Improving Business

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The longest of journeys begins with a single step. Seventeen Carmichael Improvement District (CID) leaders and volunteers recently set out on foot to meet business owners. The all-morning "business walk" included shops and companies around the Carmichael "Y" - the intersection of Manzanita Avenue and Fair Oaks Boulevard. Armed with clipboards and flyers, volunteers gathered contact details, shared information and asked 60 business owners for input on the organization's operations.

"Not all business operators knew they had access to our services," said CID outreach chair Johnna Phillips. "We want them to know we're here to help them succeed."

Formed with Sacramento County facilitation in 2016, the non-profit serves nearly 450 commercial properties and 700 businesses. These range from large retail stores to professional offices and single-owner operations within 460 acres of the local business corridor. Security, street cleanliness, beautification and economic development are principle CID goals. Funded by a property assessment, the cooperative has hired a security company to protect

businesses and customers. It will soon appoint an executive director.

"We've achieved coordination with law enforcement agencies to reduce criminal activity and to address the homeless problem in our area," says board member/lawyer Gary Hursh. "We feel we're on a sound foundation to establish Carmichael as a place where businesses and customers want to be."

CID board meetings are held at the Carmichael Library (5605 Marconi Ave), on fourth Thursdays of each month at 1 pm. These meetings are open to the public. More information is available at www.carmichaelid.org ★

Sacramento Valley Concert Choir Celebrates 50th Anniversary

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Valley Concert Choir (SVCC) celebrates its 50th Anniversary with a one-night-only free, public concert, "Why We Sing: SVCC Turns 50!" on Tuesday, May 21, 2019, 7:30 pm, at the Unitarian Universalist Society of Sacramento, 2425 Sierra Blvd, Sacramento 95825.

The concert is led by esteemed Artistic Director Jim R. Parr, Jr., and accompanied by acclaimed concert pianist Jason Sia. Enhancing this once-in-a-lifetime event are Guest Conductors Anthony Lien and William Zinn, an instrumental ensemble, and choir alumni.

Repertoire ranges from "Bohemian Rhapsody" to "Moonglow" to the breathtaking finale of "Why We Sing" followed by "The Awakening."

In its five decades, SVCC has performed at the State Fair, Crocker Museum, River Cats game, Sac Sings Festival, and elsewhere. But public performances are rare: SVCC's primary goal is to bring music to those who may not be able to get out into the community (which means private concerts in places such as retirement homes).

Current members, aged 30 to 88, hail from all walks of life—education, medicine, legal, tech, biz, finance, and more. A love of singing—and a love of giving—bring them together.

In 1969, SVCC began as a class in San Juan Unified Adult Ed program. Then in 1979, fueled by talent, enthusiasm, and loyalty, the choir branched out as an independent community choir, funded by member dues and donations. Membership has ranged from as few as 12 to the current resounding 80-plus!

Luxury Theater Opens at Country Club Plaza

ARDEN ARCADE, CA (MPG) - Joining a host of other recently relocated or newly established businesses in Country Club Plaza is Country Club Luxury Cinema, located directly across from new mall tenant, Rebounderz. A large group of business owners and interested parties assembled Wednesday evening for the venue's ribbon cutting and tours of the theater which opened Friday. A soft opening was held Thursday evening with a few of the thirteen screens showing Avengers: Endgame.

Invited guests praised the food, which is freshly cooked in the full kitchen behind the snack counter. Offerings include artisan pizza, nachos, fries, and popcorn chicken balls. More traditional movie fare, popcorn and candy, is also available. Margo Powers, Cinema West's food and beverage manager, expects the menu offerings to grow.

"People can just come in

and have a beer," she said, without buying a ticket or seeing the movie. Tables and other seating are situated in a corner off of the snack bar with a huge window looking into the mall and across to the nearest neighbor.

Wines, beers, and cocktails are also on the menu. Sacramento, she said, is an IPA town so she has included a selection of local beers and local wines.

Guests toured the thirteen theaters, which include two giant screens. They sat in the spacious and well-cushioned seats, adjusted the table trays, and reclined their legs, which they probably needed if they returned to see the three hour long Avengers movie.

