

Accountability? Yeah, Right.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Jim Nielsen, Republican Caucus Chairman, commented on the Democrats massive new \$52 Billion tax increase that will further make doing business in California difficult for small business owners and steal more money from the wallets of hard-working residents.

"There is no sunset to this massive \$52 billion tax" Nielsen said, "Our highways, roads and bridges are in 'third world' condition. Transportation, however, has not been a priority for Sacramento Democrats. This massive tax will not only impact Californians at the gas pump; it will result in higher costs for food, clothes and other goods.

Myths vs. Facts about the increase:

Myth: All \$52 billion will go to fix our roads.

FACT: Senate Bill 1 sends money to transit, walking and bike paths and state parks, and leaves the door open to divert money to high-speed rail.

Myth: This is a solution where drivers will pay less for a better quality of life.



More Taxes on Cigarettes and **Electronic Vaping Devices** SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

California voters approved Proposition 56, which increased the excise tax rate on cigarettes and expanded the definition of "tobacco products" to include any type of tobacco, nicotine, little cigars, and electronic cigarettes sold in combination with nicotine.

On April 1, 2017, the cigarette tax rate increased from \$0.87 to \$2.87 per pack of 20 cigarettes. In addition, the distribution of nicotine delivery devices - including, but not limited to, electronic cigarettes, e-cigars, e-pipes, vape pens, and e-hookahs - sold in combination with substances containing nicotine are now subject to the current tobacco products tax rate of 27.30 percent of the wholesale cost of the product.

Nicotine delivery devices sold independently and not in combination with any liquid or substance containing nicotine are not subject to excise tax. This includes any battery, battery charger, carrying case, or any other accessory used in the operation of a nicotine delivery device.

Any product approved by the U. S. Food and Drug Administration as a tobacco cessation product or other therapeutic purpose when that product is marketed and sold for such approved use (for instance, nicotine patches) will also not be subject to the excise tax.

Additional information regarding the provisions of Proposition 56 is available online. You may also view the BOE's online Cigarette and Tobacco Products Tax Guide on the BOE website.

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FACT: Huge increases in the gas tax today will grow in the future while failing to recognize a pending "cap-and-trade" expansion could raise gas prices by an estimated 63 cents per gallon in 2021, increasing to 73 cents per gallon in 2031.

Myth: Republicans do not have a plan.

FACT: Republicans have a plan, Assembly Bill 496, that fully funds road repairs and traffic relief without increasing taxes on working and middleclass Californians.

FACT: Electric vehicle owners pay a flat rate of \$100. More typically, California drivers will pay an extra \$125 to \$260 each year in gas taxes. (This is on top of what we currently pay.)

Myth: This is a compromise solution.

FACT: Conducted behind closed doors, this is a deal driven by Sacramento Democrats.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Whether you want a dark pour over from Sumatra, a Guatemalan latte, or a tidy macchiato made with beans from Africa, the baristas at Insight Coffee Roasters in Milagro Center are ready to brew it to your liking.

Insight Coffee Roasters, which officially opened in January, joins the growing list of eateries and cafes quickly filling up the space at Milagro Center, rounding out its café experience with home-made pastries and house granola, and of course, a java menu fit for the most persnickety of coffee coinsures.

"We're growing by the week here," says Alex Murio, shift supervisor, who has just trained his fifth employee, Carmichael resident, Jesse Song. "We now have six employees, including me."

particular on weekends during the before and after dinner rush at nearby restaurants, Insight recently extended its weekend hours and is now open from 7 a.m. until 9 p.m. on Friday and Saturday evenings. With its large, open-air positioning, and a double-sided brew bar that can accommodate roughly 20 customers at a time, Insight is an ideal spot to sit, sip and enjoy the market atmosphere.

"We love being right here in the center of the action where people are always coming and going around us, and we are looking forward to our new neighbors coming in," Murio said. "It's a great spot to enjoy a coffee, meet up with friends and maybe even grab desert."

