The Lion in Winter

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - American River Nature watchers recently beheld hungry sea lions swimming through Arcade, Carmichael and Fair Oaks. Winter visits by the species are not uncommon but the recent sightings were considered rare for the distances the mammals had traveled inland.

In the space of two weeks, there were two separate sightings - thought to be the same individual - at Nimbus Dam. The 90ft high concrete wall stopped his migration and hours of happy hunting followed. "You could hear him before you saw him," said a

transfixed angler. "He was roaring like an elephant. I saw him surface with a fish trashing in his mouth. He swallowed it whole - head-first."

Battling against the dam's white-water outflow, the muscular visitor gorged. When exhaustion took over, he slipped briefly back toward the Nimbus Fish Hatchery, only to return to the floodgate again and again. After a day, he vanished downstream but likely spread the word among fellows nearer Sacramento. Last Friday, not one but three of his species were seen laboring upstream near Watt Avenue. The trailblazer alone returned to feast at Nimbus. Here, angler Jason Nicholas put down his rod to watch a large

steelhead being devoured. "In 30 years that I've fished here," he observed, "I've never seen anything like this."

Around 6ft long (weighing perhaps 400 pounds) this adult had journeyed more than 130 river miles from the Pacific Ocean. Though quite a feat, his trek is not a record. Another sea lion reached the Woodbridge Dam near Lodi in 1997. "They're salt-water animals but they follow the fish," explained California Department of Fish and Wildlife spokesman Andrew Hughsan. "They come inland from the (San Francisco) Bay for late salmon and steelhead. They like the fish that are rich in meat and fat."

The mammals frustrate

anglers and have occasionally provoked violence from some who regard them as poachers. "They're the dogs of the ocean," says Hughsan. "They're curious and friendly; they'll steal fish, but they won't hurt anyone."

"We don't monitor sea lions or do anything about them unless they're distressed. A marine mammal inland is a naturally-occurring phenomenon. If you see one, don't feed it. They need to be left alone to catch fish. It's a cool sight. People should just stand back and enjoy the moment."

Footnote: sea lions are Federally protected. Anyone seeing harassment or injury toward the species should call the police or a park ranger. ★

Expanded Hours, Products and Training Will Benefit Local Residents with Vision Loss

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Sacramento region residents with vision loss will have greater access to low-vision and blindness technology and products thanks to a new partnership between Sacramento non-profit Society for the Blind and North State Assistive Technology in Chico that began Feb. 1. Through the partnership, Society for the Blind's onsite retail store at 1238 S Street in Sacramento is now open 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday through Friday and will include weekend and evening appointments. The store, now called North State Assistive Technology at Society for the Blind, offers an expanded collection of assistive technology products with better pricing, in-home delivery and set-up,

training and online shopping. For more information, visit SocietyForTheBlind.org/Store.

"This partnership ensures a one-of-a-kind retail store for our region that continues to offer products and devices for people with vision loss while also expanding to provide even better service to the many Sacramento region residents who are learning how to achieve fulfilling lives with vision loss," said Shari Roeseler, executive director, Society for the Blind.

The expanded store features products and devices for people with low vision and those with no functional vision, including canes, talking clocks and calculators, kitchen products, and various video imaging and optical reader devices.

"This is a wonderful opportunity to bring more products and services to people living with low vision and blindness throughout all of Northern California," said Cory Hanosh, owner, North State Assistive Technology.

For more than 60 years, Society for the Blind has created innovative ways to empower individuals living with low vision or blindness to discover, develop and achieve their full potential. Society for the Blind has grown from a dedicated group of volunteers that included the Lions Clubs of America to a nationally recognized agency and the only comprehensive rehabilitative teaching center that provides services for a 27-county region of

Paying it Forward

Express Employment Hiring Drive Generates Funding for Sacramento's Women's Empowerment

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Express Employment Professionals (EMP) NE Sacramento has again put women in need at the top of their philanthropic agenda, which means more homeless women across the Sacramento region will have an opportunity to change this year.

Since 2015, EMP has donated \$10 to a nonprofit of its choosing for every first-time job placement booked through its agency during Annual Pay It Forward Holiday Hiring Drive, which runs from November to December. EMP has more than 750 franchised locations across the country and each conduct their own individual philanthropic programs.

In 2015, Express Employment staff voted to support Women's Empowerment of Sacramento (WEP) through as part of its giving back campaign. The 2016 drive, the sixth annual campaign, generated 62 first-time job placements, culminating in a total of \$620.00 for WEP. On January 29, the agency's General Manager, Kristen Garl, and Kathryn Ontiveros, EMP accounting specialist, presented WEP with their donation before a backdrop of photo stories of hundreds of just some of the women who have been helped via the programs offered at WEP since its inception in 2001.

