

Elks July 4 Parade in 60th Year

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - "United We Stand" is the theme of the Carmichael Elks' July 4 parade. United in support, 800 hundred marching, motoring, cycling patriots will boost the Independence Day spectacle. Hugging the shade, many thousands more spectators will cheer the event's 60th year.

While VIPS abound, non-profits demonstrate that community is where the heart is and volunteer organizations will field contingents. Car clubs contribute dozens of vehicles: these range in age from a WWI chemical truck to Model A Fords; from 1960s "muscle cars" to contemporary Mustangs. "We'll have many fabulous vehicles this year," promises organizer Jim Warrick. "The whole world admires classic American cars. In many ways, they represent our independence and ingenuity."

In colonial garb, Sons of the American Revolution will lead the parade. Close behind, Del Campo High School's ROTC unit will bear flags. Churches, businesses and schools contribute floats; beauty queens and business folk will adorn convertibles. Go-Kart riding Shriners, Keystone Kops, musicians, fire trucks and ancient tractors complete the cornucopia of Americana. Best viewing spot is at Carmichael Park frontage, near Grant Avenue.

The crawl along Fair Oaks Boulevard turns into Locust Avenue, ending at the Elks Lodge (5631 Cypress Avenue). Here, free swimming, live music and a barbecue will continue celebrations. Anyone may join the



Sheriff's Canine Association Recognized as Non-Profit of the Year

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Sheriff's Canine Association was

selected by Senator Ted Gaines as a California Non-Profit of the Year and was recently recognized at the State Capital during the third annual California Non-Profits Day.

The Sacramento County Sheriff's Department's Canine Association officially became recognized as a non-profit association in 2005. The association was initially established by members of the Sheriff's Department Canine Detail who saw a need for financial assistance to aid the retired canines after they had served our community.

These fantastic animals are often asked to do extremely hazardous work and can be credited for saving lives, apprehending criminals who have evaded capture, and also locating missing persons. Some of them are also trained to locate firearms, explosives, narcotics, and evidence.

Since its inception, the Sacramento Sheriff's Canine Association has supplemented the training and equipment of our

active canine teams and enhanced the safety of our deputies and their canine partners. The association has also been able to assist with veterinary bills after these dogs retire and fully cover the costs of all burial fees associated with each of our retired canines when they are laid to rest.

Senator Gaines Opposes Wasteful Budget

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) today issued the following statement regarding the Democrat majority-vote budget bill:

"I tip my hat to Governor Brown and his Democrat allies in the legislature; they can spend money faster and more irresponsibly than any group of people I've ever seen. This budget is – again – the biggest in Golden State history. We keep spending more and more but not getting better roads, better schools, or better anything besides wealthier public employee unions."

A slight downturn could send us into a fiscal crisis in Sacramento. Far from being recession proof, we would be recession toast."

"This is a budget that guarantees higher taxes for families around the state. Is it any wonder that working-class people are fleeing California as fast as they

could they want to stay when their government treats them like ATMs? Democrats force them to pay the highest sales taxes, highest income taxes, some of the highest gas taxes and property taxes in the nation, and then celebrate when and brag about how much this year's budget 'invests.' For once, I wish the Democrats would spend less and let the people invest in themselves.

"This is Governor Brown's last budget and thankfully so. He's spent 8 years talking about fiscal discipline and prudence while supporting new taxes, fees and spending at every turn. He's leaving behind a legacy of poverty, massive homelessness, and fiscal recklessness."

Women's Empowerment Receives \$11,500 from American River Bank Foundation

Donation to Go Towards Paid Job Training for Homeless Women

SACRAMENTO REGION. CA (MPG) - American River Bank Foundation recently granted \$11,500 to Sacramento nonprofit Women's Empowerment to provide paid job training for homeless women through the group's Get A Job Kit small business. Funding also will support Women's Empowerment's new property management training program REstart in partnership with the Institute of Real Estate Management (IREM) Sacramento.

"American River Bank Foundation's funding has been absolutely vital as we've grown The Get A Job Kit small business over the past four years, ' said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women's Empowerment. "We are so thankful to American River Bank Foundation and its continued investment in paid job training for women who are homeless. They stepped up to fund The Get A Job Kit, and now they're making the same commitment by investing in our REstart program to train women in the field of property management."

