## Grand Old Flag Gets Brand New Home

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Some patriots make huge efforts for their flag. A band of Carmichael brother and sister veterans lobbied for four years to get a flagpole so they could salute their nation's emblem at Oakmont senior residence. The Greatest Generation's dogged determination paid off as the Stars and Stripes last week rose over their home. Above, a CHP helicopter hovered in tribute. Congressman Ami Bera presented a US flag that had recently flown above the United States Capitol. A bugle sounded and warriors of WW II, Korea and Vietnam theaters recited the Pledge of Allegiance. The Engle Road facility counts 23 veterans - six of WW II vintage - among residents. One of its Vietnam survivors, "the General" Michael Crawford, retired as a two-star

general with two Silver Stars, two Purple Hearts and a Distinguished Flying Cross on his jacket.

Oakmont picked up the \$5,200 tab for the new steel and aluminum staff. "Original plans for this property included a flag pole," explained WW II and Korea veteran Bill Davies. "For some reason it wasn't put in. I'm from a five-generation military family; we always flew a flag at our home. The emblem means so much to people who have served under it."

This unflinching campaigner and friends picked up the baton and eventually nudged Oakmont administration to erect the edifice. Davies shepherded it through the permitting process with visits to county hall, and was among the first to salute when the 25-ft pole rose in the residence courtyard. "We're elated," says the 91-year-old. "Old Glory's flying 24/7

and we'll honor it every chance we get. To the veterans who live here, it's an emblem of everything we valued and fought for."

Former Air Force Major Dwight Worden flew 200 combat missions in the Vietnam War. "It's important for us to have this at our home," he explained. "Our flag is an emblem of everything we valued and fought for..." ★



## Democrats Vote to Crush, Destroy Independent Contractors

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)**

- On September 10th, members of the California Senate Republican Caucus voted against Assembly Bill 5 which would threaten the livelihoods of many California independent contractors. AB 5 undercuts workers' freedom in many industries to choose independent work and threatens their employment status. The author of AB 5 offered carve-outs for several well-connected professions which favored certain industries over others.

On the Senate floor tonight, Senate Republican Leader Shannon Grove (*R-Bakersfield*) introduced an amendment to AB 5 which would have conformed California's test for employment with an existing federal standard and offered parity across the board. Senator Brian Jones (*R-Santee*) presented a separate amendment that would have delayed the implementation of the Dynamex decision for two years.

In addition, other members of the California Senate Republican Caucus offered amendments to AB 5 that would provide exemptions for the following industries: forestry, health care professionals, newspapers carriers and distributors, physical therapists, interpreters, translators, single truck owner-operators, non-profits, franchisors, franchisees, and design who were excluded from AB 5. Senate Democrats blocked these efforts to protect the employment status of independent contractors.

"Over 2 million Californians choose to work as independent contractors and AB 5 only protects certain industries. I am proud to have stood with my Republican colleagues in offering better solutions to protect workers in industries such as healthcare, transportation, and newspapers carriers and distributors. If the governor truly believes in supporting a California for all, then he needs to do the right thing and veto AB 5." - *Senate Republican Leader Shannon Grove (R-Bakersfield)*

"I opposed Assembly Bill 5 because it undermines the principle of equal treatment under the law and deprives many Californians the right to be their own bosses. The bill's Christmas tree of exemptions is a prime example of the Legislature picking winners and losers. Why should some people enjoy an exemption while others such as newspaper carriers and language interpreters and translators do not?" - *Senator Patricia Bates (R-Laguna Niguel)*

## Mira Loma Community Signs Steel Beam for New Science Building

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Hundreds of Mira Loma High School students, staff and community members took a moment to sign their name onto a steel beam that was installed onto the frame of the school's future science building.

The excitement for Mira Loma's signature project was buzzing throughout the day as students penned their names to the beam, and iron workers continued working to frame the new building piece-by-piece a short distance away.

"I think it's nice that we get to sign this beam, and then all the students will have their name in this building forever," said sophomore Andy Chittenden.

San Juan Unified Assistant Superintendent of Facilities, Maintenance & Transportation Frank Camarda said the Mira Loma science

building is right on track to open by August 2020, in time for the next school year. Passersby that have noticed the steel work going into place will soon start to see a roof go up, and work on solar-paneled car parts in the parking lot area will begin in the next couple of months.

"It really is a great thing for our campus to actually see it being built," said James Hill, science department chair.

The two-story science building will include "next-generation" classrooms and labs for all of the sciences including chemistry, physics, physical and earth science. An outdoor observation deck and flex space are also included in the design.

"It's really exciting to see the project come to life. We've spent a lot of time doing site work, so this part, where you see the vertical construction is really exciting," Camarda said.

The signed steel beam is the final piece installed and celebrated by the construction crew with what is known as a "topping out ceremony" where it is swung into place with an American Flag attached to it.

Staff and students at Mira Loma are indeed excited for the future, not only for the science building but for the trickle-down effect of how the building will affect other programs as well.

"I'm impressed that science gets its own separate building and then (other) teachers that don't have a classroom can move into the other classrooms," sophomore Melissa Moskvych said.

