Walt Disney Imagineering Spotlights Local Students

GLENDALE, CA (MPG) - Walt Disney Imagineering – which dreams up and designs all Disney theme parks, resorts, cruise ships and other family entertainment experiences – selected six teams of finalists to compete in the 2020 Imaginations Design Competition, held Jan. 13-17. This year's teams included two local Sacramento region students studying at Laguna College of Art and Design as well as teams from Savannah College of Art and Design, Texas A&M University, United States Naval Academy, and University of North Carolina School of the Arts.

For this year's competition, teams were challenged to create an iconic

installation at the contestants' own campus or city that serves as an inspiration, honors the past, and is a vision of the future. It could be architectural, ornamental, static or active – whatever the team feels is the best way to represent their unique chosen location.

The competition also embraces both the intimate and grandiose of ideation – the guidelines are that the designs be appropriate for the location selected. In telling the very unique story of the chosen spot, it should respect and integrate local traditions and geography. This project should be a place to gather and celebrate, as well as reflect and educate the community – a concept that will go down in history as symbolic of the team's campus or city.

Teams consist of two to four college students and recent graduates who come from a myriad of majors comparable to the more than 100 disciplines at Walt Disney Imagineering, and were encouraged to tap into the expertise of everyone on their cross-disciplinary team in supporting this idea.

Carmichael student Matthew Mooney and Folsom student Valoia Laolagi presented The Laguna Beach Homestead, sharing the creative culture of Laguna Beach with the broader community through continued education, emphasizing the beautiful coast and the many artists it has attracted for over 100 years.

The homestead would give Laguna Beach's nearly 8 million annual guests

Legislators Announce Audit Request of Homelessness Spending

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) and Senator Brian Jones (R-Santee) announced that they have requested a statewide audit of homelessness spending in California. Joining them as coauthors on the request are Assemblymembers Phillip Chen, Steven Choi, James Gallagher, Tom Lackey, and Jay Obernolte. The Joint Legislative Audit Committee will consider the request on February 19, 2020.

"The Governor is approaching our homelessness crisis with the sense of urgency it requires, but it's important that we do not measure success just by how many dollars we spend," Assemblyman Kiley said. "Billions have been spent in recent years, yet people are not getting the help they need and the problem continues to grow. For the Governor's proposed investments to make a difference, we need a much better understanding of what is and is not working in our use of existing resources."

This week the Governor's homelessness taskforce led by Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg and Los Angeles County Supervisor Mark Ridley-Thomas recognized the need to evaluate past and current spending citing, "In order to expand access to mental health and substance abuse treatment for individuals experiencing homelessness, the state should work in tandem with counties to ensure that existing funding, funding proposed in the Governor's budget, and proposed Medi-Cal reforms align with the state's goals to improve access to treatment."

"Solving this dire crisis will definitely take aggressive funding, but simply throwing money at the problem is not a smart solution," said Senator Jones. "We need to ensure taxpayers' hard-earned dollars are being spent wisely and used effectively. This audit is necessary and will show us what's working - and what's not working - so we can make informed decisions moving forward that will actually help us start making a dent in the problem."

A Book About Living Lessons About Life, Learned from Death

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - "Universally, people are fearful of death. ... Everyone knows the finality of it," said Chris Meyer. He knows this all too well as the owner of three funeral homes in the Sacramento Region, including Lind Brothers Funeral Home in Carmichael (4221 Manzanita Ave.)

While helping people arrange funerals for their loved ones, Meyer said, "Over the years, the stories started repeating themselves. ... There's a pattern, there's these common themes." People shared their regrets — both for their lost loved ones and for themselves. These stories of regret are what inspired Meyer to write the book *Life in 20 Lessons: What a Funeral Guy Discovered about Life, from Death*.

"There have been hundreds of books written on grief, and death, and dying," said Meyer. His book is different: "It's not a book about dying; it's a book about living."

