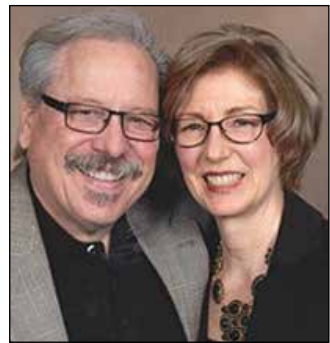

Yes on 6 Exposes Waste, Fraud and Abuse of Gas Tax Funds

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - With the election just weeks away, the Yes on Prop 6 Gas Tax Repeal Campaign has released government documents and records showing numerous examples of "epic levels" of waste, fraud and abuse of gas tax funds and other taxpayer resources at Caltrans and local transportation agencies throughout California.

The records and documents were obtained through the California Public Records Act (CPRA) process and cover only materials received back from the CA Dept. of Transportation (Caltrans), local transportation agencies in San Diego, Los Angeles, Orange County, the Bay Area, and Sacramento. Other local government agencies also receive and spend gas tax funds - raising the question of how many more examples of waste of gas tax funds exist.

"These examples of outrageous waste of the gas tax and other taxpayer resources provide the best reason to vote YES on Prop 6 the Gas Tax Repeal Initiative," said Carl DeMaio, chairman of the campaign. "Our existing gas tax funds are being wasted and we demand that these revelations of outrageous expenditures be immediately reformed before we give these people any more of our taxpayer dollars," noted DeMaio.

"These outrageous examples of waste of our gas tax funds

A New Sustainable Community

Fair Oaks EcoHousing Project Is Now Under Construction

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Construction is underway on the Fair Oaks EcoHousing project, located at 4025 New York Avenue. The mission of the project is to create a community-focused, environmentally friendly neighborhood right here in Fair Oaks. The community will integrate private homes into a cohesive village atmosphere with shared amenities and green spaces. Construction on the community began in December 2017.

Marty Maskall, founding member of Fair Oaks EcoHousing, said the community focus is "smart growth and green design." The project is transforming 3.7 acres of land (which originally had just two homes on it) into a sustainable neighborhood of 30 homes. In December 2013, Maskall had a contract,

contingent on project approval, to purchase the property. The purchase closed in June 2015. And next year, in May or

June of 2019, families will be moving into the community. Of the 30 homes, seven are still available for purchase.

Maskall leads monthly introductory meetings and site tours for anyone interested in becoming a member of the EcoHousing community. The meeting includes a short video featuring the

SMUD and D.R. Horton Agree to Build All-electric Homes

Electric Utility Aims to Reduce Greenhouse Gases Through "Electrification"

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - SMUD and top national homebuilder D.R. Horton are teaming up to build 104 all-electric homes in two new neighborhoods. These "all-electric communities" - "Juniper," which is planned to include 66 homes, and "Independence," which is anticipated to include 38 homes, are both located in North Natomas and will be priced for first-time homebuyers. The homes are included in the SMUD Smart Home program and are part of a broader electrification effort by SMUD, the first of its kind in the USA.

Groundbreaking for the subdivisions began earlier this summer. The model homes are completed, and the communities are open for sale. Construction will continue through 2019. If built as planned, SMUD will provide \$466,000 in incentives to D.R. Horton for including appliances and equipment to make the homes all-electric. These include heat pump heating and cooling, heat pump water heating, and induction stoves—appliances that are typically more energy efficient and can deliver lower overall energy bills.

Heat pump water heaters can reduce electricity use by up to 60 percent compared to electric resistance water heaters. Instead of using electricity to create heat, heat pump water heaters use a refrigerant cycle to transfer heat from surrounding ambient air into the hot water tank. They also cool the area where they are located, usually in the garage. Induction stoves may cook 50 percent faster than electric resistance stoves, and often as fast as gas. They also use less energy than traditional electric stoves and offer digital control of the temperature, and they have no open flame. The absence of combustion

in all-electric homes may result in greater occupant safety.

These homes will help community-owned SMUD meet its aggressive commitment to reach 90 percent reduction in greenhouse gas emissions by 2050 and surpass the state's greenhouse gas reduction goals of 80 percent by 2050.

These D.R. Horton homes are part of the SMUD Smart Home program, which offers incentives to builders and developers of up to \$5,000 for new single-family homes, and up to \$1,750 for new multifamily units, built to be all-electric. The homes must have all-electric appliances and mechanical systems—no gas line in the home, and no gas service at the property—in order to meet the minimum program participation requirements.

