Fighting Cancer Together

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Local teenagers are well on their way to raising \$50,000 to aid cancer research. Inspired by one of their team's survival, three young activists are captaining a fundraising campaign with schoolmates.

Newsom **Administration Claims another '\$1.831 Billion Needed'**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In a last-minute call last Thursday evening, Department of Finance officials notified the Legislature that Governor Newsom is transferring an eye-popping \$1.831 billion to the Disaster Response-**Emergency Operations** Account to spend through the current fiscal year with only limited details.

"The spending of billions of taxpayers' dollars must be reviewed and approved by representatives of the citizens of California. It is time for the Legislature to return to the standard separation and balance of power," said Vice Chair of the Senate **Budget Committee Senator** Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama). "There is too little transparency, oversight and accountability. The public deserves better."

Without sufficient evidence to support the need for this massive spending, the letter from the Department of Finance breaks down expenditures as follows:

\$1.3 billion to procure personal protective equipment; \$251.7 million to establish and support over 3,000 hospital beds; \$30 million for hotels for healthcare workers and support staff; \$159.4 million to cover costs for ongoing state response activities; \$98.4 million for statewide testing and con-

tact tracing and tracking. Californians have answered the call and slowed the spread of the virus. Hospitals are safe, and most have few, if any, COVID-19 patients. The U.S. Naval hospital ship Mercy has returned to the port in San Diego. The field hospital at Sacramento's Arco Arena will close at the end of the month after the state paid an outrageous \$1 million to house fewer than 10 patients.

Senator Nielsen said, "There is no surge in hospital demand in California."

As the Los Angeles Times editorial stated, "[T] he state is moving from the emergency response phase into one of recovery, the governor needs to start sharing power again with the Legislature, as the state's constitution intends. That means no more COVID-19 blank checks."

"Long standing processes and procedures to establish the balance of power in our government must be strictly followed. The Administration must demonstrate why it needs

CHP to 'Unleash' California's Newest Canine Graduate Teams

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol (CHP) is proud to announce the graduation and deployment of nine CHP canine teams, along with one canine team from the University of California, Davis Police Department. The certification of the new canine teams follows 400-600 hours

Due to the current health crisis, the traditional graduation ceremony and skills demonstration was not held, but the Department does want to acknowledge the hard work and commitment of the teams, while sharing the news of their successful certification with the public as they begin deploying to communities throughout the state.

"The addition of these highly specialized teams to our existing canine units is a win for the people of California," CHP Commissioner Warren Stanley said. "Sending more handlers and their canine partners to patrol throughout the state, following their intensive training, will undoubtedly make a positive impact on public and officer safety."

This is the second of two graduations in 2020 for canines trained in handler protection and narcotics detection, handler protection and explosive detection, or explosive detection only. The canine teams complete between 10 and 15 weeks of intensive training at the CHP Academy, depending on their specialty. The CHP officers represent seven different geographical regions, statewide.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. California Highway Patrol Canine Fact List:

Although a formal graduation ceremony

was not held due to the pandemic, eight Patrol and Narcotics Detection Canine (PNDC) teams and one Explosives Detection Canine; (EDC) team completed training and were certified by the California Highway Patrol; (CHP) on May 28, 2020. Additionally, one Patrol and Explosives Detection Canine; (PEDC) team from the University of California, Davis Police graduated with this class;

The PNDC teams go through 11 intensive weeks, or 440 hours, of criminal apprehension and narcotic detection training. The PEDC teams go through 15 weeks of intensive training, or 600 hours, of criminal apprehension and explosives detection training. The EDC teams go through 10 weeks of intensive training, or 400 hours, of explosives detection training. The canines are used to support the Department's mission of providing Safety, Service, and Security to the public;

Among the graduates were four Belgian Malinois (Mal-lin-wah), one Dutch Shepherd, four German Shepherd Dogs, and one German Shorthair Pointer;

All handlers are experienced officers with the CHP. The officers represent the following CHP Divisions: Northern, Valley, Golden Gate, Border, Coastal, Inland, and Protective Services;

The canines are trained to meet the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training canine team guidelines;

To maintain the canine's interest and skills at a high level for peak performance, and to expose the team to various situations likely to be encountered while working in the field, eight hours of weekly training is required throughout their career;

Following this graduation, the CHP will have 38 PNDC teams, six PEDC teams, and six EDC teams deployed throughout

SACRAMENTO REGION. CA (MPG) - SMUD is again stocking three Sierra reservoirs with rainbow trout. The fish planting starts in June and stock 25,000 pounds of fish at Union Valley, Loon Lake and Ice House reservoirs in El Dorado County.

