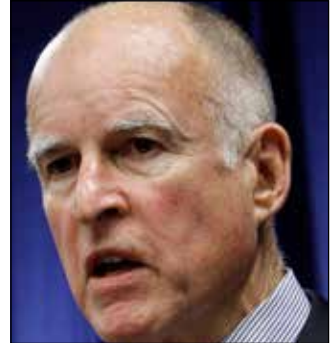

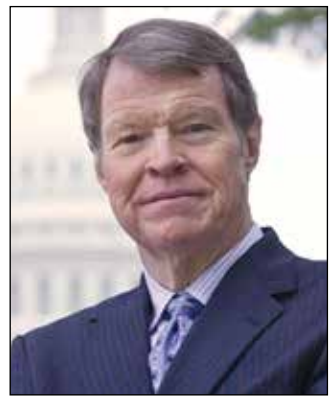

Adding Spice to Milagro

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Approaching its first-year anniversary, Ernesto Delgado's Milagro Centre eatery is called Mesa Mercado. Translated roughly as "market to table," the name echoes the restaurateur's philosophy. "Food should come fresh from the market to your plate," he approves.

Napa-raised, Ernesto embraced the Oxbow Public Market concept and has found the Carmichael eating destination a perfect fit. "It's all about food," he says. "My restaurant showcases the original nature of Mexican cooking." Traditional methods include grinding corn and on site for tortillas and tamales; using only fresh chili in salsas.

Hooked on his mother's meals, Ernesto's culinary passion accelerated after leaving home to study design in Sacramento. "I was frustrated I couldn't get food like my mother served," he recalls. "So, I started cooking from her recipes." Eschewing a design career, he opened El Patron Bar and Grill on Folsom Boulevard in 2002. Later downtown success with Tequila Museo Mayahuel fueled his vision to combine a place to eat with a place to shop. "I want people to walk around and experience all a market has to offer," he explains. "If you don't want to sit at a table, you can use my taco bar. Or you can buy food to take home." When Milagro Centre space was offered, Ernesto became the project's first taker. Naming his restaurant was simple: "I was surprised that the name Mesa Mercado hadn't been taken," he says. "That was a good sign for me."

Entrepreneur Allan Davis' choice of the name Milagro (Spanish for miracle) seemed another omen. "I'm a man of faith," confirms Delgado. "A miracle is about love and faith. So is the food industry."

SACRT Offers Free Transfers for Connect Card Users

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - With a unanimous vote, the Sacramento Regional Transit District (SACRT) Board of Directors approved a pilot program to provide a free 90-minute transfer option to passengers who use a Connect Card, the region's new smart card fare payment system. The transfer option will be available to customers beginning on Thursday, June 15, 2017, marking the official launch date of the new Connect Card system.

RideSacRT, the agency's mobile fare app, has included 90-minute transfers since its roll-out in January 2016. The new Connect Card is expected to be more widely used since the initial cards will be free, whereas the mobile app requires a smart phone. Transfers on the Connect Card will be good for unlimited boarding within a 90-minute period on both bus and light rail, just like the mobile fare app. The free transfers are expected to help generate additional ridership.

Connect Cards can be loaded with transit passes and stored value online, SACRT's Customer Service and Sales Center located at 1225 R Street, and at participating retail outlets. Customers who prefer to pay with cash will also be able to receive the benefits of the 90-minute transfer by simply loading cash onto their Connect Card at SACRT's Customer Service and Sales Center, and at select retail outlets, including Raley's/Bel Air markets in mid-June when the Connect Card officially launches.

The Board action comes on the heels of news that fare revenue has increased by 18% over the past nine months, despite a decline in ridership. The revenue increase is being attributed to SACRT's fare enforcement efforts, which has successfully reduced SACRT's fare evasion rate from more than 15% a year ago, to just 5% now. "SACRT staff has taken every measure to ensure that our trains and buses are cleaner and safer than ever before," said Henry Li, General Manager/CEO. "Fare enforcement efforts have reduced the number of non-fare paying passengers and increased the security presence throughout our system. It's a win for everyone"

Bus agencies throughout the Sacramento region are also adopting the Connect Card in order to provide seamless travel for passengers transferring from one bus line to another. The free 90-minute transfer will be available for six months, while the agency conducts an equity analysis.

The Connect Card and the RideSacRT mobile fare app will make it more convenient to ride by providing online sales, speeding up boarding times and removing the worry of having exact cash to pay fare.

