## Wall of Honor Tributes Recall Community's Finest



Patriots Park was the scene of remembrances last weekend. Located on the Carmichael, Citrus Heights and Fair Oaks border, the reserve contains a monument for fallen community heroes.

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Carmichael and Fair Oaks stalwarts gathered last weekend to recall fallen heroes of nation and community. The annual "Wall of Honor" ceremony was observed at Patriots Park.

Built in 2008, the reserve's stone

monument is dedicated to 14 local men – from military, police, CHP and fire-fighting forces – who died serving nation or neighborhood during Carmichael Park District's 57-year existence. The community pays tribute to the heroes each November. From the 1960s through to 2017 – from Vietnam battlefields to California highways – the heroes fell

while protecting American values. Space remains on the wall for plaque additions and the park district annually considers nominations.

Last Saturday's ceremony attendees included bereaved families; elected representatives and park district leaders. Congressman Ami Bera and County Supervisor Susan Peters

## California State Parks Thanks Military, Providing Free Admission at State Parks

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - California State Parks is honoring the service of veterans, as well as active and reserve personnel, by offering free admission to 144 state parks on Veterans Day, Monday, November 11.

"We invite our veterans and active/reserve military personnel to wear their uniforms with pride while visiting one of our beautiful parks," said California State Parks Director Lisa Mangat. "We thank them for their service and sacrifices to our country. This is a small gesture of our gratitude and appreciation."

A valid military ID must be presented to park staff in order to receive free admission to the California State Railroad Museum (Sacramento), Railtown 1897 State Historic Park (Jamestown), eight state vehicular recreation areas and 134 state parks accessible with the "California Explorer" Annual Pass. A list of participating park units is available at [www.parks.ca.gov/VeteransDay2019](http://www.parks.ca.gov/VeteransDay2019).

Participating parks include sites that honor historic military sites or veterans from the Mexican American War to the Cold War.

AB 150 (Olsen), signed by Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr. in 2013, authorized California State Parks to offer veterans, active duty, and reserve military personnel from the United States Armed Forces and the National Guard of any state a reduced or free-day use at participating state parks.

California's 280 state parks and the recreational programs supported by the department are a gateway to the well-being of environments, economies and all people. They offer the opportunity for families, friends and communities to connect through various recreational opportunities such as off-highway motor vehicle recreation, boating activities, horseback riding, on and off-road cycling, hiking, camping, rock climbing, tours, school group enrichment and special events.

Before leaving for a park, find out if any roads, trails and/or campgrounds are closed by visiting the park's webpage or the park's social media accounts. Check your destination's and route's weather conditions and prepare accordingly. And remember, safely share the road. Be prepared for equestrians, pedestrians, joggers, wildlife, rocks, tree limbs, etc., in the roadway. ★

## Colorful Service Will Bless Clan Regalia

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - As bagpipes skirl, families will present clan regalia for sanctification at St Michael's Episcopal Church (Carmichael) on November 23. In a pageant that celebrates most things Scottish, Pastors will

bless kilts, shawls -- even plaid ties -- with a laying on of hands. Sacramento Daughters of Scotia annually hosts the event.

"Kirkin'" (blessing) services for tartans were popular fundraisers for British war efforts during WW II and American Celtic organizations still stage the festivals. Armed Forces and Firefighter representatives

last year joined 25 families in presenting tartans for sanctification. "There's a great hungering in the Scottish community to celebrate our heritage in this way," says Daughters of Scotia member Kathy Hanson. Hymns and prayers complete the service; an afternoon tea and Highland dancing will follow.

Anyone may attend. A

procession of tartans begins at 1 pm at St Michael's Episcopal Church, 2140 Mission Avenue Carmichael. Collection Donations will benefit the Sacramento Food bank.

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - It's that time, when colorful leaves cover the ground, and the aroma of pumpkin pie and spices are everywhere. Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays are just around the corner. This is that joyful time of the year when we count our blessings around the Thanksgiving table, and enjoy the spirit of Christmas with family and friends as we unwrap beautiful carefully packed gifts.

