First 5 to Administer Prenatal Care Contract Homeless Initiatives are Working — County Expands



The purpose of the CalWORKs Home Visiting Initiative (HVI) is to support positive health, development, and well-being outcomes for pregnant and parenting women, families, and infants born into poverty.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Tuesday, Dec. 11, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors authorized the Department of Human Assistance to execute an agreement with First 5 Sacramento Commission (First 5) in the amount of \$4,800,000 for the coordination, oversight and monitoring of the CalWORKs Home Visiting Initiative Program.

Program implementation will begin on Jan. 1, 2019 and runs through Jun. 30, 2020.

The purpose of the CalWORKs Home Visiting Initiative (HVI) is to support positive health, development, and well-being outcomes for pregnant and parenting women, families, and infants born into poverty, expanding their future educational, economic, and financial opportunities, and improving the likelihood that they will exit poverty.

Combining home visits with CalWORKs provides an opportunity to connect

parents with necessary professional resources to assist in improving their parenting skills and household order, and ensuring that their children have a safe and nurturing environment that allows them to thrive and grow.

New parents and caretakers receiving CalWORKs will be paired with student nurses and other trained professionals who will make regular visits to the participants' homes to provide guidance, coaching, access to prenatal and postnatal care, and other health and social services.

"We are thrilled to award this program funding to First 5. They will get the HVI program off the ground and running," said Ann Edwards, Director of the Sacramento County Department of Human Assistance. "Providing mothers and their unborn and young children care and resources is our number one priority. These services will set them up for success and a positive life outcome."

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In 2017, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved funding and implementation of four major initiatives to address critical needs of those experiencing homelessness and to help reduce the homeless population. Subsequently, two associated augmentations were added to further address the needs of all vulnerable population groups. The first programs began in October of 2017, several began in 2018 and many are in the process of becoming operational. In just one year's time, the County has achieved phenomenal results from these new initiatives.

- Improve the Family Crisis Response and Shelters (October 2017)
 - o 146 families served in shelter
 - o 50 moved to permanent housing
- Preserve Mather Community Campus (October 2017)
 - o 351 individuals served in transitional housing
 - o 116 moved to permanent housing
- Full Service Rehousing Shelter (March 2018)
 - o 91 individuals in scattered-site shelters
 - o 19 moved to permanent housing
- Flexible Supportive Re-housing Program (February 2018)
 - o 191 individuals enrolled
 - o 94 moved into permanent housing
- Transitional Aged Youth (May 2018)
 - o 115 served with prevention, diversion and intervention services
 - o 35 moved to permanent housing
 - o 32 maintained housing through services
 - o 17 entered emergency

shelter
 • Unincorporated County Navigation Services (April 2018)

- o 177 served through outreach and rehousing services
- o 30 moved to permanent housing

 In total, 416 individuals have moved into permanent housing since the start of the first initiative in October 2017.

"We are thrilled to share the success that our programs have had in this first year. In some programs, success has been demonstrated in mere months," said Ann Edwards, Director of the Department of Human Assistance. "We are reaching people we have never been able to engage and they are seeing a real difference in their lives."

On Oct. 16, 2018, the County Board of Supervisors endorsed the investment strategy for nearly \$20 million in new State funding to combat homelessness in partnership with Sacramento Steps Forward and the City of Sacramento. On Dec. 11, the Board of Supervisors approved the acceptance of more than \$11 million that the Department of Human Assistance will directly administer, building of the existing initiatives to reduce homelessness.

State funding comes through the State's new Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) and the California Emergency Solutions and Housing Program. The funds will provide additional emergency shelter for both families and individuals through Emergency Family Shelter and the Full Service Rehousing Shelters (FSRS). The FSRS is a scattered-site model using master leasing of vacant homes in the region to house up to five persons

in addition to a fulltime house monitor. Residents are provided with intensive case management services and rehousing assistance to help them exit the program into stable, permanent housing with the support they need.

The funding also will create a Flexible Housing Pool (building on the Flexible Supportive Rehousing Program) that will offer both services and re-housing assistance to help households in shelter or working with navigation programs to move into housing more quickly.

For the first time, clients experiencing homelessness who are engaged in Adult Protective Services or jail diversion will be offered this practical assistance to resolve their homelessness. The County will also administer a new expungement clinic to help remove barriers to housing and employment.