The Get A Job Kit was launched under Women's Empowerment's name in April 2014 after the business was donated by local entrepreneur Shirley Willey, who had created and run the business for nearly 25 years. The social enterprise trains graduates of Women's Empowerment's nine-week job-readiness program in the production, customer service. quality assurance, forklift operation, shipping and receiving industries. Over the course of five weeks, trainees are paid to assemble the Get A Job Kits, an all-in-one career organizer, to fill customer orders while receiving hands-on training, performance evaluations and relevant job



of Women's Empowerment's paid property management training program. The foundation recently granted \$11,500 to the organization.

experience. Since launching the small business, Women's Empowerment has sold 15,000 Kits to high schools, veterans programs, nonprofits, vocational and technical colleges and antirecidivism programs.

Women's Empowerment's recent partnership with IREM Sacramento provides Women's Empowerment graduates with paid training in property management, a career that provides both stable employment and housing on the property being managed.

"As homelessness increases in our community, and finding affordable housing becomes even more challenging, we developed a strategic partnership that provides both income and housing," Culp said. "We are grateful to American River Bank Foundation for seeing the value of this new, innovative training program."

The Get A Job Kit and REstart are two components of Women's Empowerment's programs that end homelessness for women and children in Sacramento. Women's Empowerment was

featured on NBC's The TODAY Show in 2015 for offering the most comprehensive job-readiness program in the Sacramento area designed specifically for women who are homeless and their children. The award-winning organization has graduated 1,503 homeless women and their 3,600 children. Last year, 92 percent of graduates found homes and 77 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. Women's Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and receives no government funding except for in-kind rent from the County of Sacramento. 





"INCREDIBLES 2" BRINGS CREDIBLE **SPUNK AND SPIRIT TO SEQUEL**

A Film Review by Tim Riley

INCREDIBLES 2 (Rated PG) Fourteen years have passed since writer-director Brad Bird delivered an animated film that was energetic and ingenious with fresh appeal for Pixar's "The Incredibles."

With the same duties as writer and director, Bird obviously took great care and meticulous devotion to produce a worthy sequel with "Incredibles 2," with plenty of heart and good humor to rival the original.

Most of the primary voice actors have returned with Craig T. Nelson as the patriarch of the Incredible family, Bob or his alter-ego Mr. Incredible, and Holly Hunter as his wife, Helen aka Elastigirl, and Sarah Vowell as teen daughter Violet.

The modern world has banished all superheroes into retirement due to the collateral damage that often followed their heroics. The Incredibles chafe at these limits, feeling discarded from society, until a new villain, the Underminer (John Ratzenberger), surfaces.

Though Mr. Incredible, with the physique of a competitor for Mr. Universe, wants to be the center of attention in the superhero world, the sequel belongs to his spouse, Elastigirl, who is called upon to use her powers as she has a less destructive method.

The superheroes, referred to as Supers, have fallen into disfavor with the public. Tech wizard Winston Deavor (Bob Odenkirk) and his sister Evelyn (Catherine Keener) seek to restore the public image of the Supers and enlist the help of Elastigirl to serve as the ambassador.

The Incredible family and all other superheroes have been declared illegal and are eager to get back into action. Meanwhile, the Incredibles are living like fugitives in the lowrent Safari Court motel until Elastigirl proves their worth to society.

After dispatching the Underminer's destructive plan to level Municiberg with a giant boring machine contraption, Elastigirl heroically uses her flexible powers to stop an insidious plot to derail a brand new high-speed monorail train filled with dignitaries.

The evil force behind a plot to cause panic and turn Municiberg into a dystopian urban wasteland is Screenslaver (Bill Wise), a high-tech super-villain who manages to hypnotize his victims to bend to his will, acting as pawns to thwart Elastigirl's mission.

For now, the Incredible family goes about new routines while Elastigirl is engaged

once again as a Super. Mr. Incredible becomes Mr. Mom, struggling to keep up with baby Jack-Jack who is showing signs of unbelievable superpowers usually manifested during tantrums.

Jack-Jack has abnormal powers for a toddler, including becoming a demon baby with the ability to burst into flames, turn invisible, break through walls and windows, and levitate. Best of all, his power includes shooting burning lasers from his eyes.

