SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -After nearly four months of locked gates, the Sacramento State Aquatic Center reopened early this month. Carmichael Water District Terminates Unapproved Employee Benefits

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) -

The Carmichael Water District (CWD) Board of Directors recently terminated multiple employee benefit programs (education/training benefits, deferred compensation, life insurance, and leave benefits) that had been granted without the approval of the Board - even signing a resolution on May 18, 2020, stating that the programs were "unauthorized by law and in violation of District policy." At that same meeting, the Board directed the Ad Hoc Compensation Policy Committee (members Paul Selsky and Jeff Nelson) to review the District's benefit programs and make recommendations for any changes to the Policy Manual.

After reviewing the District's policies and comparing them to other similar employees. The Board

Policy Committee presented their recommendations at the June 15 meeting. Before the Board terminated the benefits in question, employees could utilize an Education/ Training benefit that granted \$500 per course for certifications, trainings, or continuing education programs. Higher benefits could also be approved by the General Manager. The Committee recommended that the Board limit the benefit to \$500 per person per year as well as impose stricter requirements that the education/trainings relate to the employee's position at the district.

The District was using two deferred compensation plans for employee retirement accounts: a matching plan for union employees (up to \$200 per pay period) and a non-matching retirement plan for other benefit at the May meeting, but the Committee recommended that the benefit be reinstated (or rather, officially recognized as policy) and be extended to include all District employees.

The employee Life Insurance Benefit was also implemented on two tiers: The District paid for basic life insurance up to \$200,000 for exempt employees and up to \$150,000 for nonexempt employees. The Committee suggested a modification to equalize the benefit so that all employees are eligible for the higher coverage level.

The Committee recommended no changes to official leave benefits such as family and medical leave, vacation, sick, holiday, and administrative leave. Some employees were utilizing and accru-May meeting, but the

agencies, the Compensation suspended the matching Committee emphasized that admin leave was never officially approved by the Board. So, for any employees who thought they were accruing admin leave time, that benefit has basically disappeared.

Director Roy Leidy asked for clarification on the termination of admin leave, asking whether the Committee recommended any restitution for those employees who were losing the paid admin leave benefit: "Going forward, what is equitable?" Director Leidy also expressed frustration that the Board wasn't given copies of the Committee's recommendations ahead of time so the Directors could have been prepared to have a real discussion during the meeting: "Since we did not get this information until just now, I'm a little bit pissed off. ... ing admin leave before This is what happened last it was terminated at the time with the resolution. Sac County Receives Grant for Housing Site

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County has been awarded funding for a proposed 127-unit housing development by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). The No Place Like Home (NPLH) program funding, totaling \$14.5 million in new money for Sacramento County, will provide 50 permanent supportive housing units for individuals and families experiencing homelessness and who are living with a serious mental illness.

Sacramento County's successful application in the State's second competitive funding round was the result of a collaborative effort between Sacramento County Department of Health Services, Mutual Housing California, the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency, and the cities where the developments are located.

The new apartment complex, on Stockton Boulevard in south Sacramento, will consist of a three-story building of stacked flats with an interior corridor and elevator, two buildings of three-story garden walk-up buildings, and four townhome buildings. The seven residential buildings will provide 127 units consisting of 125 affordable units and two

unrestricted management units.

There will be a blend of one-, two- and three-bedroom units. Inclusive of the 125 affordable units, there will be thirteen units with Americans with Disability Act (ADA) accessibility and five units with communication features (e.g., wiring for audio and visual devices). There will be 67 units (project-based vouchers) for households experiencing homelessness and, of these, 50 will be NPLH-designated units. Of the NPLH units, 40 percent will be allocated to the category of chronically homeless, and 30 percent each to categories of homeless and at risk of chronic homelessness.

Tenants will be referred through coordinated entry administered by Sacramento Steps Forward for all units reserved for persons experiencing homelessness. Tenants will be referred through DHS Behavioral Health Services for all units reserved for persons who are at risk of chronic homelessness. Sacramento County Division of Behavioral Health Services has committed to provide mental health treatment services to the designated NPLH units for a minimum of 20 years.

Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted last December to partner with Mutual Housing California to apply for the funds available under the \$2 billion

Proposition 2 ballot measure approved by California voters in 2018.

Sacramento County Behavioral Health Director Ryan Quist welcomed the approval of the Mutual Housing award. "We are very excited to see this project come to fruition," Quist said.

'This represents Sacramento County's ongoing commitment to develop permanent supportive housing for homeless individuals and provide community-based support for individuals with behavioral health challenges."

In June 2019, Sacramento County announced the funding of two additional proposed permanent supportive housing developments in the first funding round. The projects, Sunrise Pointe and Capitol Park Hotel, will result in 180 new housing units for persons experiencing homelessness, 87 of which will be dedicated to persons that also have a serious mental illness (designated NPLH units). Sacramento County Division of Behavioral Health Services has committed to providing mental health treatment services to the designated NPLH units for a minimum of 20 years.

Continued from page 1 was not presented until the Board meeting, and this is not the way I believe the Carmichael Water District ought to be operating, in all fairness and transparency. I'm not going to comment further on this other than to ask more questions, because I haven't had the time to really digest this. And it's very much unfair to drop it on Board members or members of the public, whether they're here or not, for consideration at the last second. This is not the way we operate."

Director Leidy said, "I am eager to move on expeditiously because this is a matter of concern to our staff, and I want the staff to understand that we're trying to move forward with this and not delay things at all." He also asked for staff to comment on the recommendations "because you're the people who are directly affected by these potential changes."

Manager Lynette Moreno said the recommendation to cut the budget for staff training/education, capping the benefit at \$500 per person per year, is "really prohibitive." The District "has always been a proponent of education. ... I think it's discouraging if we back down on that." Moreno also stated that trainings, certifications, and degree programs should be treated as separate categories with separate caps.

Regarding the termination of admin leave, Moreno said, "Now you've cut total compensation for all the exempt employees, which are the ones that have to work the longer hours and be on call 24/7. It's punitive to me."

Carmichael Water District Human Resources Coordinator Lori Kalisiak agreed that terminating admin leave is "basically giving all exempt employees a cut in pay." Kalisiak also said that the education/training benefit already Assistant General required job relevance: time.)

"There was a process in place, (and) \$500 will barely pay for a class in most cases."

Carmichael Water **District Public Information** Officer Chris Nelson asked whether the Board felt that the education benefit had been abused. Director Jeff Nelson responded that the money spent on the benefit exceeded what had been officially approved by the Board. However, Director Leidy said he does not believe the benefit has been abused.

Director Leidy asked that Board members consider comments from staff as they prepare to discuss the Committee recommendations at the July meeting. He said, "It's critical to staff here and the morale of staff, so we need to move this forward."

The 'Golden Years' Can Feel Oppressive

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - "The Golden Years are supposed to be carefree, but sometimes the challenges of growing old can be depressing. At worst, they seem downright unfair," says Rebecca Weber, CEO of the Association of Mature American Citizens (AMAC)

Weber cites, as an example, the complications of what used to be the simple task of getting your driver's license renewed. "It's a breeze for younger drivers. They can get their new licenses by mail or online and in many states their licenses are good for ten years. Not so for too many older citizens. Many states require in person renewal

procedures for older applicants in their 60s and 70s and will only issue renewal licenses for a maximum of five years and a minimum of one to two years. Specific state by state license renewal information is available on the Website Insure.Com."

And, the AMAC chief notes that more and more states appear to be planning license renewal restrictions on older drivers. As the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL) put it: "While older drivers have lower crash rates reported to the police, the likelihood of seniors being involved in a fatal crash goes up after age 70. Nine states are considering legislation on older driver issues in 2015, with Nevada and Virginia enacting new laws. A number of states considered legislation dealing

with medical fitness."

