A Big Day of Giving



Staff and critters at Effie Yeaw Nature Center gave a big thumbs up for donors who last week boosted the non-profit's finances by \$63,000.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Local non-profits were big winners in Sacramento's May 7 Big Day of Giving. Many achieved support that surpassed fundraising hopes. Choreographed by the Sacramento Region Community Foundation, the give-athon assisted 614 non-profits. Top Carmichael beneficiary, the Effie Yeaw Nature Center rallied \$63,000 in support. Its total was second-highest among educational non-profits; Friends of Sacramento Library raised \$81,540 - a windfall that will in part assist Carmichael Library.

Effie Yeaw supporters rejoiced in gifts that topped projections by more than \$10,000. Administered by the American River Natural History Association, the Center lost County funding 10 years ago and continues educational programs solely through community generosity. The Big Day achievement was critical: two fundraisers recently canceled due to the COVID crisis and the organization was obliged to re-invent its art gala as an on-line auction, scheduled for June 6.

"We've also had to cancel many school programs and camps," said Effie Yeaw staffer Tova Fleming. "So our Big Day appeal was critical.

We were overwhelmed by a beautiful response." The center's total was boosted by \$22,000 in large donations from three local families. These were used as matching incentives for more than 300 other donors.

Carmichael Parks Foundation realized almost \$14,000. This total included a \$5000 gift from Supervisor Susan Peters. Two \$500 incentive prizes further bolstered Foundation's funds. Awarded by Big Day organizers, one rewarded the group that achieved most donations in one hour. "Our directors set alarms and gave on line between 4 and 5 am," explained president Sharon Ruffner. "In that hour, we raised \$3653." The Foundation provides youth program scholarships and park improvement.

San Juan School District's Science, Technology Arts and Reading program (STARS) was assisted to the tune of \$6,600. Sacramento Fine Arts Center raised \$14,370. Kiwanis Family House gained \$147,000 and the Carmichael Kiwanis Club received \$9850. Susan Peters' pledge of \$5000 to the Fair Oaks Theater festival was more than matched; the festival's appeal generated almost \$18,000. Reflecting an upswing in generosity to support groups, Orangevale/Fair Oaks Food Bank gained \$42,600.

Sacramento Children's Receiving

Home collected \$57,330. Soil Born Farms - a Rancho Cordova enterprise that promotes sustainable food production - harvested \$61,400. American River Park Foundation and Save the American River Association supporters gave \$21,500 and \$7,800 respectively.

To the delight of appeal of BDOG organizers, Sacramento region donations totaled almost \$12 million. This result beat 2019's bottom line by close to \$4 million. Biggest beneficiaries included Sacramento Food Bank and Family Services; The Salvation Army; Yolo Food Bank; Placer Land Trust and Sacramento SPCA. The Crocker Museum topped cultural non-profits with \$151,000 in gifts. "With the COVID situation, we were unsure of response," said Sacramento Region Community Foundation CEO Linda Beech Cutler. "In the end, all our expectations were exceeded. More than 65,000 donated. Despite the many challenges we face, the spirit of generosity is alive. People realize more than ever that non-profits are critical to communities."

Commissioner Lara Expands Order for Insurance Companies to Partially Refund Premiums

California Department of Insurance

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara issued a Bulletin extending his previous order requiring insurance companies to return partial insurance premiums to consumers and businesses and provide much-needed financial relief amid the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The Department of Insurance will review all premium adjustments to ensure they are fair and adequate and reflect

policyholders' reduced risk.

The Bulletin now includes the month of May, having already included the months of March and April, covering at least six different insurance lines: private passenger automobile, commercial automobile, workers' compensation, commercial multi-peril, commercial liability, medical malpractice, and any other insurance line where the risk of loss has fallen substantially as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Commissioner's Bulletin 2020-4 requires

insurance companies to provide an adjustment to the premium in the form of a premium credit, reduction, return of premium, or other appropriate adjustment as soon as possible, and no later than August 11, 2020. For most if not all consumers, this will be a percentage of the premium - not 100 percent - and the Department of Insurance will validate each insurance company's plan so that refunds are adequate and reflect the reduced risk.

