Down-Sized Memorial Gathering Salutes Heroes

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Carmichael's Memorial Day tradition continued – much abbreviated in size – beneath the Vietnam Monument in Koobs Nature Area (Engle Road) last weekend.

Normally an occasion for big crowds, the 2020 commemoration conformed to COVID assembly restrictions. A dozen supporters (including a Boy Scout color guard) were allowed. Others were turned away at the gate but were able to watch the ceremony live-streamed on Facebook.

Iraq War veteran Matt Cecatto spoke on the value of remembrance. "As we come together in this

pandemic, let's hold together," said the US Army Purple heart recipient. "Memorial Day is not just for veterans. It's for families that are left behind and children who are raised without knowing what their father or mother looked like." Veterans did not serve for years to support their battle buddies, he said. "You serve for your family, your neighbors and strangers you see in the grocery store. Young men and women who are not physically here today will always be here, as long as we recall their sacrifices. We learn in the military that you can't do things 10 percent or even 95 percent. I'm reminded today of people who went all the way – who gave 100 percent – for their country and for people they didn't even know."

Carmichael rock heartthrob Todd

Morgan led the depleted throng in Wood Guthrie's folk anthem "This Land is Your Land."

Korean War veteran Bill Fellers (89) played Taps, echoed by Boy Scout bugler Stach (14). With the ringing of a bell, the 15 heroes immortalized by a Koobs Nature area plaque were named.

The young men all attended nearby La Sierra High School and died while serving in Vietnam. They are: Robert D. Anderson, Mark W. Burchard, Robert S. Bynes, Jerry Cowser, Kenneth R. Escott, Gary R. Field, Herbert Frenzell, Frank Thornburg, Ralph Guarienti, Larry H. Morford, Thomas C. Pigg, Randall B. Rainville, Kim Richins, Jeffry Tharaldson and Robert A. Willis. ★

Vitalant Calls on Donors to Help Patients Now

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Vitalant – the nation's largest nonprofit, independent blood collector – serving the local community here in Northern California, has declared a critical shortage of blood as supplies have been significantly impacted by the coronavirus pandemic. Shelter-in-place orders led to 762 blood drives canceled since early March in this area alone, resulting in a loss of 25,194 uncollected blood donations. That, coupled with a resumption of surgeries and other medical procedures as stay-at-home restrictions were lifted, has caused a 25 percent increase in the need for blood during the past several weeks.

All blood types are critically needed right now, with an especially high need for type O, A-negative and B-negative red blood cells. In addition, platelets are always needed by patients for cancer treatments, surgeries and emergencies. Because of its short shelf life – only 5 days – the supply of platelets must be continually replenished.

Donors are strongly urged to give blood as soon as possible by going online to vitalant.org or calling 877-258-4825 (877-25-VITAL).

"We strive to maintain a 4-day supply of blood just to provide what patients need, and currently we're at less than half that for certain blood types," said Dr. Ralph Vassallo, Chief Medical Officer at Vitalant. "It's absolutely vital – a matter of life or death for some – to have enough blood collected and readily available on hospital shelves when patients need it."

In Sacramento and the Chico/Redding areas, Vitalant must collect over 8000 blood donations per month to meet patients' transfusion needs. Every two seconds, someone needs blood. Vitalant urgently needs donors to make an appointment to ensure a stable blood supply.

Vitalant recently released its Because of You, Life Doesn't Stop campaign, calling on all donors to take action now and give blood or convalescent plasma to meet immediate and ongoing needs. Recovered COVID-19 patients have immune-boosting antibodies to the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus in their plasma, which can be given to patients currently fighting COVID-19.

"The public responded when thousands of blood drives were canceled – more than 100,000 units of blood lost – at the beginning

Sac County New Health Order and Stage 2 Variance

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County was given the approval by California Department of Public Health (CDPH) to move further into "Stage 2" of California's Roadmap to Modify the COVID-19 Stay-at-Home Order. The Variance Attestation approval for Sacramento County was officially posted on the CDPH website late on Wednesday, May 20. Today, as a reflection of the approved attestation document, the County released its May 22, 2020, Sacramento County Public Health Order effective at 11:59 a.m., and has been revised to outline which sectors have approval to move forward with opening in accordance with State guidelines. This Health Order

supersedes previous orders and is in effect until it is rescinded or amended by the Sacramento County Health Officer to coincide with the State's movement through the stages in its Resilience Roadmap.

