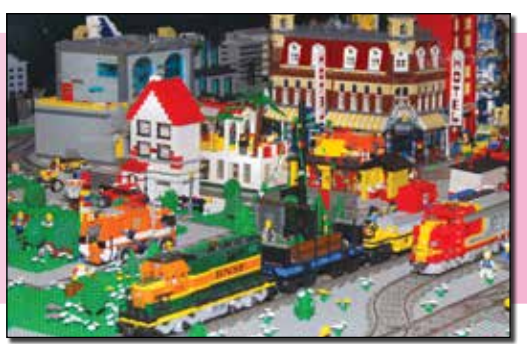

Keeping Schools Safe

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Just days prior to the mass shootings in Las Vegas that left 59 dead and more than 500 wounded, Bob Erickson was presenting a day-long training for educators and staff in the San Juan Unified School District that could not have been more timely. "Basically, we were talking about things that were done right and others that could have been done differently during the Sandy Hook Elementary School shootings," said Erickson, a retired sergeant with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, now managing San Juan Unified's Safe Schools Program.

Safe Schools is essentially

the backbone of the district's campus safety and security system, which covers all policies and procedures for initial assessments and, if necessary, responses to myriad issues and events that can go on at any one of the district's 65 campuses in a single day, including bullying, weapons found in back packs or lockers, drug and alcohol-related offences, assaults, intruders, gang activity, suspected child abuse, and, sadly, the very real possibility of a student suicide on campus.

Established in 1988, Safe Schools operates through a partnership with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department. To select, train and assign off-duty officers to serve as School Resource Officers (SROs) who patrol, monitor and respond to

incidents across five designated school zones that include all 64 campuses in the district. SROs are assigned to roughly 5 schools each, but if needed, they will cross out of their districts to support other SROs in crisis.

In addition, the Citrus Heights Police Department

also participates with the provision of two, full time SROs at Mesa Verde and San Juan high schools, which sit within the SJUSD's boundary lines. They also will cover a crisis if needed at other schools in Sacramento County's unincorporated areas.

All calls for SRO assistance that are not initiated through a 911 call for police are filtered through a Safe Schools dispatcher at the district offices in Carmichael. And, while the majority of dispatched calls for an SRO response are not lockdown or high-level emergencies like Sandy Hook or Vegas, as unlikely as they are to occur, according to Erickson, trainings for campus shootings are necessary and, in the recent case, involved the keen eye of

Taxes, Taxes and More Taxes

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - This year, California lawmakers proposed increasing taxes and fees by \$373.4 billion annually – a staggering amount that would cause rampant unemployment by forcing many businesses to close their doors, leaving taxpayers wondering if the "California dream" is finished.

The California Tax Foundation recently released the 2017 edition of "Tax Watch: Major Taxes and Fees Introduced in the California Legislature," identifying all measures that proposed a new or increased tax or fee, and showing which became law, which failed, and which remain alive for consideration next year.

The cumulative sum of the proposals identified in Tax Watch is the highest since this annual report was first published in 2015.

While some proposals are dead and the fate of others remains up in the air, the report notes that taxpayers will have to pay \$8.75 billion a year more in higher taxes and fees under legislation approved by the Legislature and signed by the governor this year.

Even proposals that were rejected this year have a negative impact on the state's jobs climate. Attempts to eliminate Proposition 13 property tax protections, to dramatically increase taxes on employers, or to expand regulatory fees are enough to stifle investment and expansion, because such efforts create uncertainty, and promote the perception that California is a hostile place to do business.

Lawmakers sought to increase taxes and fees that would raise the price of basic necessities – housing, health care, child care, groceries and driving. In addition to costing individuals and families, these taxes impact employers, making it costlier for start-ups, family businesses, neighborhood restaurants and California's iconic industries to stay afloat.

Most Californians want to remain in the Golden State – California is our home. Yet we all have at least one friend or family member who left California for a better job in another state, or to enjoy a reduced cost of living.

It is no secret that California has costly regulations, a litigious atmosphere and a high tax burden. Legislative leaders often dismiss these complaints and point to California's economic output and job growth – after all, California is the fifth largest economy in the world. But how much better would the state jobs climate be without the job losses that wipe out so many of the

UC Davis, Shriners Hospitals Party Down With the Kids

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Children, few would argue, should never have to spend a single day in a hospital bed, hooked up to life-saving monitors and medications, undergoing treatments for things like cancer, head trauma from accidents and the myriad things that can go wrong. But, sadly, many do.

To make things feel a little better, to normalize the experience to some degree for the children admitted as patients (and their families) at UC Davis Children's Hospital and Shriners Hospitals

Placer and Yuba Counties, and as far north as Redding, CA.

For the last six years, the Pierce's and several of their Spirit Halloween store employees have brought costumes, backpacks, toys, face paint, photo booths, craft fixings, live character "actors," along with a boat-load of Halloween fun to UC Davis' Children's Hospital and organized a Halloween bash for the children admitted as patients and their visiting family members.

In addition to the parties, in the weeks prior to Halloween, Spirit Halloween stores across the region organize a range of fundraisers, including the company's

company, actually started this program for children's hospitals back east several years ago and we began participating in 2011," said Pierce. "We start planning for the Halloween party and raising funds in all of our stores right after we open in early September, and we don't stop until we close the doors November 2."

