Salute to Our Heroes

Veterans Day Service Recalls Locals Who Gave All



Military veterans and supporters joined a salute during November 11 observances in Carmichael. The Vietnam monument names students of La Sierra high school who died in the Vietnam War.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Carmichael's Vietnam Memorial was central to this week's Veterans Day commemorations. Flags, music and remembrances were shared by nearly 200 visitors.

The first-known California monument to the Vietnam War is in Earl J. Koobs Nature Area, beside the old La Sierra High School on Engle Road. First dedicated in 1973, the lofty steel edifice honors La Sierra graduates who died during Vietnam years. The nature preserve is named for La Sierra science teacher Earl J. Koobs, who fostered its establishment. Before his 2015 death, WW II veteran Koobs presided over many ceremonies honoring fallen La Sierra students.

Under the aegis of Carmichael Kiwanis, the nature area is now a center for community service. Many Boy Scout Eagle Scout projects have been completed in its five acres. Carmichael Organic Gardening Club maintains a butterfly garden and recently erected a Blue Star Marker honoring US those serving the US military.

North State Camp Fire Update

GRIDLEY, CA (MPG) - As of Wednesday night, according to CAL FIRE, the fire in Butte County had burned 133,000 acres and is 30 percent contained. CAL FIRE is estimating the fire won't be fully contained until Nov. 30.

A total of 6,453 homes have been destroyed, along with 20 commercial structures.

The number of fatalities from the Camp Fire rose to 48 on Wednesday. According to the Butte County Sheriff's Office, an additional 13 fatalities were confirmed Monday and six more on Tuesday.

Ten sets of human remains were recovered in Paradise: seven in homes and three outdoors, according to a BCSO press release. Three more sets of remains were recovered in Concow.

The fire broke out last Thursday, but by Friday, the community was already mobilizing to help.

The Butte County Fairgrounds in Gridley were established as a central staging area for rescue and relief efforts, and Farmer's Hall was set up as a shelter for fire evacuees.

Last Friday night, the community organized a dinner for evacuees at the community center adjacent to Gridley High School. It was an effort that came together quickly and included the efforts of the Gridley Rotary Club, Gridley Lions Club, the local Knights of Columbus chapter, and others. The Gridley Parks and Recreation Department was a big part of planning the event.

Local doctors, along with a number of volunteer nurses from Orchard Hospital, helped to evaluate the medical needs of evacuees and help some of them re-establish prescriptions they didn't have time to grab as they evacuated, often on mere minutes' notice.

Please continue to pray for all the fire victims. ★



SMUD X-Rays High-voltage Lines to Prevent Large Power Outages

SMUD's high voltage transmission lines in the Sierra deliver large amounts of power from SMUD's hydroelectric facilities to customers in the valley. A fault on one of those lines can significantly impact the electrical system, potentially leaving thousands of customers in the dark. Critical to the lines' capability are splices that enable the lines to be continuous. As transmission lines are strung or repaired over time, the splices, which are tubular sleeves, can degrade.

To find potential faults SMUD is using state-of-the-art portable X-ray photography to inspect major transmission lines that feed

the SMUD grid. Since the X-ray data collected is live, any potential issues are found immediately and repairs are promptly made to arrest future failure.

These high-voltage lines are strung atop high lattice-style towers. Maintenance and repairs on them can involve a lot of work, sometimes more than a hundred feet above the ground, and the work is typically done while the lines are energized so power can flow without interruption.

"Having this tool available to us helps eliminate the guesswork," said SMUD Chief Energy Delivery Officer Frankie McDermott. "It

Fire Volunteers Work to Rescue Animals

The Camp Fire Effect on Livestock is Huge

GRIDLEY, CA (MPG) - Our community is painfully aware of the events that have transpired over the last week affecting Paradise and the surrounding areas. Gridley has seen an influx of evacuees from all walks of life seeking refuge, including man's best friend. The Red Cross Shelter located at the Butte County Fairgrounds is one of a handful of shelters that will take animals large and small. Though they are not allowed inside the main areas of the shelter, the Feather Room and Farmers Hall, smaller domesticated animals are allowed to remain on the property under supervision of their owners. This has caused many evacuees to camp outside with their animals to keep them close during this time of tragedy. For some it is their only source of comfort. While the smaller animals are allowed to stay with their owners, the larger live stock is housed near the Fairgrounds arena and show areas.

