

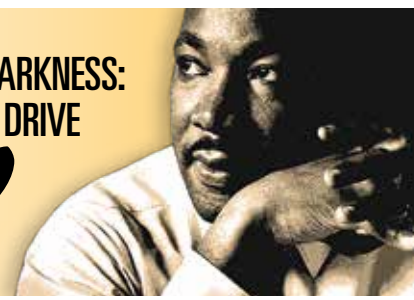

Stepping Out with Stephanie

New Chamber Executive on the Job

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The book-keeping is detailed, the meetings numerous and the responsibility huge. But Carmichael Chamber of Commerce executive director Stephanie Young is loving her new job. Recruited to replace former CEO Virginia Stone, Young moved into Chamber's Milagro Centre headquarters at the beginning of the year. Stone will remain as a mentor while the appointee eases into the position.

"My focus right now is on meeting as many Chamber members as possible," says Young. "We're also gearing up for our Person of the Year fundraiser (March 20) followed by the Best of Carmichael event (May 29). I'm so grateful to have Virginia's help with those. So far, our members have been warm and welcoming. I believe they're excited to see what new ideas I'll

bring to Chamber life." Previously an administrative analyst with Carmichael Park District, Young is now a lone Chamber employee. "In my old job, there were lots of staff and a few volunteers to call on," she says. "Now, it's just me – and Virginia – and lots of volunteers. But the great thing about volunteers is that they help because they want to, not because they have to."

There's no shortage of company out of office, either. The executive job entails daily encounters with business people, agency chiefs, elected officials, community leaders and residents. Sit-down meetings also fill her time. Young sits on the Chamber board and most of its committees. She is a Carmichael Improvement District director; a SMUD Advisory Council volunteer; she also serves a newly-formed co-op of Carmichael organizations called the Community Relations Committee. "My Chamber job is

more complex than it seems at first glance," she explains. "As with any non-profit, the executive must stay on top of detailed accounting. There are months of member events to plan ahead for; even our regular luncheons involve days of preparation. Fortunately, I'm a planner by nature; that comes from so many years in the recreation field. When you organize parades with 10,000 people involved, you prepare for bumps in the road. Back-up plans are always critical."

"The best part of my new job is building relationships with people," Young considers. "I want to help businesses have a great future in this area. And I want this community – that includes its 52,000 residents – to thrive. Our Chamber mission is to bring businesses and community together. That's my vision, too."

Are You Ready for The Presidential Primary?

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Once every four years, the state of California conducts a party Primary Election. The purpose of this election is for the voters registered within a party to help select a presidential nominee to represent that party in the November General Election. Sacramento County Voter Registration and Elections just mailed out a Voter Registration Status Postcard to every registered voter. The postcard is specific to the voter and lists name, address and registered political party. It is very important that voters review the information to ensure it is correct before ballots are mailed out the first week of February.

Political parties can choose to limit participation in their party's primary to only registered voters of that party. In other words, if you're a registered Democrat, you wouldn't be allowed to participate in the Republican primary. The same is true for any party that holds a presidential primary.

If a voter is registered with a political party, they will receive a ballot that contains presidential nominees for that party only.

If a voter is not registered with a political party, also known as "No Party Preference," they will receive a ballot that does not contain any presidential nominees.

However, they have the option to crossover and choose to request a ballot that contains nominees for the American Independent Party, Democratic Party, or Libertarian Party, for this election only without changing their voter registration. To crossover, voters can do one of four things:

Visit a Vote Center between Feb. 22 and March 3

If they would like to vote for presidential nominees in the Green Party, Peace and Freedom Party, or the Republican Party, then they must be a registered voter with that party. To re-register visit the California Online Voter Registration website.

Eligible residents that are not yet registered to vote can do so on the California Online Voter Registration website and be sure to select one of the political parties.

Series of December Storms Provides a Good Start to Sierra Snowpack

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Department of Water Resources (DWR) conducted the first manual snow survey of 2020 at Phillips Station. The manual survey recorded 33.5 inches of snow depth and a snow water equivalent (SWE) of 11 inches, which is 97 percent of average for this location. The SWE measures the amount of water contained in the snowpack, which provides a more accurate forecast of spring runoff. "While the series of cold weather storms in November and December has provided a good start to the 2020 snowpack, precipitation in Northern California is still below average for this time of year," said DWR Director Karla Nemeth. "We must remember how variable California's climate is and what a profound impact

climate change has on our snowpack." More telling than a survey at a single location are DWR's electronic readings from 130 stations scattered throughout the State. Measurements indicate that statewide, the snowpack's SWE is 9.3 inches, or 90 percent of the January 2 average. "It's still too early to predict what the remainder of the year will bring in terms of snowpack," said Sean DeGuzman, chief of DWR's Snow Surveys and Water Supply Forecasting Section. "Climate change is altering the balance of rain and snow in California. That is why it is important to maintain our measurements of the snowpack to document the change in addition to having critical information to forecast spring runoff." California traditionally receives about 75 percent of its annual precipitation during December, January and February, with the bulk

of this precipitation coming from atmospheric rivers. Similar to last year, California experienced a dry start to this water year followed by cold, wet December storms that brought the state up to 74 percent of average annual precipitation for this time of year. Climate change is expected to lead to continued warming and fewer but more intense storms impacting the snowpack of the Sierra Nevada. These changes continue to impact the distribution of snow across elevations, its pattern of accumulation, and rate of melt. DWR conducts five media-oriented snow surveys at Phillips Station each winter in January, February, March, April and, if necessary, May. On average, the snowpack supplies about 30 percent of California's water needs as it melts in the spring and early summer. For more information visit <https://water.ca.gov/>

