CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The more you listen, the more you hear. And when a truly inspirational story finds you, you just have to listen.

An overflow crowd attended the recent Carmichael Chamber of Commerce luncheon on January 22, there to hear the amazing story of Mikuni family restaurants. Taro Arai, the

Chief Dreaming Officer for the company, told the story of how the family grew from very humble beginnings.

His father, Koki Arai, once had a dream that he was to open a restaurant in the United States. He said "Dad, you know nothing about cooking, nothing about business, and you want to start a restaurant?" But, because of his faith and the message he was given, Koki

persevered. Coming to America with almost nothing, they opened their first restaurant in Fair Oaks on Hazel Blvd.

At one time the family received a loan from a friend and businessman in Japan. In a short time they had lost everything, but were resolved to not give up. "My father continued because he had faith in God" Taro said. "He always said we will be blessed."

And blessed they were. Over time, they have added many new restaurants in the region and all of them successful. They have also given back a great deal to the community. Their belief is they have been so blessed and they will always be dedicated to blessing others.

If you ever get a chance to hear Taro speak of their family story be sure to attend. It is truly inspiring. ★

Raising Your Awareness of Human Trafficking

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - During the month of January, advocates, organizations and individuals unite to raise awareness about human trafficking. Human trafficking is an issue that touches every community, including Sacramento County youth.

Since September 2015, Sacramento County Child Protective Services has identified 199 adolescents who were sexually exploited or at risk of being sexually exploited. 98 percent of those youth are female with the median age of 13-17, and a disproportionately high number of these youth – 45 percent are African American.

Child Protective Services (CPS) is the lead agency charged with providing services and support, including placement, for these vulnerable youth. CPS has a significant need for Foster Families, now called Resource Families, to provide loving and stable homes for all children and youth that enter foster care. There is a specific need for youth that have been sexually exploited. Learn more about becoming a Resource Family and/or adoptive parent by attending a Resource Family/Adoptive Parent Orientation or call 916-875-5543.

In 2015, the District Attorney's Office created Sacramento Together – a Human Trafficking Task Force coalition. Sacramento Together wants to raise awareness about this issue and encourage all members of the public to attend a showing of the documentary entitled, "California's Forgotten Children." This film gives viewers the tools to combat this epidemic.

The Sacramento County District Attorney's Office is also part of a number of collaborative efforts to rescue and assist victims including; Sacramento Together Anti-Human Trafficking Coalition.

"California's Forgotten Children" is a feature documentary about child sex trafficking.

A Vital Emergency Bridge Program for Foster Children

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Counties throughout California are working to recruit loving families to care for foster children, but some families may feel they cannot afford to bring a foster child into their home due to budget constraints. To increase the number of foster parents and meet the needs of foster children, the Emergency Child Care Bridge Program for Foster Children was established for counties to help caregivers pay for child care until they find other subsidized child care or are able to

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - With 24 museums participating by offering complimentary admission, the 21st Annual Free Museum Day takes place on Saturday, February 2, 2019, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. New this year, the popular day is also the kick-off to Sacramento Museum Week (February 2-8, 2019) filled with special events, activities and activations at various museums. While admission is complimentary to everyone on Free Museum Day only, regular admission applies at all museums during Sacramento Museum Week. Coordinated by Sacramento Area Museums (SAM) with the support of Visit Sacramento, Free Museum Day and Sacramento Museum Week in 2019 are proudly presented by Sutter Health and sponsored by California Family Fitness.

"We are thrilled to present the 21st Annual Free Museum Day plus extend the fun by offering a new Sacramento Museum Week this year," said Sacramento Area Museums Chair Delta Pick Mello. Free Museum Day is a popular cultural tradition designed to encourage all members of the community to experience the Capital City's incredible wealth of art, history, science and wildlife, free of charge. Many of the museums are within walking distance of each other and easily accessible via public transportation.

And, to help easily and conveniently transport guests who wish to visit multiple museums in Sacramento's urban core, Sacramento Regional Transit (SacRT) is offering free rides on all buses and light rail trains on Saturday, February 2 only with a printed SacRT Museum Day flyer (only one flyer needed per family or group). For more information specifically about SacRT park-and-ride stations and schedules, visit sacr.com/services.

