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Time to Twist and Shout

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Baby boomers were out in gray-haired force to catch Ticket to Ride – a Beatles cover band – in Carmichael Park last weekend. The concert was the second performance of the 47th annual concert season sponsored by Carmichael Recreation and Park District. The musicians kept 1300 fans dancing and singing to Lennon-McCartney hits for more than two bours

At 52 years old, guitarist Bud Ehrk – one of two Carmichael-based band members – figured he was among the youngest in the crowd. "I started playing my parents old Beatles' 45s when I was seven," he recalls. "When I learned guitar, the first song I got down was 'Twist and Shout.' I guess it only has three chords. The famous British Invasion was long gone by the time I was a teenager. But I always preferred 60s music and I loved the Beatles.

Their songs were upbeat and their harmonies were brilliant."

Ticket to Ride formed three years ago. Leader and bass player Matt Udall is an attorney who lives in East Sacramento. Guitarist Bud Ehrk works as an aircraft mechanic on weekdays. Drummer Tony Nunes has a California State job and commutes to band gigs from Chico. Carmichael resident Kevin Arthur (guitar) is a retired traffic signal technician.

Unlike some tribute groups, Ticket to Ride musicians don't feel the need to resemble Liverpool's most famous sons. "We have the Sgt. Peppers' coats because people love the colorful uniforms that relate to that Beatles period," says Ehrk. "But we don't want to wear cheesy wigs. We just want to be ourselves; being out there playing the music that makes people so happy."

The 47th season of free CRPD concerts continues this Saturday. Performers are as follows. Downbeat for all shows is 6:30 pm. ★



Dusty Baker Inducted into National High School Hall of Fame

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) -Dusty Baker, who was one of the top four-sport high school athletes in California history before his stellar professional baseball career, is among 12 individuals who will be inducted in the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) National High School Hall of Fame June 30 at the JW Marriott in Indianapolis, Indiana. The 37th Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will take place on the third day of the 100th annual NFHS Summer Meeting.

During his high school career at Sacramento Del Campo High School in the 1960s, Baker played football, basketball and baseball, and competed in

track and field. Although be his sport of choice, baseball would eventually Baker excelled in the other

sports as well.

In football, he scored six touchdowns in one game and set several scoring records as a running back and punt returner for Del Campo High. In basketball, Baker averaged 22 points and 17 rebounds and, as a result of his high school performance, was offered a scholarship to Santa Clara University.

In track and field, Baker set a school record of 9.8 in the 100-yard dash, and he recorded a 23-6 effort in the long jump at the California State Track and Field Meet.

Baker was drafted by the Atlanta Braves and, despite the scholarship offer to play college basketball, chose baseball, which turned out to be a pretty good decision. Baker played the first eight of his 19 seasons with the Braves, with his best season in 1973 when he hit .288 with 21 home runs

Mather Vets Campus to Lose Full Capacity For Housing

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Volunteers of America (VOA) is facing a funding shortfall that will permanently impact Mather Community Campus, the region's most successful program to combat homelessness. This loss of funding is forcing VOA to cease critical components of the Mather program model which will significantly affect the program's ability to help clients get off the streets and back on their feet.

Without immediate and ongoing support, Mather will no longer be able to operate at full capacity and will have to cease operations in one of the campus' 13 residential buildings – a building that can house 90 individuals for up to one year in a transitional housing setting. That's 90 people who are on the streets now, ready for change, but will have nowhere to go.

Loss of funding also strikes fatal blow to Mather's Community Dining Hall/Culinary Training Kitchen: The Community Dining Hall will close; clients will no longer receive 3 hot meals daily at a shelter without kitchen facilities in resident quarters; The Culinary Training Kitchen program will close clients will no longer receive valuable job training that prepares them for employment once they leave the shelter.

Since 1993, Mather Community Campus has helped more than 4,500 people forge their own path out of homelessness through an innovative, proven approach that combines transitional housing with a multitude of supportive services.

"We actually give people their life back. We help them recover the things they need to function in society like getting their driver's license, opening a bank account, and working on credit repair or record expungement. Mather also helps with clothing, vocational training, and employment placement," said Sherman Haggerty, Division Director, VOA Employment Services. "We provide the foundational tools people actually need to become a part of the community again. No other program does these things."

Celebrate Recovery with Higher Power

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Higher Power Ministry hosts a recovery celebration at Lakeside Church in Folsom every Friday at 7:00 PM. Christian bands from a variety of genres such as blues, country, and rock and roll perform at the celebration. Lead Director of Recovery John Heath joked, "I turn the church into a nightclub every Friday night, with Jesus in the middle."

