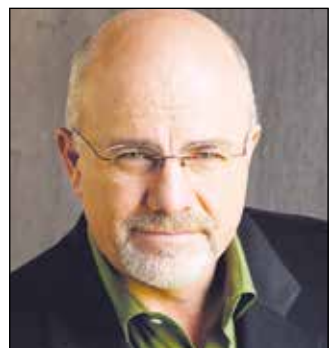

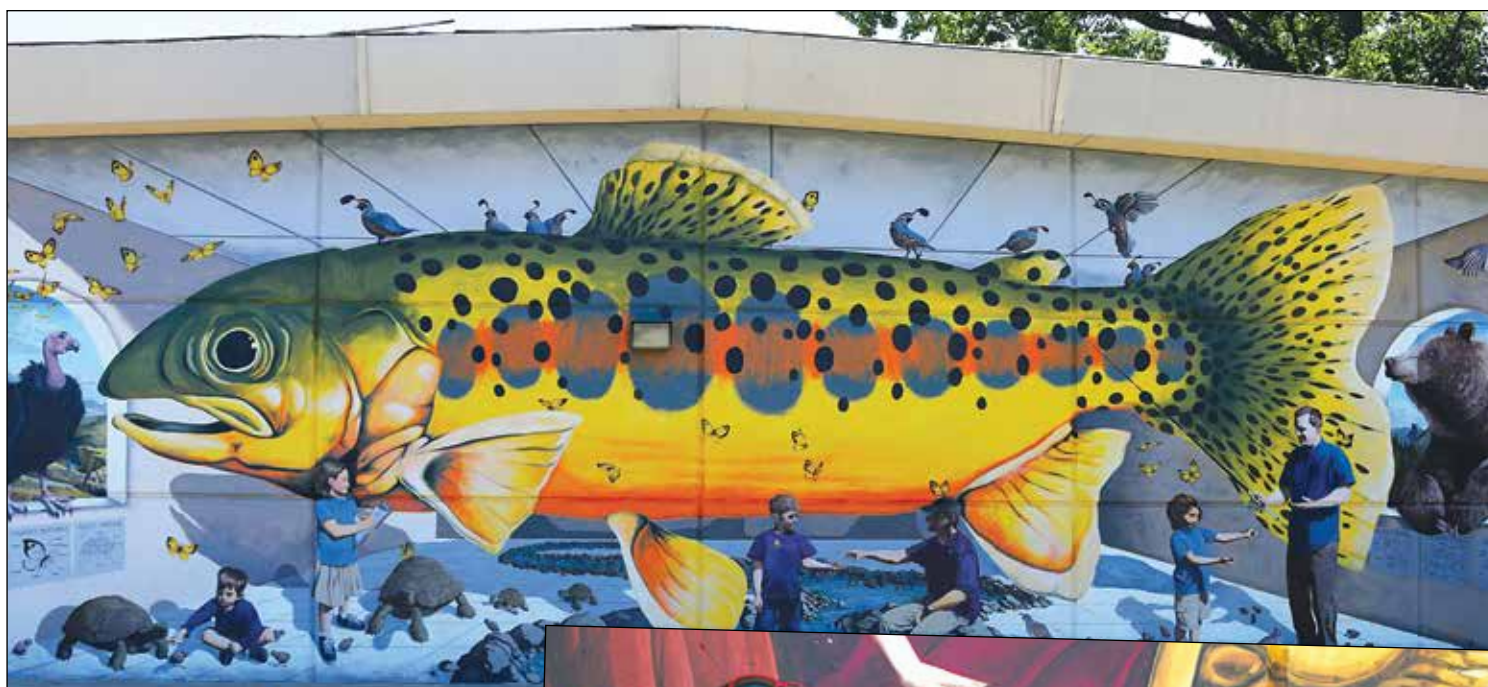

## Montessori Murals Capture California in Art

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - A five-summer mission at the California Montessori Project (Carmichael) has festooned the old La Sierra High School campus with five murals. The last was recently unveiled to reveal a dazzling pageant of California history.

