CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Following the sellout success of 201/'s inaugural event, Carmichael Park Foundation last week staged a second "Dinner in the Park" fundraiser. The gala benefits park beautification and helps fund programs offered by Carmichael Park District.

Entirely al-fresco, the gathering ambled over two hidden-gem reserves. September is Alcohol and Drug Recovery Month sacramento region, ca (MPG)

- In recognition that recovery happens and people can change their lives for the better, the Behavioral Health Services, Alcohol and Drug Services presented a resolution to the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors, who proclaimed September 2018 as Alcohol and Drug Recovery Month in Sacramento County.

And recovery does happen. Case in point: DeAnna Lopez, a Sacramento County resident, began using drugs when she was 11 years old. At 15, she was pregnant, unemployed and living in her car. DeAnna could not stop using and did not know how to get help. DeAnna's moment of clarity came when her daughter was born.

Child Protective Services was the first organization to offer DeAnna help, and she gladly accepted. Today DeAnna is 12 years sober and works as a Court Services Supervisor for WellSpace Health. She delivered a passionate speech at the Board of Supervisors meeting, recognizing her daughter and County services for helping her recover from an addiction to drugs. DeAnna is a true success story and is a living testimony that recovery does happen and people do change their lives.

"It is critical that people experiencing substance use disorders receive the support they need," said Sacramento County Alcohol and Drug Services Division Manager, Lori Miller. "The reality is that behavioral health is essential to health, prevention works, treatment is effective, and people recover."

The County recently passed the 2018-19 budget, which included \$5.9 million to implement the Drug Medi-Cal Waiver that will provide enhanced drug treatment services.

Sac County provides various alcohol and drug treatment services that range from outpatient treatment, medication assisted treatment, residential treatment, detoxification and Perinatal Services. Climate Change: Governor Jerry Brown, Ignores Energy Jobs

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The doomsday predictions of global-warming alarmists would have us believe there are more droughts, more extreme hurricanes and tornados, that arctic snow caps are melting, and all coastal cities are in danger of rising seas.

Convinced the sky is falling, Henny Penny and a band of gullible friends march off to tell the king, only to meet their end at the hands of a wily fox. 'The sky is falling!' Henny Penny said, in a silly tale about a chicken who believes the world is coming to an end.

Does this sound familiar? The defacto leader of 'The Sky is Falling' Chicken Little Party, Gov. Jerry Brown warned in 2016, 'If Trump turns off the satellites, California will launch its own damn satellite,' after he called Trump a 'fraud' at the Democratic National Convention for his continued denial of global warming.

When President Donald Trump pulled the United States out of the Paris Climate Accord, California Gov. Jerry Brown said the world is only just beginning to feel the environmental harm inflicted by the Trump administration. 'He has set in motion initiatives that will cause damage,' the Los Angeles Times reported Brown said, comparing the

planet under Trump's climate policies to a person who has just fallen from the top of the Empire State Building. 'You are falling down four stories, but have 80 to go,' he said. 'Maybe you are not damaged yet, but it is certain you will

"The governor said his overriding concern is that global progress has stalled. 'This is real,' Brown said. 'It is far more serious than anybody is saying."

Trump said the agreement was 'very unfair' for the U.S., especially the U.S. coal industry, NPR reported. And he reported good news for the battered industry: the development of new mines.

Yet doubling down once again, last week California Gov. Jerry Brown signed two bills making it all-butimpossible for the Trump administration to drill for oil in federal waters off California by banning any new infrastructure to support the projects.

Apparently Gov. Brown

hates the people of California who need jobs. Under his leadership, California has not only lost hundreds of thousands of voters and residents through outbound migration to Texas, Arizona, Nevada and Florida, the state has shifted to a parttime economy. Other than Silicon Valley, Hollywood, and a threatened agriculture industry, Democrats in California have shunned manufacturing jobs, and replaced them with part-time, minimum wage workers who need welfare to make ends meet.

There is one exception: Oil industry jobs. California boasts 360,000 jobs in the oil industry. Yet to hear Gov. Brown talk, he despises the oil industry.