Insight keeps the menu simple with three single-origin coffees to choose from on its menu at any given time, typically one from Africa, another from the In fact, business is so brisk, in Indo-Pacific region, and one

from the Americas. In addition to a standard house brew at the ready, Insight's brew bar offers a variety of pours, including one from a Brew Chemix, which looks like something you'd have used in chemistry class, as well as brews using the Aeropress and Bonavita methods. Not sure what those are? No problem. On Saturdays and Sundays from noon to 1 p.m. Insight offers free tastings and brew education "classes," with demonstrations on origins, roasting and brewing methods.

Oh, and there is tea: green, white, oolong and red tea, hot or cold, as well as chai, matcha latte, hot chocolate, Kombucha and, of course, cold pressed brew, with or without caffeine. Finally, if you're brewing for 20, Insight offers catering services.

"I think what sets us apart from other coffee chains is our personalized approach to the art of coffee," said Murio. "We

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


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Sports Media Club's Spellacy Admitted to Stanford Summer Program

Myth: Californians will spend less time on congested highways and roads.

FACT: Only about two (2) percent of the funds can be spent on highway and road congestion relief, leaving drivers paying more while still stuck idling in traffic.

Myth: California cannot pay for these costs out of the General Fund.

FACT: General revenues are at an all-time high, but Democrats have increased spending on discretionary government programs other than roads by billions of dollars in recent years. Democrats could have prioritized our roads. "This will affect the working poor and middle class Californians like Miranda Thomas, a single mom on a fixed income with a young child who needs to see a pediatrician often. She wrote to me and said, 'Being poor shouldn't force us off the road."" said Nielsen.

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

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DMV Accepts U.S. Passport Card for New Driver License

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) announces the acceptance of a valid U.S. passport card when applying for a first time driver license (DL) or identification card (ID). The DMV included the U.S. passport card in the list of approved legal presence documents starting on April 3, 2017.

"We added the U.S. passport card to offer more options for our customers," said DMV Director Jean Shiomoto. "The passport card is secure, more convenient, and less expensive than a passport book and it will help new driver license and ID card applicants establish their legal presence."

Millions of people have applied for and received a U.S. passport card from the U.S. Department of State Bureau of Consular Affairs since they became available in 2008. The verification process and security features in the card are similar to a passport book, which the DMV currently accepts. The DMV determined that the passport card is a readily available and secure document that will help in establishing the applicant's legal presence.

First-time driver license applicants must make an appointment before visiting a DMV field office. Walk-ins are only accepted at Driver License Processing Centers.

The DMV has a helpful webpage that features the requirements for driver license and ID card applicants. To apply for an original driver license or ID card, customers

must complete a Driver License or Identification Card Application form (DL 44), give a thumb print, have their picture taken, provide their social security number, and verify their birth date, legal presence, and California residency.

The DMV reminds all new DL and ID card applicants that they must provide proof of California residency. The residency requirement law went into effect July 1, 2016. For more information about the residency requirement visit the DMV website.

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

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Roth Over Pension Dear Dave,

My wife and I are both 25 years old, and we're working on Baby Steps 4, 5 and 6. I have a 401(k) through my employer, and she has a pension. Currently, we're falling short of the 15 percent of income you advise putting toward retirement. Should we get IRAs, or start stocking money away in her pension?

- John

Dear John,

I wouldn't put money into a pension. For one thing, when you die after putting money into a pension, in most cases it dies with you. Number two, when you put money into a pension, you're going to get about a six percent rate of return in the current environment — maybe even as low as five percent. You're not making much on it while you're alive, so I don't advise putting money in pensions. We let employers put money in pensions, if they want to. That's a nice benefit, but I wouldn't add



to it.

I would do a couple of Roth IRAs, and max those out. Then, max out whatever you've got at work that you own. Of course, when you're vested in a pension, you own it. That much is true. But still, I don't advise adding to pensions, buying years up, or any of those kinds of things.

There are a few examples out there where that kind of thing works mathematically to your benefit, but they're very hard to find. Out of all the years I've been in this business, I can count on two hands the number of times I've seen it work out.

So no, I wouldn't do more with a pension where you add to it yourself, especially at such a young age. —Dave

Why the smallest debt first?

Dear Dave, I'm new to you and your plan. Why do you want people to pay off the debt with the smallest balance first, instead of the one with the highest interest rate?

- Courtney

Dear Courtney,

Simply put, because personal finance isn't all about math. Personal finance is only about 20

percent math. The other 80 percent is behavior.