Explains artist/teacher Noah Kocina: "The work reflects two significant events in our history - the establishment of Spanish missions and the rush to find gold." Over summer vacations, Fair Oaks resident Kocina completed this and previous tableaux that total 2,500 square feet in area. Reflecting utilitarian 1960s school design, his canvases were originally concrete classroom abutments.

The Montessori Project began leasing teaching space from Carmichael Recreation and Park District in 2019. Kocina and director of school operations Gary Bowman beheld blank concrete slabs and envisioned opportunities for beautification - and for enhancing the school's community presence. Bowman

suggested a series of murals and commissioned Kocina to get painting during summer teaching breaks. "I'd start at 6 am," says the artist. "Mornings were completely quiet, and painting felt like meditation. I'd work six or seven hours, until it got so hot my paint dried before I could apply it."

Kocina's designs represent Montessori philosophy and five cultural elements of school studies: botany, zoology, geometry, geography and history. Before he began painting, one lone wall already bore a painted Stars

and Stripes. CRPD administrators okayed his murals as long as the nation's symbol remained. "We were fine with that," says Kocina. "But I wanted the flag grander and larger. I incorporated it in my geometry mural - there's a lot of geometry in the design of a flag." His botany mural centers around a huge California poppy. A 36-foot trout dominates his zoology design. The muralist's big view

## El Camino Football Bounces Back Eagles Take Flight Over Bella Vista

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - After a disappointing week 1 loss that saw their team lose 45-0 to the hands of Oakmont, the El Camino Eagles were looking to finally take flight during the 2018 campaign. They did just that in their 42-20 victory against Bella Vista Friday night.

An offense that could not score any points in week 1 soared



behind backup Quarterback Dez Ortega's first start. Ortega came

up big, throwing for over 200 yards and controlled the pace of the game from start to finish. Kentrell Williams ran for a pair of touchdowns, including a sneaky misdirection that saw him truck through the entire Bella Vista defense right up the gut in the first quarter. Wide Receiver Jasani Harris navigated his way through the Bronco's defense with shifty moves that kept them on their toes all night. After the game Head Coach

JP Dolliver said his Eagles knew they were going to have to rise to the occasion this week after everyone felt the sting of week 1's defeat.

"Our guys knew that we suffered a lot of injuries in week 1 and so they were going to have to be ready to step up and rise to the challenge and be prepared to play hard."

The same Eagles team that had scored no points in week 1

## Andrew Grant Continues Town Hall Series

Still No Word from  
Bera on Debates

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Congressional candidate Andrew Grant, Republican challenger to Ami Bera, continued his Town Hall series Tuesday night at Arden-Dimick Library in Sacramento.

The town hall events give voters an opportunity to hear directly from Grant on his candidacy and his agenda for Congress.

They also allow for open dialogue with voters to hear their questions and concerns.

With incumbent Ami Bera continuing to avoid Grant's debate challenge, this dialogue is something Grant feels

has been lacking. Grant has invited incumbent Congressman Ami Bera to hold five debates in advance of the November election, but Bera has refused to commit to dates. In 2012, Bera challenged then-Congressman Dan Lungren to multiple debates saying, "Now is not the time for the politics of division, but rather the time for a clear exchange of ideas on how we begin to move forward as a region, state and nation."

Bera has been a representative of California's 7th Congressional District since 2013. He previously served as associate dean for admissions at the UC Davis School of Medicine as well as the Chief Medical Officer for the County of Sacramento.

Grant is a business leader and former intelligence officer, who served in combat as a Marine, a senior official in the U.S. State Department, and for the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

# Cake4Kids Now Baking in Sacramento

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - A baker's dozen is thirteen as the cake enthusiasts who attended Cake4Kids' orientation at Arcade library on Saturday, August 18 know. This second orientation in the Sacramento region for the Sunnyvale-based nonprofit drew bakers of all backgrounds and ages hailing from Carmichael, Arden Arcade, Rancho Cordova, Elk Grove, Rancho Murieta and beyond to learn more about Cake4Kids.

Mary Barnes, Cake4Kids' Sacramento ambassador, led the hour long program. Barnes is a Sacramento native who first discovered the group when she lived in San Francisco. When she returned to Sacramento to pursue her legal career she wanted to bring the program with her and spoke about why she chose the eastern part of Sacramento.