A speaker talks to the group about recovery from addiction such as drugs, alcohol, gambling, food addictions, sexual addictions, workaholics, co-dependency, and self-harm. "These are life and death situations for the people that come in here, and there's no such thing as a hopeless case," said Heath. "We're getting phenomenal results."

Higher Power Ministry originated in 1992 at Central Peninsula Church in Foster City. Senior Pastor Jeff Farrar saw the need to help people overcome the addictions that were leading them to jail, institutions, and death. Pastor Steve Aurell, who was a ministry leader until his death in 2013, knew just how difficult it is to overcome addiction since he had once served 15 years in San Quentin Prison because of his own drug addiction. As Pastor of Recovery at Higher Power, Pastor Aurell saved many lives including the life of John Heath.

Heath had a long history of addiction. During the early 1980s, at the height of the cocaine craze, Heath worked In addition to cocaine, he used in 2006: "It was like no other for the Cartel transporting drugs over the border. After a year of sobriety, Pastor Aurell asked Heath to become a leader in the Higher Power Ministry. "I then knew that God had a sense of humor," said Heath. After seeing firsthand all the good Higher Power had done for people in need, Heath

felt compelled to spread the message to other communities: "God tapped me on the shoulder and asked me to start a recovery church."

Heath moved to Shingle Springs and spent a year in prayer. Then he met Pastor John Voelz at Lakeside Church, who invited him to use the church as the site of a new Higher Power Ministry. Heath said, "We are so

appreciative to Lakeside Church for allowing Higher Power to exist in Folsom and for letting us use their site to further our mission of helping those who are lost to addiction in the community." Higher Power at Lakeside opened on July 7, 2017. "Seven, seven, seventeen — three sevens. I believe those are divine numbers," said Heath.

"I started the ministry one person at a time," Heath said. "We accept them however they are — high, drunk, or however they walk in." Anyone who comes to the celebration can share with the group and seek help. "We stay there all night long if we need to," he said. Higher Power Ministry leaders then follow up during the next week to offer additional help. If someone needs a recovery program, the leaders will find one for them. "We're building a family," said Heath. "It's a huge support system."

Many of the leaders are also recovering addicts, and Heath shares his story to inspire others to overcome their own struggles. Although Heath is not an ordained pastor, he found a way to ensure that Higher Power has a strong spiritual support system. He established an Elder Board comprised of two recovery pastors — each with 30 years of sobriety - who give spiritual advice and guidance. Heath said that Pastor Gary Freitas from Manteca and Pastor Dale Marsh from Oroville provide "spiritual direction, protection, and correction in the ministry."

The events are open for anyone to attend. Heath said, "It's a lot of fun. It's not too churchy." They serve free dinner, dessert, coffee, and other refreshments. Higher Power is a 501(c)(3)charitable organization; donation checks can be written to Higher Power Ministry and then mailed to Lakeside Church, 745 Oak Avenue Parkway, Folsom, CA

with the Los Angeles Dodgers, including the 1980 season when he hit 29 home runs and was fourth in the MVP balloting and 1981 when he helped the Dodgers to a World Series title. He was a two-time National League all-star and received a Gold Glove Award as well. Baker finished his career with one season in San Francisco and two years in Oakland and posted a .278 lifetime average with 242 home runs.

After his playing career, Baker managed the San Francisco Giants, Chicago Cubs, Cincinnati Reds and Washington Nationals for 22 years and posted a .532 winning percentage. He ranks 15th on the all-time list with 1,863 victories. He led the Giants to the 2002 National League

of the Year three times.

Baker continued to give community throughout Baker played eight years his playing days, returning to speak to groups about honor, sportsmanship, parenthood, racism or other life challenges. He began the Dusty Baker Baseball School, and his commitment, leadership, compassion and concern for the development of young student-athletes continues today after more than 35 years. He also is a member of the Advisory Board of Positive Coaching Alliance, which is dedicated to promoting positive character development in youth and education-based athletics.

> Baker is a member of numerous halls of fame, including the Sacramento Sports Hall of Fame, the Marine Corps Sports Hall of Fame, the California Black Sports Hall of Fame, the Bay Area Sports Hall of Fame and the California Interscholastic Federation

pennant and was named (CIF)-Sac-Joaquin Section Hall of Fame. He received the Major League Baseball Silver Bat Award in 1980

and 1981. The National High School Hall of Fame was started in 1982 by the NFHS to honor high school athletes, coaches, contest officials, administrators, fine arts coaches/ directors and others for their extraordinary achievements and accomplishments in high school sports and activity programs. This year's class increases the number in the Hall of Fame to 482.

