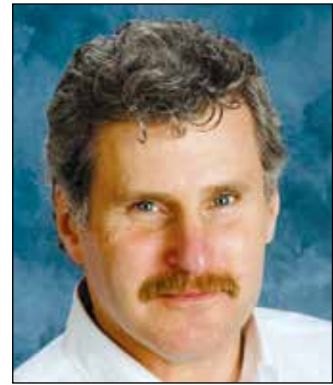

Birds and Breakfast

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Two recent sold-out events continued a tradition at Carmichael's Effie Yeaw Nature Center. The annual Bird and Breakfast fundraiser introduced 180 nature lovers to avian species in their busiest season. 2017 Nest building has begun in earnest in the 100-acre preserve; some early birds are already incubating eggs.

Rain or shine, Audubon-guided nature walks have been a hit for 30 years and are consistent fundraisers. "It's a rare opportunity for people to experience animal lifecycles and study the things they often pass by," explains staffer Betty Cooper. "Audubon people come in advance to research our preserve and the riverside. They discover where the cool stuff is and lead small groups from spot to spot, explaining what they see."

Dozens of species were noted. In American River shallows, herons, egrets and wood ducks sought breakfast. Red-shouldered



hawks were rebuilding a nest in the same tree that hosted their 2016 family. Like many raptors, the parents favor spots that have previously proved successful for hunting and child-raising. Two hummingbird nests - tiny miracles of lichen and cobweb -- were viewed through magnifying scopes. One was under construction while the other already hosted hen and eggs. Bush tits flitted busily, lining pendulous, abodes with feathers and plant down.

The program's outreach included

sponsored children for whom bird-watching is a rare opportunity. Sierra Club volunteer Jackie DeLu accompanied such a group and noted enthusiastic observations from kids who would otherwise be unable to afford the outing. "One little girl spotted a nest almost before she was out of my car," said DeLu. "These kids had great nature eyes. The trip encouraged them to take their time and observe."

French Invasion Coming

MATHER, CA (MPG) - America's oldest ally, France, is sending her world-renown aerial military jet demonstration team to Mather for one day only. The event is sponsored by the California Capital Airshow (CCA) and the City of Rancho Cordova for a single performance on April 15th.

This stop is part of a limited tour by the French Air Force to honor the 100th Anniversary of the United States entering into World War I. It also corresponds to the upcoming centennial celebrations honoring the opening of Mather Field, which would later become Mather Air Force Base.

The performance is the only west coast appearance and one of only eight U.S. cities to host this

extraordinary eight-ship military jet demonstration team, known as "Patrouille de France."

The visit from Patrouille de France marks the first time the CCA will host an off-season airshow demonstration. While the aerial demonstration will take place on the afternoon of Saturday, April 15, the Patrouille de France will arrive in Sacramento on Thursday, April 13, according to CCA Executive Director Darcy Brewer.

"The event certainly has its historical significance, but it will also serve as an opportunity for aviation fans to witness heart-pounding jet engines in flight months before the premier California Capital Airshow on September 9 and 10," said Brewer.

"The California Capital Airshow is proud to honor the men and women

Game Plots

New Zelda is a Breath of Fresh Air

Open worlds are to modern videogames what skinny jeans are for teenagers. They're popular and "in style," even if they don't fit. An open world (a term used to denote a vast, freely explorable space in a game) has the potential to inspire a sense of awe, independence, and freedom beyond the means of any other art form. But in the modern day, open worlds are often shoehorned in as little more than a bullet-points on the back of a box, glorified hubs to contain dozens of hours of menial activities marked brightly and colorfully on your map.

Plenty of otherwise entertaining games are guilty. The vigilante hacker game *Watch_Dogs 2* sports a beautifully detailed version of San Francisco that purports to be a black hat's paradise, but in reality just features little in the way of meaningful interaction. Some, like *Ghost Recon: Wildlands*, don't even bother to populate their open world, presenting the player with miles and miles of empty, repetitive wilderness.

