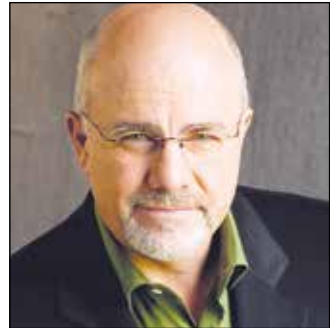

Cakery Brings on the Sweets

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Take everything you know about the upside down cake and toss it in the bowl. Melissa Archuleta is whipping up custom cakes that defy tradition, including layered wedding cakes that can be hung upside down from a tree, cowboy hats and guitars, even glass slippers.

Archuleta's Jaynee Cakes Custom Cakery celebrated its brick and mortar debut in Milagro Centre April 22. The business, which she refers to as a "cakery," as to distinguish it from a bakery, was previously providing custom orders exclusively online since 2010.

Archuleta's foray into cake making began roughly seven years ago. Wanting to cater to her husband's colleagues from In-An-Out Burger who were slated to come for a party, she crafted a giant hamburger cake complete with lettuce, tomato and even a smudge of catchup, resting on a sheet

cake resembling the chain's drive-thru facades.

"Everyone loved it," Archuleta says. Next, she turned to Craig's List where she posted a photo of the burger cake and offered to bake another one for anyone willing to pay for it.

"It just exploded," Archuleta said. "Really quickly, I found myself working as a cottage baker out of my home in the Bay Area, doing custom orders for brides mostly, but also some parties and special events."

In 2010, Archuleta and her husband moved to North Highlands and she brought the business with her, kept the ads going and the cake options cooking.

"I'd just keep coming up with new ideas for cakes, trying out new recipes and designs, checking out YouTube videos for inspiration,

Survey Finds Water-Rich Snowpack

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The recent manual snow survey by the Department of Water Resources (DWR) at Phillips Station in the Sierra Nevada found a Snow Water Equivalent (SWE) of 27.8 inches, 190 percent of the May 1 long-term average there (14.6 inches).

Electronic measurements indicate the water content of the statewide snowpack today is 42.5 inches, 196 percent of the May 1 average. The SWE of the northern Sierra snowpack is 39.9 inches (199 percent of average); the central and southern Sierra readings are 47.1 inches (202 percent of average) and 37.6 inches (180 percent of average), respectively.

Today's readings will help hydrologists forecast spring and summer snowmelt runoff into rivers and reservoirs. The melting snow supplies approximately one-third of the water used by Californians.

"California's cities and farms can expect good water supplies this summer," said DWR Acting Director Bill Croyle. "But this ample snowpack should not wash away memories of the intense drought of 2012-2016. California's precipitation is the most variable in the nation, and we cannot afford to stop conserving water."

Snowpack water content is measured manually on or near the first of the month from January to May. The Phillips snow course, near the intersection of Highway 50 and Sierra-at-Tahoe Road, is one of hundreds surveyed manually throughout the winter. Manual measurements augment the electronic readings from about 100 sensors in the state's mountains that provide a current snapshot of the snowpack's water content.

Frank Gehrke, chief of the California Cooperative Snow Surveys Program, conducted DWR's survey today at Phillips and said of his findings, 2017 has been "an extremely good year in terms of the snowpack."

Gehrke said the snowpack is encouraging in terms of surface water supplies. "The thing we're looking out for is primarily the southern Sierra, where we have full reservoirs and in some cases a huge snowpack," he said. "We want to make sure that we prudently manage that so we don't cause any downstream issues."

California's reservoirs are fed both by rain and snowpack runoff. A majority of the state's major reservoirs are above normal storage levels.

Earlier this month, DWR increased its estimate of this year's SWP supply to 100 percent of requests for contractors north of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and 85 percent of requests for other contractors, the highest since the 100-percent allocation in 2006.

Del Campo High Students Spend a Morning In DUI Court

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Standing firm in a teal suit and black glasses, attorney Paula Spano turned toward the crowd of roughly 1,000 Del Campo High School students seated behind her and delivered this stern admonishment: "You all look like very nice people, but I never want to see you in my courtroom," she said.