Other ridership initiatives that SACRT is working on include optimizing bus routes to make them reflect 21st century commuting patterns; advocating for dedicated local funding for SACRT to increase service frequency and expand our service area; and launching technology advancements to enhance safety, security and amenities for customers that will accelerate SACRT's value in providing a world-class regional mobility network. Eastern Oak Park's Expansion Project has Broken Ground

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The Mission Oaks Recreation & Park District is excited to expand and renovate its oldest park. Eastern Oak Park, located at 3127 Eastern Ave. (just north of Robertson Ave.), was the first developed park when Mission Oaks became a special district in 1975. The park itself was not easily seen by passers-by along Eastern Ave. because it was set back behind the Eastern YMCA.

When the YMCA property was listed for sale in 2014, the MORPD became very interested in the possibilities of expanding Eastern Oak Park. After seeking feedback from those living in close proximity to the park, MORPD received overwhelming support of the plan to expand the park. The purchase was successful and that was followed by community planning meetings with valuable public

participation.

The old and outdated YMCA buildings and swimming pool were determined to be too costly to save and refurbish, so those were removed in 2015. The grounds were excavated and left in safe condition while the architectural work was being done,

and the scope of work was being finalized. Fast forward to Saturday, May 6 and we have shovels in the soil to signify the official ground breaking of this long anticipated project.

The entire park will be closed until the project is complete. There are many variables that can

change the completion date, but we are targeting October 21 for the official Grand Opening of the park. Once confirmed, MORPD will make an announcement. The park will have several new features including: A plaza to be named after fallen officer Danny Oliver; an off-leash dog

area; a 6-court pickleball facility; a futsal court; a basketball half-court; a walking trail that loops around the perimeter of the park; a new playground; picnic shelters; improved irrigation; a restroom building; improved parking.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - River City Brewing Company celebrates the one-year anniversary of its move to Carmichael this Saturday, May 20th. An exciting day is planned to

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In order to tackle the impacts of illegal camping and other crime within County Parks and the American River Parkway, Sacramento County Regional Parks introduced the Park Resource Team in January 2017. The Park Resource Team (PRT), consists of a dedicated crew of five park rangers and four maintenance staff focusing primarily on the impacts of illegal camping, crime, and trash removal.

"Regional Parks deployed the Park Resource Team in January to areas hardest hit by recent flooding and illegal camping trash," said Jeff Leatherman, Director, Sacramento County Regional Parks. "Through the work of the team, we've been able to improve our response and cleaning up areas impacted by illegal camping, making our parks and Parkway a better place for visitors to recreate."

Since January, the PRT has made 65 arrests and issued 150 citations.

While the rangers continue their law enforcement efforts, County Parks maintenance staff work to remove debris accumulated from illegal dumping and flooding. This year, the maintenance

team received the addition of a lightweight tractor and the support of a debris transfer vehicle—both courtesy of the County's Department of Waste Management and Recycling.

With the addition of the tractor, maintenance staff can remove more debris than was previously removed with hand crews. The equipment also ensures maintenance staff safety by minimizing the amount of trash staff have to hand load into trucks for transport to the dumpsters or landfill. The machinery also assists staff in collecting heavy debris such as mattresses, couches, and large containers, in hard-to-reach places along the Parkway.

Additionally, trash dumpsters are emptied daily, minimizing the re-depositing of trash back into the park system from the dumpsters. Between January-May, the maintenance team has removed 165.5 tons of garbage from the Regional Park system.

The local winner of the 2017 Congressional Art Competition will show work in a national high school art exhibition staged in the Capitol, Washington DC.

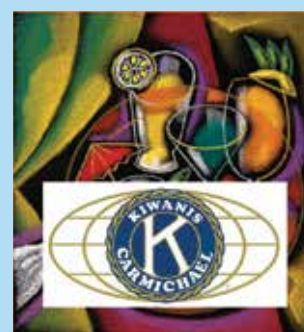
Sponsored by the Congressional

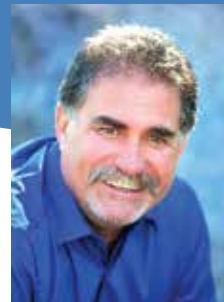

“Infrastructure Week,” Highlights More Than \$2.7 Million Planned for Local Water Infrastructure Projects

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In recognition of “Infrastructure Week” from May 15-19, 2017, Golden State Water Company (Golden State Water) is highlighting plans to invest more than \$2.7 million for local water infrastructure projects in 2017. SMUD Launches “Shine” Community Sponsorship Program

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - SMUD recently announced that it has launched Shine, a new community development program designed to improve and revitalize neighborhoods in the Sacramento region.