"With the vast majority of Californians still under 'stay at home' orders, the

risk of accident and loss remains low for many lines of insurance and their premiums should reflect that," said Commissioner Lara. "While I appreciate companies that have already taken action to return premiums, the Department of Insurance will be checking that the reductions are adequate and consumers and businesses are not shortchanged."

On March 18, Commissioner Lara issued a Notice, calling on all admitted and non-admitted insurance companies to

Warmer Weather Will Speed Snowmelt, Increase River Flows

With temperatures forecast to increase this week, California's snowpack will be melting faster, potentially filling rivers and streams with dangerously cold and swift moving water.

As some counties begin to ease shelter-at-home restrictions, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) notes that California's stay-at-home order remains in effect, and it's important to continue practicing physical distancing. Californians may walk, run, hike and/or bike in their local neighborhoods as long as they continue to practice physical distancing of six feet.

For those who choose to venture near or in water, PG&E encourages them to take extra precautions when in or near rivers, especially around hydroelectric facilities and dams, where water flows can change rapidly. Anglers also are encouraged to take precautions as trout season has opened for most California rivers.

Although California's snowfall is below normal, runoff is expected to continue into early summer.

"Public safety is our

highest priority. We encourage everyone recreating in or near water to plan at all times how they can quickly and safely escape in case of changing water flows and cold temperatures," said Jan Nimick, PG&E vice president of Power Generation.

Most California rivers are fed by snowmelt, making them cold even in summer. Simple actions such as recognizing if the water is too cold or swift, knowing your limits, wearing a life jacket and simply not entering the water when conditions are deemed unsafe can save a life.

Below are some water safety tips:

Stay Out and Stay Alive - Stay Out of Canals and Flumes

Recreating in PG&E canals and flumes is strictly prohibited. Stay off elevated flumes and out of these water conveyances, regardless of who owns them, as they are very dangerous due to slippery sides and fast-moving cold water. Be mindful of signs and warnings. Stay out of areas that are signed as restricted, fenced off or buoy-lined.

Know the Risks

Prevention is the best way to save a person from drowning. By the time a person is

struggling in the water, a rescue is extremely unlikely and places the rescuer at risk.

Sudden immersion in cold water can stimulate the "gasp reflex," causing an involuntary inhalation of air or water. It can even trigger cardiac arrest, temporary paralysis, hypothermia and drowning. When faced with swift water, even the strongest swimmers can be easily overwhelmed.

Cold water entering the ear canal can cause vertigo and disorientation. This can confuse swimmers, potentially causing them to venture deeper into the water.

Cold water also reduces body heat 25 to 30 times faster than air does at the same temperature and causes impairment that can be fatal.

Learn About Self-Rescue Techniques

If you do fall into the water, here are some survival tips:

Don't panic. Try to control your breathing; don't gasp. A sudden, unexpected fall into cold water causes an involuntary gasp (or torso) reflex. It takes less than one-half cup of water in a person's lungs to drown. If you remain calm, you have a greater chance of self-rescue; If you have a boat, stay with it. It will help you stay afloat

Spring Storms Not Enough to Offset Dry Winter

The season's final manual snow survey at Phillips Station was conducted by the Department of Water Resources (DWR). The survey recorded 1.5 inches of snow depth and a snow water equivalent (SWE) of 0.5 inches, which is 3 percent of the May average for this location. The SWE measures the amount of water contained in the snowpack, providing a more accurate forecast of spring runoff than snow depth alone.

Measurements from the 130 electronic snow sensors scattered throughout the state indicate that the statewide snowpack's water equivalent is 8.4 inches, or 37 percent of the May average. The readings will help hydrologists forecast spring and summer snowmelt runoff into rivers and reservoirs.

"March and April storms brought needed snow to the Sierras, with the snowpack reaching its peak on April 9, however those gains were not nearly enough to offset a very dry January and February," said Sean de Guzman, chief of DWR's Snow Survey and Water Supply Forecast Section. "The last two weeks have seen increased

temperatures leading to a rapid reduction of the snowpack. Snowmelt runoff into the reservoirs is forecasted to be below average."