Spano, who works for the Sacramento County Office of the Public Defender, is assigned to the first-offender and misdemeanor DUI Court in Schools Program, first launched in San Joaquin County in 2003 and then in Sacramento County in 2010. Funded through a grant from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the program brings actual DUI court cases to area high schools, and Ms. Spano was trying to tell the students in a round-about way she hopes they never need her services.

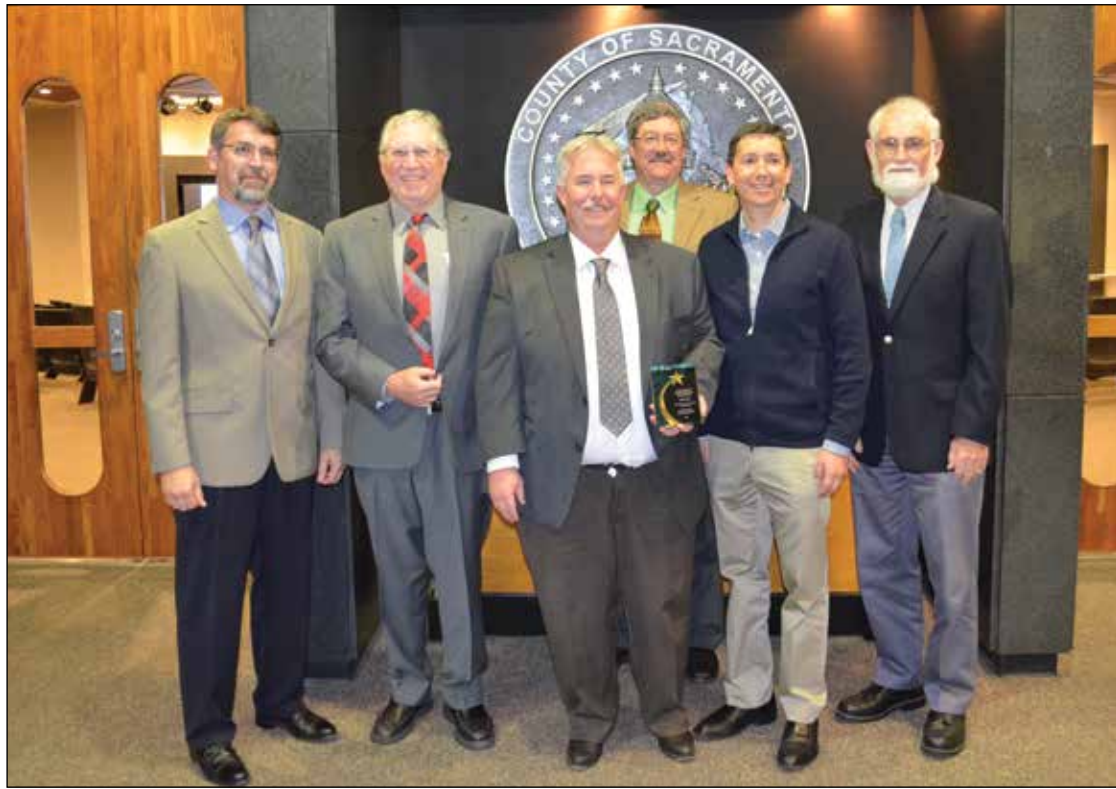

Carmichael Water District's Pipeline Conveyance Project Receives Environmental Recognition Award

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - On Monday, April 17, 2017 Carmichael Water District (CWD) was recognized by the Sacramento Environmental Commission (SEC) for demonstrating outstanding efforts to improve the environment through the American River Pipeline Project (Project).