In the book, he writes that "the funeral home has also given me my greatest gift — perspective. ... I have sat with the survivors. I have listened to their stories, their cries, their confessions, their regrets, their wishes. ... So, I sat down and memorialized the lessons I learned to make certain you don't search your whole life only to realize the true meaning of life on your deathbed."

Meyer said the biggest regret he heard was "time. You can't get more time." That's why many of the lessons in the book encourage people to focus their time

Assemblyman Ken Cooley Applauds Governor's Effort to Combat Homelessness

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman Ken Cooley (D-Rancho Cordova) announced his support for Governor Gavin Newsom's comprehensive plan to reduce homelessness in California.

Governor Newsom has proposed a \$1.4 billion plan to combat homelessness in California by allocating money to help pay rents, build more affordable housing, construct more shelters, and expand services. Governor Newsom has also directed agencies to locate public land that can be utilized for emergency shelters.

"In my Assembly District, we have several supportive housing communities, including the Mather Veterans Village and the Mather Community Campus,

on the site of the former Mather Air Force Base," said Assemblyman Cooley. "I know from my experience in Rancho Cordova that when you provide housing and then place supportive services around that housing, it is very compatible with outstanding community life. I applaud Governor Newsom for staking out a leading role on this issue."

Assemblyman Cooley has long been committed to advocating for people experiencing homelessness. His service in the League of California Cities included serving as its 1st Vice President. He also chaired the organization's Housing, Community, and Economic Development Committee; and when he was on the League Board, he chaired the League's homelessness working group. In the State Assembly beginning in 2013, he served as a member of the Select Committee on Homelessness. Furthermore, he authored legislation in 2015 to increase funding for "rapid rehousing" services, and has supported nearly every piece of affordable housing and homelessness legislation before him during his seven years in the State Assembly.

"Housing and homelessness are crises in our State, and we must not let our fears or apprehensions

undermine our confident belief in a better future for all Californians," said Assemblyman Cooley. "Instead, we must bring confidence to the conversation and then add the full resources needed to properly meet this challenge, including evidence-backed solutions and partnerships between state agencies, local governments, and private organizations."

Continuing, he said: "Since December 1977, I have had the following John Wesley quote on the wall as a guide to my work:

'Do All The Good You Can By All The Means You Can In All The Ways You Can In All The Places You Can At All The Times You Can To All The People You Can As Long As You Ever Can'

I still measure my life by this standard. I am proud to support my Governor who shares this vision."

Ken and his wife Sydney have been married for 43 years and have made the east Sacramento County community of Rancho Cordova their home since 1977. Both his sons live there with their wives and children. Ken is a licensed attorney who graduated from McGeorge School of Law in 1984 and is a 1977 graduate of U.C. Berkeley. ★

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On February 8, 2020, the Vida de Oro Foundation will be giving away prom dresses for the second year in a row, but this year it will include young men's attire as well. The Vida de Oro Foundation, a public benefit nonprofit organization, has been informed by Quota International of Oroville and LULUs.com, that they will be contributing 1,700 prom dresses and some new shoes for this year's prom dress giveaway.

Established in 2016 and best known for producing the annual Sacramento Taco Festival, the Vida de Oro Foundation received over 600 prom dresses last year that were saved from the devastating Camp Fire in Paradise, California. With the help of the media and Sacramento Councilmembers Angelique Ashby and Allen Warren,

the Foundation gave away over 500 dresses to young women representing 73 different schools from throughout Sacramento and as far away as Fresno, Oakland, and Corning, California.

"This event creates an opportunity for young women to participate in a very important passage of life, attending their Prom," says Mina Perez, President/CEO of the Vida de Oro

Foundation. "And last year we had many requests from young men, but we were not set up to provide them suits. This year with donations from Armando Flores and CAFE, and Sacramento Kiwanis we'll be able to include young men."

The dresses, which vary in sizes, are donated under the condition that they be given away and not sold. With the assistance of U-HAUL, the dresses and suits will be given away at the former Wonder Bread building located at 1324 Arden Way, Sacramento, CA.