Following the latest bill signing, Brown said in a statement: 'California's message to the Trump administration is simple: Not here, not now. We will not let the federal government...destroy our treasured

The climate change hysteria is so vast, CBS reports, 'UN says number of hungry people worldwide is growing, with climate change partly to blame.' The UN claims climate change is 'wreaking havoc on crop production' in much of the developing world, the United Nations said Tuesday, CBS News reported.

California politicians have gloated over being the first state to enact such aggressive green energy and greenhouse gas busting policy, but have yet to produce any proof that these oppressive and business-killing laws have had any 'green' results.

Ironically perhaps, Brown kicked off his 2018 Global Climate Action Summit, Wednesday, and welcomed China's 120-plus attendees - the largest country delegation at the event –

As Daniel Turner points out, China is the world's number one polluter, exempt from the sacred Paris Climate Accord, and the land of forced child labor in coal mines. It's odd Brown would welcome this, yet he rolled out the red carpet for the Chi-Coms.

Turner and I discussed several issues:

Brown never addresses that energy costs in California are among the highest in the nation, and only continue to increase due to the California's mandates of renewables in electricity production.

In 2017, A Los Angeles Times Report Found That Despite California Using 2.6% Less Electricity Than In 2008, Residential And Business Customers Pay \$6.8 Billion More For Power Than In 2008. 'Although California uses \$2.6% less electricity annually from the power grid now than in 2008, residential and business customers together pay \$6.8 billion more for power than they did then.' (Ivan Penn and Ryan Menezes, 'Californians Are Paying Billions For Power They Don't Need,' Los Angeles Times, 2/5/17)

Since 2008, Electric Rates In California, Adjusted For

Inflation, Have Increased 12% While Declining Almost 3% Elsewhere In The United States. Los Angeles Times

The other important issue we discussed is the vast untapped energy resources in the Monterey Shale Oil Reserve. Since Jerry Brown was reelected Governor in 2011, I've been writing about California's Monterey Shale formation:

'California sits on twothirds of America's shale oil reserves. The Monterey Shale Formation is four times the size of the Bakken Shale Reserve in North Dakota, which is now the largest oil producer in the country behind Texas.

Along the Western side of the San Joaquin Valley in the middle of the state, the Monterey Shale Formation encompasses several hundred miles, where water has dried up and unemployment is the highest in the state.'

A study found that exploiting Monterey shale could generate up to 2.8 million new jobs and add 14 percent to the state's GDP by 2020, near the peak of production. Instead, California's Governor wants to ban the sale of internal combustion passenger vehicles in the state, and has signed legislation to mandate 100% renewable energy by 2045.

Most countries around the world think that it's a good thing to have cheap energy. But in California, we have plenty of cheap energy available, just not the political will to access it. The state is awash in ultra cheap natural gas, yet in California, our corrupt government finds a way to create an energy shortage, and charge rate payers the highest rates in the country.

It's as if Gov. Jerry Brown is trying to destroy California.

Platinum Party Honors Pefley Partnership

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Jack and Jerri Pefley's platinum anniversary dinner menu began as humbly as their first meal as husband and wife. Driving from Hatboro (PA) to Niagara Falls in 1948, the newlyweds stopped to eat. "We had a cup of soup and a salad," recalls Jerri (90). "We had only two days for our honeymoon. We were hungry, and restaurants were closed. That was the only meal we could find."

Seventy years later, fillet steak and desserts followed the nostalgic first courses at Eskaton Village. The Pefleys assembled family and old friends for a champagne toast to love and partnership. Now almost 95, Jack offered a formula for marital longevity: "Be out of town as much as possible," he sug-

kidding. The Pefley marriage endured many years of long separations.

"We were apart so much,

to see each other again," said his wife. "But it was hard, too. When our son John spoke at his El Camino High School graduation, Jack was away flying. In those days, people were committed to careers. Family events weren't used as excuses."

Jack and Jerri wed at the same Hatboro church where they contrived their first date. Carmichael bred, Jack's war service and subsequent military career decreed he would not return home permanently for many years. His test-pilot flights near Hatboro required rapid reactions so, after beholding 20-year-old Pennsylvanian Jerri Kratz in spring, he proposed in summer and they married in fall. "Jack's commitment to decisions was something I liked," approves his bride.

