We Will Never Forget

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - During recent Memorial weekend celebrations, one Carmichael family sponsored its own veteran tribute. For nine years, former football coach Mark "Coach" Soto and his wife Teresa have honored four young men who died in service with their son Josh Soto's Marine unit in Afghanistan.

The heroes were: Lance Corporals Victor Dew; Phillip Vinnedge; Joseph Rodewald and Corporal Justin Cain.

Victor Dew attended Granite Bay High School during the time Mark Soto coached its football teams. After the 2010 tragedy, Soto was asked to eulogize Victor at his Roseville funeral. "In his unit, 25 men died," recalls Soto. "Their losses were historic." With two sons in uniform at the time, the Sotos decided Victor Dew and his three comrades should not be forgotten. The couple has helped form a national non-profit to educate students, coaches and communities about the needs of military veterans. On the home front, they annually

remind neighbors that Memorial Day should honor sacrifices. "The day is not about parties and barbecues," explains Teresa. "It should be about remembering and honoring those who gave everything for us." Each Memorial Day, their front-yard banner displays pictures of the four lost infantrymen and a "never forget" legend.

"People stop, they honk their horns," reports Soto. "Some even salute as they drive down Jan Drive. Many thank us. But it was these men and countless others who sacrificed. We do this to thank them." ★

The Elephant in the Room

Last year the California State Supreme Court issued a ruling on whether a person working for a company is classified as an employee or independent contractor in a case now commonly called the Dynamex decision. In the Court's ruling, they changed the criteria for determining if a person is an employee or could be considered an independent contractor from what was called the Borello standard to an overly simplified but problematic ABC test.

The ABC test makes perfect legal sense in the simplistic way it segregates employees from independent contractors but does not consider the economic or social impact of doing so. Our "progressive" legislature likes the ABC test as a means to capture the revenue from the 2 million plus independent contractors

in our state impacted by this ruling. Employee unions also like the decision as it affords them the opportunity to organize and represent greater segments of private sector employees. Through all the rhetoric and attention to the Dynamex decision, few leaders are focused or aware of an as yet, undiscussed, cost.

Our Country prides itself as a land of opportunity, a place where if you work hard, you can realize your dream of owning your own business. History is full of examples of individual success coupled with collaboration and cooperation with others. The creativity and entrepreneurial spirit these individuals exhibited continues to be held in high regard.

The State Supreme Court's Dynamex ruling, the resulting discussion and most of the proposed solutions for the Dynamex decision threatens this entrepreneurial spirit. It also undermines our core values of opportunity and independence. Individuality, unconventionality and creative life management are not supported by turning independent contractors into employees. Further, these values are not encouraged,

usually suppressed and often punished when exhibited by employees.

Assembly Bill 5, (Gonzalez), does just that. It doesn't make much difference if surgeons, insurance agents or other industries are selectively excluded. The Elephant in the Room is how the current approach to codifying the Dynamex decision, effectively undermines the hopes and dreams of a large class of individuals in our economy. These individuals include seniors supplementing their incomes, stay-at-home parents contributing to household finances, entrepreneurial students in college reducing student loan costs, and those who support themselves in the gig economy while developing that one amazing idea.

For a brief moment, there was a ray of hope and redemption for our legislature, found in Senate Bill 238 (Groves). The bill proposed to use the Federal standard to define employment using criteria more definitive than the Borello standard making it difficult for the employers to game the system and retains independent contractor status for the many individuals across our economy.

Unfortunately, SB 238 failed passage in the Senate Labor and Employment Committee on a partisan vote.

If AB 5 is approved in the Assembly as is anticipated, the members of the State Senate, including State Senator Richard Pan, who serves as a member of the Labor, Public Employment and Retirement Committee, will have an opportunity to fix Dynamex to benefit employers, individual Californians and the state's economy. The lives, livelihood and economic future of hundreds of thousands of Californians who are independent contractors who want to remain so are not being addressed in the current approach to solving the problem our State Supreme Court created with the Dynamex decision. The current way this problem is being legislated is clearly not the balanced, thoughtful, or comprehensive approach this subject matter deserves.

In the rush to implement our State Supreme Court's decision regarding how an employee is defined in our State, our legislators haven't created a solution; they have merely crafted an alternate definition. This alternate decision

The award-winning organization has graduated 1,574 homeless women and their 3,627 children. Last year, 82 percent of graduates found homes and 76 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. Women's Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and receives no government funding except for in-kind rent from the County of Sacramento.

Sharing Songs and Prayers of Mourning at Carmichael's Vietnam War Monument

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Carmichael's Vietnam Memorial was this week's setting for commemorations to those who served their country. More than 160 visitors shared songs, prayers and remembrances. The patriotic program was augmented by a Cherokee mourning song, performed by former CSO entertainer Delta Edun.

The first-known monument to the Vietnam War in California is in Earl J. Koobs Nature Area at the now-shuttered La Sierra High School. First dedicated in 1973, the lofty steel structure and its plaque honor La Sierra graduates who died during Vietnam years. Memorial and Veterans Day ceremonies have been held in its shadow for 18 years.

