CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Dr. Robert Graykowski has been a vital part of the Carmichael community and beyond for more than three decades. He has helped thousands overcome both the mental and physical challenges of everyday life. While his mission to help others live a healthier lifestyle has been there since the beginning, his approach took a sudden and unexpected change one fateful day.

"My wife and I were in a helicopter crash in 2002 and she had a traumatic brain injury so I did everything to find out how to take care of that," said Graykowski. "We'd gone the medical route and all they did was want

to keep medicating her."

The terrifying accident changed the lives of Dr. Graykowski and his wife, Jeanine, forever and led to their dedication of

specializing in head trauma. Through this dedication he was able to help his wife overcome her injuries and bounce back to full health.

"I started out as just a chiropractor dealing with your basic injuries - neck pain,

back pain, all of those things, but then I went more into corrective," he explained. Since the helicopter accident the Graykowski's practice, Chiropractic USA, has taken on a Continued on page 3

## **Carmichael Teen** Murdered on Manzanita Ave.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - A teen was shot and killed on Sunday afternoon in Carmichael.

Police found 16-vear-old Zachary Whittington shot dead at the Continental apartment complex on Manzanita Ave. The Sheriff's Department discovered Whittington after responding to a 9-1-1 call in which a neighbor reported hearing a gun shot.

Deputies later located and detained a 13-year-old male less than a mile away on Bourbon St. A handgun was found in a nearby trashcan.

The 13-year-old was subsequently arrested for murder and charges related to firearm possession, according to an official statement from the sheriff's department.

"These people knew each other, they were acquaintances," said Sgt. Shaun Hampton. "We believe the victim was targeted. We don't know why."

## The Job Search: New Light on an Old Issue

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Countless people have been there. It's daybreak, and the angst sets in. Midsummer is traditionally the time of year when recent high school and college graduates focus on career issues. Meanwhile, many people who have been out in the workforce for some time are looking to rebuild their profes-

An anonymous university career advisor in Fresno reminds individuals to focus on the foundation of the career search. "The commonality is what I call your sales documents," she proclaims. "This would be a resume and cover letter. A resume is not just a fact sheet; it's a sales sheet." She warns that even a quality resume submitted is a waste of time if it is not effectively targeted to an appropriate job prospect, calling it the "spray and pray" method.

While shooting straight for the dream job is enticing, the advisor proclaims, a structured game plan is the most effective tool. She illustrates her point, noting that after three-decades in helping people find work, "How the heck do I have any business applying for a job as a senator?"

Marty Nemko, author of Careers for Dummies, would concur, maintaining that too many job seekers don't have realistic expectations of their abilities. "About seventy-five percent of people think they're above average," Nemko reports. He also maintains that many job seekers have the exact opposite problem, that they don't have enough self-confidence to pursue the work they are meant to do. As a result, they sell themselves short with low paying and unfulfilling work.

Nemko will also maintain that the traditional progression from high school to university isn't necessarily the right way to go for long term career success. Ironically, such a proclamation comes from a man who obtained his doctorate in educational psychology from UC Berkeley. "I didn't succeed because I earned a Ph.D.," Nemko asserts. On the contrary, Nemko holds that elbow grease, not his advanced degrees, paved the road to his success. He reflects on his own unfulfilling high school and university experience, being forced to absorb information that he ultimately didn't need to know. "I would have done better learning on my own."

The two experts would concur that higher education isn't always the pathway to success for a teenager who is looking toward their career future. The university advisor notes that modern high schools are doing a better job than before with helping students establish careers after graduation. She notes examples of programs that train students as nursing assistants and diesel mechanics. Such individuals are able to hit the ground running with solid careers after graduation. "College isn't for everybody," the advisor reminds.