Conceived in 2011, the Project puts into action Integrated Regional Water Management agreements and solutions that successfully solve water supply reliability issues at a local level. The Project was developed to provide a replacement water supply for Golden State Water Company's (GSWC) customers in Gold River and parts of the City of Rancho Cordova where supplies were lost due to groundwater contamination. Utilizing existing treatment capacity at CWD's Water Treatment Plant the project enables CWD to divert and deliver up to an additional 4.5 million gallons of

water per day through a newly installed pipeline crossing 80 feet under the American River. The new water supply originates from the recovery of remediated Aerojet Rocketdyne (Aerojet) groundwater discharged to the American River at Buffalo Creek. Additionally, the project provides improved drought reliability for CWD.

Specifically recognized by the SEC was the Project's environmental restoration component. This environmental restoration included the removal of 400 feet of 33-inch diameter exposed steel pipe dating back to the 1950s that had long been an unsightly presence in the river channel. In addition, three concrete intake and pump station structures, a failing riveted steel culvert, and large buried valves were demolished and removed. The restoration culminated with the reconnection of an upstream riparian habitat that had been separated from the

primary American River channel by freefall discharge from a 65-year old culvert. This concerted effort in restoring vital environment assets contributes to CWD's recognition among the environmental community as a leading steward of our natural habitat/resources.

"This is a great demonstration of Public and Private partnerships coming together to find solutions to achieve benefits for our community" said CWD's General Manager Steve Nugent. The project, spearheaded by CWD stands as a testimony to the region's commitment to working together in addressing both short-term drought response, long-term supply reliability planning, and environmental stewardship.

and getting better and better at it," said Archuleta, who has had no formal training.

Within a short time Archuleta was having to turn down orders. Then, when the state's new cottage industry laws went into effect in 2013, she ditched the online ads, crafted a website, took a few business management classes and began zeroing in on expanding her presence.

One of her first custom orders, which came via word of mouth, was for a cake in the shape of a glass slipper for a bridal shower.

"I had no idea how to do it, but this person called me and said she was told by another baker that 'if anyone could do the glass slipper cake, Jaynee Cakes could,'" said Archuleta. "I still don't know who that was, but I'd really like to."

One of Archuleta's signature wedding cakes is a pricy, seven-tier tower of sweetness adorned with, among other things, 24-karat, edible gold dust and Swarovski crystals, which sold for \$2,000.

"I'm kind of a daredevil," said Archuleta. "My motto just became if you can think it, we

can make it."

Growth meant getting out of the home kitchen and into a larger space, which is how and why Jaynee Cakes came to Milagro Centre. Growth also demanded more help, so Archuleta taught her mother, Terri Fruci all eight of her basic recipes and put her on the payroll. Fruci oversees the much of the baking in the storefront, leaving Archuleta more time to focus on designing, decorating and marketing the business.

"Mom has a background in retail and I'm more creative," says Archuleta. "So we complement each other. We know how to pull each other off the ledge if we start getting too crazy."

For now, you'll find cakes, whole or by the slice, cupcakes and artisan deserts on the menu, with a range of fillings and frostings all made from fresh ingredients, including strawberry lemonade with lemon filling, white almond with raspberries, red velvet, vanilla bean and of course plenty of chocolate. Baking and sugar sculpting classes for adults and kids are also on the radar.

Jayne Cakes has a small

counter area for seating where you can watch her at work. But unquestionably the most popular spot in the house is on the purple velvet sofa, which, aside from her product's quality and originality, may just be Archuleta's most powerful marketing tool.

"On opening night, out of nowhere, customers started taking turns sitting on the sofa, taking selfies," said Archuleta. "They created an Instagram account for it and even set up a hashtag at 'thepurplecouch.' It's kind of taking on a life of its own."

Del Campo High Students Spend a Morning In DUI Court

students a sobering opportunity to sit inside a court room where a real judge, a real defendant and a real prosecutor deliberate the sentencing phase in a DUI case and hand down the punishment, all in real time.

The intent is to expose young people to the actual legal and financial consequences of a DUI court conviction so that they may make better choices when they get behind the wheel. It

also aims to remind them of the heart-wrenching impact on communities and families DUI cases involving injuries and fatalities can have.