On Free Museum Day, event coordinators suggest that guests plan to visit no more than two or three different museums on this day in order to allow adequate time to enjoy the experience and to travel between individual sites. Due to the popularity of Free Museum Day, some locations must limit the number of admissions for safety reasons. The event is scheduled from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. but note the last guests will be admitted at 4 p.m.

It's the beginning of a new year and the time when people often make resolutions to embark on something new—like playing the piano, expanding skill sets in the kitchen or learning a new language.

How about making a resolution to enhance your home and lifestyle by being as water wise as possible? Sacramento Suburban Water District (SSWD) has ideas and resources to make this one of the easiest resolutions to keep.

1) **Check the soil moisture level before watering your yard.** In the Sacramento region, most household water

is used outdoors and 30 percent of it is wasted due to overwatering or evaporation. By checking your soil before you water, you can make sure your plants get just what they need. SSWD has free moisture meters available for its customers.

- 2) **Install WaterSense-labeled showerheads and faucet aerators.** Showering accounts for nearly 17 percent of the indoor water use. By installing a WaterSense-labeled showerhead you can save thousands of gallons of water a year.
- 3) **Upgrade your sprinklers and sprinkler controller.** Replacing your old pop-up

sprinklers with high-efficiency rotator sprinklers can reduce the amount of water used by 30 percent and lead to healthier plants. These sprinklers deliver water in multiple streams at a slower rate, allowing the water to be better absorbed by the soil. And by installing a WaterSense-labeled weather-based sprinkler timer, you can save even more. SSWD has rebates available.

- 4) **Use plenty of mulch around your plants and trees.** Mulch helps regulate soil temperature, reduce evaporation and keeps weeds at bay. Apply 2 to 3 inches of organic mulch around shrubs and 4 to 6 inches around your trees. Make sure to keep the mulch 4 inches away from the tree trunk.

- 5) **Set up a Water-Wise House Call.** During this complimentary service for SSWD customers, one of our water efficiency experts will do a complete review of your water use. They'll make recommendations for ways you can use water more efficiently, help you determine if you have any leaks and tell you about all of the rebates SSWD has available. A Vital Emergency Bridge Program for Foster Children

pay for child care themselves. Introduced in January 2018, the Bridge Program aims to increase the number of stable, sustainable family placements for children in foster care. The program provides eligible caregivers vouchers to pay for child care. These vouchers help ensure that caregivers have adequate support to balance work and home lives and increase the likelihood of a smooth transition.

In 2018-19, 46 counties opted in to receive a portion of the \$31 million allocated to provide Bridge Program services. As of November 30, the program in Sacramento County had served 72 foster children in nearly 60 foster families.

On December 11, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved a nearly \$500,000 increase of the Bridge Program contract funding to expand child care support services. The \$1.3 million budget for Fiscal Year 2018-19 will be used to contract with Child Action, Inc., the local child care resource and referral agency, for Child Care Vouchers, Navigator Services and Trauma-Informed Care Training/Coaching.

“With more parents working outside the home, the ability to recruit and retain foster parents is becoming more challenging,” said Michelle Callejas, Sacramento County Director of Child, Family and Adult Services. “The Bridge Program is vital to help the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services place more local foster children in homes where they will receive high-quality care. The amendment of the contract will allow our department to support even more families who open their homes and hearts to foster children.”

The Bridge Program is comprised of three major components. This includes emergency child care vouchers that are issued to eligible families to cover child care costs for children ages 0-12 for 6 to 12 months; support from a child care navigator who will work with families to find a child care provider, assist with completion of child care applications, and develop a plan for long-term child care; as well as trauma-informed care training so child care providers can learn strategies for working with children

in foster care, many of whom have experienced trauma.

There are many types of families in the foster care system who are eligible for the Bridge Program: Resource families that have completed the Resource Family Approval (RFA) process; Foster Family Agency-approved or County-approved homes; families who care for foster children in an emergency placement; an approved relative or a non-related extended family member; parenting youth and non-minor dependents; or those who have children placed with them for a compelling reason.

Career Criminal Sentenced for Assault on Police Station

DATE: January 22, 2019
CASE: Fernando Sanchez (Case # 17FE017119)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Sydne Jones, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Allen Sumner sentenced Fernando Sanchez to 88 years and 4 months to life in prison. On November 20, 2018, a jury convicted Sanchez of assault with a deadly weapon, assault on a police K9 causing serious bodily harm, attempted carjacking while armed with a weapon, burglary while armed with a weapon, felony evading officers and vandalism.