Several employees, including Dyanna Paredes and A.J. Souza, also live nearby. The location benefits Matt Ceccato from

Congressman Ami Bera's office as well.

"It's the closest movie theater to my house," he said.

The lease was signed in 2015 said Cinema West CEO Dave Corkill, who also operates theaters in Folsom, Woodland, and other locations in California and Idaho.

The Sacramento SPCA announced the receipt of \$25,000 to help senior cats and cats needing extended medical care at the Sacramento SPCA through a single gift made to establish The Joe Willie Initiatives. But more important is the story behind this gift; a remarkable bond between a man and his special needs cat, Joe Willie, that inspired a movement.

Mark M. Glickman, a resident of Carmichael, was inspired by his cat, Joe Willie, who had significant medical needs when Mr. Glickman adopted him 29 years ago.

"In November 1990, I was on a noon-time walk in the San Francisco Financial District when I came upon a mobile adoption site," shared Mr. Glickman. "One of the kitties was a small Tuxedo cat. He had neurological damage in his back-side, and did not walk well. I expected that he would require ongoing attention for his condition, but adopted him anyway and named him Joe Willie."

by potential adopters. Now, with this generous gift designated for medical care for cats, we will be able to save even more lives."

Mr. Glickman's donation is the largest donation the organization has ever received for senior kitties and those with special needs. In addition to the Sacramento SPCA, Mr. Glickman honors the memory of Joe Willie through his support of other animal welfare organizations, including Marin Humane and Field Haven Feline Center.

"All of my cats have inspired me," said Mr. Glickman. "While I learned about cats from them, I learned about myself from Joe Willie. I want other people to adopt a cat and have that opportunity for an extraordinary connection."

The Sacramento SPCA reports an overall increase in cat adoptions since partnering with Mr. Glickman with more than 60 adopted through the program. And the goodwill is spreading – other Sacramento SPCA supporters have also been inspired to sponsor adult and senior cat adoptions.

Mr. Glickman issued the following statement:

"Historically, cats have not been treated with the same level of respect, understanding or attention as other animals. That has not been true of the Sacramento SPCA. For the last three years the organization has been at the forefront of this issue, seeking to change those perceptions. I am hopeful that my gift will allow them to continue their work in new and innovative ways."

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - All kids love soft toys. But a child whose life is in crisis really needs something to cuddle.

At accident or domestic crime scenes, terrified children often end up in police cars. Police officers – frequently parents themselves – know the value of a huggable teddy. "A soft toy gives traumatized children comfort," says Carmichael grandmother Nancy Fellers. "It also makes a police officer less frightening." From several Sheriff's deputies in her own family, Nancy (86) learned that cops bought emergency toys with their own money. She decided a stitch in time was called for.

For the past 20 years, the retired school teacher and travel agent has collected, cleaned and repaired thousands of what she calls "stuffies." Used or new, the comfort critters come her way from church friends, fellow Kiwanians and neighbors.

Nancy's mission has turned her Carmichael home into a virtual Pooh Corner, but she has the support of her 88-year-old husband, retired ARC professor Bill. "When we get used stuffies, we always wash them," explains Nancy.

"Many need to be re-stuffed – you'd be surprised what some manufacturers fill them with. If a toy gets a hole in it, a child could ingest some really awful stuff." After revitalizing each critter, she adds a new bow to each fluffy neck; she and husband Bill then deliver the individually-bagged stuffies to Sheriff's headquarters in Rancho Cordova. Here, big burly cops select bunnies, bears and monkeys to store in patrol cars for emergencies. "The officers are always glad to see me," says Nancy. "They know I come with gifts that make their job easier. To a frightened child, a cuddly critter helps children see officers as kind and caring. In these situations, a toy is a necessary part of police work. I don't see why deputies should have to pay for them."

Though she loves her vocation, the octogenarian hopes to eventually bag her last bunny and find a successor. "The work hardly costs anything and it takes little time," she says. "All you need is a washing machine, some basic sewing skills and a kind heart."

