

County Elections Announces Vote Center at Golden 1 By Janna Haynes,

Sacramento County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Voter Registration and Elections announced a partnership with the Sacramento Kings to have Golden 1 Center serve as a Vote Center this November Election. Golden 1 Center will open as an 11-day Vote Center leading up to the Presidential Election on Nov. 3, 2020. The location will be the largest Vote Center in the county and allow for critical social distancing while still providing voters with all the needed services that Vote Centers offer.

At the Vote Center, any Sacramento County resident can:

Drop off your completed ballot; Get a new ballot printed to take home; Vote in person; Register to vote; Update your registration; Receive language assistance; Use an accessible ballot marking device

A voter anywhere in the state may drop off their voted ballot to Golden 1

In addition to providing the arena at no cost to the County, the Kings will also provide free parking in the Downtown West Garage to individuals accessing the Vote Center, which will open Saturday, Oct. 24 and run through Election Day, Nov. 3.

Golden 1 Center is the first professional sports venue in the state to announce plans to serve as a Vote Center. In addition to its partnership with the County, the Kings are working with the California Secretary of State's office to amplify poll worker recruitment and education efforts, increase awareness around voting timelines and requirements, and host a virtual voter registration workshop for employees. The Kings plan to offer up staff to train as Election clerks to staff the Vote Center.

"We are incredibly excited to work in partnership with the Sacramento Kings and the Golden 1 Center to host a Vote Center for the November election," said Sacramento County Registrar of Voters Courtney Bailey. "Access to a large, state of the art facility such as Golden 1 Center helps us ensure accessibility and proper social distancing, while also providing our residents the voting services they need. We're grateful to the Sacramento Kings for reaching out to us to help facilitate this partnership."

Some Benefits Are Now Reinstated for Carmichael Water District Employees

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - After an in-depth discussion by the Carmichael Water District Board of Directors on June 15, regarding employee benefits, the Board held a special meeting on July 14, to continue the discussion and make clarifications to the policy drafts. The Board specified that under the employee education/training policy, the District will pay for job-related trainings and required classes, including the costs of the classes, travel, and materials. But employees utilizing the education assistance portion of the benefit would be subject to the new cap of \$500 per employee per year — a benefit that would terminate at \$2,500 total per employee. Also, only classes at non-profit universities would be eligible for reimbursement.

The Board also specified that the life insurance beneretirement benefit would now be available at the same level for all District employees, both union and non-union. The Board discussed their intention to retroactively reinstate the District matching retirement benefit to June 1,

Human Resources Coordinator Lori Kalisiak said that limiting the education assistance to non-profit universities would mean "no one could even attend American River College, since it's not a university." She also stated that the Board was making decisions based on inaccurate information because HR was not consulted in gathering the relevant data. Kalisiak said she wished the Board had handled these issues more transparently and actually spoken to staff instead of acting unilaterally.

BOE Member Gaines Strongly Opposes Fitness Centers are Safe and Essential **Prop. 15 "Split Roll" Initiative**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Board of Equalization (BOE) Member Ted Gaines held an informational hearing that considered both the pros

and cons of Proposition 15, California's "Split Roll" initiative that will appear on the November ballot. Following the hearing, Member Gaines came out in forceful opposition to the measure

"California is straining under the coronavirus. Millions are unemployed, businesses are closed, and the last thing we need new taxes put on the backs of struggling families. We are a resilient state and I'm convinced we will recover but for that to happen we need a business climate that promotes prosperity. Proposition 15 does the opposite. It will crush agriculture. It will hurt the mom and pop shops who are already at risk and scared for their futures. It will drive businesses out of our state.' Gaines said.

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California's landmark Prop. 13, which was passed in 1978. Prop. 13, among other changes, implemented a predictable, stable property tax regimen in California, where commercial and residential properties are taxed at 1-percent of their purchase prices and increases in property tax are capped at 2-percent a

year from that purchase-

price valuation.

Under Prop. 15, many commercial properties would be subject to reassessment annually, or at least every three years, opening the door to the unpredictable property tax spikes that forced seniors out of their homes in the 1970s and contributed to the taxpayer revolt that ended in passage of Prop. 13. It is referred to as "split roll" because it would lead to different treatment of residential and commercial properties in the property tax roll.

In addition, under the measure's definition of "real property used for right now is \$12 billion in commercial agriculture," fixtures and improvements such as irrigation systems, barns, tasting rooms and even fruit trees would be subject to reassessment, exposing the agricultural sector to a wave of new and higher taxes. Additionally, the nonpartisan Legislative Analyst's Office review of Prop. 15 indicates that rural areas may end up losing money overall if the initiative passes, even as their agricultural interests pay more in taxes, providing a double blow

protections provided by to these communities.

