CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - With 2017 into its first weeks, the \$6.5 million second phase of Fair Oaks Boulevard improvement is inching toward completion. While traffic delays meant a winter of discontent for many motorists, there is a light at the end of the boulevard. The two-year project is on schedule for a spring completion.

Already, the Carmichael route once named Sacramento's ugliest street is looking prettier. Between Landis and Engle, overhead utilities have now vanished underground. Fronting Carmichael Park and between Engle elsewhere, new concrete sidewalks are already in use. A much-needed traffic light at the Landis intersection has been

installed and will be switched on by April. The next steps will include road repairs and surface overlays; landscaped center medians and a major planting project for the mural frontage at Grant.

"Yes, there have been delays," conceded project engineer Steve White. "Early rains and the challenges of underground utilities held things up but they're nearly behind us. We can now look for smoother traffic for motorists, bikes and pedestrians. People have been patient. They'll be pleased the results.

Begun in October 2015, Phase 2 upgrades include:

- Bike lanes, landscaped medians and sidewalks from Landis to Shirley.
- Signal modification at Grant and Engle.
- New traffic signals at Fair Oaks and Landis.
- New sidewalks on the south side of Grant, serving Carmichael Park.
- Burial of overhead utilities.
- New road surfaces.

Phase 2 continues a massive corridor project formulated through County and community collaboration. A vibrant Carmichael town center, considers Supervisor Susan Peters, will encourage economic development for the area.

Property Business Improvement District Gets Underway

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Spearheaded by the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce, after a special vote, a new Property Business Improvement District (PBID) has been formed to give a fresh face to local businesses in the Carmichael corridor.

According Carmichael Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Linda Melody, the new PBID will be a win-win for citizens and businesses, as well as the city. The PBID is a non-profit, with a 501C6 designation as a "mutual benefit" non-profit, now known as the "Carmichael Improvement District, Inc."

"It will serve to help bring

improvements to Carmichael and draw the business community together. Carmichael is the 16th PBID in Sacramento County, where an assessment is voted on by business property owners, who also help to decide what the funds will be used for. Best of all, those monies stay in Carmichael," said Melody.

The PBID will be responsible for improvements and services within the designated area, which include a variety of enhancements such as streetscape, image improvements, advocacy, better safety, cleanliness, economic and administration upgrades. All this will be funded and directed by property owners.

According to the Carmichael District website, the Management District plan

is available online. "Detail on the concerns and solutions offered by this entity may be found on this site (<https://sites.google.com/site/carmpbid/>) along with board leadership detail and a bit of history on this significant effort for our future. District operations will create clear and demonstrated improvements for ownership, bettering the experience of all who live, work and enjoy Carmichael now and in the years ahead."

The Carmichael Chamber of Commerce has been around for nearly 70 years. As issues and times have changed, the PBID is one tool the Chamber can use to find workable solutions for businesses in the corridor.

"Property owners are concerned about

safety and security, about the homeless issue, about economic development in Carmichael and other things as well. The funds provided by the assessment will be used to help remedy some of these issue," said Melody. "Beyond the challenges of today, we really want to see owners working together with other owners to create a fresh vision for what Carmichael can be in the future."

Melody has been on board from the very beginning and intends to stay committed to the process. "The Chamber would like to see a more beautiful, vibrant Carmichael where the crime rate is cut down, properties are beautified and empty storefronts are filled again. We

Womens Empowerment Receives \$25,000 from Savemart Cares

Grant Will Help Sacramento Women Break the Cycle of Homelessness

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Save Mart CARES has donated \$25,000 to help homeless women in Sacramento find homes and jobs to support their families through Women's Empowerment's comprehensive job readiness program. The mission of Women's Empowerment aligns closely with the mission of Save Mart CARES, which supports programs that have a record of results and contribute to the advancement of community, arts, recreation, education or sports.

"A significant measure of a community's health is how many of its residents are employed," said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women's Empowerment. "Women who experience homelessness face profound barriers in their search for employment, so we empower them with tools to overcome those hurdles and secure jobs that will support their families. We are grateful to Save Mart CARES for recognizing that when women rise from homelessness, the entire community rises with them."

In Women's Empowerment's initial eight-week program, women who are homeless receive free onsite child care in the group's child development center and transportation assistance. Each woman works with a master's level social worker to address her root causes of homelessness. She attends classes on job readiness, confidence building, health and empowerment, as well as support groups for domestic violence and substance abuse. Women then focus on job placement with their employment specialist and volunteer career mentor. Women who have graduated from the eight-week program can enroll in the group's graduate services at any point in their lives when they need assistance. Services include paid job training, vocational certifications, counseling with a social

worker and employment specialist, access to a professional clothing closet, financial coaching and job retention services for employer and employee.