I was able to speak to Artemis Black, or "Molly" to her colleagues, who is the Lead for Large Animals for the North Valley Animal Disaster Group of NVADG. NVADG's Livestock Rescue Unit and crew arrived on scene and immediately got to work on the intake of animals affected by the fire shortly after the shelter was established. Each animal taken in requires special handling and an array of paperwork releasing liability before it can be placed and receive medical treatment. Molly along with the NVADG crew, has been tasked with assisting the continued evacuation efforts of animals still located in the disaster area, reuniting animals with their owners, organizing supply and shelter for those animals, coordinating with trained specialists to treat the injured animals and more. NVADG in conjunction with a group called Cowboy 911, a public group dedicated to helping

farmers, horseman and animal owners in times of need or disaster, have utilized social media to reunite owners with their animals and arrange assistance to help rescue those in peril. While most of the animals arrived with their owners, some have been brought in separately and remain un-identified.

Days after the shelter opened, animals continue to pour in, some uninjured but most under extreme stress. NVADG in association with the Veterinarian Emergency Response Team out of UC

Davis have been working along with skilled volunteers and private Veterinarians to treat those wounded animals and maintain a healthy environment in which they can recover. The VERT team arrived Saturday November 10th with their mobile unit, essentially a horse trailer retrofitted into a mobile Vet pharmacy and crew consisting of 2-3 Veterinarians and 3-5 students. Dr. John Madigan from UC Davis Veterinarian School and Hayley Dieckmann, President of the Student VERT Club and third year Veterinarian Student, were onsite Sunday overseeing medical treatments, and implementing an incident command system. Dr. Madigan explained that VERT assisted in getting supplies donated and coordinating the reimbursement of medications and supplies used by private Veterinarians from their personal stock. Hayley Dieckmann explained the importance of the VERT unit in situations

where animals have been critical injuries, allowing access to crucial medical supplies and treatments that can make the difference in saving the animals life. The unit provides students with the opportunity for extra training in times of disaster and plans to be on site for at least a week.

One of the horses being treated by the VERT team was Renegade, owned by Sharon and Richard Metcalf of Paradise. Renegade, a former Top 10 Canadian Nation Champion and Bronze Medalist Champion in the Las Vegas Arabian Breeders Finals, sustained burns to his muzzle and sensitive eye area. Renegade was one of 8 horses, three of which were pregnant, to survive the fire and be reunited with his owners.

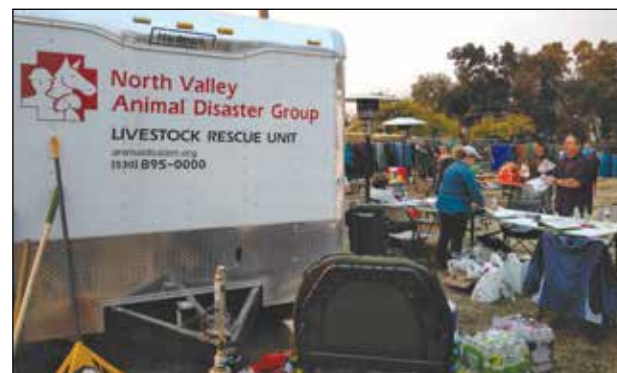
Richard Metcalf first noticed that the sky was too dark to be normal last Thursday morning around