Only a few games in recent years have fully capitalized on their open world and made it feel like an integral part of the experience (*The Witcher 3* and *Metal Gear Solid V* are strong examples), but nothing has better been

able to buck this trend than *The Legend of Zelda: Breath of the Wild*. Its vast explorable world is not a feature; it is the core of the experience. Unlike traditional open world games, *Breath of the Wild* refuses to restrict the player. See a mountain? You can climb it, no invisible walls to artificially hold you down.

But most importantly, *Breath of the Wild* feels undeniably alive. A living world is essential to an open world game; once the experience starts feeling alive rather than pixels on the screen, the player can better invest themselves in its world. While *The Witcher 3's* conventional wisdom dictates that this is best accomplished through rich, personal stories and an emphasis on logical worldbuilding, *Breath of the Wild* uses a different strategy, one hardly used for the past ten years. It uses tangibility.

This was a strategy first pioneered by the masterpiece *Half-Life 2*, which granted players the ability to lift and manipulate objects in the world via a tool called the "gravity gun." Though simple in concept, the gravity gun allows players not just to see the game's world, but to reach through the screen, to touch it and change in a manner consistent with how they'd interact with reality. It weakens the fourth wall.



If *Half-Life 2* weakens the fourth wall, *The Legend of Zelda: Breath of the Wild* breaks it down entirely, pulling the mind of the player off of the couch and into its universe.

Breath of the Wild turns the tangibility factor up to eleven. A realistic physics system and an emphasis on improvisational combat combine to make the space around you essential to success. Objects can be lifted, weaponized, and broken on a whim. The wildlands abound with ingredients to cook food necessary to survive. *Breath of the Wild* not only allows you to interact with its world, it requires it.

If *Half-Life 2* weakens the fourth wall, *Breath of the Wild* breaks it down entirely, pulling the mind of the player off of the couch and into its universe. Once that occurs, it ceases to be a game and begins to be a true, immersive realm, one where the open world vision is realized, and where endless adventure awaits.

Sacramento is a Synergistic Startup Epicenter

It's no secret Sacramento is a terrific environment for startups with university talent, investors, accelerator and startup programs, driving distance to the Bay Area, and an international airport, not to mention great quality of life. What is less known are the many features that distinguish us from other startup-friendly communities.

First, there's our senior population. Americans aged 65 and older are expected to grow from 46 million to more than 98 million by 2060. California is projected to be among the fastest growing states. Californians age 60+ are expected to grow more than twice as fast as the total state population. By 2040, nearly 500,000 people age 60 and over are expected to live in Sacramento County.

A growing field addressing the needs of seniors is gerontechnology, a combination of gerontology and technology. It blends technology and innovation to address the challenges of aging and caregiving. For the savvy entrepreneur, it's potentially the pot of gold at the end of the rainbow.

AARP reported in January 2016, "Companies from established multinationals to startups, mass-market firms to niche players, are recognizing a (senior) caregiving market opportunity that's expected to reach \$72 billion in 2020 alone. The cumulative total for 2016-2020 is expected to be \$279 billion."

A second unique feature is that in the west coast, Sacramento most reflects the overall makeup of the United States. An indication of how a product or service

may perform nationally can be obtained locally. For startups targeting the 60+ crowd, Sacramento seniors offer an invaluable wealth of feedback to entrepreneurs. Innovation and technology may come from the youth, but practicality, insights and reality checks come from seniors.

A third feature of Sacramento is the growing infrastructure of startup support. In addition to the Hacker Lab, Urban Hive, Sacramento Entrepreneurship Academy, SCORE, Sacramento Business Services Center and numerous Meetup groups, startup specialty groups are locating in Sacramento. Aging2.0 (www.aging2.com), based in San Francisco, focuses on helping entrepreneurs who are targeting the senior market.

Kerri Vogtmann, (Sacramento@Aging2.com), founder of the Sacramento Aging2.0 chapter notes, "Given the Sacramento business landscape, we have a real opportunity to be the epicenter of gerontechnology." Ms. Vogtmann is currently organizing the Sacramento Aging 2.0 pitch competition on Tuesday, April 18, 5:30 - 8:00p.m. The public is welcome to attend and vote for the startups they feel best meet the needs of seniors. Registration is at aging2.com/events.

