CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Peach pies, peach cakes, peach ice cream and pickled peaches; if it looks, tastes and smells like the fuzzy fruit, it will be procurable at Carmichael's Peach festival on Sunday, August 5.

Hosted by the Farmers Market, the annual celebration usually attracts thousands of fruit lovers to Carmichael Park. Get there early: the market opens at 9 am and tart and vendors quickly sell out of peachy products. The festival includes a dessert contest that annually challenges cooks and judges. Among 2017 entries were traditional cobblers, a boozy tiramisu, zesty crostata, a peachy mousse and cupcakes. "Sampling eight desserts in a row is a tough service," sighed a volunteer adjudicator. "But someone had to do it..."

Contest rules specify peaches must be the main recipe ingredient. Other than that, anything goes and creativity is among judging criteria. Entries must be presented by 12 noon on festival day (pre-registration is encouraged via the market's website).

In contrast with culinary finesse, peach-eating races produce many gooey faces. "It's our most popular contest," says Farmers Market co-founder Marie Hall. "Entrants try to down 13 ounces of peaches and cream without using their hands. Six to 60-year-olds compete but we give the little ones a head-start. It's fun to watch all those faces planted in plates. Everyone comes up covered in cream."

Covered California to Increase Rates

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Covered California announced last week that 2019 premiums are going up once again. The 8.7% average increase marks the fifth consecutive year of rising health plans.

"The proposed rates, negotiated with Covered California and filed Thursday with regulators and subject to their final review, mean those who receive a subsidy to help purchase coverage will pay an average of 6 percent more if they renew in the same plan next year, which translates to an estimated monthly premium of \$123 after tax credits," according to an official statement from California Covered. "Subsidized consumers account for 88 percent of Covered California's enrollment, and those subsidies rise along with rates to help offset any increases."

With rising costs and the zeroing out of the federal penalty for not enrolling in coverage, an estimated 260,000 people in California are expected to drop health coverage in 2019, according to Covered California Executive Director Peter Lee. This includes approximately 160,000 people who buy insurance through Covered California and an additional 100,000 people who buy directly from insurers.

Covered California claims the largest reason for another increase in premiums is due to the alarming rate of increased medical cost that is far and away outpacing general inflation and wage gains for workers. ★



Chamber Recalls History as Supporters Honored

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Now celebrating a platinum anniversary, the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce recently feted longest-serving supporters. Formed in 1948 by a handful of merchants, the organization has boosted business and community interests for 70 years.

While no founding members surfaced for the awards luncheon, many organizations were applauded for more than 30 years of support. Resident Jack Pefley (94) took top honors for 42 years of membership. Carmichael Water District and Lind Brothers Funeral Home followed with 39 years and 38 years respectively. Sixteen members, including churches, senior homes, service groups and a dance band boasted more than 25 years of membership. At 32 years, Bel Air Grocery is the oldest continuous retailer among Chamber ranks.

Though 70 years is an historic milestone, the chamber has even deeper community roots. It morphed from the Carmichael

Colony Improvement Club, formed by local settlers in 1913. Legendary farmer Mary Deterding was its first president.

Her volunteer roll read like a local street map: Mr. and Mrs. Ed Van Alstine; Mr. and Mrs. A. O. Stanley; Mr. and Mrs.

A.D. MacDonnell; Mr. and Mrs. A.D. Boyer and Mrs. E. Clark. Meetings were convened in barns and sitting rooms; pioneer needs were addressed. Getting electricity and telephone lines to the new colony took major effort and the group lobbied the American Canyon Company for reliable irrigation and household water supply. Road signs were another project for the group (members evidently had few qualms about naming streets for themselves). Colony founder Daniel Carmichael was cajoled to supply wood for signs and land for the first school. Through five decades, efforts by club members brought parks, a library and a post office to the area.