Shine awards will range from \$5,000 to \$100,000 and are very competitive. Any nonprofit organization —501(c)(3) or 501 (c) (6)— within SMUD’s service territory is eligible to apply.

Shine awards are available at three funding levels: Spark (up to \$10,000), Amplifier (up to \$50,000) and Transformer (up to \$100,000). Applications will be accepted through June 26.

While SMUD will consider a broad variety of potential projects, it is primarily interested in proposals within the following areas: Neighborhood revitalization or clean up; STEM education (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math); Environmental, energy-efficiency, energy conservation or greenhouse gas reduction; General

beautification.

“As a not-for-profit, community-owned organization, we work hard every day to improve the lives of our customers,” said SMUD CEO & General Manager Arlen Orchard. “The Shine program is a perfect extension of that commitment. By taking a collaborative approach and working directly with local nonprofits, we’re helping make improvements that neighborhood leaders believe will have the biggest impacts on residents in their communities.”

SMUD awarded three pilot Shine sponsorships over the past six months to test the feasibility and administration of the program. Those grants include: Lighting up the Kay and St. Rose of Lima Park (Applicant: Downtown Sacramento Partnership); Creating the College and Sports Academy of Del Paso Heights (Applicant: Mutual Assistance Network of Del Paso Heights); Renovating the Wellspring

Women’s Center kitchen (Applicant: Wellspring Women’s Center)

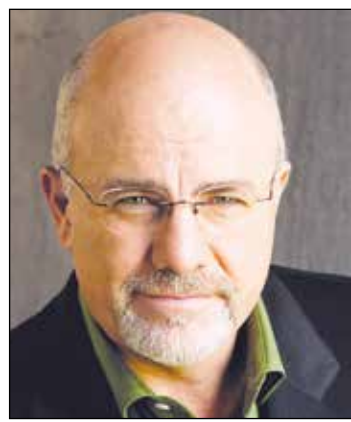

Thoughtfully and prayerfully decide what your giving amount will be, so that you don’t destroy your ability to save and do other important things. Talk to him about these concepts, then ask him to wait two or three days and think about his decision.

If he comes back and says he still wants to give half of it, I would encourage him to do so. But slow things down a little, and make sure this isn’t a knee-jerk reaction. You need to be a wise giver, not an impulsive giver!

Why the smallest debt first?

Dear Dave, My husband and I are currently in Baby Step 2, and paying off all our debt except for our home. A friend recently told us to pay off everything except for the credit card debt. She says we can then settle for a far less amount and not have so much money going out the door. This feels a little unethical to me. What are your thoughts?

Dear Jennifer,

There’s a good reason this idea feels unethical to you — it is unethical! Would a good friend, a smart friend, encourage you to do something as dishonorable as not pay a bill you’re morally and legally obligated to pay? I don’t think so.

If you’re able to pay your bills, you pay your bills. It’s as simple as that. Now, if you honestly can’t pay the bill, and you have to settle upon a mutually agreed upon amount with the creditor or collector, then it’s okay at that point to try and reach a settlement.

Otherwise, it’s a simple question of ethics. Pay the bill!

The Problems with a Carbon Tax

While President Donald Trump wants to cut taxes, there are others who hope to raise them -- by taxing carbon. The idea has long been supported by environmentalists and left-leaning groups, but

recently it has found support among some establishment Republicans. The notion is that by taxing carbon, the country would use less, reducing our impact on climate change.

However, there are a number of problems with the plan.

There is no viable alternative to carbon-based fuels. The goal of a carbon tax is to force people to embrace substitutes, but fossil fuels are one of the most inelastic products. There just aren't any viable and scalable alternatives.

If the price of gasoline were to rise significantly because of a carbon tax, some people would carpool or take public transportation, but the vast majority would just have to suck it up and pay the higher price.

The price of everything

would rise. Economic theory says that corporations don't pay taxes, people do. Companies pass along taxes to consumers in the form of higher prices.