"All students need to be accompanied by a parent or responsible guardian and be attending a high school," adds Perez. "I firmly believe as this is an American Tradition and no student should be left out from attending their Prom because they did not have the right formal attire."

The dark depths of heart-rending grief would not be possible without a deep and profound love. He writes, "I hope you have felt that inconsolable pain because it means you have truly loved. Like a part of you is missing. Like a pit at the base of your stomach that disables your desire for food or sunlight or movement. And it lasts. Oh, how it lasts. That pain is commensurate with the amount you have loved — extreme pain, extreme love. Congratulations if you have felt that."

Talking about death everyday while raising three young sons was a surreal experience for Meyer. He was experiencing the

vibrance of new life while at the same time helping families face death and say goodbye. These profound moments taught him to be grateful for all the small, precious moments in life that can be so easy to overlook. He writes that he strives to be "a person who is rich in moments with their family. ... Family is complicated. But family is everything in this world."

Meyer also urges us to keep elderly friends and relatives close to us rather than shutting them away: "They need us." He explained that being around activity and staying engaged with family and friends keeps their minds active and gives them purpose. In the book, he writes, "Hold someone's hand, look into their eyes, and listen to their story. If there is no story, just hold their hand."

Driver Killed In Collision on Sutter Avenue

On January 16, 2020 at approximately 6:59 am, The California Highway Patrol (CHP) received a call of a two-vehicle traffic collision on Sutter Avenue west of Fair Oaks Boulevard. While en-route to the scene of the collision, CHP dispatch advised a vehicle was overturned on its side with an unresponsive male driver.

CHP officers responded to the collision scene and learned that a 54-year old man out of Carmichael had been driving his 2006 Chevrolet Equinox on Sutter Avenue westbound west of Fair Oaks Boulevard and had collided with a Ford F-150 pickup truck which was parked on the north curb edge of Sutter Avenue. After colliding with the parked F-150, the Equinox overturned onto its left side and remained until emergency personnel arrival. Sacramento Metropolitan Fire Department (SMFD)

responded to the scene of the collision and pronounced the driver dead at 7:18 am. Witnesses remained on scene and the cause of the collision is under investigation.

Dave Ramsey Says

There's No Magic Pill

Dear Dave,
My wife and I made a resolution this year to pay off \$20,000 in credit card debt we've accumulated. I want us to follow your plan, and live on a really tight budget. She wants us to use a debt consolidation company, like some of her friends have done. I'm really against her idea, but how can I change her mind?

—Blake

Dear Blake,
I'm glad you two have made the decision to get out of debt, and gain control of your finances. When it comes to this sort of thing, it's wise to remember there's no magic pill. No debt consolidation company is going to get you out of debt and help you stay

out of debt. The answer is learning how to control yourself and your behavior with money. Using a debt consolidation company seems appealing, because there's usually a lower monthly payment or lower interest rate attached. The problem in most cases, however, is the lower payment or interest rate exists only because the term is extended. You might pay a little less each month, but you end up staying in debt longer. There are other problems involved in using debt consolidation companies, too. For one thing, it can trash your credit for a long time when it comes to buying a car or a house. For these reasons I sometimes refer to it as a CON-solidation, because the whole thing is basically a con. They make you think you're really doing something about your debt problem, but the debt—and all the bad habits that caused it—are still there. My guess is your wife's friends think using a debt consolidation company is an easy, harmless way to

get out of a financial mess. But sometimes you've got to be an adult, admit the mistakes you've made, and do what it takes to straighten things out. This kind of thing isn't a math issue. It's a behavior issue. Making the decision to get out of debt and never go back there again, by living on a really tight budget and making sacrifices, is the best way to fix this mess and learn a lesson in the process.

Live like no one else, so that later, you can live—and give—like no one else. Stay away from debt consolidation companies, Blake. Doing this the right way is worth it!