"We thought about logistics," she said, "An area where there were a good number of residential areas to pull volunteers from."

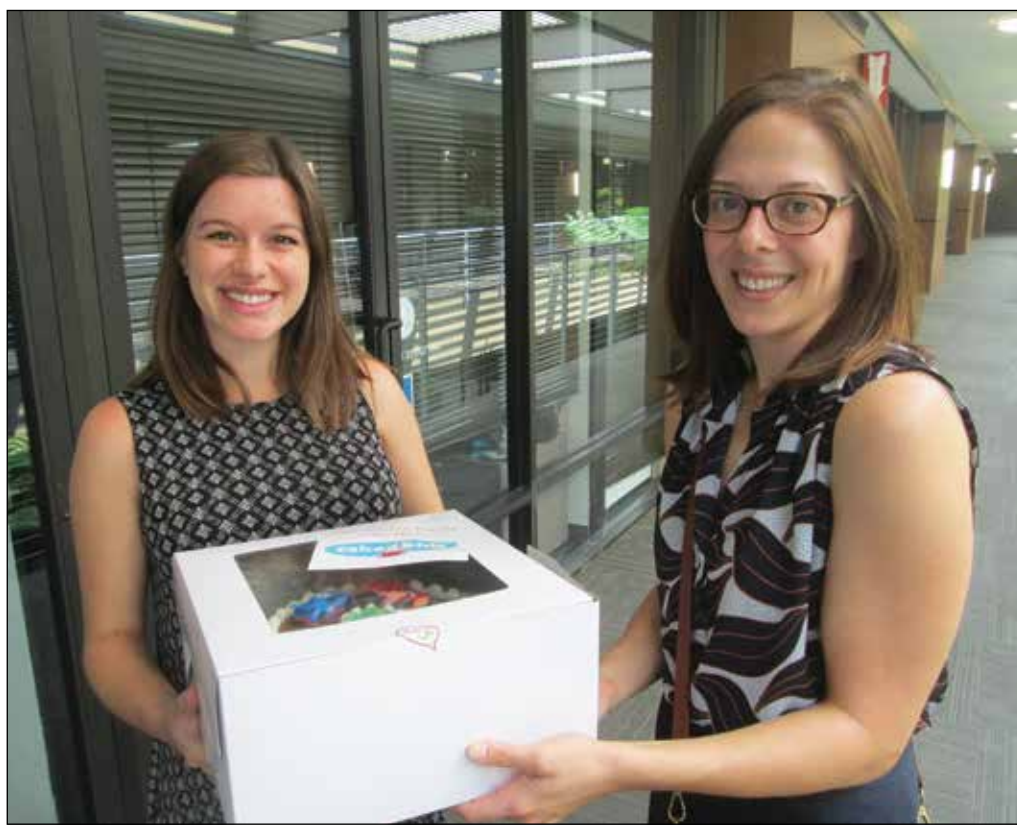
This area, she explained, is close to freeways, homes, several nonprofits serving the demographic that Cake4Kids supports - homeless, recent immigrants, those in foster care, and victims of human trafficking - and it doesn't cost money for parking so that left downtown and midtown out of the running.

"It is supported by Carmichael, east Sacramento, Sac State students, and ARC students. We thought it was a good location to start because of all of those factors."

In addition to being the nonprofit's Sacramento ambassador and tackling the job of finding volunteers, contacting agencies, and filling requests, Barnes, like other volunteers, works full time. She is also a volunteer baker and delivered the first cake in Sacramento to Opening Doors, an organization that serves individuals and families escaping human trafficking and refugees new to the area. She baked a vegan banana cake for a boy and decorated the cake with a racecar theme, complete with toy cars atop a protective layer of marzipan, and topped with vegan chocolate frosting.

"We have several requests for vegan cakes from this organization. We're challenging our bakers right away," said Barnes, adding that all requests had been claimed and filled since the first orientation in July with twenty attendees.

In 2010, Cake4Kids was born. Only thirteen cakes were baked and delivered that year. Fast forward eight years when more than 10,000 cakes have been baked and delivered by volunteers as far south as San Diego. The nonprofit also serves Fresno, Marin, Monterey, Napa, San Mateo, and five other California counties.

