grandchildren. Their daughter Louise lives in Sacramento and is a singer in the local group "Sister Swing" that entertains at many of the senior living communities. Their daughter Denise is a special education teacher who lives in Atascadero.

Together, John and Alice are such a sweet and endearing couple, now finding a new home in Carmichael.

Prepare for More Storms

Special Sacramento
County Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County is in the midst of another round of storms that are predicted to cause more localized flooding with creeks, streams and rivers. Forecasts have indicated rain through the end of the week. Due to previously saturated grounds and high winds, we may see downed power lines, topped trees and fences. Please secure furniture, propane tanks, and check trees close to buildings and review thunder safety tips. Residents may also review downed power line tips and information for patients who rely on specialized medical equipment at home at www.sacoecs.org.



If your home has been subject to flooding, be prepared! Get sandbags.

For those living in areas that have experienced flooding, check with your insurance company about damages to your property and study the safety tips for returning home after a flood on the county web site.

Sign-up for Emergency Alerts. This system alerts residents about emergency events and other important public safety information quickly in a variety of situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons and evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods. www.sacramento-alert.org

Flood Preparedness includes: If your home has been subject to flooding, be prepared! Get sandbags.

You should move valuables to higher place in your house, and transport valuable vehicles from the floodplain area. Before evacuating a flood prone structure, be sure to close gas valves. Always pack warm clothes, blankets, water, food, identification, medication, and any critical paperwork. Time permitting, be sure to properly secure your propane tanks so they don't float away.

Breakfast for the Birds

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - There is more to ornithology than binoculars and obliging birds. Add a nature preserve resonant with avian song; throw in expert docents; garnish with breakfast fit for a kingfisher.

You then have the Effie Yeaw Nature Center's popular spring event. "Bird and Breakfast" is served Saturday and Sunday March 18 and 19 at the center's Ancil Hoffman Park facility. Reservations are required; the two-day fundraiser sells out every year. Supporters will likely see 40 or more species and no bird gets left behind; Sacramento Audubon guides get as excited about tiny finches as rock-star great blue herons, snowy egrets and gorgeously-plumed wood ducks.

Equally fascinating are home-building habits during the most industrious time of the avian year. Because eagle-eyed scouts locate nests with expert ease, visitors will likely see wren, hawk, woodpecker and bush tit abodes. Higher and harder to spot, some hummingbirds will have nested by March. Nest-watching is enhanced by on-site viewing scopes.

A 27-year spring tradition, the \$40 Saturday safari is followed by gourmet breakfast. Family-friendly Sunday costs \$10; \$5 for children. A continental breakfast is included. Groups are welcome. Neither excursion is recommended for very young children. Participants should bring comfortable shoes and binoculars. Bird and Breakfast begins at 8 a.m., both days. Be My Chocolate Valentine

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

The age-old question of who invented chocolate spawns so many answers it'll make your head spin. Or is that just the sugar rush?

Whether the response is the Aztecs and Mayans because these ancient civilizations cultivated the cacao tree, or the Spanish for perfecting the chocolate drink xocolatl, or Britain and Germany with the first chocolate factories, or the Swiss who made chocolate a staple for the entire world, there's no debating that Cupid is the cocoa bean's chief ambassador. Nearly half of all Valentine's Day gifts is candy, according to

retail industry figures.

Chocolate makers from Sacramento to Florida are looking to take their bite of the \$1.7 billion Americans are projected to spend this season on the sweet stuff.

Although the love holiday falls on a Tuesday this year, Ginger Elizabeth Chocolates in Midtown (1801 L St.) is expecting a three-digit jump in business from an ordinary weekday. Romantic procrastinators will appreciate the boutique's extended hours on Feb. 13 and 14, though that doesn't guarantee your honey's favorite chocolate bonbons and macarons will still be behind the glass.

For master chocolatier Norman Love, whose candies make frequent 3,000-mile treks west to California as one of the confectioner's top markets, roughly 15 percent of online sales are generated in the three weeks leading up to Valentine's Day. "It's our second-biggest retail

period [after Christmas]," Love said.