"County Public Health staff has been working to ensure a coordinated system with healthcare partners to identify possible cases, coordinate testing, and lead contact tracing to identify those possibly exposed for infection control. Our Public Health system, along with the public's compliance with the health orders leading to this point, are responsible for the County being able to move further into Stage 2," said Dr. Peter Beilenson, Director of Health Services.

Once Sacramento County business sectors approved for Stage 2 reopening have

implemented the state's reopening requirements, they will be allowed to resume modified operations with social distancing, and include, for example: dine-in restaurants, shopping malls, micro-enterprise retail/storefronts, car washes, pet grooming, day care, outdoor museums and open gallery spaces, and small offices when telework is not possible.

However, unless bars, breweries and wineries provide in-house dining, they will not be permitted to reopen beyond takeout and delivery. Additionally, CDPH is not approving the opening of any gyms or small fitness studios of any kind and does not permit in Stage 2 gatherings of any kind in any County. Read the State Variance document and the County's Health Order with readiness checklists for

complete details on what is permitted.

"Businesses are responsible for reviewing and understanding the guidance that's been provided, and they are required to post readiness checklists certifying their ability and commitment to reopen safely. Working in partnership with our business community, we're ensuring compliance with the County's Health Order so that our residents continue to stay healthy as the local economy reactivates," said Board Chairman and District 1 Supervisor Phil Serna.

For Sacramento County, its Health Officer, Dr. Olivia Kasirye, attested to criteria laid out by the state, including: stability of COVID-19 cases/deaths in the county; protection of essential healthcare

need. We are often the preferred provider to many of the assisted living, independent living, skilled nursing communities in our area."

"Right now, because of the COVID-19 scare, people are ignoring serious or chronic health issues because of their fear of picking up the virus at their doctor's office or at the hospital," Boyd said. California Poison Control Sees Spike in Household Disinfectant Exposures

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As California residents use more cleaning products to disinfect their homes during the COVID-19 pandemic, the California Poison Control System's Sacramento Division, housed at UC Davis Health, saw a spike in reported household disinfectant exposures in March and April.

All age groups in California have reported more exposures to disinfectants, including bleach, but cases involving adults have grown the most:

Adults 20 or older: 262 cases in February, 724 cases in March, 796 cases in April; Children ages 6-19: 65 in February, 60 in March, 86 in April; Children under 6 years: 133 in February, 232 in March, 215 in April

"May seems to be on track to be similar to March and April," said James Chenoweth, assistant professor of emergency medicine at UC Davis Health. "Most of these calls are accidental exposures. People are buying cleaning products and using them on food or spraying them excessively. There can also be issues with mixing certain cleaning products together." He said most cases have been minor and did not require hospitalization.

The National Poison Data System, the data warehouse for the nation's 55 poison control centers, has also seen an increase nationally in disinfectant exposure cases during this same time, with 1,673 cases in February, 3,401 cases in March, 3,601 in April.

With more children staying home during the COVID-19 pandemic, the odds of children accidentally being exposed or ingesting household cleaning products also increases.

Justin Lewis, director of the California Poison Control System's Sacramento Division, recommended the following tips to help prevent accidental household disinfectant poisonings:

Use products as directed on the label; Don't mix multiple disinfectant products together; Make sure to be in a well-ventilated area when using disinfectants; Use the recommended personal protective equipment (gloves, goggles) per the product label; Don't use cleaning products on the skin or ingest or inject them; Do not use disinfectants on food; Keep household disinfectants out of reach of young children and add child locks to cupboards where disinfectants are stored; Store cleaning products in their original labeled containers. If diluted disinfectants and sanitizers are put in spray bottles, be sure that they are clearly labeled and stored out of the reach of children; Know the poison control number – 800-222-1222 – and PoisonHelp.org, which is open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Language interpreters are available. ★

workers and first responders; adequate testing and containment capacity; hospital capacity; support for vulnerable populations; and requirements for Stage 2 timelines and triggers for adjustments.

Therefore, the public and business owners must closely follow the state's reopening guidance and the County's Health Order to help curb a surge of new COVID-19 cases, which would return the past restrictions and closures.

Sacramento County is recommending the CDPH guidance on the use of cloth face coverings whenever social distancing cannot be maintained indoors or outdoors. While wearing a face covering, the public should find ways to maintain social distancing requirements of six feet or more, practice good hand hygiene, and stay home if ill.

The cloth face coverings recommended are not medical grade respirators, such as N95 and surgical masks. A cloth face covering should cover the nose, mouth and

chin, and be made of soft or permeable material, without holes or one-way valve that allows respiratory droplet release.