The 12 individuals were chosen after a two-level selection process involving a screening committee composed of active high school state association administrators, coaches and officials, and a final selection committee composed of coaches, former athletes, state association officials, media representatives and education leaders. Nominations were made through NFHS member associations. ★

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Democrats Arbitration Proposal Binds Patients Badly

It's been more than 100 days since the Democrats were restored to power in the House of Representatives. They haven't accomplished much, aside from talking. Some of what they have to say is just partisan politics.

There are other things they are talking about doing of which we should be wary. One is House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's plan to reduce prescription drug prices by promoting binding arbitration.

Pelosi's plan empowunaccountable government officials to have the final word on how much Medicare should pay for certain drugs. This price controls by a different name approach has attracted support from numerous lawmakers – but it's a terrible idea.

Implementing this plan will reduce competition. the one mechanism that guarantees seniors can get what they need at the lowest cost and highest quality.

Currently, the government doesn't provide prescription drug coverage to Medicare beneficiaries directly. Instead, it allows private insurers to sponsor and sell drug plans to

with one another to win seniors' business.

Insurers are usually able to negotiate bulk purchase agreements with drug companies. Occasionally though, insurers think a drug company's requested price is too high. Right now, when negotiations over price stall, the government doesn't do anything. The feds let insurers decide which drugs to include or exclude from plans.

Pelosi's vision allows Medicare officials to intervene in negotiations. If an agreement can't be reached, Medicare administrators could appeal to a government-appointed arbitrator. Medicare would suggest a price. So would drug manufacturers.

Both sides having put forward their best arguments, the arbitrators, in theory independent and unbiased, would choose one or simply propose their own price in a legally binding decision neither fellow at Frontiers of side could appeal. Except, unlike the way that works at the Better Business Bureau, the government arbitrators would probably be predisposed to side with Medicare in any conflict.

CHP Freeway Shooting Investigation Leads To Multiple Arrests

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol (CHP) Valley Division today announced making arrests in a freeway shooting that occurred on March 17, 2019, on Interstate 80 in Placer County.

The shooting took place between two groups of individuals on westbound Interstate 80 at Douglas Boulevard. Multiple rounds were fired into the victim's vehicle resulting in the driver sustaining major injuries. Immediately after the shooting, the suspect vehicle fled the scene by driving his vehicle the wrong way on the northbound Douglas Boulevard on-ramp to westbound I-80.

Through a collaborative effort with our partners in the Roseville Police Department, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), Solano County Sheriff's Department, Richmond Police Department, the Vallejo Police Department, and the Federal Bureau of Investigations Safe Streets Task Force, three arrests have been made related to this

Early this morning Tevarus Hill, 27, was arrested in Benicia, for attempted murder and multiple weapons charges. At the same time, Myles Sherman, 24, was arrested in Vallejo, also for attempted

murder and multiple weapons charges. A third suspect, Enacio Bolton, 26, is in custody as the result of an unrelated incident and will be held for attempted murder

'We want to assure the public that these acts of violence are not random but often targeted attacks between parties that know each other," said Chief Brent Newman, commander of CHP's Valley Division

Based on a recent increase in highway violence including freeway shootings, the CHP has taken several proactive steps to address this issue. These include redeploying staff, adding to investigative teams, involvement in zero-tolerance gang enforcement operations, and increasing communication at all levels among the involved law enforcement agencies and community leaders.

"We know how scary these types of incidents can be to a community and the CHP is doing everything in our power to locate and arrest those responsible for these senseless acts of violence," added

"We thank the hundreds said Tom Whaley, whose of Public Health annual 42-year-old wife Christina finally was able to find a provider who would write the prescription at UCLA, 200 miles from their San Luis Obispo home, so she could die peacefully last year. "The reality is most terminally ill people who try to utilize the End of Life Option Act are much older and weaker than Christine was, so they wouldn't be able to overcome the obstacles she did to use the law to end their suffering."

A total of 768 terminally ill Californians received prescriptions for aid-in-dying medication and 485 (63%) of them took the medication between the first day of the law took effect, June 9, 2016, until Dec. 31, 2017, according to California Department reports.

California is one of eight states — including Colorado, Hawaii, Montana, New Jersey, Oregon, Vermont, and Washington — as well as the District of Columbia, that have authorized medical aid in dying. Collectively, these nine jurisdictions represent more than one out of five Americans (21%) and have 40 years of combined experience successfully implementing this end-of-life care option.

