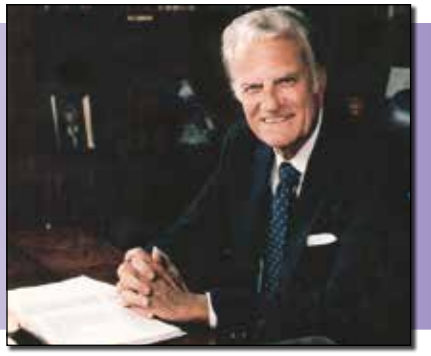

Hero Remembered with New Park Plaza

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - A slain Carmichael/Arcade deputy has been memorialized by Mission Oak Park District. Last weekend, Eastern Oak Park dedicated a "Danny Oliver Plaza," whose plaque recalls the officer's tragic end of watch. His widow and daughters joined Sheriff Scott Jones in unveiling the plaza arch.

"As long as there is evil in this world, there must be brave men and women ready to step into the fire," said Jones. A monument plaque proclaims Oliver as a golden rule adherent. "He treated the people on his calls as he would want his family

to be treated," says the inscription.

The plaza dedication came soon after undocumented immigrant Luis Bracamontes was found guilty of Oliver's murder and many other charges. Patrolling Auburn Boulevard in October 2014, the deputy and his partner observed a man and woman parked at a motel. Oliver approached their car and was shot in the head. The murder began a manhunt that spread to Placer County. Car-jacking two vehicles and shooting and injuring a car owner, the fugitives sped to Auburn. Near Interstate 80, Bracamontes fired on two Placer police officers. One, Investigator Michael Davis, died

CHP Investigation Locates Stolen Vehicles and Narcotics in Bust

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On February 21, 2018, the California Highway Patrol (CHP), Valley Division Investigative Services Unit (ISU), assisted by the Sacramento County Auto Theft Suppression Task Force (SACCATS), served a search warrant at a residence in Carmichael, California. In recent weeks, the CHP recovered numerous stolen vehicles in a Carmichael neighborhood. Upon further investigation, investigators identified a nearby residence where numerous stolen vehicles were being hidden. CHP investigators



served a search warrant at the residence which led to additional search warrants being served at a residence and storage facility in the City of Sacramento.

Twelve stolen vehicles (including cars, trailers, off highway vehicles, and a boat) were discovered on the properties. The total recovery value of the vehicles is estimated at \$35,000. Additionally, narcotics to include heroin, marijuana, and methamphetamine, a street value of approximately \$158,000.00, were discovered. Four arrests were made as a result of this operation. The investigation is ongoing.

The safe securement of the residence and property required coordination of 20 officers and investigators, as well as the assistance from the CHP's Air Operations Unit and K-9 Units. SACCATS is comprised of personnel from the California Highway Patrol, Sacramento County Probation, Citrus Heights Police Department, California Department of Motor Vehicles, and the California Department of Insurance. ★

FreeFall Stage Performance Delivers Laughs, Awareness

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - What do a classic, British comedic farce about mistaken identity, an old aunt from Brazil and human trafficking all have to do with one another?

Well, everything, if you are among the cast and crew members of FreeFall Stage, which is preparing for, among other productions and events, an 11-day run of Brandon Thomas's "Charley's Aunt" at the EPIC Bible College in Carmichael beginning March 1.

To begin with, the play: "Charley's Aunt," kicks off the FreeFall's 2018 season. The play was originally performed in three acts and reportedly broke historic performance records (1,466) for plays of all genres upon its debut run at London's Theatre Royal

in February of 1892. It promises to deliver everything you ever needed or wanted in a comedic play: love, laughs and lies, fake accents and impostors--all delivered with good intentions. No one gets hurt.

The play is one of six full-time productions on the FreeFall agenda for the season. FreeFall

got its start in Folsom in 2002 as T.H.E. (Talented Home Educated) Actors Workshop. Initially, it began by offering theatrical training to high school students. By 2012, productions were added and the name was changed and public performances were added to the mix.

Today, FreeFall Stage is Folsom's longest-running community theatre. It is thriving even without a permanent home. The lease on its original space at the Sutter Street Theatre was up in 2015, so the company has been producing nomadically at various locations around the Sacramento County area since.