Gaines hosted today's Prop.15 informational hearing, convening initiative supporters and opponents, assessors, the Legislative Analyst's Office, Board of Equalization personnel, as well as tax professionals involved in the property tax appeals process. The hearing was non-partisan and did not call for the Board to take a position on the measure. It was designed to give Board Members deeper insight into the alleged need for the initiative, how it would be implemented, and how it would affect property tax administration in the state. However, the day's testimony made clear to Gaines that the measure would be a disaster for California taxpayers and

"When will California taxpayers ever catch a break? They pay the highest gas taxes, highest state sales tax, highest income taxes, highest corporate tax in the western states; it's never ending. If this Initiative were to be successful, I have no doubt that Prop. 13 homeowner protections would be the next target.

"I support Prop. 13. For four decades it's been the bedrock protection for homeowners and business property owners. As a taxpayer advocate, I oppose split roll and every other effort to raise California taxes."

Elected in 2018, Ted Gaines represents nearly ten million people as a Member of the Board of Equalization.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Fitness Alliance (CFA) announced that since reopening on June 12, its members have reported no cases of COVID-19 traced to California fitness centers including health clubs, gyms or studios. CFA surveyed 150 fitness operators, representing 785 locations in California, to demonstrate the implementation of its guidelines and superior safety standards have kept its communities safe while providing an essential service to its members and vital jobs to its employees.

"Our survey results show fitness centers are safe due to the standards we are implementing," said Randy Karr, founding partner of CFA and President and CEO of California Family Fitness. "Survey respondents had more than 5.5 million members check into their facilities between June 12 and July 13, and only .002 percent of those members have tested positive for COVID-19, with no cases reported as a result from visits to fitness centers.'

'We support doing the right thing to flatten the curve, but America is facing a physical and mental health crisis and physical fitness is essential to combat this pandemic," said Francesca Schuler, founding partner of CFA and CEO of In-Shape Health Clubs. "This is why the California Fitness Alliance worked with Governor Gavin Newsom's administration to develop standards that would enable fitness centers to stay open safely during the COVID-19 pandemic."

Under CFA's "4-W" program to protect and prevent the spread of COVID-19, our participating fitness clubs have members wear masks, work out 6-feet apart, wash their hands before exercising and wipe down the equipment they use when finished. This is in addition to fully complying with or exceeding strict safety standards directed by state and county public health offices for facilities and staff including frequent cleaning, sanitizing, social distancing, physical separation and new check-in procedures.

One in five Americans experiences a mental health issue and physical fitness can be a critical way to combat these issues according to the Journal of Clinical Psychology. Additionally, heart disease is the leading cause of death in the United States – responsible for 840,768 deaths in 2016 and an annual total cost

estimated at \$351.2 billion in 2014-2015. The leading causes of cardiovascular disease are obesity, high blood pressure and lack of physical activity. Forty-seven percent of Americans have at least one risk factor for heart disease.

'Sadly, people with chronic health issues have significantly higher risk of severe illness or death if they do become ill from COVID-19," said Marc Thomas, CFA advisory board member, Co-CEO of Aspyr Holdings and an Orangetheory Fitness Franchisee. "According to the National Institutes of Health, engaging in regular physical activity is critical to preventing heart disease and Type 2 diabetes among other ailments, confirming once again that fitness is an essential business."

In fact, Dr. Hemmal Kothary, the Chief Medical Officer for Dignity Health Central California Division, believes fitness is so essential to mental health that he's joined CFA as a medical advisor.

"Now more than ever, people need routine and healthy ways to deal with things like anxiety, depression and the isolation caused by this pandemic," Kothary said. "The communities created within fitness clubs not only help people maintain motivation for their physical fitness but remind us that we are not alone even when we are safe and physically distant."

"Our industry takes health very seriously, which is why we implemented strict standards. The results of our survey demonstrate these standards work," said Cory Brightwell, CFA advisory board member and CEO of Chuze Fitness.

"The California Fitness Alliance will continue working with the Governor and local governments to demonstrate that fitness centers are not where infections are spreading." ★

At the height of their fortunes, Bud and Myrtle raised an art-deco home on his Poverty Flats development. The Sacramento Union noted its breathtaking \$16,000 price tag. Now a senior residence, the mansion housed Daniel, Myrtle, the Robb in-laws and their daughter Molly in precarious elegance.


By the roaring 20s, Bud's golden years had roared to an end. Even before the Depression, he'd lost his own money and the savings of others who believed in him. Cronies threw a farewell dinner at Sacramento's Hotel Land and the Carmichaels shuffled sedately off to San Francisco with law suits and bill collectors in pursuit. The impoverished ménage eventually occupied shabby rooms in an O'Farrell Street hotel that Bud had once owned. He died there in 1936, aged 70. Family lore says Myrtie was too poor to fund interment and scattered his ashes on San Francisco Bay.

