Cadillac King's Final Ride

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Stalwart of the Carmichael Elks July 4 parade and a Great American, Larry Bunfill died last week. He was just weeks shy of his 100th birthday.

Bunfill was a builder, a racehorse owner and most famously, a Cadillac fanatic. He and brother Curley (still going strong at 104) were recognizable at Carmichael events by their cowboy attire that reflected a passion for Americana and their childhood in a travelling Wild West show. One of 11 siblings, Larry was born in a covered wagon in South Dakota. The Bunfill kids rode almost before they could walk but rarely knew a steady address. "In those days, you could camp in town parks," remembers Bunfill. "We lived like gypsies." The Great Depression destroyed any tenuous prosperity. From the age of 13, Larry worked to help support his family. "I didn't get any further than the third grade," he regrets. "My schooling

suffered but I stuck with my family."

Gravitating west as teenagers, Larry and Curley found work as extras in cowboy movies. Larry and Curley married sisters Jewel and Gladys Law and followed family tradition by taking their own broods on the road - following

track meetings. Bunfill thoroughbreds competed all over the Western states. Larry's biggest win was a \$50,000 purse at the Longacres track in Washington State with a stallion called Huzzah-New. In lean times, the brothers fell back on building contracting. Larry's

daughter Lonie was one of the first Californian women to hold a contractor's license. "My kids had a different sort of upbringing," he nods. "But they all turned out good."

The brothers also followed family tradition in their choice of cars. Larry guessed he and family

members had owned a Cadillac for every one of his years. "Dad bought our first one in 1941," he recalled. "Ever since, we've all got them. We like the way they drive." The family settled in Carmichael in the 1980s. The brothers and their offspring famously provided

vintage Caddies to haul celebrities in the July 4 parade. Congressman, senators, sheriffs, sport celebrities -- and even this reporter -- waved from back seats. Bunfill mobiles rolled on to become props in movies. For Clint Eastwood's "Pink Cadillac," Larry's 1959 red Coup de Ville was painted pink for the lead role.

His showiest favorite was a "solid gold" 1956 model, identical to one driven by Elvis Presley. When McClellan Air Force closed in 2001, this gilded convertible led a final parade. The Bunfill family also loaned vehicles for any number of car show fundraisers. "My biggest pleasure," said Larry, "is to see the good you can do with a great car." Larry is survived by WW II hero Curley, four daughters, a son and a host of relatives. And a stable of vintage Caddies.

His funeral will be held at 10 a.m. Friday, June 2, at St John the Evangelist Church, 5751 Locust Avenue, Carmichael. He will be buried at Fair Oaks Cemetery in a Bunfill family plot. The headstone is ornamented with a horse head and Cadillac fins. ★

Gibson Ranch Likely to Remain Under Ose Management

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The County Board of Supervisors and former Congressman Doug Ose have a working plan for management of Gibson Ranch on the table that, with the exception of one caveat concerning entry fee increases, appears poised for approval and, if so, would pave the way for Ose to continue on as manager of the 325-acre nature reserve.

The Board of Supervisors has directed Regional Parks Director

Jeff Leatherman to fine-tune a plan he and Ose jointly crafted and presented to the board May 23 that proposes a year-to-year contract for Ose's company, GRP 2011, LLC. (GRP), rather than a 20-year lease he'd originally said he would pursue. The lease would run for four years and carry an option for extensions of up to four additional one-year terms, with a 90-day notification to terminate.

Perhaps the most significant changes, however, involve a shift in responsibility for several

operational costs from Ose to the county. Ose was granted a five-year renewable lease to manage the park in 2011, however, earlier this year he announced plans to pull out unless the county could renegotiate an agreement to offset his monthly losses of roughly \$20,000, losses he said he was incurring largely due to rising labor costs.

Under the terms of the proposed plan, the city would take on \$110,500 in annual operating costs for Gibson Ranch. Both sides seem to support the plan,

but Ose cautioned more tweaking could be required.

"What I've tried to do is identify marginal costs, costs for things like sewer, water and electricity," Ose said. "I don't want to eat my cake too soon, though. I know the rules and this is not a done deal until they say yes."

Under the plan the county would pay an estimated \$53,000 for utilities, including sewer and water quality certification; between \$5,000 and \$7,000 to maintain and repair the wells on

the property, and provide Ose with a \$50,000 annual contribution toward reimbursements for capital improvements and deferred maintenance.