Each cake is prepared from scratch especially for the child, decorated, packaged in a cake box, and delivered to the requesting agency. Although volunteers never meet the children, they often receive thanks from the children or, in some cases, from the parents or caregivers.

Before volunteer bakers can claim cakes, they must attend a mandatory orientation where they'll learn about the organization, the demographic served, logistics, and resources. One of the volunteer benefits is that each baker may take cake decorating classes and be reimbursed for up to \$100.00 each year. The ability to be a fabulous decorator is not a requirement, although some cakes are quite lavish. Each cake, she added, must have the child's name.

During the orientation, Barnes said that 60,000 children are in foster care and only 5% between 15 and 18 years of age are adopted in California. Nearly 30 percent of children are homeless in the United States, and Barnes referenced the thousands of U.S. based human trafficking cases annually. These are some of the at-risk children Cake4Kids serves.

Julie Eades, the organization's executive director, attended the inaugural orientation in July and said in a telephone interview that, "When you're on or near the poverty line, a cake might not be the thing you choose to

spend your money on. We talk about the fact that these children get moved from home to home and sometimes they don't get any birthday celebrations. Not because nobody cares. It's just one thing extra that people caring for them have to think about."

Cake4Kids serves children and young adults up to the age of 24 and Eades said that some children as old as twenty have never had a cake before the one baked and delivered by a volunteer. She also said that the older children are extremely appreciative of the cake made just for them. Everyone should feel special one day a year.

Men, women, and children 16 years and older interested in baking cakes and bringing joy to a child should sign up to be a volunteer on the organization's website. Sacramento orientations will be held through December at Arcade and Arden-Dimick libraries. The goal is to have 100 volunteers on board. On October 20 and December 22, orientations will be held at Arcade library on Marconi from 12:30 p.m. - 1:30 p.m. On November 10, Arden-Dimick will host from 12:30 p.m. - 1:30 p.m. The September orientation date and location has not been set. # Record Set for Monthly Traffic at SMF in July

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Sacramento International Airport recorded 1.1 million passengers in July 2018, making it the busiest month in airport history. The airport expects to serve one million passengers each month through the end of 2018 and is on track to serve an estimated 12 million passengers this year, another record-breaking milestone.

Passenger traffic at Sacramento International Airport has shown a robust increase of 11.8 percent in July 2018 over the same time period in July 2017. The busiest month on record previously was July 2007, when the airport served 1.013 million passengers.

"We are encouraged by this growth and by our customer's response, making Sacramento International Airport an attractive airport for continued growth," said Mark Haneke, manager of air service development and marketing for the Sacramento County Department of Airports.

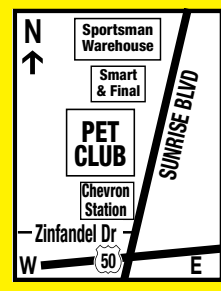
The increase stems from Sacramento regionally-generated passenger response to the addition of several destinations and carriers at Sacramento International Airport, including:

- New nonstop service to Austin, St. Louis, Orlando, New Orleans\*, and Cabo San Lucas on Southwest. (\*New Orleans service was temporarily suspended in August but returns on a daily basis in November)
- The return of ultra-low cost carrier Frontier Airlines with service to Las Vegas and Denver
- The return of international carrier Air Canada with nonstop service to Vancouver

# DA Anne Marie Schubert Announces Success of Summer Youth Shadow Days

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announces the success of the Criminal Justice Youth Shadow Days, and the first-ever Crime Lab Youth Shadow Days.

Launched in 2015, the Criminal Justice Youth Shadow Day is a program in partnership with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, Sacramento County Probation Department, Public Defender's Office and Sacramento Superior Court.

High school students job shadow professionals from various criminal justice agencies. Based on their interest, students are paired with prosecuting attorneys, defense attorneys, probation officers, law enforcement officers, investigators and judges to get a first-hand look at the criminal justice process and the different roles within the system. There is also a presentation on crime scene investigations (CSI), evidence collection and forensic science used to solve crimes. At the end of the day, a career fair

is held with various agencies represented.