FreeFall, says House and Stage Manager, Emma Eldridge, daughter of FreeFall Stage Founder, Dee Dee Eldridge, would

like to find another home in Folsom, but is keeping its options open.

"We are in search of a permanent space right now and ultimately our own performance center in Folsom," said Eldridge, who will play Miss Amy Spettigue in "Charley's Aunt." This is where we originally set down roots and we'd like to stay in Folsom if possible."

The company, says Eldridge, typically produces what she calls "family friendly" plays. But it also has been quietly building a name for itself for diving into darker social justice issues, specifically human trafficking, which it did with an 18-show run in Folsom in 2014 of Andrew Kooman's play, "She Has a Name." There is also a

Senator Gaines Introduces Bill to Help Families Save for College

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) today announced Senate Bill 1218, legislation that will help families save money for college by making contributions to 529 plans tax deductible in California.

“The cost to send kids to college has skyrocketed over the past several decades. Students who work, receive scholarships and/or financial aid, and get help from their parents still manage to graduate with tens of thousands of dollars racked up in student loans,” said Senator Gaines. “My hope is that by allowing the ability to deduct 529 contributions, it will increase savings and decrease the amount needed in student loans.”

A 529 savings plan is an investment account meant for

college tuition and other higher-education costs. The plans are usually sponsored by states and offer various benefits. Many states give the account owner full or partial state income tax deductions for their contributions to the state’s 529 plans. California is currently one of only nine states that do not offer a state income tax deduction or tax credit for contributions to the state’s 529 college savings plan.

Senate Bill 1218 will make contributions to 529 plans of up to \$20,000 per year tax deductible in California. This limit will be adjusted each year for inflation.

For reference, tuition and related costs (books, living expenses, etc.) at both the University of California and California State University systems have tripled over the last

15 years. The average cost for one year at a California State University is approximately \$25,000. The average cost for one year at a University of California is nearly \$35,000.

To attend the private University of Southern California, tuition alone will cost more than \$50,000 per year. Data from The Institute for College Access & Success shows that the average borrower from California has \$22,191 worth of student loan debt that still needs to be paid.

from his wounds.

At the time of Oliver's death, the 47-year-old deputy was assigned to Problem Oriented Policing in the Sheriff's North Area Division. Addressing his family and 200 park patrons, Supervisor Susan Peters hoped his service would not be forgotten. "A park is where we want to be safe," she said. "Our protection here, as well as in our homes and places of business, relies on the dedication of those who wear a badge. Everyone who enjoys this park and its special plaza should know that the fun that occurs here - in safety - is not without sacrifice."

Formerly home to the YMCA, Eastern Oak Park is one of 17 reserves administered by Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District. Its \$2 million redevelopment project began last year and includes walking paths, restrooms, pickleball

film version. Both explore the dark underworld of human sex trafficking in Thailand.

"We are known for being family friendly, yet at the same time we like doing shows that have a message," said Eldridge. "We were the first to produce and perform that play and then we toured it around Sacramento and Northern California until 2016."

In October, FreeFall will once again take a dive into the issue of human sex trafficking. FreeFall company staff have been meeting with and interviewing actual human trafficking victims, getting their stories down and preparing to produce those stories in a series of monologues.

"We will be producing original stories from survivors, men and women, and the intent is to raise awareness of this issue and keep the stories alive so that no one forgets how serious this is," said Eldridge. "It is an important

subject and we are excited to be working on this next project. It is very different from our typical productions because it will be a collection of monologues, so it is very special."

FreeFall, which is a non-profit running on donations, ticket sales and other forms of support, has partnered with some of the area's leading anti-trafficking entities, including 3Strands Global, Blue Heart International and Courage Worldwide.

The company currently has about six board members and seven on staff, with various numbers of actors, depending on the performance. Currently, there are 10 actors preparing for the March 1 run of "Charley's Aunt," which Eldridge says has been in the works for some time.

