Present 1906
Earthquake Living
History Day**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California State Capitol Museum Volunteer Association (CSCMVA) is proud to present a compelling 1906 Earthquake Living History Day on Sunday, April 28, 2019, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Free to the public, this interpretive Living History event is designed to re-enact some little known events connected to what is known as California's "Big One" - the 1906 San Francisco Earthquake and Fire.

For one day only, each year, the California State Capitol Museum Volunteer Association invites the community to step back in time to revisit the earth-moving experience and learn from the past. Visitors to the California State Capitol Museum will be surrounded by docents in period attire as they re-create the memorable scenes of the recovery efforts.

Some key moments in time include local dignitaries as they assisted refugees - many of whom camped out on the Capitol grounds or at Sutter's Fort - and Sacramento women as they aided Bay Area families in need by providing meal tickets, clothing and blankets. And, guests will be close-at-hand when then-California Governor George Pardee receives an important telegram - not a text, email or phone call - from President Theodore Roosevelt offering a staggering sum of \$1 million for disaster relief.

Pinwheels for Child Abuse Prevention Month

SACRAMENTO COUNTY (MPG)

- To honor National Child Abuse Prevention Month, Sacramento County Child Protective Services staff "planted" 350 silver and blue pinwheels at the CPS office on Bradshaw Road. On average, CPS social workers investigate 1,100 reports of child abuse or neglect every month. Roughly 350 children who have experienced trauma or abuse are seen at the Special Assault Forensic Evaluation (SAFE) Center each year.

The SAFE Center, located at 3701 Power Inn Rd., provides a welcoming, child-friendly atmosphere where children, who may be victims of sexual abuse, physical abuse, or witnesses to violent crimes, are interviewed by specially trained staff who have experience in talking to children about difficult subjects.

In 2008, Prevent Child Abuse America, a

national, non-profit organization dedicated to the development of programs that prevent all types of child abuse and neglect, introduced the pinwheel as the national symbol for child abuse prevention through Pinwheels for Prevention®. Since then, agencies including child advocacy centers across the nation have been planting Pinwheel Gardens to raise awareness of child abuse and neglect and to support the healthy development of our nation's children.

"It is important for social workers and staff to be part of the Pinwheels for Prevention campaign; to have a visual representation of their tireless effort to keep children in our community safe," said Michelle Callejas, Director of the Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services. "It's also important that we take the time to show our appreciation for Sacramento County social workers for the profound

difference they make each day in the lives of children and families across our community. The pinwheels are a reminder that we should all want each child in our community to have a safe and happy childhood."

Here are 5 tips for preventing child abuse and neglect:

- (1) Be a friend to a parent you know. Ask how their children are doing. Draw on your own experiences to provide reassurance and support. If a parent seems to be struggling, offer to babysit or run errands, or just lend a friendly ear. Show you understand;
- (2) Be a friend to a child you know. Remember their names. Smile when you talk with them. Ask them about their day at school. Send them a card in the mail. Show you care;
- (3) Talk to your neighbors about looking out for one another's children.

Encourage a supportive spirit among parents in your apartment building or on your block. Show that you are involved.

- (4) Give your used clothing, furniture and toys to another family to use. This can help relieve the stress of financial burdens on parents.
- (5) Volunteer your time and money for programs in your community that support children and families.

Serial Bank Robber Wanted for Series of Bank Robberies

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) is seeking information to aid the identification and apprehension of a bank robbery suspect who is allegedly tied to four robberies in the greater Sacramento region. The young Caucasian male is suspected of the following robberies:

Friday, November 23, 2018, at approximately 1:55 p.m. at River City Bank located at 239 E Street in Davis;

Tuesday, November 27, 2018, at approximately 2:05 p.m. at U.S. Bank located at 903 Colusa Avenue in Yuba City;

Wednesday, January 2, 2019, at approximately 1:43 p.m. at U.S. Bank located at 1020 White Rock Road in El Dorado Hills;

Friday, February 15, 2019, at approximately 3:25 p.m. at U.S. Bank located at 1020 White Rock Road in El Dorado Hills;

Additionally, the suspect also allegedly attempted to rob the Wells Fargo Bank

located at 1235 Stratford Avenue in Dixon on Saturday, March 2, 2019, but was unsuccessful.