The Food Must Get Through: Post Office Food Drive Hauls It In

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - As if delivering full loads of mail on the eve of Mother's Day were not enough, American mail carriers served a humanitarian cause on Saturday, May 11.

The National Post Office food drive gathered groceries for food banks across America. Paper sacks were distributed to millions of homes days before collection and carriers began their Saturday routes expecting to return to base heavily laden. "It was a long, hard day, but worth it to know we were helping needy families," said the Carmichael Office

union president Barry Wilson. Zone 95608's 50 carriers and many volunteers toiled from 10 a.m. until 7 p.m. collecting, hauling and sorting over 16,218 pounds of non-perishables. These were dispatched to the Sacramento Food Bank.

In days that followed, hundreds more pounds of groceries rolled in to the Post Office. The food bank also received these late donations.

"Too many people in this country are still going hungry," said National Association of Letter Carriers President Fredric Rolando. "We see this first hand in communities we serve. For more than

two decades, our members have taken the lead in the effort to help. It's an easy way for our customers to help people in their own communities. Food banks usually benefit from an upswing in donations during the holiday season. By spring, stocks dwindle." Because school lunch programs are suspended during summer, Rolando added, many families scramble to feed children.

The success of the food drive demonstrates "the remarkable connection between letter carriers and the communities they serve," he said. "It's a bond that serves the nation well." ★

Newsom Requests Preparation of Water Resilience Portfolio

SACRAMENTO CA (MPG) - As climate change continues to threaten the state's water infrastructure and reliability, Governor Gavin Newsom today signed an executive order directing his administration to think differently and act boldly by developing a comprehensive strategy to build a climate-resilient water system.

The order seeks to broaden California's approach on water as the state faces a range of existing challenges, including unsafe drinking water, major flood risks that threaten public safety, severely depleted groundwater aquifers, agricultural communities coping with uncertain water supplies and native fish populations threatened with extinction.

"California's water challenges are daunting, from severely depleted groundwater basins to vulnerable infrastructure to unsafe drinking water in far too many communities. Climate change magnifies the risks," said Governor Newsom. "To meet these challenges, we need to harness the best in

science, engineering and innovation to prepare for what's ahead and ensure long-term water resilience and ecosystem health. We'll need an all-of-above approach to get there."

The order directs the secretaries of the California Natural Resources Agency, California Environmental Protection Agency and the California Department of Food and Agriculture to identify and assess a suite of complementary actions to ensure safe and resilient water supplies, flood protection and healthy waterways for the state's communities, economy and environment.

The order directs the state to think bigger and more strategically on water by directing the agencies to inventory and assess current water supplies and the health of waterways, future demands and challenges. The agencies will seek input over the coming weeks and months through listening sessions, information workshops and other public meetings to help inform the water resilience portfolio that will be recommended to the Governor.

Legislation to Stop the Text Tax Clears First Hurdle

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Assembly Communications and Conveyance Committee approved AB 162 on a 8-0 vote, a bill authored by Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) to statutorily prohibit the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) from taxing text messages or any other technology classified as an "information service" by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). The bill now moves forward to a full vote on the Assembly Floor.

"I am very encouraged

by the bipartisan support this proposal received today," Kiley said. "It is important that the Legislature deliver a strong message to the people of California that we want to keep their text messages tax-free."

The bill's 25 coauthors are the third most of any bill this year, making it one of the top three most popular bills in the Legislature according to CALmatters.

The CPUC's proposal to add a surcharge to text messages was set to be considered in January 2019 before the FCC issued a declaratory ruling classifying text messages as

an "information service." While the CPUC has statutory authority over the regulation of telecommunications technology, this legislation will explicitly prohibit surcharges on information services under state law.

Sacramento Police and Sheriff's 17th Annual Remembrance Ceremony

WOODLAKE, SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On Friday, May 2, officers from several agencies, including Sacramento Police Department and Sacramento Sheriff's Department, descended upon the quiet Woodlake neighborhood for the 17th Annual Remembrance Ceremony, and to commemorate a new memorial plaque for Officer Mark Stasyuk who lost his life in the line of duty on September 17, 2018.