Examples of allowable face covering include scarf, bandana, or neck gaiter. The Health Order includes provisions for exercising and while using modes of public transit, as well as exceptions for children and some individuals – read the details for Face Coverings in the May 22 Health Order.

The best defense against COVID-19 continues to be: Staying at home and physical distancing; Washing hands frequently; Avoiding touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands; Avoiding being around people with COVID-19 symptoms

Social Security Matters

What will my Wife's Survivor Benefit Be?

Dear Rusty: I am a 68-year-old retired male and had planned on waiting to collect Social Security benefits beginning at age 70. My wife is currently 53 years old. When I die, would my wife's spousal benefit at her full retirement age be equal to what I would be receiving at age 70 or be reduced? Also, if I were to die before 70 and before collecting social security, what would be my wife's survivor benefit at her full retirement age? **Signed: Older Husband**

Dear Older Husband: Your wife's survivor benefit as your widow will depend upon two things – the amount you were receiving (or were eligible to receive) at your death, and the age at which she claims her survivor benefit as your widow.

If you were receiving an increased benefit because you waited until age 70, your wife's benefit - if she has reached her full retirement age - will be 100% of the amount you were receiving at your death. If she hasn't yet reached her



from you, she could take the smaller survivor benefit first and delay taking her own SS benefit until it reaches maximum at age 70 and switch to her own benefit at that time. The goal is for her to get the highest possible benefit for the rest of her life.

Finally, if you were to die before you started collecting your increased Social Security benefit at age 70, your wife would still have the same options, but her survivor benefit amount would be based upon the amount you were eligible to receive at your death, even though you were not yet collecting. In other words, all those delayed retirement credits (DRCs) you are now earning (and will continue to earn until you are 70) will not be lost – the benefit you have earned up to the point you die will be what your wife's survivor benefit is based upon.

full retirement age when she claims her survivor benefit (she could claim as early as age 60) the benefit will be actuarially reduced according to the number of months prior to her full retirement age (FRA) that she claims it. The amount of reduction for claiming her survivor benefit before her FRA is 0.396% for each full month earlier, which is 4.75% per year earlier than her FRA, to a maximum of 28.5%. And for clarity, your wife isn't required to take the survivor benefit immediately upon your death; she can wait until the benefit reaches 100% at her full retirement age, if desired and if financially feasible.

If your wife is also eligible for a SS benefit on her own work record and you die before she reaches her FRA, she will have the choice to take either her own Social Security benefit or her survivor benefit from you. If her survivor benefit will be her highest possible benefit, she would have the option to take her own SS retirement benefit from her own work record first and delay taking the larger survivor benefit until it reaches maximum at her FRA. Or, if her own benefit at age 70 would be more than her survivor benefit



We Need to Make More of Our Own Drugs

A country learns about itself in a crisis, and one revelation in the coronavirus emergency is that we can't make our own penicillin.

The first patient successfully treated with the antibiotic was a woman suffering from sepsis in a Connecticut hospital in 1942. Her treatment took up half the country's supply. Yet in short order we figured out how to mass produce the medicine, saving the lives of countless soldiers in World War II. Once, factories throughout the country made the stuff.

But that was a long time ago. The last U.S. plant to make penicillin, a Bristol-Myers Squibb operation in Syracuse, New York, shuttered in 2004.

What happened? According to Rosemary Gibson of The Hastings Center and author of the book "China Rx," "Industry data reveal that Chinese companies formed a cartel, colluded to sell product on the global market at below market price, and drove all U.S., European and Indian

producers out of business."

Just like that – it's not so easy to simply start up a penicillin fermenter – we were out of the penicillin-production business.

The story of penicillin is the tale of U.S. dependence on China-sourced pharmaceuticals and active drug ingredients writ large.

From 2010 to 2018, U.S. imports of pharmaceuticals from China increased 75%. China is the second largest exporter of drugs and biologics to the United States behind Canada, and our dependence is even greater, given that China is the source of the active ingredients of many drugs produced elsewhere.

China is a dominant force when it comes to generic drugs in particular, which account for the vast majority of medicines that Americans take. We rely on China for 90% of our antibiotics, and for drugs for everything from HIV/AIDS to cancer to antidepressants.

China is fully aware of its leverage. It notoriously threatened via its state-run media to cut off our supply of drugs (except fentanyl, of course) and plunge the U.S. into "the mighty sea of coronavirus."

Even if China weren't a malign global competitor (it is), a remorseless dictatorship (it is) or a dishonest kleptocracy (it is), there would be risk inherent in having so

many of our medications and their components coming from one country. We become vulnerable to any disruption of Chinese production, whether from disease, political unrest or war.