Surveys say fishing tops the reasons folks visit the Crystal Basin Recreational Area and the trout plants enhance angling opportunities for the public. On average, the fish weigh almost two pounds, including some trophy fish.

Continued from page 1 haircuts, hair coloring, blowouts, weaves and extensions, braiding, lock maintenance, wig maintenance and hair relaxing treatments.

Salon activities that cannot be done with face coverings on both the worker and client – or that require touching the client's face - such as shaving, facial waxing, threading, eyelash services and facials - remain prohibited at this time in all counties. Likewise, nail salons remain closed.

"Together, Californians have limited infections in our state, and because of that work, many counties may make a decision to restart modified hair and barber services," said Dr. Sonia Angell, State Public Health Officer and Director of the California Department of Public Health. "However, COVID-19 is still present in our communities and we are still at risk. As we venture outside our homes, it is critically important to keep physical distance, wear face coverings in public, and wash hands frequently to help protect yourself and those around

Under the new guidance to reopen, ca.gov

salons and barbers must: Implement measures to ensure physical distancing of at least six feet between and among workers and customers, except when providing haircutting and other close contact services; Provide temperature and/or symptom screenings for all workers at the beginning of their shift and any vendors, contractors, or other workers entering the establishment; Encourage workers and customers who are sick or exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 to stay home; Screen customers upon arrival and be prepared to cancel or reschedule customers who indicate they have any signs of illness; Require workers and customers to use face coverings during the entire haircutting and other close contact hair services.

Census Bureau Opens for Operations in Select Northern California Counties

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -The U.S. Census Bureau, in coordination with federal, state and local health officials, will begin to drop off 2020 Census questionnaire packets at front doors of nearly Northern California that do not have regular mailing addresses, such as in rural areas or households that use post office boxes.

That delivery is called the

"Update Leave" operation, and it began March 15 before all fieldwork was suspended March 18 due to the COVID-19 nandemic.

Field staff have been trained to observe all social distancing protocols and will wear official government-provided 150,000 households in personal protective equipment for their safety and the safety of the public. This operation is contactless and follows the most

current federal health and

safety guidelines.

People are strongly encouraged to respond promptly to the 2020 Census using the ID number included in the questionnaire packet. Responding with a census ID or the paper questionnaire helps ensure the best count of their community. People can respond online, by phone or by using the paper form in the packet.

We are new to the Houston area and Hurricane Harvey absolutely stressed my wife, Joy, to almost having a nervous breakdown. In February, she turned 65 and now is obsessed that if we get caught in a flood, she will pick up the Coronavirus (COVID-19). With an evacuation in tiny boats when areas are under water, she is extremely stressed.

Joy's 91-year-old mother is living in an assisted living facility and we live over 15 miles away from her. What can we do to be prepared for another an emergency regarding the elderly? Seeing what is happening in other areas regarding nursing homes with elderly and COVID-19 this is concerning us? Thanks, ~ Chris from The Woodlands

Everyone should have a family disaster readiness plan for hurricanes, tornadoes, earthquakes, and/or all types of natural disasters. Now with COVID-19, this is especially important for seniors or those that are disabled. This is especially crucial for their survival because many are energy or technologically dependent for life support or ongoing medi-

cal treatment. ***Remember to have extra masks and practice "social distancing" of at least 6ft. ***

Here are a few questions, to help you prepare for nearly any disaster or hurricane no matter what area of America vou live with or without coronavirus COVID-19.

- · Do I stay or go? Know your evacuation route or have a plan in place. Advise your family of your escape route. This will depend on where you live either in the city or in the country. Leave early because during many storms or disasters there have been massive traffic jams to get out of that area.
- a) Make sure you have a sufficient supply of prescriptions and always bring your list of current prescriptions for yourself or any family member.
- b) Have a copy of medical records for those with critical medical conditions such as your mother-in-law's. Keep the medical records in a safe place that you can get to immediately when evacuating.
- c) Advise your family members where the information is located for thosewith health issues.
- How will you reconnect with family if separated? Create a plan to reconnect with loved ones if land or cell phones are down. Have a backup battery to charge cell phones.
- Do I have access to clean water? If you do not have access to clean water, then


any crisis becomes critical in a couple of days. Remember, you may not have access to a grocery store due to the type of disaster you are in or suppliesmay be depleted. Begin gathering water and food supplies due to the low amount that America now has due to COVID-19.