"Jack saw me singing in the church choir. A pilot friend introduced us. He asked me to lunch and

to a June Allyson movie. My birthday party was that night and I was engaged to marry someone else. I went out with Jack because I liked him - and I really liked June Allyson."

During the Hatboro courtship, the dashing Navy pilot dashed between Hatboro and Berkeley CA, finishing his political science degree. "I sure hoped Jack would propose," Jerri admits. "One day he gave me a gift box with a ribbon sticking out of it. I pulled the ribbon. Every few inches were slips of paper with lines from love poems. At the very end was a diamond ring."

The September bride personified post-war glam in white lace. Their freezing cold Niagara bridal suite, regrets the groom, had twin cots. Because their car was borrowed, Mr. and Mrs. Pefley headed home after two days. Longer journeys soon became the norm. During Navy postings in the Philippines, Japan, Morocco, Southern California and France, the Pefleys raised three kids. Retiring as a Commander, Jack established his family in Carmichael and began an 18-year career flying for World Airways. His second retirement was in 1983. The Pefleys occupied Palm Drive acres they called Rocking K.P. (Kratz and Pefley) Ranch.

Both served the Carmichael community: its Presbyterian Church, Chamber of Commerce and parks have claimed many volunteer hours. These days, the K.P. ranchers keep a gentler pace at Eskaton Village, Carmichael.

"We still love being together," says Jack's bride. "Even after 70 years, we never run out of things to say."

Sac Feral Resources to Hold **Community Cats Workshop**

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - You've seen the cats scurry into the brush when you walk by, or the kitten who shows up on your doorstep every so often looking for something to eat. Some people consider these feral cats nuisances; some consider them cute; and others, like Sac Feral Resources, understand the need for the neighborhood to work together to manage feral cat colonies. A workshop being offered on September 30 at Carmichael Library will teach community members how to improve the situation for both feral cats and humans who share the same neighborhood.

The workshop, part of the Community Cats Project, will be divided into two parts. The morning session will focus on feral and community cats. This session may be taken alone, but it is a prerequisite for the afternoon that will discuss and teach Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR). The workshops are free and open to the public.

"I want to improve the situation for the cats and for the neighbors," said Linda Morgan of Sac Feral Resources. a non-profit all-volunteer organization. "Ultimately, the objective is to stop more kittens from being born into a situation where they are not welcomed, wanted, or cared for," she said, "and to humanely care for cats already in the neighborhood." The hope, she added, is that people, even those currently caring for feral cats, will "take something away that will improve the lives of the cats and the neighborhood."

How do these cats get into the neighborhood? Some are left behind after the humans move. Others are set outside after a death in the family. Still others are put out instead of taken to one of the shelters because the people fear the cats will be euthanized. There are many reasons. Sac Feral Resources' intention isn't to focus on the reasons. It is to teach people how to control the cat population.

"There's a method to colony management," she said.

"I don't think people realize how much of a problem this is. Throughout the county there are between one and two hundred thousand feral cats. There is no inventory."

By learning how to monitor and manage the colony within a neighborhood, she added, the population can stabilize and

eventually will decrease because cats are trapped, spayed, neutered, and returned. They are unable to reproduce. There is also what Morgan calls a feeding protocol, which is not simply leaving a bowl of food outside for the neighborhood cat.

The organization encourages people to register colonies, to learn what needs to be done within an apartment complex or neighborhood. Some residents, she said, have been faced with eviction if they continue to feed the cats. Socializing feral kittens helps make them adoptable.

"The in-depth workshops cover the background of what these cats are, the philosophies of people in the neighborhood, and why it is a neighborhood problem," said Morgan. "Cats are left behind. People are dumping cats where they see cats being fed. Cats are out there because of human action or inaction."

