# **Effort to Repeal**

Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) has stepped up to repeal the Democrat's recent huge gas tax. He has issued following statements regarding his effort to repeal Senate Bill 1, the transportation proposal recently passed by the legislature that imposes \$52 billion in permanent new gas taxes and user fees on California motorists.

"I will be exploring every possible avenue to repeal the gas tax, whether it's through legislation, an initiative to change or eliminate other gas taxes, or other courses of action. I am going to fight to overturn this unfair and regressive tax and get some justice for the California families and businesses that are getting nickeled and dimed to death.

"The Governor has compared fixing our roads with the urgency of fixing a leaky roof. Well guess what Governor Brown, Californians have already paid to fix the roof but the repairs have not been made and we're all wondering why we're left paying for the same service twice.

"And how are the people supposed to believe that this money will actually go to transportation? Currently, the state is diverting a billion dollars in weight fees away from roads every year. According to a recent Legislative Analyst's Office report, CalTrans is overstaffed by 3,500 people wasting \$500 million of road money every year. Why would anyone believe that this new tax isn't a bait and switch sham where the funds won't be diverted to pay for pet projects like the High Speed Rail boondoggle? "We already have some of the highest gas taxes and worst roads in the country. For years we've starved transportation when we've had many billions in surplus, even though it was supposedly a 'system in crisis.' Before we take a single penny from Californians in new taxes, it is our duty to make 100-percent certain that we are spending the money we already collect exclusively on road repair and construction. Senate Bill 1 failed to do that and I'm going to make every attempt to make it right." # Washburn to Play Softball at Saint Anselm

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - St. Francis senior Lauren Washburn has committed to play softball at Saint Anselm College in New Hampshire, fulfilling a lifetime dream to play in college.

"It took a lot," said Washburn of her softball career. "I have been trying to do it (have a chance to play softball in college) since the seventh grade. To finally be able to say, I am going somewhere to play softball is achieving that goal."

Washburn is a three-year letter winner in the St. Francis softball program. She is hitting .500 this season with 22 RBI with seven multi-hit games. She had a season-high four RBI in a win over Casa Roble earlier this season.

"She is a consistent hitter and puts the ball in the play," said Head Coach Kevin Warren. "She is a great situational hitter who understands the game and is a student of the game."

"It is very pretty out in New Hampshire and there is a lot of snow," said Washburn. "It was a really pretty campus and people were very nice and friendly."

The snow presents challenges for a sport played outdoors in the spring and will provide a contrast to the sunny California weather Washburn is accustomed to in Sacramento.

"Right now the field is still covered in snow so they have been traveling a lot," said Washburn. "I like to travel and they go to states like Florida and Massachusetts to play a lot."

Entering the third week of league play, Washburn still has more than half her senior season left with the Troubadours. She hopes to make the most of it for her and her Troubie teammates.

"I want to keep being a team player and help St. Francis go somewhere (in the postseason)," said Washburn.

### Get Your Yard Ready for Summer at Mulch Mayhem

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Sacramento Suburban Water District (SSWD), Carmichael Water District and other local water providers will be holding Mulch Mayhem events on Saturday, May 6th and 20th from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm at various locations throughout the Sacramento region.

This free event is designed to help local residents ready their landscapes and yards for the hot days of summer. Mulch slows evaporation, moderates soil temperature, and helps controls weeds. As it breaks down, mulch also adds beneficial nutrients to the soil.

"Adding three to four inches of mulch around plants and trees is one of the best ways people can reduce their landscape's water needs," said Greg Bundesen, SSWD's Water Conservation Supervisor. "It's estimated that by taking this simple step, people can save 30 gallons for every 1,000 square feet of yard each time they water."

Customers of SSWD, Placer County Water Agency, the City of Roseville, Carmichael Water District, San Juan Water District and the City of Sacramento will be able to take up to one yard of mulch (enough to fill the bed of a pickup truck) for use at their home. The mulch is available on a first-come, first-served basis while supplies last.

Customers are encouraged to bring their own shovels, containers, tarps or other items to cover

the mulch and must provide their own way to haul it away. The free mulch is for personal use only, and cannot be resold or used for commercial properties.