The Criminal Justice Youth Shadow Day was held on June 15, 2018, with 110 students from 70 high schools participating. Due to the high level of interest, a second shadow day was held on August 3, 2018, with another 103 students from 40 high schools. There is a student waitlist for next year.

A first-ever Crime Lab Youth Shadow Day was also launched this year. Students visit the District Attorney's Crime Lab and meet with criminalists who are experts in the various fields of forensic science and crime scene investigations (CSI). They are provided a hands-on learning experience in areas including blood spatter analysis, bullet trajectory, trace evidence, firearms and tool comparison, drug analysis, toxicology and a mock field sobriety and breath alcohol test.

The Crime Lab Youth Shadow Day was held on July 27, 2018. Within a few days of announcing the new program, it exceeded student capacity

with 80 students from 32 high schools participating. A second shadow day was held on August 24, 2018, with an additional 40 students from 22 high schools.

"I'm excited about the overwhelming interest and great success we have with our youth programs," said DA Schubert. "Thanks to our criminal justice and community organization partners, we will continue these innovative programs to engage students from neighborhoods across the county and inspire them to pursue a career in the criminal justice field."

The District Attorney's Office is now accepting applications for its 4th Annual Youth Academy. For more information and to apply, visit [www.sacda.org](http://www.sacda.org). Deadline is September 7.

got out to a red hot start with the ball in week 2.

It began in the first half with the misdirection Williams took to the house, and listed at 220 lbs., it was safe to say no one wanted any part of him coming downhill as he barrel rolled into the end zone for a touchdown.

"They think they can take me down with one guy," Williams said after the game. "I'm like, you can try."

Then there was the other big play. With the Eagles up 7-6 and in possession of the ball

around the Bella Vista 40 in the second quarter, Ortega hit Harris on what looked to be a slant route on the left side of the field in the flats. Harris juke and then cut back into the middle of the field with a burst of speed and looked to be engulfed by defenders but proceeded to pop up out of the pile and take off towards the opposite side of the field and scamper into the end zone.

"I just saw open field and I knew I had to get there," said Harris about his spectacular dash.

For Harris and the Eagles

this win was a remarkable feeling after the disappointment they felt in week 1; a total turnaround in a two week process.

"We just knew 45-0 that wasn't us," said Harris.

"We know that we are the type of team that's capable of playing much better and tonight we came out and executed the way we knew we were capable of."

El Camino will look to keep their season on the rise when they take on Woodcreek at home this Friday at 7:30 pm. ★

of geography shows the solar system in relationship to Planet Earth. He plans a separate future work illustrating native American life before missionaries and miners arrived.

Though Kocina was paid for his five-summer project, the tableaux are still works of passion. "At first, I tried to keep my art simple," he recalls. "I began with only one person in my geometry design. By the final mural, I was working on an epic. I used as many people, animals and

symbols as I could. Every man, woman or child in all five works is a likeness of someone affiliated to this school."

"Planning the last mural, was like casting a play," he says. "I had to find 23 people with face and body types to match monks, miners, a Mexican senorita and the goddess Minerva from our State seal." One of Kocina's daughters became his goddess and even constructed body armor for reference photos. Near Minerva's spear-point, the artist himself peeps Kilroy-like

over the California state line. "Hardly anybody's noticed me yet," he says. "But I'm there as a final signature. I like to conceal objects in my painting to give the kids an extra layer of interest when they're poring over it. My face is an extra Easter egg."

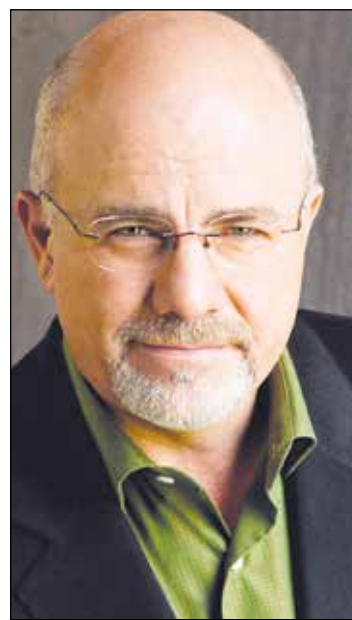

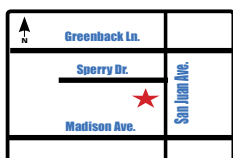

### WHY DID THEY CANCEL FACE OFF?

**Question:** Do you know why Syfy is ending *Face Off*? I thought it was really original and fun to watch. —Laura  
**Matt Roush:** This was always among my favorite reality-competition series, and I'm going to miss it. To answer your question, I'll reference an excellent report from reality-TV expert Andy Dehnart, which boils down to the usual reason for