We list debts in the debt snowball in order of the smallest to the largest balance, putting as much as possible toward the smallest while paying the minimum payments on the others. The reason, as I mentioned earlier, is behavior modification. It helps you see yourself making a dent in your debts.

It's easier to change bad habits when you see quick results from your efforts to eliminate negative behaviors. Paying off the smallest debts first, instead of the debts with the highest interest rates, will give you quick wins that will help keep you motivated. It provides proof that you can succeed and become debt-free! —Dave

You go through life being aware of other people. You are conscious of who you like and who you dislike along with the reasons why. Of the people you are closest to, you can probably list some of their strengths, weaknesses, likes, and dislikes. You might even have insight into their motivation for doing certain things.

Start now beginning your introspective self-assessment. This exercise is only for you. It's based on what you think, not what others think of you. You don't need to show or discuss your results with anyone. You do not need to justify or explain yourself.

First, list all of your strengths. Anything counts, no matter how small or insignificant it may be. A strength can be anything that is easy for you to accomplish,

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anything you are good at, or anything that comes naturally. Include everything without making any judgments. Don't reject strengths you don't like.

Next, honestly itemize all of your weaknesses. A weakness is anything you are not good at or struggle with. Again, how you feel about each weakness isn't relevant at this point. It doesn't matter why you feel something is a weakness.

Now you are ready to identify everything you like. Make a complete list. Don't eliminate anything for any reason. Cost, practicality, or image doesn't matter. The only requirement is that you really like each item you include.

The last step is to itemize all those things you don't like. Once again, include everything. All that matters is how you feel about it. Anyone else's opinion is irrelevant.

After you have generated all four lists, it's time to start integrating the different categories. Begin by matching your strengths to what you like. There is no pressure to make perfect links from these two lists.

But ideally your strengths that match your likes give you a good indication as to a fulfilling direction you may want to take. You may also have identified strengths you were not consciously aware of. This is one of the benefits of an honest self-assessment.

Capitalizing on your strengths is a powerful strategy for accelerating your accomplishments. Everyone has more potential within themselves than they realize.

Look through your weaknesses. Identify any weaknesses that are preventing you from doing something you like. Any weakness can be overcome with desire, dedication, effort, and persistence.

Many weaknesses are actually just self-imposed limitations. When you tell your mind there is something you can't do, it believes you, creates a weakness, and impacts your behavior accordingly.

Weaknesses can also be imposed by others. When you believe someone else's assessment about your abilities, a weakness is embedded in your mind that is just as stifling as if you thought of it yourself.

Weaknesses serve as excuses for inaction or avoidance. Goals are labeled as unrealistic when weaknesses are considered roadblocks. Success requires that you refuse to let perceived weaknesses halt your progress.

Knowing who you are provides you with the insight necessary to identify meaningful goals and take action to reach them. When you know who you are, your life has direction and purpose.

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Fake Tax Payment Checks Lead to Conviction of Bogus Home Loan Business Operator

Tax Recovery and Criminal Enforcement (TRaCE) Task Force investigation led to the prosecution and conviction of Carlo Hamrahi, 44, of Santa Clarita. His issuance of fake checks led to the discovery of his fraudulent home loan modification scheme for which he was convicted of two felony counts of grand theft and a white collar crime enhancement resulting in losses exceeding \$100,000 on April

Superior Court in Norwalk. He was sentenced to three years state prison and ordered to pay \$140,000 in restitution to his victims.

The TRaCE investigation began after the Board of Equalization (BOE) received fraudulent checks totaling nearly \$900,000 issued by Hamrahi. After BOE discovered the checks were bogus, the TRaCE Task Force executed a search warrant at

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A 6, 2017, in Los Angeles County Hamrahi's home in March 2015. This turned up evidence that Hamrahi, using the alias Roberto Colleoni, was operating Colleoni Enterprises, a company offering home loan modifications.

TRaCE task force agents found that Hamrahi induced numerous unsuspecting homeowners to enter into home loan modifications, baiting them with promises of reducing their mortgage balances by fifty percent, lowering their interest rate payment terms to forty years in duration all while providing a money back guarantee.