"We love this play," said Eldridge. "It's not a well-known play, but it is action-packed and very funny. Those of us who are in it are still laughing after

rehearsals. We looked at doing it last year but it didn't work out. We try to offer a good balance of themes and we haven't done a farce in a while. I think it's a good way to start out our season."

FreeFall's annual gala is also coming up. Set for April 21, the "April in Paris" themed event will benefit the company's productions, rental fees for spaces until it finds another permanent home, as well as classes for students, which are still offered. ★

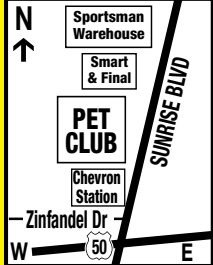

A Tribute to Billy Graham

Overstating the significance of Billy Graham is difficult. Arguably the most important religious leader of the 20th century, Graham presented the gospel to an estimated 215 million people through his many evangelistic campaigns around the world and to hundreds of millions more through radio, television, satellite broadcasts, print, and the internet. The pastor to presidents, Graham served as a spiritual advisor to chief executives from Dwight Eisenhower to George W. Bush. As depicted in an episode of the Netflix miniseries, "The Crown," Graham also provided spiritual counsel to Queen Elizabeth II of England.

Graham helped launch three major enterprises—the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, "Christianity Today" magazine, and Youth for Christ, a ministry to high school students. He helped shape numerous evangelical colleges, seminaries, and parachurch organizations including World Vision, World Relief, and the National Association

of Evangelicals. Graham also worked to bring the global Christian community together and to promote evangelistic efforts through international conferences held in Berlin, Lausanne, and Amsterdam.

Graham was as close being to a national pastor as the United States has ever had. He spoke at Richard Nixon's funeral in 1994, prayed at the inaugurations of five presidents, at a memorial service following the 1995 Oklahoma City bombing, and at a service in the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. for victims of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, and preached to survivors of Hurricane Katrina in 2006.

Throughout American history revivalists have helped win countless individuals to Christ. Graham followed a pattern established during the antebellum Second Great Awakening by Charles Finney—and continued by Dwight Moody in the Gilded Age and Billy Sunday in the early 20th century—of holding evangelistic meetings for a week or more in major cities. Modern technology enabled Graham to proclaim the

Christian message of salvation to many more people than any other preacher in history. Unlike his predecessors, Graham also held campaigns in metropolitan areas around the world, including many behind the Iron Curtain before the fall of communism. Moreover, Graham spread God's word through his "Hour of Decision" global radio program and numerous prime-time television specials.

Among the three million converts Graham's preaching produced are John Guest, a founder of the Coalition for Christian Outreach and the rector of two major Pittsburgh congregations, and Louis Zamperini, the protagonist of the book and movie "Unforgiven."

Many lesser known individuals also came to Christ through Graham's campaigns. Consider one example. In 2008 my wife and I spent three weeks in Romania volunteering with a ministry called "Least of These," which had worked for 15 years to help orphans and Gypsies. We stayed with a Romanian couple; the wife, Ramona, directed the ministry, and her husband Ghita,

pastored a church. Surprisingly, Nicolae Ceaușescu, one of communism's most brutal dictators, permitted Graham to hold a week-long crusade in Romania in June 1985. Growing up in Romania, Ghita knew nothing about Christianity, but he was intrigued by a billboard he read advertising the campaign and decided to attend. As he heard Graham preach, God tugged at his heart, and Ghita responded to the altar call and accepted Christ as his savior. His commitment to Christ led him to study at a Bible school and go into the ministry to advance the gospel in Romania.

While financial and sexual scandals rocked the world of televangelists and sexual abuse cases abounded among Catholic priests, Graham stood as a model of integrity. Graham honored his promise never to be alone with a woman other than his wife, and the finances of the Billy Graham Evangelical Association were open for inspection. During his six decades of ministry, he faced no serious accusations of misconduct of any kind.

In his more than 400 crusades held on six continents from 1947

to 2005, Graham preached the same basic message. He insisted that to have their sins forgiven, enjoy an intimate relationship with God, and go to heaven, individuals must accept Jesus Christ as savior and Lord and be born again. Graham repeatedly asserted that the Bible provided answers to every human problem and satisfied every human longing.