California's weather variability has been on full display this water year. Dry conditions in October and November were followed by precipitation in December that measured 120 percent of average. Very dry conditions returned to much of the state in January and February, with March and April storms leading to the snowpack peaking at just 66 percent of average on April 9.

In normal years, the snowpack supplies about 30 percent of California's water needs as it melts in the spring and early summer. The greater the snow water equivalent the greater the likelihood California's reservoirs will receive ample runoff to meet the state's water demand in the summer and fall.

The state's six largest reservoirs currently hold between 83 percent (San Luis) and 126 percent (Melones) of their historical averages for this date. Lake Shasta, California's largest surface reservoir, is 94 percent of its historical average and sits at 81 percent of capacity.

Applicant Review Panel Submits the Remaining Pool of 60 Applicants for 2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Applicant Review Panel (panel) has announced that it concluded the last of its public meetings on May 7, and selected 60 of the most qualified applicants to move forward in the selection process for the 14-member 2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission (Commission). The panel submitted the list of the 60 remaining applicants to the California State Legislature, where leadership has the option of removing up to 24 names from the list – eight from each sub-pool.

Over the course of the last few months, the panel held candidate interviews, many remotely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The final public meeting narrowed the pool of applicants to 20 Democrats, 20 Republicans, and 20 from neither of those parties.

“The panel has now concluded its critical step of the process to form California’s second citizen-led redistricting Commission,” said Christopher Dawson, panel Counsel. “During the meetings, the panel members remarked how impressed they were by the caliber, passion, and commitment of the candidates, and identified 60 of the most qualified applicants who have demonstrated strong analytical skills, an ability to be impartial and an appreciation for California’s diversity. We are confident that these remaining 60 can draw fair and legal districts for the good of our state and its future.”

The final pool of 60 is a diverse group coming

from all regions of the state and with different backgrounds. Each offers different skills, experiences, and perspectives that will benefit the new 2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission. For the complete list of the 60 remaining applicants, please visit ShapeCaliforniasFuture.auditor.ca.gov.

The legislative leaders have until June 30, 2020, to exercise their strikes (eight total strikes allowed for each sub-pool) and submit a list of remaining applicants to the California State Auditor. From the remaining list of applicants, the California State Auditor will then randomly select the first eight commissioners. Those eight commissioners will select the remaining six that will, in total, make up the 14-member Commission. The Commission will include, in total, five Democrats, five Republicans, and four members from neither of those parties.

The 14-member Commission will redraw the lines for California’s Congressional, State Senate, State Assembly, and State Board of Equalization districts, based on information gathered during the 2020 census. The Commission must draw the districts in conformity with strict, non-partisan rules designed to create districts of relatively equal population that will provide fair representation for all Californians.

About the 2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission

Every ten years, after the federal government publishes updated census information, California must redraw the boundaries of its Congressional, State Senate, State Assembly, and State Board of Equalization districts. In 2008, California voters passed the Voters FIRST Act authorizing the creation of an independent Commission comprised of 14 members. The 2020 Commission will include five Democrats, five Republicans, and four who are either registered without, or “independent” of, any political party (decline-to-state or no party preference) or with another party. The Commission is responsible for drawing the lines of each district.

The Applicant Review Panel was responsible for reviewing the application materials submitted by individuals who applied to serve on the 2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission and identifying the most qualified applicants. The panel was randomly selected and established as required by law for the sole purpose of identifying 60 of the most qualified applicants. The panel’s members consisted of three independent auditors – one who is registered with the Democratic Party, one who is registered with the Republican Party, and one who is registered with another party or without a party preference. You Could Have an Uncashed Sac County Check

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Currently, the County has more than 11,000 uncashed checks, totaling more than \$3.2 million. How does this happen and could this be your unclaimed money?

If a Sacramento County issued check goes six months without being cashed by the rightful payee, the information becomes available in a PDF document on the Unclaimed County Warrants (checks) webpage. The data is also searchable on the County’s Open Data portal.