cancellation—declining ratings—as well as an apparent shift in programming priorities at an ever-evolving Syfy. I also think Syfy erred in past years by running the seasons too close to each other—in 2017, the 11th and 12th seasons were barely separated by a month—and may have burned out the franchise a bit. I'm hoping Syfy will reconsider once some time has passed, and maybe revive the show on a less frequent basis with

even higher production values (as befits the trade of fantasy make-up the show celebrates). I also need judge Ve Neill to get her own show. I think I'll miss her warmth, humor and wisdom most of all.

## Sacramento County DA Reports



### Defendant Sentenced for Foothill Farms Murder

**DATE:** August 17, 2018  
**CASE:** Robert Gene McCormack (Case #16FE012920)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Omar Singh, Homicide Unit  
The Honorable Pamela Smith-Stewart sentenced Robert Gene McCormack to 66 years to life in prison. On July 26, 2018, a jury convicted McCormack of the second-degree murder of Kert Lackey and for being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true the allegation that McCormack personally discharged a firearm causing death. The Court found true that McCormack has a prior 1998 strike conviction for assault with a deadly weapon.

Robert McCormack and his girlfriend invited her ex-boyfriend, Kert Lackey, to their house for dinner. That night, McCormack overheard a loud conversation between his girlfriend and Mr. Lackey. McCormack struck Mr. Lackey twice in the head with an aluminum bat. When Mr. Lackey attempted to fight back, McCormack barricaded himself in the house. Mr. Lackey walked down the driveway toward his car, McCormack exited the house with a loaded 9mm semi-automatic handgun and shot Mr. Lackey seven times. Mr. Lackey died immediately at the scene.

### Massage Therapist Convicted of Sexually Assaulting Clients

**DATE:** August 20, 2018  
**CASE:** Thomas Self (Case #16FE010737)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit  
Thomas Self was convicted by a jury of multiple felony and misdemeanor counts of sexually assaulting three women at his massage therapist business.

Self is a well-known massage therapist who had businesses in Orangeville and Folsom. He specialized in massaging runners and other athletes throughout the Sacramento and Placer region. On August 5, 2015, a female victim received a sports massage from Self. He told the victim he "referred pain," meaning he would work on one area of the body to alleviate symptoms in another area of the body. During the massage, Self then sexually assaulted her with his fingers. On March 12, 2016, a second victim had a sports massage from Self. During the massage, Self sexually assaulted her with his finger. On August 2, 2016, a third victim had an externship with Self through her school and was in training to become a massage therapist. During the training, Self demonstrated massage techniques on her body, touched the victim under her underwear and made sexually suggestive comments. For extended periods of the training, Self was nude.

Self faces a maximum sentence of 11 years and 4 months in prison. Sentencing is set for September 28, 2018, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 24 before the Honorable Shelleyanne Chang.

### Defendant Sentenced to Life Without Parole for Murder, Sexual Assault of 6-Year-Old Girl

**DATE:** August 21, 2018  
**CASE:** Juan Rivera & Lisa Burton (Case #15F03256)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Supervising Deputy District Attorney Chris Ore, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit  
The Honorable Steve White sentenced Juan Rivera to life in prison without the possibility of parole. On June 18, 2018, Rivera pled guilty to murdering 6-year-old Jadianna and the special circumstance he committed the murder while engaged in committing a lewd or lascivious act on her. He also pled guilty to committing lewd acts with a child under 14 years of age.