"We are very proud to support Women's Empowerment Sacramento," said Garl. "We have worked with a handful of nonprofit organizations over the last six years and they are all wonderful organizations. But three years ago, as reviewed our goals for the campaign, our staff voted and WEP was selected hands-down by the majority of our team."

The money will go to support WEP programs, which include a comprehensive, nine-week job-readiness

education and emotional empowerment workshop for area homeless women. That includes, resume preparation classes, mock interviewing, Internet job search training, budgeting, access to the agency's dress for success clothing closet, transportation and even free, onsite childcare.

In addition, women enrolled in WEP programs are paired with an employment specialist, social worker and a volunteer career mentor to help them identify their skills and interests and realize their career goals. Getting off the street and into a job, experts agree, is the sure-fire way for homeless individuals to create a pathway to a new life and end the cycle of

poverty.

To date EMP has donated a total of \$1,640 to WEP via its Pay It Forward campaign.

"We have an amazing relationship with Express Employment," said WEP's Development Manager, Holly Byrom.

"The support we receive each year is significant, and their mission is very closely aligned with our goal to help women get out of poverty and into a job, a home and a new life."

More than 1,500 women with a combined total of some 3,500 children have benefited from the classes and services offered through WEP, 521 in 2017 alone. Roughly 80

percent of those served, including the 157 in 2017, have successfully secured a job or enrolled in school or vocational training upon completion of their WEP program.

WEP was named Nonprofit of the Year by the Nonprofit Resource Center in 2009, one of the most prestigious honors a nonprofit can receive in the Sacramento region. And, in 2014, WEP was chosen as the Organization of the Year at the inaugural Women's Appreciation Awards by Congresswoman Doris Matsui, then Senate President pro Tem Darrell Steinberg and Assemblyman, Roger Dickinson.

WEP is a private organization and

does not receive any federal funding. Its social enterprise program generates roughly \$54,000 in income annually. Grants and family foundations account for roughly \$400,000 toward its annual \$1.1 million budget. Remaining funds are generated through a combination of individual gifts, the United Way and Special Events.

"We know the pathway to breaking the cycle of homelessness is through employment," said WEP Executive Director Lisa Culp, formerly on staff at Sacramento's Loaves and Fishes. "Our participants are 100 percent homeless women. So we promise them that if they come in and complete our program, we will help them find a job, a home and a new life."

It takes money to offer all of the services made available to local homeless women in need. Programming costs for WEP account for \$723,000 alone. As such Garl said her agency's support for WEP is ongoing. As her team connects with existing and potential employers, schools and other entities, it networks for homeless women and WEP, encouraging employers to believe in second chances and supporting WEP's social enterprise, the Get a Job Kit.

The kit, which sells for \$15.99, is a colorfully printed "tool box" for job seekers, which includes a comprehensive packet of job readiness guide sheets and resources. It was created for WEP clients initially, but it is adding value to the community at large, especially wherever there are students or other job seekers trying to secure long-term employment.

"We are always pushing for support for Women's Empowerment everywhere we can," said Garl. "We could not be more thrilled to be connected with WEP and its mission, and intend to keep supporting them for as long as we can, in as many ways possible." ★

New Veteran's Commission Approved

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors recently authorized the adoption of an ordinance to create a Veterans Advisory Commission for Sacramento County.

The Commission will be composed of five veterans appointed by the Board of Supervisors, with one nominee from each Supervisor. Its purpose will be to advise the Board and County staff on matters pertaining to veterans in Sacramento County. Terms will be two years, with a limit of no more than four consecutive years serving on the Commission.

The Commission will work with the County Veterans Services Office to provide an annual report to the Board of Supervisors on issues pertaining to veterans in Sacramento County. There is no cost associated with creating this commission, but it will greatly benefit the veteran

population of Sacramento County.

There are more than 87,000 veterans living in the County. Many veterans come to Sacramento County for services, such as assistance with veterans benefits, employment and training, cash assistance, housing, behavioral health, and business assistance. There are also many veteran's groups and representatives that work with the County, through Board of Supervisor offices and the County Veterans Services Office, but there is no formal and central body that focuses the County's attention on the variety of issues pertaining to veterans.

The creation of such a commission assumes it operates under the following parameters:

- Purpose - The Commission would represent all veterans in Sacramento

County by advising the Board of Supervisors and County staff on matters pertaining to veterans, holding informal public meetings, providing the public with information, and receiving comments relative to veterans' issues.

