

- National Junior Men's Tennis Champion Jenson (J.T.) Brooksby barely recalls the first time he played tennis. "I was four years old," he says. "I knew I liked grabbing a racquet and hitting a ball."

ISIS Member Arrested on Eastern Avenue

Held in Sacramento County Without Bail

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Last week the FBI arrested an ISIS member wanted for the murder of an Iraqi police officer in June of 2014. The suspect, Omar Abdulsattar Ameem, 45, is also connected to other acts of terrorism and terrorist organizations. Federal Agents, with the aid of the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department and Metro Fire, raided an apartment in the Eastern Villa complex on Eastern Avenue on the morning of Wednesday, August 15.

"Ameen, originally of Rawah, in the Anbar province of Iraq, fled Iraq following the alleged murder, and later settled in Sacramento as a purported refugee," according to an official US Department of Justice release. "It is alleged that Ameen's family supported and assisted the installation of al-Qaeda in Iraq (AQI) in Rawah, and that Ameen was a member of AQI and ISIS. It is also alleged that he participated in various activities in support of those terrorist organizations, including helping to plant improvised explosive devices, and committing the murder that is the subject of the extradition request. Ameen concealed his membership in those terrorist groups when he applied for refugee status, and later when he applied for a green card in the United States."

The FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force has been investigating Ameen since 2016 for suspected violations, including fraud and misuse of visa, permits and other documents.

According to reports, Iraqi authorities want US officials to allow Ameen to be extradited back to his home country to face charges that could result in the death penalty. Ameen is currently being held in Sacramento County without bail and is seen as a flight risk and a danger to society.

Six District Attorneys Unite to Consolidate Golden State Killer Case in Sacramento County

13 Additional Felony Counts of Murder with Special Circumstances Charges Filed

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -

Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced today that the case against Joseph James DeAngelo, 72, Citrus Heights, will be prosecuted jointly in Sacramento County, where the defendant is being housed after his arrest on April 24, 2018. This joint prosecution will involve Contra Costa, Orange, Sacramento, Santa Barbara, Tulare, and Ventura Counties. An amended complaint charging all crimes together in one case, as well as 13 counts of kidnapping to commit robbery, was filed today in Sacramento Superior Court.

DeAngelo now faces 13 felony counts of murder with special circumstances allegations of multiple murders, murder during the commission of rape, robbery, and burglary. DeAngelo was charged today in an amended complaint with 13 felony counts of kidnapping to commit robbery with sentencing enhancements for personal use of a firearm



and personal use of a knife during the commission of the offenses. He faces a minimum sentence of life in state prison without the possibility of parole. DeAngelo is expected to appear in Sacramento County for arraignment on Thursday, August 23rd at 1:30 p.m. in Department 61.

In announcing this decision, District Attorney Schubert stated, "The joining of this case in one county is in the best interest of victims, the efficiency of the case and the fair administration of justice. I look forward to all counties working together collaboratively in seeking justice in this case."

Exhibiting at this business expo helps SMUD grow its pool of qualified potential contractors and helps business owners learn how to maneuver the state's certification program, a win-win for both. "SMUD also realizes reciprocal benefits by promoting the economic development of its customers who own the company," added Capra.

Continued from page 1 new places and I started to think about tennis as a career."

One match at a time, that dream is coming true. The 17-year-old Carmichael athlete recently beat 256 others to the top of his national division. Beyond trophies, the victor's big prize is to cross racquets with some of the world's best players when he debuts as a "wild card" entry in the US Open Tennis Championships this month. On the hallowed courts of Flushing Meadows, the teenager will experience international competition at its toughest. "It's an amazing feeling," he says. "I've never played at this level before. This is what I've been training hard for – for a very long time.'

Jenson has come far from preschool tuition at Arcade's Rio del Oro Racquet Club. Early regarded as a prodigy, he's had five lessons a week since the age of seven. These days, he plays four hours of tennis daily and works out in a gym for another hour. To accommodate the regime, he's been homeschooled since sixth grade.

"Learning at home teaches you to manage your time," says the student whose homework gets done in airports and hotel rooms. "You miss out on the social aspect of school, but I still interact with other tennis players – male and female." Dating, he considers, can wait till college.

Following offers from many top US schools, he recently accepted a full athletic scholarship from Texas Christian University. For now, graduating high school is a priority. Jenson is a straight-A student who learns online for four hours a day; his other classroom is a hard court at Arden Hills Resort, Carmichael. Here Joseph Gilbert – regarded as one of the top junior coaches in the US runs the JMG Academy for 40 teenagers who aspire to play college and pro tennis.

"Jenson is one of the most competitive kids I've ever taught, says Gilbert. "His ability to focus for long periods sets him apart. There's an innocent side to him: he's good-hearted and always wants to do the right thing. Off-court, he's laid back; once he's on-court, his intensity takes over. In Flushing, I just want him to soak up the atmosphere, enjoy the moment and have this level of competition as a consistent goal."