The Florida-based chocolatier is debuting a "Perfect Pairs" collection for this Valentine's Day. Two gourmet flavors are combined inside each individual piece to create pairings ranging from the familiar - strawberry and banana, and coconut and pineapple, for example - to one with an "opposites attract" bent that marries sweet raspberry with tart lemon.

"Each pair represents its own challenges, as it's not as simple as a 50/50 split between each flavor," Love said, explaining that, like a real marriage, there's give and take when seeking "equality and harmony." 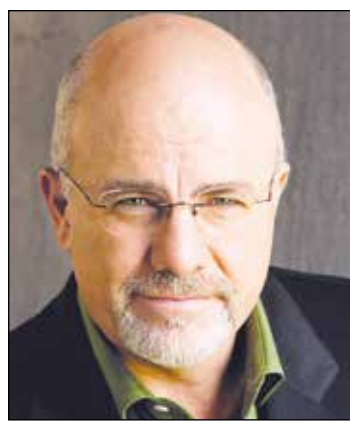

Dave Says

A Good Marketing Idea

Dear Dave,
 I'm a small-business owner with a lawn care franchise. It's common in our industry, after the season is over, to send out pre-pay letters for the upcoming season. If we send out these letters offering a five or 10 percent discount for early payment on next year's services, is that too similar to borrowing money from our customers at five to 10 percent?
 - Kevin

Dear Kevin,
 Not at all. I definitely would send pre-pay letters. It takes some of the seasonality "ouch" out of your financial equation, and it gives them the opportunity to take advantage of a bargain. It's not a bad plan from a marketing standpoint for your business, either. You might even

be able to add some new customers with an offer like this. You obviously have to be really secure and confident in your ability to provide the service. Otherwise, you could end up in a really bad situation. Your equipment, staffing and track record in the business will all come into play. But if all this is strong, and you've been in the business for a number of years and plan on staying in the business for years to come, then this is something I'd definitely do.

Girlfriend Debt Account

Dear Dave,
 I'm 29, and I have no debt. I've gotten a good start on my savings and retirement, too. My girlfriend and I plan to get married in the next couple of years, and she has about \$90,000 in debt. I'm not paying on her debt yet, but I think together we can save up enough to pay it off by the time we're married. Should I temporarily slow down saving for a house and start saving toward paying off her debt?
 - James

Dear James,
 Yes, I would have a "girlfriend debt" account. That way when she becomes your wife, you two can write a check the moment you get back from the honeymoon and be debt-free — or at least knock out a huge portion of the debt. After that, the two of you — as in WE — resume saving for retirement, a house and so on.
 That, James, is exactly what I would do. You're right in line with my thinking on this, brother. Best of luck to you both!

"Non-Violent Second-Striker" Early Prison Releases: January 2017 Update

DATE: February 1, 2017

In January 2015, the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) began a new parole determination process, evaluating "non-violent second-strikers" for early parole. If early release is granted, they are released after serving only 50% of their sentences. Under existing law, they would otherwise have to serve 80% of their sentences before being eligible for parole.

Upon receipt of inmate names from CDCR with a recommendation for release, the Board of Parole Hearings [BPH] conducts an administrative review to determine if the inmate should be released early from prison as a 'non-violent second-striker.' BPH forwards the names of these eligible inmates to District Attorneys' offices and invites input in making their determination about the inmate's potential early release. Unlike parole hearings, where the prosecution, defense attorney and victim may appear, there is no public hearing for these administrative reviews. Rather, the decision is made purely by CDCR administrative staff. Additionally, prior to consideration for early release, no evidence-based "risk assessment" is conducted to determine if the inmate poses a danger to the public.

