SAC SPCA Will Close **Adoptable Goods Thrift Store**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- The Sacramento SPCA announced plans to commence a wind-down of its Adoptable Goods SPCA Thrift Store operations, including the closure of the store at 1517 E Street by year's end.

Sacramento SPCA CEO, Kenn Altine, said, "Since 1977, the Adoptable Goods SPCA Thrift Store has played an integral role in furthering the Sacramento SPCA's mission to help animals and people in our community, contributing more than \$3.2 million towards shelter programs, building improvements and most importantly, the building and remodeling of the Sacramento SPCA's Spay/ Neuter Clinic, which performs more than 18,000 life-changing surgeries every year. Unfortunately, the sharp decline in the overall retail environment coupled with rising operating costs and an aging building has made it incr ingly challenging to operate a profitable store."

Adoptable Goods will remain open for the rest of the year; however, they will no longer be accepting donations of goods, stating they have more than enough items given by the community to keep the store stocked through the coming months.

The Sacramento SPCA will also continue to accept book donations and items needed at the shelter. A complete list of ongoing shelter needs and other ways to give can be accessed at sspca. org/giving. The Sacramento SPCA asks that all items be brought to the shelter facility at 6201 Florin Perkins Rd., not to the thrift store.

"I am so grateful to the volunteers of the Sacramento SPCA Women's Guild, who many years ago recognized an opportunity to collect and sell gently-used goods donated by the community to help animals in need", said Altine. "We recognize that Adoptable Goods has provided a meaningful channel for members of our community to support the Sacramento SPCA and we are incredibly thankful for their contributions and commitment. We will continue to explore other opportunities for our caring supporters to donate their treasured goods to benefit the animals.'

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Once a colony, now a proudly unincorporated Sacramento County community, Carmichael will mark its 110th anniversary on September 28.

Founders Day commemorates the 1909 real estate venture by town founder Daniel Carmichael. The Georgian-born entrepreneur purchased two large chunks of the old San Juan and Del Paso land grants and carved these into 10-acre blocks. Mini farms were offered to pioneers for around \$1000 each. The lots have since been much subdivided and though few original homes remain, streets and parks named for pioneers Van Alstine, Gibbons, Barrett, Clark, Kenneth, Stanley (and Carmichael himself) are monuments to the colony's founding years.

History aside, the anniversary provides much festivity. The area's largest annual car show will fill much of Carmichael Park with classic motors. Local rock heart-throb Todd Morgan is among entertainers. A free kids Zone will include bounce houses, a rock-climbing wall, crafts, basketball bungee and a petting zoo. Food trucks will provide food for

Sacramento becomes the first team to win Triple-A Championship three times

Special from Sacramento River Cats

MEMPHIS, TN (MPG) - The Sacramento River are the Triple-A National Champions after shutting out the International League Champion Columbus Clippers by a score of 4-0 on Tuesday night at AutoZone Park in Memphis, TN. Behind a stellar outing from left-hander, and eventual Most Valuable Player Caleb Baragar, the River Cats became the first franchise to take home their third Triple-A National Championship.

Baragar was nothing short of magnificent for a second straight time this postseason, compiling a combined 2-0 record with a 0.90 ERA in 10 innings, and dominating the Clippers' offense over his five frames on Tuesday night. Baragar gave up just two hits while fanning five batters to earn MVP honors.

The River Cats jumped on the Clippers early, knocking out Columbus starter Kyle Dowdy in the first inning and tagging the right-hander for three runs. Francisco Peña delivered an RBI-groundout, then a couple batters later Jacob Heyward delivered a two-RBI single to right field.

Peter Maris would add a solo blast in the sixth inning to expand the lead to four. The swing of the bat was his second home run of this postseason. Levi Michael and Abiatal Avelino would finish the night with three hits apiece to pace the Sacramento offense from the top of the order.

The Sacramento bullpen was nearly perfect on their way to the first shutout of the playoffs from the River Cats. Right-hander Ricardo Pinto delivered two perfect innings while striking out four. Flame-throwing righty Melvin Adon contributed a scoreless inning, allowing one hit to start the ninth. Then lefty Steven Okert would come on to induce a double play and strikeout the final batter to clinch the Championship for the River Cats.