The plan contains one component, however, for raising revenue that the board is not supportive of: raising the park's entry fee from \$5 to \$8. As result, the supervisors have given Leatherman and, ostensibly, Ose, more time to come up with alternatives for that piece.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Eskaton Village Carmichael, a continuing care retirement community (CCRC), is celebrating its 25th anniversary, as well as outstanding satisfaction results. "Residents frequently tell staff how much they appreciate them," said eight-year resident Karen Robison, who is a member of the Eskaton board and the community's resident council. Robison, who lives at Village Carmichael with her husband Karl, says staff is

Mariann Sheldon, president of the resident council, who moved to Eskaton almost three years ago with her husband Dale. "When we say we are family it includes the employees."

Residents create the lifestyle they want to live, and influence the culture, cuisine, activities, outreach and life-enriching programming. There are 40 committees plus the resident council that are engaged in creating community. "Residents here consistently express care for one another," said Dick D'Agostino, past president of the resident council and a resident for six years with his wife Pat. "It's a family. We look out for each other."

The residents truly care about the staff and formally recognize individuals twice a year. Once between Christmas and New Year's when they donate to the Employee Appreciation Fund, and in the summer when they announce the Employee Scholarship Fund recipients.

Due to a large bequest left to the resident council years ago, an open-ended Scholarship Fund was created for staff education. In 2016, \$23,000 was awarded to 18 employees. To be eligible, the employee must have at least six months minimum employment with Eskaton, be in good standing with their manager, apply for the scholarship and go through an interview process with the scholarship committee.

"There was serious concern from a couple of the board members about the wisdom of raising the entry fee," said Ose. "They were very direct in saying they didn't want to see the vehicle entry fee raised, and I was just as direct in saying 'I'm not losing any more money.' So we are sharpening our pencils and will be attempting to find a solution."

County Supervisor Sue Frost called the new plan a "win" for all sides, indicating it would likely be one the entire board could approve, provided the entry fee issue was resolved.

"There is a lot to like in the new proposal, which appears to me to be a win for the county, a win for GRP, and most importantly a win for the community," Frost said. "However, I am not in favor of increasing the parking fee above \$5 because I do not think it's fair to ask the residents of the community to pay a fee higher than every other park in this county. I'm optimistic we can get this done while keeping the fee at \$5."

In April, officials said Recreation and Parks department would compete with Ose and potentially other, outside vendors for the management the Gibson Ranch contract. A fourth option: close the park for good. It was unlikely an outside vendor would have taken over the contract as there were no serious bids on the table and, shifting management back to Recreation

& Parks would have called for the addition of as many as five new positions just to manage the park's equestrian boarding program launched under Ose's tenure.

Leatherman now asserts there was always a plan to have his department, essentially the county, work with Ose in drafting a plan to share operational responsibilities and find a way to keep the park open.

"The BOS is focused in on what alternatives we have to raising the fee, but the remaining points appear to be consistent with what the board is willing to support," Leatherman said.

The new proposal also calls for the county to install an automatic pay station in the park, which could net the county additional revenue of between \$7,000 and \$10,000 annually.

"During the winter months, we go skinny, because not a lot of people come through the gates," said Ose. "So we've worked out a plan to install essentially a pay station so that, during those days we do not have an open kiosk at the entry, patrons can pay their fees and we can use those funds to help offset operational costs."

Ose said more changes, although likely minor ones, are expected, but he remains optimistic and has agreed to continue on as manager of the park until the end of June.

"I've agreed to play nice in the sandbox," Ose said. "We've extended our contract to June 30. We've got a great working relationship. They (the board of supervisors) aren't easy, but they are supportive and they are direct." ★