Carmichael population and industry mushroomed after WW II. Town leaders (many of them Improvement Club members) formed a business organization. Their energetic new Chamber of Commerce took over the older club's representation

A World (Language) of Help

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - "Buenos días! Lamentablemente, tienes diverticulitis. Debe comer alimentos ricos en fibra y estará bien."

Imagine knowing no Spanish, yet trying to understand your doctor delivering your test results this way; maybe over the phone. And maybe it's for a family member, and you'll have to do your best to explain.

Understanding the language your health care provider speaks is a key component in the outcome of your treatment, according to a landmark 2002 study by the *Institute of Medicine*. The study was requested by Congress in 1999 in order to assess the extent of disparities in the types and quality of health services received by U.S. racial and ethnic minorities and non-minorities. It concluded that more interpreters should be available in clinics and hospitals to overcome language barriers that may affect the quality of care.

That's where Language World Services Inc. comes in. An interpreting and translation agency that supports over 200 languages, Language World Services employs over 200 people at locations throughout California, as well as a twenty-person call center in Carmichael.

It all started eighteen years ago in a garage.

Language World Services CEO Bill Glasser's life had inadvertently prepared him for this career, though it wasn't always evident. Glasser was born in Spain and raised in LA, where he worked in the heavily Spanish-speaking restaurant industry. Having later moved to Sacramento, Glasser found himself laid off from his job in the Sacramento Bee marketing department, and looking for something to do.

Glasser's friend, who was renting a room from him, had been volunteering as an interpreter at Schreiner's

hospital on Stockton Boulevard. Despite being called in to volunteer more and more frequently, his friend's requests for real full-time work from the hospital were consistently rebuffed. That's when the then-unemployed Glasser recognized the need and started his interpreting business. "We didn't have any standardization of protocols back then," Glasser said of the industry. "It was the wild west."

The majority of Language World Services' work is in health care and human services. "There isn't an unimportant call," says Glasser. "You're getting a cancer diagnosis, learning your child has a birth defect. As a human being you deserve the right to know what's going on with your body."

Immigration naturally plays a huge role in the industry. Glasser's experience in this realm goes as far back as 1986, when he served as an interpreter for a group of lawyers helping to legalize families when President Reagan passed the Immigration Reform and Control Act.

Things can get especially tricky in this current climate. Individuals and their families' stories can be heartbreaking, but interpreters are carefully vetted and trained to not take sides. Still, the human element is always a factor, and Glasser is proud of one example where an Indian family was detained at the border and the detention center called for a Punjabi interpreter—a rarity. Plenty of Spanish-speaking interpreters were provided by other agencies, but Language World Services was the one agency able to supply the Punjabi-speaking family with one. Language World Services has also started a program called Language World Services, which offers volunteer Technological

advances have also altered the translation landscape, though not entirely. Much of the process around the interpreter has become automated, but the actual work is still very low-tech. "A person who speaks two languages brokers the communication," explains Glasser. While technology companies are dropping millions to create AI that can do the work of the interpreter, speech-to-speech recognition, "The delicate and nuanced electronic activity that the human brain does may not get there," Glasser maintains.

And there are plenty of problems that technology can't solve. For instance, among interpreters are harder and harder to come by as they age out of the industry and find new work. Glasser identified young Hmong translators and interpreters as a source of need, and he is always looking to bolster the stable. From first employing form 1099 translators that weren't tested or trained to now fully vetted employees as staff members at places like University of San Francisco and Children's Hospital Oakland, Glasser's focus has always remained on human connection and simplifying the industry. "You understand someone's language, you have the person," says Glasser. "My perfect view is to make interpreting professional, to make it not such an exotic boutique service business, but to make it as simple as calling the geek squad."

Perhaps they can call it the Speak Squad. Then they could tell you, "Good morning! Unfortunately, you have diverticulitis. But if you maintain a high-fiber diet, you'll be just fine."

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - James Radford, founder and CEO of Dignity Home Services, would like to see his new business succeed. In fact, he truly wants to clean up.

The Missouri native specializes in helping homeowners in transition. When an individual is moving out of their home and needs help with the process, Radford is now the one to call in the greater Sacramento area.