Last year's Mulch Mayhem was a huge success with all of the participating water providers running out of mulch before the end of the event. Locations and more information is available online at BeWaterSmart.info.





# Local Charity Shares Ways to Celebrate National Volunteer Week


Last year, Carmichael volunteers, families and groups paved the way as part of the Sacramento Area Team to collect shoebox gifts for more than 14,700 children.

Tax Freedom Day Late Again for California

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** -Californians who have filed their income tax returns by the April 18 deadline will unfortunately have to wait eight days longer than the rest of the nation until they've collectively earned enough money to pay

off their total tax bill for the year. Tax Freedom Day, calculated annually by the Tax Foundation, is the day when Americans have earned enough money to pay their taxes at the federal, state and local levels.

Nationally, Tax Freedom Day lands on April 23, but for California

it lands on May 1.

"For some lawmakers, this terrible distinction seems to be a badge of honor," said Board of Equalization Vice Chair George Runner. "With liberal politicians recently voting to increase gas and car taxes, I fear this day will come even later next year for hardworking taxpayers."

According to the Tax Foundation, Americans will pay \$3.5 trillion in federal taxes and \$1.6 trillion in state and local taxes, for a total tax bill of \$5.1 trillion, or 31 percent of national income. That's more than Americans will collectively spend on food, clothing and housing combined.

Compared to other states, California's Tax Freedom Day is one of the latest in the nation. Only Massachusetts, New York, New Jersey and Connecticut have later dates.

#### "Roads 101" subject of Two **Community Meetings**

A presentation by Sacramento County's Director of Transportation about the status of our streets and roads will be held at my next two Community Meetings in May. The first will be on Tuesday, May 9, at the Carmichael Park Clubhouse, 5750 Grant Avenue, and second will be in Arden Arcade on Thursday, May 11, at the Conzelmann Community Center at Howe Park, 2201 Cottage Way. Both meetings will start at 6 pm.

At the upcoming meetings the

transportation director will present what I call "Roads 101" to explain how road maintenance is funded, the funding limitations and regulatory restrictions as well as analysis of Governor Brown's legislative package that is expected to help address the road maintenance challenges faced by local government.

Last fall I hoped Measure B (the local transportation sales tax measure) would help close the County's \$450 million road maintenance backlog. While the measure garnered 65.7% of the vote in November, it did not meet the necessary legal threshold for passage (it needed 66.7%). Had the measure passed, our Department of Transportation estimated the County would be able to repave almost all of the residential streets in the unincorporated area.





# **Globalist Influence in the Trump Administration**

The most globalist and influential political action organization in the United States is the Council on Foreign Relations (CFR). The Donald Trump Administration is the most clean of CFR influence in many decades, perhaps since Calvin Coolidge. Traditionally this organization claims either the president or the vice president in every administration, and always the Secretary of State, and ambassadorships to the United Nations, Russia and China. Under Trump it claims none of these posts. Moreover, CFR members largely fill the majority of presidential cabinets. Normally, they have highly placed members in both major political parties and thus for almost 100 years they win every presidential election. They are the moneyed elite capable of bringing to candidates the millions of dollars that are needed to win. They are in both political parties and they own the major media outlets. Thus their influence over presidential candidates for a hundred years is never really covered, but all presidential candidates know

of their influence and power.

No candidate for president gets to office without CFR approval, until now

Over the decades they have been called the shadow government, the secret combination, the moneyed establishment, the eastern establishment and now just the establishment. They have hated only two presidential party nominees Barry Goldwater in 1964 and Donald Trump in 2016. The first they destroyed, the second they seek to remove or destroy.

President Woodrow Wilson was the first president to reference a secret influence over politics at the highest level. In his The New Freedom (1913) he wrote of his experience with a hidden force: "Since I entered politics, I have chiefly had men's views confided to me privately. Some of the biggest men in the United States in the field of commerce and manufacture, are afraid of somebody, are afraid of something. They know that there is a power somewhere so organized, so subtle, so watchful, so interlocked, so complete, so pervasive that they had better not speak above their breath when they speak in condemnation of it."