Think you might have an uncashed check with Sacramento County? Here are quick and easy ways to find out:

From the Unclaimed County Warrants webpage, scroll through the check numbers on the Unclaimed Warrant listing PDF document (use the Find feature [Ctrl+F] to search names or other terms in the PDF).

Go to the Sacramento County Open Data portal. Once on the portal, click the “Finance” icon; click the “County Outstanding Checks” link; and click “Data” tab. Then click on the column “filter” cone-shaped icons for specific value sorting, or the column headings for alpha/numeric listings to get ascending or descending sorts.

If you find your name or business on the data listing, go to the Unclaimed County Warrants webpage to find out about the documentation and information needed to validate that you are the rightful payee to receive the funds.

More Unclaimed Monies

The Department of Revenue Recovery (DRR) has unclaimed payments that are a result of not having a current address for the recipient. On the Open Data portal, under the Finance category, check out the Revenue Recovery Unclaimed Payments data and search for your name. If you locate a claim due to you, contact DRR at (916) 875-7815, and provide the following information:

Claimant’s Name; Date of Birth; Address (Current and Previous); Phone Number; Amount of the claim; DRR Account Number; Court Docket Number; Date of Order; Defendant’s Name; Proof of Identity (Driver’s License or ID Card); Proof of Payment: Copy of check, money order receipt or credit card confirmation number; Information regarding the incident (case information)

Sacramento County makes this data easily available on its websites, Open Data Portal and other measures to ensure the information is accessible and the monies go to the rightful payees. ★

America Has Lost 594,300 Clean Energy Jobs; 850,000 Expected by June 30

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - Nearly 600,000 U.S. clean energy workers have lost their jobs since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic after 447,208 new workers filed unemployment claims in April – tripling the claims filed in March. That’s according to a new analysis of unemployment data released by E2 (Environmental Entrepreneurs), the American Council on Renewable Energy (ACORE), E4TheFuture, and BW Research Partnership.

The analysis of Department of Labor data found that 594,347 workers in clean energy occupations, representing 17.8% of the industry’s workforce, filed for unemployment benefits in April and March. The number of jobs lost is more than double the number of clean energy jobs created since 2017. Before March, clean energy had been one of the U.S. economy’s biggest and fastest-growing employment sectors, growing 10.4% since 2015 to 3.4 million jobs at the end of 2019. That made clean energy by far the biggest employer of workers in all energy occupations, employing nearly three times as many people as the fossil fuel industry.

In the coming months, the analysis projects that job losses will continue to rise unless Congress and the Trump administration take quick and substantive action to support the clean energy industry and its workers. If nothing is done, the report forecasts that 850,000 clean energy workers will have filed for unemployment by June 30.

A loss of that magnitude would mean that one out of every four clean energy workers employed at the start of 2020 will have lost their jobs in just six months.

Industries Hit Hardest

According to the unemployment data analysis, energy efficiency lost more jobs than any other clean energy sector for the second consecutive month in April. The energy efficiency sector accounted for nearly 70% of all clean energy job losses in April, with more than 310,000 energy efficiency workers filing for unemployment.

Renewable energy lost nearly 13% of its workforce, with more than 71,800 unemployment filings in April. There are now nearly 100,000 renewable energy workers out of work since March. If trends continue,

more than one out of every five renewable energy workers will soon be jobless.

Both the clean grid and storage sector and the clean vehicles sector lost 14% of their workforces in April, losing 54,700 jobs combined. In total, those sectors have lost 26,200 and 46,500 jobs, respectively.

The clean fuels sector lost the largest percentage of its workforce among all clean energy industries, losing 10,400 jobs in April, or 26% of its workforce. Since March, the sector has lost 12,500 jobs or more than one-third of its workforce.

States and Localities Hit Across Country

California continues to be the hardest hit state in terms of total job losses, losing 77,900 jobs in April alone and more than 100,000 since the crisis began. Texas, Michigan, Florida, and Georgia also had a high total of clean energy unemployment filings in April, with each state experiencing more than 22,000 job losses. An additional 23 other states had at least 5,000 clean energy unemployment filings, according to the new analysis.