To date, the Pierce's stores have raised roughly \$360,000 for UC Davis Children's Hospital, and the company, via the generosity of its customers and other fundraising channels, generated just under \$50,000 for Shriners' the first year of participation, Pierce said. "Every penny, 100 percent of what we raise in the stores and through fundraisers goes to fund the two facilities' children's programs now."

For William Banks, 5, of Chico, CA and his mother, Amanda, the Halloween "spooktacular" brought a welcome respite from the day-to-day routine they've been operating on since he was diagnosed with lymphoma in August. Banks' wore a contagious, ear-to-ear smile as he spent the afternoon painting his face and head, crafting and mingling with other kids and their families—doing everything a kid should be doing this time of year, never mind the cart of medications and monitoring devices he had to push around the party. Those things are just part of life right now.

"This is so great," William said, freezing for selfies with his mother, taking in the attention from staff, media representatives from this paper and others, including local TV reporters, and of course his fellow patients. "I feel really happy today," he said, and then went off to paint the top of his head tiger style.

for Children in Sacramento, staff and supporters delivered the "spirit" of Halloween, literally and figuratively, and threw them all a big fat party Oct. 18 and 19.

It's an annual event, says Shanda Pierce, who, alongside her husband, Kirk own more than 20 Spirit Halloween pop-up stores across the Central Valley, as well as Sacramento,

Vampire Ball, a purple pumpkin painting contest, as well as in-store outreach to Halloween customers to benefit UC Davis programs. And, last year, Spirit of Halloween fundraisers expanded to include support for Shriners Children's Hospital next door and now both facilities are recipients of the company's program.

"Spirit Corporation, our parent

But its core services provide an ongoing menu of programs and services for patients and their parents through the work of child life specialists, as well as music and art therapists, among others, who deliver a range of powerful coping strategies and educational information for the patients and their parents.

Diana Sundberg who runs the program at UC Davis, said the donations and party made possible by Spirit Stores is a vital part of the process of keeping kids' spirits high as they go through what is, in most cases, the scariest time of their lives.

"We do everything we can to help minimize fears and normalize the hospitalization experience for the children," said Sundberg. "By throwing the kids a Halloween party with costumes and games, we give them something they can recognize from home, be a part of, and a little bit of normal that they can carry with them while they are going through their treatment or in the recovery process. It's a very scary experience for kids to be away from home, let alone in a hospital. So bringing in Halloween fun for them is one of the ways we work to take those fears away, even if for just a little while." ★

Lisa and Jason Chandler from Cottonwood, CA, joined their daughter, Anastacia Reynolds, 12 for the fun at UC Davis. "This place is amazing," said Lisa Chandler, wrapping her arms around her daughter who must currently use a wheel chair to stay mobile. "We can't believe how awesome all this is. She's making such amazing progress and this is really a great way to give her and all the kids a chance to socialize and just be kids for a little while. This facility is

absolutely amazing. They are the best."

hindsight to in reinforcing protocol. “The seminar was called ‘Lessons Learned From Sandy Hook,’ and I started out by saying the chances of a school shooting happening on one of our campuses are very slim,” says Erickson. “We are constantly aware that a school campus or workplace shooting can happen anywhere, but statistically, the odds are very low that we will have a campus shooting like Sandy Hook. That said, someone always wins the lottery. Our trainings are not to scare anyone, but we need to be prepared.”

District-wide staff trainings like these, as well as a regular review of policies and procedures for handling an entire range of campus emergencies are held roughly every three months for teachers and staff, along with SRO representatives and other Safe School team members.

All schools in the district are required to have a “Comprehensive School Safety Plan” in place that should be made available for public review at any time.

In the case of Sandy Hook, says Erickson, many teachers and students exposed themselves to the gunman by trying to run first rather than hide, following a previously standardized policy of run, hide, fight, which today winds counter to the tactic advocated by many Safe Schools teams, including San Juan’s.

“Here in the San Juan School District, we look at it as hide, run, fight,” says Erickson. “If you can run to safety, do it. But if you are not sure, we advocate hiding first. At Sandy Hook, you had teachers who hid kids in cupboards and other places and called 911. That was exactly the thing to do. In other instances, however, teachers heard shots and went out to investigate and they were killed. So if you hear something that sounds like a shot, it’s probably a shot and you should hide.”

In addition, first responder protocol has also changed, according to Erickson, since the Columbine school shooting in Colorado in 1999.

“Before Columbine, law enforcement or SROs would arrive on the scene,

form what’s called a ‘perimeter’ around the school, and then wait for reinforcements before going in,” said Erickson. “Now, they are trained to just go in.”

Trainings rotate from campus to campus and are usually held on shortened days in the afternoon to ensure everyone who wants to attend can, Erickson said. In a few weeks another “active shooter” and high-alert response workshop will take place. Attendees will be given a range of scenarios, broken up into groups and charged to each come up with their own strategies for effective response.

One aspect that also gets emphasized in active shooter trainings that will also be highlighted, is the concept of friendly fire. Erickson explains it best.