Violet, mastering the power of invisibility and creating force fields, is an introverted and bright 14-year-old who is socially awkward but sarcastic and has a crush on classmate Tony (Michael Bird) that is complicated by his inability to remember who

The Incredible middleson is Dash (Huck Milner), a mischievous sort modeled it would seem on Bart Simpson, who desperately wants to be part of the action. He has the remarkable power of super speed and is dismayed that he has to keep his ability a

Screenslaver turns out to be an exceptional villain in his use of computer screens and special goggles, once affixed to a person's face, that transform his victims into hypnotized pawns for his evil

An old friend of the Incredibles is a fellow Super named Frozone (Samuel L. Jackson), who falls prey like all the others to Screenslaver's master plan after being turned into his unwitting accomplice.

An epic battle takes place on a cruise ship where officials from around the world are gathered to formalize a treaty that would restore the Supers as guardians of the public order. Screenslaver will have none of that.

The climactic confrontation brings the entire Incredible family into a serious showdown on the ship, where they are called upon to save the day once again. Even the precocious Jack-Jack gets to use his powers along with his

As with most sequels, "Incredibles 2" creates a sense of déjà vu of what transpired the first time, mainly because it picks up where "The Incredibles" left off. The riveting action, including a daring helicopter rescue, makes for a good time for family entertainment.

Whatever might be said about this sequel, "Incredibles 2" is likely to be one of the summer's big hits and for good reason.

Reducing Global Energy Turmoil with Fracking

When President Trump pulled out of the Iran nuclear deal, analysts warned that Iran's crude oil production and exports could decline, forcing crude oil prices up. Call it "turm-oil" in the energy

For example, Time magazine quotes PIMCO Executive Vice President Greg Sharenow: "The consumers are going to shoulder the bill. The U.S. economy will face headwinds from prices that will come as a natural result of this."

Maybe, but likely only in the short term.

While it remains to be seen whether this shortage will materialize, one thing remains clear: The recent U.S. gas and oil boom will help fill any impending gaps in the global energy supply.

Thanks to hydraulic fracturing, U.S. crude oil production should grow to help meet or exceed demand over the long term, which means prices will likely stabilize at a reasonably affordable price.

President Obama imposed economic sanctions on Iran in 2012, and it had a major impact on Iran's ability to produce and export oil.

According to the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, Iran was exporting about 2.6 million barrels of crude oil per day in 2011. By 2014 that number was down to just over 1 million.

The Iranian nuclear agreement in 2015 relaxed many of those sanctions, and Iran began to increase its crude oil exports — to 1.5 million barrels per day. Today it's just over

sanctions apply to Iranian oil production -- an issue that is as yet undecided -- daily global production could decline by 1 million barrels or more.

The good news is that the United States has the resources and the ability to fill the gap, and rising crude oil prices could serve as the catalyst to do so.

According to the U.S. Energy Information Administration (EIA), "The United States remained the world's top producer of petroleum and natural gas hydrocarbons in 2017, reaching a record high. Since 2008, U.S. petroleum and natural gas production has increased by nearly 60 percent."

The EIA points out that U.S. crude oil production has increased nearly every year, leveling off only in 2016 when the price of crude declined to less than \$30 per barrel. Saudi Arabia and Russian production have remained roughly the same for a decade.

The EIA goes on to say, "U.S. petroleum production increased by 745,000 barrels per day (b/d) in 2017, driven by a 21 percent increase in oil prices to approximately \$65 per barrel." If U.S. producers, lured by oil at around \$70 per barrel, were to continue at that rate of increase, the U.S. would compensate for the Iranian oil cutback in two years.

Crude oil is a commodity. And like most commodities, its price will fluctuate, sometimes wildly. But high oil prices and low U.S. production costs mean Iranian oil production decline can be replaced in the near future.

Defendant Convicted for Series of Armed Robberies

DATE: June 7, 2018

CASE: Taher Farraj (Case #17FE007880)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney
James Wax, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Taher Farraj was convicted by a jury of three counts of robbery. The jury also found true gun use and intentional discharge of a firearm allegations. Prior to trial, Farraj pled to being a felon in possession of a firearm and being a felon in possession of ammunition.

On April 15, April 18 and April 24 of 2017, Farraj robbed the same convenience store on Fruitridge Road while armed. Farraj would either ask for change or make a purchase to get the clerks to open the cash register. He would then pull out a silver revolver and grab money from the registers. During one of the robberies, Farraj fired the gun off at the store ceiling. The three robberies were captured on surveillance cameras inside the store. A probation search of Farraj's residence and car revealed clothing that matched the clothes worn by the suspect during the robberies and a .22 caliber silver revolver, which was loaded with 6 rounds.