The ceremony included a procession of law enforcement officers from Sacramento Police Department and Sacramento Sheriff's Department led by the Sacramento Firefighters Pipes and Drums.

Officer Paul Brown, President of the Sacramento Police Sheriff's Memorial Foundation welcomed officers, fallen officer families, dignitaries, fellow officers from outside agencies, and the general public.

"Today, let us remember our Sacramento fallen," said the 20 year Sacramento Police Department veteran.

Pastor Anthony Sadler of Shiloh Baptist Church gave the invocation prior to guest speakers.

"It is in times like these that we realize how fragile we are and how quickly our loved ones can be taken away from us." Each officer, he added, to be remembered had paid

the ultimate price, as did the fallen officer's family, in order to protect the citizens.

"Today we are saddened, and also honored, to add yet one more hero to the rank." He then called for prayers for Deputy Mark Stasyuk and his family.

"We honor Deputy Stasyuk for his extraordinary bravery in the face of imminent danger," he stated.

Throughout the invocation, the bells of Sacramento Regional Transit's light sounded gently. The memorial, a living monument, is situated across the street from Woodlake Park and behind the light rail station on Arden Way. Land was donated by North Sacramento Land Company, wrote Rotary

Club of North Sacramento President, Stephen Lemmon. His organization, along with Woodlake Improvement Club worked with the land company.

"Since we had a great working relationship with the Sacramento Police Department, the idea was hatched for a memorial," Lemmon wrote, adding that Rotary Club member Dennis Tsuboi submitted the design and the club contributed \$10,000.

In 1992, "a foundation was formed including both unions for Sac PD and Sac Sheriff, reps for the Chief and the Sheriff, the Rotary Club, Woodlake and the Council Member," wrote Lemmon.

A list of major funders, board of directors, and past board members is etched in

granite beside the dedication stone that reads, "For all those who served & sacrificed wearing the badge, we are eternally grateful."

Sacramento Police Department Chief Daniel Hahn spoke first.

"Welcome to these sacred grounds," he said. "We will never forget the sacrifice that you have made for our entire community."

Chief Hahn spoke several minutes about current challenges for law enforcement, community, and how these men and women "know what it takes to protect our community, to protect our values and our way of life."

"We pray that this will be the last year that we add a name to this very important memorial," said Hahn.

Sheriff Scott R. Jones spoke next, thanking Supervisor Susan Peters, general public, and fellow officers.

"I love coming to this place. I come from time to time. It seems like things are a little quieter, things are a bit more contemplative. It seems like I'm able to be a little bit more reflective. I love the fact that the community takes care of this place. It is truly hollow ground," he said, adding that he also hates that there needs to be a place like this and that another name needs to be added this year.

Mark Stasyuk's name joined twenty other Sheriff's department officers, District Attorney Investigator Grant Wilson, Galt Police Department Officer Kevin Tonn, and

sixteen Sacramento Police Department officers.

"His life made a difference," said District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert.

Chief Todd Sockman, Galt Police Department, spoke about the family of law enforcement and the family that includes the community.

"As a family, we can get through this," he said.

Following the guest speakers, the name of each of the 39 fallen officers was called, with a moment of silence, and the placement of a yellow rose on each memorial plaque by members of each respective agency. Each officer was honored with a white-gloved salute by a member of his agency.

Sheriff Jones said of 4 1/2 year veteran Mark Stasyuk, that he "exemplified what it meant to be a law enforcement officer."

Yellow roses were presented to members of the Stasyuk family who carried the flowers and placed them on his memorial.

Following a moment of silence, the rider-less horse was led in and through the memorial, a bugler played "Taps," followed by a 21-gun salute, and a fly-over of helicopters in the missing flyer formation.

"If one member suffers, all suffer together," said Sacramento Police Officer William J. Conner in the benediction. "We are all part of something greater than ourselves."

We've Heard Enough From Robert Mueller

The last thing the world needs is more of Robert Mueller's commentary, but Congress is determined to have him hold forth at a public hearing.