During the commission of each of the robberies, the suspect entered the bank, approached the teller, and presented a demand note. After receiving money, the suspect then departed on foot.

The suspect—believed to be 20 to 30 years old—stands 5'6" to 5'10" tall with a thin build. He has frequently worn hooded sweatshirts with the hood pulled over baseball-style

caps, dark basketball-style shorts, and black shoes. Images of the suspect, including a composite developed from surveillance footage from the robberies, are available on the FBI's Wanted Bank Robber website: <https://bankrobbers.fbi.gov/2018-12-20.9882688550>.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation, El Dorado County Sheriff's Department, Davis Police Department, Dixon Police Department, and Yuba City Police Department are investigating this series of bank robberies.

Individuals with information about this man may call the FBI Sacramento Field Office. Tips may also be submitted online at: tips.fbi.gov. If the subject is spotted in the community, the public is urged to call 911 and not approach the individual. Wanted fugitives, bank robbers, and other cases in need of additional information from the public are posted on the FBI Sacramento Division's Most Wanted page. ★

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Those passionate for pristine waterways may join a huge effort on Saturday, April 13. From 9 am till noon, hundreds of volunteers will clear debris from American River beauty spots. Thanks to human abuse – and a season of high water – unwanted harvests spoil spring wildflower displays. The annual April cleanup usually yields about 4500 pounds of garbage.

Coordinated by the American River Parkway Foundation, this project grooms reserves between Discovery Park and Sunrise Bridge. Seven river sites – including locations in Carmichael, Fair Oaks, Rancho Cordova and Sacramento – are included in housekeeping.

The cleanup preps the parkway for summer activity. "A clean river also decreases garbage that ends up at sea," says Parkway Foundation staffer Justino Santana. "Trash not only mars landscapes; it causes

pollution and endangers wildlife on waterways and at the coast."

Santana advises volunteers to dress for dirt and to wear stout shoes. Gardening gloves save from scratches. Volunteers who are younger than 16 must be accompanied by an adult. Participation qualifies for student community service hours. Trash bags will be provided and Sacramento County will dispose of the garbage haul.

Sac Airport Sees Runway Closure

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On April 2, the Sacramento International Airport (SMF) will initiate a project to rehabilitate the West Runway (16R/34L) that will continue until late October. During this time, the East Runway (16L/34R) will be the only operational runway at SMF.

The rehabilitation will involve removing the existing asphalt runway and replacing it with a new concrete runway. "Runway rehabilitation is a common necessity for airports," says Airports Director Cindy Nichol. "The new concrete runway will require less maintenance and have a longer lifespan than the current asphalt runway."

In preparation for managing a one runway operation effectively, airport staff consulted with other single runway airports to learn best practices for airfield maintenance that minimizes the impact to commercial flight operations.

Due to the need for routine maintenance on the East Runway, the airport will implement twice monthly

closures of the East Runway beginning at the initiation of the West Runway project. These closures will occur on the first and third Sunday of each month from 12:30am to 5:30am. This was identified as the day and time with the least impact to operations. The first closure will take place April 7.

"We have been working closely with our airline

partners in planning for managing a one runway operation," continued Nichol. "We chose a five hour window with the least operational impact."

During the closures, arrivals will not be allowed after 12:30am and departures not until 5:30am. Aircraft that arrive after 12:30am during one of the twice monthly closures will be diverted

to another airport. Aircraft that do not depart before 12:30am during a closure will not be able to leave until the runway reopens at 5:30am.

The East Runway is one mile closer to most residential areas, because of this, Natomas communities may experience an increase in aircraft noise throughout the duration of the project. ★

Companies Move to Keep Better Employees

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Employers have been actively recruiting workers in a 'finder's focus' as economic growth created opportunity over the last decade. A lack of skilled applicants in all sectors and a shortage of basic labor has moved companies to a new 'keeper' environment as they seek to retain those in their workforces.