To be eligible to administer and receive the HEAP funds, the Board of Supervisors declared a shelter crisis on Oct. 16. Other cities declaring a crisis and participating in the program include the City of Sacramento, Elk Grove and Citrus Heights.

On Dec. 12, The Board of Supervisors heard and adopted the proposed Sacramento County Homeless Plan that is required to facilitate participation in the State's No Place Like Home (NPLH) program. This program provides funding for new permanent supportive housing for people who are experiencing homelessness, chronic homelessness, or who are at risk of becoming chronically homeless, and who are also living with a serious mental illness and in need of mental health services. In NPLH developments, the County will provide

a 20-year commitment to comprehensive services, including behavioral health services.

In addition to meeting State requirements for NPLH, the County's Plan serves as a building block for all partners within Sacramento County to implement shared strategies that make a measureable impact on homelessness. The Plan was endorsed by the City of Sacramento and County Continuum of Care on Dec. 12.

"The County Homeless Plan reflects countless hours of collaboration with County departments, community groups, stakeholders and other jurisdictions within our region," said Cindy Cavanaugh, Director of Homeless Initiatives. "The Plan lays out comprehensive strategies and concrete actions for Sacramento over the next several years. While pleased with early results of our homeless initiatives, this Plan says that, as a community, we are not letting up."

Sacramento County will be eligible for \$5,087,737 through the noncompetitive NPLH funding for housing developments, and is eligible to apply for a share of \$400 million in competitive funds. The Board of Supervisors will approve development applications for the first round of NPLH competitive funding on Jan. 29.

With the initial success of the Sacramento County homeless initiatives and additional funding sources for expansion, collaborative community partnerships, and dedicated service providers, Sacramento County recognizes that change is possible for our community and the lives of its valued residents. ★

and they marched in the Pearl Harbor Memorial Parade on December 7. The Sacramento Young Marines joined 125 Young Marines from across the country for Pearl Harbor Remembrance. The Young Marines along with the leadership of the American Legion, Marine Corps League Hawaii, and Vietnam Veterans of America Hawaii, performed a wreath laying ceremony at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific, the Punchbowl, in memory of all the brave men and women who are interred there.

A significant honor for the Young Marines was leading the Pearl Harbor Memorial Parade in Honolulu. They carried the banners of the 12 capital ships that were attacked. The parade's objective was to honor the heroes and survivors of Pearl Harbor and World War II, to pay tribute to veterans, active duty military members and military families, to

celebrate freedom and to keep in remembrance the heinous events of Dec. 7, 1941.

In addition, the Young Marines cleaned-up three beaches, Ft. Hase Beach, North Beach, and Pyramid Rock Beach, at Marine Corps Base Hawaii.

"The Young Marines met some of the survivors of that historic event of 77 years ago," said Col William P. Davis USMC (Ret), national executive director and CEO of the Young Marines. "Those veterans are, in every sense of the words - living history, and each has a story to tell. It is an honor for Young Marines to meet these veterans and memorialize the one who are no longer with us."

Young Marines units raised funds at their local level to supplement the costs of traveling to Hawaii to attend the remembrance ceremonies. Young Marines used their creativity, and applied the program's core values - leadership,

teamwork and discipline - to implement unique and effective fundraising efforts.

The Young Marines is a national non-profit 501c (3) youth education and service program for boys and girls, age eight through the completion of high school. The Young Marines promotes the mental, moral and physical development of its members. The program focuses on teaching the values of leadership, teamwork and self-discipline, so its members can live and promote a healthy, drug-free lifestyle.

Since the Young Marines' humble beginnings in 1959 with one unit and a handful of boys, the organization has grown to 270 units with 9,000 youth and 2,600 adult volunteers in 40 states, the District of Columbia, Japan, and affiliates in other countries.