Radford says that he sets his business apart from other home cleaning services through a "solid, precise process." In one fell swoop, Radford and his colleagues will haul items for residents, as well as clean carpets and windows.

The amiable man of thirty nine understands that his clients, leaving their homes, are often facing a challenging transition. Radford recognizes their situation and makes it his personal mission to help them any way he can. If needed, he will even assist clients with selling, storing, or disposing items removed from their homes. "I take it from a servant's heart and a servant's approach," Radford maintains.

In this process, he emphasizes an expedient manner of serving them. "We do everything," he proclaims. "What can take people two or three months, we can do in six or seven days."

The job was done in five days and Radford was off and cleaning.

That was last February, and he now employs a crew of 10-12 people. The Dignity in Dignity Home Services extends to Radford's employees as well as his clients. Instead of considering them mere laborers, Radford provides his workers with the opportunity to grow with him. "Everybody's involved in the business," he

asserts. Radford encourages his associates to literally buy into his vision, giving them the option to become stock holders. What's more, he lets them in on the company's internal workings, such as teaching them how to read profit and loss statements.

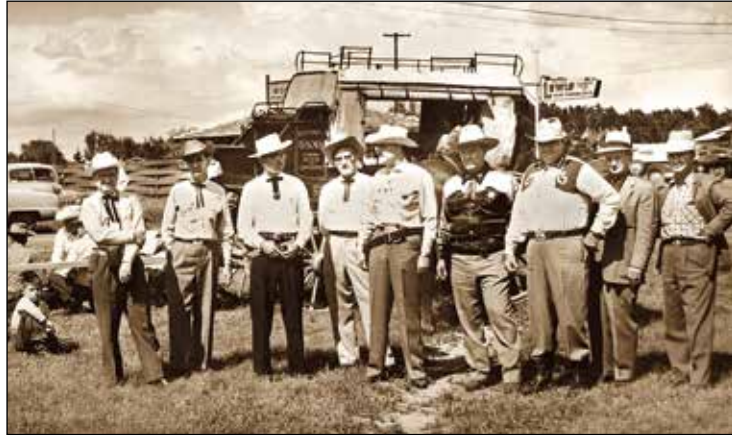

for local interests. An early Chamber inspiration was to make Carmichael a destination; for this, they mooted a Western theme for main street stores.

Merchants eagerly embraced the idea: they strutted around town in cowboy hats and holsters. Frontier facades were erected for stores; wooden planking was laid over sidewalks; rodeos and Western dances were staged in parking lots. A 1953 "Western Days" festival brought thousands to downtown Carmichael. Miss Carmichael beauty pageant contestants posed on wooden fence rails. Though it took off with a yee-hah, the Western concept did not lasso enduring support. Sidewalk planking and hitching rails are long gone. These days, a "Frontier Village" strip mall and the Western Feed Store are lonely vestiges of that quirky merchant ambition.

Where the Chamber failed at establishing a cow town destination, Allan Davis's Milagro restaurant complex now promotes Carmichael as a chow town. The

three-year-old culinary center, coincidentally, now houses the Chamber office and is a major organization sponsor. Like any non-profit, the group has had good years and lean years. With almost 300 members and energetic leadership, the 70-year-old Chamber is now enjoying a revitalization. High-profile events like the "Carmichael Person of the Year" gala and the "Best of Carmichael" – supported by celebrities like radio host Kitty O'Neal, TV host Tina Macuha and basketball legend Vlade

Divac – have recently kept the Chamber conspicuous in public attention. Like the hoary old Carmichael Improvement Club, Chamber members are also lobbying for town needs with a strong voice in Property Business Improvement District (PBID) affairs.