While Kentucky, Hawaii, and Louisiana all saw job losses exceed 25% of their clean energy workforces, no state was hit harder in terms of total number and share of its clean energy workforce than Georgia. In addition to suffering the fifth most total job losses, the state lost 31% of its clean energy workforce — the highest percentage of any state and double the national average of 15%.

Local Economies Hit

April’s edition of the analysis expanded to include losses by metropolitan areas and counties. By total job losses, five counties lost more than 5,000 clean energy jobs in April alone, including Los Angeles County, Calif.; King County, Wash.; Harris County, Texas; San Diego County, Calif.; and Cook County, Ill. As a share of their workforces, California and Georgia counties suffered the most, with four counties in each state losing at least 23% of their clean energy jobs.

The metro areas that lost the most clean energy jobs in April were metro areas with the largest populations and economies, including Los Angeles, New York City, and Chicago. Metro areas that were hit hardest as a share of their workforce varied more, with Cleveland, Las Vegas, New Orleans, and Pittsburgh all losing at least 18% of their clean energy jobs. ★

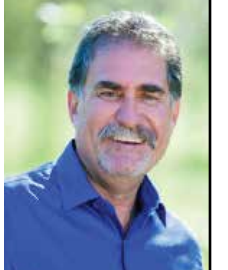

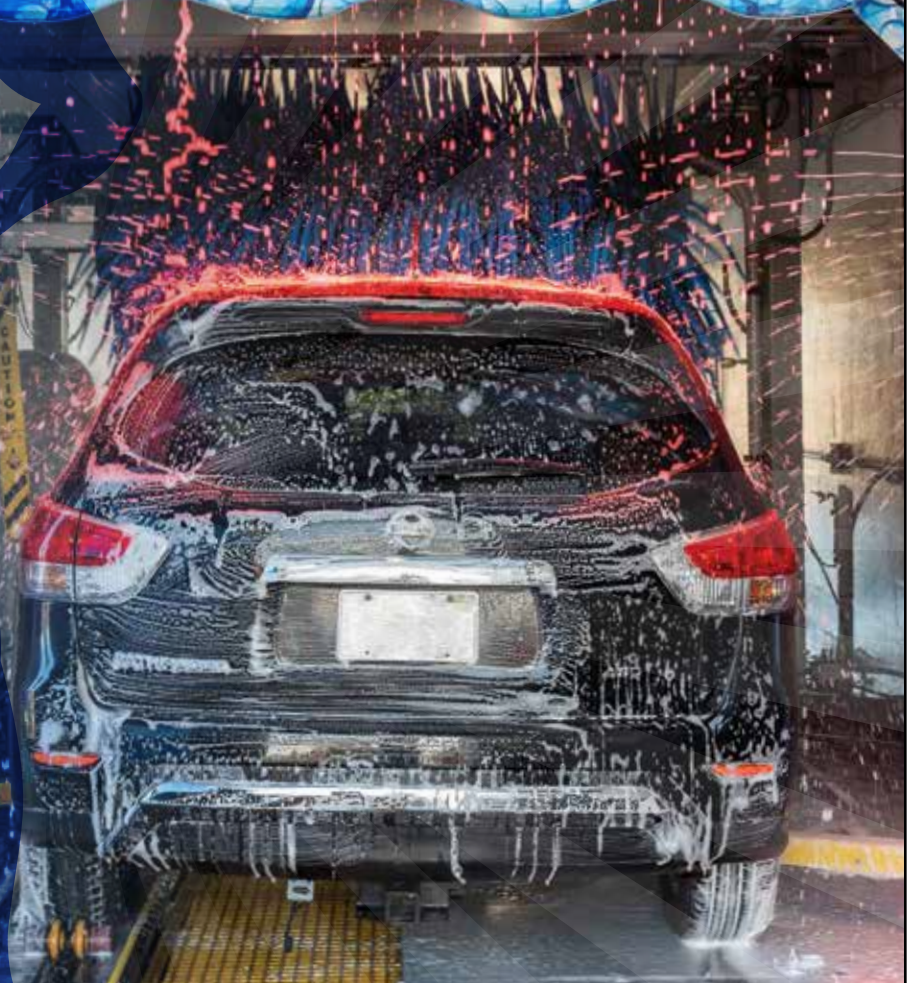

Social Security Matters

About the "Earnings Test" and "Registering" with Social Security

Dear Rusty: Does tax filing status matter when calculating how much you can earn without a reduction in your monthly SS payout? My wife and I have filed a joint income tax return for years. My wife is working and I'm 62 and wondering - if I start drawing SS, does the earnings limit only relate to what I earn, or does it include what my wife earns as well? Is the earnings limit tied to our IRS filing status? I need to know if I should file my taxes as a single to be sure my wife's earnings are not combined with mine to affect my Social Security payment.

Also, I've read that it's recommended to register online with SS if you're 62. As I understand it, this should be done even if one's not intending to start benefits yet. Is this true? What are the benefits for doing this? Does it make for a quicker start of payments once the election to start benefits is made? Would it help my wife should I die prior to starting my benefits?
Signed: Wondering

Dear Wondering: Income tax filing status doesn't matter when it comes to determining if



your earnings from work exceed Social Security "earnings limit." If you collect SS before you reach your full retirement age (FRA), your wife's earnings from working will not be counted toward your personal SS earnings limit. The earnings test looks only at your personal earnings and, if you exceed the limit, SS will take back some of your benefits. But only your personal earnings - as reported on your W-2 or Self-Employment tax return - count. If you're not working, then your Social Security benefits will not be affected by the earnings test, even if you file a joint return which has an Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) which is more than the annual earnings limit because your wife works.