On September 11, 2017, an officer attempted a traffic stop on Fernando Sanchez when Sanchez sped away onto South Avenue. Sanchez rammed through the secured gates at the Kinney Police Station, striking a marked patrol vehicle. He then continued through the secured lot and rammed another set of gates, before driving onto a residential street and crashing into a fence. He then fled on foot and a K9 officer was deployed. When the K9 caught Sanchez, he struck the dog multiple times with a razor blade. An officer believed Sanchez had a gun and fired at Sanchez, hitting him in the leg. Sanchez fled on foot into a backyard, where he armed himself with a metal pipe. He then went to a nearby home and demanded the homeowner drive him out of the area. Sanchez struck the victim multiple times with the metal pipe. When the victim was able to take possession of the pipe, Sanchez ran into the victim's house and came out a short time later with the victim's car keys and a metal cooking pot that he swung at the victim's head. Sanchez ordered the victim into the car with him, but the victim refused and the two struggled. When officers arrived at the home, Sanchez was detained after a struggle. Reno the K9 sustained two large lacerations across his torso, cutting down through the muscle.

Sanchez was sentenced under California's Three Strikes Law having been previously convicted in 2004 of assault with a deadly weapon, kidnapping and attempted robbery.

Gang Members Sentenced to Life for Multiple Murders

DATE: January 14, 2019
CASE: David Javier Jaimes Alex Martinez Camacho (Case #14F01928)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Morgan Gire, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

The Honorable Maryanne Gilliard sentenced David Javier Jaimes and Alex Martinez Camacho each to two terms of life in prison without the possibility of parole, plus 111 years and 4 months to life consecutive. On July 19, 2018, a jury convicted Jaimes and Camacho of the first-degree murders of Gladis Quinteros and Enrique De La Cruz as well as attempted murder. The jury also found true the special circumstance that both defendants committed multiple murders. Allegations that the defendants personally discharged a firearm causing death and committed the crimes for the benefit of a criminal street gang were also found true.

On May 21, 2013, Jaimes and Camacho were in a car with fellow North Sacra Norteño ("NSN") gang members. While driving on Birdcage Street, they saw who they believed was a rival Sureño gang member talking with another man and woman. The defendants got out of the car and shot the victims multiple times. The victims died at the scene. The defendants fled and the case went unsolved. A month later, Jaimes and Camacho were again in a car with other gang members. The defendants mistakenly believed they saw Sureño gang members in a truck and followed them. While stopped at the intersection of Arden Way and Morse Avenue, one of the gang members in the car opened fire on the truck, critically wounding the passenger. A nearby sheriff's deputy heard the shots and pursued the suspect vehicle. During a high-speed chase, a handgun was thrown from the vehicle and was later recovered.

An examination of the handgun revealed a connection to the murders on Birdcage Street. It was also linked to a series of shootings in Sacramento and Citrus Heights. Further investigation showed Jaimes and Camacho were responsible for the vast number of those shootings. ★

SMUD Seeks Local Families for Research Project on Lighting and Autism

Initial pilot showed lighting had positive impacts on children with autism

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - SMUD is seeking local families for a research pilot project to evaluate the effects of lighting on children with autism. Interested families are invited to attend an informational meeting on January 24, from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at 6301 S Street in Sacramento to learn more.

"Studies have shown that lighting affects our circadian rhythms and may have impacts upon our health and behaviors," said SMUD's Lighting Expert Connie Samla. We're excited that our initial tests showed promise, so we wanted to reach 30 additional families to further identify changes in sleep and behavioral patterns."

Eligible participants are families that live in the Sacramento region with children ages 5 to 10-years-old with autism spectrum disorder. If selected, SMUD will provide \$1,500 in lighting

products for participants in the project.

For the first study, SMUD partnered with the Folsom Cordova Unified School District to study the effects of tunable LED lighting systems in the classroom and at two homes of children with autism. After 16 months of study, technical experts found positive results and released their findings with recommendations for further home study. Highlights from the first study are below.

- Students reported a slight increase in overall feelings of wellness and slightly lower energy levels.
- Teachers had positive feedback and all reported the new lighting helped them teach more effectively.
- The new lighting systems reduced electrical demand by 60-74% and energy consumption by 26-57%.

