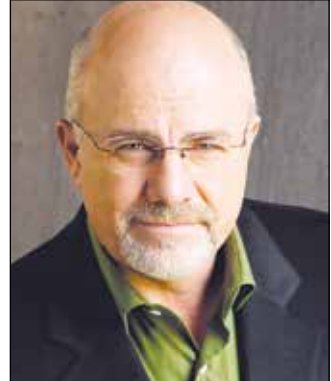

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Carmichael's Vietnam Memorial was this week, setting for commemorations to those who served their country. Flags, music, prayers and remembrances were shared by more than 150 visitors, many of them veterans.

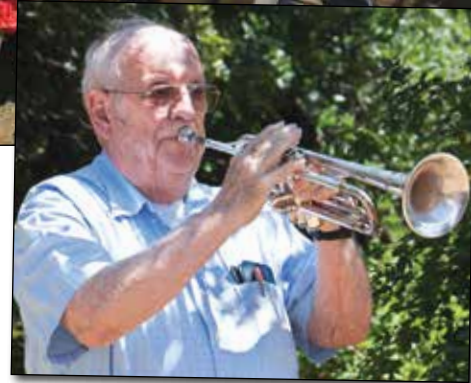
The first-known monument to the Vietnam War in the USA is in Earl J. Koobs Nature Area, at the now-shuttered La Sierra High School. First dedicated in 1973, the lofty steel structure and its plaque honor La Sierra graduates who died during Vietnam years. Patriotic ceremonies have been held in its shadow for 17 years.

A paternal figure at the tributes, Earl

("Ranger Jack") Koobs, was a La Sierra teacher who taught many volunteers or draftees for Vietnam service. The science teacher also fostered development of the nature study area that bears his name. Koobs died in 2015. Under the aegis of Carmichael Kiwanis and other organizations, his reserve is now a center for community service. At least 15 Boy Scout Eagle Scout projects have been completed in its five acres; Carmichael Organic Gardening Club maintains a butterfly garden; California Montessori Project and many other community supporters maintain vegetation and trails for environmental education.

California Law Allows Time Off to Vote on Election Day

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - To help ensure voters can get to the polls on Election Day, June 5, California law allows workers to take up to two hours off work to vote if they are unable to during non-work hours.

"Californians should make a plan now for how they will cast a ballot on Election Day," Secretary of State Alex Padilla said. "Every registered voter has a right to cast their ballot before the polls close. If you can't make it to your polling place outside of working hours, you have the right to take time off to vote, without a loss of pay."

California Elections Code section 14000 allows workers up to two hours off, without a loss of pay, to vote if they do not have enough time to do so in their non-work hours. The law requires workers to notify their employers two working days before the election if they need to take time off to vote.

Polling places are open between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Also, every California employer is required to post, in a visible location, a notice informing employees of their rights at least 10 days before an election. Sacramento Taco Festival Adds Wrestling DJ Big Al Sams to Host This Year's Taco Eating Contests

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The 5th Annual Sacramento Taco Festival, which is held on Del Paso Boulevard between El Camino Ave. and Arden Way, is comprised of several event components that has made it fun and unique among Northern California festivals. Three of these events have become especially popular among Taco enthusiasts, the Taco Eating Contest, Northern California's Chihuahua Beauty Contest, and Professional Wrestling. But it's

the new contests that will focus on culture and history.

This year's Festival has attracted the nationally recognized disc jockey and TV personality Big Al Sams, a favorite among fans of KHYL 101.5 (V101fm) and "Mark at the Movies." Big Al, originally from Chicago, will be hosting this year's Taco Eating Contest, which is being sponsored by V101fm/iHeart Radio. It is a contest that measures the person who can eat the most regular size tacos in 60

seconds, with the winner walking away with The Taco Trophy, a guaranteed \$100 prize money plus the pot collected from the \$5 entry fee. Last year's winner set a new record of eating 6 tacos in 53 seconds.

"We're very excited to have Big Al Sams join us this year as host of the Taco Eating Contest," Says Festival Coordinator Mina Perez. "He's going to make this annual contest much more fun than what it already is and I understand some of the wrestlers

are joining the competition too."