SMUD customers who own existing homes in the SMUD service territory can also qualify for up to \$13,750 for existing homes that convert from gas to electricity. For example, owners of existing homes may receive up to a \$4,500 incentive to replace an existing gas furnace by installing an electric heat pump space heater. A homeowner may receive up to a \$3,000 rebate to switch out an existing gas water heater for an electric heat pump water heater.

There are also rebates available from SMUD for traditional efficiency measures such as duct sealing, insulation, and windows.

The event, sponsored by Capital Public Radio, will take place in the Capitol Plaza Ballrooms basement, 1025 9th Street in Sacramento, and will raise funds for Women's Empowerment's job-readiness

programs for homeless women and the group's onsite center for homeless children. Nearly a dozen local artists will display and sell their work, with 50 percent of art proceeds donated to Women's Empowerment. Tickets are \$50 at www.womens-empowerment.org. Guests must be age 21 or older.

"Cabaret on K is the perfect opportunity to have a positive impact on your community while celebrating Sacramento's thriving arts scene," said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women's Empowerment. "Guests will enjoy live music and art while helping to end homelessness for women and their children."

Women's Empowerment is offering the most comprehensive job-readiness program in the

Sacramento area designed specifically for women who are homeless and their children. The award-winning organization has graduated 1,543 homeless women and their 3,710 children. Last year, 92 percent of graduates found homes and 77 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. Women's Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and receives no government funding except for in-kind rent from the County of Sacramento. Nevada City Cohousing community, which is the inspiration for Fair Oaks EcoHousing. Both communities share the same architect and have a very similar design, with rows of private homes facing each other, large porches on the front and back of each home, a shared pool, a club house, and a side area for parking.

Community members will own their own homes and be part of a homeowners association to fund the operating costs and maintain the shared spaces. Members will be able to participate in shared gardening, and prepare meals in the club house made from ingredients grown in the community gardens. Maskall said that prices for new homes in the Fair Oaks EcoHousing community are comparable to other new homes on the market that utilize green design and construction, ranging from approximately \$360,000 up to \$680,000.

At a recent introductory meeting and site tour on October 13, attendees all shared similar motivations for considering membership: a sense of true community.

Cisca van Beek is originally from Holland, and she said cohousing communities are very common there and in many other places across Europe: "There are countless benefits; the communities are great places to raise kids."

Scott and Joyce Hedges explained that people are so

busy these days that it's difficult to create a sense of community. They are looking for a sense of belonging and a connection with others.

Erin Huff currently lives in Oak Park with her husband John and their two-year-old daughter. Huff has been interested in cohousing and pocket neighborhood ideas for quite a while. She is considering Fair Oaks EcoHousing because of the "intentional cohesive community building."

Current members also attended the meeting to share their reasons for joining the community and to get a look at the progress on their homes.

Lorri Reynard, who is originally from New York, chose to join because "the community aspect really resonated with me; I want to know my neighbors."

Denise Knight lived in Fair Oaks in the past and loves the area. In addition to the social aspect, she said she became a member in order "to have all the amenities but share the work."

Roslyn Eliaser said, "I love the idea of having the privacy of my own home but within a community... You can accomplish so much more together."

Both the members and prospective members share a strong desire to become part of a collaborative community where neighbors know each other and work together.

is proof that voters cannot trust California government agencies with even a penny more of their money until efficiency and accountability reforms can clean up these excessive expenditures," said Carl DeMaio, Chairman of Yes on Prop 6 Gas Tax Repeal Campaign. "Voters can send a strong message by voting YES on Prop 6 to repeal the costly and unfair gas and car tax hikes," DeMaio concluded.

Facts about this massive hike:

- Voting Yes on Prop 6 will repeal the car and gas tax, and ensures that any future car and gas taxes must be approved by the voters
- On Nov 1, 2017, Californians became subject to an additional tax of 12.5 cents more per gallon (20 cents more for diesel)
- Estimates suggest it will cost an

average family of four \$779 or more per family, per year

- The tax also hits business owners who rely on transporting goods, raising the cost of everything from apples to bread, and everything in between
- Vehicle license fees (car tax) will increase as much as \$175 a year - striking the wallets of hard-working families across the state
- The tax revenue goes into the state's General Fund, meaning there's zero guarantee the money will be used to actually fund the transportation "fixes" they claim will happen
- Nearly 1 million signatures were collected to qualify the measure on the November ballot; just over 550,000 were required

Speaking engagement set for November 4 at 6pm Service

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Dr. Reichman comes from a long line of orthodox rabbis. His paternal grandfather, an orthodox rabbi, immigrated to the United States from Austria. His first exposure to the Gospel was at the age of 8, when a friend invited him to attend a Vacation Bible School. After that summer, two of his sisters attended a youth camp sponsored by the same church and came home having accepted Jesus Christ to be their Savior. His parents had divorced by this time, opening the door for Dr. Reichman and his sisters to freely attend church.