Nemko advises careerists to focus on the process of employment, and that the dream job probably won't fall into someone's lap. When asked about mistakes job seekers make, Nemko laments that too many are unwilling to lay the necessary groundwork needed to find fulfilling employment. "I think they spend too much time on the sidelines, thinking about the perfect

Similarly, the university career advisor asserts the importance of keeping an endpoint in mind, along with plans to get there. Working with students and alumni who are planning or retooling their careers, she will ask them, "What's your game plan? What do you want to end up with, and what do you want to do?" She holds that this advice applies not only to those who are starting out in the work world, but also for established professionals who long for a change. She notes the importance of acknowledging one's interests and how they might apply on the job market. The advisor reflects on meeting with an accountant who was sick of his job, and wanted something entirely different. His wife noted that he was good with children, and truly enjoyed his time as a little league coach. After hitting on that one insight, the dissatisfied professional clarified the objective of his career shift and asked, "How do I go from being a CPA to being a school counselor." The advisor notes that he was off and running from there.

## 28 Students Begin Paid Construction Internship **Program in Placer, Sacramento Counties**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

A total of 28 high school students and young adults donned their tool belts today to begin a paid monthlong internship program sponsored by the North State Building Industry Foundation - a program designed to give them skills they would need for a career in the homebuilding

The program is a collaboration between the Foundation, major Sacramento-area homebuilders, a number of trade contractors, and 11 area high schools. Now in its fourth year, the program fills a major need for contractors and students alike, said Rachel Bardis, the Foundation's 2018 chair.

"There is a growing shortage of construction workers in the region, so now is a great time for young adults interested in the trades to find a rewarding career," Bardis said. "The internship program gives participants a great skill set and they are then very likely to find a job when they're out of high school."

Mo Rahim, vice president for Taylor Morrison, one of four homebuilders participating this summer, agreed.

"This is a great program for us to reach out to the community and expose young talent to a great industry," he said at an event in Elk Grove on the last day of program's first four-week session on June 29, which saw 34 students and young adults learning skills in plumbing, painting, heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) and framing.

"As an industry as a whole, there is a major labor shortage, and this is a great way to introduce young people to all aspects of the industry.'

While the state has been increasing career technical education funding in recent years, area industry leaders have recognized that they need to be involved as well, Bardis added.

"For the past four years, the Building Industry Foundation has coordinated this job-training program," she said. "After students take part in a series of after-school classes during the school year, they have the opportunity to earn money in our

paid internship program and really get hands-on experience."

Interns are paid \$11 an hour.

Other builders participating this year are Anthem United, Lennar and USA Properties at developments in Elk Grove, the Vineyard area, Roseville, Folsom and Natomas.

Also involved are the following trade contractors: Black Diamond Electric, Central Valley Painting, Creative Design Interiors, CVC, Deal Mechanical, Eagle Lathe and Plastering, Fenceworks, Fletcher Plumbing. Hutton Lovewell, L&S Framing, Marticus Electric, Production Framing, Rayco Electric, Sommercal Concrete, Timberlake Cabinets, Timberworks and Villara Building Systems.

High schools involved in the program are Cosumnes Oaks, Laguna Creek, Monterey Trail, Pleasant Grove, Sheldon, and William Daylor in the Elk Grove Unified School District, and five schools in Placer County - Center, Lincoln, Oakmont, Placer, and Whitney.

In addition, a number of young adults aged 18-22 enrolled in a separate Foundation training program are participating in the hands-on

internship program.

Interns enrolled in the first session found the program to be extremely beneficial.

"It was a good opportunity to learn something new and taught me what hard work means, what it takes to earn money," said Robert Langamon, 17, an incoming senior at Cosumnes Oaks High School, on the last day of the first session.

And Jared Delacruz, 21, said he's ready to begin a career as a heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) tradesman.

"I've always been interested in construction. My family has been in construction and some have been general contractors," he said. "The internship was really helpful in helping me understand what I'd like to do, and now I know I'd like to work in HVAC," he said.

**Building Industry Foundation** programs have a great track record in placing graduating students into jobs. In April, of 57 graduating seniors who participated in last year's summer internship program, 54 were hired by contractors at a Foundation-sponsored job fair.

different direction and grown with time. "Now I do a lot of work in orthopedics and biophysics...so we do spinal correction work also.

"I've worked with a lot of head trauma patients to regain as much function as possible. There's a lot of things we do with the nervous system to repattern it. It started with my own wife and she's regained 100 percent."