As for your second question: it is not necessary, nor would it gain you any advantage, to "register" with Social Security before you are ready to claim your benefits. Indeed, Social Security does not even provide you with a way to do that. What they do provide is a way for you to create your own personal "My Social Security" online account, which gives you access to all of the online features provided by the Social Security Administration, including allowing you to apply for your benefits online (the fastest way to claim) whenever

you're ready to do that. Having an online SS account doesn't provide you with any benefit advantage, but it allows you to monitor your lifetime earnings record, get a replacement SS card if needed, and get estimates of your current and future Social Security benefits to help you decide when to claim. You can create your personal "My Social Security" account by going to www.ssa.gov/myaccount. They use a "two-factor" security process, which means you'll not only need to set up a password but also a second way to confirm your identity (usually via a code sent to a text-enabled cell phone or your email account). But, even if you have this online account pre-established, your wife will still need to contact Social Security directly to claim her survivor benefit if you predeceased her. Survivor benefits must be applied for by the surviving spouse directly contacting Social Security.

New York Story

New York is the greatest city in the world. It also is uniquely suited to the spread of the coronavirus.

As the national debate over re-opening continues and the political blame game intensifies, it's worth considering the scale of New York's outbreak. There is nothing like it anywhere else in the country, and almost nothing like it in the rest of the world.

The story of coronavirus in America is overwhelmingly the story of coronavirus in New York and its surrounding suburbs. Any account of how we got to this place, with deaths nationally headed toward 100,000, must center on New York, which was seeded with the virus early and then seeded much of the rest of the country.

Nearly 20,000 people have died in New York City. If the city were a country, it'd rank sixth in the world in total deaths, behind France and ahead of Brazil.

In New York City, according to a New York Times report, deaths have

been more than 300% above normal. In New Jersey, intimately connected to New York, deaths have been 90% above normal. Otherwise, no other state is close. In the rest of New York state, deaths have been 9% above normal.

The epidemic started early in New York. By the time it had its first confirmed case on March 1, there may have been as many as 10,000 undetected cases.

The city was getting seeded constantly from abroad. A study published by medrxiv.org concluded that "introductions from Europe account for the majority of cases found in NYC in the first weeks of March 2020." Then, people coming from or through New York spread the disease elsewhere in the United States.

A New York Times analysis found that the number of cases around the country correlated with how many travelers arrived from New York in early March. New York's connection to the world, especially Europe, its density and its mass transit system all made it a potent vector.