One of the families in the home study reported dramatic improvements in their child's behavior. The other family reported modest behavioral changes, but a dramatic reduction in the amount of time it took their child to fall asleep.

After reviewing the results, SMUD technical experts recommended that school districts should install LED lighting systems that include lighting control scenes. Districts should consider installing tunable-white LED systems for new classrooms, especially those used at night or for teaching students with special needs. SMUD also suggested that more research needed to be done in the homes of students with autism and thus the reason for the second project.

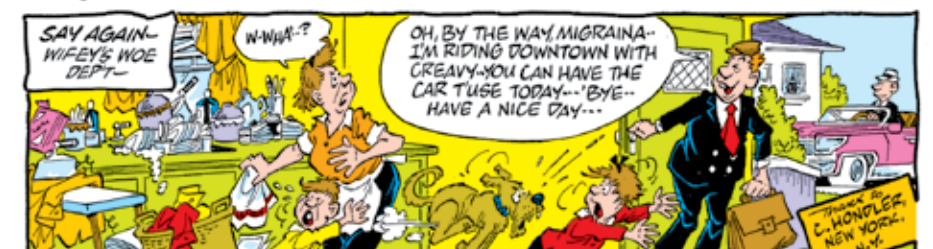

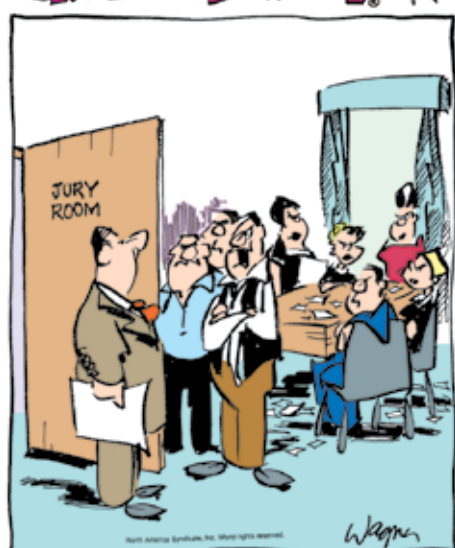

Women's Empowerment Receives \$25K from US Bank

Funds will provide job skills training and financial literacy for homeless women

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

Women's Empowerment has received a \$25,000 grant from U.S. Bank Foundation's Community Possible program. The grant will fund job skills training, career-readiness classes and financial literacy programs for Sacramento women experiencing homelessness.

"U.S. Bank continues to invest in the bright futures of homeless women through its generous donations to our job-readiness programs," said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women's Empowerment. "Our partnership with U.S. Bank ensures women can break the cycle of homelessness by gaining the skills needed to secure employment, regain a home and manage finances. When our mothers become financially self-sufficient, they create a better life for their children."

Since 2001, Women's Empowerment has been working to break the cycle of homelessness for women and children in Sacramento. In the initial nine-week program, women who are homeless receive free onsite child care in the group's child development center and transportation assistance. Each woman works with a master's level social worker to address her root causes of homelessness. She attends classes on job-readiness, confidence building, health and empowerment, as well as support groups for domestic violence and substance abuse. Financial empowerment courses are provided, including budgeting, improving credit score and second

chance checking. With the help of volunteer teachers, women unlearn financial habits and create a step-by-step action plan for achieving their financial goals. Women then focus on job placement with their employment specialist and volunteer career mentor.

Women who have graduated from the nine-week program can enroll in the group's graduate services at any point when they need assistance. Services include paid job training, vocational certifications, counseling with a social worker and employment specialist, access to a professional clothing closet, and job retention services for employer and employee.

"At U.S. Bank, we invest in and support programs and organizations that help people succeed in the workforce and gain greater financial literacy," said Jessica Cook, assistant vice president at U.S. Bank. "Through our Community Possible giving and engagement platform we are working to close the gaps between people and possibility. Our partnership with Women's Empowerment is doing just that."

is an award-winning organization that has graduated 1,554 homeless women and their 3,738 children. Last year, 82 percent of graduates found homes and 76 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. Women's Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and receives no government funding except for in-kind rent from the County of Sacramento. 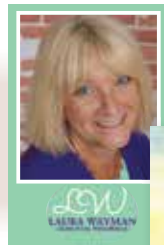

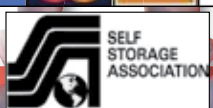