Health 2.0 (www.health2con.com) is another startup specialty group, focusing on healthcare innovation. Keisuke Nakagawa (keisuke@whitecoat.com) is the co-founder of Health 2.0 Sacramento and of whitecoat, a startup focused on developing technologies to advance medical education and health literacy. "Sacramento and its leadership

have done a tremendous job cultivating and promoting startups. It's becoming a powerful startup ecosystem," commented Mr. Nakagawa. "This is especially true in healthcare."

Being the state capital is a fourth unique feature of Sacramento. Governments are often viewed as slow and not innovative. This is not necessarily accurate. Through policy, governments can create opportunities for startups. The critical factor is entrepreneurs' involvement in local and state government. There are numerous ways to be involved. The Sacramento County Adult and Aging Commission (www.sacramentoadultandaging.org) is one of many bodies that welcomes the involvement of private citizens. Among other things, this commission is charged with advising the Board of Supervisors on matters relating to older and dependent adults. Entrepreneurs interested in gerontechnology are welcome on this commission.

"We fail to see that there is a cause and effect in our relationship with government," said Mr. Nakagawa. "Being close to policy makers can be a strategic advantage."

The startup "bones" of Sacramento - talent, investors, support organizations, user population and geography - create a solid foundation for entrepreneurs. What makes us especially appealing for startups are our additional qualities: our vital senior population, our national profile, startup specialty groups and being the state capital. When you put it all together, Sacramento is primed to be a synergistic startup epicenter. ★

Last year, was big year for small business in America. It's a trend that's continuing industry-wide. Business births in 2016 exceeded the exit-rate of companies for the second year in a row.

Here is a list of some of the top performing industries.

- 1. Food and Restaurant-related Businesses**
Food-related businesses saw a significant increase over the past year. Restaurant and food service sales were expected to jump to over \$700 billion, continuing an upward trend since the 1970s. Sacramento Democrats Doing Too Much to Protect Felons; Not Enough for Working Californians

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento Democrats passed two legislative proposals (Senate Bill 6 (Hueso) and Senate Bill 54 (de León) that would make California a sanctuary state for convicted felons who are in the country illegally and provide free legal service for them. Former chairman of California's state parole board, Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama) issued the following statement: "College scholarships for

middle class families are slated to be chopped making way for free legal service for arrested undocumented immigrants. "I cannot say this enough -- this is not about immigration. This is about enabling criminal behavior and activity that endangers our citizens. "Creating a sanctuary state is dangerous for Californians; it compromises our public safety and diminishes justices." In 2011 under President Obama, the U.S. Government Accountability Office reported that 54 percent of all undocumented criminals were arrested in California. More than 100,000

were incarcerated costing California taxpayers billions. "[A]bout 50 percent" of these undocumented offenders "were arrested at least once for either assault, homicide, robbery, a sex offense or kidnapping." Senator Jim Nielsen represents the Fourth Senate District, which includes all or portions of Butte, Colusa, Glenn, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Tehama and Yuba Counties. 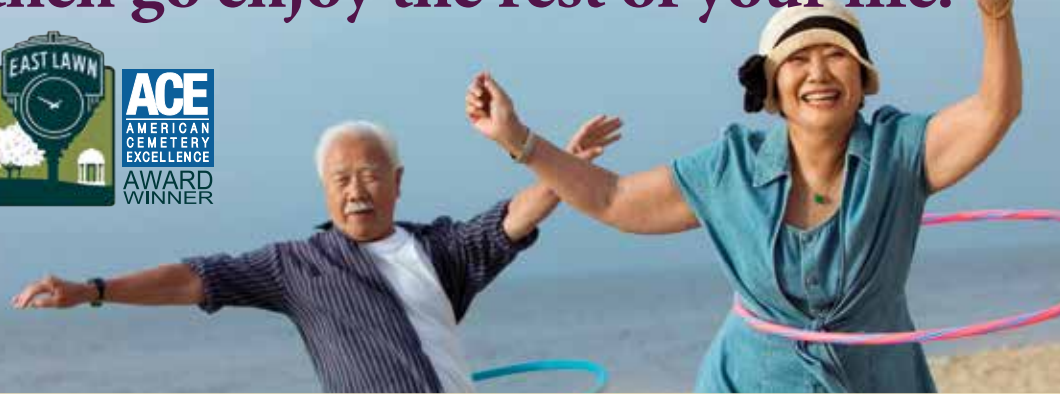