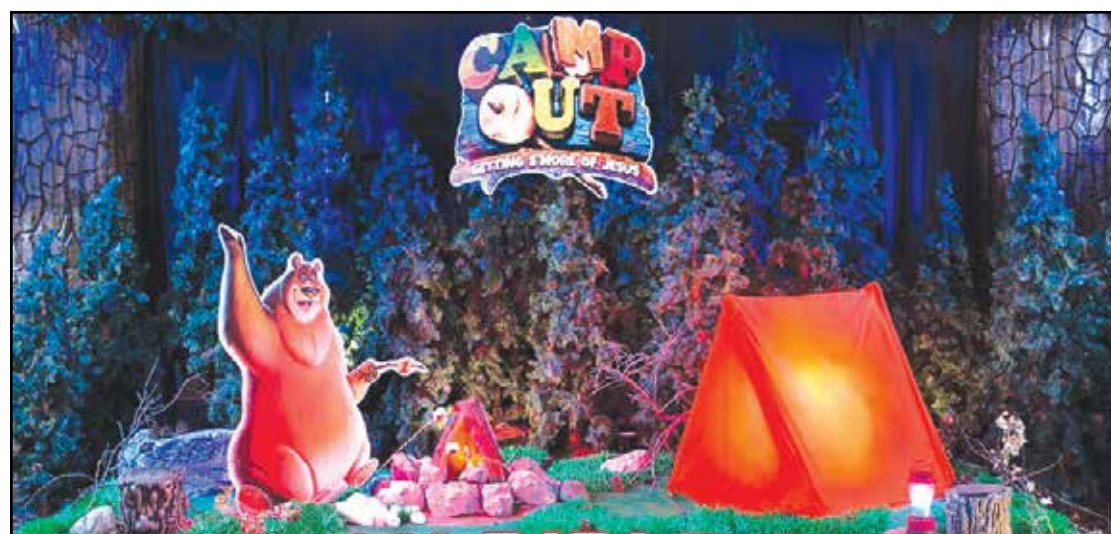

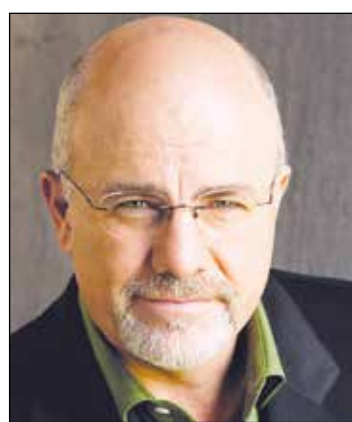

of expenses stashed away would worry me. That's the way you've got to look at it. Just use a little common sense with the numbers.

I'd love for you to put down 20 percent because you'd avoid private mortgage insurance (PMI), which runs about \$75 a month per \$100,000 borrowed. It costs you a lot of money if you don't put down 20 percent. You should try to do that if possible, but don't be irresponsible with your emergency fund in the process.

Your emergency fund, when it's there, tends to keep emergencies away. When it's not there, you have a tendency to attract emergencies and your life starts to sound like a sad country song!

Don't compromise your emergency fund

Dear Dave,

My wife and I are debt-free, and we're ready to start building our first home. We're a little short on cash to make the 20 percent down payment you recommend, but we do have a fully funded emergency fund in place. Would it be okay to take a little out of our emergency fund to make up the difference?

—Chris

Dear Chris,

Well, you didn't give me exact numbers here. I don't know how short a little short is, and I don't know how big your emergency fund is. If you use a little of your emergency fund to round off the 20 percent and then you have an emergency, where are you going to be?

I recommend always having three to six months of expenses set aside for emergencies. If you've got \$50,000 in your emergency fund and you use \$10,000 of it, you'll be fine. But anything that leaves you with less than three or four months

Ethics and integrity

Dear Dave,

I'll be getting out of the military soon, and I want to open a coffee roastery in civilian life. I had planned to work at an established place like Starbucks for a while so I can learn the business. Recently, I've become concerned with this idea from an ethical point of view. Can you give me some guidance?

enough integrity to even think about this means you're a conscientious, honest person. I think you're going to be okay.

Making and serving coffee is not a proprietary set of information. It's done all over the world by lots of people, so you're not violating any ethics by doing that. Now there would definitely be something wrong with you stealing another company's exact recipes or logo, but I think you already knew that.

There's nothing wrong with learning how to make different coffee drinks that are made all over the world. Starbucks doesn't have a corner on that. There are coffeehouses all across America these days, so there's no ethics breach. Just understand what's proprietary about a company or a brand, and don't duplicate that.