“The hope is that we can affect at least one person today by showing the actual ramifications of driving under the influence,” said Deputy District Attorney Brian Morgan who prosecuted the April 28 case at Del Campo.

More than 6,000 DUI cases are assigned to the Sacramento County Superior Court each year, Spano told the students. Her program, however, involves only cases concerning first-time offenders and those where there have been no serious injuries or loss of life. In exchange for volunteering to participate in the program, Spano said, defendants may be offered a reduced sentence of some form.

The Del Campo hearing was preceded by a jarring, 10-minute video montage of reenactments of drunken driving accidents and their aftermaths involving mostly teens or young adults. Once in session, Morgan delivered the facts of his case against

the 22-year old defendant seated next to his attorney, Ms. Spano, before Sacramento County Superior Court Judge Hon. Russell Hom.

The defendant, identified as “Mr. Wong,” was arrested in downtown Sacramento in January, explained Morgan. He’d been pulled over for speeding and charged with one count

of driving under the influence of a controlled substance, and another for driving with more than twice the legal limit of alcohol in his body.

As some students fiddled clandestinely with their cell phones, Mr. Wong plead guilty to the charges against him and Judge Hom delivered the sentence: Five days in jail, fines and court fees likely to amount to as much as \$12,000, three years of probation, a suspended driver’s license, and mandatory enrollment in a six-month program for defendants with high blood alcohol counts in their systems upon arrest.

When it was over, Judge Hom stepped down from the “bench” to speak to the students directly.

“What you just saw was real. This was an actual case,” Hom said. Then he gave Mr. Wong an opportunity to reflect and explain to students and the court what he was thinking the night he was downed as many as three shots of hard liquor before getting behind the wheel of his 2000 Dodge Infinity and speeding through town at 3 a.m.

“I felt like I was good enough to drive,” Wong said, before admitting to having driven under the influence many times prior. “I guess I just had that mindset that kids do. That we are superior to everything,” he said.

Not all DUI sentencing cases end with fines, fees and jail time. It’s well known that a good number of them involve horrific accidents causing deaths and life-altering injuries that bring unspeakable loss to victims’ families and loved ones, a fact the deputy district attorney made clear during a post-trial Q&A with the students.

“You know the difference between that video you saw and Mr. Wong? Dumb luck. Dumb, damn luck,” Morgan said.

Mary Beth Long-Randall, a graduate of Del Campo High School also addressed the students as a friend held up a photo of her brother, Harrison and his twin sister, both also Del Campo graduates. Between sobs, she slowly walked the students and the members of the court through the day in 2012 when a drunken driver with an apparent

history of DUI arrests, barreled through an intersection in their neighborhood not far from the school, leaving her brother, who was walking with his girlfriend at the time, so horrifically maimed he succumbed to his injuries 13 days later. He was 21.

Pleading with the students to think about their choices, Long-Randall reminded them of the irreparable damage caused to her family and countless others via the choices made by drunken or impaired drivers.

“Don’t make your community suffer. Don’t make your family or your parents suffer,” she said. Many students approached her afterward to offer hugs and support.

Judge Hom asked for a show of hands from those who’d had the experience of getting into a car with a driver they knew was impaired. Juliana Gordon, a senior at Del Campo raised her hand and explained she could identify and, although scared at the time, she got in the car anyway, something this program also tries to address. Young people must learn about the consequences of driving under the influence, but they also need to be given permission to tell friends or family members who’ve been drinking or getting high they won’t be getting in the car with them.

For Gordon, it was another case of dumb luck.

“I just got in the back seat and prayed,” she said. ★

It's Spare the Air Season

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento region's 23rd Spare The Air season starts May 1. Each summer, the Spare The Air campaign educates the public about the health effects of air pollution and asks residents to drive less when a Spare The Air alert is issued due to poor air quality.

Residents in the Sacramento region are urged to pay attention to the daily Air Quality Index (AQI) by downloading the free Sacramento Region Air Quality app. It's available in iOS, Android and Windows app stores. Users get the daily air quality forecast, current air pollution readings for Sacramento, Placer, Yolo-Solano and El Dorado counties, as well as Spare The Air alerts and wildfire smoke advisories when issued.