Coach Gilbert will accompany Jenson to New York. Anesthesiologist dad Glen Brooksby and equestrian mom Tania will also join the pilgrimage. "My parents are a huge part of my dream," says their only child. "For so many years of tournaments, mom and dad have traveled with me. They're at least as important to my success as my coach. Every match I've won, they've won it with me."

Along with his opportunity to face international professionals next week, Jenson will also compete in the US Open junior championships. As a "wild card" entry to the main event, he does not yet know whom he will meet on court. "Whoever it is, I'm ready to test myself," he predicts. "I'm not focused on the results. I'm focused on improving my game."

The US Open Tennis Championships run from August 27 to September 9. ★

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - A home loss at Del Campo is something Mike Dimino and his team were not used to last season, but it was something they had to get used to during Friday night's 51-15 loss to Merced. The Cougars were undefeated at home last season, which included a 41-14 victory over Merced to start the year.

But from the opening kickoff Merced's offense posed a problem for Del Campo's defense as they got out to a hot start in the first quarter, scoring back to back touchdowns to jump out to an early 14-0 lead. By the second quarter Merced's offense was in hot pursuit while Del Campo's inability to take care of the football was on full display.

Following Dhameer Warren's 20 yard touchdown pass to Noah Leaf to make it 31-7 Merced, Del Campo proceeded to muff the kickoff, which Merced recovered. One play later Warren struck again, connecting with Xavier Stewart from 26 yards out to make it 37-7 going into half.

The second half wasn't much different for the Cougars.

Following the game longtime Del Campo Head Coach Mike Dimino was not amused at his team's inability to protect the pigskin.

"They literally got two touchdowns in 23 seconds, one touchdown in five seconds," said Dimino.

"I can honestly say that's never happened to one of my football teams before."

There were times when the running game for Del Campo looked solid and gave them the ability to potentially put the ball in the end zone. Yet the offense misfired numerous times in the passing game inside and around the twenty yard line, which included a handful of picks that stalled drives and gave Merced the ball back.

Postgame, Dimino, alongside numerous senior players and assistant coaches, gave heartfelt speeches to the team that preached the importance of not quitting and playing hard until the final whistle blows. Body language came into play after the 37-7 halftime deficit.

"We have to be better and will be better," said Dimino postgame.

Del Campo looks to rebound in two weeks after a Week 2 bye when they take on McQueen High School on the road. ★





Defendant Convicted for Murdering Jail Cellmate

DATE: August 16, 2018 **CASE:** Richard Russell Harden (Case #09F01356)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Satnam Rattu, Homicide Unit

Richard Russell Harden was convicted by a jury of the second-degree murder of Evaristo Ramirez and assault with a deadly

On February 16, 2009, Richard Harden walked into the Home Depot on Folsom Blvd. and attacked an employee with a hammer. Harden was booked into jail and placed in a cell with Evaristo Ramirez. The next day, Ramirez was found unresponsive in the cell. An autopsy revealed that Ramirez was strangled to death and had multiple blunt force injuries to his head and torso.

Harden faces a maximum sentence of 19 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for September 14, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 19 before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle.

Defendant Sentenced for Series of Armed Robberies

DATE: August 17, 2018 CASE: Taher Farraj (Case #17FE007880)

The Honorable Tami Bogert sentenced Taher Farraj to 31 years and 8 months in prison. On June 6, 2018, a jury convicted Farraj of three counts of robbery. The jury also found true gun use and intentional discharge of a firearm allegations. Prior to trial, Farraj pled to being a felon in possession of a firearm and being a felon in possession of ammunition.

On April 15, April 18 and April 24 of 2017, Farraj robbed the same convenience store on Fruitridge Road while armed. Farraj would either ask for change or make a purchase to get the clerks to open the cash register. He would then pull out a silver revolver and grab money from the registers. During one of the robberies, Farraj fired the gun off at the store ceiling. The three robberies were captured on surveillance cameras inside the store. A probation search of Farraj's residence and car revealed clothing that matched the clothes worn by the suspect during the robberies and a .22 caliber silver revolver, which was loaded with 6 rounds.

Farraj has prior convictions for being a felon in possession of a firearm and the sale/transport of marijuana.

Gang Members Convicted of Gun Possession

DATE: August 20, 2018

CASE: Raheem Thomas, Adrien Hines,

Isaiah Taylor (Case #18FE002528 **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Nicholas Johnson, Targeting Armed Recidivist

Gang Enforcement Team (TARGET)
Raheem Thomas and Adrien Hines were convicted by a jury of being a felon in possession of a firearm with a gang enhancement. Isaiah Taylor was convicted of unlawful possession of a firearm with a gang enhancement.