“One of the things we also emphasize is a hands up policy,” Erickson said. “If you are walking on the campus during a lockdown and law enforcement is there with weapons drawn, you always want to keep your hands where they can see them. Hands are what kill people. The hand is needed to make the gun go off.”

The district is also amidst implementation of a campus fencing program launched several years ago. According to Keith Reed with the schools facilities department, a total of eight campuses identified as high-priority sites, such as Del Campo High School, now have fences. At a cost of \$1 million, the pace of the

project is slow and, cautions Reed, they serve as deterrents, not guarantees against the possibility of a high-alert crisis.

“The fencing helps, but really the focus is to serve as a deterrent, which is why we have the SROs and trainings in place,” Reed said. “They are designed in a way that forces visitors to enter the campus through the main office and they are not cheap, so completion is based on when funding comes available. But we do prioritize based on the needs of each school.”

Greif counselors are also part of the Safe Schools team and are trained to provide support to school counselors and psychologists in the district in responding to a crisis, such as a student suicide and other highly charged, emotional events.

“Sadly, we do have student suicides in schools,” says Erickson. “It happens. And when it does we have staff who are trained to comfort those in crisis and help allow students to have their emotions. We never want to advocate for anything else.”

Student threats against schools are common. And, it’s Erickson’s job, working with Safe Schools team members, to identify those threats, discern which are real and respond accordingly. As unlikely as mass shootings in schools are, in all cases where they have occurred, according to Erickson, there were warning signs.

“Kids post threats against their schools on social media all the time,”

says Erickson. “It’s almost weekly that the threats come in. Now, is it likely the student is going to come (to school) with a loaded gun? No. But we take every single threat as if it were real. Every shooting we’ve had (in the country) there was a message sent out by the shooter in advance. In cases where we do perceive the potential of a threat to be real, we will go out to visit homes. We’ll find out if there are guns registered at the house. We look in (students’) bedrooms, we check it out to see what’s going.”

While parents have not been flooding the district since the Vegas shootings to ask about their school’s safety plans, they do call. Regularly. And their calls, says Erickson, are important.

“Believe me, I spend a lot of my day on the telephone just talking to parents to assure them that we are all about student safety, safety for all the students and the staff and the families.”

“I wouldn’t say that I’ve had any calls of concern about Vegas or since that event,” says Erickson. But we do get calls from parents every day about something and when we do, I investigate it, triage it and if there is something we need to respond to, we do. Believe me, I spend a lot of my day on the telephone just talking to parents to assure them that we are all about student safety, safety for all the students and the staff and the families.”

Educated in Ohio, the teacher was involved in theater from childhood. She completed a Master’s degree in curriculum and administration in Sacramento and, after a period in journalism, joined the El Camino High school arts department. By her 2001 retirement, more than 3000 teenagers had brushed up their Shakespeare, Bernstein, Hammerstein and Hart under her aegis. She directed Broadway veteran Kate leveraging as the ingenue in “Anything Goes.” Later, a redhead called Jessica Chastain played the lead in Elliott’s production of “Mame.”

“I know the difference between what is high-school good and wonderful,” says Elliott. “I saw a lot of talent. Jessica stood out for her absolute dedication. She was a great Shakespearean actress; she analyzed and really understood the literature.” Other El Camino achievers include Shannon O’Hurley, Rebecca Riker and Grammy-winning Gospel singer Mandisa. Their teacher – who also doubled as a crisis advisor at the school – follows their progress with pride.

“I went to New York to see Jessica in “The Heiress,” she says. “I became a blithering idiot when I talked with her afterwards. I was so impressed by her performance. Many of my students now have their own acting companies; some are writers and many more have gone on to diverse careers in performing arts. This makes me very happy. I can’t take credit. They had talent; I gave them opportunity. If I have a legacy, it’s of giving my students a good work ethic. I was firm; I didn’t indulge them. I taught them to behave as young adults.”

Elliott’s masterstroke of recruiting school football team players as a chorus line or production extras always guaranteed full houses. According to a former student, “Lee took a nothing school program and turned it around. If she said she was going to do something, it happened.”

The drama queen’s magic is far from final curtain. She directs a community theater group in Dover, Ohio and is a columnist for the New Philadelphia-based Times reporter. “I am one of the more fortunate people to have had a full, affirming career,” the teacher considers. “And I’ve loved every minute. To return to Sacramento and be surrounded by so many loving students was touching beyond belief.”

