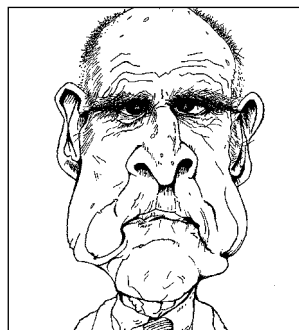

Arrest Made in Suspected Arson at Local Hospital

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - At 10:00 pm on December 26th, 2018, Metro Fire crews were dispatched to multiple trash can and dumpster fires at Mercy San Juan Medical Center located in Carmichael. Prior to our units arriving, MSJ Security staff was able

to control 2 fires in trash cans using a Dry-Chemical extinguisher. Metro Fire crews arrived and quickly controlled the remaining fire in a large dumpster near the parking structure for the main hospital.

Bystanders reported seeing an adult white male wearing a black hoodie, black pants, and carrying a black backpack. Sacramento County Sheriff Deputies quickly responded to the area and found a person matching the description of the suspected arsonist and detained him for questioning. Using hospital security

footage, a positive identification was made with the person detained to at least one of the fires. James Richard Rhodes, 41 of Sacramento was arrested on suspicion of arson to property. The investigation is still on-going to determine if Rhodes was responsible for the other two fires on the property.

Speed Bump Coming for Local Business?

The latest job demand and hiring trends

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Employers are downshifting in the hiring race as 2019 begins. One regional company is reducing workforce by more than fifty percent (50%) as tariff related contract losses impact Sacramento area employment. In direct contacts with regional employers between November 19th and December 17th, Pacific Staffing discovered fifty-six percent (56%) of companies are hiring in the First Quarter of 2019. Hiring has pulled back

SMUD Board of Directors Approves 2019 Budget

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The elected SMUD Board of Directors approved a \$1.71 billion budget. The 2019 budget provides funding for all capital and operations and maintenance (O&M) programs needed to meet the Board's Strategic Directions in the year ahead and in future years.

The 2019 budget is \$25 million less than the 2018 budget, which is primarily due to lower planned capital expenditures, though SMUD anticipates an exciting and transformational year as the electric company continues laying the foundation for the future. Next year's budget includes funding for many industry-leading initiatives and a variety of programs and investments that support the development of SMUD's load-serving capacity, grid modernizations and compliance with regulatory requirements. Support for outreach and communications to educate customers about SMUD's move to time-of-day pricing is also included.

Some major capital projects for next year include the rebuilding of three major substations that serve large

numbers of residential and commercial customers, hydro generation facilities work and the designing and building of a new energy control facility. Completion of the SMUD Headquarters remodeling project, and new and ongoing technology projects are included as well.

Other major projects include removing and replacing more than 50 circuit miles of cable; automation of a couple of dozen high-voltage switches; upgrades and expansion of the downtown Sacramento electrical distribution network; expansion of the grid into new communities in Folsom and Rancho Cordova; and improvements at a bulk substation that serves the Arden area.

SMUD continues to be in a strong financial position. In 2017, Fitch and S&P upgraded SMUD's credit ratings to AA, from an already impressive AA-, while Moody's continues to rate SMUD Aa3. To maintain these credit ratings, which continue to be the highest in three decades, SMUD has a strategic financial target to maintain strong operating cash flow. Forecasted 2019 operating cash flow cover is 1.76

times operating cash flow, which exceeds the SMUD Board's minimum target of cash flow cover of 1.5 times operating cash flow and supports a higher level of proposed capital spending. The higher credit rating produces a lower cost of borrowing.

SMUD customers continue to pay significantly less for electricity than most Californians, and as of September 1, 2018, more than 30 percent less than customers who are supplied by neighboring PG&E.

As the nation's sixth-largest, community-owned electric service provider, SMUD has been providing low-cost, reliable electricity for more than 70 years to Sacramento County (and small adjoining portions of Placer and Yolo Counties). SMUD is a recognized industry leader and award winner for its innovative energy efficiency programs, renewable power technologies, and for its sustainable solutions for a healthier environment. SMUD's power mix is about 50 percent non-carbon emitting. For more information, visit smud.org.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Airport Firefighters shaved their heads as part of the second annual "Brave the Shave" in honor of Captain Tim Anderson, a Sacramento County Airport Firefighter who lost his life to cancer in 2017. Brave the Shave was started one year ago by Tim's son Mason, when his mother Lacey was diagnosed with breast cancer just 6 months after his dad, Captain Tim Anderson died.