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

Sacramento County Recommended Budget Approved

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to approve the \$4.4 billion recommended budget for Fiscal Year 2019-20.

"Sacramento County's FY 2019-20 budget provided substantial challenges due in part to decreased state and federal revenues, significant costs around lawsuits and increased expenditures," said District 2 County Supervisor and Board Chair Patrick Kennedy. "We were able to weather these challenges with a balanced budget that minimizes the impact to critical services, without eliminating whole programs or services."

The County's General Fund and Restricted Funds budgets for FY 2019-20 totaled \$2.7 billion in appropriations, which is a 4.2 percent increase over last year's total. Enterprise and special revenue funds comprise the remaining \$1.68

"We were able to recommend a balanced budget that avoided eliminating community-based contracts and targeted whole programs or services, limited the impact on Board-priority programs and avoided employee layoffs," said County Executive Nav Gill.

In spite of the growth of revenue, reductions in positions and programs were necessary due to lawsuit costs, investments in the jails in order to resolve a lawsuit around conditions of confinement. decreases in state and federal revenue for certain programs, as well as other obligations.

To close a general shortfall of \$55 million, Sacramento County recommended \$43 million in reductions in General Fund Departments and \$12 million in General Fund reserves to bridge the gap.

General Fund departments identified a number of targeted program and position reductions. The reductions included the elimination of 181.3 FTE positions that were either vacant or, in a few cases, filled by employees who were shifted to other positions in the same class. No layoffs were necessary.

The budget also recognized areas of growth, including:

\$21.7 million to make improvements to the County's jails as part of continuing efforts to resolve conditions of confinement concerns identified in a recent lawsuit; \$2.3 million in state and federal revenue to add 25 FTE positions in Child Support Services; \$1.2 million in 2011 Realignment Local Innovation funds to add seven positions in Probation to establish a Pre-Trial Assessment and Monitoring Pilot Program; \$1 million set aside for costs related to the Hardesty/ Schneider lawsuit against the County; \$3.5 million to add 29 FTE positions in Airports Department to handle the impact of increasing passenger and freight volume; and \$668,000 to cover the cost of postcards and postage for the March 2020 Primary Election, as required by state law.

The budget also continued funding for programs and services that were initiated over the last few years with Board approval, including:

Homeless Initiatives: The FY 2019-20 Budget expands services in several areas using state and federal funding, for a total of a \$20 million budget for the initiatives. A \$700,000 reduction in funding for the Scattered Site Housing program subsidies (contractor did not need the full amount and placed families in federally funded housing slots). The remaining amount for the Scattered Site Housing program is \$2 million:

The Parkways and Unincorporated Communities Clean-up and Safety Initiative to reduce the incidence and mitigate the impact of illegal camping in the County's parkways and unincorporated communities received continued funding with a reduced level of deputies on the Homeless Outreach Teams, reduced hours for the Parks Resource Team and eliminated funding for an animal control officer;

The intelligence-led policing model implemented by the Sheriff's Department;

The Healthy Partners Program that provides healthcare services to undocumented

A strategic plan to reduce disproportionate African-American child deaths through staffing in Child Protective Services, Public Health and Probation;

Implementation of an Adult Supervision Model in Probation that will prioritize supervision and services for high-risk probationers in the first six months to a year of probation;

Behavioral Health Services enhancements to provide appropriate services to persons with serious drug and alcohol use disorders, reducing reliance on hospital emergency rooms, and ensuring that individuals experiencing a mental health crisis receive treatment in the most appropriate setting for their needs;

Continue to implement the Boardapproved three-year MHSA (Mental Health Services Act) to expedite mental health services for individuals with serious mental illness and/or co-occurring substance use disorders and are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless;

Animal Care Initiatives focused on improving animal care, increased spay/ neuter services and increasing the Bradshaw Shelter's live release rate. The budget recommends reductions in contracts and two positions, but the department expects to continue to maintain its high live release rate;


Efforts to reduce fire danger and illegal camping, increase debris removal and enhance the visitor experience in the American River Parkway and the County's Regional Parks will continue with a reduced number of seasonal staff hours from 9,000 to 4,654;

The numbers on the Recommended Budget will change between now and September, when the County receives new information, including the impact of the State Budget and updated revenue totals. The Final Budget will come back to the Board of Supervisors in September for review and adoption.

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CEOs for Abortion

Clarity of thought and expression about moral issues is not a core competency of CEOs.