Despite his active attendance in church, it was not until he was a teenager that he finally came to accept Christ as his Savior. During the invitation in the morning service, Al realized that everything he had been taught about Jesus was exactly what his father had taught him about Messiah. This settled in his heart and he readily received Messiah. However, not without cost--his father mourned him as dead and never spoke to him again. The Lord laid a claim on Al's life a year later at youth camp and he surrendered his life to serve the Lord. Following high school, he traveled with a

Christian musical drama group for two years.

In 1975 he enrolled in Baptist Bible College in Springfield, Missouri. Upon graduating in 1979 with a BA in Theology, Al was ordained. He and his wife, Michele, embarked on a 17 year pastoral ministry and the continuation of his education. He earned his Master of Theology and Doctor of Theology degrees from Bethany Theological Seminary in Dothan, Alabama, graduating Suma Cum Laude in both programs.

In 1984, Al began to develop a burden for the salvation of his own people. He has been used by the Lord in many churches desiring him to preach the need of taking the Gospel to the Jews, from whence it came. He led the churches he pastored

to financially support Jewish Missions in a substantial way. Al has served as Missions Committee Chairman of the Central West Texas Baptist Bible Fellowship during his time in Texas, Chairman of the Illinois Baptist Bible Fellowship for four years, and Chairman of the Board of Directors for Freedom Flyer Ministries. He has pastored three Baptist churches in New Mexico, Texas and Illinois. Since 1997, the Lord has opened the door for Al and Michele to serve in Jewish ministry. In 2013 the Lord led Al to launch Ahavath Messiah Ministries (Love of Messiah Ministries), where he continues to labor to bring the Gospel to Jewish people, as well as encouraging and teaching churches to do the same. Al travels to churches all across the country sharing his burden of taking the Gospel "to the Jew first, and also the Greek." He is a gifted speaker, who evidences the hand of God on his life and ministry.

ASK MATT

SHOULD I WATCH GOD FRIENDED ME ON CBS?

Question: Why do many programs run over their 30 or 60 minute time period by a minute or two? I often record programs, and the last minute or two of a story's wrap-up is lost. The program is recorded precisely at 30 or 60 minutes but the broadcast lasted a minute or two longer. — Ellen Margate, FL

has been going on for a long time—and it can be even more confusing with certain cable programs that produce oversized episodes running 15 or more minutes longer than the usual hour with commercials. Those with DVR recorders tend to have less of an issue with this, because the programmers generally provide information about which episodes are expected to run a minute or so longer, and

generally it works (although it still sometimes lops off the last few seconds of a show— especially noticeable if you're a fan of Chuck Lorre's vanity cards). The reason for these overruns is very old-school, with schedulers believing if a popular show runs into another show's time period, it may keep viewers from turning between episodes to the competition. This usually ends up just annoying viewers for the reasons you state in your question. If your device allows you to do it, I always recommend recording a few minutes beyond the allotted time slot—or even recording the following show just to be safe.

Connoisseur is European for Smart Aleck

Our resident cowboy, Steve, brought us the shocking news: cowpuncher Three-Chord Cortez, that bunkhouse balladeer, plans to study opera, in hopes an aria or three will make him even more attractive to girls during a serenade. Apparently, singing *La Donna Mobile* might be more effective than “You don’t know what lonesome is ‘til you start herding co-o-o-ows” ... especially if she doesn’t speak European. I thought I’d jot down a few

opera-watching truths for ol’ T.C. just to help him out.

1. Take off your hat. You can keep jujubes in it if you want.
2. If you like a particular aria, you can yell *Bravo!* if it’s a man, *Brava!* if it’s a woman, or *Bravisimo!* if it’s an *isimo*. It’s considered poor form to yell “Eeeee-HAAA!” or “You get ‘em, Hon!”
3. One of the strangest operatic devices is called *recitative* – pronounced rest-a-TEEF – (don’t

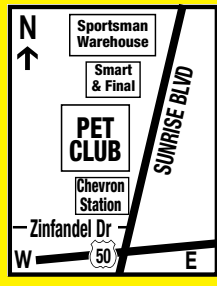