The Sacramento County District Attorney's Office takes an active role in evaluating these cases and writes letters to the Board with an overview of the inmate's criminal history and current commitment offense, an opinion regarding the public safety risk posed by the inmate, and the appropriateness of an offender's early release. The Board determines whether an offender would pose an unreasonable risk to public safety based on their prior criminal history, facts behind their current commitment offense, behavior in prison, rehabilitation efforts, whether the inmate has any medical condition which might affect his ability to re-offend, and written statements.

In November 2015, the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office began posting on its website information about "non-violent second-strike" offenders who have been granted early release from prison.

As of January 31, 2017, 196 inmates sentenced from Sacramento County have been

granted early prison releases. Given the number of violent offenders who continue to be granted early release, DA Anne Marie Schubert began monthly updates to provide the public with a sampling of the noteworthy criminals who appear to pose a risk to public safety, but are being granted early release into our community as 'non-violent second-strikers.'

In the month of December 2016 and January 2017, inmates granted early prison release include:

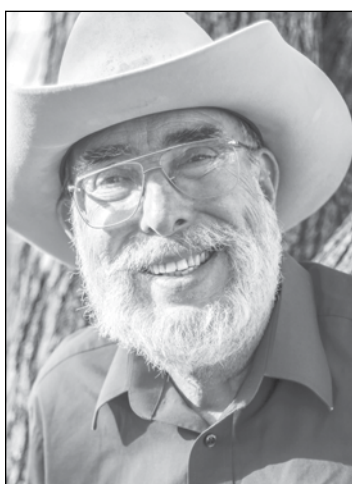
Eric Jeffrey Nelson (Case #14F03928) – Nelson's first strike conviction was in 2008. In 2011, Nelson was convicted of his second strike in Nevada. Nelson was convicted again for assault with a deadly weapon, this time causing great bodily injury, and a gang enhancement. He received a 24 to 60 month prison sentence. After being released from prison, Nelson returned to California and was still on probation for his 2008 conviction. All of Nelson's crimes since 2008 have been committed while on probation or parole. In June 2014, Nelson committed his current offense of hit and run causing death. Nelson received a sentence of 6 years in prison for this offense.

Marcus Brogdon (Case #15F05542) – Brogdon has a 2009 strike conviction for robbery. In September 2015, Brogdon was riding a motorcycle when an officer noticed his motorcycle had expired registration. When he was apprehended, he was found to be in possession of a 9 mm handgun that was loaded with 10 rounds of ammunition, which Brogdon was not permitted to possess because of previous convictions. He received a sentence of 2 years and 8 months in state prison.

Aaron Wellington Hudson (Case #15F06287) – Hudson has a prior 2007 strike conviction for assault with a firearm. Less than one year after this strike conviction, Hudson was convicted of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and possession of a controlled substance with a firearm. He received a sentence of 7 years and 8 months in state prison. In October 2015, Hudson was again found to be in possession of a loaded .45 caliber firearm and loaded .45 caliber magazine. Hudson was sentenced to 32 months in state prison. ★

Taxes Not the Answer to Road Repairs

California's roads are crumbling. Reports routinely show our state has some of the poorest pavement conditions in the country, with high-tax liberal strongholds of San Francisco and Oakland leading the way. The culprit? Misplaced spending priorities.

If you spilled your latte when hitting that huge pothole on the way to work, thank your elected leaders. Gov. Jerry Brown says he has a fix for it — a 42 percent gas tax hike, plus a new \$65 vehicle registration fee that includes hybrids and electric vehicles. He claims the increases are needed because repairing California's highways can't be funded with existing revenues.

Why not? Budgets are about priorities and the governor and legislative leaders have a say on how tax dollars are spent. State revenues have grown by roughly 50 percent in just under 10 years. And, apparently, Brown thinks the state can afford a \$68 billion — and growing — high-speed rail project that still hasn't found a way to deal with the Tehachapi Mountains.

In addition to about \$7 billion in annual fuel tax revenues, the state

also collects a carbon tax from oil companies that brings in about \$2 billion. Oil suppliers pass the tax on to us at the pump. The Legislative Analyst's Office estimates this adds, at minimum, 11 cents per gallon to the cost of gasoline.