9:30 a.m. and looked out the window to discover why. Just over the treeline of his 7 1/2 acre dream ranch was a billowing cloud of black smoke. He called 911 and the operated told him to get out as fast as he could. He and his wife Sharon grabbed a handful of items and ran to open the gates to the corral that contained their prize winning horses. They flung the gates open so that their horses could have a chance of survival and hopped into their 4-wheel drive truck heading towards the Skyway. They recalled that the trees were already blanketed in white ash and the tips were beginning to singe due to the heat of the fire closing in. Leaving their home, located off of Clark Road,

lost everything and that they would never see their beloved horses again, they made their way to the Gridley Red-Cross Shelter. Miraculously the animals survived and Cowboy 911 in combination with NVADG were able to locate their horses and extricate them from the burning area. Unfortunately, the Metcalfs dream ranch where they intended to spend a peaceful retirement was completely destroyed. Although their home and belongings were gone, they found solace in the fact that all of their horses survived against incredible odds.

The Metcalfs expressed their deep gratitude for the all of the assistance they had received from Cowboy 911, VERT and NVADG teams, local volunteers, and the generosity of the surround community. Students from Gridley High's FFA Club with advisor Matt Reed have been volunteering their services to aid NVADG and help with animal husbandry concerns like cleaning pens, feeding and general care of the animals already on site. On Sunday, the animal roster included about 130 horses, and around 150 smaller animals including 5 cows, 37 goats, 38 sheep, 6 pigs, 3 donkeys, 3 llamas, 13 chickens and more. The FFA students were busy helping with kids and lambs that had been born at the evacuation center in the few days since the fire had started. The experience of volunteering during this time of crisis has inspired many of the FFA students to pursue careers in fields pertaining to animal emergency response.

Although there is no way to forecast how many more animals will arrive,

they found that the roads were grid-locked and the street lights were not working. Desperate to get out, they ended up using the Paradise Memorial Trail way, a bike and pedestrian trail that runs through Paradise, as a road to get to the skyway and to safety.

Thinking that they had

the NVADG crew expects many more and will not turn away any animals in need of shelter and medical treatment. Volunteers and donations are welcome in the continued effort to help the wounded, weary, and strained animals from the Camp Fire and their equally exhausted owners. ★

Arrest Made in Vehicle vs. Juvenile Bicyclist Fatal Hit and Run Collision

Special CHP Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On September 19, 2018 at approximately 5:20 a.m., the California Highway Patrol (CHP) was dispatched to a call of a traffic collision involving a vehicle versus a bicyclist on Watt Avenue near Whitney Avenue. A 14 year old boy was riding his bicycle on Watt Avenue when he was struck and killed by a vehicle. The driver of that vehicle fled the collision scene.

CHP investigators began a criminal investigation in an attempt to locate the suspect vehicle and identify

the responsible driver. With the assistance of witnesses, physical evidence, and information provided to Crime Stoppers, the suspect vehicle, a green 2000 Toyota Sienna, was located. A search warrant was obtained and vehicle was seized as evidence. Through subsequent investigation a person of interest, Edward John Flores (04/02/1968) of North Highlands, was identified as the possible driver involved in this collision.

On November 05, 2018, Flores came to the North Sacramento CHP Area office and spoke with CHP investigators. During the

course of their conversation with Flores, investigators developed probable cause and arrested Flores for being the driver of the Toyota at the time of the collision.

Flores was booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail on charges of felony hit and run and driving with a suspended license.

provides another level of protection to help prevent outages on our transmission lines and helps us to harden the SMUD grid.”

To do the X-ray inspections that see inside the critical splices, they brought in lineworkers from Western Area Power Administration (WAPA), who are certified to do what’s called “barehand” work on energized transmission lines high above the ground while suspended from a helicopter.

Barehanding is a technique that safely allows transmission lineworkers to “bond on” and have

direct contact with energized, high-voltage lines to perform work. Special protective clothing, including gloves, socks and boots, place the lineworker within the field of electricity that surrounds the energized conductor, allowing the electricity to flow around their body.

The work is part of many ongoing projects to improve and enhance reliable power delivery. The transmission lines in El Dorado County enable SMUD to deliver power from the Upper American River Project (UARP), SMUD’s huge system of hydroelectric power plants

in the Sierra. The UARP’s nearly 700 megawatts of clean power can provide about 20 percent of SMUD’s power in a normal water year, which can be crucial especially in summer months when market power is more expensive.