She outlived her husband by 25 years; spinster sister Molly died in a nursing home in 1976, at 106. Because she and the Carmichaels were childless, many personal details of Carmichael Colony's illustrious founder were

This historian is thankful that one old photo album provides some insight. Says descendant Sally Rubio: "My grandmother Maizie kept detailed journals. We know that after Bud died, she and other relatives helped Myrtie and Molly. It's good we have these pictures of much happier days; they show that Dan Carmichael and his family really enjoyed time together."

Why is GSWC requesting this rate

The CPUC requires GSWC to submit a GRC application every three-years. GSWC is requesting authorization to increase revenues in the Arden Cordova service area by \$2,876,700 (or 19.03%) for 2022, \$622,600 (or 3.44%) in 2023, and \$691,600 (or 3.66%) in 2024. The total requested increase for all three years combined would be \$4,190,900 (or 26.13%).

The purpose of this GRC is for GSWC to cover its anticipated costs from 2022 through 2024 for improvements to the water supply system, federal income tax, property taxes and cost for other operating expenses (such as lab fees for testing and conservation, etc.)

On May 27, 2020, GSWC filed Advice Letter No. 1818-W with the CPUC regarding the acquisition of Sutter County Water Works District No. 1's (WWD1) Robbins Water System (Robbins). GSWC will provide service and water supply for Robbins customers and they will be will be served through the Arden-Cordova Customer Service Area. The acquisition of Robbins. which is reflected in this application, does not increase the rates requested for the existing Arden Cordova customers

How could this affect my monthly bill? If the proposed application is approved by the CPUC, the average residential customer with a 5/8 x 3/4" meter using 13 Ccf would see a monthly bill increase of \$6.96 (or 18.76%), from \$37.10 to \$44.06 in 2022. In 2023 the average residential customer would see a monthly bill increase of \$1.54 (or 3.50%), from \$44.06 to \$45.60. and a monthly bill increase of \$1.70 (or 3.73%), from \$45.60 to \$47.30 in 2024, excluding any applicable surcharges.

How does the rest of the process work? This application will be assigned to a judge, who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process. The judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt GSWC's application, modify it, or deny it, Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners.

The Public Advocates Office may review this application. The Public Advocates Office is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a statutory mandate to represent customers of investor-owned utilities to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with safe and reliable service and the state's environmental policy goals. The following is an Ordinance adopted by the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova at its meeting of July 20, 2020:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, LEVYING A SPECIAL TAX WITHIN COMMUNITY FACILTIES DISTRICT

Community Facilities District No. 2020-1 (Landscape Maintenance)

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova ("City Council") adopted a resolution entitled "A Resolution of the City of Rancho Cordova of Intention to Establish a Community Facilities District and Future Annexation Area (the "Resolution of Intention"), has conducted proceedings (the "Proceedings") to establish City of Rancho Cordova Community Facilities District No. 2020-1 (Landscape Maintenance) (the "CFD"), pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, Chapter 2.5 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5, commencing with Section 53311, of the California Government Code

(the "Act") to finance certain public services (the "Services) as provided

in the Act: and

WHEREAS, pursuant to notice as specified in the Act. and as part of the Proceedings, the Council has held a public hearing under the Act relative to the determination to proceed with the formation of the CFD and the rate and method of apportionment of the special tax ("Special Tax") to be levied within the CFD to finance the Services and at such hearing all persons desiring to be heard on all matters pertaining to the formation of the CFD and the levy of the Special Tax were heard, substantial evidence was presented and considered by this Council and a full and fair public hearing was held; and

WHEREAS, upon the conclusion of the hearing, this City Council adopted its Resolution of the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova of Formation of Community Facilities District (the "Resolution of Formation") pursuant to which it completed the Proceedings for the establishment of the CFD, the authorization of the levy of the Special Tax within the CFD and the calling of an election within the CFD on the propositions of levying the Special Tax and establishing an appropriations limit within the CFD, respectively; and

WHEREAS, on July 6, 2020, a special election was held among the landowner voters within the CFD at which such voters approved such propositions by the two-thirds vote required by the Act, which approval has been confirmed by resolution of this Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA DOES ORDAIN as follows:

Section 1. By the passage of this Ordinance, the Council hereby authorizes and levies the Special Tax within the CFD pursuant to the Act, at the rate and in accordance with the rate and method of apportionment of Special Tax set forth in the Resolution of Formation which rate and method is by this reference incorporated herein. The Special Tax is hereby levied commencing in fiscal year 2020-21 and in each fiscal year thereafter to pay for the Services for the CFD, as contemplated by the Resolution of Formation and the Proceedings and

Section 2. The Chief Financial Officer of the City or designee or employee thereof of the City is hereby authorized and directed each fiscal year to determine the specific Special Tax to be levied for the next ensuing fiscal year for each parcel of real property within the CFD, in the manner and as provided in the Resolution of Formation

Section 3. Exemptions from the levy of the Special Tax shall be as provided in the Resolution of Formation and the applicable provisions of the Act. In no event shall the Special Tax be levied on any parcel within the CFD in excess of the maximum tax specified in the Resolution of Formation.