Farraj has prior convictions for being a felon in possession of a firearm and the sale/transport of marijuana

Farraj faces a maximum sentence of 35 years in prison. Sentencing is set for August 3, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 14 before the Honorable Tami Bogert.

Sexually Violent Predator Who Assaulted Two Boys to Remain in Hospital Custody

DATE: June 7, 2018

CASE: Clay Jones (Case #80213 & 81875)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney
Denise Halstead, Mental Health Litigation Unit

A jury found true a petition of civil commitment against Clay Jones as a Sexually Violent Predator (SVP).

In 1988, Jones was convicted of 12 counts of child sexual assault against two boys ages 4 and 10. The assaults included sodomy and lewd and lascivious acts with a child under 14 years old, and forcible lewd act with a child under age 14. Jones was sentenced to 33 years state prison for these offenses. Upon his review for parole, he was referred to the Department of State Hospitals for consideration as a Sexually Violent Predator. Two psychologists gave an opinion that Jones had a mental diagnosis and because of this mental disorder he is likely to commit a sexually

violent predatory offense if released from the hospital.

Defendant Sentenced for Murdering Ex-Girlfriend

DATE: June 15, 2018

CASE: Dameshlo Green (Case #14F03237)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin
Greene, Homicide Unit

The Honorable Helena Gweon sentenced Dameshlo Green to 75 years to life in prison. On February 27, 2018, a jury convicted Green of the first-degree murder of Tamisha Ridge and being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true that Green personally used a firearm that caused the victim's death. The Court found that Green had suffered a prior conviction, felony assault with a deadly weapon, which is a strike under California's three strikes law.

Green and the victim had and on and off relationship for more than 10 years. After 5 years of no contact, they resumed their relationship until the victim broke up with Green a few months later. On May 14, 2014, Green entered the victim's residence, went into her bedroom and shot her in the head with a shotgun.

Defendant Convicted for Attempted Murder of Woman in Her Home

DATE: June 15, 2018

CASE: Jordan Lynch (Case #17FE014700)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Sam Alexander, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit


Jordan Lynch was convicted by a jury of attempted murder and burglary. The jury also found true allegations that Lynch personally used a deadly weapon and caused great bodily injury.

On August 9, 2017, Lynch attempted to enter the 47-year-old female victim's bedroom through the window. The victim woke up and closed the window before he could enter. Lynch then went to a sliding door and used a metal pole to smash the glass and gain entry. He immediately grabbed the victim and stabbed her in the side, lacerating her kidney. When she tried to get away, Lynch stabbed her in the neck. The victim was finally able to escape and neighbors were awakened by her screams. When Lynch tried to flee, the neighbors tackled him and held him until police arrived.

At sentencing, the Court will determine an allegation that Lynch has a prior 2016 strike conviction for robbery. If found true, Lynch faces a maximum sentence of 27 years in prison. Sentencing is set for July 13, 2018, at 2:00 p.m. in Department 21 before the Honorable Steve White.

Twenty-five years is long, long time. I don't know your dad, and I have no clue about his situation or state of mind back then and in the time since. I can't imagine doing that to a child of any age, though.

Do what you feel in your heart is best. But in my opinion, there's no obligation here. God bless you, Julie.

Dear Dave,

When is the right time to buy a house when someone is following your Baby Steps plan?

- Samuel

Dear Samuel,

That's a good question. Let's start by going over the first few Baby Steps.

Baby Step 1 is saving \$1,000 for a beginner emergency fund. Baby Step 2 is paying off all consumer debt, from smallest to largest,

using the debt snowball. Baby Step 3 is where you increase your emergency fund to the point where you have three to six months of expenses set aside.

Once you've done all that you can begin saving for a home. I'll call it Baby Step 3b. For folks looking to buy a house, I advise saving enough money for a down payment of at least 20 percent. I don't beat people up over mortgage debt, but I do advise them to get a 15-year, fixed rate loan, where the payments are no more than 25 percent of their monthly take-home pay.

Doing it this way may take a little more time, and delay your dream of becoming a homeowner a bit, but buying a house when you're broke is the quickest way I know to turn something that should be a blessing into a burden!