Graham strove to live fully "sold out" to God. While he had flaws, Graham's life and legacy are impressive. Critics complained that his message was overly simplistic, protested that he did not speak out forcefully enough on issues such as racism and poverty, and denounced his support of the Vietnam War and opposition to feminism.

Nevertheless, Graham was regularly ranked near the top of the most admired people in the world and received many honors at home and abroad including the Presidential Medal of Freedom and honorary knighthood from Elizabeth II.

Graham's influence will continue through the millions of lives he helped transform, the thousands

of Christian leaders and evangelists he inspired, and the work of the BGEA. The association still sponsors evangelistic campaigns, trains many evangelists, publishes "Decision" magazine, and sends chaplains to areas recovering from natural disasters.

The evangelist declared, "One day you'll hear that Billy Graham has died. Don't you believe it. On that day I'll be more alive than ever before! I've just changed addresses." As the author of a book about angels and three about heaven, Graham is well prepared to enjoy his new address.

A Final Tribute Honoring a Special Lady During Women's History Month

Women's History Month celebrates the vital role of women in American history. The vibrancy and legacy of women past and present unifies and nourishes our collective whole as we march onward towards fundamental human equality.

Lieutenant Lynn Balmer, born September 12, 1907, on the family homestead in Plumas, California, saw history unfold before her eyes and created a bit of history herself. On her 108th birthday, she was recognized by American Legion Post 709, Rancho Cordova, California, as the oldest living female member of the American Legion.

However, now this special lady has been called to Post Everlasting. Lynn Balmer died peacefully at her home at Country Village in Chico, California, on December 9, 2017, at the vintage age of 110.

She was a lifetime member of American Legion Post 709, Rancho Cordova, California, where her nephew, Sgt. Ken Hicks, U.S. Air force veteran, was Historian. He is currently an active member of Post 709.

She was also a lifetime member of the American Legion Auxiliary Unit 637, Citrus Heights, California.

After WWII started, Lynn Balmer joined the military, "to free a man for active duty." She served in the U.S. Coast Guard and achieved the rank of Lieutenant (junior grade) LTJG. Lt. Balmer secured a top secret clearance and worked in Military Intelligence. Using her keen mathematical abilities, she read and interpreted weather maps and charts and used morse code to help ships navigate through dangerous waters and adverse weather conditions between the United States and England.

Prior to her military service, Lt. Balmer was an elementary school teacher, teaching her first class in 1927. She later taught mathematics to high school students. In 1943, her passion for teaching and love for her students, (having no children, she treated each and every child as her own) gave way to her patriotism and love of country when she enlisted in the U.S. Coast Guard.

Yes, Lt. Balmer entered two noble professions and gave of her immense talents whole heartedly.

Between the years of 1946 and 1967 she attended the University of Washington part time, taught mathematics to junior high school students, volunteered at a children's orthopedic hospital, and was a professional skater to boot. She retired and moved to Chico, California in the late 1990s with her husband, Charles.

Lynn Balmer's passion for life lives on. She told stories about living through World War 1, living through the nationwide flu epidemic in 1918 by wearing bags of asafetida around her neck to school, living

through the Great Depression, and when there were shortages of grain and sugar, feeling very lucky that her father had bees so their family of nine children had honey.

Her nephew, Sgt. Hicks, and her extended family and friends continue to carry on Lt. Balmer's storytelling to the delight of young and old alike.

The Women's Suffrage movement was going strong in her childhood and when Lynn was 18 years old, she recalled that her mother got to vote for the first time in her life during the 1920 election. When Lynn became of legal age, she, too, proudly exercised her right to vote and encouraged all women, young and old, to exercise their hard-earned right to vote.

Lt. Balmer died at 110 years old leaving a personal legacy of a life well lived. She did not let life pass her by. Her deep love of country and patriotism ignited her commitment to help protect our democracy and way of life. That love still flourishes in the lives she touched personally and by the sheer power of her being.

She had richness of character, strength, gentleness, and a pioneer spirit exemplifying qualities of our American Legion veterans.