After hearing the news

of his mom's diagnosis, Mason at 10 years old wanted to have a shaving party in an effort to turn a difficult situation into something positive. Mason challenged local area firefighters to shave their heads with him as a way to honor his dad and support his mother. In 2017, 112 firefighters in 4 states and 2 countries shaved their heads in support of the Anderson family.

Mason's mom Lacey is now cancer free and this year Mason would like to open Brave the Shave up to all firefighters and their families affected

by cancer in an effort to make December Firefighter Cancer Awareness month. Firefighters and anyone else wanting to offer their support were asked to shave their heads in the month of December and post the pictures or videos to Mason's Facebook page Brave the Shave with Mason Anderson or his Instagram Brave the Shave Mason Anderson. This year's goal is 150 shaved heads. Mason is only 57 shaved heads away from meeting that goal!

from this same time one year ago when sixty-five percent (65%) planned to hire in January, February and March. While the pace of hiring among top Sacramento regional employers has fallen throughout 2018 companies report finding applicants and specific skilled workers remain a top challenge in the new year.

While not a single company surveyed planned first quarter layoffs in 2018, in the first three months of 2019 seven percent (7%) are reducing workforces. Staff reductions are attributed to seasonal change and slower demand for products and services. Forty-four percent (44%)

of hiring in the first quarter is for attrition, or replacements, among existing workforces while employers seek just forty-two percent (42%) for growth.

By talking to top regional firms each quarter since 1992, Pacific Staffing has learned there are always hiring challenges for employers, regardless of economic direction. In this first quarter of the new year seventeen percent (17%) of employers also report a continuing challenge with finding enough applicants, despite the slowdown. Others also citing increased minimum wage and hiring specific skilled trades as workplace concerns.

Sales, customer service, accounting/finance, technical, warehouse and shipping experience is in high demand through March. Drivers for route and delivery remain scarce.

The most active sector is Service companies with Manufacturers second, followed by Construction and Retail through January, February and March of 2019.

Sacramento Regional Top Companies Polled by Industry were Service (54%), Manufacturers (25%), Construction (19%) and Retail (2%)

Housing The Homeless in Schools

Homelessness is a tragic and growing problem. Human beings are scattered in parks and vacant lots like war-refugees, lacking even basic needs we take for granted - a clean bed, a warm shower, and a regular meal. If you take the time to learn their stories, you can't help but ponder, "there but for the grace of God go I."

The homeless also create real problems - aggressive panhandling impacts businesses, discarded needles and feces accumulate on our streets, waste and urine give rise to dangerous pollution of our rivers & streams, and campfires threaten to loose wildfires on the American River Parkway. Perhaps the fastest growing concern is that the homeless are far more likely to spread contagious diseases - including some thought to be nearly eradicated in the US.

This dichotomy makes solutions difficult.

Taxpayers, non-profit groups, and churches spend millions of dollars and volunteer hundreds of thousands of hours trying to alleviate this suffering. Some programs, like St. John's Program for Change, are designed to break the cycle of homelessness by providing job-training and life skills; while others exist to provide short-term relief.

One of the later is the Winter Shelter program, supported by HART, the County of Sacramento, and the Sacramento Catholic Diocese. The program supplies meals and overnight shelter during the coldest months, often housing them in local schools or churches.

Given the higher rate of

contagious diseases, mental health problems, IV drug use, and growing segment of homeless population from early prison releases, there is a question of whether housing the homeless in schools and childcare facilities is safe or appropriate - especially when other facilities are available.

The program runs from December 31 to February 24. Schools are vacant for Christmas Break during a portion of that time, but most run while children are in school, where students will be using the same facilities, including bathrooms, within hours of the shelter program.

So far, the schools used have been largely limited to Catholic schools in the Sacramento Diocese - primarily those in working class zip codes with the lowest income levels.

But that doesn't mean risks should be ignored; rather if such a program is to be successful, every effort should be made to ensure the health and safety of students and the public. The fallout, should an incident occur or a child be harmed, would be catastrophic for the program and the church. And it would drive away public support for other programs to help the homeless.

Last year, a Hepatitis-A outbreak among the homeless spread to the general public, resulting in over 20 deaths and 500 hospitalizations in San Diego. Two years ago a sudden outbreak of Rotavirus, which is transmitted the same way as Hepatitis-A, closed down multiple schools in Sacramento County. Earlier this year, Los Angeles reported an outbreak of Typhus in the homeless

community. In fact, nearly every study shows a significantly higher incidence of contagious diseases within the homeless population.

It is shocking that HART and the Sacramento Diocese has not only ignored these warnings, but actually rejected assistance to reduce the risk of exposing students to contagious diseases - some of which can be fatal. Sacramento County is now considering steps to deal with the associated health and safety risks, but those steps are slow in coming and may not be sufficient if advocates resist or schools fail to take advantage of additional resources being offered.