Where is all the money going? Huge amounts go to projects that don't improve roads. Much of the carbon tax revenue will end up funding high-speed rail. The Democratic-controlled Legislature rejects every bill to direct these dollars toward reducing emission-generating traffic gridlock.

If Brown's plan to raise the gas tax passes — which seems likely given the new Democratic supermajority — Californians could end up paying as much as 80 cents in combined federal and state taxes for each gallon of gasoline — a rate far higher than any other state. Not to mention we already have some of the highest gas prices in the nation.

It isn't the elite who are squeezed by these costs. It is the less fortunate who struggle to find affordable housing and often must travel further to their workplaces.

Sadly, this is all by design. Many Democrats envision a society where everyone is reliant on public transit. This "green" vision is attractive to Millennial

voters, who tend to be issue-driven idealists. They believe we should all pay a little more to save the planet.

That's troubling, given the findings in a new report that shows Millennials are poorer and less employed than their Baby Boomer parents.

There are alternatives to raising taxes. The public should call upon the governor and Legislature to first consider the following ideas:

- Audit the California Department of Transportation for savings. Experts agree Caltrans has wasted billions of taxpayer dollars in recent years, not counting the new Bay Bridge.
- Use cap-and-trade and existing revenue streams to target traffic gridlock and tackle deferred road maintenance.
- Enact legislation to ensure transportation dollars are spent on actual transportation projects, and require the California Transportation Commission to prioritize projects that provide the greatest economic benefits.

As both California and the Bay Area so aptly demonstrate, high taxes do not guarantee good roads. If our leaders have failed to properly prioritize and manage our existing tax dollars, is it really wise to give them more?

Fake News, Executive Orders, and Immigration

The controversy over so-called "fake news" does not seem to be going away. However, the press's frustration about it is increasingly misplaced. After the presidential election the media fixated for months on a handful of fictitious headlines from suspect websites that were shared around Facebook which allegedly affected the election. But they missed the bigger story about their own problematic reporting.

Take, as an example, the current fervor over President Donald Trump's executive order temporarily halting immigration from seven Middle Eastern countries and reducing the number of total refugees to the United States. In one of its first articles about the executive order, CNN's headline screamed: "134,000,000 People Banned from U.S." Other press reports have suggested Trump's order is illegal, unconstitutional, or un-American.

That's a curious set of claims for an order that functionally resets the country's refugee policy to what it was 18 months ago, under President Barack Obama. Was Obama's refugee policy un-American and anti-Muslim?

What's really going on here? Bad reporting and myths.

The first myth is that Trump has banned Muslim immigration. Tell that to Muslims in Indonesia, Pakistan, and India, the three countries with the highest Muslim population, none of whom are affected by Trump's order. Moreover, Trump has not actually banned immigration from any country. Rather, he's put a 120-day halt on refugees entering the United States, a 90-day ban on immigration from seven specific countries, and an indefinite halt in refugees from Syria. If Trump wanted to ban Muslim immigration, there are an additional 46 Muslim-majority countries in the world that his order should apply to.

The second myth is that Trump's order is unprecedented, or even illegal. That would be news to Congress, which in 2015 passed a new immigration law limiting immigration from four of the countries on Trump's list, and to former President Obama, who halted all refugee immigration for six months from Iraq in 2011 for the same reason Trump is acting now: to install better security measures against terrorists posing as refugees to enter the country. For that matter, why did Trump pick seven specific countries to halt immigration from? Because he copied Obama, who in 2016 added Libya, Yemen, and Somalia to a list already including Iraq, Syria, Iran, and Sudan, as places where refugees should receive additional scrutiny. Why? Because they are heavily affected by Islamic jihadist terrorist groups who have been known to pose as refugees to attempt to enter the United States and Europe.