Did you know that there are many children around the world, who have never received a gift in their life time? Did you know that there are children who are not able to go to school because they do not have their own pencil or notebook? Going to school means a lot more than

getting an education. Often it means getting a meal at least once a day. The life of a child who had never experienced such blessings as having a new toy, their own drinking cup or even a toothbrush, is very difficult.

Operation Christmas Child (OCC) is one of many projects of the Samaritan's Purse organization that delivers the Good News and Great Joy to children around the world. Simple shoebox gifts have life changing impact. Every child deserves to experience Christmas at least once in their lifetime.

# El Camino Center for The Arts Named Best In Real Estate 2019

## San Juan Unified School District

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - The El Camino Fundamental High School Center for the Arts was named by the Sacramento Business Journal as the top real estate development project (education category) in the Greater Sacramento region.

San Juan Unified was honored along with the project's design-build contractor McCarthy Building Companies, Inc. and architect HGA Architects at an awards breakfast Sept. 20 at McClellan Conference Center.

The Center for the Arts – a 14,000-square-foot, 500-seat theater with a full stage, control center, lobby, and orchestra pit – stood out among other education projects in large part because it was the district's first design-build project. With design-build, contractors, and architects bid for a construction project as an entity based on qualifications. The design-build method has not historically been utilized by K-12 school districts in California.

"San Juan Unified is a pioneer here, not only in Sacramento County but Northern California," Frank Camarda, San Juan Unified Assistant Superintendent, told

the Business-Journal. "Most other districts have not caught on."

The design-build benefit for El Camino was that San Juan Unified was able to bring on a team of HGA and McCarthy, both of which have extensive experience designing performing arts spaces with a high emphasis on acoustics and lighting.

"It had to have the highest acoustical sound rating you could get in a high school theater," Camarda said.

Other real estate projects to be honored by the Sacramento Business Journal include The Bank restaurant (downtown Sacramento), Elk Grove Aquatics Center, Sutter Medical Foundation West Roseville Campus, The Hardin (downtown Sacramento), Bennett's Kitchen-Bar Market and the Sacramento Memorial Auditorium restoration project among others.

The Center of the Arts was funded by Measure N as El Camino's high school signature project. Along with the Sacramento Business Journal award, it has also received an Honor Award from the Concrete Masonry Association of California and Nevada and a Construction Management Association of America Design-Build Award. ★

*Continued from page 1* were among speakers. Dr. Bera said the nation should "pause and consider values that bring us all together."

Supervisor Peters noted that the 12-year-old park's landscaping was maturing and its masonry was gathering the patina of age. "This park is more than a recreational gathering spot," she said. "Patriots Park serves a deeper meaning. The individuals listed on this wall remind us how grateful we are to men and women who wear different uniforms but have a common bond in putting service above self. Regardless of whether they wore a Sheriff's uniform

or that of the Highway Patrol or a branch of the armed services or of fire protection, each was dedicated to the common good. They believed in serving us. It is fitting that we continue to remember each honoree."

"We recognize the passage of time does not shield you from the emptiness you feel," Peters told families of the fallen. "We nevertheless hope Patriots Park is a source of comfort and pride in remembering your loved ones. Whatever uniform your loved one wore, we will be forever grateful for their dedication, commitment and service. The community will never

forget them."







# Changes to Plan F... Causing Medicare Supplement Renewal Premiums to Rise!



Toni,  
We have received a 20% increase in our Plan F Medicare Supplement. I'm a 70-year-old female in decent health, but my husband is undergoing cancer treatment. Also, his cardiologist has advised him that he may need a pacemaker. I've understand told that Medicare Annual Enrollment is our time to change our Medicare Supplement plans. I'm concerned that with the Medicare Supplement increase that we may not be able to afford the premiums with future increases. Would a Medicare Advantage plan be a good option to change to with Fred's cancer issues? What we should do? Signed Cathy from Virginia

Cathy:

Cathy, you were given wrong information because you do not have to wait until Medicare Annual Enrollment to make a Medicare Supplement change. You can change your Medicare Supplement any time during the year. Medicare Annual Enrollment is a time to change your Medicare Advantage plan or Medicare Part D Prescription Drug plan. You are not alone with receiving a Medicare Supplement

plan F increase. It seems that the Plan F renewal increase is more than the Plan G or other Medicare Supplement plan increases. Most insurance agents are finding out about the increases via an email from the insurance company informing of a renewal rate adjustment.