Hamrahi collected fees and upfront money from the trusting homeowners, giving the appearance that the loan modifications had been executed to the extent of forging deeds and opening escrow accounts. Hamrahi even sent them fraudulent "payoff" checks containing stolen identities, which were eventually returned

by two percent, and extending by banks as fraudulent. No homeowners received legitimate home loan modifications under Hamrahi's scheme.

The TRaCE Task Force is made up of investigators and special agents from the California Department of Justice, Board of Equalization, California Attorney General's Office, Franchise Tax Board, Employment Development Department, Department of Motor Vehicles, Federal Bureau of Investigation,

Internal Revenue Service and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security Investigations. The partnership was formed in 2014 to investigate criminal elements of the underground economy engaged in manufacturing, importation, distribution, and the sale of pirated intellectual property, as well as other crimes resulting from the evasion of business and income taxes.

Co-Defendant Sentenced for Home Depot Parking Lot Murder

DATE: March 27, 2017 CASE: Jeffrey Michael Caylor & Kari Ann

Hamilton (Case #14F01906) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney

Donell Slivka, Homicide Unit

The Honorable Michael Kenny sentenced Kari Ann Hamilton to 13 years in prison. Co-defendant Jeffrey Michael Caylor was previously sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole plus an additional 50 years and 8 months.

On December 21, 2016, a jury convicted Caylor of the first-degree murder of Hassan Alawsi. The jury found true the special circumstance that Caylor shot the victim from a motor vehicle intentionally causing death and the allegation that Caylor personally and intentionally discharged a firearm causing death. Caylor was also convicted of attempted murder, assault with a firearm causing great bodily injury, robbery, burglary, vehicle theft and felon in possession of a firearm. Kari Ann Hamilton was convicted of accessory to the murder. Hamilton was also convicted of attempted murder, robbery, burglary while armed with a firearm and vehicle theft.

On March 16, 2014, Hassan Alawsi was sitting in his car at the Home Depot parking lot on Florin Road when Caylor drove up and shot and killed him. Hamilton was in the car with Caylor. A few hours later, Caylor and Hamilton returned to their neighborhood in Carmichael. The two accosted a neighbor, and Caylor pulled out a gun and demanded the victim give them her car keys. When the victim refused, Caylor physically assaulted the victim. The defendants then stole the victim's car. On the morning of March 17, 2014, Caylor and Hamilton drove to their prior business location in the stolen car. As they approached the business, Caylor observed the neighboring business owner. Caylor and Hamilton had a hostile business relationship with that individual. Caylor pointed a gun at the business owner and pulled the trigger three times, but the gun did not fire. That victim got the license plate of the vehicle and called 911.

The defendants were stopped in the stolen vehicle by Chico police, which led to the discovery of the gun used to murder Mr. Alawsi and evidence linking the defendants to the assault of the second victim and car theft.

Former CHP Employee Convicted for Murder of Woman

DATE: April 6, 2017 CASE: Cresencio Camasura (Case #15F01521) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Valerie Brown, Homicide Unit



Cresencio Camasura was convicted by a jury of murder in the second degree of Vida Sarang. The jury also found true the allegation that Camasura personally used a deadly weapon.

On March 10, 2015, Cresencio Camasura killed his wife's cousin, 65-year-old Vida Sarang, by stabbing her more than 15 times with a butcher knife. Ms. Sarang was retired from her career at Sutter Health and had been staying with Camasura and his wife for several months. Camasura worked for the California Highway Patrol in data entry for more than 20 years. On the day of the murder, Camasura was just beginning a three-week vacation from his job. Shortly after 7:00 a.m., Camasura called his wife and told her he killed Ms. Sarang. He then called 911 to report his crime. Upon arrival, officers found Ms. Sarang deceased in the kitchen.

Camasura faces a maximum sentence of 16 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for May 12, 2017, at 10:30 a.m. in front of the Honorable Eugene Balonon.