The AQI keeps the public informed about how clean or

polluted the air is in their communities. The chart has six categories: Good (green), Moderate (yellow), Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (orange), Unhealthy (red), Very Unhealthy (purple), and Hazardous (maroon).

Some people are more vulnerable to the health impacts of air pollution, including children, because their lungs are still developing; older adults and the elderly; pregnant women; and individuals with heart or lung disease, especially asthma. Even if you are healthy, air pollution can cause respiratory irritation or breathing difficulties during exercise or outdoor activities.

Follow these tips to help reduce air pollution and protect your health this summer:

• **Reduce your driving** - postpone at least one trip, especially on

- **Spare The Air day**
 - **Garden green** - avoid using gas-powered lawn mowers, leaf blowers and other garden equipment
 - **Link your errands into one big trip to lower pollution** by reducing cold starts of your car engine
 - **Work from home** - get employer permission in advance
 - **Bring your lunch to work**
 - **Use an electric starter or chimney briquette starter instead of charcoal lighter fluid** to start your barbecue
 - **Postpone outings on gas or diesel-powered boats, trail bikes or all-terrain vehicles** because they are high pollution sources
 - **Take public transit, walk or bike for commute, errands and recreation**

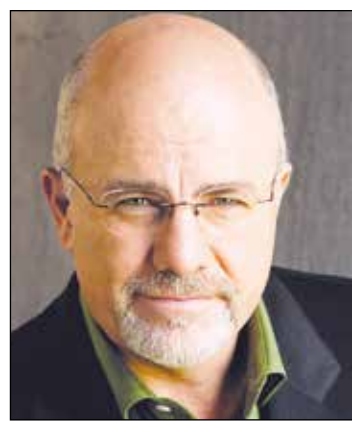

Dave Says

Giving beyond your means

Dear Dave,
My wife and I are debt-free except for our home, and we're on Baby Steps 4 and 5. Recently, we were asked to make a large donation to a charity we already support. We don't have the full cash amount they asked for on hand, and after hearing that, they said we could make monthly installment payments until the donation amount was paid in full. We're hesitant to do this because it seems a bit like debt to us. What do you think?
- Ben

Dear Ben,

Well, it's not debt. There would be no repercussions, other than guilt, if you couldn't make the full donation. So, it's not debt. To be honest though, I don't engage in that kind of stuff when it comes to giving.

My wife and I do all our giving — except for our tithe to our local church — through our family foundation. Sometimes we'll do this giving in a couple of installments, but it's not because we don't have the money. It's generally a situation where we're walking with the charity or ministry throughout the year,

and we're observing and assessing the need.

I'd be hesitant to give a gift when I don't have the money. Most of the time, approaches like this fall under the heading of manipulation. You're being pushed beyond your means. Most giving of this type, biblically speaking, would be from surplus. And right now, you don't have the surplus.

I'm kind of uncomfortable with this, Ben. I don't engage in making gift promises beyond what I have. It's not debt, but it kind of starts to feel like it, and it's not so much living beyond your means as it is giving beyond your means. That's just another reason it doesn't strike the right chord with me.

Know where to go

Dear Dave,

I am 18 years old and home-schooled. I want to continue my education this fall, and my dad works at a college near our home. I would get free tuition, but there's another college farther from home that I like just as much — but it's more expensive. On the plus side, it is a Christian school, and my faith is important to me. What do you think I should do?

Dear Braden,

Free tuition is a major plus in my book. At the same time, I can

understand your desire to get out from under mom and dad's wings a little bit. Just don't make the mistake of thinking that a school, church or anything else is completely Christian. You'll meet some of the wildest characters ever at a Christian school, just like you would at a public university. However, you would have the advantage of a built-in spiritual support network.