In 2015 Congress passed legislation called "Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015" (MACRA) to help the medical industry by correcting the "Doc Fix" proposal. MACRA also made changes to Medicare Supplement's plans F and C which begins January 1, 2020.

Those who want to change their current Medicare Supplement plan and have had their Medicare Part B longer than 6 months must now answer underwriting questions regarding their health as you and your husband will have to do.

Cathy, you have an option to change from Plan F to other Medicare Supplement plans such as plan G or N, but you must qualify medically. If you cannot qualify because of a health issue, then there is a Medicare Advantage plan which puts you in control of your healthcare called a Medicare Savings Account (MSA).

**Let's discuss the difference:**  
 • Medicare Supplement Plan G: offer lower rates and the same Medicare benefits as Plan F except the Medicare Part B deductible is not covered

and will be paid for by the enrolled Medicare beneficiary. Part B deductible for 2019 is \$185.



## Sacramento County DA Reports

**Sentenced for Insurance Fraud, Accessory After the Fact**  
DATE: October 29, 2019  
CASE: Jose Leyva & Leticia Leyva (Case #19FE004862)  
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Suzanne Salazar, Insurance Fraud Unit

The Honorable Michael Savage sentenced Jose Leyva to 90 days and Leticia Leyva to 60 days in county jail. Both defendants were ordered to pay \$9,277 in restitution. On October 16, 2019, Jose Leyva pled to felony insurance fraud and Leticia Leyva pled to misdemeanor accessory after the fact.

Jose Leyva and his wife, Leticia Leyva, owned a car, which was being driven by their adult son. Their son was driving the car in the middle of the night when he crossed over into the opposite traffic and hit a car head on. The collision caused serious bodily injury to the son's passenger and the other driver as well as damage to both vehicles. Immediately following the crash, the son fled the scene on foot. Soon after, he called and spoke to his father twice. When dispatch contacted Mr. and Mrs. Leyva to inquire about the vehicle, they claimed the car had been stolen. They also insisted that their son was home asleep. The facts showed Mr. Leyva's cellphone was tracked from his residence in Sacramento to the area of the collision in Woodland. Mr. and Mrs. Leyva then attempted to file a stolen vehicle report with law enforcement and continued to insist the car was stolen to their insurance company.

**Defendant Convicted of Shooting, Murdering Partygoer**  
DATE: October 23, 2019  
CASE: Dayshawn Jackson (Case #18FE007348)  
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Laura West, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

Dayshawn Jackson was convicted by a jury of the second-degree murder of Larry Ragsdale Jr., shooting from a car at a person, and being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found that Jackson personally used and discharged a firearm causing death during the commission of the murder and firing from the car.

A few minutes past midnight on August 27, 2017, Dayshawn Jackson was inside the car he was driving when he fired a gun multiple times at people outside of a party that was taking place. The victim was struck in the torso and killed as he stood in front of the party talking with friends.

The court found that Jackson had previously been convicted of a strike, first-degree residential burglary. Jackson faces a maximum sentence of 55 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for December 13, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 24 before the Honorable Shellyanne Chang.

**Defendant Convicted of Murdering Girlfriend at Hotel**  
DATE: October 17, 2019  
CASE: Lucas Sanchez (Case #17FE016812)  
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Allison Dunham, Homicide Unit.

On October 4, 2019, Lucas Sanchez was convicted by a jury of the first-degree murder of Jennifer Rutter. The jury also found that Sanchez personally used a deadly or dangerous weapon in the commission of the murder. Sanchez entered a plea of not guilty by reason of insanity. On October 16, 2019, the jury found Sanchez was legally sane when he committed the murder.