The third myth is that Trump's immigration order and goal of reducing refugee immigration is unprecedented. Tell that to President Obama, who made it almost impossible for Syrian refugees, Muslim or Christian, to immigrate to the United States until last year. That is to say, the Syrian civil war raged and Obama's administration took in just 201 refugees from 2011-2014. The United States only began accepting significantly more refugees in 2015 and then dramatically expanded the number of Syrian refugees in 2016. Trump's policy simply resets refugee levels to their 2015 standards.

The fourth myth is that it is illegal to use religion as a category in determining who should be granted refugee status. To the contrary, religious persecution is, under long-standing American and international law, one of the principle reasons to grant refugee status. That makes the outrage over Trump's order more puzzling, given that under Obama,

less than 1 percent of the Syrian refugees America took in were Christian, despite the fact that Christians made up 10 percent of the population of Syria and were specifically singled out for genocide. In a period of roughly five years of Obama's presidency, between a half-million and million Syrian Christians fled religious persecution, and the United States accepted almost none of them. In 2016, when the United States accepted more Syrian refugees than in the five previous years combined, just 152 (0.8 percent) of the 17,671 refugees were Christian.

None of this means that Trump's executive order was well planned or implemented. It appears to have been created haphazardly without sufficient input from or guidance to the agencies that are actually tasked with carrying it out. And while there is legitimate reason to scrutinize refugee applications more carefully, there is no justification for treating green-card holders the same way. Green-card holders are permanent U.S. residents who have already gone through extensive security screenings that can easily last a year or more. Moreover, while America has a legitimate interest in securing its borders, common courtesy suggests we should not grant refugees legal status to enter and then reject them at the border after a trans-Atlantic flight. This policy could have been announced with a 24-hour notice.

But the bigger story here is not President Trump's policy, which, after all, differs from his immediate predecessor only mildly. The real story is how badly our professional story tellers in the media have botched the truth.

Dumping TPP Placed Kink in Globalist NWO Plans

Many still do not understand the significance of Trump's Trans Pacific Partnership (TPP) pullout. It was the most serious blow to the globalists in 100 years. In the political literature of the last 100 years internationalism, world government, new world order (NWO), world order and globalism are synonymous. They suggest a progressive transfer of national sovereignty to a higher level of government such as the United Nations. The idea of the 1950's and 1960's was to increasingly enlarge the UN until it was the recognized world government with total power. When possible this process continues.

Since countries have been slow to forfeit their national sovereignty to the UN, proponents next encouraged regional governments—uniting countries into geographical units, as for example the European Union, then later, when peoples and nations get used to this power transfer, unite them then into a single political unit. Since countries will never initially unite into a single political unit, the plan was to begin with economical unity then progress to the political unity desired, precisely as was successful in the E U. The unification of Europe into a regional government progressed through the following five stages: European Coal and Steel Community, Common Market, European Economic Community, European Community, and finally European Union when political unity was possible.

The USSR, after the fall of communism in 1989, transformed itself into the Commonwealth of Independent States Free Trade Area (CISFTA)—a regional government of nations still under the control of Russia. The world has since been divided into other regional governments each following the European Union model and free trade agreements (economic persuasion) have been the favorite tool. Currently there are 23 such regional agreements each

at a different stage in the unification of the countries in their regions and most still saddled by the necessity of using the somewhat deceptive "free trade" terminology. In time the plan is to reduce 206 countries to less than 20 regional governments turning these countries into mere states of regional countries—a much more manageable world, globalists believe.

Some of these perspective regional governments have progressed beyond the need to keep the "free trade" terminology when they describe themselves as for example, the African Economic Community and the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA), both uniting large sections of Africa. The Council of Arab Economic Unity (CAEU) uniting northern Islamic Africa and the Middle East is another. South America is to be united by the Southern Cone Common Market, frequently referred to as Mercosur. It has progressed to the point that it now has a Joint Parliamentary Committee, which is a final step toward political unification. But most still need these words. Central Europe is to be united by the Central European Free Trade Agreement (CEFTA). The South Asian Free Trade Area (SAFTA) exists to unite countries from Afghanistan to Sri Lanka.