Meanwhile, notes Weber, seniors seem to be a target of choice not just for scammers but for "legitimate" commercial enterprises. "For example, timeshare predators seem to aggressively target the elderly, using extreme deceptive and exhausting sales practices that coerce customers into signing up for timeshares - a technique that may be particularly effective on the elderly."

But, she warns, even those timeshares that are purchased willingly can be cause for concern due to maintenance fees, which may seem affordable enough at first but, which can become onerous as the years go on.

As consumer advocate Dave Ramsey

describes it: "The average annual maintenance fee is \$1,000. But the surprise comes when you find out the fees go up every year, often much faster than the normal inflation rate. The latest numbers say the increase averages around 4% a year. So, in hard numbers, your original \$1,000 fee could be \$1,477 by year ten - a total increase of around 48%!"

Excessive fees can make timeshare ownership a nightmare, says Weber, particularly if you are an older owner whose resources may be limited. It is one of the key issues targeted for reform by such organizations as The Coalition to Reform Timeshare. The organization says it is actively seeking to impose "a strict code of ethics and transparency" for the industry.

Face Masks for Ag Growers, Workers and Processors

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Department of Agriculture has received a new shipment of surgical masks to help reduce the spread of coronavirus among agricultural workers and industrial N95 respirator masks for agricultural pesticide applicators.

N95 masks have been in short supply for use by the agricultural industry since the inception of COVID-19, as these masks are needed by healthcare providers. The California Department of Food and Agriculture has assisted in procuring these masks through the California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES). Many pesticide labels require the use of N95 masks as part of the personal protective equipment needed to apply the chemical.

In May, the Sacramento County Department of Agriculture distributed thousands of 3-ply, non-surgical masks and cloth masks at county Department of Agriculture offices and the Sacramento County Farm Bureau. The supply was quickly distributed, and the state and the

county worked together to get more.

"The California Department of Public Health has mandated the use of face coverings to keep people who may have the virus, and not know it, from transmitting it to others, especially in settings where it is difficult to maintain social distancing," said Chris Flores, Sacramento County Agricultural Commissioner. "We are thankful that our state partners were able to procure these masks for our essential farmworkers and agricultural businesses".

The Sacramento County Department of Agriculture will distribute the majority of the masks through their Galt and Walnut Grove offices. If you are an agricultural producer or processor and are in need of either disposable 3-ply surgical masks or N95 respirator masks for agricultural pesticide applications, please contact the department at the numbers listed below. CRA Program Invests \$80 Million in 2020

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In late February 2020, the Sacramento County Department of Finance put out a call for applications for the Community Reinvestment Act (CRA) program. This year, the County Treasury invested a record amount of money in financial institutions with a local presence that meet the credit needs of the community.

In addition to putting out a call for applications, the Department of Finance actively reaches out to all banks operating at least one branch in the County to let them know that the CRA Program is accepting applications.

"This year, we awarded four banks with deposits," said Dave Matuskey, Sacramento County Investment Officer. "Each bank received \$20 million for a total investment of \$80 million. This is a big increase from the \$30 million total that went to the same number of banks in the program last year."

The increased investment amount is due in part to a change that was made that allow regional and community banks to more easily qualify for larger deposits.

The CRA Program authorizes the placement of public deposits from the County's Pooled Investment Fund in one-year, fixed-rate certificates of deposit with qualified financial institutions that meet the credit needs of the community, including credit unions and community banks.

The four banks that were awarded deposits this year are: Bank of the West, Banner Bank, East West Bank, Five Star Bank

Unsecured personal property tax bills are mailed to all owners of unsecured property in July of each year. If you owned unsecured personal property in Sacramento County, such as a boat, jet ski or aircraft; or leased or owned fixtures and equipment related to a business on Jan. 1, 2020 and do not receive a tax bill by

Aug. 7, 2020, please contact the Sacramento County Tax Collector's Unsecured Property Tax Unit at (916) 874-7833, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday - Friday, excluding holidays. NONRECEIPT OF A TAX BILL DOES NOT EXCUSE DELINQUENCY OR ALLOW THE TAX COLLECTOR ΤO CANCEL PENALTIES OR COLLECTION COSTS. Tax bills become delin-

quent if not paid in the Tax Collector's Office by 5 p.m. on Aug. 31, 2020, or received by mail bearing an Aug. 31, 2020 postmark.