Section 4. All of the collections of the Special Tax shall be used as provided in the Act and in the Resolution of Formation, including, but not limited to, the payment of costs of the Services, the payment of the costs of the City in administering the CFD, and the costs of collecting and administering the Special Tax.

Section 5. The Special Tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem taxes are collected and shall have the same lien priority, and be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for ad valorem taxes; provided, however, that the Council may provide for other appropriate methods of collection by resolution(s) of the Council. In addition, the provisions of Section 53356.1 of the Act shall apply to delinquent Special Tax payments. The Chief Financial Officer of the City is hereby authorized and directed to provide all necessary information to the auditor/tax collector of the County of Sacramento in order to effect proper billing and collection of the Special Tax, so that the Special Tax shall be included on the secured property tax roll of the County of Sacramento for fiscal year 2020-21 and for each fiscal year thereafter until no longer required to pay for the Services or until otherwise terminated by the City.

Section 6. If for any reason any portion of this ordinance is found to be invalid, or if the Special Tax is found inapplicable to any particular parcel within the CFD, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the balance of this ordinance and the application of the Special Tax to the remaining parcels within the CFD shall not be affected.

Section 7. The Mayor shall sign this Ordinance and the City Clerk shall cause the same to be published immediately after its passage at least once in a newspaper of general circulation circulated in

Sandy Kozlen called in to the May 18 meeting, stating that Steve Nugent, who retired last year as General Manager after 30 years with the District, "made some mistakes." Kozlen said that staff should be kept in the loop on such major changes, but he emphasized that benefits unapproved by the Board are illegal and must be terminated, even if the Board later decides to reinstitute them.

From the beginning, Director Leidy said the matter should have been handled with more transparency: "I'm just wanting to be equitable to the staff that we value so much. And if I was a staff member, I'd feel this was a real slap in the face."

May 18 meeting all agreed that learning about the termination of benefits during the meeting was a shock. Assistant General Manager Lynette Moreno said, "I don't appreciate that all of this is happening the way it's happening. ... It does feel like punishment to staff."

HR Coordinator Kalisiak also expressed frustration: "To me, it seems very adversarial with staff." She stated that the meeting agenda didn't provide enough information about what was going to be discussed, and the refusal to provide a copy of the resolution prior to the meeting "deprives us of the necessary notice to be able to address this." She asked, "How long has this been tancing guidelines.)

Staff members who spoke at the taking place? At what time or times was this discussed by the Board?"

The drafting of the resolution and the Board discussions that led up to it are not part of the public record and did not occur during any public Board meetings. So, presumably, these issues were discussed by the Board during closed sessions.



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Ask Joni

Does Medicare Cover "Expensive" Injections in Doctor's Office?



Toni King

Toni:

I have been laid off this week with my current employer's benefits ending August 31. I turn 65 in August and will be enrolling in Medicare. My employer group health plan currently has an HSA with a high deductible of \$3,000 which I meet early in the year due to my health issues. The biggest medical expense is shots that I receive from 2 doctors. One is a shot for macular degeneration which is over \$2,000 per shot. It does not take me too many treatments to make the \$3000 deductible. The other is for allergy shots taken monthly from my allergist that are not too expensive. My concern is how does Medicare pay for these 2 medical procedures?

Great question, Sherry:

In the Medicare and You handbook, it discusses "What does Medicare Part B cover?" It states that Medicare Part B "helps to cover **medically** necessary doctors' services, outpatient care, home health services, durable medical equipment and other medical services.

Many preventative services and other medical services covered under Part B are discussed in the Medicare and You handbook.

Sherry, you mentioned that vou have a concern about whether the expensive macular degeneration shot for your eye and the allergy testing and shots can be covered under Medicare Part B. If these procedures are medically necessary, then Medicare will pay for those procedures.

"Medically necessary" as defined by Medicare means "health-care services or supplies needed to prevent, diagnose, or treat an illness, injury, condition, disease, or its symptoms and that meet accepted standards of

medicine." Under "Doctor and other health care provider services", the handbook states that "Medicare covers medically necessary doctor services (including outpatient services and some doctor services you get when you're a hospital inpatient) and covered preventative services. Medicare covers other health care providers like physician assistants, nurse practitioners, social workers, physical therapists and psychologists.