If anyone had any doubt, look no further than the "historic" pro-abortion statement by nearly 200 CEOs that ran in a full-page ad in The New York Times. It is a festival of absurdity and euphemism, an exercise in perverse virtue-signaling to a progressive audience that believes that maintaining one of the most permissive pro-abortion regimes in the developed world is a virtue.

The CEOs define abortion as "equality" ("Don't Ban Equality") and, of course, refer to it as "comprehensive reproductive care," the ubiquitous phrase that has the advantage of sounding like the opposite of what it's describing.

The CEOs contend that abortion is central to their businesses, which might be true if all of their companies had the same business model as Planned Parenthood. But Bloomberg L.P., Amalgamated Bank

the companies whose CEOs signed the ad, are hardly dependent on abortion to thrive.

The old saw was, "What's good for General Motors is good for America." Now, according to top CEOs, what's good for abortion is good for American business. They seem to consider abortion a crucial component of GDP just like personal consumption, business investment, government spending and net exports.

They argue that "equality in the workplace" is an important business issue, and it is impossible to achieve without unrestricted access to abortion. Any restriction "threatens the health, independence and economic stability of our employees and customers."

The idea that abortion is necessary for the health of women is one of the most misleading pro-abortion cliches. Comprehensive data from Florida last year shows that only a small percentage involve a threat to the mother's life or health, and pro-life laws account for such cases -- even the sweeping Alabama law has a health exception.

The contention that restrictions put "the economy at risk" is nonsensical. Are we supposed to believe that the reduction of the abortion rate in the U.S. from its high in 1980 of

and H&M, to name three of 29.3 abortions per 1,000 women of childbearing age to its post-Roe v. Wade low of 14.6 as of 2014 has been a calamity for corporate America?

By this standard, Utah must be a terrible place to do business since its abortion rate is so low, and the District of Columbia an enticing place to do business since its abortion rate is so high. (To the contrary, Forbes ranks Utah as the second-best state for business in the country.)

The implication is that these CEOs prefer that their employees and customers not become mothers, or if they are mothers, not have more children. It apparently hasn't occurred to them that unborn children will grow up to buy their products or perhaps work for their firms one day.

The CEO ad is another sign that the debate over abortion has entered a new phase. It isn't enough anymore to say that abortion should be safe, legal and rare, the old Bill Clinton formulation, because that implies a moral disapproval. Now, abortion is a positive good.

Pro-life laws will have to prevail against this inflamed pro-abortion sentiment -- and the swath of big business that shares it.

Golden State Killer Case Selected As 2019 DNA Hit Of The Year

The forty-five year investigation into the horrifying serial murders, sexual assaults and burglaries in California resulted in arrest after law enforcement's use of investigative genetic genealogy.

Kobe, Japan - June 18, 2019: Gordon Thomas Honeywell Governmental Affairs (GTH-GA) has announced that the Golden State Killer case investigated by numerous California police departments was selected as the 2019 DNA Hit of the Year. The case was selected from 70 cases submitted from 20 countries. It was chosen by a panel of seven international judges with career backgrounds in forensic DNA. The recognition was announced during the annual Human Identification Solutions (HIDS) Conference held in Kobe, Japan.

Now in its third year, the DNA Hit of the Year program is organized by GTH-GA, an international authority on DNA database policy, legislation, and law. "The 2019 list of cases expresses the extraordinary commitment police have to solve and prevent crime with forensic DNA databases," said Tim Schellberg, GTH-GA's President.

Judges selected the California case from seven finalists. The six runner-up cases were from Austria, Dubai, South Africa, Brazil, Massachusetts and New York. The Golden State Killer is accused of committing terrifying crimes between 1973 and 1986.

Multiple DNA strategies were utilized while trying to solve these cases. The break in the case occurred when the crime scene DNA was placed into a genealogy database and an investigative lead was developed through a distant relative. The announcement of the Golden State Killer's arrest through the use of investigative genetic genealogy set off a national phenomenon to identify suspects in some of the worst unsolved crimes in US history.

Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert said: "Using investigative genetic genealogy to identify those who are accused of horrific crimes has revolutionized law enforcement's ability to solve violent crime. The arrest of the alleged Golden State Killer was an amazing moment for his victims as well as for the United States' crime fighting history. This new law enforcement tool is bringing hope to victims and their families who have waited decades for justice."

"Having the Golden State Killer case chosen as the 2019 Hit of the Year is a great honor. The DNA Hit of the Year program demonstrates the value of DNA databases to solve and prevent crime through real cases. It is my hope that governments continue to expand DNA programs to stop criminals and save lives," said District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert.