A hundred years later, Secretary of State, Hillary Clinton, identified the CFR as her source of direction when she addressed them in their new D. C. "sub-center down the street." She told them: "I am delighted to be at these new headquarters. I have been often to the mother ship in New York City but it is good to have an outpost of the Council right here down the street from the State Department. We get a lot of advice from the Council so this will mean that I won't have as far to go to be told what we

should be doing and how we should think about the future." In the presidential campaign the establishment media portrayed Donald Trump as a joke-certainly not a serious candidate, not a real conservative, a flip-flopper on the issues, anti-women, anti-immigration, insulting to everyone, a braggart, only into himself, least likely to beat Hillary Clinton, only attractive to white males, and not in touch with reality with respect to the Middle East, and more. They were wrong. A third of these charges would have easily destroyed previous candidates. As president they work to obstruct everything he does. He is vilified in virtually every national press outlet. Unfortunately Trump's CFR record, although the best ever, is no longer pure. CFR Lieutenant General H. R. McMaster replaced General Michael Flynn as National Security Adviser and Neil M. Gorsuch as U.S. Supreme Court justice, is imminent. Gorsuch was first listed as a CFR member in the 2007 Annual Report and thereafter for five years. He is not currently listed. Gorsuch must be questioned regarding this affiliation. Membership in the CFR is by invitation only following a period of observation making certain that your loyalty to the values of the organization are impeccable. Those values are empowerment of the United Nations, internationalism, world government, nation building and eradicating national borderseach out of harmony with the Constitution as created by the Founders.

Gorsuch may be promoted as an originalist on the Constitution but as a member of an organization that sees the Constitution as

an obstruction to the New World Order, which the CFR promotes, the Senate must know which loyalty is primary and if not the Constitution he must be rejected by all Senators. Should a decision come before him that forces him to choose between two loyalties, internationalism and U.S. nationalism, which will he endorse?

Another concern surfaces; Ruth Bader Ginsburg also has CFR membership and thus two of the nine justices of the highest court in the land could have a higher loyalty. She has made no secret that she views international law (UN law) as constitutional. In fact her loyalty to the Constitution came into question in 2012 when the Egyptian government sought her advice in the writing of a new constitution. She recommended the South African or Canadian models and could not recommend the U.S Constitution. Two of nine justices who may have a higher loyalty than the Constitution is two too many.

Trump would be better off to avoid all globalist organizations and members in his administration. There are plenty of experts available without globalist sympathy. Still, he has done well in reducing globalist influence in those he chooses to advise him.

### **Credit Unions in Sacramento County Generate \$850 Million Impact**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Credit unions serving members in Sacramento County recently generated an \$850 million annual impact to the region's economy, which supported 5,730 local jobs and also produced \$55.1 million in savings to those members according to a special report released April 18th by the California Credit Union League.

The economic impact of both locally-headquartered and non-local credit unions serving members across the county in 2016 also contributed to the industry's total statewide impact across California, which was \$17 billion. This is equal to the same positive effect as some of the nation's largest corporations in America, including Kraft Heinz, General Mills, Xerox, and Facebook-each having approximately \$17 - 18 billion in annual revenue.

As they pump financial benefits back to members through offering better interest rates on loans and deposit accounts, as well as lower or no fees, these 17 credit unions were serving more than 575,000 members across Sacramento County through a mixture of online and mobile banking channels, as well as a network of 84 branches that members can visit in person.

The reports were commissioned by the League and independently completed and published by ECONorthwest, an economic research and consulting firm in Portland, OR. The study looked at balance sheet, regulatory "call report," and operational data to come to its conclusions. ECONorthwest completed an independent analysis of credit unions surveyed

and used a "multiplier-effect" model to extrapolate its economic conclusions.

In a separate local quarterly-trends report, 10 credit unions headquartered in Sacramento County collectively hit records in membership (1.26 million members), money lentout (\$11 billion), and deposits (\$14.2 billion). These statewide trends in first-mortgages, secondmortgages, HELOCs, business loans, new and used auto loans, credit cards, and other consumer loans give a snapshot of how local consumers are currently spending their money.