There are common-sense precautions which do not

hinder the Winter Shelter Program in anyway. Public and private entities have offered to help. HART and the schools just need to accept that help.

- 1) Health screenings for contagious diseases by a healthcare professionals - including testing and inoculations to prevent spreading diseases like TB, Rotavirus, Typhus and Hepatitis-A.
- 2) Training by County Department of Health for volunteers and school administration of the proper clean-up and decontamination protocols.
- 3) Megan's List and warrant checks for domestic violence or

crimes again children by Law Enforcement professionals.

- 4) Written notifications to all parents in participating schools with information about precautions they can take (such as Hep-A vaccination).
- 5) Inspection by the County Office of Environmental Management before children are permitted to use the facility after the housing period.

These precautions are not draconian - in fact, the homeless would benefit from increased health screenings. But, at a time when the public is already concerned over failures by government and churches to

protect children, these precautions will demonstrate that the Diocese, County, Schools, and HART are as serious about protecting children as they are about serving the homeless.

Reducing the pain and struggle of those experiencing homelessness is an obligation we share as human beings. But putting children at risk is neither humane, nor is it necessary.

Republican Waldron Denounces DMV for Continued Use of Flawed REAL ID Process

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assembly Republican Leader Marie Waldron issued the following statement in response to news that the Department of Motor Vehicles waited a month to notify Californians about the federal government's rejection of the state's REAL ID residency verification process and continued to issue card that

it knew would require additional documentation:

"It's completely unacceptable that the DMV knew about this issue for a month before even acknowledging something was wrong. The DMV has only been requiring one form of identification to verify residence (current lease, utility bill, etc.) but DHS stated that two forms of identification were needed. This is unacceptable and flies in the face of security for our citizens, which is what Real ID was

created for in the first place.

The state must fast-track everybody who received a REAL ID since the DMV was notified of this problem to avoid further delay, wasted taxpayer dollars, lost wages and productivity. I sincerely hope we can work together with the federal government to resolve this issue and minimize the disruption to people who have already been inconvenienced by long wait times and poor service at the DMV. ★

California Gov. Jerry Brown 'Exit Interview' is Classic Jerry

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - At California Gov. Jerry Brown's "Exit Interview", the Sacramento Press Club auctioned off autographed souvenirs from his years in the Governor's office, including cartoons of his budget press conference presentations of charts and graphs, Proposition 30 memorabilia increasing sales and income taxes, and graphs showing state government living within its means. Other charts showed record spending levels.

Gov. Jerry Brown is known for his infrequent and rather unscripted press conferences, often making glib remarks, or quoting Zen Buddhism, Latin theology, philosophy, and "ontology" - the nature of being. Tuesday Brown did not disappoint during his "Exit Interview," as he prepares to leave the Governor's office for the last time on Jan. 7.

"I don't do that many press events," Brown said as he made his way on stage. "There's so much media now." Given that Brown began his political career right out of college in 1969, he dealt with mostly newspaper reporters and television news at that time.

In front of hundreds of credentialed California media and state government employees, Brown called today's media "the legitimate ones" and "all sorts of characters running

around social media," when asked how he deals with media. "The proliferation of social media is just all kinds of noise," Brown said. "The news cycle never stops."

Asked if California's Obamacare plan - Covered California - will be able to continue following the recent federal District Court ruling finding the Affordable Care Act unconstitutional, Brown said he thinks it will be overturned, and that the decision will impact the next presidential election. "Congress will probably overturn, because it will create such a backlash," Brown said. "And Democrats will take over the Senate."

After serving a record four terms as California Governor, Brown was asked about the many times he's campaigned for office, and whether it was too much. Brown spoke about how much he likes campaigning "because it's exciting, and it's a group activity."

"People like being around other people," Brown said. "We are a tribal species; campaigning is very tribal."

Asked if it was a mistake to run for President too many times, Brown replied that it was. "What works in one campaign

doesn't work in another," he said. Jerry Brown ran for

36 and for a second term in 1979. He ran

of Oakland 1999-2007, California attorney general 2007-2011, and was elected governor for a third term in 2010, and a fourth term in 2014.

While Brown said that he didn't regret running for so many offices, had he not lost, he never would have had time off to enjoy "working for Mother Theresa and practicing Zen medication in Japan," following his 1982 unsuccessful U.S. Senate run.

Brown was asked to explain his proudest accomplishment, but instead said he was more concerned about the future, especially "a nuclear war to avoid" and climate change - which caused the media crowd to clap wildly and cheer.