So, the question of how we could have kept the U.S. from getting so hard hit is really how we could have kept New York from getting so hard hit. Every

day counted, and better leadership at the federal, state and local levels would have made a difference, but we shouldn't underestimate the difficulties. Trump's early travel restrictions on China would have had to be imposed on Europe as well, when no one was contemplating that. New York's leaders would have had to warn people off the subways, shut the schools and torch the Big Apple's economy before any plainly visible metrics justified it.

This is why the simplistic shots at President Trump, who indeed should have taken the virus more seriously at the outset, don't work. He's the president of New York, but also of other large, international cities like Los Angeles and Miami that have escaped New York's fate. Has his leadership been better in those places, or do divergent conditions and local decisions account for the better outcomes?

None of this, of course, is to disparage New Yorkers. They have absorbed a gut punch over the past two months with characteristic grit and bravery. Yet, without New York's distinctive vulnerability, the course of the epidemic would look completely different.

Do Friends Really Understand The Maze of Medicare?

Toni King

Hi Toni:

I met with your office in late 2019 for a Toni Says® personalized Medicare consultation. I have a question regarding travel outside the United States due to COVID-19. Once everything calms down and there is travel to other countries, I would like to plan a trip overseas.

A friend recently gave me Medicare advice that now has me very confused. She told me that some Medicare Plans give foreign travel medical coverage such as Medicare Plan F, but not Plan G, which was my choice. Is that true?

Thanks for any help you can give me.

Medicare Alert! Your friend is giving Medicare advice and has no idea of what a Medicare Supplement covers. This is not the first time that a friend has confused someone trying to understand the maze of Medicare.

Medicare Supplement plans F, G and N cover the same limited amount of emergency foreign travel with illnesses such as COVID-19 and accidents. This is an extra perk

Medicare does not cover. The Foreign Travel plan has a \$250 deductible and \$50,000 lifetime maximum. The Medicare Supplement pays 80% to lifetime maximum of \$50,000 and the insured (you) pay 20% and amounts over the \$50,000 lifetime maximum.

Who knows what air ambulance from Greece will cost, but a big recommendation that I would suggest to you, Lee Anne is that you talk with your travel agent or explore online for true travelers insurance that will take care of your medical needs while traveling in countries around the world.

Remember that Original Medicare and Medicare Advantage plans only take care of medical and prescription drug expenses in the United States. Lee Anne be sure you have enough prescriptions while you are traveling overseas, or you will have to pay out of pocket.

Since your friend seems to be the Medicare Supplement Plan F expert, is she aware that starting January 1, 2020 changes were made to Medicare Supplement Plan F. For those enrolled in a Medicare Part A prior to January 1, 2020, they can apply for Medicare Plan F. Those who enroll in Medicare Part A after January 1, 2020 are not eligible to apply for Plan F and can enroll in Medicare Supplement Plan G

Here is a big surprise for your friend because Medicare Supplement Plan G can be more affordable than Medicare Plan F.

Medicare Plan N will be the lesser premium plan with more out of pocket.

Let's discuss the differences in Medicare Supplements Plan G and Plan N:

- **Plan G:** offers lower rates and the same Medicare benefits as Plan F except the Medicare Part B deductible is not covered and will be paid for by the enrolled Medicare beneficiary. Medicare Part B deductible for 2020 is \$198 which is Medicare Plan G's out of pocket.
- **Plan N:** generally, has lower premiums than Plan G with generally more out of pocket. There is a \$20 co pay for a doctor visit with \$50 co pay for emergency room. Medicare Part B deductible is not covered, and Medicare Part B excess charges are not paid for by the insurance company which Plan G includes. Plan N can have more out of pocket cost than Plan G.

America needs to realize that their friends care about their best Medicare interest, but knowing Medicare's rules are another issue. provide their policyholders with a 60-day grace period to pay their premiums. With the deadline for this grace period fast approaching, Commissioner Lara today issued a second Notice requesting insurance companies to work with their policyholders who may

be struggling financially to allow them an additional 60-days, effectively extending the grace period until July 14, 2020. After July 14, 2020, insurers are encouraged to work with their individual policyholders who have been acutely impacted by COVID-19 and are still unable to timely pay their

premiums.