"Credit unions' combined ripple effect in the broader economy cannot be ignored as their financially cooperative, not-for-profit model reinvests local dollars back into local economies," said Diana Dykstra, president and CEO of the League, which is based in Ontario, CA. "These reports reaffirm credit unions' efforts to empower their members by helping them make wise financial decisions and thrive."

Household wealth and socio-economic mobility are increasingly seen as being tied to opportunities in financial education, an area many credit unions consider their strength.

"Research shows that up to half of wealth inequality may be caused by differences in financial literacy," states a January 2017 Education, Income and Wealth article published by the Federal Reserve. "As a result, people are more likely to use costly home loan mortgage products, pay higher transaction costs and fees, and use high-cost borrowing options."

# USCIS Will Issue Redesigned Green Cards and Employment Authorization Documents

#### USCIS Special Release

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services today announced a redesign to the Permanent Resident Card (also known as a Green Card) and the Employment Authorization Document (EAD) as part of the Next Generation Secure Identification Document Project. USCIS will begin issuing the new cards on May 1, 2017.

These redesigns use enhanced graphics and fraud-resistant security features to create cards that are highly secure and more tamper-resistant than the ones currently in use.

The new card designs demonstrate USCIS' commitment to continue taking a proactive approach against the threat of document tampering and fraud. They are also part of an ongoing effort between USCIS, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement to enhance document security and deter counterfeiting and fraud.

The new Green Cards and

EADs will: Display the individual's photos on both sides;Show a unique graphic image and color palette: (Green Cards will have an image of the Statue of Liberty and a predominately green palette; EAD cards will have an image of a bald eagle and a predominately red palette); Have embedded holographic images; and no longer display the individual's signature. Also, Green Cards will no longer have an optical stripe on the back.

Some Green Cards and EADs issued after May 1, 2017, may still display the existing design format as USCIS will continue using existing card stock until current supplies are depleted. Both the existing and the new Green Cards and EADs will remain valid until the expiration date shown on the card.

Certain EADs held by individuals with Temporary Protected Status (TPS) and other designated categories have been automatically extended beyond the validity date on the card. For additional information on which EADs are covered, please visit the Temporary Protected Status and American Competitiveness in the 21st Century Act web pages on uscis. gov.

Both versions are acceptable for Form I-9, Employment Eligibility Verification, E-Verify, and Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE). Some older Green Cards do not have an expiration date. These older Green Cards without an expiration date remain valid. Individuals who have Green Cards without an expiration date may want to consider applying for a replacement card bearing an expiration date. Obtaining the replacement card will reduce the likelihood of fraud or tampering if the card is ever lost or stolen.

### Legislation to Fix Security Flaw in State's Voter File Passes First Hurdle

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - In a rare moment of bipartisanship, the Senate Committee on Elections and Constitutional Amendments unanimously voted to pass Senator Jim Nielsen's measure to fix a security flaw the state's voter file.

"Our democracy is an honor system based on trust," said Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama). "We must do everything we can to protect its integrity and keep the trust of the people. This measure will help ensure that trust."

"I thank my colleagues on the committee for their support," added Senator Nielsen.

Senate Bill 682, if passed, would prohibit the Department Motor Vehicles (DMV) from giving the Secretary of State electronic information needed to complete the voter registration affidavit for ineligible voters who hold special drivers' licenses for noncitizens.

California's current online voter registration system automatically allows the voter registration of anyone with a drivers' license who self-certifies that they are eligible to vote - including individuals DMV knows to be ineligible because they were issued special noncitizen drivers' licenses. These noncitizen drivers' licenses do not establish voter eligibility, yet the online voter registration system only requires a drivers' license number. As a result, undocumented residents may be unlawfully registered to vote.

There is no protocol for

communication between the Secretary of State and the Department of Motor Vehicles to prevent these registrants from being approved under current law.

"Keeping the voter roll clean and up-to-date is a challenging task. This bill helps fill a gap in the security of the voter roll," said Candace Grubbs, Butte County Elections Clerk-Recorder.



# **RT Financials Showing Positive Trend**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (Sac RT) has been relentlessly optimizing business practices over the past eight months to bring its financial house in order, and the positive results are very encouraging. In Fiscal Year (FY) 2017, Sac RT is trending below budget. This has allowed Sac RT to develop a budget for FY 2018 that is expected to be \$1.6 million less than the prior year.