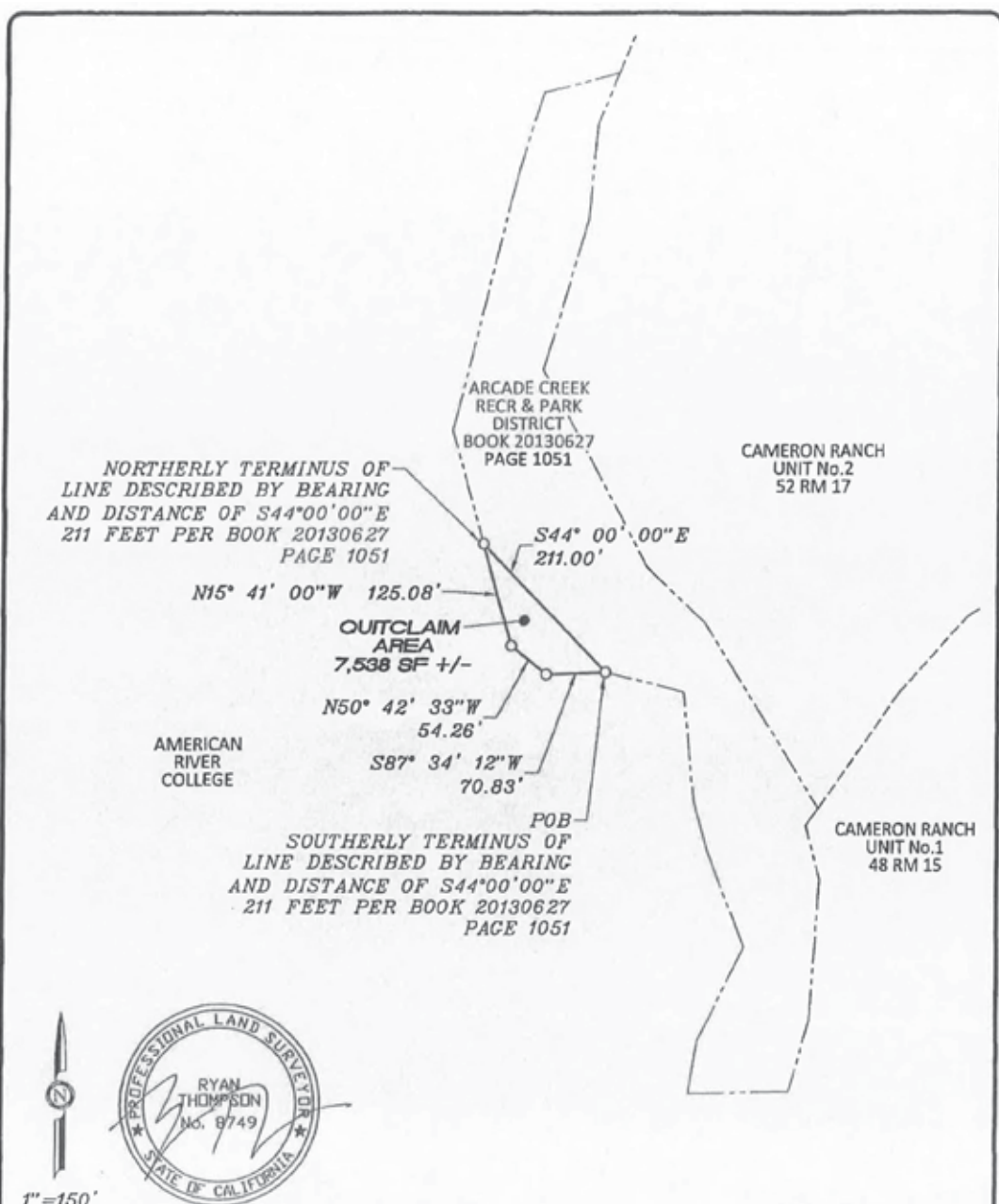

The proposed easement is specifically described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by the reference (hereinafter referred to as the "Easement"); and

WHEREAS, the District desires to give notice of its intent to dedicate to the Sacramento Municipal Utility District the Easement described above and to call a public hearing in connection therewith.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Education of San Juan Unified School District does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted as true and correct.

Section 2. The District declares its intent to dedicate and convey the Easement to the Sacramento Municipal Utility District, as described and depicted in Exhibit "A" for the purposes set forth in the Grant of Easement Document attached herewith.