What can attendees expect? Morgan will bring in traps and demonstrate their use. She'll show videos, and teach how to talk to others as a colony manager. She'll teach how to trap the "untrappable" cats. She'll also explain how to feed cats. "There's a protocol behind it that will make you more successful," she said. "With TNR, responsible feeding, and colony management, the cat population will stabilize and ultimately be reduced through attrition. Neighborhood cat issues can be resolved when residents are empowered to work together in this shared objective."







We Must Come Together to Make Behavioral Health a Priority

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Behavioral health issues will plague one in four Americans in their lifetime, and half of us will care for someone living with a mental health issue during our lives. If you are not experiencing a behavioral health challenge right now, someone you know certainly is. These issues can strike someone once during their lifetime, or they may be something a person deals with every moment of every day.

In my role with Mental Health America of California, I work closely with youth and in the workplace mental health space. I see that the state of California, and the nation as a whole, is facing significant issues when it comes to behavioral health. Children are dying from substance use disorder and overdoses; they are dying from suicide. Neighbors are disabled because of behavioral health challenges.

MHAC has been working for 60 years to ensure that everyone in California who needs mental health services and support has access to appropriate help before they reach a point of crisis. But we cannot do this alone. That's

why we have joined forces with a first-of-its-kind coalition called Behavioral Health Action. The coalition brings together more than 50 diverse organizations that touch behavioral health in some way. This includes law enforcement, health care providers and hospitals, education, business, government and labor. Our goal is to elevate the issue of behavior health and raise awareness among the public and elected officials about what we can do to make a change.

Today, many elected officials are concerned about reducing costs of health care in the state of California. Others are concerned about closing achievement gaps. One way to solve these problems is to address behavioral health challenges and treatment. While we as the Behavioral Health Action coalition can create innovative solutions, it is up to the legislators to implement policies and bring change at a statewide level.

This issue runs deep. It is going to take steadfast effort from our whole village to make a dent in behavioral health outcomes and to improve the lives of people living with these challenges. If we do not include many partners with many perspectives, we'll never make a

lifference

I lost two siblings to suicide. I grew up in a family and in a community where substance use and mental health issues were prevalent, but no one ever talked about it. No one discussed treatment. Because of this, behavioral health has always been my top priority, and I hope others will give it the importance it deserves – from our neighbors and friends to our local and state representatives. We all need to take responsibility, and we all need to unite our voices, if we want to make progress on this issue.

If you are not mentally well, how can you achieve anything else? If we don't highlight and elevate behavioral health, reduce its stigma and identify appropriate services and support that our communities need, we're going to have many more problems before anything gets better.

I am a candidate this year for the San Juan Unified School Board. I can assure you that behavioral health will be my chief concern as I run for elected office, and I urge all other elected officials and candidates to make it a priority as well when they are on the campaign trail.





THRILLER "MILE 22" TRAVELS A TOUGH PATH; "LODGE 49" ON TV

THE PREDATOR (Rated R)

"The Predator," written and directed by Shane Black, takes a departure from the past, infusing this action thriller with tongue-in-cheek humor and wisely skipping any misguided links of previous films in the franchise to the "Alien" films.

At best, "The Predator" is an action-filled B-movie that would probably play best at local drive-ins, if such theaters remained in plentiful supply. But that doesn't mean it's lacking as an entertaining diversion.

The action gets off to a fast start when Quinn McKenna (Boyd Holbrook), a former Special Forces Army Ranger turned mercenary soldier, is in Mexico on a mission to rescue hostages held by a drug cartel.

The arrival of an alien spaceship scrambles the hostage liberation effort, and McKenna and his squad are faced with a deadly encounter with the Predator, a fearsome creature with physical strength unmatched by any human.

Barely escaping as the only survivor, McKenna is able to retrieve some alien gear, including a helmet and a metal casing for the forearm. He ships the equipment back home to his son, Rory (Jacob Tremblay).

Once the package arrives, Rory, a loner afflicted with autism who is bullied at school because he's a genius, tinkers with the alien equipment, triggering the Predator's ability to track down what McKenna managed to steal.

Upon returning to the States, McKenna is taken by the government for mental observation and is put on a military prison bus with a group of veterans suffering from PTSD who know each other from group therapy.