Beijing is a particularly nasty actor, but the coronavirus has demonstrated that even friendly nations will keep medical supplies from one other if it is in their self-interest to do so.

It is only prudent, then, that the U.S. begin a national effort to produce more of its own medicines.

Unspooling entrenched supply chains won't be simple. The U.S. should create every incentive for drug companies to at least move out of China into other foreign countries, and ideally come back here (economic incentives clearly matter – when drug companies lost tax preferences to manufacture in Puerto Rico, many of them left for China). Eventually, federally funded health systems, including Medicare, Medicaid and Veterans Affairs, should buy only American-sourced pharmaceuticals.

Prescient commentators have been warning of our growing dependence on China for medicines for years. After this, there's no excuse for not fixing it.

Ask Toni

Enrolled in Medicare . . . Now I Can't Fund My HSA!

Toni King

Reader Alert: Toni turned 65 on Wednesday, May 20th and has now joined the maze of Medicare. She will discuss what Medicare issues she meets in the future.

Hi Toni

I attended one of your seminars and now I need help with my Medicare issue. I am 65 almost 66, "still working" and covered by my employer's group health HSA plan. Approximately \$5000 is contributed to my qualified tax-deductible HSA account for medical expenses.

When I talked with my company's HR department, they advised me to apply for Medicare Part A (hospital) although I really did not need it. Now I find out that since my insurance is an HSA, signing up for Part A has disqualified me for any contribution to the HSA plan. I have a few questions:

- 1) Does having Part A really disqualify me from contributing to my HSA Plan?
- 2) If so, how can I stop Medicare Part A and stop this HSA tax situation?

Thanks, ~ Stephen,
Lake Charles, LA

Stephen:

This is an especially important topic to those who are turning 65, still working

with an HSA because as you are experiencing Stephen, HR departments and friends are giving wrong advice to those becoming Medicare age. This week, three different Toni Says Medicare column readers, sent in HSA questions because they had received wrong information which is costing them from funding their HSA.

The rule about Medicare Part A and making contribution to an HSA is discussed in the Medicare & You handbook. It states, "You can't contribute to your HSA once your Medicare coverage begins" ... the handbook also states in the last paragraph, "To avoid a tax penalty, you should stop contributing to your HSA at least 6 months before you apply for Medicare." **Please review this information... Very important...**

Below are the answers to your questions:

1. That's correct!! Enrolling in Medicare Part A will disqualify you from contributing funds to your HSA. Contact the Toni Says office by email at info@tonisays.com or call 832/519-8664 and together we can explore your Medicare options.
2. Question #2 about stopping your Medicare Part A. I would call Social Security at 1/800-772-1213 or visit your local office explain to the agent how you were misinformed since you have been enrolled and funded your HSA before you turned 65 and now you cannot contribute to the plan. Ask how you can

appeal what was advised to you. Since Social Security offices are not open due to COVID-19, you will have to fax in your information, and you want to schedule an appointment with a Social Security agent by phone until the Social Security offices reopen.

3. Getting Part A back: When you talk with Social Security ask what type of problems you will have to getting back into Part A later. It is rare that one stops Medicare Part A, but more Boomer's enroll in HSAs to grow their retirement because of Health Savings Accounts. I have consulted with many who have stopped Medicare Part B(Medical) when they have returned to work with group health insurance.

For those who need to delay Medicare Part A due to "still working fulltime" with company health insurance and want to continue making contributions to their HSA can do so by simply NOT enrolling in Medicare Part A when turning 65. When you and your spouse retire later past 65, when no longer working full-time with company health insurance, then you can apply for Medicare. 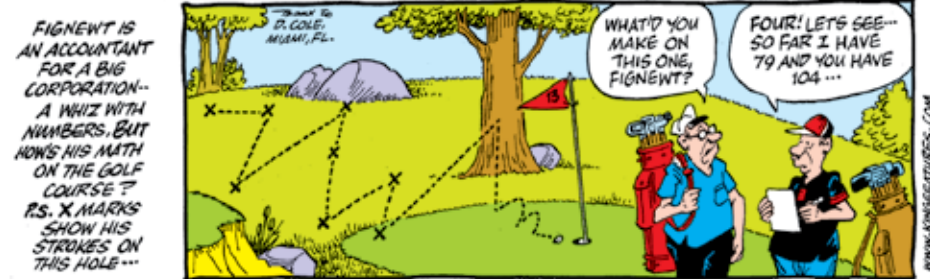
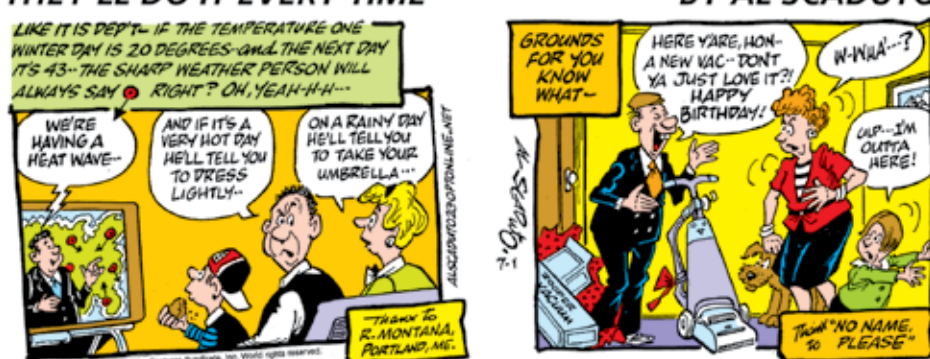