Mira Loma's science building is funded by Measure N and is being built by DPR Construction and was designed by Lionakis Architects. Construction Management firm ICS is overseeing the project in conjunction with San Juan Unified staff. ★

creation of the gig economy giving economic opportunities to folks outside of the traditional workplace. AB 5 will not only limit an individual's ability for flexible employment, but will destroy entire industries across California. # Behind the Wheel or on Foot, Think Two Steps Ahead

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - September is Pedestrian Safety Month, and the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) is asking drivers and people walking to look out for one another.

"Despite advances in vehicle technology that act as additional safety measures for drivers and passengers involved in a crash, pedestrians are still just as vulnerable as in years past," OTS Director Barbara Rooney said.

"Whether we are driving or walking, we are all going places so it is important that we avoid bad habits and put safety first."

According to a report released this year by the Governors Highway Safety Association (GHSA), a projected 6,227 pedestrian deaths occurred nationwide last year, the highest number since 1990. In California, 858 pedestrians were killed in 2017, accounting for nearly 25 percent of all traffic deaths.

It is why the OTS is working

with our safety partners, state and local agencies on educating the public about safe roadway habits, regardless of how you get around.

"People should not be afraid of a car hitting them as they cross the street," Rooney said.

"Having said that, it is important that pedestrians are aware of their surroundings and think about how they would want a pedestrian to act if they were the one driving."

The OTS offers the following tips for drivers and pedestrians

to help ensure we all get to where we need to go safely:

For pedestrians: Cross the street at crosswalks, preferably with a stop sign or signal. Do not cross the street midblock (no jaywalking); Make eye contact with drivers; Look for cars backing up. Avoid darting between parked cars; Wear bright color clothing during the day and use a flashlight at night; Do not use your cell phone or wear ear buds while walking.

For drivers: Avoid distractions such as a cell phone; Never drive

under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs; Watch for pedestrians when backing up; Follow the speed limit; Yield to pedestrians at crosswalks. Make sure the path is clear before making a turn at an intersection.

The OTS administers funding for traffic safety programs statewide with the goal of reducing crashes that result in deaths, injuries, and economic losses. The OTS is a department under the California State Transportation Agency (CalSTA). ★

**U.S. FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The U.S. continues to experience cases and outbreaks of measles, largely due to unvaccinated or under-vaccinated segments of the population. Measles can be a serious disease. This year has seen the greatest number of measles cases reported in the U.S. since 1992, and since measles was declared eliminated in 2000. Of those diagnosed with measles,

approximately 10% have required hospitalization. The majority of cases are among people who were not vaccinated. The Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) vaccine has been approved in the U.S. for nearly 50 years. It is highly effective and very safe. As a result of its use, measles was declared eliminated in the U.S. in 2000, rubella in 2004, and since 1989, mumps cases have decreased by 99%. ★

**The Threat of Red Britain**

Tory Prime Minister Boris Johnson has, to his credit, seized the initiative in the battle over whether Britain will truly exit the EU, and on what terms.

But no one can know how this high-stakes gamble will turn out. Johnson just lost his slender parliamentary majority, and the prospect of a new election looms. If things break the wrong way, the winner could be opposition leader Jeremy Corbyn, a throwback leftist redolent of the bad old days of Britain's self-imposed stagnation.

It's hard to exaggerate the threat represented by Corbyn and Co. taking control of our most important ally. In U.S. terms, Corbyn is a mashup of Bernie Sanders and the Squad, mixing orthodox socialist economics with a hostility to U.S. foreign policy and Israel.

He is a figure that time is supposed to have forgotten. He inveighed from the back benches against Labor's turn away from the old-time religion under moderate prime

minister Tony Blair. When he mounted an unlikely leadership bid in 2015, he found an audience, much as Bernie Sanders did in 2016. Now, the old-time religion is a few lucky breaks away from power.

Corbyn's past, and present, is littered with valentines to left-wing thugs. He cozied up to the IRA in the 1980s when it was trying to decapitate the British government by bombing. He wrote for a pro-Soviet newspaper during the Cold War. He called the Russian invasion of Ukraine "not unprovoked." He's said warm things about Hamas and Hezbollah, and can't bear to condemn Islamic terrorism without also criticizing the West.

It's no accident that his Labor Party has become lousy with anti-Semites.

His left-hand man, John McDonnell, shadow chancellor of the exchequer, is fond of implicit threats of violence. To wit, "Any institution or any individual that attacks our class, we will come for you with direct action." He has called Tory MPs "social criminals." This from the man in line to become, in our terms, secretary of the treasury of one of the great banking centers on the planet.

If McDonnell's style of rhetoric has a grim revolutionary cast, it's for good reason. In an interview

with -- no joke -- the Trotskyist Alliance for Workers' Liberty years ago, he said that the most important influences on him were "Marx, Lenin and Trotsky, basically." Corbyn has expressed similar sentiments.

At least they don't leave any doubt where they are coming from. If Corbyn had his way, it would be as if Margaret Thatcher never happened (indeed, McDonnell has mused about going back to the 1980s to assassinate her -- you know, the way many people do about Adolf Hitler).