On February 7, 2018, Sacramento County sheriff's deputies had information that Raheem Thomas had an outstanding warrant. When deputies contacted Thomas, he was in the driver's seat of a parked vehicle. When they went to remove Thomas from the vehicle, they found a semiautomatic handgun on the front passenger floorboard. The firearm was fully loaded with a round in the chamber. Thomas later stated that he was a gang member, but denied knowing about the firearm. Adrien Hines and Isaiah Taylor were with Thomas at the time. Hines later gave a statement that the gun will have his DNA and fingerprints on it, but denied owning, using or knowing it was in the vehicle. Deputies also found a firearm in Taylor's front left pocket. The firearm was fully loaded with a round in the chamber. Taylor later gave a statement admitting the gun was his, and that he was a gang member.

Additional allegations that Thomas has a prior 2016 conviction for carrying a concealed gun for the benefit of a criminal street gang and that Hines has a prior 2016 conviction for discharging a firearm at an unoccupied vehicle and a prior 2014 conviction for inflicting corporal injury on spouse will be determined at the sentencing hearing.

Thomas faces a maximum sentence of 17 years in prison. Hines faces a maximum sentence of 16 years in prison. Taylor faces a maximum sentence of 7 years in prison. Sentencing for Thomas and Taylor is set for September 12, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. Hines will be sentenced on October 5, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. Both sentencings will be in Department 39 before the Honorable David Abbott. ★



Larger emergency fund?

Dear Dave,

My wife and I are following your plan, and we just paid off all our debt except for the house. Since we work for the same company, do you think we should have an emergency fund that is larger than you normally recommend?

-Don

Dear Don,

That's great news! You've finished Baby Step 2, and now you're ready for Baby Step 3, which is fully-funding your emergency fund.

I don't see a reason to set aside more than six months of expenses. My recommended range for an emergency fund is three to six months of expenses. If your employment situation is one where there's more risk of something going wrong, you should lean toward saving six months' worth. If your employment outlook is really stable,

Dave Says you can go with setting aside repossess if the borrower three or four months of expenses

in an emergency fund.

I look at your situation as being more high-risk. You each have jobs, so that's the good news. But if the company went down, or experienced layoffs, you could find yourselves unemployed at the same time. My advice would be to save up six months of expenses for your emergency fund. With that kind of cash just sitting there, you should be able to make an easier and less stressful transition in almost any kind of unemployment scenario or other emergency.

Secured vs. unsecured debt?

Dear Dave,

What exactly is unsecured debt, and how is it different from secured debt? - Rich

Dear Rich,

"Unsecured" debt generally means someone loaned you money, but they don't have a lien on anything. Credit cards and student loans are examples of unsecured debt, because there's nothing they can directly

doesn't pay. However, they can sue you if you don't pay, and get a lien against something after they sue you. In some cases, this is done against your income by garnishing your wages.

Some examples of "secured" debt would be things like a home mortgage or car loan. A home mortgage loan is secured by the home. If you don't pay, they can foreclose and take the house. The same is true with a car loan. If you don't make the payments, they can take the car.

Typically, unsecured debts will be the last debts you pay if you're in financial trouble. You'd make the car payment before paying on your student loan, and you'd make your house payment before paying on a credit card.



USDA Forest Service Announces New Strategy for Improving Forest Conditions

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Forest Service (USFS) announced today a new strategy for managing catastrophic wildfires and the impacts of invasive species, drought, and insect and disease epidemics.

Specifically, a new report titled Toward Shared Stewardship across Landscapes: An Outcome-based investment Strategy(PDF, 3.7 MB) outlines the USFS's plans to work more closely with states to identify landscape-scale priorities for targeted treatments in areas with the highest payoffs.

"On my trip to California this week, I saw the devastation that these unprecedented wildfires are having on our neighbors, friends and families," said U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue.

"We commit to work more closely with the states to reduce the frequency and severity of wildfires. We commit to strengthening the stewardship of public and private lands. This report outlines our strategy and intent to help one another prevent wildfire from reaching this level."

Both federal and private managers of forest land face a range of urgent challenges, among them catastrophic wildfires, invasive species, degraded watersheds, and epidemics of forest insects and disease. The conditions fueling these circumstances are not improving. Of particular concern are longer fire seasons, the rising size and severity of wildfires, and the expanding risk to communities, natural resources, and firefighters.

"The challenges before us require a

new approach," said Interim USFS Chief Vicki Christiansen. "This year Congress has given us new opportunities to stand shoulder-to-shoulder with state leaders mitigate to identify land management priorities that include mitigating wildfire risks. We will use all the tools available to us to reduce hazardous fuels, including mechanical treatments, prescribed fire, and unplanned fire in the right place at the right time, to mitigate them."

A key component of the new strategy is to prioritize investment decisions on forest treatments in direct coordination with states using the most advanced science tools. This allows the USFS to increase the scope and scale of critical forest treatments that protect communities and create resilient forests.