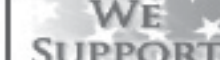

Bill Helping Small Businesses Unanimously Passes Senate Governmental Organization Committee

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Andreas Borgeas presented Senate Bill 1457 in the Senate Governmental Organization Committee, which passed 14-0. The bill would require state agencies to work with small businesses and establish policies to waive or reduce penalties and fines for small businesses. "Senate Bill 1457 will provide regulatory relief for small businesses impacted by the economic fallout as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic,"

said Senator Borgeas. "Now more than ever, California should provide regulatory relief and allow state agencies to waive or reduce civil penalties for small businesses operating reasonably and in good faith." The United Chamber Advocacy Network (UCAN), a coalition of seven local chambers of commerce in Northern California representing over 4,000 members, testified in support of the bill. As many small businesses struggle to survive due to recent closures and stay-at-home orders, California should

consider reducing the financial burdens imposed on small businesses as a result of unintended mistakes corrected in good faith. *Senator Borgeas represents the 8th Senate District, which encompasses all or portions of Amador, Calaveras, Fresno, Inyo, Madera, Mariposa, Mono, Sacramento, Stanislaus, Tulare, and Tuolumne Counties. Resolution to End Governor's Emergency Powers Announced

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Under Section 8629 of the California Emergency Services Act, the Legislature has authority to terminate the Governor's emergency powers. Assemblymembers Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) and James Gallagher (R-Yuba City) are introducing an Assembly Concurrent Resolution to exercise this statutory prerogative. A "State of Emergency" in California is a legal term describing not merely conditions of extreme peril, but also the inadequacy of state and local institutions to combat the threat within the constraints of the State Constitution. "This Resolution is meant to restore a proper balance between the legislative and executive branches," said Assemblyman Kiley. "To the extent the Governor retains extraordinary powers, they should be limited in scope in coordination with the Legislature, which has authority to terminate those powers altogether." Since proclaiming a State of Emergency on March 4, Governor Newsom has issued 39 Executive Orders, unilaterally changing 200 laws spanning most sections of the California code. This includes creating new voting laws

for an election six months away and overhauling Workers' Compensation rules. "We must take action to restore representative, constitutional government," Assemblyman Gallagher said. "The Governor has clearly overstepped his authority, from arbitrarily changing state laws, to using state agencies to threaten small business outside of their legal jurisdiction, to spending money outside the scope of legislative authorization. It is incumbent upon the Legislature to restore the balance of powers." The nonpartisan Legislative Analyst, in a report Sunday on the Governor's May Revision, was "very troubled" by the authority the Governor seeks to take away from the Legislature. The report concludes: "we urge the Legislature to jealously guard its constitutional role and authority." "The Emergency Services Act was designed to grant extraordinary powers to a Governor under conditions of extreme peril," Assemblyman Kiley said. "It was not meant to give a single person the ability to remake all of California law indefinitely. An open-ended state of emergency, with boundless powers vested in a chief executive, is incompatible with democratic government." ★

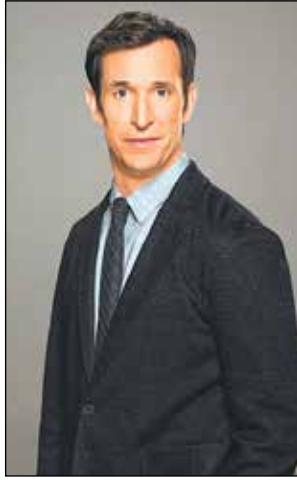