As vice-president, Director Tobin will serve as a member of ACWA's leadership team that will guide the Association's advocacy and collaboration with the Newsom Administration, California Legislature, Trump Administration and Congress to protect and promote California's water interests. ACWA vice-presidents normally become president of the Association for the two-year term following

their vice-presidency and then serve as immediate past president for another two years. Consequently, Director Tobin will be involved at the highest level of ACWA leadership for the next six years. Tobin brings a wealth of regional and statewide experience to the position, serving: For the past two years on the ACWA Board of Directors as Chair of ACWA's Region 4 (covering Sacramento, San Joaquin, Solano, Stanislaus and Yolo counties); As a member of the Association's Federal Affairs and Local Government committees; And on the Board of the ACWA Joint Powers Insurance Authority. She also served as chair of both the Sacramento Regional Water Authority and Sacramento Groundwater Authority. While Director Tobin

is responsible for representing all members of ACWA in carrying out her leadership duties, her presence in ACWA leadership will ensure that issues of importance to San Juan Water District and the Sacramento region are addressed. Emergency Child Care Needed for Foster Families

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - To recruit more loving families for children in foster care, Sacramento County is making it easier to find and afford childcare services for resource families. The Emergency Child Care Bridge Program's goal is to increase the number of resource families for children in foster care by helping families find the right child care provider, connecting families to long-term child care subsidies, and by providing vouchers to pay for childcare for up to six months. The vouchers help ensure that a resource family has adequate support to balance work and home lives along with providing a smoother transition when welcoming a child into the home.

"There are new and exciting things coming to the Bridge Program in 2020," said Gloria Bedford, Human Services Program Planner. "The program is receiving an additional \$750,000 from

the California Department of Social Services that will go directly to child care vouchers to help more resource parents pay for daycare and help to stabilize foster placements more quickly."

From its inception in May 2018 through October 2019, the program in Sacramento County served 190 families who were fostering 264 children and issued \$1,165,230 in vouchers to resource families.

"More parents are working outside the home, which makes the ability to recruit and retain foster parents more challenging," said Michelle Callejas, Sacramento County Director of Child, Family and Adult Services. "The Bridge Program is vital to help the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services place more local foster children in homes where they will receive high-quality care and to support these families who open their homes and hearts to foster children."

There are three major components of the Bridge

Program:

Emergency child care vouchers that are issued to eligible families to cover child care costs for children ages 0-12 for up to six months;

Support from a child care navigator who will work with families to find a child care provider, assist with completion of child care applications, and develop a plan for long-term child care;

Trauma-informed care training so child care providers can learn strategies for working with children in foster care, many of whom have experienced trauma.

Families who are eligible for the Bridge Program include:

Resource families that have completed the Resource Family Approval (RFA) process;

Foster family agency-approved or county-approved foster homes;

Families who care for foster children in an emergency placement;

An approved relative or a non-related extended

after a two-day wartime courtship. And yes, their marriage lasted. “We’re fascinated by such stories,” says DaMant. “For those of us who were born in the US, meetings are a chance to discover our heritage.” British ancestry – even by marriage – enables DBE membership; Commonwealth-born members hail from many nations where Union Jacks once fluttered.

Queen Victoria’s vast empire may no longer exist, but Elizabeth II reigns on gloriously for the Daughters. At their June meeting, they sang “God Save the Queen” for the enduring monarch’s 91st birthday. Sausage rolls accompanied the celebration; strong breakfast tea was tiple of choice. “My wonderful English grandfather made me a tea-drinker,” says Regent DaMant. “I felt closer to him last year when I went to England for the first time.”

Nationwide, Daughters support fundraising for DBE-run senior homes. They also sponsor young women’s college scholarships. National annual meetings are diverse as the Empire upon which the sun never set. The recent 2019 gathering in San Francisco began with bagpipes, a parade of flags and a welcome from the British Consul. Indubitably guaranteed for conventioners was Scottish shortbread and lashings of correctly-made tea.

Turn the pot for efficient infusion. If milk (never cream) is required, a small amount goes first into the cup. Then pour tea and sip with genteel murmurings of appreciation.

Even if it's just two or three bucks a week, that action represents a lot of financially irresponsible behavior in your life.

I'm going to be very blunt with you. The lottery is a tax on the poor and people who can't do math. Your chances of winning are bleak at best. Did you know the odds of winning the Powerball jackpot are about 1 in 292,000,000? There are plenty of other very unusual things that are much more likely to happen to you than winning the lottery. Your chances of making a hole-in-one on the golf course are about 1 in 12,500. Even your odds of having quadruplets are around 1 in 11 million.

When times are tough and you're strapped for cash, the last thing you need to do is spend what little you have on gimmicks. My advice is to focus on working hard, living on a tight budget that cuts out all unnecessary expenses, and saving every penny you can. Unlike the lottery, this is a plan that works every time. When you start living on a budget and get out of debt, it provides a little bit of breathing room in your life. You might even feel like you got a raise!

Don't let your finances—and your dreams—be hijacked by the lottery.