Additionally, by working diligently over the past year with rating agencies, last week Sac RT received great news from Moody's, a bond credit rating service, that upgraded Sac RT's bond rating from "negative" watch to "stable" outlook, which will help Sac RT to issue future bonds at a much better interest rate for regional capital projects. The significant transformation that Sac RT has made in the last year, as well as strong political support and strong board governance, is

building up RT's long-term financial stability, which will continue to move Sac RT in a new direction.

Under the direction of Henry Li, General Manager/CEO, Sac RT committed to strengthening its finances while making the system more clean, safe and convenient for riders. Sac RT has identified innovative revenue sources, strengthened its finances and reduced expenses to fund maintenance and capital investments. By aggressively containing costs and pursuing revenue enhancement opportunities, Sac RT has secured more than \$3 million in operating funding, which helped enhance customer services.

"At a time when many public agencies are increasing budgets, we have been able to reduce ours. We are figuring out innovative ways to do more with less." said Henry Li, General Manager/CEO. "Our number one priority is the customer, and the ability to reduce the annual budget without cutting service or increasing fares is

a huge victory from where Sac RT was a year ago."

Based on these positive trends, Sac RT projects to add to its fund balance for the first time in three years, and build up an emergency cash reserve of \$6 million (with a 2017 year-end goal of \$9 to \$10 million). This will go a long way towards reducing Sac RT's reliance on its line of credit to pay bills, a goal set by the Board of Directors.

By building strong employee and labor relations, Sac RT has been able to identify ways to reduce the annual increases associated with salaries and benefits that continue to offer value to employees, at a sustainable cost. There will only be a small increase in spending in this category for FY 2018, which is expected to be \$1.95 million, or 1.8 percent, a modest amount for an organization that provides over 1,000 jobs to the region.

# **California's Economic Output Outpaces Nation for Fourth Straight Year**

Domestic Product (GDP) has grown consistently rates that ranged from 5.0 percent to 10.4 percent over faster than the nation's as a whole for four straight years. In 2015, the California GDP rose 5.6 percent, while the U.S. GDP increased 3.7 percent (unadjusted for inflation). Also called "economic output," GDP measures the market value of goods, services, and structures that are produced within a particular period, and tends to be related to population, income, spending, employment, housing permits, and other measures of economic activity. According to the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, the New York-Newark-Jersey City metropolitan area led the nation with an economic output of about \$1.603 trillion in 2015. California was represented by two of the top 10 areas: Los Angeles-Long Beach-Anaheim (\$930.8 billion), and San Francisco-Oakland-Hayward (\$431.7 billion). The Los Angeles metropolitan area accounts for 37.9 percent of California's GDP, while the San Francisco Bay Area comprises 17.6 percent. The Sacramento-Roseville region accounts for 4.8 percent (\$118.8 billion). San Jose has been the fastest growing metropolitan

area within California - and the second fastest in the U.S. - with stronger economic growth than 380 of the SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California's Gross nation's 382 metropolitan areas in 2015. With growth the past five years, the San Jose area had the largest increase in that time frame -37.6 percent - more than 60 percent higher than the California average gain of 23.1 percent, for a total GDP of more than \$235 billion. The state's second-largest increase was in the Visalia-Porterville area - 32.4 percent - followed by Merced (30.2 percent), Napa (29.6 percent) and Madera (28.1 percent). The Hanford-Corcoran area also finished above the state average (24.2 percent). Both the Chico and Sacramento-Roseville areas had strong showings in 2015, ranking fourth and fifth in the state respectively in GDP growth. One way to compare economic wellbeing among regions is to calculate inflation-adjusted GDP per capita. Real economic output per capita in the San Jose area was close to twice that of the California average in 2015. Other areas with higher than average per capita real GDP include San Diego, and Napa. Fair Oaks, CA (MPG) - Long-awaited plans for renovating one of the region's oldest private country clubs is officially underway at North Ridge Country Club, involving a \$3.5 million overhaul that promises members and guests at the club alike a trail of new greens and bunkers on par with some of the finest courses in the world.