Historically low unemployment is moving Sacramento companies from recruiting to retention. When asked, 'In 2019 where is retention on your list of

priorities?' the majority report it has topped the list. Fifty three percent (53%) of those surveyed in direct contacts (between February 25th and March 22nd) cite it as their #1 priority in Q2 2019.

As one construction sector contact said in anecdotal comment, "#1 no matter the unemployment rate" keeping skilled, experienced employees is always important. Another manufacturer says, "More than important, imperative in an era of low unemployment". When asked about retention, other contacts cited changes in the employee base as one issue in keeping employees

on the job, "Understanding multi-generational desires" and another citing more opportunity, "It's easier to leave and land on your feet" and, as one employer cited, "Increased focus on generations to improve retention, especially millennials". The idea of company 'loyalty' is often noted as an issue with one service company polled reporting, "More problems with transient employees" and another saying retention of experience is vital in, "Maintaining client relationships, you must be proactive with employees' to keep them."

While greater business

opportunity exists, as this service contact noted. "We're ready to grow, just trying to find talent." Pacific Staffing discovered that fifty-seven percent (57%) of Sacramento employers are seeking to hire in the next three months. While forty-eight percent (48%) are motivated by replacements or attrition in the existing workforce forty one percent (41%) are still hiring for expansion or

growth of the business in April, May and June.

Twenty per cent (20%) of hiring is prompted by seasonal needs. Most seasonal demand was from construction sector companies as they all were seeking general labor, skilled construction trades, equipment operators and drivers.

Other skills in demand in the second quarter among all companies surveyed include

customer service, sales, route/delivery drivers, product assembly, manufacturing and IT.

Sacramento regional top companies polled by industry were: 54% were Service, 25% were Manufacturers, 19% were Construction and 2% were Retail. For more information, employment blogs and market surveys go to www.pacificstaffing.com. ★

Assemblyman Kevin Kiley Introduces Legislation to Close Secret DMV

SACRAMENTO, CA - Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) introduced Assembly Bill 862 today that would prohibit the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) from operating a secret DMV field office that only serves a select group of individuals in state government, including Members of the Legislature and their staff.

"At a time when the DMV is failing to adequately serve Californians, it is unconscionable that lawmakers tasked with keeping the department accountable do not have to wait in the same lines as the people they represent," Kiley said. "We'll see if there's more interest in

fixing the DMV once all California Legislators are required to endure the same experience as their constituents."

Multiple news reports and audits in recent months have highlighted the DMV's deficiencies, including:

Over 6-8 hours wait times in many locations; Mishandling of 23,000 voter registrations since passage of Motor Voter law; Incorrectly registering over 1,500 ineligible voters, including non-citizens; Preventing over 500 eligible voters from registering due to failure to submit paperwork on time; Employee sleeping on the job over 2,000 hours; Dozens of technology outages disabling operations for hours at a time; Failing to comply

with federal law regarding Real ID identity verification; Resignation of DMV director responsible for mismanagement.

Most recently, an audit by the Department of Finance uncovered a number of concerning findings at the DMV including an outdated organizational structure, poor performing IT systems, and a failure to properly train employees to meet the needs of customers.

\$15.5 Million in Rebates Awarded for Electric Vehicle Chargers

SMUD SPECIAL RELEASE (MPG) - A rebate project to increase access to electric vehicle (EV) chargers throughout Sacramento County is launching with up to \$15.5 million in funds available for qualifying local businesses and nonprofit organizations.

The rebates will be available through the Sacramento County Incentive Project to install both commercial-grade Level 2 chargers and high-powered DC fast chargers. The project is an initiative of the California Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Project (CALeVIP), which works with local community partners to develop and implement regional incentive projects for charging infrastructure that supports the adoption of EVs statewide.

CALeVIP and its regional projects are implemented by the Center for Sustainable Energy and funded primarily by the California Energy Commission's Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program. California's goal is to get 5 million EVs on its roads by 2030 to reduce carbon emissions and to support those vehicles by installing 250,000 chargers statewide.