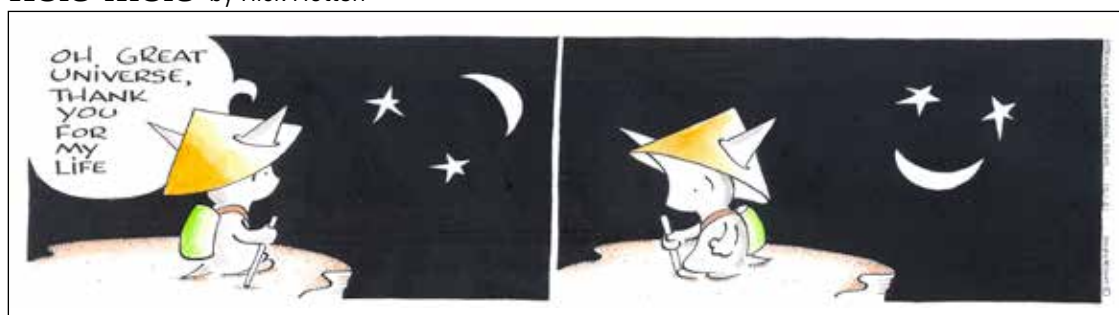

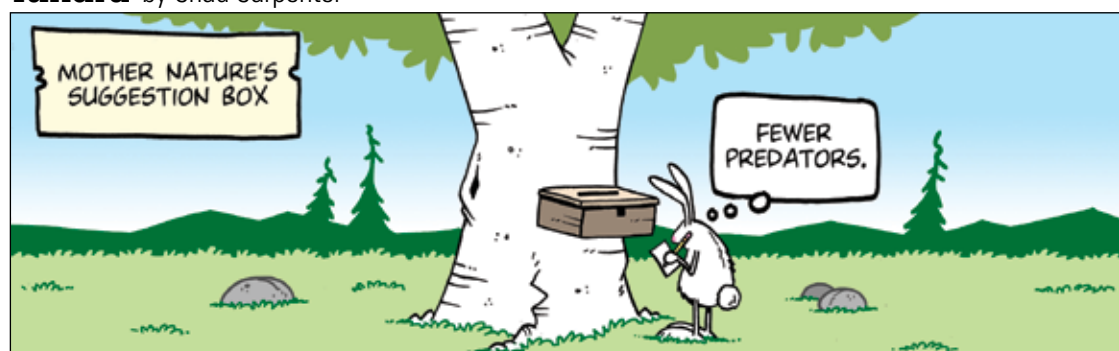

Game Plots

Games Tear Down the Empathy Wall

The greatest innovation of video games as an art form is the utter elimination of the empathy wall. Most storytelling mediums rely on the consumer's natural empathy to form an emotional bond with fictional characters, but although this elicits undoubtedly moving and powerful reactions, by the very nature of empathy the emotional response is only a diluted shadow of what the character is going through. But in a video game, that wall emotionally separating you from the world of the screen, canvas, page, or stage doesn't exist. In a game, things don't happen to a character, they happen to you. In this way games can provoke a more raw genuine response, undiluted through the lens of empathy, by communicating emotion directly to the player.

But when games knocked down one wall they accidentally erected a more difficult obstacle in its place. A game is only emotionally effective as long as a player feels rooted and grounded in its world; otherwise it's a toy on a screen like anything else. Game designers are faced with the challenge of tying the player's mind and the player's onscreen avatar together. If the player can project themselves into this digital persona, then by manipulating the persona, designers can directly emotionally manipulate the player.

Of course, one strategy to tie the player and the avatar together

is through tried-and-true empathy. Through writing and dialogue, designers can create strong fully-realized characters for a player to control, but though this effectively conveys a sense of responsibility for the character, it often fails to convey a sense of unity with the character, as the player is forced to direct the avatar to do something that they wouldn't do in that situation. Though a few games play with this dichotomy effectively (*Spec Ops: The Line* is a great example), most lose the player's emotional investment.

Better methods take advantage of the unique aspects of video games. *Darks Souls* and *The Legend of Zelda: Breath of the Wild*, for example, employ "blank slate" characters in a world where the player has a high degree of freedom. These characters, which are often physically customized by the player themselves, act as a sort of "second body" for the player to completely project themselves onto without any individual characterization to get in the way, and often become like a paintbrush for the player to express themselves onto the world. The character onscreen isn't some representative character, it's quite literally the embodiment of you, allowing the game to communicate emotions directly as if you had experienced them yourself.

But arguably the most effective method unites the former two,

creating fully-realized characters that players still have the freedom to guide and project themselves onto. In games like *The Witcher 3* and *Life is Strange*, players can't fundamentally change the personality or appearances of the onscreen characters, but they can guide them in key decisions, and so imbue a touch of their own personality into the character's. In the best of these style of games, the digital avatar and the player form a bond by learning to think like one another, creating an out-of-body and out-of-identity experience for the player that the developer can still emotionally manipulate without sacrificing creative control over the story.

Ultimately, the youth of the video game artform means that no method is perfect, and numerous more techniques are yet to be discovered. However, because of their ability to tear down the empathy wall through interactivity, games have the potential to become an emotional tour de force of an art form.