Graykowski explained his practice as having evolved into three parts as well as a partnership with the Sacramento River Cats. "We have a wellness practice in that it's chiropractic and exercise and nutrition," he said. "We have the sports performance; we take care of a lot of athletes, obviously the River Cats being one of them, and then I also do a lot of brain injury and head trauma patients."

Dr. Graykowski's lifelong love for baseball led him in a direct path towards his career beginning back in his college days at

Long Beach State. "I've always had a desire to look at the biomechanics of the sport," he said. "When you start to look at how the body is functioning in sports you want to improve effectiveness and efficiency and prevent injuries - and a lot of injuries are because your body's not working in sync, it's actually working against itself."

Today, Major League Baseball and sports in general are constantly surrounded by the controversy of head injuries and how they affect players moving forward in not only their careers but their personal lives as well. The San Francisco Giants (River Cats) organization has been no stranger to concussions and Dr. Graykowski has dealt with some of those issues directly.

"When I go to the River Cats stadium I adjust them there," said Graykowski. "I'll probably adjust 15 players every time I go there, so we're taking care of mainly a lot of the pitchers, catchers, their first stringers...At first they were looking at just as far as injury, now they're looking at as far as performance."

Most notably this year for the River Cats has been the up and down season of outfielder Mac Williamson, largely due to a concussion that he suffered in San Francisco after colliding with the wall in foul territory. Williamson is just one of Dr. Graykowki's many patients that he hopes to treat back to what he calls "optimum sports performance."

"Whether you're a mom trying to take care of your kids or just out there playing weekend golf, optimum performance is what we're looking for here in our office."

The Central Valley Water Board Will Be Conducting a Year-Long Study on the Lower American River to Determine the Primary Sources of E. Coli

#### SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)

- Every natural water body can be a conduit for pollution, trash, bacteria, algae and microorganisms. Sacramento County and the Sacramento Area Sewer District are collaborating with the California Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) to fund their weekly E. coli water sampling at nine sites on the American River.

Most E. coli strains are harmless and do not cause human illness. They are the helpful bacteria found in the intestines of mammals - humans, pets, wildlife and birds. Increased levels of E. coli does not necessarily equate to an increased exposure risk for swimmers. E. coli are generally found in all recreational waters.

The Central Valley Water Board will be conducting a year-long study on the Lower American River to determine the primary sources of E. coli. The study will begin this summer and is designed to more fully understand the primary sources of *E. coli* and any increase exposure risk to those recreating in the Lower American River.

The County Public Health Officer is the local authority in determining if a recreational area needs to be closed. Closures would be considered for a known communicable disease outbreak or a known sewage release. There have been no water-related illnesses for our rivers and streams reported to the Sacramento County Public Health Division. E.coli-related illness cases are required by Title 17 law for

medical providers and labs to report E. coli-related cases to County Public Health. County Public Health investigates every reported case of E. coli-related illness to identify the source and stop the spread of the disease. If the County Public Health Officer decides there is a risk to the general public, a public notification is sent out.

Anyone enjoying public waterways should always follow healthy swimming habits:

- Do not drink recreational water or use the water for cooking.
- Do not enter the water if you have cuts or open sores, as these are pathways for bacteria to enter your body.

Avoid algae blooms (brightly

- colored water) and trash in the water.
- Wash your hands or shower after swimming.
- Pay attention and follow any warning signs and postings. Do not access a water body if posted warnings indicate it is not safe to do so.
- Contact your healthcare provider if you have concerns regarding your health after swimming in recreational waters.

A RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO CONTINUE TO LEVY ASSESSMENTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2018-19, PRELIMINARILY APPROVING THE ENGINEER'S REPORT AND PROVIDING NOTICE OF HEARING OF THE MISSION OAKS RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT PARKS AND RECREATION MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District, Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District was authorized by an assessment ballot proceeding conducted in 2006 and approved by 68.78% of the weighted ballots returned by property owners, and such assessments were levied by the Advisory Board of Directors by Resolution No. 2006-04 passed on May 2, 2006; and WHEREAS, on March 29, 2018 by Resolution No. 2018-01, the Board ordered the preparation of an Engineer's Report for the Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District (the "District") for fiscal year 2018-19; and WHEREAS, pursuant to said Resolution, the Engineer's Report was prepared by SCI Consulting Group, Engineer of Work, in accordance with 22565, et. seq., of the Streets and Highways Code (the "Report") and Article XIIID of the California Constitution; and WHEREAS, said Engineer's Report was filed with the Secretary of the Board of Directors and the Board of Directors has reviewed the Report and wishes to take certain actions relative to said Report. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Advisory Board of Directors of the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District ("Board"), that: SECTION 1.