It's not as though we don't already have the special counsel's version of events. He mustered enormous investigate resources and took two years to write a 400-page report that is available to the public and presumably carefully written (although not necessarily carefully thought through).

That should be enough for Mueller to stand on, and enough for Congress to make a decision to impeach or not impeach, or otherwise dispose of the matter as it sees fit.

Instead, Mueller is going to be asked to expand on his already-expansive report that not only blew through Justice Department regulations, but inverted the long-standing burden of proof in the Anglo-American legal tradition.

As a prosecutor, Mueller's

job -- his sole job, really -- was to decide whether or not the president was guilty of a crime. He declined to do this, choosing instead to write a nearly 200-page volume on obstruction cataloging what he found in the course of not making the only decision he was supposed to make.

The relevant regulations say that at the conclusion of the special counsel's work he or she "shall provide the Attorney General with a confidential report explaining the prosecution or declination decisions reached by the Special Counsel."

On obstruction, Mueller reached no such decision, and he didn't write a confidential report, either -- his report was clearly meant for public consumption. Besides that, he's a stickler for the rules.

Worse, as Trump's special counsel Emmet Flood set out in an excoriating letter, by stipulating that the evidence prevented him "from conclusively determining that no criminal conduct occurred," Mueller stood the presumption of innocence on its head.

By Mueller's standard, the prosecutor doesn't have to prove guilt -- the target has to prove innocence. And if the target doesn't, he will be disparaged in a long-form quasi-indictment spelling out why he's not exonerated.

If anyone not named Donald J. Trump were subjected to this new

prosecutorial standard, it would occasion widespread comment and -- one hopes -- consternation.

Now, Congress wants Mueller to compound the offense by speaking publicly. It doesn't want facts from him. They are already in the report. It wants opinions and sound bites, especially any embarrassing to the president. Congress wants him to spend a couple of high-profile hours further "not exonerating" the president.

If Mueller had a proper understanding of his role, he would decline the congressional invitation. But the fact is that Mueller and Congress have a symbiotic relationship. For two years, Mueller was acting as, in effect, the lead counsel for an impeachment inquiry -- bizarrely housed within the executive branch -- while Congress wants to use his moral authority as a crutch at a time when it is vulnerable to charges of partisan overreaching.

This, too, is not supposed to be how the system works. But we are long beyond anyone caring. For a swath of the political world and much of the media, all that matters is that Mueller "not exonerate" Trump, and the more, the better, in whatever format or forum.

Sacramento County DA Reports



Defendant Sentenced for Shooting at Family Members in Front Yard

DATE: April 4, 2019

CASE: Markees Brown (Case #17FE017680)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Nicholas Johnson, Targeting Armed Recidivist Gang Enforcement Team (TARGET)

The Honorable Ernest Sawtelle sentenced Markees Brown to 258 years to life in prison. On November 6, 2018, a jury convicted Brown of three counts of first-degree attempted murder with premeditation and deliberation, three counts of assault with a semi-automatic firearm, three counts of shooting at individuals from a car, shooting at an inhabited dwelling and felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true multiple firearm enhancements.

Allegations that Brown suffered three prior strike convictions for first-degree residential burglary were found true at the sentencing hearing.

Markees Brown was dating a young woman who was in an ongoing dispute with members of a family who lived in the Strawberry Manors neighborhood. On September 11, 2017, members of that family were out in the front yard, including a 4-year-old boy. Brown and another individual drove up to the family's residence. Brown then got out of the car, pulled out a semi-automatic handgun and shot four times at the residence. No one was struck by the gunfire. Brown got back into the car and drove away. Several family members were able to identify Brown as the shooter.

Defendant Convicted for Multiple Robberies

DATE: May 7, 2019

CASE: Theo Simmons (Case #16FE008671)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Scott Schweibish, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Theo Simmons was convicted by a jury of four counts of robbery. The jury also found true that Simmons personally used a firearm during two of the robberies.