Speaking about wrestlers, Action Coast Empire is back for its third year providing some action-packed grappling, that will include some of Northern California's most popular wrestlers, including "The Russian Wolf" Alexis Darevko and North Sacramento's own Brittney Wonder. The afternoon wrestling will feature for the first time, a much sought after wrestler - the very ominous

Sacramento's Society for the Blind Receives \$10,000 from Sierra Sacramento Valley

Grant Will Provide Assistive Tools for Blind and Low-Vision Seniors

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Seniors with vision loss in the Sacramento region will receive assistive tools and technology, thanks to a \$10,000 grant from Sierra Sacramento Valley Medical Society Alliance. The grant will help fund Society for the Blind's Senior IMPACT Project that empowers people 55 and older with alternative, non-visual techniques and skills that enable them to perform day-to-day tasks and activities so they can maintain or increase their independence.

"We are so grateful to Sierra Sacramento Valley Medical Society Alliance for providing vital assistive tools for seniors with vision loss," said Shari Roeseler, executive director, Society for the Blind. "This critical funding will provide tools like white canes and digital voice recorders so seniors losing their vision can stay independent and confident while living their lives to the fullest."

The Senior IMPACT Project includes an eight-day retreat offered monthly at Society for the Blind that gives seniors an immersion

experience where they learn alternative techniques and skills to travel safely, efficiently and independently. They practice alternative techniques and use adapted tools to perform tasks of daily living including cooking, cleaning, shopping, home maintenance, organization, personal finance and more. They learn how to use the latest in assistive technology and mobile devices for home, school and work, and they learn Braille. Participants receive individualized attention from instructors and mentors who are blind or low vision, and they have the opportunity to join in discussion groups with peers on issues around vision loss and participate in community activities.

For those unable to attend retreats, Society for the Blind sends instructors to their homes to teach skills and offer resources. The Senior IMPACT Project also includes monthly peer support groups for English and Spanish speakers and workshops throughout the year.

For more than 60 years,

Society for the Blind has created innovative ways to empower individuals living with low vision or blindness to discover, develop and achieve their full potential. Society for the Blind has grown from a dedicated group of volunteers to a nationally recognized agency and the only comprehensive rehabilitative teaching center that provides services for a 27-county region of northern California. The nonprofit provides low-vision eye care, life and job skills training, mentorship, and access to tools to maintain independence for 6,000 youth, adults and seniors experiencing vision loss each year. California State Parks Invite Visitors to Recreate Safely and Responsibly in 2018

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - California State Parks invites new or avid outdoor enthusiasts to invent their adventures this year within the nation's largest state park system. Memorial Day weekend kicked off the busiest time of the year for the 280 state parks, drawing large crowds of visitors. Whether they plan on biking, hiking, surfing, recreating on a boat or off-highway vehicle, exploring the desert or redwoods, or simply enjoying time with friends and family, it is important for them to plan ahead and learn about the parks they are visiting.

Safety tips and information on laws can be found online at www.parks.ca.gov/safetytips. Below are some outdoor tips:

General Tips

Rules/Laws: Take the time to visit the webpage of the park you plan on visiting and learn about the rules, such as parking, if dogs are allowed and closed areas. It is also important to learn the laws for recreating in boats and/or off-highway vehicles (OHV). **Cell Phones:** Do not rely on your phones. Coverage can be spotty or nonexistent. **Weather:** Check the weather and bring appropriate clothing to fit the season. **Itinerary:** No matter what type of recreation activity you will be participating in, leave an itinerary of your trip with a family member/friend with information such as name/

age of all participants, travel destination and expected return date. This will ensure law enforcement personnel have a better understanding of your location in the event of a rescue. **Safety:** Carry a first aid kit and dress appropriately for your outdoor adventure. Avoid alcohol. It is against the law to operate a boat or off-highway vehicle with a blood alcohol concentration of 0.08 percent or more. Use the buddy system and hike with a friend or family member. Always make sure you have plenty of water and snacks with you. **Keep It Clean:** Pack it in and pack it out. **Wildlife:** View wildlife from a distance. Never feed or touch them.