Juan Rivera took custody of Jadianna after he convinced her mother to leave Jadianna for medical reasons. On May 27 and 28 of 2015, Rivera sexually assaulted Jadianna and inflicted blunt force trauma on her, which resulted in her death. Rivera then drove to Glenn County, where he burned Jadianna's body. Rivera feigned a seizure before notifying the police that Jadianna had gone missing. Rivera's mother, Lisa Burton, aided her son after the killing by providing him with a stolen vehicle to transport Jadianna's body.

On April 21, 2017, Burton pled guilty to being an accessory after the fact to murder and vehicle theft. She was sentenced to 3 years in prison.

### Defendant Sentenced for Murder, Attempted Murders

**DATE:** August 24, 2018  
**CASE:** Dashawn Tinsley & RV Watson Jr. (Case #16FE016082)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Satnam Rattu, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

The Honorable Curtis Fiorini sentenced Dashawn Tinsley to 141 years to life in prison. On June 5, 2018, Dashawn Tinsley and RV Watson Jr. were convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of Andrew VanHunnik and three counts of premeditated attempted murder.

On December 24, 2015, one victim drove to his mother's Citrus Heights home. As he exited his car, he was shot three times and suffered a broken left arm from one of the bullets. On December 28, 2015, law enforcement responded to a shooting in Citrus Heights and found a car riddled with bullets. Inside the car was Mr. VanHunnik, who was deceased from multiple gun shots. Two other victims who were also in the car survived. One victim escaped the car after being shot five times, and the second victim escaped without being shot. Detectives were able to locate witnesses and physical evidence which established both Tinsley and Watson as the shooters in the murder and the earlier attempted murder.

Watson faces a maximum sentence of 192 years to life in prison. His sentencing is set for September 28, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 26 before the Honorable Curtis Fiorini. ★

# Appellate Court Ordered Governor Brown to Return 'Unlawfully Diverted' Subprime Crisis Funds

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Gov. Jerry Brown was recently ordered by the state's 3rd Appellate District Court to repay more than \$331 million in funds the state illegally diverted from a national fund intended to help homeowners struggling with foreclosures from the housing crisis. Instead of complying with the court order, Democrats are pushing through a bill to legitimize the theft of funds.

The Assembly already passed Assembly Bill 1829, which makes the statutory changes related to the National Mortgage justifying this theft. AB 1829 was passed on a party line in the Senate Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review, 12 - 5, with all Republicans on the committee voting no.

#### Bill Analysis reports:

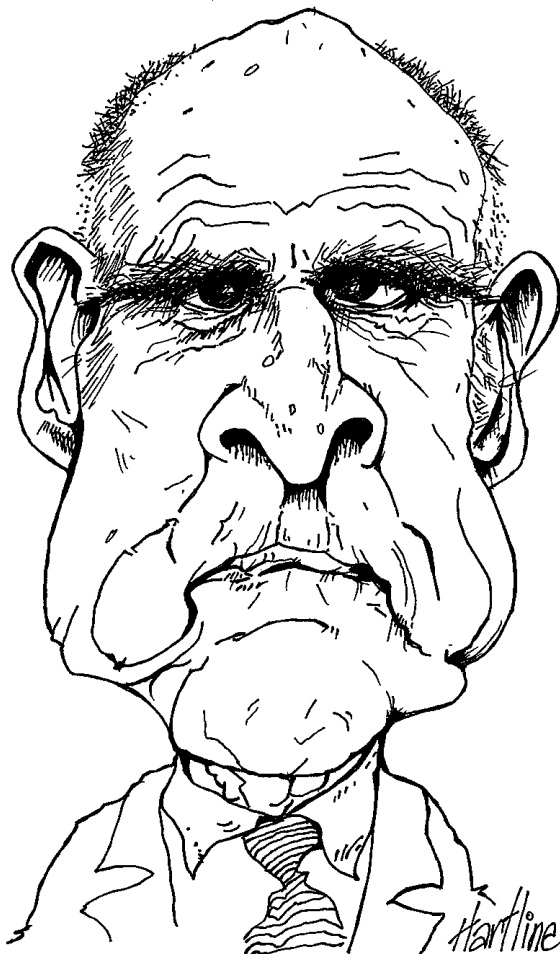
In 2012, the federal government and 49 states sued, and eventually settled with, the five largest mortgage servicers in the country related to their actions leading up to and during the 2008 financial crisis. The resulting National Mortgage Settlement (NMS) resulted in comprehensive