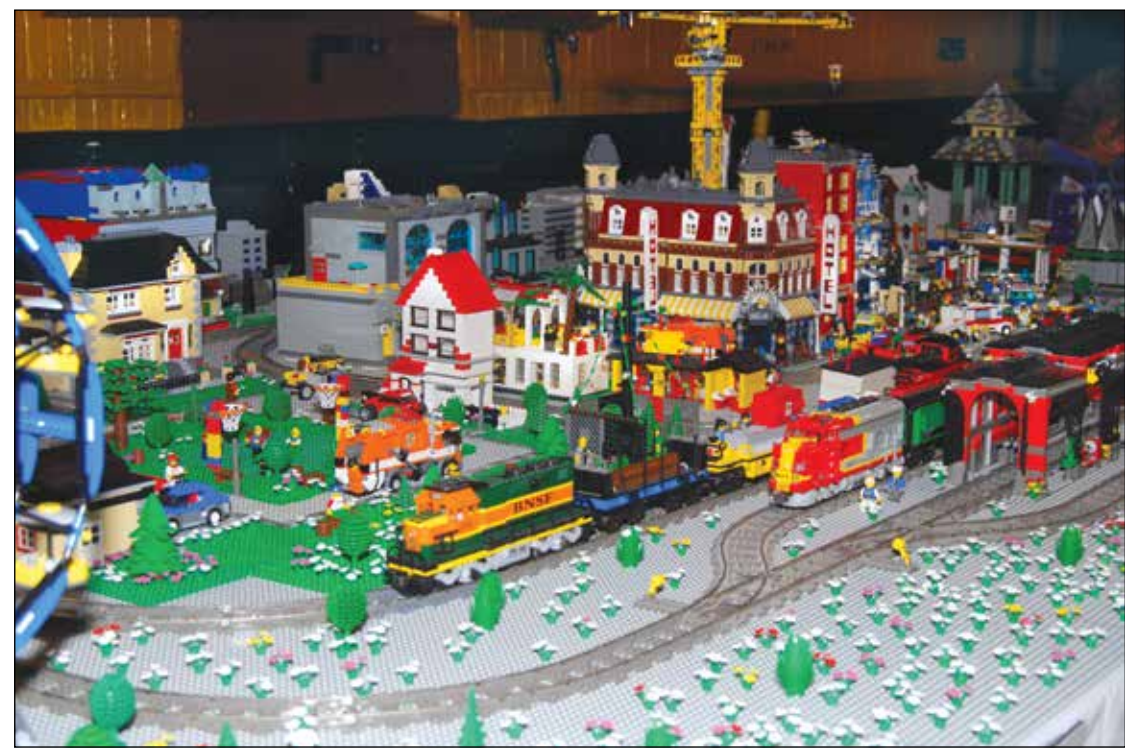

The Human Trafficking Battle Continues

FBI Announces Results of Operation Cross Country XI

FBI Special Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Federal Bureau of Investigation, along with the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC), announced October 18th, that 84 minors were recovered and 120 traffickers were arrested as part of Operation Cross Country XI, a nationwide effort focusing on underage human trafficking that ran from October 12-15, 2017.

Within the FBI Sacramento field office's 34-county area of responsibility, the FBI and its law enforcement partners conducted operations in the four metropolitan areas: Chico, Fresno, Sacramento, and South Lake Tahoe. Local recoveries of minors and pimping arrests during Operation Cross Country are as follows:

- **Thursday, October 12, 2017** Sacramento County Sheriff's Department recovered one minor
- **Friday, October 13, 2017** FBI and Chico Police Department recovered one minor
- **Saturday, October 14, 2017** Porterville Police Department arrested an adult male on felony pimping charges.

In addition to successful recovery of two minors and the arrest of a pimp, more than 23 arrests were made for a variety of charges including prostitution and probation violations. The following agencies participated in Operation Cross Country XI. Butte County District Attorney's Office, El Dorado District Attorney's Office, El Dorado County Sheriff's Office, Fresno County District Attorney's Office, Fresno Police Department, Hanford Police Department, Placer County Sheriff's Department, Porterville Police Department,

Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, Sacramento Police Department, South Lake Tahoe Police Department, and Tulare County District Attorney's Office.

This is the 11th iteration of the FBI-led Operation Cross Country (OCC), which took place this year in 55 FBI field offices and involved 78 state and local task forces, consisting of hundreds of law enforcement partners. This year's coordinated operations took place with several international partners, including Canada (Operation Northern Spotlight), the United Kingdom (Aident 8), Thailand, Cambodia, and the Philippines.

"We at the FBI have no greater mission than to protect our nation's children from harm. Unfortunately, the number of traffickers arrested—and the number of children recovered—reinforces why we need to continue to do this important work," said FBI Director Christopher Wray. "This operation isn't just about taking traffickers off the street. It's about making sure we offer help and a way out to these young victims who find themselves caught in a vicious cycle of abuse."

As part of Operation Cross Country XI, FBI agents and task force officers staged operations in hotels, casinos, and truck stops, as well as on street corners and Internet websites. The youngest victim recovered during this year's operation was 3 months old, and the average age of victims recovered during the operation was 15 years old. Minors recovered during Cross Country Operations are offered assistance from state protective services and the FBI's Victim Services Division. Depending on the level of need, victims are offered medical and mental health counseling, as well as a

number of other services.

"Child sex trafficking is happening in every community across America, and at the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, we're working to combat this problem every day," said NCMEC President and CEO John Clark. "We're proud to work with the FBI on Operation Cross Country to help find and recover child victims. We hope OCC generates more awareness about this crisis impacting our nation's children."

Operation Cross Country XI is part of the FBI's Innocence Lost National Initiative, which began in 2003 and has yielded more than 6,500 child identifications and locations. For additional information on Operation Cross Country XI and the Innocence Lost initiative, please visit www.fbi.gov.