Reliability is a core value of SMUD, a policy set by the SMUD Board of Directors who is elected by SMUD customers. To fulfill that policy, SMUD continues to bolster the infrastructure that comprises SMUD’s grid. For more information about SMUD, visit SMUD.org.

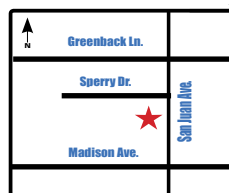

Stop the HIT to Protect American Workers

A little-known provision of the Affordable Care Act has been stealthily contributing to higher health insurance premiums. It's called the Health Insurance Tax, or HIT -- and Congress is finally ready to do something about it.

Earlier this summer, a bipartisan House majority voted to suspend the HIT through 2021. Now it's the Senate's turn to act. Billions of dollars in insurance premiums for consumers are on the line.

Since the Affordable Care Act took effect in 2014, insurance companies offering conventional full-coverage policies have paid fees based on how much their premiums are. That includes employer-sponsored group insurance plans, individual plans on

the Obamacare exchanges, and Medicare and Medicaid plans. The HIT served as an extra source of funding for the ACA.

Unfortunately, insurers simply pass the Health Insurance Tax along to individuals and employers in the form of higher premiums.

That's particularly bad for small business owners, who can't deduct HIT fees from their overall tax liability. Meanwhile, most Americans buying health coverage in the individual market have no idea that part of their premium is just a pass-through tax.

The HIT gets more burdensome every year. Fees from insurers totaled \$8 billion in 2014 and \$11 billion in 2015. Congress suspended the tax for 2017 and 2018. But if the federal government had collected the tax this year, the

tab would have been over \$14 billion.

There's no doubt the HIT has increased premiums. The Kaiser Family Foundation estimates that the HIT inflated exchange plan premiums by two to three percentage points this year. According to an Oliver Wyman analysis, the tax accounted for \$500 in annual premium costs for families obtaining coverage through an employer, \$255 for those enrolled in Medicare Advantage, and \$165 for people insured through the individual market.

Without relief from Congress, the HIT will drive up average individual premiums by more than \$2,100 -- and family premiums by \$5,000 -- over the next decade.

The HIT also knocks those least able to pay the hardest. Americans earning \$10,000 to

\$50,000 a year pay more than half of the HIT.

Large businesses can escape the Health Insurance Tax by self-insuring, or paying employee medical bills directly. But that's not an option for small businesses with fewer employees and volatile health care costs.

That's a big reason why small businesses have faced skyrocketing premiums. From 2010 to 2015, seven in 10 small businesses reported premium increases of more than 20 percent.

The HIT will only continue harming small businesses, causing cuts in employee benefits and reduced hiring. According to one estimate, the HIT could put 163,000 workers at small businesses out of their jobs in the next ten years.

The House measure to suspend the tax for three more years, H.R. 6311, would offer some relief. The Senate should support it.

Better still, Congress should repeal the HIT once and for all. Doing so would be an easy way to lower Americans' insurance premiums and

protect the middle class.