Club Volleyball has also

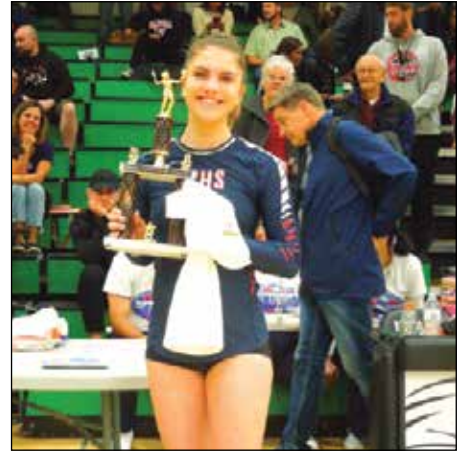

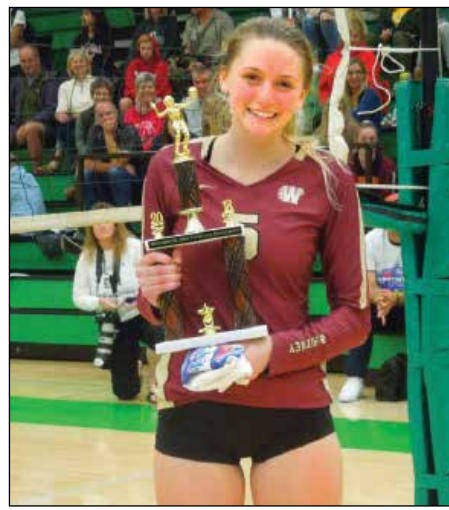

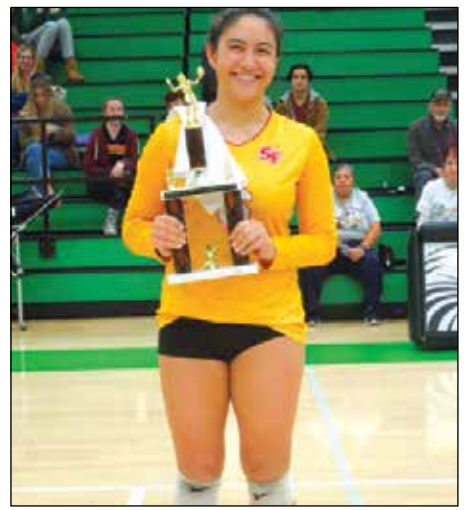

Dare to Live Without Limits

The Power of Listening



You learn by listening. Education is a lifetime process. There is always more to be learned. What you know pales in comparison to what you don't know. However, too many people have very ineffective listening skills.

A variety of factors limit the effectiveness of your listening. There are also numerous strategies which boost your listening power. Let's first examine some common listening inhibitors and how to overcome them and then look at how you can boost your listening power.

When you are formulating your response while someone is speaking, you are no longer listening to what they are saying. Stay focused on what the other person is expressing. There will be an opportunity to respond.

Daydreaming, or being distracted by your surroundings, diminishes your listening ability. Instead, concentrate on the message the other person is striving to convey. You want to discover what they are wanting, feeling, thinking, and saying.

Jumping to conclusions, or judging the speaker, causes you to stop listening. When you assume you know what will be said, you have no need to pay further attention. Hear out the other person without making any judgments. Once you have all of the information from them, you can form your conclusions.

Assessing a speaker based on appearance, social status, financial status, occupation, or any other factor, affects your listening mode. When you feel someone is beneath you, in any way, you assign little or no value to what they are saying. Closing your mind in this matter restricts the quantity and quality of the information you take in.

Becoming defensive, or taking things personally in response to what is being said, pushes you into rebuttal mode. This reaction shuts down your listening along with lowering your ability to think clearly. Listen carefully to what is being said before deciding on an appropriate response.

Selective listening is another detriment. In this mode, you hear only what you want to. You subconsciously tune out anything you don't agree with or which contradicts your beliefs. This approach closes your mind to new and different ideas. As a result, your learning ability is greatly diminished.

Here are some strategies to enhance the power of your listening. First and foremost, always keep an open mind. You never know from whom, or when, you will find valuable information. You can learn something from everyone. Constantly look for new knowledge you can acquire by listening. Often, you will be able to acquire additional information about what works or

what doesn't.

Ask questions to clarify your understanding of what the other person is saying. What you think is being said is not necessarily what the other person means. Begin questions with something like, "I just want to make sure I understand correctly. Please correct me if I'm wrong."

Take notes while you are listening. It forces you to pay close attention. Written notes are more reliable than memory. Taking notes is especially valuable when listening on the phone. There is no point to listening if you can't remember what was said.

The most educated people are those people who have developed exceptional listening skills. They have cultivated the habit of listening with an open mind. They listen far more often than they talk.

Assemblyman Kevin Kiley Announces Legislation To Keep Texting Tax-Free

GRANITE BAY, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) will introduce legislation to statutorily prohibit the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) from taxing text messages or any other technology classified as an "information service" by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). Joining him as coauthors are Assemblymembers Jordan Cunningham, Tyler Diep, Vince Fong, James Gallagher, Tom Lackey, Melissa Melendez, and Jim Patterson.