The Report for the "Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District", on file with the Secretary of the Board, has been duly considered by the Board of Directors and is hereby deemed sufficient and approved. The Report shall stand as the Engineer's Report for all subsequent proceedings under, and pursuant to, the foregoing resolution. SECTION 2.It is the intention of this Board to continue to levy and collect assessments within the District for fiscal year 2018-19. Within the District, the existing and proposed improvements ("Improvements") are generally described as the installation, maintenance and servicing of public facilities, including but not limited to, landscaping, sprinkler systems, park grounds, park facilities, landscape corridors, ground cover, shrubs and trees, street frontages, playground equipment and hardcourt areas, senior and community centers, drainage systems, lighting, fencing, entry monuments, basketball courts, tennis courts, running tracks, swimming pools, other recreational facilities, security guards, graffiti removal and repainting, and labor, materials, supplies, utilities and equipment, as applicable, for property owned and maintained by the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District. Installation means the construction of recreational improvements, including, but not limited to, land preparation, such as grading, leveling, cutting and filling, sod, landscaping, irrigation systems, sidewalks and drainage, lights, playground equipment, play courts, recreational facilities and public restrooms. Maintenance means the furnishing of services and materials for the ordinary and usual maintenance, operation and servicing of said improvements, including repair, removal, or replacement of all or part of any improvement; providing for the life, growth, health and beauty of landscaping; and cleaning, sandblasting and painting of walls and other improvements to remove or cover graffiti. Servicing means the furnishing of electric current or energy for the operation or lighting of any improvements, and water for irrigation of any landscaping or the maintenance of any other improvements. SECTION 3. The District consists of the lots and parcels shown on the assessment diagram of the District on file with the Secretary of the Board, and reference is hereby made to such map for further particulars. SECTION 4. Reference is hereby made to the Report for a full and detailed description of the Improvements, the boundaries of the District and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the District. The Engineer's Report identifies all parcels which will have a special benefit conferred upon them and upon which an assessment will be imposed. SECTION 5. The assessment is subject to an annual adjustment tied to the Consumer Price Index-U for the San Francisco Bay Area as of December of each succeeding year (the "CPI"), with a maximum annual adjustment not to exceed 3%. Any change in the CPI in excess of 3% shall be cumulatively reserved as the "Unused CPI" and shall be used to increase the maximum authorized assessment rate in years in which the CPI is less than 3%. The maximum authorized assessment rate is equal to the maximum assessment rate in the first fiscal year the assessment was levied adjusted annually by the minimum of 1) 3% or 2) the change in the CPI plus any Unused CPI as described above. The change in the CPI from December 2016 to December 2017 was 2.94% and the Unused CPI carried forward from previous fiscal years is 0.70%. Therefore, the maximum authorized assessment rate for fiscal year 2018-19 is increased by 3.00% which equates to \$52.84 per single family equivalent benefit unit. The estimate of cost and budget in the Engineer's Report proposes assessments for fiscal year 2018-19 at the maximum rate of \$52.84. SECTION 6. The public hearing shall be held, before this Board at Mission Oaks Community Center, located at 4701 Gibbons Drive, Carmichael, California 95608 as follows: on Tuesday, August 7, 2018 at the hour of 6:00 p.m. for the purpose of this Board's determination whether the public interest, convenience and necessity require the improvements and this Board's final action upon the Report and the assessments therein. ## Greg Kihn Happy to be Back Out on the Road

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Rock and Roller Greg Kihn is a rarity among the music world. Sitting down to speak with the singer/songwriter, band leader, radio personality and author, it was interesting to hear his perspective of a successful career in both sides of the media and the evolution of music both on and off the stage.

