#### Sac County **Health Officer Extends COVID-19 Order**

Sacramento County Press Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Public Health Officer has issued a new Public Health Order effective at 11:59 p.m., May 1, and will be in effect until 11:59 p.m., May 22, 2020, or until it is extended, rescinded, superseded or amended in writing by the Health Officer.

The Public Health Order reinforces the direction for all individuals to stay home and extends the terms of the order to continue social distancing and reducing person-to-person contact to further slow transmission of COVID-19.

"While there has been some relaxation of rules as they relate to recreational activities, it is absolutely vital that we maintain social distancing," said Dr. Peter Beilenson, Director of Health Services. "The intent of the order is to ensure that the maximum number of people stay home as much as possible while enabling essential services to continue, and that has been a significant factor in reducing the spread of COVID-19 in Sacramento County.

'We will continue to look at the health data and the availability of testing, and those factors will inform our decisions about modifying the Public Health Order in the future."

The new Public Health Order has clarified some essential activities and allowable recreational activities from the previous Order. Those include:

Essential Activities now allow for visiting a health care professional for medical or dental care for chronic conditions or preventive services; Allowing non-contact recreational facilities and activities that include the use of shared equipment, including shooting and archery ranges, disc golf, tennis courts and boating, provided that activities are in conformance with social distancing requirements and appropriate disinfectant processes; Contact sports or activities, including basketball, football and soccer are prohibited outside of residences; Healthcare providers and hospitals may reschedule appointments for care that was considered non-urgent and canceled when the Public Health Order was first issued. This includes elective procedures, preventive services such as immunizations and other care for chronic conditions; Residential viewings for rentals, leases and home sales are now allowable when the occupant is still residing in the residence. The requirement is still in place that the visit must be by appointment with no more than two visitors Continued on page 3



## **New Partnership Provides Innovative** Support to Sacramento Filmmakers

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -The 21st annual "A Place Called Sacramento"Film Festival will feature an entirely online Cast and Crew Call experience, thanks to a partnership between Access Sacramento and long-time "A Place Called Sacrament" Film Festival sponsor, Casting Calls America.

"Given what our nation is dealing with right now, we were extremely worried the actors and crew members who annually volunteer to make these films wouldn't get the chance to be on the big screen," said Gary Martin, Film Festival Director and Access Sacramento Executive Director. "We're thrilled our long-time sponsor Casting Calls America has stepped up to help us with a technology solution."

FilmFestO, a division of Casting Calls America, developed a new website and app, https://pcs.greenlit. app, exclusively for the "A Place Called Sacramento" Film Festival. Through the app, volunteer actors and technicians will be able to interact with the 10 winning filmmakers as they are announced May 20, and to submit their information online, free of charge, just as if they were at the traditional in-person cast and crew call.

According to Brian Jagger, Chief Innovation Officer for Casting Calls America, this means talent and crew will be able to submit directly to the 10 "A Place Called Sacramento" films, online and free of charge.

"Having started in and even an instant on-cam-Sacramento with Sacramento Casting (SacCasting.com), we are excited to help Access Sacramento keep this important local film festival moving forward," said Jagger. "Actors and crew will be able to submit their profiles directly to the producers through this innovative app."

The app will also stream the live television show on May 20, 2020 from Access Sacramento's TV studios in real time as 10 new writers turn into producers with the opportunity to have their 10-minute scripts turned into movies on the big screen and on cable television.

"This opportunity to support filmmakers with a virtual event wouldn't have been possible without the support of FilmFestO," said Martin. "The Casting Calls America team has been so accommodating in creating an app experience that allows volunteers and filmmakers to get connected so easily.'

Volunteer actors and technicians can begin immediately importing their contact information, pictures era audition in preparation for learning what this year's filmmakers will need to produce their films.

Another unique aspect of the app, pcs.greenlit.app, is that it is a Progressive Web App (PWA) which means it can be used and accessed through any device, using the devices browser, so there is no app store download required and those using a desktop computer can also use the app.

The announcement of this year's 10 winning writers on May 20th is the culmination of a writing and selection process with three rounds of blind judging to select the top scripts. In 20 previous years, 197 original 10-minute films all about a place called Sacramento have made their world premieres as part of the festival.

This year's "A Place Called Sacramento" Film Festival is scheduled for a one-day red-carpet event on Sat. Oct. 5 at the historic Crest Theatre in downtown Sacramento, subject to change depending on current health guidelines surrounding the

Coronavirus pandemic.

Continued from page 1 tough lesson. "We did lots of marching and push-ups," he recalls. "We had to make our beds and fold our clothes a certain way. There were no cell phones and no TV. The hardest thing for me was getting yelled at. But you learn not to take it personally. You kind of get broken down to be built up again – better and more focused."

Mom Coral noted big attitude changes when her son got home. "Cameron's attention span improved," she says. "He was more self-disciplined and was willing to do chores he didn't enjoy. To this day, his hospital corners are perfect. My son makes a bed better than I do."