Sanchez and the victim were in a relationship. On the morning of September 11, 2017, Sanchez and the victim were sleeping at a local hotel. Sanchez woke up paranoid and delusional from using methamphetamine. He took a closet rod out of the closet and beat the victim in the head as she slept. The victim fled out of the hotel room naked and bleeding. Sanchez proceeded to beat her in the head with the closet rod in the hotel hallway. A public safety conference was taking place at the hotel that morning. Law enforcement officers arrested Sanchez on the scene. An autopsy determined the victim died from seven to 10 blunt force blows to her head causing multiple facial and skull fractures.

Sanchez faces a maximum sentence of 26 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for November 14, 2019, in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Sweet.

### California Can't Keep the Lights On

California is staying true to its reputation as the land of innovation — it is making blackouts, heretofore the signature of impoverished and war-torn lands, a routine feature of 21st-century American life.

More than 2 million people are going without power in Northern and Central California, in the latest and biggest of the intentional blackouts that are, astonishingly, California's best answer to the risk of run-away wildfires.

Power — and all the goods it makes possible — is synonymous with modern civilization. It shouldn't be a negotiable for anyone living in a well-functioning society, or even in California, which, despite its stupendous wealth and natural splendor, has blighted itself over the decades with misgovernance and misplaced priorities.

The same California that has been the seedbed of world-famous companies that make it possible for people to send widely

viewed short missives of 280 characters or less, and share and like images of grumpy cats, isn't doing so well at keeping the lights on.

The same California that has boldly committed to transitioning to 50 percent renewable energy by 2025 — and 100 percent renewable energy by 2045 — can't manage its existing energy infrastructure.

The same California that has pushed its electricity rates to the highest in the contiguous United States through its mandates and regulations doesn't provide continuous access to that overpriced electricity.

California could have, if it wanted, pushed the utilities to focus on the resilience and safety of its current infrastructure — implicated in some of the state's most fearsome recent fires — as a top priority. Instead, its public utilities commission forced costly renewable energy initiatives on the utilities. Who cares about something as mundane as properly maintained power lines if something as supposedly epically important — and politically fashionable — as saving the planet is at stake?

Meanwhile, California has had a decadeslong aversion to properly clearing forests. The state's leaders have long been in thrall to the belief that cutting down trees is somehow an offense

against nature, even though thinning helps create healthier forests. Biomass has been allowed to build up, and it becomes the kindling for catastrophic fires.


As Chuck DeVore of the Texas Public Policy Foundation points out, a report of the Western Governors' Association warned of this effect more than a decade ago, noting that "over time the fire-prone forests that were not thinned, burn in uncharacteristically destructive wildfires."

In 2016, then-Gov. Jerry Brown actually vetoed a bill that unanimously passed the state Legislature to promote the clearing of trees dangerously close to power lines. There shouldn't be any doubt that California, susceptible to drought through its history and whipped by fierce, dry winds this time of year, is always going to have a fire problem. But there also shouldn't be any doubt that dealing with it this poorly is the result of a series of foolish, unrealistic policy choices.

California's overriding goal should have been safe, cheap and reliable power, public good so basic that it's easy to take for granted. The state's focus on ideological fantasies has instead ensured it has none of the above.

### As Safe as a Neighborhood Bank?

Dear Dave, What are your thoughts about online banks? Are they as safe as traditional, neighborhood banks? — Jeanna

Dear Jeanna, Sure, if they're guaranteed by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. The FDIC is one of two agencies that provide deposit insurance to customers in America's depository

institutions. The other is the National Credit Union Administration, or NCUA, which insures and regulates credit unions.

If you're seriously considering using an online bank, there are a few things I'd advise checking out before making the move. Look into the bank's track record, and see how long it has been open. Also, if the bank you're considering doesn't have a name-brand you recognize, find out the amount of its deposits.

Online banks don't worry me today like they did 10 years ago. And almost everyone does some form of online banking now, anyway. If the bank in question has a good reputation, and sufficient deposits to have some strength in its FDIC guarantee, I wouldn't worry about it.

# Impeaching a President, High School Civics for Politicians

Constitutional instructions for impeaching a president of the United States are very specific. Actually, reading the Constitution should easily put to rest the proposed impeachment of President Donald J. Trump. His enemies obviously have not done so.