Because we would still have to use fossil fuels for the vast majority of our travel, transportation and power generation, a carbon tax would simply be priced into virtually every product and service.

Food must be harvested, processed and transported to grocery stores. Clothes and consumer goods must be manufactured and transported to retail outlets or to consumers' homes. Planes, trains and long-haul trucks cannot run on solar or wind power. Neither can our military.

While many power generating plants use renewable

energy from wind and solar power, those renewables only make up about 7% of power generation—and that's after throwing hundreds of billions of taxpayer dollars at renewables for decades.

Thus a carbon tax would have little impact on carbon use and a big impact on what we pay for everything.

For example, Norway passed a carbon tax in 1991. They concluded, "the carbon tax effect on emissions was modest. ... This surprisingly small effect relates to the extensive tax exemptions and relatively inelastic demand in the sectors in which the tax is actually implemented."

Australia became the first country to repeal its carbon tax. When the repeal passed in 2014, Prime Minister Tony

Abbot said, "Today the tax that you voted to get rid of is finally gone, a useless destructive tax which damaged jobs, which hurt families' cost of living and which didn't actually help the environment is finally gone," according to the Wall Street Journal.

The challenge of a global economy. We live in a global economy where U.S. companies want to sell to other countries, but they have to be competitive to do so.

That's why corporate income tax reform along the lines of that proposed by President Trump or House Speaker Paul Ryan is so important. A carbon tax that raises the cost of production across the economy will make it harder for businesses to compete globally.

The good news is that

the U.S. has been reducing energy-related carbon emissions without a carbon tax. U.S. Energy Information Administration announced last October that energy-related carbon emissions for the first six months of 2016 were down to their lowest level since 1991. That's in large part because fracking has made natural gas a cleaner and more affordable option than coal.

The country needs policies that help the U.S. become more competitive. Lowering the tax burden is the best way to achieve that goal.

Bill Giving Tax Relief to Homeowners and Renters Passes First Hurdle

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On May 16th, Assemblyman Matthew Harper (R-Huntington Beach) and Assemblyman Phillip Chen (R- Diamond Bar) announced the passage of their "American Dream" bill which increases the existing homeowners' exemption on their property tax from \$7,000 to \$25,000, giving relief to homeowners, renters and those aspiring to own a home.

"Homeowners and renters in California are paying some of the highest overall taxes in the nation," Assemblyman Harper said. "It's about time that the size of the homeowner's property tax exemption kept up with

the increases in cost of living. Also, I want to thank Orange County Assessor Claude Parrish for working with me to bring this bill forward."

"High property taxes are making it impossible for too many Californians, who spent their lifetime living and working here, to stay", said Assemblyman Phillip Chen. This bill would provide immediate relief for millions of homeowners with an emphasis on helping those whose taxes far exceed their ability to pay."

The homeowner's exemption hasn't been increased in 40 years. Meanwhile, the cost

of a median priced house has increased from \$21,000 to over \$450,000, and represents a home that only 30 percent of Californians can afford to purchase. California has a housing crisis and providing tax relief for homeowners and renters will unquestionably lead to enhanced economic stability," said David Wolfe, Legislative Director with the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association.

The "American Dream" bill will also adjust the renter's credit by a corresponding amount.

Defendant Sentenced for 1997 Sexual Assault
DATE: May 1, 2017
CASE: Joseph Brian Cox (Case #15F00096)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Matt Chisholm, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Marjorie Koller sentenced Joseph Brian Cox to 20 years in prison. On March 15, 2017, Cox pled guilty to three counts of forcible digital penetration and two counts of forcible rape.

On the morning of May 20, 1997, Joseph Brian Cox unlawfully entered the home of the then 14-year-old victim, her mother and her 11-year-old sister. Cox wore a mask and held the family at gunpoint. He proceeded to bind the hands and feet of the victim's mother and sister with rope and tape. He also bound the victim's hands before forcibly sexually assaulting her in her bedroom. After the assault, Cox smoked a cigarette in the victim's room. He then looted the house for cash and valuables before fleeing. The assailant could not be positively identified because he was masked during the crime. Initial DNA testing of items found at the scene did not yield significant results and the investigation stalled pending further leads.

The Sacramento County Sheriff's Cold Case Unit continued to work the case. As DNA technology advanced, items they submitted to the District Attorney's Crime Lab for testing resulted in a hit to Cox. The most significant DNA matches were found on the cigarette butt recovered from the victim's bedroom and a roll of tape recovered from the scene that was used to bind the victims.