- Do I have adequate food supply? Most households have a few days of food available, but the best way to stock up on additional food and supplies is to add a little bit each week. Remember, during a crisis the power may be out, so cook your frozen & refrigerated food first. Be sure to have plenty of charcoal or gas tanks for a grill to last a week or 2.
- Do I have enough cash on hand in case the ATMs are not working? Remember to take your check book. Make sure you have your driver's license, passport, or ID to cash a check.

Yes, There's Good News on COVID-19

It's not March anymore.

The coronavirus has taken a heartbreaking toll on Americans, but the course of the virus is not the same as it was a few months ago. We are on the other side of the curve. There are encouraging signs all over the country, and no early indications of a reopening debacle.

The question now is whether the media and political system can absorb good news on the virus, which is often ignored or buried under misleading storylines.

The press has a natural affinity for catastrophes, which make compelling viewing and good copy. The pandemic is indeed a oncein-a-generation story. So, the media is naturally loath to shift gears and acknowledge that the coronavirus has begun to loosen its grip.

Meanwhile, progressives and many journalists have developed a near-theological commitment to the lockdowns, such that any information that undermines them is considered unwelcome, even threatening. This accounts for the

widespread sense that no one should say things have gotten better ... or people are going to die.

Usually, when it is thought the public can't handle the truth, it is a truth about some threat that could spark panic. In this case, the truth is information that might make people think it's safe to go outside again.

Almost all of the discussion about reopening is framed by worries that we will reopen too soon, not that we might reopen too late. That is literally unthinkable, even as we have entered a new phase.

As data analyst Nate Silver pointed out last week, the seven-day rolling average for deaths is 1,362, down from 1,761 the week prior and a peak of 2,070 on April 21. That's still much too high, but the trend is favorable.

Testing capacity, such a concern for so long, has really begun to expand after hitting a plateau for weeks. Testing nationally on some days has been in the high 300,000s or over 400,000. The issue in some states now is not capacity, but actually finding enough people to test.

Scott Gottlieb of the American Enterprise Institute notes that the positivity rate, or percentage of people testing positive, has continued to fall through-

The press has often, out of sloppiness or willfulness, tried to create negative news around the reopenings. CNN recently tweeted, "Texas is seeing the highest number of new coronavirus cases and deaths just two weeks after it officially reopened." As Sean Trende of RealClearPolitics pointed out, the seven-day rolling average of new cases had indeed been trending up, but the seven-day rolling average of the number of tests had gone up, too - which would naturally turn up more cases. The key indicator is the positivity rate, and it was down in Texas.

Headlines noted that Florida recorded 500 new cases in one day. It generated fewer headlines, and perhaps none, when Gov. Ron DeSantis explained that the state had received a dump of 75,000 test results, yielding the 500 new cases, for a minuscule positivity rate of 0.64%.

It's not as though we haven't had a cataract of unassailably legitimate bad news over the past few months. We've been experiencing a wrenching public health crisis and a steep recession on top of it. There shouldn't be a need to obscure favorable trends. We can handle the truth.

Social Security Matters

Are Social Security and Medicare Running Out of Money?

Dear Rusty: I have been hearing reports that Social Security and Medicare will run out of money by 2035 and will only pay approximately 75% of benefits. First, is that true about Social Security? And second, will they reduce benefits to people who are already on it or just the new people signing up? Signed: Worried about the Future

Dear Worried: The financial difficulties facing both Social Security and Medicare are well known by those of us who work with these programs every day, and Congress is equally and acutely aware of the issues. But Social Security and Medicare are two entirely separate programs which require two

entirely separate answers. Let's discuss Social Security (SS) first. The SS Trust Fund now has about \$2.9 trillion dollars in assets. These are reserves accumulated from past revenues which exceeded the cost of providing past benefits to recipients of Social Security. That seems like a lot of money but starting this year (2020) Social Security will need to use some of those reserves to pay full benefits. That's because benefits paid out to lect benefits. recipients in 2020 will be more than the money coming in (this was expected even before the pandemic exacerbated the problem). And that trend will continue, and worsen, as we go forward in time. Without for Medicare beneficia-



SS Trust Fund reserves will be exhausted in 2035. And unless Congress acts before then to increase SS revenue and/or reduce SS expenses, when the Trust Fund is dry an across-the-board cut in benefits will affect everyone. That's because with the Trust Fund empty, Social Security can only pay out as much money as it receives in revenue and it's currently estimated that, in 2035, that will result in a cut of 21% for everyone. Sadly, the actions needed to correct Social Security's financial issues are well known; what's missing is bipartisan cooperation in Congress to implement the changes needed.