"We're blessed to have so many old and new members," considers Chamber CEO Linda Melody. "Their support is our backbone. We couldn't have our 70th anniversary without their faith in the organization and in Carmichael." ★

All the Right Moves to Protect Us From a Disaster

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The recent Trump Administration decision to fund additional flood protection couldn't come a day sooner. But with the threat of floods and fires raging throughout the state, it is easy to overlook that the Bay Area remains at constant risk from a major earthquake. Along with the tragedy of such a catastrophic event, what impacts the Bay Area directly affects members of our community; almost 90,000 people commute from the Sacramento Region to the Bay Area each day for work.

Given the alarming results of a major disaster in either area, it only makes sense that the federal government move disaster response personnel and material outside of the Bay Area to areas within our region with capable infrastructure and well-insulated from flooding. The U.S. government should move the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Region IX Center from Oakland to Sacramento County - preferably co-located with or near California's

Office of Emergency Services at Mather. The current office, in downtown Oakland, above BART, and atop the Hayward fault - is too vulnerable to withstand a major earthquake; its loss could seriously impact federal assistance.

Co-locating state and federal resources makes economic sense and (importantly) facilitates the critical rule that disasters are local; unless utterly catastrophic, the feds remain a supporting element. With a modern state operations center already in place, federal officials can seamlessly integrate. Material goods and equipment can fly in and stage at Mather's massive airfield. The National Guard, often called upon in disasters, is stationed nearby. Another critical step is relocating federally-controlled disaster support materials from the Bay Area to the Sacramento region, which would ensure these materials are removed from a potential disaster zone and made accessible for victims. The material is now in an equally precarious location, manmade land vulnerable to earthquakes at the base of the San Francisco Bay. Proximity is important, but with San Jose traffic

and vulnerable bridge crossings, flexibility to shift routes is a better bet. With highway 80, 5, and 99, three major airfields, and rail lines, Sacramento is unique in its ability to hold and deliver material to the Bay Area. Given the potentially enormous scale of a response, the Sacramento River could even be used to barge material to anywhere without being disrupted by traffic or a failed part of the infrastructure.

There have been previous failed attempts to move FEMA's resources to our Region. But we cannot wait any longer. Sacramento's economy and job market would undoubtedly benefit from bringing those resources here, while also sharing in the Bay Area's economy and in times of crisis, be its most important partner.

'New Way California' is Wrong Way

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - An odd group of Republican centrists and political has-beens formed New Way California earlier this year. They claim New Way is needed because they are "committed to policies that increase opportunities for all Californians."

As the Los Angeles Times explains in *Schwarzenegger and Kasich back Republicans looking for a 'new way' for California's party*, Mayes "started it after he stepped down as the leader of his Assembly caucus last summer amid criticism for helping Democrats renew California's landmark climate program." New Way is promoting compromise, and expects to "increase opportunities" through compromise — ironic because compromise in politics never means the Left gives something up in negotiations. It's only Republicans who are expected to do the compromising. And that is because this is a group of "centrists." Tell me how lifting up the national economy, lowering unemployment to the lowest level in 50 years (African-American and Hispanic unemployment rates have hit record lows), creating 3 million jobs, lowering taxes, overturning business-killing regulations, addressing illegal immigration and open borders, dealing directly with China and North Korea, and addressing the imbalance in tariffs and trade policies is "partisan." What is happening in the U.S. is good for everyone. These are the policies that need to be emulated in California, and are still advocated by sincere Republicans.

The shamelessness exhibited in politics today is not new. But the current willingness by Republicans to sell out is audacious and unprincipled.

New Way leaders include Assemblyman Chad Mayes, former California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger, and former Assembly Minority Leader Kristen Olsen. Schwarzenegger and Olsen are on the New Way California Board of Directors.

New Way's Schwarzenegger and Mayes, and Schnur and Westly embrace California's cap and trade scheme, and want New Way Republicans to jump on board the climate change train. The only problem with this is California's cap-and-trade program has absolutely no effect on climate change. California accounts for only 1 percent of global greenhouse gas emissions.

If New Way didn't sound problematic up to this point, embracing climate change

and cap and trade shows what utter frauds they really are, and only interested in seeking power.