The CPUC's proposal to add a surcharge to text messages was set to be considered in January 2019 before the FCC issued a declaratory ruling classifying text messages

as an "information service." While the CPUC has authority over the regulation of telecommunications services, this legislation will explicitly prohibit surcharges on information services under state law.

"Text messaging is integral to modern communication, especially for young people, and should remain tax free," Kiley said. "Government policies have already made California unaffordable for far too many, and becoming the first state in the nation to tax texting would only make things worse."

The bill will be introduced when the

"While I am glad that the CPUC has withdrawn its proposal — for now — it is important that the Legislature act to prevent the agency from imposing any Text Tax in the future," Kiley said.

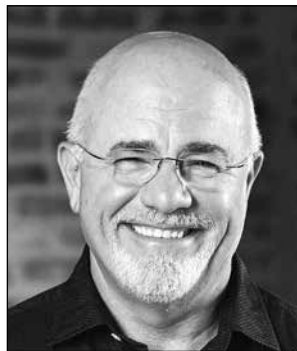

Cash out stock for emergency fund?

Dear Dave,
I'm 45, married, and we have a household income of around \$85,000 a year. We have no debt, except for our home, and we owe about \$70,000 on it. I recently stopped contributing to my 401(k) temporarily in an effort to help us build an emergency fund, but things are moving slowly. We also have \$25,000 in stock. Should we cash out the stock, and use the money for an emergency fund?

Dear Nate,
Yes, that's what I would do. Basically, your

emergency fund is in stock right now. That's not a good place to keep an emergency fund, because you never know when life will throw unexpected expenses your way or the stock market will go down.

I would cash out that stock as soon as possible. Put the money in a simple money market account—one with check writing privileges and no penalties for early withdrawals. You

always want your emergency fund to be safe and easily accessible. Then, make sure you keep pushing forward and take care of Baby Step 4, investing for retirement; Baby Step 5, save money for college if you have young children; and Baby Step 6, pay off your home early.

Baby Step 7 means building wealth and giving like crazy. These things are easy once you have the

SacRT Unifies the Sacramento Region Through Annexation of Two Cities

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) has taken another historic step towards creating a more robust regional transit system. On December 13, the Citrus Heights City Council approved annexation of their transit service into the SacRT system and earlier this month, the Folsom City Council voted to annex their transit service.

"These monumental steps set up SacRT to be a true regional transit system and increases our competitiveness for local, state and federal funding, which helps the District become more efficient and competitive for grant funding in the future," said Patrick Kennedy, Sacramento County Supervisor and SacRT Board Chair.

"The annexation of the transit systems in these cities will help unify the Sacramento region and make it easier for residents to seamlessly access jobs, school and critical services," said Henry Li, SacRT General Manager/CEO. "Adding Citrus Heights and Folsom into our system elevates the entire Sacramento region to the next level."

Similar to Folsom's agreement, this next step increases the City's voting shares on the SacRT Board, and provides for active collaboration in seeking grant funds and allocating formula funding for capital projects that will benefit the region. The City of Citrus Heights currently contracts

with SacRT for bus service. Under this agreement, service levels will remain the same or improved. SacRT plans to begin operating Folsom's Stage Line bus routes in early 2019.

"This is a win-win for Citrus Heights and the region. It will help improve our transportation services, preserve our paratransit access, and improve our bus stop maintenance," said Steve Miller, Citrus Heights Council Member and SacRT Board Member.

"Folsom is excited to benefit from SacRT's transit expertise as the largest public transit provider in the region," said Elaine Andersen, Folsom City Manager. "SacRT will be able to improve operational and administrative efficiencies that will benefit our riders, save money and allow the region to become more competitive for grant funding in the future."

"Bringing these two cities into our network advances Regional Transit's vision for the next generation of transit in the Sacramento region. This is a critical step to support that regionally shared vision," said Jay Schenirer, Sacramento City Council Member and Sacramento Area Council of Governments Board Chair.

"As we look to improve our region's economic position, a robust transportation network is needed for economic growth," said Barry Broome, CEO of the Greater Sacramento Economic Council. "The consolidation of transit services in the region is sure to bring increased efficiencies that

will lead to more convenient and dependent transportation options for our businesses and residents."