Water Recreation

Protect Your Loved Ones: Know your limits. Swimming in a lake, ocean or river is different than swimming in a pool. If someone is in distress, seek help from a lifeguard or call 9-1-1 if one is not available. **Ocean Rip Currents:** If you get caught in one, stay calm and do not fight the current. Swim or float parallel to the shore until you are out of the current and then swim toward the shore. **Swimming:** Never swim alone and be cautious at unguarded beaches, lakes and rivers. Whenever possible, swim at a lifeguard protected beach. Wear a properly-fitted life jacket: Always check the label for correct use and size. Wearing one can increase survival time and provide some thermal protection against the onset of cold water shock. It can also keep you afloat until someone can

rescue you. Actively supervise children at all times: Appoint a designated "water watcher," taking turns with other adults. Do not assume that someone is watching them. Do not enter the water if it is too cold: Waterways continue to rise as snow melts and can be dangerously cold and swift. Even the strongest swimmers can be stunned by cold water and become incapacitated.

Off-Highway Vehicle Recreation

Equipment: Use proper equipment such as protective clothing, goggles, a proper helmet, gloves and spark arrester. **Natural Resources:** Tread lightly and stay on designated trails.

Camping & Hiking

Map Guides: Get a map of the area you will be camping or hiking. **Natural Resources:** Stay on designated trails. You are not only protecting natural resources, but you are also ensuring that you do not get lost. **Snakes:** Be cautious of where you are stepping. If you see a snake, maintain a distance of 6 feet. Most bites occur when people get too close or try to touch them.

 "FunnyBone."

"We were perhaps the first festival to feature professional wrestling as part of the entertainment," says Perez. "And our tradition continues this year because of its popularity and we always make sure we have men and women wrestling."

Perez adds that the unique entertainment throughout the festival is what makes it fun, interesting, and ideal for the whole family.

"The contests and people winning prizes is one of things the Taco Festival is becoming known for," she says. "This year we're adding a singing contest

where all contestants must sing at least a minute and a half of the Academy Award winning song "Remember Me" from the Disney/PIXAR move "COCO," and we also have a Crazy Hat contest - it's a light-hearted attempt to rival the Kentucky Derby's hat wearing tradition, and which history we share."

Once called Rancho Del Paso, in the mid to late 1800s North Sacramento was the world's largest racehorse breeding and pasturing ranch owned by James Ben Ali Haggin, whose horse "Ben Ali," became the only Kentucky Derby winner from the region. But it was the great stallion "Salvatore" that won international

fame by beating Tenny in a challenge race that captured the hearts of millions. Ridden by legendary Jockey Issac Murphy, an African American whose tragic story is yet to be formally told, Salvatore beat Tenny by a nose in the June 25, 1890 race.

The 5th Annual Sacramento Taco Festival is scheduled for June 2, 2018 from 10:30 am to 6:30 pm on Del Paso Boulevard in Old North Sacramento. Tickets are \$7 online (Eventbrite) and \$10 at the gate. Children 12 and under are free. For more information or tickets visit www.sactacofest.com.

The Folsom Bass Team took on the Delta waters on a perfect spring day for a fishing tournament. Boats were launched and fish were weighed in at the Delta Loop's B&W Resort for the team's May tournament.

Jerry Lawler and Marshal Smith took home first place honors with a big fish of 7.27 pounds and a total weight of 22.03 pounds.

Tom Manley and Michael Allen placed in second with a big fish of 5.40 pounds and a total of 19.96. Allen credited Manley for his familiarity with the waters. "He took us to the right spot," said Allen.

Mike Bugliarello and Gabe Luna finished in third place with a total of 15.99 pounds, but it

was Bugliarello's 9.09 pounder that took top big fish honors.

Overall, the 19 boats and 38 fishermen caught 88 fish combining for 207.25 pounds on the day, averaging 2.36 pounds per fish.

Ryan McGinnis currently ranks atop the team's Angler of the Year standings, followed by Pat Rounds and Mike Bugliarello. With their second place finish, Michael Allen and Tom Manley have moved into the top 10 overall and now rank eighth and tenth place, respectively.