The preserve is named for Earl ("Ranger Jack") Koobs, a WW II veteran and La

Sierra teacher. Koobs fought to keep the woodland area undeveloped and to establish a monument for his fallen students. He died in 2015. Under the aegis of Carmichael Kiwanis Club, the Koobs reserve is now a center for community service. Many Eagle Scout projects have been completed in its five acres; Carmichael Organic Gardening Club nurtures a butterfly garden; California Montessori Project and other supporters maintain woodland and trails for environmental education.

Thanks to a donation of \$25,000 from La Sierra alumni, permanent bench seating was recently increased to accommodate larger event audiences.

Earl J. Koobs Nature Area is open to visitors from March to October on the second Saturdays of each month. For information, go to www.carmichaelkiwanis.org or visit the Koobs Nature Area site on Facebook. ★

"I met some really amazing people (in the sport) and the coaches are so dedicated to teaching you to work hard," said Burrows of her time with Capital Crew. "It requires so much mental toughness and grit. I learned so much through that process with rowing. There is not an option except to get through the hard work. It has carried over to school and I will take that with me."

She has served as a Retreat Leader during her senior year, a passion that was developed through her own retreat experiences.

"Retreats are a huge gift for me," said Burrows. "Coming to St. Francis it was not something on my radar. I had amazing leaders on my retreats and it inspired me. I had such a great experience, I wanted to give that to other people and hopefully inspire them to keep the cycle going."

Burrows said retreats are one of many unique aspects of the student experience at St. Francis.

"No other high school gets the experience we get," said Burrows. "I wanted to take advantage of it. The retreats taught me how to step back and be able to have prayer and reflection. I can have those morals and values in anything I do. How we strongly hold our Catholic education in the classroom has helped create who I am."

Burrows was also able to spend two weeks over the last two summers on service trips, attending both the Winnebago (Neb.) and Chicago Service trips.

"It was one of the best weeks ever," said Burrows of her week with young Neighbors in Action in the Windy City. "I think having such an eye-opening experience before I went into my last year of high school was perfect timing for me."

She credits them with helping her growth during her high school.

"Both of my service trips were very grounding and humbling for me," recalled Burrows. "It is an important experience for everyone to have in their life. Getting them from my St. Francis experience, shaped who I am and how important I hold service. Seeing the injustices of the world first hand is the only way you are going to learn about them and want to change."

Burrows completed her senior year with an internship in the Athletic Department with Assistant Athletic Director Kelly Ketcham in Sports Medicine.

"Doing the internship and taking Anatomy at the same time basically solidified that I want to work with helping people injured or hurting and help them feel better so their bodies can perform at their most efficient," said Burrows.

What's next for this talented Troubie? She will be attending UCLA after initially considering 9-10 schools. She plans to study human biology and society with a minor in Spanish. After her internship with Ms. Ketcham, she is very interested in getting involved in sports medicine.

No matter what she does, she will continue to shine brightly as a Bruin as she did as a Troubie.

Volleyball Coaches and players who wear their school/club shirt/jersey will be

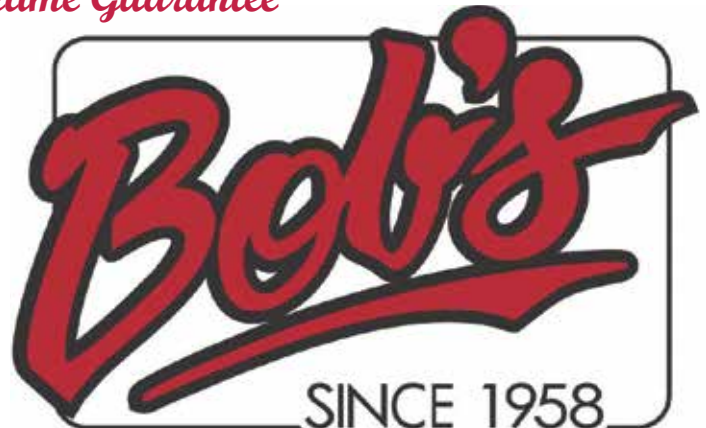
offered a discount at the gate.

More Money Required for Camp Fire Rebuild; No New Taxes Needed

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama), Senate Budget Vice-Chair, issued the following statement regarding the Governor's revision of his spending plan:

"The state budget is flush with billions in surplus revenue. Twenty-one billion dollars (\$21 billion), to be exact.

"But that's not enough for some in the majority party. They want more. They want to raise taxes on

water, fertilizer, dairy, tires, guns and businesses.

"Why does the state need to raise taxes when there's \$21 billion in surplus?"

"They are spending their way into another crushing deficit that will harm the poor, blind and disabled, and squeeze the middle class once again.

"Haven't we learned from Gray Davis' spending spree - and subsequent crash - two decades ago?"

"In this eye-popping \$213 billion budget, there's

\$10 million in one-time funding for local governments affected by the Camp Fire, \$40 million for emergency readiness and \$75 million for those affected by power shutoffs. This is the deadliest fire in the state's history, and while we appreciate the Governor's attention to Paradise and the Ridge, our communities will require much more support to rebuild.