Last year I explained: *If the level of air pollution in the United States is among the lowest on the planet, according to the World Health Organization, why does California Governor Jerry Brown believe "the threat of climate change could be more dangerous than that of fascism during World War Two?"* Will someone please tell Chad Mayes and Arnold only the Solomon Islands, the island of Vanatu, New Zealand and Micronesia are more pollution free, according to the most recent WHO report on air pollution. 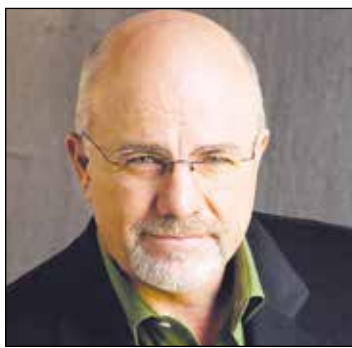

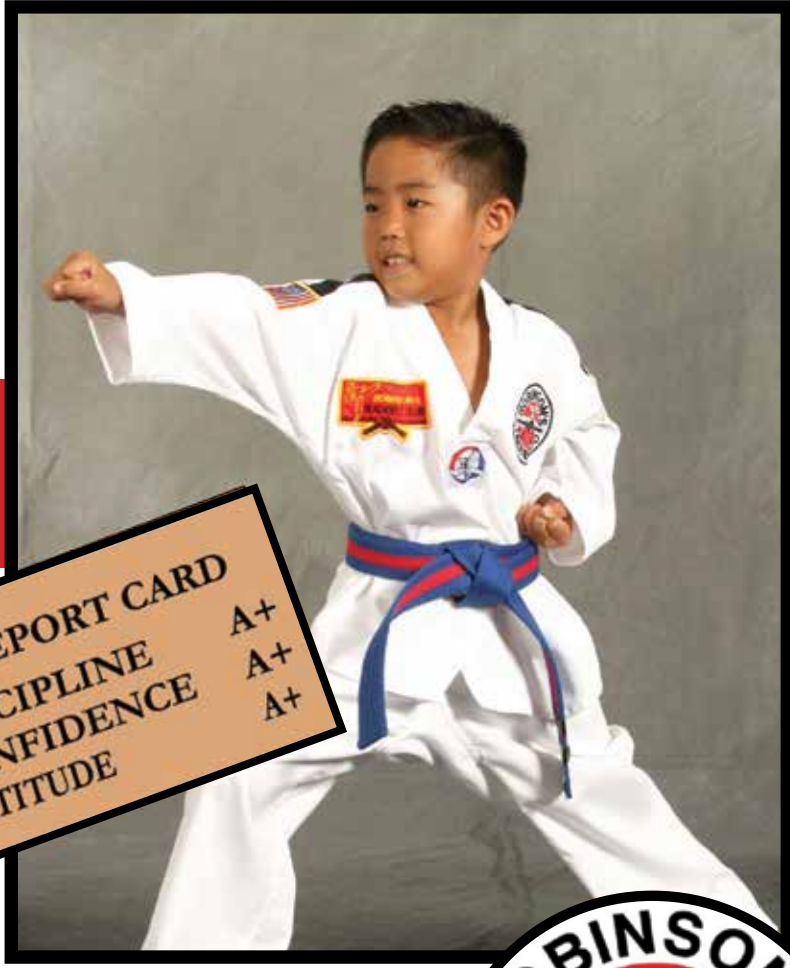

Society for the Blind Receives Donation for Device Lending Library

Sacramento Senator Lions Club Gifts \$10,000

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Society for the Blind received a \$10,000 grant from the Sacramento Senator Lions Club to fund a device lending library in the organization's Low Vision Clinic. The lending library will allow patients to borrow low vision devices such as hand-held magnifiers and portable electronic devices to determine if they are a good fit. These devices enlarge text or convert text to speech so people with vision loss can continue to read.