During Women's History Month, it is only fitting we pay special tribute to Lt. Balmer and reflect upon and celebrate the lives of famous women pioneers and leaders in our history, as well as celebrate the unsung women heroes of our daily lives. ★

Defendant Convicted of 10 Counts of Child Sexual Assault

DATE: February 16, 2018

CASE: Victor Miroshnichenko (Case #16FE020660)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney TeriAnn Grimes, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Victor Miroshnichenko was convicted by a jury of two counts of sex act with a child under 10 years old and eight counts of lewd and lascivious acts on a child under 14.

When the victim was 9 years old, her grandmother suffered three strokes and came to live with the victim's family. Another member of the victim's family, Miroshnichenko, also came to visit several days each week. Miroshnichenko began grooming the victim by showing her pornographic books and videos. When the victim was 10 years old, he began sexually assaulting her for the next two years. The victim disclosed the abuse in October 2016, when her mom found her hiding in the bathroom after Miroshnichenko had just come out of the bathroom.

Miroshnichenko faces a maximum sentence of 52 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for March 16, 2018, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 15 before the Honorable Laurel White.

Defendant Sentenced to 12 Yrs. Prison for Felony Real Estate Fraud

DATE: February 16, 2018

CASE: Dennis Joseph Giacopetti (Case #16FE011744)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Ruth Young, Real Estate Fraud Unit

The Honorable Patrick Marlette sentenced Dennis Joseph Giacopetti (aka Dennis Jacopetti) to 12 years in prison. On January 12, 2018, Giacopetti pled no contest to forgery, grand theft and filing false documents. Giacopetti also admitted the aggravated white collar enhancement and the enhancement for commission of a felony while released from custody on another case.

Giacopetti advertised the businesses Legal Aid Services of California and Legal Aid of California online and through Craigslist. Although he was not an attorney, Giacopetti represented himself as an attorney in order to obtain clients. Through these false representations, he unlawfully obtained legal fees from

multiple victims. Giacopetti also filed false legal documents and illegally acted as a foreclosure consultant.

This case was investigated and prosecuted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Real Estate Fraud Unit.

High-Risk DV Offender Convicted for Multiple DV Related Charges

DATE: February 23, 2018

CASE: Patrick Lee (Case #16FE021010)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Allison Dunham, High Risk Domestic Violence Unit

Patrick Lee was convicted by a jury of domestic violence, criminal threats, child endangerment, kidnapping and false imprisonment. The jury also found true that Lee used a knife and caused great bodily injury involving domestic violence.

Lee and the victim lived together with their one-year-old child. On June 21, 2016, Lee assaulted the victim, causing visible injury. The victim's cousin reported it to the police. Lee was arrested and charged with domestic violence. He bailed out of custody and reconciled with the victim. On October 15, 2016, Lee demanded the victim cut off her hair. He told her if she didn't cut it off, he would kill her and displayed a knife. When their son began to cry, he threatened to kill her and the child if she did not stop him from crying. Lee then hit her, causing an injury. The victim did not report the incident, nor did she seek medical treatment for her injury. Approximately two weeks later, the victim decided to leave Lee. On October 29, 2016, Lee showed up at her work unannounced and demanded she talk to him. He threatened to hurt her and the customers in the store if she did not comply. The victim went out to the parking lot to talk with Lee in his car. Lee then drove out of the parking lot with the victim in his car and told her he was going to kill her. Believing he would kill her, the victim jumped from the moving car. She suffered a fractured skull and extreme facial trauma, which required a metal plate in her face and skin grafts.

The victim later reported that Lee was emotionally, economically and physically abusive to her throughout their relationship.

Lee faces a maximum sentence of 18 years in prison. Sentencing is set for March 22, 2018, in Department 40 before the Honorable Raoul Thorbourne. ★

I'm kind of starting over again financially, because I sold a company I had run for almost 15 years, then got into real estate and lost almost everything. I'm making just enough to squeeze by, and my credit card debt totals \$40,000. Would this be a good idea?

 I don't usually give folks any wiggle room when it comes to sticking with the proper order of the Baby Steps. But if you're that close to being completely debt-free, I don't see anything wrong with paying off the house first.
