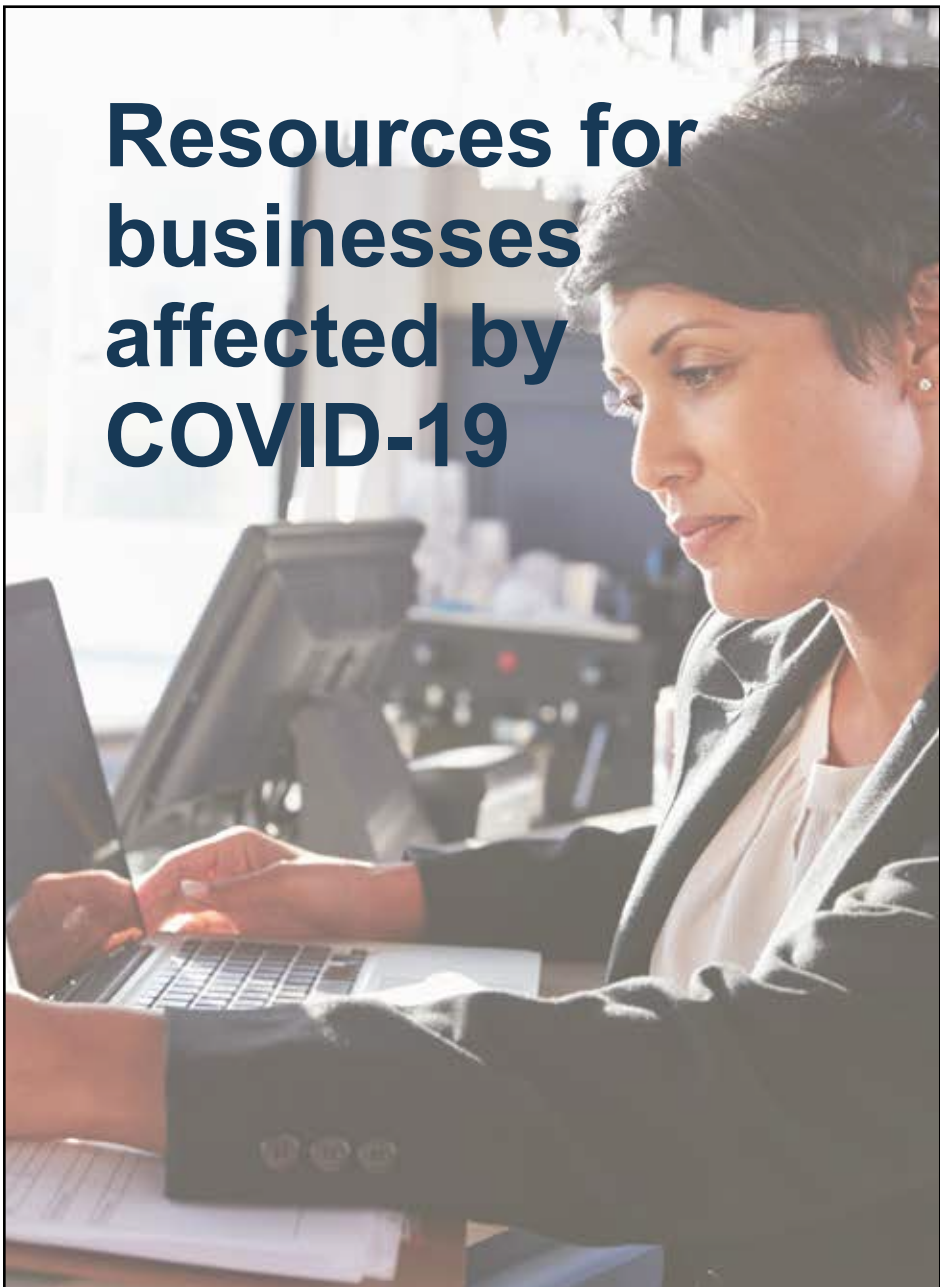
The Last of Us is one of my favorite games of all time, but I am yet to buy *The Last of Us Part 2*. Though critics have mostly praised it as another masterpiece, the universal sentiment has also been that it is exceedingly unpleasant to play. The violence is easily the most brutal ever seen in a video game, souring any entertainment value the first game brought to the table through combatting its boneheaded faceless foes.

But though I'm yet to play the game myself, the work of those who've written critically of the game's themes has been intriguing. Some writers have argued that *The Last of Us Part 2* is hardly a masterpiece, that it forces the player to suffer 30 hours of agonizing pain and death to communicate the stupidly simple message "violence is bad." After reading their work, my mind returned to another moment in the gameplay trailer: Ellie is attempting to infiltrate an enemy base when she comes across a guard, a girl not much older than herself. The girl isn't paying attention (in fact she's distracted playing video games), so Ellie approaches from behind and puts a knife to her throat. When the

girl tries to fight back, her life ends with Ellie's knife underneath her chin. "That was dumb," Ellie mutters as she wipes her knife clean.

The scene recalled a similar moment in the classic World War II film *The Bridge on the River Kwai*. Two young men, wearing opposite uniforms, encounter each other in a forest. The scene ends in the same way, with one's knife ending the life of the other, but while Ellie's kill is swift, merciless, and quickly forgotten, *Kwai's* characters are given a moment to simply stare into each other's eyes before the fighting begins. That small moment means everything, a true acknowledgment of each other's humanity. The war is impersonal, but the kill, tragically and by no fault of either person, is intimate.

And though I'm yet to play the game, this discrepancy has me worried. Engaging in excessive, brutal violence is unnecessary to condemn it. If anything, what I've seen of *The Last of Us Part 2* indicates that it treats suffering as base and commonplace. To condemn violence, you don't need spurting blood, screams of pain, or shouted names. All you need is a single moment to look your enemy in the eye. ★