All things considered, and since you mentioned your faith specifically, I'd probably choose the Christian school. But I wouldn't go into debt to make it happen. There's absolutely no reason why you can't work and go to school at the same time. Pay it as you go. I did it, and I finished with good grades in four years. It's a little bit harder way to go, but it's a lot better than ending up with a ton of student loan debt when you're through!



Defendant Convicted of Carjacking, Discharging Firearm, Evading
 DATE: April 24, 2017
 CASE: Jamar Stevens (Case #15F07245)
 PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Scott Schweibish, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Jamar Stevens was convicted by a jury of carjacking with a use of a firearm allegation found true. Stevens was also convicted of shooting into an occupied dwelling, negligent discharge of a firearm, being a felon in possession of a firearm and evading police officers.

On November 28, 2015, officers attempted to stop Stevens, who was driving a stolen vehicle. Stevens attempted to elude the police, driving onto a dead-end street and then fleeing on foot into a backyard. Stevens tried to kick in the backdoor of a home before firing a single round into the sliding glass door to gain entry. Once inside, Stevens demanded the victim's car at gun point. Stevens fled in the victim's truck and was seen by officers, resulting in a second vehicle chase. When the truck became disabled, Stevens again fled on foot into the football stadium at Luther Burbank High School. Stevens tried to get inside the concession building by firing another round at the door, which did not work. Stevens finally gave himself up to officers.

Stevens' criminal history dates back to 2004, including multiple convictions for domestic violence, vehicle theft, evading police officers and resisting arrest.

Stevens faces a maximum sentence of 29 years and 4 months in prison. Sentencing is set for June 2, 2017, at 9:00 am in Department 33 before the Honorable Michael Savage.

Defendant Sentenced for Series of Sexual Assaults, Robberies
 DATE: April 24, 2017
 CASE: Jerry West Jr. (Case #15F05919)
 PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Jones, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Shelleyanne Chang sentenced Jerry West Jr. to 446 years to life in prison. On February 7, 2017, a jury convicted West of two counts of forcible oral copulation, two counts of assault with intent to commit forcible oral copulation, attempted forcible copulation, two counts of assault with a semi-automatic firearm, kidnapping for purposes of robbery and oral copulation, four counts of robbery and carjacking. The jury also found true multiple use of a firearm

allegations and a multiple victim allegation.

On August 31, 2015, Jerry West put a gun to a female victim's head, demanded her cellphone, groped her and demanded oral copulation. He then fled in the victim's vehicle. On September 22, 2015, two women were in a car that had just parked. West opened the car door, put a gun to the passenger's head and demanded property from her. He then put the gun to the driver's head, demanded her property and struck her in the head with the gun. West groped both victims while pointing the gun at them and forced the passenger to orally copulate him. When the driver began a struggle with West for the gun, West fired the gun at both victims and missed. West then grabbed the victims' purses before fleeing. On September 25, 2015, West grabbed another female victim and covered her mouth so tightly that she couldn't breathe. West dragged the victim into Southside Park, where he demanded her property, groped her and demanded that she orally copulate him. He continuously threatened her life if she screamed or ran. The victim was able to break free and ran to a nearby residence where she called 911. The victim's iPhone was tracked, leading officers to West. DNA evidence linked West to the two prior assaults.

West has two prior 2008 strike convictions for carjacking two separate victims.

Defendant Convicted for Child Sexual Assault
 DATE: May 1, 2017
 CASE: Maurice Higgs (Case #16FE017541)
 PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Bruce Chang, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Maurice Higgs was convicted by a jury of three counts of child sexual assault on a child 10 years or younger, two counts of child sexual assault by force and one count of child sexual assault on a child under 14 years of age.

Beginning February 2012 until February 2014, Maurice Higgs sexually assaulted a female child on multiple occasions when she was 5 to 7 years old. Higgs threatened the victim on at least one occasion that he would physically harm her if she told anyone. He eventually admitted the assaults to law enforcement.

Higgs has two prior 2003 strike convictions for robbery and making criminal threats.