"Thanks to the Sacramento Senator Lions Club, our patients will now have access to vital assistive devices that allow them to maintain their independence," said Shari Roeseler, executive director, Society for the Blind. "We could not have established this much-needed lending library without this grant."

Society for the Blind operates a full-time Low Vision Clinic in Sacramento and a satellite office in Roseville. It is one of the longest running community-based clinics in the region. The Low Vision Clinic provides care, vision rehabilitation, low vision devices and transportation assistance to more than 375 people

each year. Clinics are staffed by three optometrists with special training in low-vision eye care and serve patients with cataracts, glaucoma, age-related macular degeneration, diabetic retinopathy and other congenital and degenerative eye diseases. Clinic staff includes an occupational therapist who works with patients with some functional vision, teaching them techniques to use their remaining vision safely and effectively and providing training on assistive devices.

"The Senator Lions are pleased to make this gift in celebration of the Lions Club International Centennial," said Senator Lion Vicky Brady, who coordinated the Centennial Gift. "Our longstanding dedication to assisting people with vision loss continues through this contribution to Society for the Blind."

For more than 60 years, Society for the Blind has created innovative ways to empower individuals living with low vision or blindness to discover, develop and achieve their full potential. Society for the Blind has grown from a dedicated group of volunteers to a

nationally recognized agency and the only comprehensive rehabilitative teaching center that provides services for a 27-county region of northern California. The nonprofit provides low-vision eye care, life and job skills training, mentorship, and access to tools to maintain independence for 6,000 youth, adults and seniors experiencing vision loss each year. American River College Wins \$700K Grant for Accounting Apprenticeship Program

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - American River College (ARC) has received a \$700,000 grant from the California Community College Chancellor's Office to launch an innovative new accounting apprenticeship program. Working in partnership with government and industry partners, ARC will start a new career pathway designed to meet pressing local, regional, and statewide labor market needs in the financial services sector.

"This grant creates an exciting opportunity to build sustainable financial services professional pathways for the people of our region," said Frank Kobayashi, ARC Associate Vice President of Workforce and Economic Development. "This

ARC is partnering with the California Government Operations Agency, California Department of Tax and Fee Administration, Employment Development Department, Franchise Tax Board, and SEIU Local 1000. The new program will coordinate and leverage existing SEIU, ARC, and state agency resources to support workers' overall engagement and success.

At its core this new and innovative apprenticeship program is an investment in people. ARC courses combined with hands-on job training and career mentorship will provide

structured professional development for apprentices. As apprentices acquire in-demand skills they will have access to upward mobility opportunities including career advancement and higher wage earnings.

ARC hopes to have 60 apprentices complete the program over 42 months. Coursework provides apprentices with vital academic qualifications necessary to be successful in accounting and other related financial services occupations within the State of California.

"We need to increase the pool of civil service applicants who are prepared to fill vacancies in the financial services sector. This sector has significant shortages and is projected to grow exponentially over the next 10 years," Kobayashi added.

A key component of ARC's student success strategy is the Dusty Baker Student Athlete Center. The center provides a "one stop shop" of resources for student athletes, including academic counseling, workshops, referrals to other campus services, and much more.

"I commend the great work done by our Dusty Baker Center staff and our athletic training room staff. It takes a team to support student success and we have a great team in place," Booth said.

Notice regarding State Farm California Personal Property Depreciation Decision

The case regarding State Farm's method of depreciating personal property in California was tried in Santa Clara County Superior Court in November and December of 2015. After hearing the evidence and arguments presented by both sides, the Court issued its decision on April 20, 2016. The Court held that for certain claims State Farm did not calculate depreciation according to the requirements of California law and also failed to adequately notify its policyholders, in writing, of the basis or reasoning for its calculation of depreciation.

Since this lawsuit was filed, State Farm has changed its claim adjustment practices. State Farm now asks policyholders who make a personal property claim to rate the condition of each item of lost or damaged personal property they claim. State Farm then factors condition into its calculation of depreciation. The full text of the Court's Decision is available at statefarmpersonalpropertysettlement.com.