Defendant Sentenced for Felony Convictions, Stemming from Welfare Fraud DATE: April 7, 2017

CASE: Randnette F. Billings (Case #12F03169) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney John Pezone, Public Assistance Fraud Unit

The Honorable Michael Kenny sentenced Randnette Billings to four years and four months in county jail prison. Billings will serve two years in custody and two years and four months on mandatory supervision by the Sacramento County Probation Department. On March 9, 2017, a jury convicted Billings of felony welfare fraud, felony perjury, felony offering a false document at a legal proceeding, felony grand theft and felony offering a false claim for payment.

Billings was on public assistance from 2006 through 2010. She concealed the fact that she was working as an In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) provider, which led to a loss of approximately \$54,000 dollars to the Department of Human Assistance (DHA). Billings committed perjury when she made the misrepresentation of her income. When DHA told her of the fraud, she requested a hearing in front of an Administrative Law Judge. At the hearing, Billings offered a forged letter from the Sacramento Public Authority, which led to a decision in her favor. Investigation of the letter revealed it was a forgery, which led to a second hearing held by the county and a reversal in the initial decision.

Billings also committed grand theft of more than \$2,000 from IHSS. Billings submitted a false claim for payment for alleged services she provided when her client was confined to a hospital and skilled nursing facility.



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
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
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Stealing the March

Commentary by Dr. Earl Tilford

The ousting of Steve Bannon from the National Security Council (NSC) staff is part of a reorganization initiated by President Donald Trump's National Security Advisor, Army Lt. General H.R. McMaster. This move solidifies leadership within the NSC at a critical time in our nation's history and it clears the deck for action.

My first reaction to the attack on Syria's Shayrat airfield was that President Trump made the foolish mistake of leading by heart rather than mind. Not the case. The attack constituted a carefully, albeit quickly, devised strategic move. The first clue was that the president's entourage traveling to Mar-a-Lago to meet with China President Xi Jinping included Secretary of State Rex Tillerson, Secretary of Defense James Mattis, and National Security Advisor Lt. Gen. H.R. McMaster. The foreign policy A-Team. What does that tell us? In military terms, Trump was "stealing the march," a military term for gaining the strategic advantage before the opponent can react.

General McMaster's 1997 book "Dereliction of Duty" examined President Lyndon Johnson's national security team from 1964 through 1968 when major decisions led to disaster in Vietnam. President Johnson manipulated his national security team to assure compliance and near-obsequious acquiescence among Joint Chiefs of Staff. For Johnson the conflict in Vietnam distracted from his top priority: Instituting his Great Society. President Johnson got the military leadership he wanted, weak, unobtrusive, and accommodating: the B-team. President Trump turned to his A-team for the first,

major foreign policy statement of his presidency. McMaster, who may have masterminded the attack on the Syrian base, studied Johnson's mistakes as the departure point for meeting the challenges President Trump faces. As the president admitted during his April 5 press conference, he "inherited a mess." The messes he inherited in Syria and North Korea rank at the top of Trump's national security problems. While LBJ put his domestic political agenda ahead of national security, Trump does not

After completing his doctorate, McMaster served as operations officer for the Army's **Opposition Force (OPFOR)** based at Ft. Irwin, California in the heart of Death Valley. During the late 1990s, McMaster employed Russian armored tactics and equipment modified to emulate Russian weapons. The OPFOR also excelled at deception. Each tank brigade underwent two weeks of simulated warfare. Almost invariably the visiting brigade was handed its proverbial head on the initial engagement due to the OPFOR stealing the march, doing the unexpected to achieve a decisive advantage. The target was always the mind of the opponent because the brain is where the decisive—the strategic—fight is won or lost

The brilliance of the attack on Shayrat airfield was its strategic impact. The operational target was the Syrian base from which aircraft took off to drop nerve gas on civilians—killing almost 100—many of them women and children. The strategic targets, however, included political leaders in Damascus, Teheran, Moscow, Pyongyang and Chinese President Xi Jinping dining beside President Trump at Mar-a-Lago when 59

t cruise missiles started obliterat-;, ing Shayrat.

The attack means leading from behind is over and America is on the path to recovering world leader status. Assad survives for now but needs to think about retiring. Putin will fume and fuss, but should know milquetoast at the White House, hand wringing in Foggy Bottom, and a Pentagon focused on political correctness rather than combat effectiveness are gone.