Higgs faces a maximum sentence of more than 135 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for June 9, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 42 before the Honorable Allen Sumner. ★

Regional Transit Launches Survey to Engage Community

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

The Sacramento Regional Transit District (Sac RT) is undergoing a major transformation to enhance service, to improve agency operations and bring greater value to the region. "Sac RT is focused on greater community engagement and that means listening to what residents want and need our public transit system to be," said Henry Li, General Manager and CEO of Sac RT. "The Sacramento region is growing and we have new activity centers for housing, employment, shopping and entertainment as well as changing traffic patterns. Our public transit system needs to adapt to these changes and we are excited to work with community partners to develop a more valuable

transit service."

Over the past year, Sac RT has improved its financial stability, attracted new riders and strengthened its commitment to clean, safe and convenient transit service. Additionally, in February 2017, Sac RT released its new Strategic Vision, a multi-year plan that prioritizes a customer-first agency culture as well as a route optimization study to analyze how to best serve different parts of the region.

RT operates approximately 69 fixed routes and 43 miles of light rail that covers a 418 square-mile service area. Buses and light rail trains operate 365 days a year. RT's entire bus and light rail system is accessible to the disabled community. *Source: Sacramento Regional Transit* ★

Catfisher Uses Sacramento Businesses to Lure Victims

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

Better Business Bureau (BBB) is warning social media users of an Internet criminal who is using four Sacramento businesses as a front in order to scheme innocent people into sending him money.

The alleged businesses include: Brad Computers Co., Bran Computers Co., B & M Computers Co., and J&M Computers Co.

According to their websites, three of the four businesses sell computers and computer accessories. Each lists a different physical address as their location, all in Sacramento. However, BBB has been unable to confirm any of these locations, or the legitimacy of the businesses. All currently have an 'F' rating.

Victims were typically contacted by the alleged business owner on dating and travel websites. He uses different variations of the names Brad, Michael, James, and Brandon. Most victims say they talked to the owner over email, one victim by phone. In some instances he waited months before asking for money, but

others say that he asked for money just a few short days after initiating a conversation.

When he does ask for money, he claims he needs it to help pay for tariffs to receive international goods for his business. Once the money is sent, typically via wire transfer, he stops responding. Victims are both female and male.

Better Business Bureau urges consumers to remember not to send money or personal information to people you do not know, and to report scams at bbb.org/scamtracker.

How to avoid a romance scam:

- Ask them to video chat. Ask the person to chat over a live video connection such as Skype, Facetime, or Google Hangout. If they avoid you, or claim they're too busy, this is a red flag and you're probably dealing with a catfish.
- Do a reverse image search. An Internet criminal never uses their own picture, but what can be more surprising is that they often use a picture of a famous

model or singer. Do a reverse image search on your Internet browser by uploading the picture directly, or by providing a link if the image is online.

- Do a web search for the business. If the person you're talking to claims to own a business, verify the business at bbb.org. Look for any alerts, complaints, or reviews.
- Copy and paste their email into your web browser. Many scam artists do not take the time to write original emails to each of their victims, and often use the same sob story every time. Copy and paste some of the email into your web browser - you may be surprised by what you find.
- Don't be ashamed to report the scammer. If you are the victim of a romance scam, come forward and share your story with others. Report it to your local Better Business Bureau and learn more about romance scams at bbb.org/scamtracker.

Game Plots

In America, Japan Remains Strong

Japan is nothing new to the videogame industry. Though the first video game originated in the United States, and although Atari, a US-company, was the first to found the megagiant industry we know today, it was the Japanese Nintendo Entertainment System that shocked videogames' hearts back to life after Atari's disastrous failure. More Japanese companies like Sega and Sony would soon join the fight, and it wasn't until 2001 when Microsoft's Xbox became the first major American product to retake a significant portion of the market.

And in 2017, Japan's influence remains strong. Though both Sony and Xbox are now so large that they can't be legitimately tied to a single country, Japanese developers continue to make headlines and break top sales charts seemingly every month.

But what makes this island nation, with a population a third that of the US, so consistently prolific and so disproportionately dominant on the world videogame stage?