Cameron believes CAP training will make him better at fundraising; he also credits his philanthropic efforts for ongoing success in the Patrol. "I used to be shy but fundraising taught me to be more social," he says. "I can budget. Any organization needs to spend its funds wisely. I can do media interviews and inspire teamwork. Fundraising's taught me not to try to do everything myself - I've learned to

motivate friends to help me." Chief Master Sergeant Dax's power of persuasion has already benefited his squadron. He's recruited five new members, including his dad – building contractor Jeff Dax - and his mom. "Cameron's enthusiastic and dependable," says Squadron 14's Commanding Officer Richard Markwell. He's a

credit to the uniform."

Now also in uniform, mom and dad are enjoying the group's activities. "Cameron's enthusiasm has always been infectious to those around him," says 2nd Lieutenant Coral Dax. ## **Social Security Matters**

#### Should My Wife Take Her Social Security at Age 62?

Dear Rusty: I have been advised by my financial planner to start my wife's social security benefits at the age of 62 (she is now 61). I am 65 and still employed, not on Medicare, and not taking social security benefits. My wife's benefits are much less than mine. I hope to wait until age 70 before starting my benefits. My income is currently \$160,000. Do you see this as a wise choice to start my wife's SS benefits at age 62? Signed: Inquiring Wife

#### Dear Inquiring Wife:

Whether your wife should start her benefits at age 62 depends upon whether her own benefit at age 70 would be more than she is entitled to as your spouse at her full retirement age (FRA). You can get these estimates from Social Security. If her own benefit would eventually be higher than her spousal benefit from you, she can wait to get her own higher benefit at age 70 (as you are). But if her benefit as your spouse will be the highest she can attain, then claiming her own benefit before you claim yours could be a



good choice, but there are some things to consider if she does that:


First, if your wife claims at age 62 (or any age before her FRA), that will mean that her eventual spousal benefit when she claims it (when you claim your SS) will be less than 50% of the benefit you are entitled to at your full retirement age. Taking her own benefit earlier than her FRA will mean her spousal benefit from you will be reduced to less than half of your FRA benefit amount, even if that spousal benefit starts after she has reached her FRA.

Second, if your wife is still working, by claiming FRA she will be subject to Social Security's "earnings test" which limits the amount of money she can make without SS taking back some of her benefits. For 2020, the annual earnings limit is \$18,240 (changes annually) and SS will take back benefits equal to half of any earnings which exceed that amount. The earnings limit becomes less severe during the year your wife reaches her FRA and goes away entirely after she reaches her FRA, but if she works while collecting early SS benefits the earnings limit could affect her benefits.

Third, your wife's Social Security benefits will become part of your taxable income (assuming you file "married-jointly"). Taxation of your wife's Social Security benefits will be determined based upon your combined income if you file your taxes as a married couple. At your combined earnings level, up to 85% of your wife's SS benefits will become part of your taxable

I'm not suggesting you not follow your financial planner's advice; I only want to make sure vou're aware of all the factors involved when benefits are claimed early. Sometimes, a wife claiming at age 62 is a prudent choice as your financial planner has suggested. But sometimes understanding the above factors may lead to a different strategy.

#### Social Distancing Isn't a Religion

Forgive Jacksonville, Florida, for it has sinned.

The largest city in Florida partly reopened its beaches, and it became something of a national scandal. CNN ran a disapproving segment, and the hashtag #FloridaMorons trended on Twitter.

As the CNN report put it: "The scene at Jacksonville Beach wasn't one of caution in the middle of a worldwide pandemic. Crowds cheered and flooded the beach when police took the barriers down. People were seen swimming, biking, surfing, running and fishing."

None of these activities has been shown to be a vector for the spread of COVID-19; in fact, no outdoors activities have been shown to be dangerous at all. A recent study examined hundreds of outbreaks and traced only one to an outdoor environment.

Surfers and bikers are the least of our worries. Yet, there is a segment of American opinion that takes it as its responsibility to scold and shame anyone who dares go out and get a

little fresh air.

Early on in the crisis, CNN anchors spent 20 minutes inveighing against people walking, running, biking and rollerblading along San Francisco's Embarcadero. Noting that some people were holding hands, Jake Tapper called it "enraging." Of course, random strangers don't hold hands, but people who are likely in close proximity whether they are enjoying a stroll or not.

Despite there being no indication that outdoor spaces abet the spread of the disease, parks have been shut down throughout the United States, and the closures are at times enforced with rigor. No less than Tom Brady was chased from a closed Tampa Bay park after he was discovered working out, apparently alone. A father in Colorado was briefly detained by police for the alleged offense of playing T-ball with his 6-year-old daughter on a softball field.

A sure sign of fanaticism is the inability to make distinctions, in this instance between risky and nonrisky activities and between places hard hit and places not. It's one thing to hold a day-long, 100-person family reunion in a public park, quite another to jog through one. It's one thing to begin opening up in New York City, where there have been

more than 10,000 deaths, and another to begin opening in Montana, where there have been 14.

Jacksonville, Florida is the seat of Duval County. With a population of nearly a million people, the county has had 17 COVID-19 deaths. It is hardly a hot

At least some of the spleen would be taken out of the coronavirus debate if people acknowledged that we live in a vast continental country, with radically different ways of life. Not only are not all states the same, not all counties within states are the same.