Long time Bay Area radio host and DJ, Kihn made a name for himself as a media personality after a successful career as a rock and roll artist, reaching #2 in the US Top 100 charts in 1983 with his hit single Jeopardy. Throughout his five decade career, Kihn has recorded 13 Top 100 singles and eight Billboard Top 200 albums while playing alongside some of the biggest name in the world.



"When you're writing a song, you can tell the ones that are going to be really good songs and you can tell the ones that are going to be throwaways," Kihn explained. "The songs that write themselves are always invariably better."

Despite his musical success, his 1990s transition into radio came at the right time. "When I got into radio I had been on the road for like a million years. It was time for me to kind of stay home," said Kihn.

He found unique joy in his radio work because he was usually spinning records of artists that were his

friends. "I was a classic rock DJ and some of the bands I played, I knew them personally," explained Kihn. "I either played with them or toured with them or recorded with them. So every time I'd whip out a song, chances are I knew the guys and it was a lot more fun."

Whether songwriting, recording, touring, working in radio or writing novels, the inspiration remains. "It was all part of being creative because whether you were writing a novel or writing a song, it didn't matter as long as the creative juices were flowing."

Kihn recently stepped away from radio after more than 15 years and he is once again enjoying life back in the studio and on the road. The release of his 2017

album Rekihndled and his current summer tour with good friend Rick Springfield have treated him well.

"I'm having a ball going back out on the road. I remember back in the old days it was a real pain in the butt...You'd go out and be gone for months and I didn't like it that much. But these days I like it; it's kind of like going to summer camp."

Kihn has embraced the opportunity to be able to play alongside his son, Ry, who is the band's lead guitarist. "If I didn't have Ry in my band, my son playing guitar, I don't know what I would do because he understands me and he knows what to play."

Ry grew up in a world surrounded by great guitarists, most notably guitar virtuoso Joe Satriani, who had a brief stint in the Greg Kihn Band during mid-80s before his own career took flight.

When asking Kihn if he is the only person to ever get the high wired Satriani to mellow out his playing style he recalled, "I think so . . . We used to change the set like every other day. I would throw in stuff that I knew would screw up Joe but of course you can't screw up Joe because he's already there, he's already got everything down."

Kihn continued to praise the talented Satriani: "You know how musicians are back stage. You'll be playing every (Rolling) Stones song you knew or every Led Zeppelin song or whatever, so we'd be messing around with some songs and try to stump Joe and you couldn't stump him - the guy knew every song in the world."

Kihn's appreciation for music is admirable. He has written several books surrounding the history of Rock and Roll including Rubber Soul: a murder mystery novel that takes place during the rise of the Beatles and most recently Painted Black: the tragic tale of the "death and misadventure" of Rolling Stones founding member Brian

"The turning point in most musicians' lives is the Beatles on Ed Sullivan," proclaimed Kihn. "The Beatles and the Stones - that was it for me. That was my generation."

Despite all of the different career paths and music industry changes over the decades, one thing remains the same: Kihn's guitar rig. "Over the years I never changed. I still have the same Fender Telecaster - I'm just a Telecaster guy - and I've had the same one since probably the early 70s," said Kihn proudly. "I've had the same guitar and the same amp, which is a Fender Super Reverb. It's a Fender through a Fender."

As Kihn explained, "Rock and Roll is a constantly mutating art form." But some things are set in stone.

#### Defendant Sentenced for 13 Counts of Sexual Assault

**DATE:** June 29, 2018

CASE: Andy Kelly (Case #17FE019449) PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Monica Robinson, Special Assault and Child Abuse

The Honorable Geoffrey Goodman sentenced Andy Kelly to 129 years to life in prison. On April 20, 2018, a jury convicted Kelly of 13 counts of sexual assault including committing an act of oral copulation or penetration on a child 10 years old or younger, intercourse with a child 10 years old or younger, and lewd or lascivious acts with a child under the age of 14.

From 2015 to 2016, Kelly molested a young family member. DNA evidence was recovered and corroborated the child's description of what happened to her.