Though no country's games can be painted with a universal broad brush, most Japanese games popular in the US share an inventiveness and an energy lacking in most Western titles. In

the undeniably *American Gears of War*, one can mow through enemy hordes with chainsaw-equipped machine guns. In the Japanese *Metal Gear Solid 4*, one can use similar machine guns to fight an army of tanks with giant frog legs...while watching a cyborg ninja fight a vampire on the other half of the screen.

Obviously not all Japanese games are so extreme, but most appeal to American audiences for exactly this type of fantastical situation. While the culture of American games demands "grounded" or "realistic" experiences, Japanese titles are far more concerned with the outer limits of style and imagination. For an incredible, cinematic set-piece experience, American consumers can choose between *Uncharted 4* with its guns, trucks, and motorcycles, or *Final Fantasy 15* with its behemoth monsters, teleportation, and magical swords. The consumer interested in pure escapism has an easy choice to make.

In addition to the inventive, imaginative nature of most Japanese games, Japanese popular culture as a whole has steadily grown a strong American following over the past two decades. Anime (Japanese animated television) is now a cultural mainstay among much of our country's youth, pulling consumers away from American

television for a similar reason to games. Anime is wild and creative. American TV keeps a foot firmly planted in the real world.

Of course, this isn't universal. Some Japanese developers have taken to beating Americans at their own game (*Resident Evil VII's* distinctly Louisiana flavor and US-style horror design is the strongest example), but as a whole, few Japanese titles can hope to outsell the next *Call of Duty* or *Battlefield*. Nevertheless, sales of recently-released Japanese games (like *Nier: Automata* and *Persona 5*) have been far stronger than expected, driven both by a passionate audience and positive responses from Western critics. Though Japan may no longer own the market, as it did in the heyday of Sega and Nintendo, its influence and popularity are here to stay.

CDPH Warns Consumers Not to Eat TP Food Processing's Lemongrass Satay and Shrimp Satay Due to Botulism Risk

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) today warned consumers not to eat TP Food Processing's Lemongrass Satay and Shrimp Satay jarred food products. The two items may have been improperly produced, and may be contaminated with botulism. Although no illnesses have been linked to these products at this time, ingestion of botulism may lead to serious illness and death.

TP Food Processing, Inc. of Westminster, California, has voluntarily recalled two varieties of jarred food products: TPF Lemongrass Satay in 9-ounce jars and half-gallon plastic tubs, and TPF Shrimp Satay in 6-ounce and 9-ounce jars. These items were sold under the TPF brand name in six-sided glass jars with reddish/orange screw-on metal lids.

The recalled food products

were sold at grocery stores in Arizona, California, Georgia, Oklahoma, and Oregon. Photographs and lot codes of the recalled items are on the CDPH website.

Consumers who have any of these products, or any foods made with these products, should discard them immediately. Double bag the jars and tightly seal them in plastic bags then place in the trash. Rubber or latex gloves should be worn, if possible, when discarding the products. If that is not possible, wash your hands with soap and running water for at least two minutes after handling any food or containers that may be contaminated.

Botulism is a rare but serious paralytic illness. Initially, symptoms may include double or blurred vision, drooping eyelids, and dry or sore throat. Paralysis starting in the upper

part of both sides of the body and making its way down may follow. Additional symptoms may include slurred speech, difficulty swallowing, and inability of the neck muscles to support the head. Paralysis of the extremities and respiratory muscles may occur. Infants with botulism appear lethargic, feed poorly, are constipated, have a weak cry, and poor muscle tone.

CDPH recommends that anyone experiencing symptoms after consuming these products consult a health care provider immediately. Consumers who observe the product being offered for sale are encouraged to report the activity to the CDPH toll-free complaint line at (800) 495-3232. For more information visit www.cdph.ca.gov. 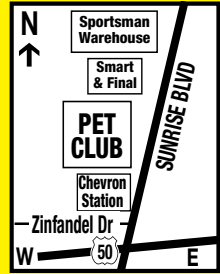