But such is the lockdown zealotry that any thought that these kinds of places should be treated differently is considered heresy sure to get people killed. It seems indisputable that the lockdowns have slowed the spread of the disease, but at an enormous economic cost. We are going to have to show some flexibility and be willing to adopt a patchwork approach to opening up around the country.

We can't be beholden to public officials and commentators who, to paraphrase H.L. Mencken, have the haunting fear that someone, somewhere may be rollerblading.

## **Spring Storms Not Enough to Offset Dry Winter**

**SACRAMENTO**, **CA** (MPG) - The season's final manual snow survey at Phillips Station was conducted by the Department of Water Resources (DWR). The survey recorded 1.5 inches of snow depth and a snow water equivalent (SWE) of 0.5 inches, which is 3 percent of the May average for this location. The SWE measures the amount of water contained in the snowpack, providing a more accurate forecast of spring runoff than snow

Measurements from the 130 electronic snow sensors scattered throughout the state indicate that the statewide snowpack's water equivalent is 8.4 inches, or 37 percent of the May average. The readings will help hydrologists forecast spring and summer snowmelt runoff into rivers and reservoirs.

"March and April storms brought needed snow to the Sierras, with the snowpack reaching its peak on April 9, however those gains were not nearly enough to offset a very dry January and February," said Sean de Guzman, chief of DWR's Snow Survey and Water Supply Forecast Section. "The last two weeks

have seen increased temperatures leading to a rapid reduction of the snowpack. Snowmelt runoff into the reservoirs is forecasted to be below average."

California's weather variability has been on full display this water year. Dry conditions in October and November were followed by precipitation in December that measured 120 percent of average. Very dry conditions returned to much of the state in January and February, with March and April storms leading to the snowpack peaking at just 66 percent of average on April 9.

In normal years, the snowpack supplies about 30 percent of California's water needs as it melts in the spring and early summer. The greater the snow water equivalent the greater the likelihood California's reservoirs will receive ample runoff to meet the state's

water demand in the summer and fall. The state's six largest reservoirs currently hold between 83 percent (San Luis) and 126 percent (Melones) of their historical averages for this date. Lake Shasta, California's largest surface reservoir, is 94 percent of its historical average and sits at 81 percent of capacity.

## Ask Joni **Past 65 and Receiving** The Medicare Part B Penalty ... Why?

Toni.

My Medicare Part B enrollment nightmare began when I was laid off from my job on March 10 th . I was given inaccurate information when I left my job and enrolled in COBRA to have knee surgery when I turned 67.

I am a 69-year-old female who has been employed by 3 different companies, and no one ever informed me that I needed to have a special form CMS-L564, "Request for Employment Information" signed by each company I worked for since turning 65.

I spoke to the district manager of my local Social Security office and she asked me why I never enrolled in Medicare's Part B when I left the company and enrolled in COBRA. I was informed that my penalty is 40%, which is 69-65 or 4 years. The penalty is not for 1 year, but forever!! Because I did not enroll in Part B at the right time.

Toni, please inform your readers how important it is to enroll in Medicare Part B when enrolling in when leaving or losing your employment or applying for COBRA after 65.

Cathie:

Last week, the Toni Says® Medicare office had repeated phone calls regarding this matter. Many that have been laid off and losing benefits were never told that they needed to have the CMS-L564 "Request for Employment Information" signed by every company they worked for since turning 65 and covered by employer benefits.

Americans do not realize how important it is to enroll the right way. At the Toni Says office, we inform those who come to the office for Medicare planning to be sure that Part B begins the day you lose your company benefits or the day your COBRA plan starts. Many try to enroll in Part B like you did Cathie with a BIG SURPRISE discovering they are penalized 10% each year or 12-month period, you could have had Part B. The penalty goes all the way back to the day he/she turned 65 or the day Part A began.

Cathie, your penalty is for 40% and the average Part B premium for 2020 is \$146.40. Your penalty will be \$146.40 + \$58.56 = \$204.96 per month for 2020. The amount will change each year.

The process to enroll in Medicare Part B past 65 whether laid off or retiring is the same:

Write in red letters Special E nrollment Period on each form for the Social Security agent that is processing them to know that you are signing up at the right time and keep from

giving you a penalty. You are applying for a SEP (Special Enrollment **Period).** (These forms are also available at the Toni Says office by emailing info@tonisays.com or calling 832/519-8664.

1)Form #1 Request for Employment Information (CMS-L564) for proof of group health care coverage based on current employment. This information is needed to process your Medicare enrollment application. If you have had 2 or more jobs since turning 65, then each company will have to sign this form. Be sure to have forms signed for both you and your covered spouse.

2)Form #2 Application for Enrollment in Medicare Part B(CMS-40B): Social Security fills out this form.

\*\*Currently, all Social Security offices are closed due to COVID-19 situation and both forms must be faxed or mailed together when sending to the Social Security office for yourself and/or spouse when applying for Medicare Part B. Please be sure to keep a copy for yourself.\*\*