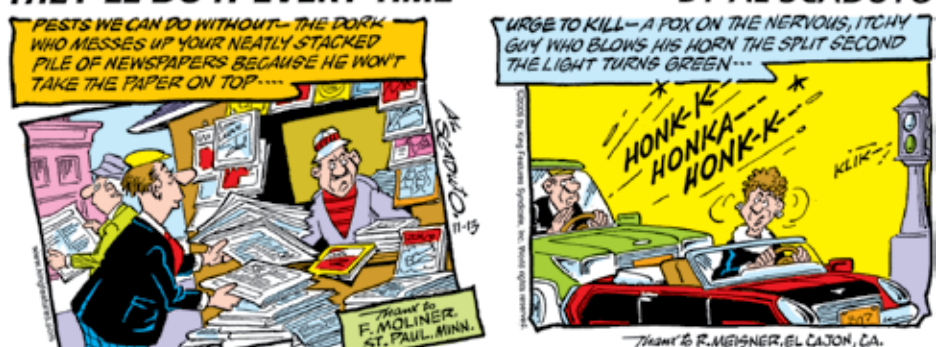

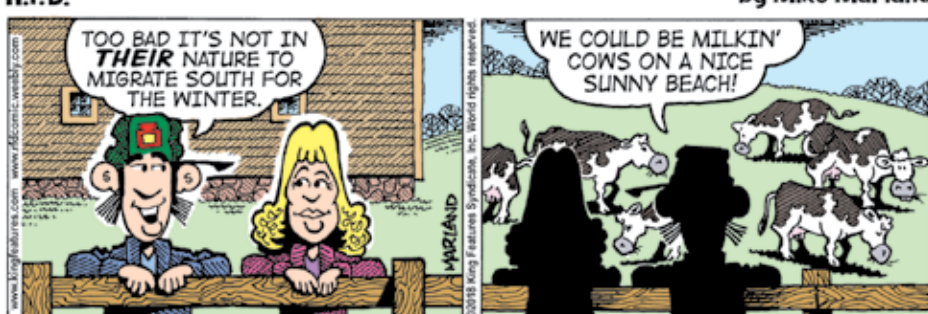

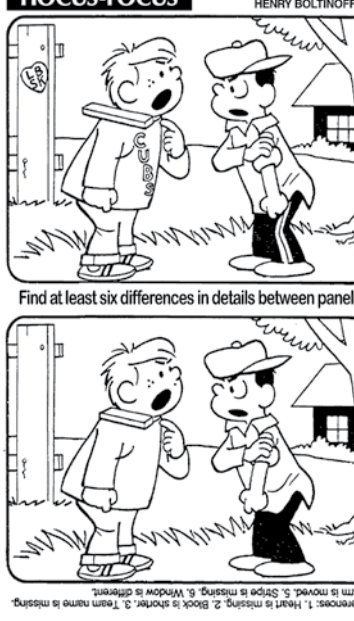

SouthEast Connector Funding Secure Following Proposition 6 Failure

MATHER, CA (MPG) - The Capital SouthEast Connector Joint Powers Authority has announced \$20 million in grant funding previously secured through the California Transportation Commission's (CTC) Local Partnership Program (LPP) available through Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, is secure following the failure of Proposition 6. This statewide proposition would have repealed SB 1, a 2017 law that generates \$5.2 billion annually in new transportation funding that is permanently designated for road repairs and public transportation.

"The voters of California have spoken and, based on the outcome of Proposition 6, understand the importance of prioritizing funding sources to maintain our state's transportation infrastructure," said Derek Minnema, executive director of the Capital SouthEast Connector JPA. "The \$20 million in funds previously

secured through SB 1 will be invested judiciously to continue the advancement of the Connector, which will provide instant regional congestion relief to downtown Sacramento and close a critical rural-to-suburban connectivity gap here in our region."

The Connector received the third largest statewide funding award of close to 90 grant applications for projects throughout California.

Earlier this year, the Sacramento Transportation Authority ranked the Connector as it's No. 1 regional transportation project pursuing funding through the CTC's LPP grant program.

The Connector closes a rural-to-suburban connectivity gap by transforming 34 miles of two-lane rural roads into a state-of-the-art, four-lane expressway connecting the communities of the City of Elk Grove, Sacramento County, City of Rancho Cordova, City of Folsom and El Dorado County. The new

expressway will provide instant regional congestion relief to downtown Sacramento, provide parallel capacity to Highway 50, and an evacuation route for the southeastern part of Sacramento County. Project benefits also extend beyond the region as the Connector has been identified as a key project within California's Central Valley Major International Trade Region, and will connect three U.S. Department of Transportation's Primary Freight Network Routes that are the backbone of goods movement within the Central Valley.

The Connector JPA was formed in December 2006 and includes Sacramento County, El Dorado County and the cities of Elk Grove, Folsom and Rancho Cordova. It is responsible for the Connector's planning, environmental review, engineering design, development and construction.