When asked about his California High Speed Rail project, he said it would be built, along with the Delta's "twin tunnels" project moving water from northern California to the south. While he said Southern California draws too much water from the north, "the Delta will be destroyed unless we have some kind of peripheral canal or a tunnel."

Brown said he doesn't like flying: "I don't like it on the plane. You go up. You go down." He said at his age he shouldn't be driving. "On the train

you can have a cocktail," Brown added.

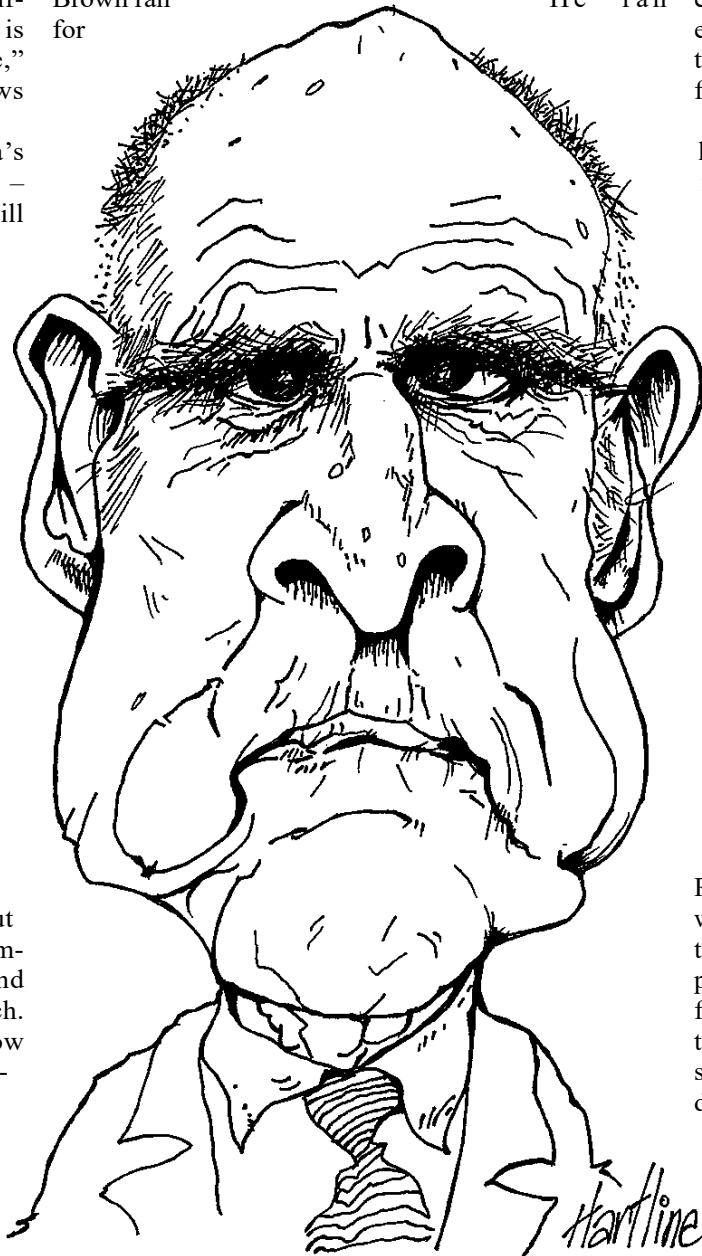
Brown said with a "very good chance of seeing it [high speed rail] built, then California will be an innovator - the only state in the country to do this. We will join the countries of Japan and Germany as innovators," Brown said.

As for the future, Brown claimed he left only a "baby deficit," rather than the trillion dollar deficit California currently has, according to Sen. John Moorlach, the Legislature's only CPA.

As for what he will miss, Brown said he's miss the Governor's Mansion - "except all of those steps. I now know why Reagan wanted to move into that one-story house," he added.

When asked what will happen to PG&E, and if it would go bankrupt, after the wildfires for which the utility company is being blamed, Brown said, "the CPUC (CA Public Utilities Commission) has to keep them accountable, but it's a strange model." Brown said the next governor will deal with PG&E and the CPUC.

Brown pivoted to climate change and described California's "new abnormal" as regular drought and fires. "This business of climate change is real," he said. "The humidity goes down, and everything is dying. It becomes kindling for fires. What we're seeing is just the prologue for fires." ★



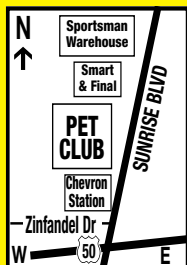