“Consumers who have lost their jobs or businesses due to this crisis deserve flexibility in paying their premiums, just like any other,” said Commissioner Lara. “I am asking insurance companies to be mindful of the revenue stream Californians have consistently

provided to insurers over the years, stand with their customers in this crisis and extend grace periods an additional 60 days.”

Commissioner Lara is also requesting that all insurance agents, brokers, and other licensees who accept premium payments on behalf of insurers take steps

to ensure that customers have the ability to make prompt insurance payments, if and where possible. This includes alternate methods of payment, such as online payments, to eliminate the need for in-person payment methods in order to protect the health and safety of both workers and customers. ★

The maximum authorized assessment rate is equal to the maximum assessment rate in the first fiscal year the assessment was levied adjusted annually by the minimum of 1) 3% or 2) the change in the CPI plus any Unused CPI as described above.
The change in the CPI from December 2018 to December 2019 was 2.45% and the Unused CPI balance is 2.13%. Therefore, the maximum authorized assessment rate for fiscal year 2020-21 is increased by 3.00% which equates to \$56.07 per single family equivalent benefit unit. The estimate of cost and budget in the Engineer's Report proposes assessments for fiscal year 2020-21 at \$52.07 which is less than the maximum authorized assessment rate.

PG&E Crews and Contractors Inspecting Gas Meters in Counties

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As part of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) ongoing efforts to provide safe and reliable service to customers, utility workers will perform routine gas meter inspections in Fairfield, Sacramento, Suisun City, Loomis and Rocklin starting May 11. The inspections are expected to last throughout the month.

Safety is PG&E's most important responsibility. To help protect the health and safety of customers and employees during the COVID-19 pandemic, PG&E has taken precautions to maintain the recommended social distancing of at least six feet from customers when conducting routine safety inspections of gas meters.

PG&E employees and contractors with Underground Construction will be conducting inspections on foot with a mobile tablet, Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.

They will be wearing a hard hat, safety vest and carry photo identification, which they will present upon a customer's request.

If a person claiming to be a PG&E employee or contractor shows you his or her identification and you still feel uncomfortable, call PG&E's customer service line at 1-800-743-5000 to verify an appointment and/or PG&E's presence in the community. PG&E employees and contractors will walk up to the gas meters at homes and businesses but will not enter homes during these inspections.

During inspections, customers may see a PG&E employee or contractor on or near their properties as they access the gas meter. This work will not affect gas service. If we are unable to safely inspect the gas meter while maintaining a six-foot clearance from customers, we will contact you and schedule an appointment at a later date.

Expert Independent Review is Needed to Comb through PPE Contracts, Says Senate Budget Vice Chair

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Assembly Accountability and Administrative Review and the Assembly Governmental Organization Committees will host panel discussions on the state's failed contract with one company - Blue Flame. News reports have since exposed more troubling failures in administration contracting efforts. Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama) who, along with a group of lawmakers, has requested a thorough audit through the Joint Legislative Audit Committee of the sole source contracting practices in these multi-million dollar legal commitments, issued the following statement:

"This hearing is a step in the right direction."

"But taxpayers deserve a thorough forensic audit of how the state signed contracts committing hundreds of millions of dollars to bring federally certified masks but failed."

"Lack of an independent, nonpartisan

audit by competent experts is not acceptable. Without a full investigation into the procurement process that transpired, there will be public mistrust."

PLEASE NOTE: As stated on its website, "The California State Auditor is the only state entity that is given full access to all records of state and local agencies, special districts, and school districts. General powers of the California State Auditor include the ability to subpoena records, take depositions, and administer oaths. In all cases, information obtained by the California State Auditor that is legally confidential must be protected from release from the public."

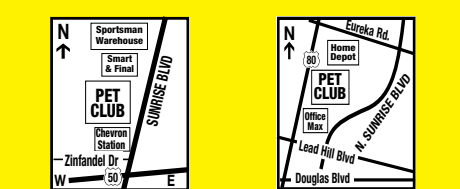