Defendant Convicted for Murdering Wife
DATE: May 3, 2017
CASE: Justin Jesus (Case #15F07687)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Shelly McGill

Justin Jesus was convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of his wife, Elizabeth Masters. The jury found the allegation that Jesus used a knife in the commission of the murder to be true. Jesus was also convicted of felony domestic violence, including allegations that he inflicted great bodily injury and used a deadly weapon.

Jesus had a history of domestic violence, and in the course of their tumultuous relationship, Ms. Masters left their home to stay with her family in Folsom. Approximately one week later on December 20, 2015, Jesus showed up at Elizabeth's parents' home in Folsom. Elizabeth Masters and Jesus left the Folsom home around midnight. Several hours later, family members heard a commotion outside

and found Jesus in the backyard holding a knife. Soon after, the family discovered Elizabeth's body on the side of the house, buried under a pile of leaves. Elizabeth had been stabbed numerous times including severe lacerations to the neck. Jesus was apprehended by law enforcement a short distance away, and in possession of the murder weapon.

Jesus faces a maximum sentence of 26 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for May 18, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Bowman.

Defendant Pleads Guilty to Attempted Murder of His Children
DATE: May 5, 2017
CASE: Charles Ewers (Case #15F02083)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Charles Ewers pled guilty to two counts of attempted murder and admitted two enhancements for causing great bodily injury and use of a deadly weapon.

On April 4, 2015 at 9:24 p.m., Sacramento Sheriff Deputies responded to Ewers home after receiving a call from his estranged wife who was concerned about her children's whereabouts as Ewers had failed to return them at the agreed upon time. Deputies heard the sound of a running car motor from the garage. They forced entry into the garage where they found two children in the car, ages 8 and 10, with bloodied head and faces. There were yellow hoses connected from the exhaust pipe that led into a small opening through the rear passenger window. Deputies immediately removed the children from the vehicle while Charles Ewers remained in the car in the driver's seat with a replica airsoft gun on his seat before he was later removed.

Ewers admitted to deputies that he had given his children Ambien to make them drowsy and had planned to suffocate his children by carbon monoxide poisoning. When they failed to get drowsy, he used a mallet to strike them each repeatedly on their heads, causing them extensive injuries to their head and bodies. After physically assaulting them, he then forced the children into his running car where he told the children they were all "going to Heaven."

When questioned by law enforcement, Charles Ewers stated, "I am in control. I am not in a rage. I am in control and I am sad that it didn't work out. If I could try again, I would." He later explained that he had planned the act for several months and was looking for the "right time" to do it.

Ewers will be sentenced to 22 years to life in state prison. Sentencing is scheduled for June 6, 2017 at 8:30 a.m. in Department 63 by the Honorable Jaime Roman. ★

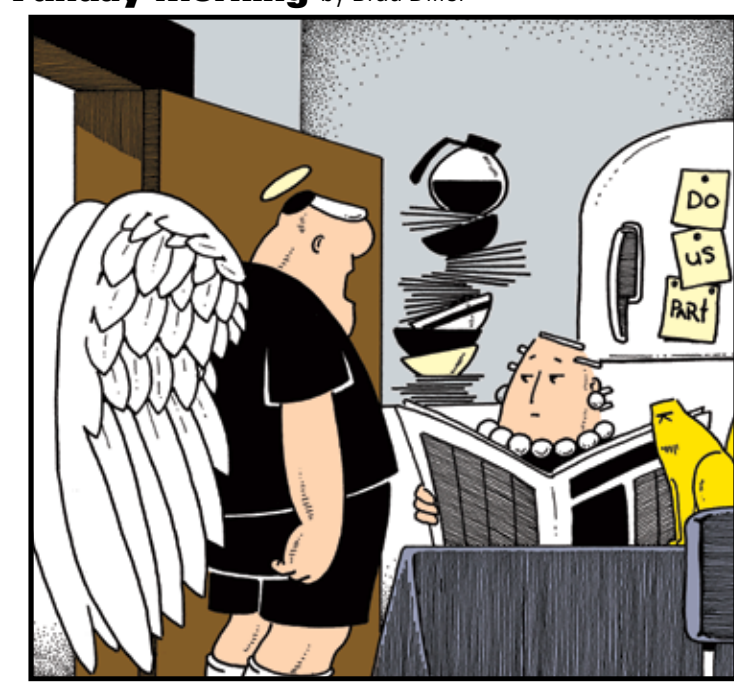

Jerry Brown's New Budget Includes Millions To Defend Illegal Aliens From Deportation