- Membership - The Commission would be composed of five members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, with one nomination by each Supervisor. At the time of appointment, members would have to be: Residents of Sacramento County; Military veterans who served any length of time in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, or Coast Guard (operating under the War Department, Navy Department or Department of Defense), and Discharged or released under conditions other than dishonorable.

- Terms - Terms for an individual commissioner would be two years, with a limit of four consecutive years of service on the Commission (two terms). Former members of the Commission who have termed out may be reappointed to a vacant seat if two years have passed since the expiration of their final term.

Sacramento County Veteran Services' mission statement is "You served us. Now let us serve you." The creation of this commission is yet another method of faithfully serving those that have served us.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sutter's Fort visitors will have the opportunity to step back in time to the 1840s to understand the two different ways emigrants originally came to California – by land or by sea – while sharing the unique challenges they faced and what daily life was like during their journeys. As background, Sutter's Fort was once home to sailors who "jumped ship," trappers who became overland trail guides because of the failing fur trade, wagon train parties looking for a new life, and soldiers who served in the Mexican-American War and whose services were terminated in California – 3,000 miles from their homes in the east.

California State Parks, Sutter's Fort State Historic Park (SHP) and Friends of Sutter's Fort are proud to present an interactive and fun "Hands on History: By Land and By Sea" event on Saturday, February 17, 2018, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. With interpretive themes that change monthly, the popular and

interactive "Hands on History" events typically happen on the third Saturday all year long.

As an event highlight, some of the special hands-on activities awaiting Fort visitors include helping to pack a wagon while making choices about what to bring along for their journey of a lifetime, determining latitude with a sailing sextant, hoisting a laden barrel, weaving rope, learning simple knots, creating maps with available resources, and even marching to the beat of a military drum. And, of course, popular demonstrations of black powder weaponry in action will take place including the crowd-favorite firing of Sutter's cannon. Defendant Pleads to Felony Real Estate Fraud Charges

DATE: January 12, 2018

CASE: Dennis Joseph Giacometti (Case #16FE011744)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Ruth Young, Real Estate Fraud Unit

Dennis Joseph Giacometti (aka Dennis Jacopetti) pled no contest to forgery, grand theft and filing false documents. Giacometti also admitted the aggravated white collar enhancement and the enhancement for commission of a felony while released from custody on another case.

Giacopetti advertised the businesses Legal Aid Services of California and Legal Aid of California online and through Craigslist. Although he was not an attorney, Giacometti represented himself as an attorney in order to obtain clients. Through these false representations, he unlawfully obtained legal fees from multiple victims. Giacometti also filed false legal documents and illegally acted as a foreclosure consultant.

Giacopetti will be sentenced to 12 years in prison and ordered to pay restitution to all victims named in the complaint. Sentencing is set for February 18, 2018 at 8:30 a.m. in Department 62 before the Honorable Gregory Haas.

This case was investigated and prosecuted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Real Estate Fraud Unit.

Defendant Convicted for Attempted Murder, Assault, Arson

DATE: January 16, 2018

CASE: Richard Castello Galindo Jr. (Case #15F03295)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Andrea Morris, Felony Prosecution Unit

Richard Galindo was convicted by a jury of one count of attempted murder with willful, premeditation and deliberation, five counts of assault with a deadly weapon, and one count of arson of an inhabited structure.

Galindo and the victim were friends. On June 2, 2015, Galindo drove to the victim's apartment. When the victim refused to meet with Galindo, Galindo became angry and banged on the apartment door demanding the victim speak with him. The victim's friend, roommate, and two small

children were also in the apartment at the time. The victim stood at a second-story window and an argument ensued between him and Galindo. Galindo threatened to burn the apartment down. He then lit an object on fire and threw it through the first-floor window, which ignited the downstairs of the small apartment. The victim and everyone in his apartment barely escaped out of the back door. The apartment was completely destroyed by the fire, and there was severe damage to neighboring apartments.

Galindo has a prior 2003 strike conviction for assault with a deadly weapon. He faces a maximum sentence of 36 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for February 22, 2018 at 1:30 p.m. in Department 31 before the Honorable Michael Kenny.

Inmate Convicted of Assault, Weapons Charges

DATE: February 2, 2018

CASE: Erik St. John (Case #15F02031)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Jennifer Tucker, Prison Crimes Unit

Erik St. John was convicted by a jury of assault on a non-confined person by an inmate with a deadly weapon and a personal use allegation was found true. He was also convicted of four counts of possession of an inmate-manufactured stabbing weapon and resisting an executive officer.