#### Defendant Sentenced for Kidnapping, Carjacking, Sexual Assault

CASE: Eddie Ray Jones Jr. (Case

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Kevin Jones, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Patrick Marlette sentenced Eddie Ray Jones Jr. to 65 years to life in prison. On January 11, 2018, a jury convicted Jones of two counts of kidnapping during a carjacking, two counts of robbery and one count of oral copulation by force or fear with kidnapping and use of a dangerous or deadly weapon or firearm allegations. The jury also found true a use of a firearm allegation on all counts.

On September 10, 2016, Jones was inside a restaurant on Mack Road when the female victim entered the restaurant with her 2-year-old granddaughter. After purchasing food to go, the victim returned to her vehicle and began placing her granddaughter in her car seat. Jones approached the victim from behind, told her he had a gun and pointed it at her through his coat pocket. He proceeded to order the victim into the vehicle and to drive. Over the next hour, the victim was forced to drive around while Jones smoked drugs. He then pulled out the gun, switched seats with the victim and drove to a secluded area where he forced the victim to orally copulate him. He then stole money from the victim's purse, dropped her and her granddaughter off on the side of the road and drove off in her vehicle. Jones was arrested later that month after leading police on a high-speed vehicle chase and attempting to escape on foot.

The victim was able to describe Jones' distinctive tattoos and picked him out of a photo lineup. DNA evidence found on the victim's

shirt was also analyzed by the District Attorney's Crime Lab and was a match to Jones.



#### **Defendant Sentenced for Sexually** Assaulting Two Family Members

In 2016, Dew sexually assaulted a 5-yearold family member. During the course of the investigation into the assault, it became known to law enforcement that Dew had also sexually assaulted another family member from 2000 to

#### Defendant Convicted for Murder of Moped Business Partner

**CASE:** Kyle Billy Fletcher (Case #15F02336) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney William Satchell, Homicide Unit

Kyle Billy Fletcher was convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of Daniel Aiello and possession and transportation of methamphetamine for the purpose of sales. The jury also found true that Fletcher personally used a dangerous weapon.

Daniel Aiello had known Kyle Billy Fletcher for several years and was his business partner at Midtown Moped, a moped shop on X Street in Sacramento. On April 14, 2015, Mr. Aiello accused Fletcher of embezzling from the business and informed him that he filed a police report. On April 15, 2015, the Sacramento Police Department responded to a report of loud noises at the business. Officers found Fletcher in the process of moving a surveillance system from the business to his vehicle and detained him. Shortly after, officers located Mr. Aiello deceased inside the business with a belt around his neck. Officers also located approximately 50 grams of methamphetamine in Fletcher's vehicle. An autopsy was performed and the cause of Mr. Aiello's death was determined to be strangulation.

Fletcher faces a maximum sentence of 30 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for August 24, 2018, at 9:30 a.m. in Department 11 before the Honorable Trena Burger-Plavan. ★

## Insurance after diagnosis

Dear Dave,

I started looking at life insurance policies after my wife and I had our daughter. During the screening process, I found out I had testicular cancer. I went through treatments, and the doctors have officially declared me to be in remission. Still, I can't find a life insurance company that will work with me. I have a small policy through my employer, that is equal to double my salary. Do you have any suggestions for finding additional coverage?

## Dave Says

Dear Nate,

It's great news that you're in remission. I'm really happy for you, buddy. I know your wife is thrilled, too.

I would advise conducting a search of every "guaranteed issue" company and policy out there. The term, guaranteed issue, means they don't do a medical check. The problem is these policies generally run 10 to 20 times more per thousand than those where you qualify medically. So, you're not going to get a lot during this time.

Check at work, and see if you can buy more and add it to the coverage they already provide. Some employers provide a double-up option if you're willing to pay for the additional coverage. If you can, and the price is reasonable, do it. If you have a mortgage, call the mortgage company and get mortgage life insurance. It's gimmick insurance — and something I don't normally recommend — but many times you can get it

without medical clearance.

Once you get past that three-to five-year window where many insurance companies will work with you again, try to find a good, level term life insurance policy with coverage that's 10 to 12 times your income, and drop all this other stuff. In the meantime, pick up anything else you can find – even if it's those little \$10,000 policies banks sometimes attach to your checking account for \$20. Pile up those little odds and ends, until you get as much coverage as you can within reason.