Examples of stories from various cities that took part in Operation Cross Country XI:

On October 13th, FBI Denver recovered two minor girls—one 3-month-old and one 5-year-old. The subject, a friend of the children's family, offered an undercover officer access to the two children for sexual purposes in exchange for \$600. The FBI is working with Child Protective Services to conduct a forensic interview and secure safe placement of the children. The subject was placed under arrest.

Also on October 13th, a 16-year old female victim was recovered by FBI El Paso, after an undercover agent called an online advertisement for entertainment. Shortly thereafter, the agent met with a 21-year-old female, who offered a fee of \$200 to engage in sexual intercourse with her and another female, the 16-year-old victim. Further investigations revealed that a second adult female drove the minor and the 21-year-old to the undercover's location. Both female subjects have been arrested on federal charges. ★

DTSC Inspections Lead to Enforcement Action Against Sacramento County Electronic Waste Recycler

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Superior Court has entered a judgment against California Electronic Asset Recovery (CEAR), an electronic waste recycler in Mather, for hazardous waste management violations.

Under the terms of the judgment, the company will pay the Department of Toxic Substances Control a total of \$390,000.

The judgment follows a series of DTSC inspections over a three-year period (2012-14) that found multiple violations of the state's Hazardous Waste Control Law. DTSC has

continued to inspect the facility in recent years and has found no violations.

"Compliance with the hazardous waste law is very important in protecting public health and the environment, and DTSC appreciates CEAR taking the steps necessary to comply with the law," said Keith Kihara, Chief of DTSC's Enforcement and Emergency Response Division.

CEAR operates an indoor treatment machine that shreds electronic devices and metal components into small pieces and sorts them. Among the items recycled by CEAR are televisions, monitors and

computer equipment.

The company's violations included the illegal treatment, storage and disposal of hazardous waste containing lead, cadmium, copper and zinc, among other compounds, and failure to operate its facility in a manner to minimize the release of hazardous waste.

HEROIC "ONLY THE BRAVE" FIGHTS THE BATTLE OF MOTHER NATURE

A Film Review by Tim Riley

ONLY THE BRAVE (Rated PG-13)

Wildfires have been an unfortunate big news item lately with the raging inferno that has consumed vast areas of Sonoma and Napa counties. Of course, the devastation has been horrific, even though firefighters valiantly battle the furious flames.

"Only the Brave," based on the true story of a heroic crew of firefighters that became one of the most elite firefighting teams in the nation, arrives in a timely manner to remind us that heroes even sometimes have to fight Mother Nature.

Chances are you have never heard of the Granite Mountain Hotshots, or even what it means for a firefighting crew to be known as "hotshots," which by all means is not the usual connotation of a showy or flashy person.

A special and honored designation, hotshots are the country's top wildland firefighters – the Navy

SEALs of firefighting. They don't carry hoses; they literally fight fire with fire, digging lines, cutting down trees, lighting back burns to battle a wildfire.

In Prescott, Arizona, Eric Marsh (Josh Brolin), mentored by Fire Chief Duane Steinbrink (Jeff Bridges), sets out to lead a group of 20 men to be the first local city fire crew to achieve the exalted status of hotshots.

It's a dangerous occupation that compels discipline, teamwork and dedication, but Marsh, by virtue of his temperament, commitment and loyalty to his men, is the right guy to inspire the guys to risk their lives to save others.

Though not given to any sentimentality, Marsh is willing to give a chance to Brendan "Donut" McDonough (Miles Teller), a drug user that has run afoul of the law as well as an expectant father, to turn his life around by joining the team as a probationary recruit.

In many ways, the story is told from the perspective of McDonough, a fallible character,

who has to earn the trust of crew supervisor Marsh, the 20-year veteran who is very much aware of his own imperfections.

The emotional core of the movie is the relationship between a troubled, very young novice and a more senior man who has already come to term with the weaknesses in his life and aspires to build the kind of man who is more a credit to the team than a hero.

Another key character is Marsh's wife Amanda (Jennifer Connelly), a strong-willed woman who runs their ranch when he's off fighting fires while also tending to her own business of caring for horses as a farrier.

Fire also burns in the relationship between Marsh and his wife Amanda, a couple very much in love but under significant strain. They share a love of the outdoors, but the demands of his job certainly impacts their marriage,

given that Marsh is away so much fighting fires.

Now it's obvious that in a disaster film involving fire, the action focus is to be some enormous conflagration. But "Only the Brave" takes its time to put the fire crew through its paces to first achieve the "hotshot" status that does not come easily.

For one thing, not everyone is thrilled that Marsh wants to take a chance with Brendan. Fellow firefighter Chris MacKenzie (Taylor Kitsch) doesn't give Brendan the benefit of the doubt, aware of his past and thinking he could hold the crew back from its mission.

And yet, Brendan through his actions manages to gain Chris' trust so that eventually they become roommates and best friends, and there is attention paid to how that relationship develops and changes.

The same can't quite be said for many of the others on Marsh's

team, but then aside from Marsh's dependable right-hand man Jesse Steed (James Badge Dale), who's a force of nature in his own right, it's hard to flesh out the remaining crew members in a memorable sense.

More than most action films focused on an elite squad, this one is truly an ensemble piece where the collective efforts of the crew figure immeasurably into the whole of the action scenes.

Once having been certified as

hotshots, the Granite Mountain team is challenged to fighting several sequences of wildfires that are quite stunning with great visual impact in their combustible intensity.