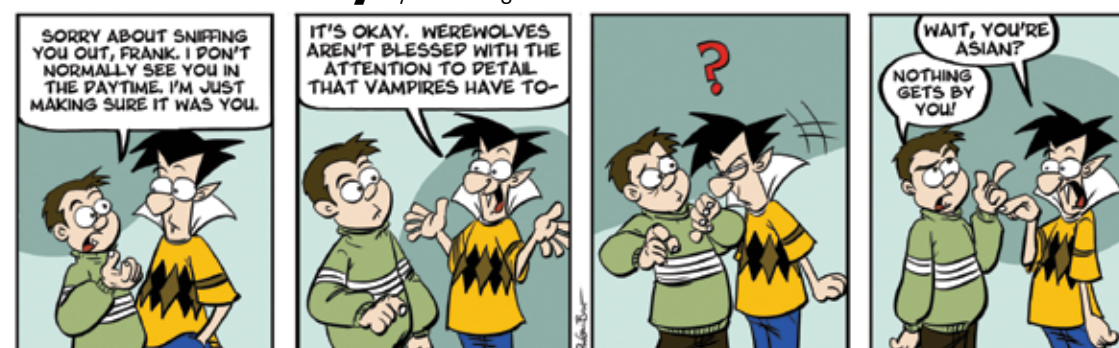

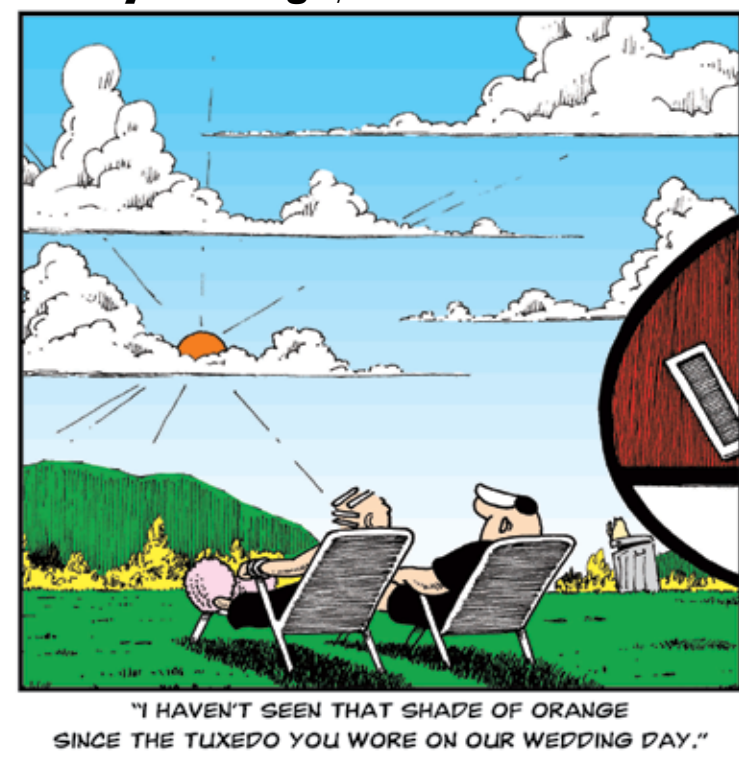

It Takes a Family for a Successful Comeback

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - A little more than six years after closing down, Carmichael-based ACR Solar International is open for business and on fire, experiencing triple-digit revenue increases and finding itself basking once again in the sunlight of self-ownership.