Regarding North Korea's latest missile launch, President Xi probably spent last night reevaluating what his dinner host said 48 hours earlier regarding North Korea, "all options are on the table." It's important because, as one of China's leading businessmen, Xi knows that after U.S. bunker buster bombs hit North Korean nuclear sites and precision-guided munitions rain down on missile launch sites, communist artillery probably will pummel Seoul a few miles to the south. Within the hour, American and South Korean airstrikes will obliterate most North Korean artillery, but much of Seoul will be shattered. It's likely Republic of Korea (ROK), and a limited number of US ground forces, will be battling the North Korean People's Army. U.S. and ROK forces will prevail but Seoul and its economy may be devastated. North Korea will be as well with millions of starving refugees streaming north to become China's problem.

World leaders hear this: Adult leadership is back in charge at the White House and intent on reclaiming America's exceptional role in world leadership.

Sanctuary Cities Do Not Have a Mandate to Protect Criminal Illegals

"The last time I looked, aiding and abetting a criminal in the commission of a crime is, itself, a crime and the perpetrator is usually charged, arrested and held. So, why are Mayors DeBlasio of New York City, Eric Garcetti of Los Angeles and their colleagues in so-called sanctuary cities across the nation not behind bars? They should be arrested for being accessories in the crimes committed by illegal immigrants under their protection?" That is the question on Dan Weber's mind.

Weber is president of the Association of Mature American Citizens, the largest conservative watchdog organization for seniors. He says the protection of illegal immigrants who have committed crimes is "indeed a crime and a preposterous stretch, even for leftist ideologues such as DeBlasio and Garcetti. A Harvard-Harris poll conducted just last month showed that 80% of the country oppose sanctuary cities. Obviously, there is bi-partisan support for President Trump's efforts to protect American citizens from illegal immigrants who could do them harm. Why? Because the mayhem these criminals cause has become an almost daily occurrence. Some pretty dastardly crimes have been committed by miscreant illegals that sanctuary cities and sanctuary states protect."

Weber was referring to the arrest of an illegal charged with sexually attacking his girlfriend's two-year-old daughter. He also stabbed a woman outside of a local bar and then stabbed his girlfriend when she confronted him about the sexual abuse of her daughter. criminals. The madness must end lest the United States gains a reputation for being a safe haven for all manner of crimi-

"The man in this case, Tommy Alvarado-Ventura, is from El Salvador and has been deported four times for entering the country illegally. He keeps coming back like a bad penny. The incident occurred just two weeks ago in Nassau County in New York, State which established itself as a sanctuary state. The Police Commissioner of Nassau County, Thomas Krumpter, told reporters that it was 'probably the most heinous criminal act I've ever seen.' But, it is probably even more of a criminal act on the part of some elected officials that they are willing to sacrifice the safety of law abiding residents in order to provide a safe haven for villains like Tommy Alvarado-Ventura."

That vicious attack was no isolated incident, Weber notes. He points to the pending case in Rockville, MD where two illegals from Guatemala who are 17 and 18 years old are set to stand trial charged with raping a 14 year old girl in a high school bathroom. That arrest came as the city of Rockville was about to vote on whether to become a sanctuary city. And, he says, Google the topic and you'll find numerous such crimes that have been committed in every corner of the country.

"It is interesting to note that against this backdrop the Department of Homeland Security says that in a period of one week recently there were more than 200 instances of local authorities refusing requests to detain illegal immigrant end lest the United States gains a reputation for being a safe haven for all manner of criminals. If illegals from south of the border can set up their criminal enterprises in America so readily, what is stopping illegal ISIS terrorists from entering the country to wreak havoc? The poem at the base of the Statue of Liberty reads 'Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free.' The invitation does not include malicious rapists and murderers. Whether you voted for Mr. Trump or not it is shear insanity to oppose him on the issue of whether cities and states should cooperate with Immigration and Customs Enforcement authorities," says Weber.

He adds that illegals also have a significant negative impact on our economy and cites a report issued by the Federation for American Immigration Reform claiming that undocumented aliens cost U.S. taxpayers some \$100 billion a year. Weber points out that senior citizens bear the brunt of that cost. "Every dollar a sanctuary city or state spends on protecting illegals is a dollar that is not available to support services for the elderly."

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
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


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