Defendant Sentenced for Murdering Wife

DATE: May 18, 2017

CASE: Justin Jesus (Case #15F07687)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Shelly McGill

The Honorable Michael Bowman sentenced Justin Jesus to 26 years to life in prison. On May 2, 2017, a jury convicted Jesus for the first-degree murder of his wife, Elizabeth Masters. The jury found the allegation that Jesus used a knife in the commission of the murder to be true. Jesus was also convicted of felony domestic violence, including allegations that he inflicted great bodily injury and used a deadly weapon.

Jesus had a history of domestic violence. In the course of their tumultuous relationship, Ms. Masters left their home to stay with her family in Folsom. Approximately one week later on December 20, 2015, Jesus showed up at Ms. Masters' parents' home in Folsom. Ms. Masters and Jesus left the home around midnight. Several hours later, family members heard a commotion outside and found Jesus in the backyard holding a knife. Soon after, the family discovered Ms. Masters' body on the side of the house, buried under a pile of leaves. She had been stabbed numerous times including severe lacerations to the neck. Jesus was apprehended by law enforcement a short distance away, and in possession of the murder weapon.

Defendant Convicted of Kidnapping & Assault with Intent to Commit Rape

DATE: May 9, 2017

CASE: Thomas Chavez (Case #15F04824)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Maria Wilson, Adult Sexual Assault Unit

Thomas Chavez was convicted by a Sacramento Superior Court judge of kidnapping and assault with the intent to commit rape.

On August 6, 2015, at approximately midnight, a woman was walking down Stockton Boulevard when Chavez pulled up behind her in his car. He jumped out of his car, grabbed her from behind, held an ice pick to her neck and forced her into his car. Chavez drove behind a nearby store to an isolated area. Fortunately, CHP officers who were nearby observed Chavez drive behind the store and went to investigate. The officers shined their light into the vehicle and heard the woman screaming for help. Chavez was arrested soon after.

The Honorable Laurel White found Chavez guilty of kidnapping and assault to commit rape. In addition, the court found Chavez had suffered prior convictions for sexual assault in 1988. Chavez faces a sentence of 30 years to life in state prison. Sentencing is set for June 2, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. in Dept 10.

Defendant Convicted for North Highlands Party Shooting

DATE: May 12, 2017

CASE: Ira Johnson (Case #15F04234)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Jeff Hightower, Homicide Unit

Ira Johnson was convicted by a jury for the second-degree murder of Rogelio Gastelum, and two counts of attempted murder. The jury also found true allegations that Johnson personally discharged a firearm causing death or great bodily injury.

On July 12, 2015, Ira Johnson and his friends attended a party in North Highlands. When asked to leave, the group started a fight. Johnson and another unidentified man pulled out guns and fired multiple shots into the crowd of partygoers, killing Rogelio Gastelum. Two other victims were shot, but survived their injuries.

Johnson faces a maximum sentence of 59 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for July 21, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 41 before the Honorable Helena Gweon.

Defendant Convicted for Murder by Lying in Wait

DATE: May 12, 2017

CASE: Timothy Varmall (Case #15F01019)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Omar Singh, Homicide Unit

The Honorable Michael Bowman found Timothy Varmall guilty of the first-degree murder of Smurti Patel. Judge Bowman also found true the allegations that Varmall was personally armed and committed the murder by means of lying in wait.

Between September 2014 and February 2015, Timothy Varmall followed Smurti Patel and planned "coincidental" run-ins with her to make her think favorably of him. His purpose during those months was to find the best opportunity to kill Ms. Patel. On February 9, 2015, Varmall stalked Ms. Patel and followed her onto a light rail train. As they exited, Ms. Patel spotted Varmall and agreed to walk with him. As they walked across a dark lot, Varmall stabbed Ms. Patel seven times. Varmall fled the area while Ms. Patel staggered across the street to a restaurant, where medics were called to the scene. Ms. Patel died from her wounds on February 13, 2015. Varmall confided in one of Ms. Patel's friends that he murdered her because he was romantically interested in Ms. Patel and she rejected him.

The Court also found true that Varmall suffered two prior strike convictions for purposes of the Three Strikes Law. In 1994, Varmall was convicted of sexual penetration with a foreign object and forced oral copulation.

Varmall faces a maximum sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for June 9, 2017, at 10:30 a.m. in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Bowman. ★