The Sacramento River Cats finished off their 2019 regular season with a 73-67 record – the first winning record since becoming a San Francisco Giants' affiliate in 2015. The club won their first Pacific Northern division title since 2012, and became the first Giants Triple-A club to win their division since 1998. The River Cats went on defeat to defeat the Las Vegas Aviators in five games, then the Round Rock Express in a sweep to claim their first Pacific Coast League crown since 2008. In a year in which 85 players appeared Sacramento, the River Cats 20th season came to an end on September 17 with a Triple-A National Championship.

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

The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) is getting ready to roll out a newly redesigned bus network that offers sevenday-a-week service, more late night and weekend service and more frequent service. The new bus network launched on Sunday, September 8, 2019.

Customer Assistance Teams will be out across the region helping riders navigate the new bus network and offer trip planning assistance.

"We started from a blank slate and took a closer look at where people live, work and play in the Sacramento region to develop a new bus network that will improve mobility and move the region forward," said SacRT General Manager/ CEO Henry Li.

"SacRT is moving forward with significant improvements that will help reduce congestion and lead to economic growth," said Sacramento County Supervisor and SacRT Board Chair Patrick Kennedy. "The new bus network is just one of several historic improvements that SacRT has made over the last several years to make it easier for people to travel around the region."

SacRT began the process of redesigning the bus network nearly three years ago, with the support of our planning partners, the Sacramento Area Council

Yes, Gun Ownership Is a God-Given Right

The fastest way to trend good way, is to say that the right to bear arms is a Godgiven right.

As David Harsanyi notes in his history of the gun in America, "First Freedom," John Adams said in his defense of one of the British soldiers charged in the Boston Massacre in 1770 that self-defense was "the primary canon in the law of nature."

Owning a gun is an extension of this law of nature This is glossed over even and has been recognized as such for a long time in Anglo-America. The right to bear arms had deep roots in England, and predated the Constitution on these shores.

There was no doubt at the time about the importance of the right to bear arms. Harsanyi writes that "not a single soul in the provisional government or Uncle Dick bagging deer, at the Second Continental Congress or any delegate at the Constitutional Convention -- or, for that matter, any new American -- ever argued against the idea of individuals owning a firearm."

None of this is necessarily a trump card in the gun control debate -- the most commonly proposed gun their Creator with certain control restrictions wouldn't substantially lessen gun ownership. It does mean, though, that there is a limit to how far gun control can go in America and that proponents of new restrictions should be fully aware that they are tampering with a constitutionally protected individual right.

> If Uncle Dick likes to hunt, good for him. But his right to own a firearm doesn't begin or end there.





A Legislative Sneak Attack

A legislative SNEAK ATTACK is under way designed to pass the Equality Act in a piecemeal manner - with no public accountability.

With the main bill being held up in the Senate, Democrats are advancing the essence of the Equality Act which effectively criminalizes Christianity through multiple bills.

By embedding key components of the Equality Act in several pieces of mustpass legislation, the main points of the Act could soon become law. These bills could impact churches, religious organizations, and Christian schools – and anyone who dares to stand for traditional ideals of male and female.

These bills specifically undermine religious liberties!

These SNEAK ATTACK bills follow a similar pattern to the full Equality Act legislation -- they specifically target people of faith and gut the Religious Freedom Restoration Act. By doing so, they put people of faith at risk by removing any religious exemption as it relates to issues of sexual orientation or gender identity (SOGI) the workplace, the school, and public places.

The ACLU has gone so far as to equate religious freedom as nothing more than an excuse to discriminate. They say religious exemptions are being "used to license discrimination." This is outrageous.

To date, these SNEAK ATTACK bills have received almost no media coverage. But many of the sneak attack items have been attached to "must-pass" legislation and thus will slip through unaware unless citizens take action!

Sneak Attack gives men the right to women's bathrooms

The Customer Non-Discrimination Act is particularly pernicious in that it amends the Civil Rights Act to include "sexual orientation" and "gender identity." As the LGBT organization Human Rights Campaign explains, this bill goes even further by redefining "public spaces" to include "retail stores, services such as banks and legal services, healthcare providers, and transportation services." Basically, every public space bathroom would be open to transgendered individuals, and healthcare providers would be required to comply.

There has been almost NO media coverage of these SNEAK ATTACK bills that effectively implement the Equality Act in piecemeal fashion. It's up to citizens like you to sound the alarm.