"The Folsom Bass Team started in 1988 as a group of Folsom prison guards who had a passion for bass fishing. In fact, the club meetings used to be held at the prison itself," according to the team's mission statement. "Since its humble beginnings

the membership has grown and we now have members of all skill level and age. FBT's mission is to provide its members opportunities to learn about bass fishing in our local area through monthly meetings and tournaments. We emphasize the camaraderie and fun that comes from the sport of bass fishing."

Now in its 30th year, the team has seen a lot of faces come and go throughout the decades, but one thing remains the same – no one reveals any secrets. "We were all tight lipped back then," said Kris Sisto, an original member and former correctional officer himself. "Now, everybody lies."

The team's next tournament is a two day event on June 2 and 3 at Lake Shasta's Bridge Bay.

Sacramento County DA Reports



Former Teacher Sentenced for Attempted Possession of Child Porn, Use of Concealed Camera

DATE: April 30, 2018
CASE: Scott Macmillan (Case #17FE001087)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Bruce Chang, Cyber Crimes Unit

The Honorable Robert Twiss sentenced Scott Macmillan to 30 days county jail, 3 years probation and required him to register as a sex offender. On October 19, 2017, Macmillan pled no contest to attempted possession of child pornography, attempted use of a concealed camera to take photos of an adult victim for sexual purposes, and use of a concealed camera to take photos of a minor for sexual purposes.

Macmillan was a teacher at Heron School in Natomas. Several students noticed he appeared to be taking photos of female students' private parts with his cell phone. Some students started watching Macmillan and managed to record him as he used his phone to record a 12-year-old student under her desk. One student notified school authorities, who notified the Sacramento Police Department. Police found Macmillan's phone in his car with multiple images of what appeared to be the chest and genital areas of girls. An adult staff member also reported that Macmillan had approached her with his cell phone as if he was trying to take a photo or video under her skirt.

Career Criminal Convicted for Attempted Murder of Officers

DATE: May 18, 2018
CASE: Justin Hurst (Case #16FE017117)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney James Wax, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Justin Hurst was convicted by a jury of attempted murder and assault with a semi-automatic firearm on a peace officer, reckless evading of a peace officer, possession of an assault weapon, possession of a short-barreled shotgun and four counts of felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true enhancements that Hurst intentionally discharged a firearm and that he knew and intended to fire at peace officers.

On September 1, 2016, two Citrus Heights police officers contacted Justin Hurst, who was asleep in a parked vehicle. Hurst was on Post-Release Community Supervision and had a felony warrant. Officers directed Hurst to keep his hands on the steering wheel, but he instead sped away and led the officers on a high-speed chase in a residential neighborhood. During the chase, Hurst fired multiple rounds at the officers. Hurst crashed his car into a resident's fence,

and was taken to a hospital to treat his injuries. A search of his car revealed 13 cartridge casings, four firearms and boxes of ammunition.

Additional allegations that Hurst has a prior 1999 strike conviction for first-degree burglary and three prior convictions for being a felon in possession of a firearm will be determined at his sentencing hearing.

If those allegations are found true, Hurst faces a maximum sentence of 42 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for June 29, 2018, at 2:00 p.m. in Department 21 before the Honorable Steve White.

Defendant Convicted of Multiple Child Sexual Assault Charges

DATE: May 18, 2018
CASE: Andrew G. Young Jr. (Case #13F07569)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Brian Morgan, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Andrew Young Jr. was convicted by a jury of 7 counts of committing lewd and lascivious acts on a minor under the age of 14, and one count of committing a lewd and lascivious act on a minor under the age of 14 with force. The jury also found true that Young had suffered a prior conviction for committing a lewd and lascivious act on a minor under the age of 14.

The victim was a family member who was between the ages of 12 and 13 when the sexual assaults were occurring.

Young faces a maximum sentence of 440 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for June 15, 2018, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 27 before the Honorable Steven Gevercer.