If the tax bill is not paid by the delinquency date, a 10% penalty and collection cost will be added. DMV

registration may be withheld on watercraft if unsecured property taxes are reported delinquent. If a tax bill remains unpaid after Oct. 31, 2020, additional collection costs and monthly penalties at the rate of 1.5% will be added to the base tax.

Payments may be made by mail or in person at the County Tax Collector's Office located at 700 "H" Street, Room 1710, Sacramento, CA 95814, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday - Friday, holidays excluded. miss them, too. I keep hearing people saying we're all in the same boat. Well, I feel it's more like we've all been in the same storm together.

"But being open again is the best thing that's happened to us in months. We hope our programs will bounce back when everyone's confident we can provide a safe environment, on and off water."

What is a Retiree HRA Account?



Hi Toni

My husband is an oil company retiree and two weeks ago, we received a letter stating that his employer is terminating all Medicare eligible retirees Aetna and Express Scripts group benefits with a termination date of September 30, 2020. We will have reimbursement from a HRA account, which I do not know anything about.

His employer has chosen a specific HRA company to help us choose the right Medicare and Part D options and assist with administering the HRA account that pays our insurance premiums. My husband and I will want an appointment with your office to sort out what is the right option regarding this new HRA Marketplace.

We do not want a major catastrophe by making the wrong decision for our future Medicare needs. ~ Thanks, Becky from Baton Rouge, LA Becky:

Becky:

I have good news for you because I personally attended an Employer Retiree Educational Seminar recently. The seminar was very professionally presented with the speaker making sure that all the Retirees questions were answered.

The insurance rep advised all that attended to discuss

with their doctors, hospitals, and pharmacies which Medicare Advantage, Medicare Supplement and Medicare Part D plans, they accepted. She discussed how to prepare for the phone consultation and that the retiree and spouse will be assigned a specific benefits counselor who will be their counselor, not a random customer service rep that moves on to the next phone call.

From the meeting, I learned that for the remainder of 2020, the retiree and spouse who are in a Retiree plan will have a specified amount to help pay for Medicare and Prescription drug plans monthly cost.

A Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA) is an account that has been established for the employee (you) and funded by an employer. You can use the funds in your HRA to receive reimbursements for eligible health care expenses up to the allocated amount.

The HRA is tax-free if the retiree and/or spouse meets certain requirements to qualify for the HRA funding.

Once you have enrolled in a Medicare plan through employers which provide HRAs, one will then have access to the HRA and use the HRA to reimburse your costs for items listed below:

- All or a portion of the monthly premiums for individual Medicare Supplemental insurance, Medicare Advantage plans, Medicare Part D Prescription drug plan. Medicare Part B or D pre-
- miums (if any) Eligible medical out of
- pocket such as coinsurance, co-payments and

deductibles

- Dental and/or vision premiums enrolled thru the HRA plan.
- Your HRA can be used to pay for all IRS Code Section 213 (d) expenses. The speaker discussed

"what is a guarantee issue" time for the retiree with health issues which prevents one from qualifying for a Medicare Supplement medically.

With guaranteed issue rights, an insurance company must:

- Sell you a Medigap/ Medicare Supplement policy. "You have the right to buy any Medigap/ Medicare Supplement Plan A, B, C, F, K or L that's sold in your state by any insurance company if your Medicare Part A starts prior to January 1, 2020. Those who's Medicare Part A begins after January 1, 2020 qualify for Medicare Supplement Plan A, B, D, G K or L with plans C and F no longer available.
- Cover all your pre-existing health conditions.
- · Cannot charge you more for a Medigap/Medicare Supplement policy, regardless of past or present health problems.