On February 10, 2015, California State Prison-Sacramento inmate Erik St. John refused to submit to handcuffs and exit his cell. He also secured a bed sheet to the cell light fixture to hide behind. After many attempts to get St. John to submit to handcuffs, the cell extraction team entered the cell. St. John leaped out from behind the sheet, reached around one of officer's shields and stabbed the officer several times with an inmate-manufactured weapon. St. John was eventually subdued by officers. On September 25, 2015, St. John was found to be in possession of another inmate-manufactured weapon. On June 28, 2016, officers searched St. John's solely occupied cell and found two inmate-manufactured weapons and another inmate-manufactured weapon was found in his cell on October 13, 2016.

St. John has a prior 2006 strike conviction for criminal threats with a hate crime allegation and a 2014 strike conviction for arson.

He faces a maximum sentence of 25 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for March 9, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 29 before the Honorable Geoffrey Goodman. ★

What the Legalization of Marijuana Means for You

Prior to the passing of Prop 64, marijuana was only legal to those who obtained a medical marijuana license approved by a licensed medical professional. Although California has legalized pot, counties and cities have the ability to opt out. We've provided some help information below for your convenience.

5 Things YOU Need to Know About Prop 64

1. You must be 21 or over to purchase marijuana.
2. You cannot smoke marijuana within 1,000 feet of a school, day care center or youth center while children are present.
3. CA prohibits the sale of *non-medical* marijuana users under age 21. Although *medical* marijuana can still be used by people under
4. A state license issued by the Bureau of Marijuana Control is required to sell and grow in which strict rules and regulations will have to be abided by.
5. Selling pot without a license can result in a misdemeanor charge and up to 6 months in jail and a \$500 fine.

If you don't mind covering your company's expenses and getting reimbursed, but you don't want to go into debt, you'll have to save and build up a \$5,000 business expense fund in a separate checking account. This should be used *only* for business expenses, and what's spent should be replenished immediately when they reimburse you.

Boss says get a credit card

Dear Dave,
 I recently got a new job that requires monthly expenses of almost \$5,000 that are reimbursed. I can't swing that kind of money right now, and my company told me to get a credit card to cover things. I'm trying to get out of debt, and I don't like this idea. What should I do?

Dear John,
 Your company should be fronting the money for these expenses. When you talk about the cost of doing business, it's the responsibility of the company — not the employee — to pay expenses.

If I send someone on the road to make money for my company, I pay the bills. It doesn't matter if you're talking about hotel rooms, airfare, or rental cars, those are *my* expenses. If it's someone who travels a lot, we give them a company debit card. If it's just an occasional thing, we'll give them money out of petty cash. But a company shouldn't treat its employees this

You're in an unusual spot, John. Personally, I think this is an unprofessional way to run a business. But if you like your job, and want to stay without taking on any more debt, the good news is you'll only have to fill up your expense account one time.

Is this a bad idea?

Dear Rhonda,
 It's a *really* bad idea. Those two have no business thinking about a house right now, and his parents are about to make things even worse with their loving, misguided help.

If you need a co-signer, you're nowhere near ready to buy a home. They need to slow down. I mean, they're just engaged. They don't even need a house at this point. They should get married, live in a cheap apartment for a while, and work on paying off their debts. After that, they need to save up an emergency fund of three to six months of expenses, then start setting cash aside for a huge down payment on their first, modest home.

These two have a bad case of house fever. And mom and dad need to step back, look at things objectively, and realize they would not be blessing these kids by helping get them into a home they obviously can't afford!

County Board Approves Cultural Arts Awards Grant Program

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Tuesday, Jan. 23, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved the first-year funding for the 2018-20 Cultural Arts Awards Program (CAA) in the amount \$336,000. These funds will be distributed to the 59 local nonprofit arts and cultural organizations that were selected as recipients of the CAA Program by the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission.

Funded by Sacramento County and the City of Sacramento since 1991, the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission is a public agency devoted to supporting, promoting and advancing the arts in the region that also makes funding available to arts and nonprofit organizations with arts programming through the CAA Program that is offered every three years.

The CAA Program grants

assist with general operating expenses or project support to nonprofit arts and cultural organizations, government arts agencies, arts service organizations and community organizations with arts programming. These grants are funded annually from County Transient Occupancy Tax to support and enhance the quality of life in Sacramento through the support of public performances, exhibitions, festivals and major outreach programs for youths and disadvantaged populations.

Each of the 2018-20 CAA Program grantees conduct outreach programs targeting schools, senior citizens, and/or neighborhoods with limited cultural activities. For this cycle, the grantees include: theater, music, visual arts, dance, arts service, folk of traditional arts, media, literary, film, multi-disciplinary and community-based

organizations; and multicultural and culturally specific groups such as Asian, Latino/ Hispanic, African-American and groups that serve disabled and economically disadvantaged communities.