# "California at Bat" Chronicling the State's Baseball History Opens July 29 at the California Museum

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Museum announced "California at Bat: America's Pastime in the Golden State" will open on Sun., July 29, 2018. The all-new exhibit chronicles California's baseball history from the Gold Rush to present, revealing its legacy of all-stars and the contributions of female, African American and other players who broke barriers to broaden its enduring appeal. Featuring more than 200 rarely-seen artifacts, highlights include uniforms, equipment and ephemera from Jackie Robinson, Joe DiMaggio, Ted Williams, Willie Mays, Sandy Koufax and others, along with objects from Pacific Coast League teams and from Edmonds Field, home of the Sacramento Solons until 1960.

"We are thrilled to present 'California at Bat,'" said California Museum Executive Director Amanda Meeker. "Although the major leagues didn't arrive until the 1950s, Californians have enjoyed baseball for 160 years. This exhibit offers an unprecedented opportunity to view artifacts representing the sweep of California baseball from 19th century town ball to the legends of baseball's Golden Age and the heroes of the modern era."

Curated by the California Museum, "California at Bat" was developed in collaboration with Stephen Wong, author of three Smithsonian Books, including "Game Worn: Baseball Treasures from the Game's Greatest Heroes and Moments" (2016). A renowned baseball historian and collector, Wong contributed expertise and more than 80 artifacts from his personal collection illustrating many of baseball's most famous

players. Highlights include:

- New York Yankees rookie uniform game worn by Joe DiMaggio (1914-2000) in 1936, the only season of he wore number 9. Born and raised in the San Francisco Bay Area, DiMaggio is best known for his 56-game hitting streak in 1941, a standing record in 2018.
- Boston Red Sox home uniform game worn by Ted Williams (1918-2002) in 1950, the season his career nearly ended after breaking his arm in the All-Star game. The San Diego native

was the last player to bat over .400 in a season (.406 in 1941).

- San Francisco Giants home jersey game worn by Willie Mays (b. 1931) in 1965, the season he led the NL with 52 home runs and won his second NL MVP Award. Considered the game's greatest all-around player, Mays has lived in California since moving with the Giants in 1058
- Los Angeles Dodgers road jersey game worn by Sandy Koufax (b. 1935) in 1966, the last year of


his MLB career and the year he won a third Cy Young Award. A resident of California since moving with the Dodgers in 1958, Koufax is also remembered for sitting out Game 1 of the 1965 World Series when it fell on Yom Kippur, and for pitching baseball's eighth perfect game on Sept. 9, 1965.

"As a native Californian who is deeply passionate about baseball and the history of the game, I'm proud and honored to have been a part of 'California at Bat,'" said Stephen Wong. "I'm delighted to share my collection with members of the public in this extraordinary new installation revealing the state's significant contributions to baseball."

Contributions Californians who broke barriers are also explored. For example, Jackie Robinson (1919-1972), the first African American to play MLB in the modern era, is heralded through a 1947 Brooklyn Dodgers team-autographed ball, along with a ticket and program from his April 15, 1947 debut. In addition to ending the segregation that had relegated African Americans to the Negro Leagues since the 1880s, Robinson was also the first to win a NL MVP Award, reflected by his 1949 trophy on

display.

Accomplishments of California women are shown through uniforms from the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League of the 1940s and modern softball Olympians, while artifacts from Japanese American and Mexican American leagues emphasize the sport's role in facilitating social and political networks in disadvantaged communities.

In addition, the exhibit surveys the state's baseball history before the arrival of the majors in 1958. Uniforms, equipment and ephemera revisit the Pacific Coast League's Sacramento Solons, San Francisco Seals, Oakland Oaks, Hollywood Stars, San Diego Padres and Los Angeles Angels, while objects from Edmonds Field, home of the Sacramento Solons until 1960, recall the local baseball park experience.

"California at Bat" will open in a public event on Sun.,

July 29 from 12:00 to 4:00 p.m. Highlights include \$5.00 reduced admission; presentations by Stephen Wong, Matt Stone and Alan O'Connor; 19th century "base ball" demonstrations; Home Run Challenge and Speed Pitch games; baseball card evaluations; beer garden (21+); food trucks; hands-on kids' activities and more.