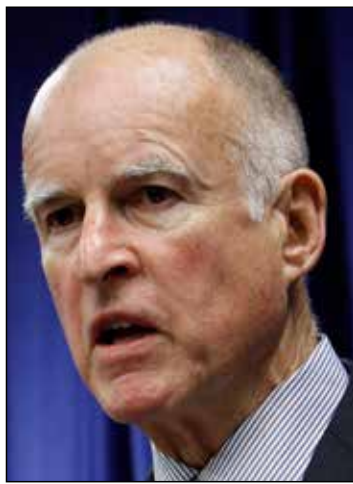
Last week, California Governor Jerry Brown unveiled his May revisions to the state budget proposal he rolled out in January. Buried deep among billions of dollars in proposed new spending are millions of dollars for the state to provide criminal defense for illegal immigrants in California who are facing deportation to their home country by their own federal government.

Apparently the governor is proposing to put taxpayer money where his mouth is, following up on his bold statement last January in his State of the State speech to the California legislature: "Let me be clear: We will defend everybody - every man, woman and child - who has come here for a better life and has contributed to the well-being of our state."

It is certainly controversial, to say the least, for a state government, within the United States, to start providing taxpayer dollars to fight efforts by the United States to deport people who have entered the country, or overstayed their visas, in violation of the law.

To find this controversial spending proposal, just in the summary document of the budget, you have to comb through to the Department of Social Services section, and then read all of the way through to page 38, in the Health and Human Services subsection - where you find under "Immigration Services" an increase of \$15 million to \$30 million "to further expand the availability of legal services for people seeking, "...deportation defense..."

President Donald Trump ran and was elected on a platform of cracking down on illegal immigration. Trump's Attorney General, former Senator Jeff Sessions (R-AL), has been carrying out the President's promises by focusing federal law enforcement resources

on cracking down on illegal immigration.

The Trump administration's focus on this issue, conversely, has been a rallying cry for the progressive Democrats that control the levers of political power in California. Legislation authored by State Senate President Pro Tem Kevin De León (D-Los Angeles) to make California a "sanctuary state" is rapidly advancing through the legislative process. In addition, the state legislature has produced stinging anti-Trump resolutions. Last week, it was announced that the California legislature extended a controversial contract for former Obama-era Attorney General Eric Holder and his law firm, at \$25,000 per month, focused on taking an aggressive posture against the Trump administration.

Sacramento Democrats are not the first to engage in this very aggressive funding of efforts to stymie federal immigration enforcement. Several large cities around California with Democratic mayors and city councils have already entered into this space.

Last December, Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti announced the creation of the "L.A. Justice Fund" to include \$5 million in taxpayer funds, saying that the city would fight for and, "... reach out to people who are

American by every measure except the papers they hold..."

(Earlier this year, the Los Angeles City Council also unanimously passed a resolution calling on the President to be impeached.)

In February, San Francisco Mayor Ed Lee allowed the city's Public Defender's Office to use more than \$200,000 in savings from the city's budget to hire additional staff attorneys for the defense of illegal immigrants facing deportation.

Most recently, earlier this month, at the request of Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg, the city council of California's capital voted unanimously to make \$300,000 of city funds available to assist a network of legal, education and non-profit groups help illegal immigrants facing deportation.

In yet another example of the high priority that Governor Brown places in "taking on" the policies of the federal government and President Trump, he has also proposed increasing the budget of California Attorney General Xavier Becerra to support a stream of lawsuits challenging executive orders of the President. The revision to the Attorney General's budget includes funding for 19 attorneys and 12 other staff members.

There is no doubt that Democrats in California are on the "tip of the spear" in taking on the policies and directives of the newly elected Republican president. Frankly, in and of itself, that is not so surprising.

But what is controversial to say the least is the fact that tens of millions of dollars are being spent, so far, by the State of California and some of the state's largest cities to wage public relations and legal battles against the federal government.

Reaching a national audience on May 10th from Sacramento, BBB, local victims and leaders of two security industry associations joined forces to alert consumers, along with ADT, a leading home security company, BBB Accredited Business and National Partner.