"The California Energy Commission is pleased to partner with the Center for Sustainable Energy and SMUD to increase access to charging infrastructure that makes plug-in electric cars with no tailpipe pollution an easier choice for drivers in Sacramento County and surrounding communities," said Janea A. Scott, Vice Chair of the California Energy Commission.

"By supporting increased deployment of charging infrastructure in communities across California, CALeVIP

is helping the state transition to zero emission vehicles, reducing pollution from the transportation sector."

In Sacramento County, the Energy Commission is funding \$14 million and the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) is providing \$1.5 million. SMUD has also committed to invest all its revenue generated by this project from the state's Low Carbon Fuel Standard Program to support additional community EV charger installations.

Currently, there are more than 10,000 EVs and nearly 700 EV chargers in public locations throughout Sacramento County, according to SMUD officials.

"Our goal is to improve the environmental, social and economic vitality of communities across our region, and increasing mobility with clean cars is one way to do that," said Ed Hamzawi, SMUD's director of Advanced Energy Solutions. "We are proud to play a key role in promoting electric vehicle adoption and infrastructure expansion as Sacramento works to lead the way."

CALeVIP is currently accepting applications from eligible Sacramento businesses and public entities for DC fast charger installations with rebates of up to \$70,000 per charger or 75 percent of the total installation project's cost, whichever is less. Rebates for Level 2 chargers are up to \$6,000 per connector. Applicants can apply for multiple charger rebates.

Additional funding is available for installations in disadvantaged communities, with up to \$80,000 for DC fast chargers and up to \$6,500 for Level 2 chargers.

Level 2 chargers deliver 15-35 miles of electric driving range per hour of

charging and are great for locations where drivers are parked for a few hours. DC fast chargers can power most EVs and provide over 100 miles of driving range per hour of charging, which is ideal along major travel corridors for on-the-go charging.

"With a growing number of car shoppers in Sacramento County choosing electric vehicles, it is increasingly important that fast charging be available at convenient locations, along the highways and at common destinations," said Andy Hoskinson, senior manager for EV initiatives at the Center for Sustainable Energy (CSE).

"The increased rebates for disadvantaged communities are particularly significant as these neighborhoods are often more heavily impacted by traffic and poor air quality."

A national nonprofit organization, CSE manages statewide incentive programs for electric vehicles and electrical vehicle charging infrastructure in California, New York, Connecticut and Massachusetts.

CALeVIP also currently offers incentive projects in a four-county area of Southern California and in Fresno County with other projects planned throughout the state. CALeVIP is currently funded for \$77 million, with the potential to receive up to \$200 million.

Property owners and managers can learn about plug-in EV charging, how to plan installations and manage chargers and the application process by visiting the CALeVIP website. A recorded webinar for prospective charger site hosts is available online. For more information, visit CALeVIP.org.

IRS Urges Taxpayers to Check Their Tax Withholding Early in 2019

INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE, WASHINGTON - The Internal Revenue Service has renewed its effort to encourage taxpayers to review their tax withholding using the IRS Withholding Calculator and make any needed adjustments early in 2019.

Doing a Paycheck Checkup can help taxpayers avoid having too little or too much tax withheld from their paychecks.

The federal income tax is a pay-as-you-go tax. Taxpayers pay the tax as they earn or receive income during the year. Employers generally use withholding tables to determine how much tax to withhold from their employees' paychecks and then pay it to the IRS. Workers who are not subject to withholding, such as those working in the gig or shared economy, should make quarterly estimated tax payments to pay their tax during the year.

Taxpayers should check their withholding each year and when life changes occur, such as marriage, childbirth, adoption or buying a home.

For 2019, it's important to review withholding and do a Paycheck Checkup. This is especially true for taxpayers who adjusted their withholdings in 2018 - specifically in the middle or later parts of the year. And it's also important for taxpayers who received a tax bill when they filed this year or want to adjust the size of their refund for next year.