In the United States The North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) was to gradually unite Canada, the United States and Mexico into one regional government as had the European Union united Europe. A real border was never to be implemented because in time we were to be the North American Union complete with open borders of the people within and with an amero dollar to match the euro dollar. To globalists national sovereignty is the enemy. The Declaration of Independence, Constitution, and Bill of Rights, that depend on and protect national sovereignty, cannot be allowed to obstruct the move to a world government.

The main reason that the U.S. was not to have an effective

southern border prior to the political unification of the three countries was because Mexico was so far behind the other two countries in economic development and it needed time to elevate itself. Mexicans flooding the U.S. for better paying jobs and many sending a portion of their money back to families in Mexico or opting to retire in their homeland with pensions acquired in the U. S., helped in Mexico's economic elevation.

Some trade agreements also intentionally interlaced with other trade agreements. The three countries in NAFTA also are signatories of the 5,600 paged Trans Pacific Partnership (TPP), just ended by President Trump. Had it been implemented it would have governed 40 percent of U.S. imports and exports and 26 percent of the world's trade. It would have been the law of the land for the United States and 11 other countries in the Asia-Pacific region regardless of what the U.S. Constitution might say.

Its sister trade deal the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP), called for by President Barack Obama in his February 12, 2013 State of the Union Address, would have economically merged the European Union and the United States much more closely with respect to market access, specific regulation and broader rules. Secret negotiations on the TTIP are expected to continue through 2020 and remain classified so the extent of this merger is unknown.

Trump's opposition to illegal immigration and his pulling out of the TPP negotiations are the most serious blows to the globalists in 100 years and will never be tolerated by them. They will continue to spew hate for him. His announced objective to renegotiate NAFTA as well and his probable pull out of TTIP too, may make him the most influential president rescuing us from world government.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Following violent protests that shut down a scheduled speech at UC Berkeley, Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Roseville) has filed a resolution urging California's public universities to adopt the University of Chicago Statement on Free Expression. The Chicago Statement reaffirms a fundamental commitment to the free expression of ideas on college campuses, as well as the principle that "debate and deliberation may not be suppressed because

the ideas put forth are thought by some or even by most members of the University community to be offensive, unwise, immoral, or wrong-headed."

Sixteen universities or faculty bodies have adopted the Chicago Statement, including Princeton, the University of Wisconsin, and the University of Chicago. In recent years, Janet Napolitano, Barack Obama, and the Foundation for Individual Rights in Education have called for strengthening protections of free speech on college campuses.

"Though Californians may disagree about their politics, where we come together is in our commitment to deliberation, debate, and the free expression of ideas," Kiley said. "That principle lies at the foundation of a free society, and should be sacrosanct at our universities, whose mission is to foster critical analysis and respect for both diversity and diverse views."