"Consumers should feel safe wherever they are," said Mary E. Power, president and CEO of the Council of Better Business Bureaus. "When a con takes advantage of people, literally at their front door, it poses a significant challenge. We appreciate the industry taking a lead on helping BBB address these deceptive sales tactics."

BBB was represented today at the Sacramento event by Lynn Conner, interim CEO of BBB serving Northeast California, who echoed Power's thoughts: "We hope our outreach will educate consumers on what to do when they encounter someone using deceptive sales tactics at their front door."

In 2016, over a half million consumers across North America used BBB resources to research information about home security

companies. But thousands also complained about dishonest and misleading sales pitches.

Speaking out today was victim Marie Marshall. The 86-year-old was deceived into switching her ADT service to another company which the salesman falsely claimed was affiliated with ADT. Marshall is now in a 60-month contract with that company, paying a higher monthly rate.

"By the time I realized I had signed with another company, it was too late," said Marshall. "I am very disappointed that I got duped into doing business with a company that practices deceptive sales."

BBB shared tips for consumers who are considering a home security system (bbb.org/homesecurity), and also released advice to potential employees who are being recruited to spend their summers knocking on doors (bbb.org/alarmsales).

"We urge those who are selling security systems to abide by the BBB Standards for Trust," said Conner. "Tell the truth, honor promises, and embody integrity."

Jay Hahn, Executive Director and CEO, The Monitoring Association said "We are in the life-safety business where credibility is incredibly important. So, it pains me, greatly, to hear about how a few unscrupulous sales reps are giving a black eye to an entire industry that I dearly love. Cleaning up our industry is

job one. We're making progress and getting our messages out. Some companies like ADT and Protection One are leading the way by fighting deceptive sales through legal action in a court of law and through PR opportunities in a court of public opinion."

Merlin Guilbeau, Executive Director and CEO, Electronic Security Association said "The ESA Code of Ethics and Standards of Conduct are our industry's stake in the ground. It says that you cannot be a member of our association if your company engages in deceptive, misleading, unlawful or unethical business practices. It is our expectation that ESA members will take this code seriously and continually make it part of their company's culture and way of doing business. It is also our expectation, that if there is a failure other ESA members and consumers will take the appropriate steps by following the process outlined in the code and file a complaint so that ESA may take appropriate action. Let's be clear... we are NOT 'knocking' door-knocking. Door-to-door selling is a very effective tool, practiced for decades in our industry. But it needs to be practiced the right way, with honesty and integrity."

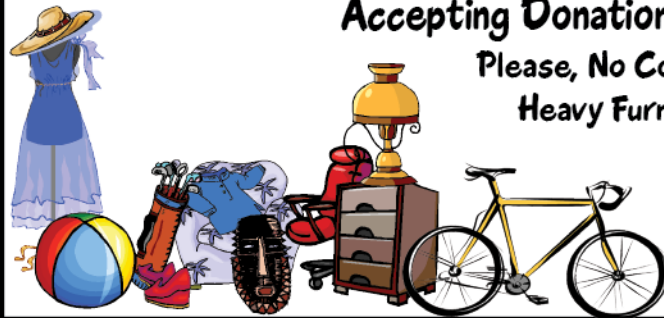

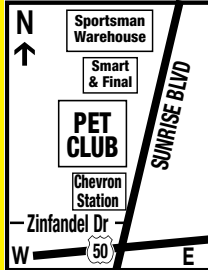

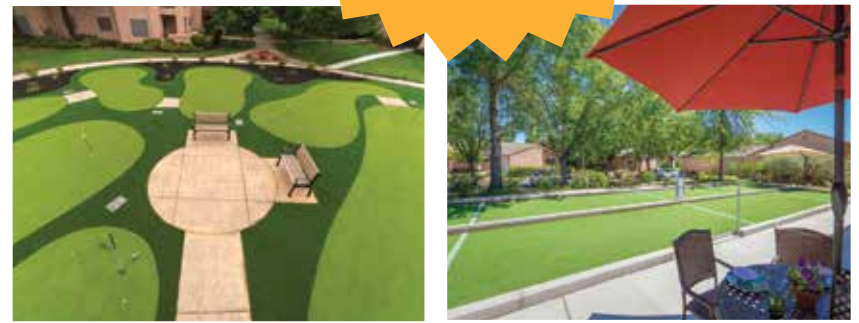