Still, the Yarnell Hill Fire, the climactic fiery showdown, demonstrates how the catastrophe of a devastating wildfire makes "Only the Brave" a respectful tribute to real-life heroes. ★

Defendants Sentenced for Crime Spree Involving Multiple Robberies, Rape

DATE: October 13, 2017

CASE: Anthony Cotton, Latrale Way, Lamar Edwards & Donny Smith (Case #14F05913)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Aaron Miller, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit
The Honorable Michael Savage sentenced Anthony Cotton to 49 years plus 8 months to life in prison. Latrale Way was sentenced to 108 years to life in prison. Lamar Edwards was previously sentenced to 16 years in prison and Donny Smith was previously sentenced to 15 years in prison.

On November 22, 2016, a jury convicted Anthony Cotton of kidnapping for purposes of robbery, first-degree residential robbery, second-degree robbery, attempted robbery, residential burglary, and assault with intent to commit rape during a residential burglary. Latrale Way was convicted of two counts of kidnapping for purposes of robbery, kidnapping for purposes of rape, first-degree residential robbery, assault with intent to commit rape during a residential burglary, forcible digital penetration, forcible rape, attempted robbery, second-degree robbery, and felony sexual battery. The jury also found true several firearm allegations connected to the crimes.

On September 27, 2016, co-defendants Lamar Edwards and Donny Smith pled guilty to first-degree residential robbery with personal use of a firearm allegations.

Between June and October 2014, the defendants committed a number of crimes in the Antelope and North Highlands areas. While committing a home invasion robbery, all four defendants held a man and his children in their house at gunpoint and ransacked the house. Two of the defendants then attempted to rape the man's 27-year-old daughter, but the father was able to run outside for help and the defendants fled. In a second robbery, Latrale Way and other unidentified suspects approached a man and a woman at a park. After the group robbed the man, Latrale Way kidnapped the woman and forced her to drive to an ATM machine to get money. Way then directed the woman to a nearby neighborhood and raped her in her car. Two weeks later, Cotton and Way

committed three additional armed robberies in the same park. Forensic DNA testing conducted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Crime Lab conclusively linked Latrale Way to the rape.

Former Baseball Coach Convicted for Child Sexual Assault

DATE: October 18, 2017

CASE: Steven Erickson (Case #16FE003051)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Catrina Skor, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Steven Erickson was convicted by a jury of 19 counts of child sexual assault on a child age 13 to 15 years old.

Steven Erickson is a former baseball coach who also ran a traveling baseball academy in Sacramento County. The victim played baseball for Erickson's baseball academy. Erickson knew the victim since he was 9 years old.

Erickson faces a maximum sentence of 37 years, 8 months in prison. Sentencing is set for November 20, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 13 before the Honorable James Arguelles.

Former Teacher Pled to Multiple Child Sexual Assault Charges

DATE: October 23, 2017

CASE: Eric Echols-Gollas (Case #16FE017839)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Brian Morgan, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Eric Echols-Gollas pled no contest to six felony counts of lewd and lascivious acts against a child under the age of 14 and one misdemeanor count of annoying or molesting a minor.

Between June 1, 2015 and July 24, 2016, while employed as a paraeducator at Prairie Elementary School, Echols-Gollas sexually abused seven girls within the classroom setting.

Echols-Gollas faces a stipulated sentence of 11 years in prison. Sentencing is set for December 21, 2017, at 8:30 a.m. in Department 61 before the Honorable Michael Sweet. ★

Engines Ready for Maiden Flight of NASA's Space Launch System

STENNIS SPACE CENTER, MISS., (MPG) - Aerojet Rocketdyne recently announced the four RS-25 engines slated to fly on Exploration Mission-1 (EM-1), the maiden flight of NASA's Space Launch System (SLS), are ready for integration with the rocket's core stage.

EM-1 is a three-week mission in which the SLS rocket will launch the Orion spacecraft into a distant retrograde orbit around the moon farther than a human-rated vehicle has traveled before, and also will deliver 13 small satellites to deep space.

"The Space Launch System epitomizes our nation's legacy of ingenuity and our spirit of exploration," said Aerojet Rocketdyne CEO & President Eileen Drake. "When it launches, SLS will eclipse the performance of any rocket flying today or currently under development."

All four of the RS-25 engines that will fly during EM-1 also flew during the Space Shuttle Program; however, they have been outfitted with new controllers and adapted

for SLS. Each engine provides half a million pounds of thrust, totaling more than 2 million pounds of thrust, for the first stage of the SLS rocket.

"These four EM-1 engines have a rich and storied history," said Dan Adamski, RS-25 program director at Aerojet Rocketdyne. "Together, they've powered 21 shuttle flights with the most experienced engine, E2045, having flown on 12 separate flights."

Aerojet Rocketdyne will store the four engines for EM-1 at its facility located at NASA's Stennis Space Center until they are ready for integration with the core stage, which is currently in development at NASA's Michoud Assembly Facility in New Orleans.