There is no doubt that Social Security needs reform to be able to sustain full benefits for future generations and, hopefully, Congress will step forward soon to make those changes. Historically, any changes made to Social Security do not affect those who are already collecting benefits (it would be politbeneficiaries (much more palatable politically). Of course, that cannot be guaranteed but, if history is our guide, changes will eventually be made which shore up Social Security's finances, and those changes will affect only those who are not yet eligible to col-

As for Medicare, part of the FICA payroll taxes paid by every American worker includes an amount (1.45%) to pay for Medicare Part A (hospitalization) coverage Congressional action, the ries. Any excess collected

goes into an "HI Trust Fund" reserved for paying Medicare Part A expenses. According to latest reports the HI Trust Fund is projected to run dry in about 2026 at which point, theoretically, only hospital expenses equal to revenue could be paid.

Medicare Part B coverage (for doctors and other outpatient services) is paid for from two sources one source is the monthly premiums which are paid by every Part B beneficiary, and the other source is the Government's General Treasury (which picks up the difference between what is collected in Part B premiums and what is needed to pay healthcare expenses). Similarly, it's expected that the Government will shore up Medicare Part A as needed when the time comes (which it has in the past). So, while Medicare is clearly under a lot of financial stress from the ever-increasing cost of healthcare, it's highly doubtful that the program is in any danger going away. More probably, Congress will look to cut the program's expense structure, which would affect medical service providers more than individuals.





California Fairs in Trouble

PLACERVILLE, CA (MPG) - Every county in our state has one. Every county in our state needs one.

But by the end of 2020, not every county in our state will have one – a local fairgrounds.

Your local Fairgrounds are the go-to place during disasters in your community - such as wildfires, floods, pandemics and other disasters. They are the hub of the community. In El Dorado County, the Sheriff utilized the fairgrounds for a press conference when Jaycee Lee Dugard was found. Domestic animals displaced by fire are housed here. Every year, local non-profits host their fundraisers, raising millions of dollars to serve our community at our fairgrounds. Hundreds of local residents walk their dogs at our fairgrounds. Local law and fire departments test and train here. The Speedway hosts races throughout the summer months, bringing fans from all over for a little clay track action. And there is our annual County Fair where local youth learn lessons that will last them a lifetime by raising and showing their livestock. Couples meet and fall in love. Longtime residents listen to the bands of their youth. Thousands of tacos are consumed. All of this could change due to the consequences of COVID-19.

In 2011, then Governor Jerry Brown eliminated ALL funding for California Fairs. For El Dorado County Fairgrounds, that constituted about 25 percent of the Thank you.

annual revenue. For some fairgrounds it was much more. Some fairgrounds have never recovered. El Dorado County Fairgrounds cut spending, created new methods of generating revenue, streamlined interim rentals, run a bar during the Fair and 4th of July, and created other events, such as the popular Crab and Chowder Gala. With the shutdown THESE ALL CEASED. As of this writing, the Fair Association has lost more than \$200,000 in interim rental revenue, and that will likely rise. If the Fair Association is not able to host the annual County Fair, it will be difficult to keep the gates open.

Here are some facts about California Fairs. Statewide, more than \$35 million is generated by non-profits for their community on fairgrounds. Fairgrounds generate more than \$3.5 billion in annual economic impact while contributing over \$200 million in tax revenue to local and state government.

There is a movement within the California Fair Network to request emergency funding.

This is where you come in. The fair industry needs the public to show their support by urging their local politicians to support emergency fair funding. El Dorado County Fair has a sample letter on their website, eldoradocountyfair.org/contact.html or simply write your own, supporting emergency funding for fairgrounds throughout the state.

Please share this with your family and friends throughout the State and urge them to write letters as well.