Impeachment means tried by the U.S. Senate for "treason, bribery, or other high crimes and misdemeanors," whether found guilty and removed or acquitted and remain in office. It begins in the House of Representatives who formulate the alleged charges then passes to the Senate for trial.

In the case of Trump the Democrats called for his

impeachment before he took the oath of office, before he made a single decision as president, or nominated a single cabinet member. Enemies began immediately searching for a crime. All other impeachment proceedings began first with a specific crime—Trump's was being elected.

The "crime" for Andrew Johnson was his violation of the Tenure of Office Act which Congress had just passed requiring him to first get their permission before removing a cabinet member. To test the constitutionality of what is now common practice, Johnson fired Edward Stanton as Secretary of War. Johnson was accused by the House but spared conviction in the Senate. So, the impeached (tried) president remained in office.

Richard Nixon was never impeached because, although accused by the House, he was never tried by the Senate. He resigned the presidency before the charges of the House could be hand delivered to the Senate for trial. The "crime" hinged on his alleged cover up of the break-in of the Democratic Party national headquarters

at Watergate. These would have included obstructing justice, abuse of power and contempt of Congress. But he was never tried, thus not impeached.

For Bill Clinton the "crime" was "high crimes and misdemeanors." The specific charges were lying under oath (perjury), abuse of power, and obstruction of justice; charges that stemmed from a sexual harassment lawsuit filed against Clinton by Paula Jones. The senate did not come to the necessary 2/3 majority, so he was acquitted (Art I, Sec. 3, Cla. 6). Tried (impeached), like Johnson, but not removed from office.

Who formulates impeachment charges? The Constitution reads: "The House of Representatives ... shall have the sole Power of Impeachment," (Art. I, Sec. 2, Cla. 5). The people placed him in power and their representatives—the House—alone initiates and formulates the charges for his possible removal. But formulating the charges does require a favorable vote of the FULL House.

Who tries the charges? "The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments. When sitting for that Purpose, they

shall be on Oath..." (to support the Constitution and tell the truth).

Who presides at the trial? "When the President of the United States is tried, the Chief Justice [presently John Roberts] shall preside." (Ibid. Sec. 3, Cla. 6).

But a president can be removed for only four reasons. "The President... shall be removed from Office on Impeachment for, and Conviction of Treason, Bribery, or other High Crimes and Misdemeanors." (Art. II Section 4). Can we remove a president we simply do not like? Only in the next election.

What are the charges against Trump? His enemies first tried treason, "he's a Russian spy." That failed! What about bribery? That's hard when he gives to charity his monthly salary. Then collusion and obstruction of justice under "high crimes," those failed too. How about adultery with Stormy Daniels and others? But that was before his election and John F. Kennedy and Bill Clinton did adultery as presidents in office, Clinton even with an intern in the Oval Office, and that was not enough to call for his office.

Adultery effectively erased less serious charges essentially removing from the Constitution misdemeanors as impeachable offenses.

Enemies then tried the 25th Amendment, containing a provision that allows for the forceful removal of a sitting president who cannot physically continue to serve. They tried, he's crazy therefor unfit for office, Rod Rosenstein offering to wear a wire to entrap the president. They could not find a cabinet member to so state. About 15 different accusations, all backfired—even the The Mueller Report. For three years our hostile establishment and Democratic news outlets never let up. Within weeks, the Russian Hoax was replaced with the "Ukrainian Hoax" but the promised Quick Pro Quo could not be found. Still no impeachable offenses.

If the intelligence community went rogue with a coup to undo the 2016 presidential election, which we have documented in previous columns, it is Trump's absolute duty to take this story to its original source, in the Ukraine in 2016, for complete exposure so it never happens again for any president of either party.

The Constitution requires it. "He shall take Care that the laws be faithfully executed" (Art.II, Sec. 4). As does his oath of office: "I do solemnly swear...that I will faithfully execute the Office of President of the United States, and will to the best of my Ability, preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of the United States" (Art. II, Sec. 1, Cla. 8).

So impeachment does not necessarily mean removal from office as Johnson and Clinton finished their terms. Nor will it for Trump. He will be acquitted for the same reason as Clinton—partisan politics—and likely will be reelected as no crime has been established.