The club's membership overwhelmingly approved the renovation plan and began the bid process for contracting roughly a year ago, ultimately selecting Palo Alto-based Robert Trent Jones II Golf Course Architects (RTJ II) for the project, which is credited for development of more than 270 golf courses across 40 countries and six continents. "We got it down to three finalists for the design of our new course, and then we took it down to one, and RTJ II won out," said North Ridge General Manager, Rink Sanford.

During an April 6 groundbreaking for the project, Robert T. Bruce Charlton, president and chief design officer for RTJ II, said the course would be going from good to outstanding, likening the ultimate overhaul to a "My Fair Lady" transformation, Sanford said.

"I love the quote Robert gave at our ground-breaking," said Sanford. "He said 'I like to compare North Ridge Country Club to a classy older woman who is beautiful and graceful, but just in need of a new dress.' To me, his description just perfectly crystalizes what North Ridge is all about and how beautiful she really is."

RTJII founder Robert Trent Jones, who passed away in 1987, is known for cutting trail of legendary successes in the completion of some of the country's most notable golf courses, beginning with a winning contract to design the Peachtree Golf Club in Atlanta in collaboration with golf legend Bobby Jones, followed up by securing a commission to redesign the 11th and 16th holes at Augusta National Golf Club.

Coveted for its high-elevation and rolling terrain, North Ridge Country

Club was founded in 1952 by architects William Francis Bell and his son, Billy Jr., renown for crafting elite courses at Rivera Country Club, Bel-Air Country Club and Torrey Pines, among others.

The 18-hole parkland golf course at North Ridge Country Club is spread across approximately 165 rolling green acres on Madison Avenue in Fair Oaks. Although the club's event center and adjacent buildings were renovated in 1997, the 63-year old course itself, says Sanford, will be getting its first upgrade, a much needed makeover to keep the facility competitive with other private clubs in the region and beyond.

"This is a fine course and we have good conditions, but what we are really doing now is modernizing and making an investment in our course to stay competitive in the private club market," Sanford said.

North Ridge was designed incorporating an old push-up mound construction method, explained Sanford, which has, over time, created drainage issues for the course, spurred by deteriorating root structures, all of old push-up method that was used to ing construction of the new greens and

"Our forefathers picked a phenomenal place to put in a course," said Sanford. "We are at the highest point in the area and we are blessed with a lot of rolling hills and terrain, but the not possible many years ago," add-

design the course originally needs to be addressed."

Sampson said that the course's natural elevation changes will allow RTJII to redesign the club's greens and bunkers to take advantage of its hilly topography in ways "that were simply

bunkers will be achieved without disrupting mature trees that have called North Ridge home for decades.

"Today, players really want greens with solid drainage, and so what this will do for us is allow us to keep the mature trees and the rolling hills, but in and around the greens and bunkers we'll be adding better drainage to bring the course in line with some of the most competitive, high-caliber golf courses anywhere in the world," Sanford said.

Meanwhile, high-quality, temporary bentgrass sod greens are being created to offer members temporary greens to utilize during the construction process.

In addition to the cache of a worldclass design firm capturing the bid for the renovations, the renovation project will also have a local touch. RTJII's Senior Project Architect, Mike Gorman was raised in Sacramento and is reported to have grown up playing the course. "This is like home to us," RTJII's Charlton said. "We travel all around the world, and having a project near our offices in Palo Alto, with Mike's family still living in Sacramento, makes this extra special."

The new course is expected to officially open in early 2018, Sanford said. While there are no increases on the horizon this year for membership fees, it is anticipated that fees will increase once the new course is fully operational. The current annual membership fee for North Ridge is \$6,500, however, due to the construction, which is expected to run through August, the club is offering a promotion of \$4,500, which runs through June.

"The long term hope is that once the new course is up and fully operational in early 2018, our membership price will go up, and that will be in keeping with what's going on with other clubs and membership fees at private courses across the country," Sanford said.

Membership at North Ridge, said Sanford, is currently at 463, near full capacity. To cover the costs of the project, members voted to each pay their share of the \$3.5 million, for a total of roughly \$8,000 or \$60 a month each.  $\star$