The soldiers, known as the "Loonies," include the suicidal Nebraska (Trevante Rhodes), Tourette's Syndrome victim Baxley (Thomas Jane), wise-cracking Coyle (Keegan-Michael Key), enigmatic Lynch (Alfie Allen), and fanatic Nettles (Augusto Aguilera).

For the sake of survival, this motley crew of "Loonies" bands together with McKenna and commandeer the prison bus to head off to McKenna's home to save Rory. In the getaway, they pick up the terrified Casey Bracket (Olivia Munn).

A biologist called to help the government study a captured alien held in a secret bunker, Casey had managed to escape when the sedated creature awoke and killed just about everybody in a bloody rampage.

Of course, McKenna's kid, who figured out the alien code, is placed in serious jeopardy. But one of the funniest scenes is when the Loonies end up at the home of McKenna's estranged wife (Yvonne Strahovski) to locate Rory and unnerve her

with their lunatic banter. "The Predator," fittingly enough with Shane Black's desire not to take things too seriously, goes all-in for overthe-top thrills with a climax so wild on top of the alien spaceship that one can only marvel at the audacity.

In the end, "The Predator" is a joyride into thrilling action where the raging battles with the Predator may not be truly suspenseful or frightening but fun nevertheless.

"TOM CLANCY'S JACK RYAN" ON AMAZON PRIME

Jack Ryan was to author Tom Clancy what James Bond was to Ian Fleming. Both heroes have had a long and successful run in source novels and plenty of cinematic iterations. Now along comes "Tom Clancy's Jack Ryan" for an eight-episode run on Amazon Prime.

The "Tom Clancy's Jack Ryan" series allows John Krasinski ("The Office") to bring an everyman quality to the CIA analyst evolved from a desk job to a daring action hero in the hot spots of the Middle

Krasinski's Jack Ryan first appears as a mild-manoffice cubicle tracking suspicious financial transactions that signal significant terrorist funding operations happening in Yemen.

Following in the footsteps of actors like Harrison Ford, Alec Baldwin and Ben Affleck, Krasinski's Ryan is similarly tossed into the cauldron of dangerous missions out in the field.

The first episode puts Jack Ryan on the spot with an assignment to cross-examine a terrorist, an obligation to which Ryan responds: "I'm an analyst. I don't interrogate people. I write reports."

The Gasoline Tax Hike WON'T Fix Roads

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Gasoline Tax hike won't fix roads. It will go into the General Fund and be spent elsewhere. Just like the last time California raised our gas taxes. The only way that we can get our roads fixed is to have a 100% Lock Box on the Existing Gas Tax.

After repealing this gas tax, we can require that there be a 100% lock-

on road repairs and maintenance. That is a giving the State a blank check to be spent on anything they want. If they wanted to fix the roads, they would have designated a special fund to put our money into that could ONLY be spent on road repair. We want to see potholes filled, roads built, and bridges fixed. We want accountability.

The state auditor discovered that box on the monies. Currently, not a more than 3,500 CalTrans employees

single dime is required to be spent had no project to work on. CalTrans wasted \$500 million dollars a year from this fact alone.

California has a \$16 BILLION surplus right now. Why should we be paying more than \$700 a year in gas taxes when the state has 16,000 million dollars in SURPLUS?

If we continue at this rate, California will have the highest gas tax in the nation. Today we pay more that \$1 more per gallon than most other states (and those states have beautiful roads, by the way). By 2021, we will be paying \$2 more per gallon. That adds up to 40 dollars more every time you fill up an average sized gas tank. If it cost you 40\$ now it will be 80\$ then to fill up your gas tank.

This gas tax not only hit us when we fill up our gas tanks but it hit us when we buy anything at the store. Diesel fuel taxes went up 20 cents a gallon. That means that it costs much more to transport all goods- including food. The cost of living in California is already too high. This new gas, diesel, and car tax makes it even more difficult for families struggling to get by.

Prop 6 requires the voters to approve any future gas taxes, diesel taxes, or vehicle related fee increases. This is the only way to make sure that our hard-earned money pays for road repair and infrastructure. We can require a 100% lockbox on the money to make sure it is spent on asphalt, steel, and concrete workers.