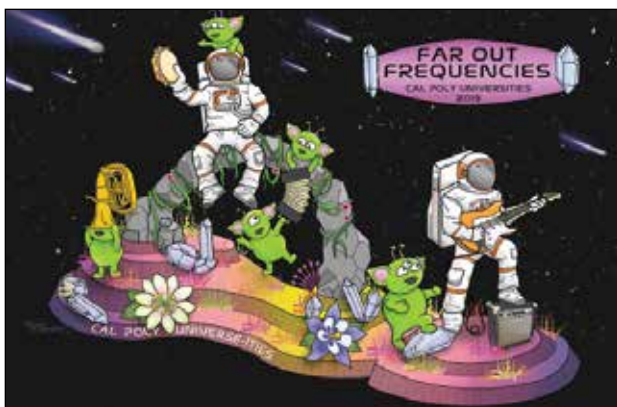
"Having a multi-modal transportation system is absolutely essential to moving people and commerce," said Amanda Blackwood, Sacramento Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce CEO and President. "We know that our Capitol region's customers and workforce cross over city lines. Ensuring they have an integrated and expansive transportation system to reach our businesses and neighborhoods is vital towards a connected region."

"We need to make transit work for all people - working professionals and for people who do not have any other option but transit to get to work, school, or services," said Bill Mueller, Valley Vision CEO. "The strides that SacRT is making demonstrate the importance of improving mobility in our region to help support job and business growth across the Sacramento region."

On December 12, the Elk Grove City Council instructed staff to negotiate a contract for SacRT to operate e-Tran service and then work on an annexation agreement after the service is taken over.

Currently, SacRT is working to redesign the entire bus network with the project, SacRT Forward. Public comment will be accepted on a proposed network until Friday, February 1, 2019. Local College Student Helps Build Cal Poly Rose Float Entry

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

Melitta Kauppinen, a 2016 graduate of Rio Americano High School, is involved with Cal Poly universities' 2019 Rose Float entry, "Far Out Frequencies," that will be seen in person by 700,000 at the 130th Rose Parade on New Year's Day and some 70 million more on national and international TV.

December 26 to 31 is Deco Week, when students and community volunteers ready the entry in the final sprint for parade day, festooning the float with colorful flowers and floral materials, enough to cover the interior of a 2,500-square-foot house. There'll be 7,000 roses, 7,200 Gerbera daisies, 3,200 irises and 200 red cabbages as well as white cushion mums, and button mums.

Melitta's role includes working with the construction team for Rose Float, and she has been involved for over two years. She joined in fall 2016 during my first quarter. This year she is the

lead for the water fountain mechanism on the back, on the camera side of the float

"I was hesitant at first to join because I didn't think that I knew enough, but after a few hours at a lab, I knew that Rose Float was where I belonged. The people are amazing, and I vibed with them instantly. Our advisor is amazing. Everyone wants to help, teach and guide. The group fosters creativity and learning; each person is unique and special. I couldn't imagine myself being involved with any other group," Melitta said.

"Far Out Frequencies," designed and built by teams of students from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and California State Polytechnic University in Pomona, "Far Out Frequencies," features a pair of astronauts and a half-dozen animated alien friends on another planet communicating through music. It is among 44 floats in this year's parade.

It is the culmination of a yearlong process that began last January. The concept was selected from about 150

ideas submitted by students, local communities, alumni and friends of the Cal Poly Rose Float program. It celebrates this year's parade theme, "The Melody of Life," by paying homage to music as a language for all.

The 48- by 18-foot entry, which stands 23-feet tall, uses animation to breathe life into this outer space close encounter between astronauts Morgan and Sally and the residents of a distant alien planet. Unable to communicate directly, the astronauts use musical instruments to share their message of goodwill with a half-dozen one- two and three-eyed aliens, leading to out-of-this-world fun and some unexpected good times.

In addition, the scale and scope of the entries has burnished the school's reputation among float builders for creativity and ingenuity. The program has received countless accolades for introducing innovations into its float designs including computer-controlled animation, hydraulic systems and cleaner emissions with propane.

Melitta added, "I am looking forward to the moment when our float comes around the corner of Colorado and Orange Grove, and we get to see our creation and see everyone's reactions to it. That moment makes it all worth it. You can hear the Cal Poly section cheering for blocks. It is also great because our operators in the float always stick their body parts (hands, feet, legs, elbows, etc.) out of small holes in the float to wave to us as they pass by." ★