Defendant Convicted for Sexually Assaulting Two Family Members

DATE: May 23, 2018
CASE: Robert Dew (Case #17FE000718)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Monica Robinson, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

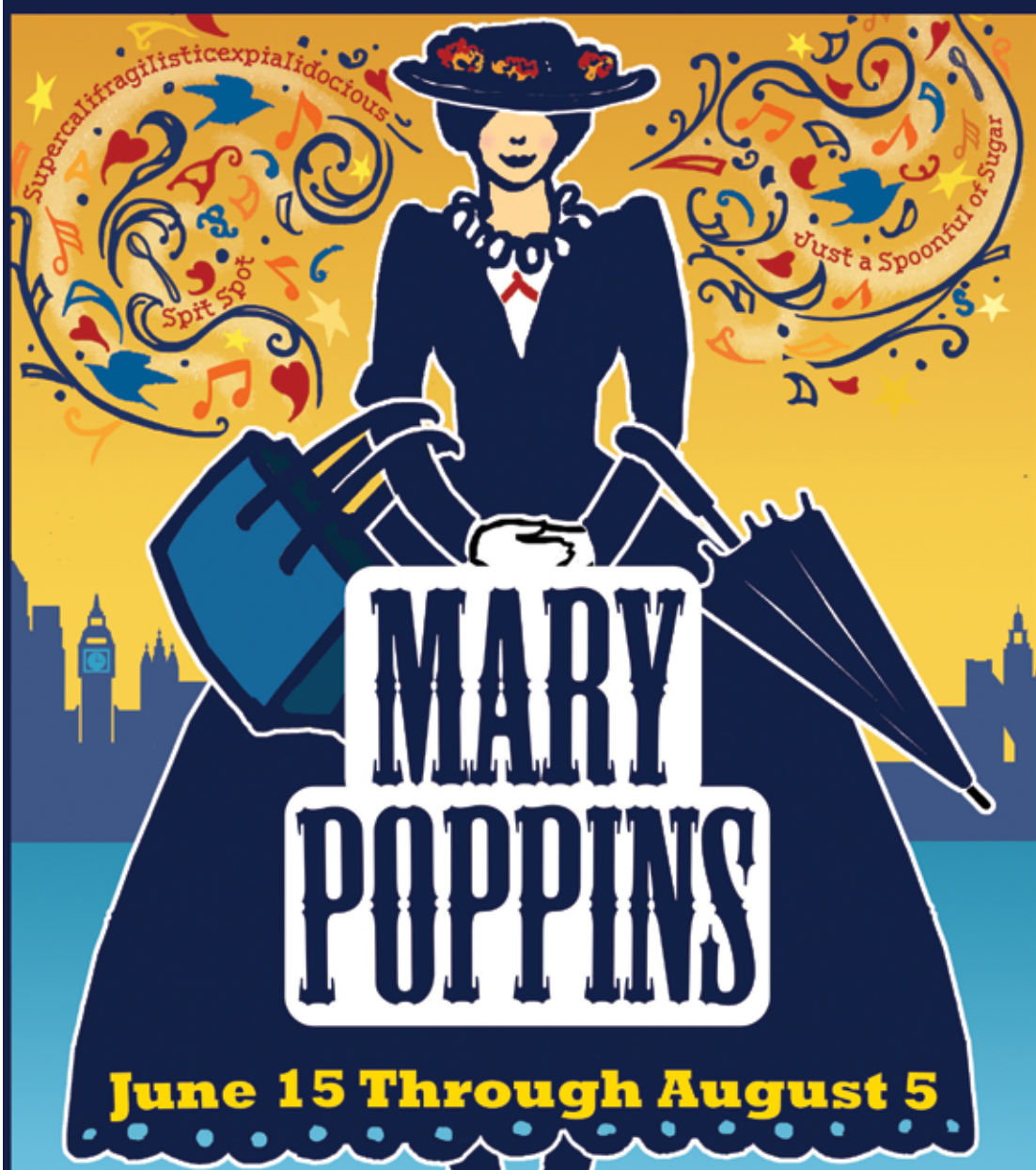
Robert Dew was convicted by a jury of eight counts of committing lewd acts on a child under the age of 14. The jury also found true a multiple victims allegation.

In 2016, Dew sexually assaulted a family member when she was 5 years old. During the course of the investigation into the assault, it became known to law enforcement that Dew had also sexually assaulted another family member from 2000 to 2002.

Dew faces a maximum sentence of 22 years in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for June 29, 2018, in Department 11 before the Honorable Trena Burger-Plavan. ★