Corbyn's program would renationalize sectors of the economy, punish shareholders and landlords, and impose stiff new taxes. If his campaign against capital crashed the pound, he'd surely be inclined to respond with capital controls, truly taking Britain back to the 1970s.

Every election in a democratic society is important. But Britain in the coming weeks will be faced with unquestionably momentous choices: Whether to take back its full sovereignty from the EU, and whether to throw in with a dangerous radical. Its modern history, and perhaps that of the West, is in the balance.

# Tainted Skin Cream Results in Mercury Poisoning

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - A Sacramento woman is currently in the hospital in a semi-comatose state after using a Pond's-labeled skin cream tainted with methylmercury. This is the first reported case of methylmercury poisoning of this type linked to a skin cream in the United States. The woman obtained the skin cream through an informal network that imported the cream from Mexico. This type of cream is used by consumers as a skin lightener and to remove spots and wrinkles. The mercury was not added by the Pond's manufacturer, but by a third party after purchase.

"Sacramento County Public Health urges the community to immediately stop using similar skin creams imported from Mexico due to the risk of contamination with methylmercury," said Sacramento County Public Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye. "Methylmercury is extremely dangerous to adults and children."

Sacramento County Public Health is working closely with the California Department of Public Health to test similar creams in the Sacramento-area for methylmercury. Methylmercury can enter the nervous system and can cause severe illness among household contacts, especially in pregnant and breastfeeding women and

children. Signs and symptoms include the following:

Difficulty concentrating, memory loss; Nervousness, irritability, anxiety; Depression, insomnia; Headaches; Weight loss, fatigue; Tremors, numbness or tingling in hands, feet, or around the lips

Children with prolonged exposure may show these symptoms: Pink hands and feet; Skin flaking; Excessive saliva or thirst, gum disease; Irritability, poor appetite; Poor muscle tone, leg cramps; High blood pressure, and a rash.

In California, over the last nine years, there have been over 60 poisonings linked to foreign brand, unlabeled, and/or home-made skin creams that contained the less toxic form of mercury, mercurous chloride or calomel.

For those who use imported skin creams from Mexico:

Stop using them immediately; Put the cream in a closed Ziploc bag and bring to your doctor; Go to the doctor and get tested for mercury in your blood and urine; Contact CDPH at (510) 981-4354 or AskEHIB@cdph.ca.gov. For free medical advice in English or other languages, call California Poison Control at 1-800-222-1222

# Bill to Reclassify Independent Truckers as Employees Passes State Senate

*AB 5 Spells the End for Independent Trucking in California*

**From The California Trucking Association**

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The California Senate approved Assembly Bill 5 (AB 5), a measure that will put tens of thousands of owner-operator truckers, who service agriculture, retail and other industry sectors, out of business. Despite efforts by the California Trucking Association (CTA) to amend the measure in a way that would protect independent truckers, Assembly Bill 5 by Assemblywoman Lorena Gonzalez (D-San Diego) passed with an overwhelming XX-XX vote.

"AB 5 could have been amended to address worker misclassification issues, as well as protect the 70,000 predominantly minority-owned truckers currently operating as independent contractors," said Shawn Yadon, CTA's CEO. "There is no reason why protecting workers does not include defending the right of tens of thousands of drivers who have built their businesses around the independent owner-operator model, invested hundreds of thousands of dollars in their trucks and have operated their own businesses for decades."

Since the bill's introduction, CTA has advocated for changes to AB 5, including requirements for operating authority, ownership of vehicles, exclusivity and transparency about pay. These changes would have set a clear criterion and established independence in a way that protected employees from misclassification without hurting entire sectors of the business community.

Instead, AB 5 proponents created a scenario in which they chose winners and losers by carving out some professions while excluding others. In an attempt to address some of the concerns of California's owner-operators, AB 5 was amended to allow drivers working within the construction industry to continue operating as independent truckers for a two-year grace period. However, AB 5 will severely limit work opportunities for tens of thousands of independent owner-operators in other business sectors.

In California, more than 136,950 trucking companies remain primarily small, locally owned business with small fleets and independent drivers.

"AB 5 will have implications that will go beyond employment classification," said Yadon, CTA's CEO. "Like the rest of the nation, California is experiencing a shortage of truck drivers, this measure will aggravate the problem by removing thousands of drivers from rosters as many have indicated they will move to other states or seek a different line of work all together."

AB 5 now heads to Governor Gavin Newsom for his signature. If signed into law, AB 5 would deny a significant segment of the trucking industry the ability to continue operating as independent owner-operators, forcing them to abandon the investments they have made in their vehicles and taking away their flexibility to set their own schedule and determine their own destiny for their business.

Governor Newsom has until October 13, 2019, to approve or veto this bill. ★

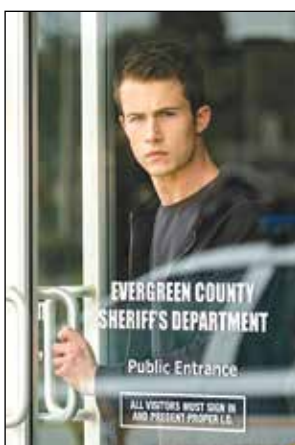