In addition to the core stage propulsion for the debut SLS flight, Aerojet Rocketdyne is also providing an RL10B-2 engine for the rocket's upper stage, which is called the Interim Cryogenic Propulsion Stage (ICPS). The RL10B-2 produces 24,750 pounds of thrust and is the main propulsion once the rocket has

reached outer space; it gives the Orion spacecraft the final boost to complete its mission around the Moon. Earlier this year, NASA delivered the completed ICPS to Cape Canaveral Air Force Station, Florida, in preparation for integration with the rocket.

"The propulsion for SLS is just one example of how all the pieces for Exploration Mission-1 are starting to come together. It is remarkable that our nation will soon debut this new capability that will enable humans to explore deep space," added Drake.

Lock Your Cars! It's Giant Zucchini Time!

This time of year church foyers offer tables of free produce brought in by Christian gardener's wanting to share the abundance of God's bounty. One ubiquitous vegetable on those church tables is the **GIANT ZUCCHINI**.

It's not that gardeners let these grow to the size of dachshunds on purpose, rather it's usually an accident perpetrated by a beginner gardener. (Have you ever noticed zucchini has camouflage skin so it can hide under their big leaves?) Many a gardener has shared with me her horror on discovering a giant, green, squash monster suddenly exposed by hoeing.

There are no warning labels on zucchini seed packages and there should be! **WARNING!!! Eternity is the attempt to consume the zucchini that will come from this package of seeds. Be prepared to lose friends, seek counseling over guilt of wastefulness, and become bored over the endless zucchini meals you'll be compelled to make.**

Seasoned gardeners tend to avoid planting zucchini like gigolos avoid lurking around trailer parks. It's the first-time gardener, thrilled at the innocent prospect of taking part in an organic dance with vegetables from her garden to table that is stunned by the shameless obesity of the zucchini. Often these wanna be gardeners are disorganized and don't realize gardening requires a chore chart of daily, weekly, and monthly duties (mostly daily!). My advice as a reformed slob turned professional organizer is: **if you don't do well with caring for houseplants forget about a garden and be very nice to your friends who have gardens.**

When you live in a country community, you're surrounded by gardeners and commerce does everything it can to market to them. Merry-go-rounds of seed packets sprout up right after New Year's, sales on garden tools pop up in early spring, live, hot house plants lure the green thumbs off their property just in time to plant for summer's sun.

A zucchini plant looks innocent in its little 1/4 cup-sized container, but inevitably during the harvest season the question pops up, **WHAT CAN WE DO WITH THESE GIANT**

SQUASH? After all there are starving children in America.

I discovered there's a glut of recipes for zucchini of all sizes. I've heard from more than one really good cook, that there's not a difference in the taste of a big versus a little zucchini.

Rather than add to the glut of recipes (okay I'll share one) I've thought up some ways to use those big ones for other than eating.

1. Food container with lid for taking a dish to the church potluck. Cut a side long wise out of the resting zucchini, being careful to keep the piece intact. (This piece will be your lid.) Gut the squash of its seeds using an ice cream scoop. Gut the meat out using a melon baller. Save the meat after absorbing moisture with paper towels. Freeze for use in one of the kazillion recipes out there.

Pry the stem off the end and with a toothpick or two attach it as a handle for the lid.

2. Hostess Gift. Cut the butt end off, about seven inches. Gut making a bowl. Fill with potting soil and plant a small plant (basil is a great gift for the hostess who loves to cook). Recipient can keep it in her kitchen or if you plant an outdoor perennial in the gift, she can plant it (squash container and all) after it's through blooming.

3. Skinny Jack-O-Lantern Use an orange zucchini to match the pumpkin jack-o-lanterns. It's very funny to see a plump pumpkin next to a tall and skinny zucchini.

4. Centrepiece If you happen to have a zucchini that's curved, it'll make a very nice swan.

5. Canoe In the same way you cut a lid out of a zucchini lengthwise to make a serving dish, this time just use the bottom and gut it. Fill it with food for birds and fish and send it off down a river or creek. Take the kids for the event.

6. Vase You can make various sizes of vases depending on how far from the end you cut. When I made a zucchini jack-o-lantern, I just used the top half after I made a vase. The vase holds water and the center makes it easy to arrange a group of flowers.

ROASTED AND SPICED ZUCCHINI SEEDS

The spicing is adapted from a Martha Stewart recipe for roasted pumpkin seeds. You need a large zucchini. The seeds of small zucchini are soft and juicy and will not work here.

- Seeds from a giant zucchini**
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger**
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon**
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cumin**
- Dash cayenne**
- Salt to taste (about half teaspoon)**
- 1 tablespoon sugar, or more to taste**
- Extra-virgin olive oil**

To remove the seeds from your giant zucchini, scrape out the fleshy, seed-riddled center portion of the vegetable with a melon baller. Separate the large, woody seeds from the flesh. Soak in a bowl of water for a few minutes to remove more of the flesh and strings. Bring salted water to a boil, add the seeds, simmer for 10 minutes, drain.

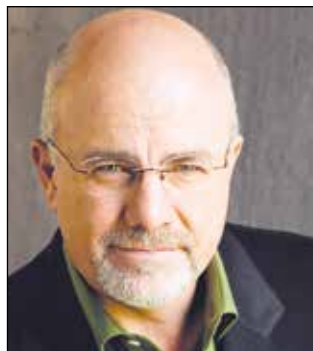
Preheat the oven to 250 F. Spread the drained (but still wet) seeds on a baking sheet. Bake them for about 15 minutes until they are somewhat dry.