new mortgage servicing standards, provided more than \$20 billion in financial relief for homeowners damaged by the mortgage crisis, and provided about \$2.5 billion directly to states for a variety of uses, including "to compensate the states for costs resulting from the alleged unlawful conduct of the [bank defendants]." California's share of this \$2.5 billion was roughly \$410 million. Under the terms of the settlement, each state's Attorney General would designate the uses of the funds. The California Attorney General's Office designated allowable uses of the received funds.

"California received approximately \$410 million of the \$2.5 billion paid to the states by the big five mortgage servicers - Ally (formerly GMAC), Bank of America, Citigroup, JPMorgan Chase and Wells Fargo - under a National Mortgage Settlement (NMS) with the federal government, the ruling states," Legal NewsLine reported.

Under then-California Attorney General Kamala Harris, the National Mortgage Special Deposit Fund was established in 2012 to directly help homeowners who suffered and were impacted by the housing crisis.

However, the money was "unlawfully diverted" to the general fund, affirming a lower court's ruling in a case taken against the state by the National Asian American Coalition, COR Community Development Corp. and the National Hispanic Christian Leadership Conference. Upon receiving the funds Governor Brown's administration raided \$331 million dollars from it and spent it backfilling budget deficits in various agencies.

#### Legal NewsLine explains:

The money was to be placed in each state's NMS Deposit Fund and the attorneys general were charged with setting the parameters of how it could be spent, with the states ordered to comply. Then-Attorney General Kamala Harris drew up a set of instructions on how the money could be used.

But the legislature then passed an act setting up the special deposit fund, which included a provision that allowed 90 percent of the money to be diverted to the general fund, regardless of Harris' instructions. A total of \$331 million was sent to the

state's main fund.

Harris instructed that the money be spent, among other elements, on the administration and monitoring of the compliance elements of the agreement, supporting relief programs, ongoing investigations and enforcement, borrower relief, funds for legal aid and grants.

In 2014 a coalition of minority counseling groups sued Gov. Jerry Brown and his Department of Finance, accusing them of illegally diverting the NMSDF relief funds. In June 2015 a Sacramento County Superior Court Judge ruled that the funds were indeed "unlawfully

transferred and must be returned." And the 3rd Appellate District Court upheld the lower court's decision. However, the Legislature is ignoring the Appellate Court ruling.

Apparently, those Senate Democrats who voted to pass the bill were apparently okay with taking money that was specifically intended for homeowners damaged in the housing crisis. Senate Democrats just turned their back on all the damaged California homeowners who lost so much during the housing crisis.

California continues to suffer from a housing crisis because of a lack of affordability. AB 1829 is not simply a clarification of legislative intent; it is a shameless theft by this administration of money intended for the California homeowners whom the funds were intended to help.

Specifically, the settlement funds would have directly helped many California homeowners, including low-income families and people of color. Ironically, Democrats stood side-by-side with "Occupy" groups, proclaiming their outrage over the actions of "Big Banks" and "Wall Street" which hurt homeowners in California. The Legislature is also thumbing its nose at the judicial system. Over the years there have been many sneaky, back-room and duplicitous actions perpetrated on the people of California by the governor and Democrat-controlled Legislature. But stealing money intended to help people damaged by what Democrats called "predatory lenders" and "Wall Street" in order to bail out the gross abuses by the Governor's and Legislature's wasteful and spending is probably among the lowest actions.

Now, when the illegal diversion of funds have been called

out by the courts and this Legislature has a chance to make things right, Democrats not only can't acknowledge the wrongness of their diversion, they're actually seeking to legitimize it.

In a unanimous opinion authored by Judge Andrea Lynn Hoch, the appeals court largely affirmed but remanded the case to a trial court with an order to issue a writ of mandate "directing the immediate re-transfer from the general fund to the NMS Deposit Fund the sum of \$331,044,084," Legal NewsLine said.

After this "reclassification" of intent, the State will probably appeal to the California Supreme Court. ★