A withholding table shows payroll service providers and employers how much tax to withhold from employee paychecks, given each employee's wages, marital status, and the

number of withholding allowances they claim.

The IRS Withholding Calculator can help taxpayers get their tax withholding right. Checking withholding can protect against having too little tax withheld and then facing an unexpected tax bill or penalty at tax time next year.

A taxpayer may prefer to have less tax withheld upfront and receive more in their paycheck. And, some people may choose to have their employer withhold more money from their paycheck. Others may choose to make higher or more tax payments than required and receive the overpayment - or refund - when they file their tax return. This is an individual taxpayer choice.

Taxpayers can use the results from the IRS Withholding Calculator to determine if they should complete a new Form W-4, Employee's Withholding Allowance Certificate. The calculator will recommend the number of allowances to claim on this form and, if needed, the amount of additional federal income tax to have withheld each pay period. Employees submit the completed Form W-4 to their employer, not the IRS.

When taxpayers file their 2018 tax return, they may notice significant changes from the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) including lowered tax rates, increased standard deductions, suspension of personal exemptions, increased Child Tax Credit and limited or discontinued deductions.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Many years ago a submarine was rammed by another ship and quickly sank. Despite many efforts by many ships to rescue the crew it was feared their oxygen would run out long before anyone could get to them. Hours into the desperate tragedy the sonar men listening for any indication of life on the crippled sub heard a tapping, suddenly realizing it was the dots and dashes of Morse code. The question came slowly: "is... there... any... hope?"

That's the question we all ask. In a turbulent world, full of disasters, misinformation and division we want to know if there is any hope. We may feel overwhelmed by the economic, political, relational, or medical situations we are in. Perhaps we are concerned for our jobs, our kids, our parents, or some other loved one. So we ask ourselves internally "is there any hope?" Recent suicides of people who survived school shootings indicate a loss of hope.

The Christian Faith gives a positive and robust answer to that feeling of hopelessness. Yes, there is hope! The Apostle

Living Hope

Peter writes to suffering believers scattered throughout ancient Asia Minor these encouraging words about hope.

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In His great mercy He has given us new birth into a LIVING HOPE through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade ---kept in heaven for you,... *1 Peter 1:3-4*

Hope is defined in dictionaries as expectation or optimism. Hope implies little certainty but suggests confidence and assurance in the possibility that what one desires or longs for will happen. In the Bible hope is not wishful thinking but a firm conviction. Hope is a positive feeling about your present & future.

In the above Biblical text the Apostle Peter adds the adjective "living" to the word and concept of hope. Why isn't just the word "hope" good enough to encourage his audience who are suffering religious persecution? Why must Peter add this modifier?

The word "living" implies that the object of this hope is alive. There are many illustrations of great humans becoming the object of a community's hope. The former NBA coach Larry Bird, or the 1910 boxer James Jefferies are two examples from sports. These men were expected to succeed.

The Apostle Peter doesn't leave us to guess who that "living hope" is. It is Jesus Christ. Jesus inaugurated the Kingdom of God on earth in His public ministry and became the

world's King by suffering death on a Roman cross. Jesus was raised to life according to the Scriptures and appeared alive to more than 500. (1 Corinthians 15:3-6) Peter declares that the resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the ground of the living hope he is teaching about. This is the Christian message of Easter: Jesus is alive!

Because Jesus is alive... hope is alive. But there is a catch to receive or access this living hope. People must respond to the mercy and love of their Creator in repentance and faith. When this occurs, and everyone has their own story of how and when it happens, Peter teaches that God gives a "new birth into a living hope." This spiritual rebirth enables the repentant believer to confidently live in the present in a Christ-like manner & with the hope that they too will one day experience the resurrection of their bodies and receive an eternal inheritance in heaven.

This is all "heady" stuff; teaching that aims to direct us toward the lynch pin of the Christian Faith: The resurrection of Jesus. The message of Easter. Plan now to attend a house of worship on Easter Sunday or join others for a Community Sunrise Easter Service at the Carmichael Park - Band Shell at 6:20AM Easter morning.