"We started all over in 2012 with negative cash flow," explains company founder Al C. Rich, who, along with the help of family and a few loyal team members, have brought the company back to life after it was shut down abruptly just one year after it was acquired by Folsom-based fuel cell maker, Jadoo Power Systems, Inc.

Rich initially launched the company in 1977 as AC Rich and Sun on the East Coast. It was a time when the mere mention of solar heating could set eye-balls rolling within energy expert circles loyal to interdependence on overseas oil and coal.

"When we were just getting started in Virginia, nothing much was happening with solar," said Rich. "It was a field that many people just weren't quite sure about yet."

But when President Jimmy Carter vowed to reduce the country's dependence on oil by the 1990s, new solar programs and government contracts to run them began to surface. By 1992, already widely recognized for its advances in solar, including its patented, award-winning solar

SKYLITE™ water heater, and procurement of several government consulting contracts, Rich was invited to participate in a new Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) Solar Program created under S. David Freeman. It proved a real game changer.

"Thank God for David Freeman and SMUD," said Rich. "They had a new solar program going and they got us out here in California from Virginia, and that's how we got to Carmichael."

The company reformed as ACR Solar, International in 1997 and established its subsidiary, solarroofs.com. In 2008, ACR Solar was named one of the fastest growing companies in Sacramento by the Sacramento Business Journal and acquired by Jadoo in 2010. Despite widespread success and a robust demand for commercial and residential solar systems, Jadoo shuttered the company the following year due to what Rich describes as "bad stock swaps." Everyone, Rich included, got their pink slips just before Christmas.

"That was a very scary time for all of us," said Rich, adding that he was a bit older and not sure about next steps, given the rapidly changing marketplace.

But he, along with his daughter Ashley, who has worked for AC Solar since 2006, and a few loyal employees refused to give up on the company. In 2012, Rich set out to rebuild using little more

than sweat equity to get there.

"I realized that I was going to have to hire myself if I wanted to continue," said Rich. "But it wasn't easy. We had to actually pay bills for the company that Jadoo never paid. We worked very hard to rebuild and it took a lot of sweat equity and loyalty."

Today, ACR Solar has 11 full-time employees, including daughter Ashley, who serves as vice president, and Rich's son, Clark, who oversees IT and

media. Three employees on the roster share ownership in the company, Rich said.

The first year back in business, ACR did roughly \$250,000 in sales. Last year, sales topped out

1.75 million and ACR found itself at number 14 on the Sacramento Business Journal's list of the region's fastest-growing companies. This year sales are expected to hit \$2 million.

So, what's the secret sauce for keeping the company on track? "Service," said Rich. "It's really simple. We are doing what I've always done, which is provide good value, dedicated customer service and good pricing. That's what works." ★

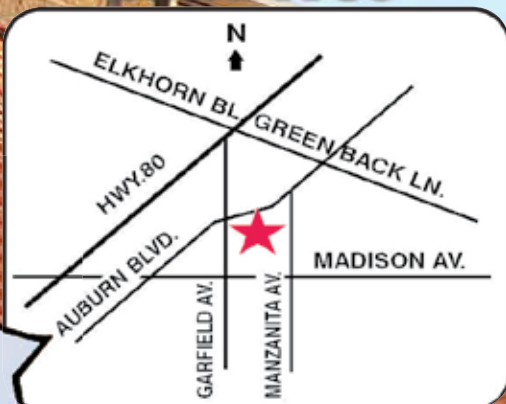

The Exciting New World of Implant Supported Dentures

There are millions of people in the U.S. who are edentulous (meaning without teeth) who struggle daily with dentures. A majority suffer from discomfort as a result of loose or illfitting dentures. 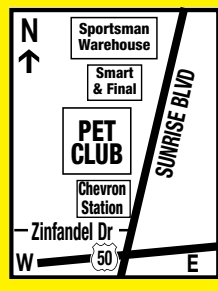