Meanwhile, combine the spices, salt and sugar. When the seeds are no longer soaked, remove them from the oven. Turn the oven up to 325 F. Drizzle – but don't douse – the seeds with olive oil to coat, sprinkle the seeds with the spice mixture (you may not need all of it) and mix thoroughly. Bake for about 15 minutes until the seeds are nice and toasty, stirring occasionally. Watch carefully as they can burn easily.

Remove from the oven and cool; they will get crispier as they cool. Store the treat in a sealed container.

So the cry, this time of year, from folks in rural communities is, "Lock your cars! It's zucchini time!" Hopefully I've taken some of the fear out of this year's harvest. If you'd like to see the one garden I attempted, you can see it in this video:

Time to leave the day job?

I've almost got all my debts paid off, and I love both of my side jobs. I was wondering how to tell when I'm ready to leave my day job and concentrate on personal training and my DJ work.

Dear Steve,
I always tell people to first get to a point where their side hustle is generating almost as much money as their day

What's the difference?

Dear Dave,
What's the difference between a credit union and a bank?

—Jake
Dear Jake,
A bank is owned by stockholders. When the bank makes a profit – and they should make a profit – the stockholders, who are owners of the company, get that profit. It can be dispersed in the form of dividends, or the value of their stock is increased. A credit union is run more like a cooperative. Technically speaking, it's operated not for profit, and the owners are the credit union members, who are also customers.

As a customer of a credit union, whatever you pay into the credit union – the "profit" – is returned to the members in the form of increased services or actual disbursements. Sometimes, you actually get a check from the credit union.

A lot of banks don't like credit unions, and say they have an unfair advantage because of their non-profit

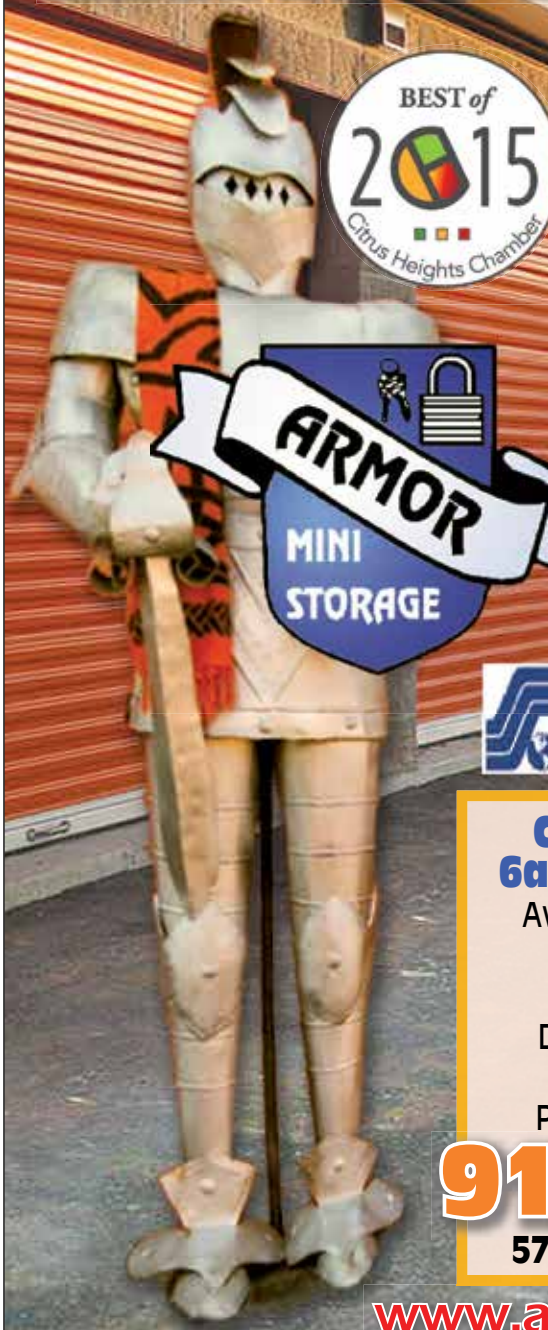

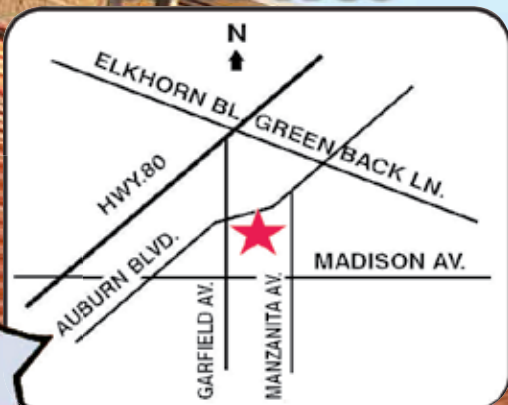

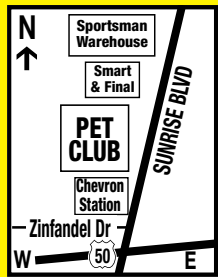