On New Year's Eve 2015, Theo Simmons and a juvenile accomplice entered a Walgreens in Rancho Cordova armed with a firearm. Both defendants went to the pharmacy and jumped the counter looking for drugs. Simmons jammed the gun in the side of a victim

and forced her in the back where the drugs were kept. The juvenile grabbed the other victim and ordered her to provide him with drugs. They placed the pill bottles into a backpack and fled the store to a waiting getaway vehicle.

On February 29, 2016, Simmons and the juvenile robbed the same Walgreens. In this robbery, the pair took a pill bottle with a tracker on it, which was tracked back to an apartment complex. Officers did not locate the suspects, but they did find the getaway vehicle. Inside the vehicle, officers located clothing consistent with clothes worn by the suspects as well as a pellet gun. Simmons and the juvenile were later arrested in San Joaquin for committing a similar robbery. They were both linked to the Sacramento robberies through clothing and prints. Simmons pled guilty to the robbery in San Joaquin County.

Simmons faces a maximum sentence of 21 years, 4 months in prison. Sentencing is set for May 28, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 28 before the Honorable Richard Sueyoshi.

Defendants Convicted for Murder of Teenage Brothers

DATE: May 7, 2019

CASE: Hieu Hoang & Richard Saterfield (Case #17FE008865)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Jeff Hightower, Homicide Unit Hieu Hoang and Richard Saterfield were convicted by a jury of two counts of murder for the shooting deaths of 19-year-old Daniel Murti and 15-year-old Sergio Murti. The jury also found that both Hoang and Saterfield personally used a firearm in the course of the murders, and that both committed the special circumstance of multiple murders.

On May 11, 2017, Richard Saterfield initiated a confrontation with the victims. Saterfield obtained a gun from his vehicle and gave it to Hieu Hoang, who shot both victims. Sergio collapsed and died where he was shot. Daniel attempted to flee through a parking lot. Hoang and Saterfield got in their car and chased Daniel. Saterfield fired several additional shots at Daniel, who collapsed in the parking lot and died.

Both defendants face a maximum sentence of life in prison without parole. Sentencing is set for June 7, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 41 before the Honorable Helena Gweon.



 of incarnations, seeing shops like JC Penney move to Arden Fair Mall, Woolworth and Weinstocks close, and Macy's move out. The mall, once a thriving retail location serving a broad population from Carmichael to Natomas and points north and south, is in the midst of reinventing itself, thanks to the new owners who took over a mere four years ago.

WinCo foods took over the long-vacant location that once housed JC Penney and more recently Weinstocks; Planet Fitness set up shop; and Flaming Grill, a decades-long staple on Arden Way, is centrally located in the mall. The theater is one of several entertainment venues the mall seeks to attract.

Rebounderz opened in January and features trampoline-based activities including basketball and dodge ball played on trampolines. A ninja warrior course is also available

as are arcade games. Seth Pearl, Operations Manager for the mall, said that a virtual reality center is expected to open this year.

In addition to entertainment, the mall is increasing its offerings of food with several new eateries for take out or dine in. YouMingTang Wutic Tea House across from Luxury Theater is celebrating its grand opening, and the mall's website says that Luchador Coffee is now serving.

Service businesses are also flourishing and include Sarah's Alterations and a barber shop that will open soon. Rainbow, a fashion retailer, has also moved in.

A caterer, who was watching her daughters perform on the ninja circuit in Rebounderz, was considering space at the mall and a small business owner was inquiring about a freestanding kiosk space in which he could sell Afghan jewelry.

Although there are many empty spaces and there was not a lot of foot traffic during the ribbon cutting ceremony, the mall is growing. Not everyone is excited about the movie theater's turquoise and rust paint scheme or night lighting, but the consensus was overwhelmingly positive Wednesday evening.

One woman wanted to buy a ticket and said she would return the next day when the theater opened, but many tickets had been presold said Assistant Manager Payge Lloyd.

"It was an exciting weekend and most showings of Avengers were sold out," wrote Cinema West Executive Director James Howard. "The shopping center is buzzing with new activity, and it looks like we have a great future."