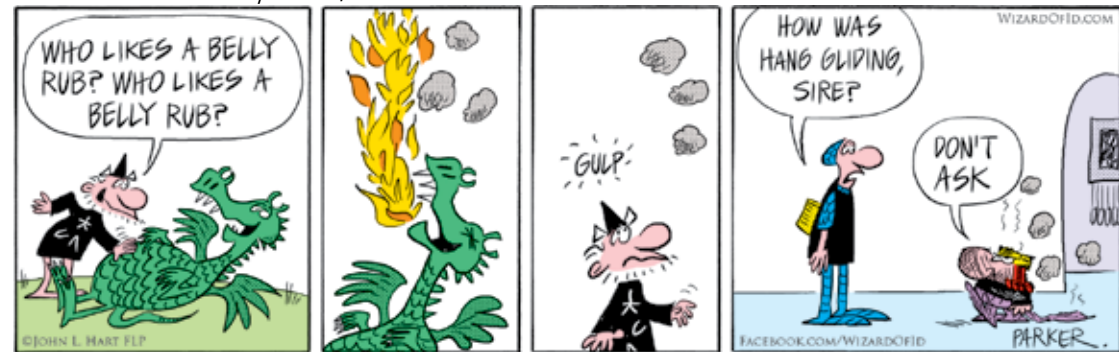

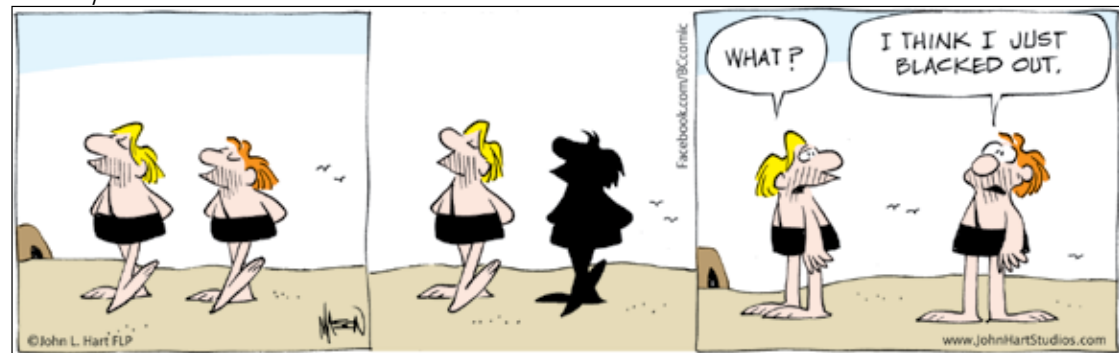

New Sacramento County Ordinance Expanding Urban Farming

Are you looking to bring fresh food into your neighborhood? The new urban agriculture ordinance has now been passed. Urban agriculture is defined as the raising of crops and animals in the urban environment, including growing crops, raising animals (such as egg-laying chickens), bee keeping, and selling the goods grown or produced.

Outline of Sacramento Urban Agriculture Ordinance:

1. It permits gardens, or small farms on vacant parcels in urban and suburban neighborhoods to grow produce to sell.
2. Temporary use permits are available for stands under 120 sq. feet, and stands over 120 sq. feet in area require a conditional use permits to sell produce, eggs, honey, and cottage goods on site.
3. It allows for the raising of limited number of egg laying chickens and ducks for parcels on less than 10,000 sq. feet in all permitted zones.
4. A limited number of beehives are allowed to be permitted for residential and commercial use.

With this ordinance it will bring greater availability and access to fresh produce in what are current urban food deserts.

Food Sale Regulations

Along with freshly grown produce, stands may also sell cottage foods.

Who are you selling to?

The California Homemade Food Act has been in effect since 2013. This new Sacramento County Ordinance allows residents to sell fresh produce, eggs, and approved cottage foods at permitted stands to the public.

Cottage foods unable to be sold include:

products containing meat or food that require refrigeration (Cheesecake, cream pies, or desserts with custard fillings) you must contact the local Environmental Management Department of Environmental Health. The Health Department will instruct you on what requirements you must comply with.

Water District Begins Restoration Activities
CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - As part of the American River Pipeline Project, Carmichael Water District (District) will begin environmental restoration activities in the American River Parkway to reduce the presence of abandoned facilities. This work includes the removal of concrete debris from the south side of the American River and removal of an existing 33-inch steel water pipeline crossing the river. The work will be completed in stages, including the removal of the pipe, beginning September 13, 2016 starting in the early morning and continuing through approximately 2:00 PM. As a safety precaution the river flow during this period may be reduced from approximately 1,500 cubic feet per second (cfs) to 1,000 cfs. Temporary restrictions on watercraft launching from American River parkway will be in place on Tuesday, September 13, 2016 beginning at dawn and continuing until approximately 1:00 PM. The restrictions will include watercraft launching at Rossmore Bar and all upstream access points. 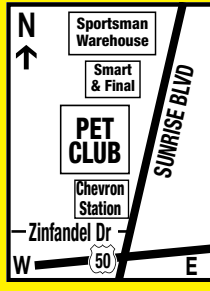