The application process for the 2018-20 CAA grant cycle began in April 2017 during which the Arts Commission received a total of 66 applications and after a comprehensive review process, recipients were scored and selected. Funding for the second and third year of the cycle is contingent on several factors including the submittal of a Mid-Cycle report that the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission staff will use to determine additional funding.

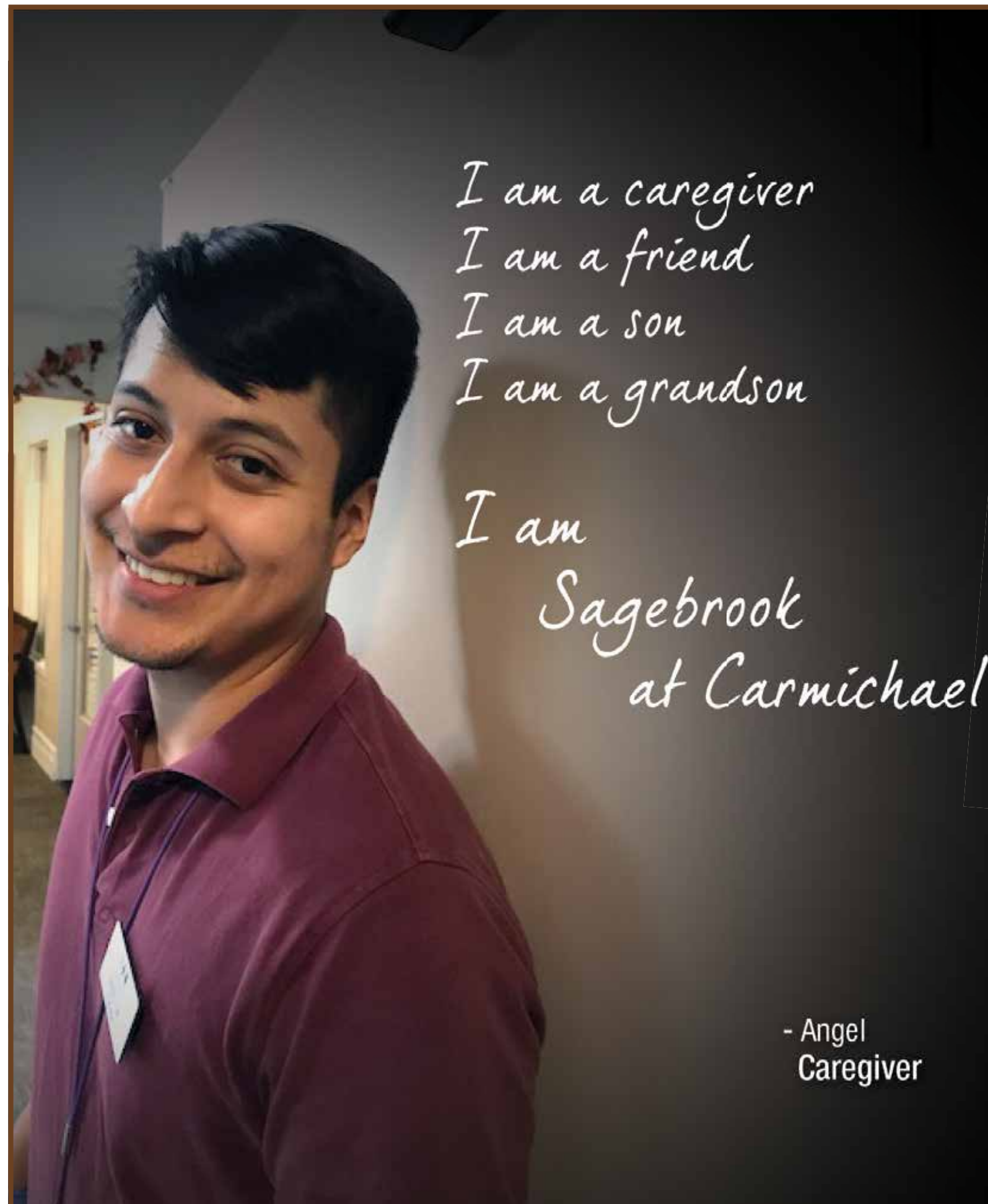

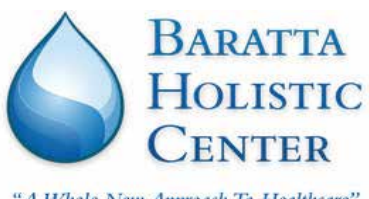