Women's Empowerment was featured on NBC's The TODAY Show in 2015 for offering the most comprehensive job-readiness program in the Sacramento area designed specifically for women who are homeless and their children. The award-winning organization has graduated 1,386 homeless women and their 3,750 children. Last year, 92 percent of graduates found homes and 81 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures.

Women's Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and receives no government funding except for in-kind rent from the County of Sacramento. To make a donation: www.womens-empowerment.org.

Save Mart CARES is a 501c3 charitable organization focused on supporting community, arts, recreation, education and sports. Finished in 2013, Phase 1 of the project improved safety and traffic flow at the Marconi/Fair Oaks intersection. Beautification included giant palm trees, landscaped medians and stone obelisk monuments.

Near Grant and Engle, two more monuments will continue the statuary. These should be up by summer. Oak

saplings will dot new center medians. Carmichael Park frontage landscaping will echo American River Parkway vegetation as depicted on muralist Hugh Gorman's Great Wall of Carmichael. Beyond beautification, "undergrounding" of power and telephone lines has removed pedestrian obstacles.

Teichert Construction will execute most aspects of Phase

2. Phase 3, scheduled to complete improvements between Marconi and Landis, will begin in 2018. The project is funded by the Federal Regional Surface Transportation Program, the State Transportation Improvement Program and development fees. For more information, visit www.sacdot.com ★

Melody said the start of the project is only months away, beginning with establishing the new non-profit, drafting bylaws and filling board positions. Financing funds will become available in the spring and she looks forward to seeing the results.

Dedication of Garden on Eden Marks Transformation from "Beast" to "Beauty"

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

Sacramento Suburban Water District and EcoLandscape California on December 14, 2016 marked the grand opening of the region's newest water-wise demonstration garden—the "Garden on Eden."

Named for its location at 4900 Eden Court in Carmichael, the Garden on Eden transforms an ugly groundwater well site (a Beast) into a water-wise garden (a Beauty) for the community to enjoy. Previously, the landscape featured a spotty, high-water use lawn.

"The drought brought new focus and attention to the benefits and beauty of sustainable, low-water use landscaping," said SSWD Water Conservation Manager Greg Bundesen during the event. "We've seen fresh interest in creating landscapes that not only use less water but have many other benefits—from preventing stormwater pollution to nurturing wildlife. This garden is designed to continue that momentum well beyond the drought."

The garden transformation was part of a workshop series on sustainable landscaping techniques sponsored by Sacramento

Suburban Water District and taught by EcoLandscape California instructors. Classroom sessions covered the basics of healthy soil, the differences between compost and mulch, water-wise irrigation, plant placement, integrated pest management, landscape design, among other topics.

Then District customers dug in during two hands-on workshops to help remove the lawn by sheet mulching, install drip irrigation and properly place plants. "Adding a hands-on component to our classroom training made it a much richer learning experience for the participants, and helped get them excited to work on their own landscape," said EcoLandscape California Executive Director Marian Bender.

The garden features low-water use plants such as Manzanita, Chaparral Currant and Blonde Ambition Blue Grama Grass, efficient irrigation and unique methods for keeping rainwater on site. As a demonstration garden, the site also includes informational signage that identifies plants, irrigation and rainwater harvesting techniques so that visitors can learn how to create their own water-wise oasis.

"We had several important goals for this project," said SSWD Board Member Kevin Thomas during the event. "We wanted to provide an opportunity to educate customers about low-water, sustainable landscaping through hands-on workshops and a permanent demonstration garden. We also wanted to be a good neighbor by investing in our community. I think we've accomplished that—and more," Thomas continued. "Right now, you see young plants, soaking in all of the winter rain. Come spring, you will see them beginning to emerge into the vibrant, colorful garden for everyone to enjoy."

The project is sponsored by Sacramento Suburban Water District in partnership with EcoLandscape California, which served as project manager and provided instruction for workshops, and is part of the District's ongoing commitment to promoting wise water use and investing in the community.







To be unclear is to be unkind

Dear Dave,
 My friend and I are roommates, and we've always had an agreement that we split each of the bills fifty-fifty. We both work and have decent jobs, but for the last couple of months she's been really late in paying her half of the bills. She says she's broke. I don't want to be mean, but how can I approach her about this situation?

Dear Alice,
 I understand that you don't want to be mean to a friend, but situations like this should be addressed quickly and directly. No matter whether you're talking about friendships or business dealings, to be unclear is to be unkind.

Turn off the television, sit down with her, and have a kind but firm conversation. Let her know that the roommate agreement is no longer working because she isn't paying her bills on time. budgeting her money. I mean, if she's got a good job her money has to be going somewhere, right? The problem is that it's not going to the proper places.

You just have to smile and say, "This isn't going to happen anymore. You're going to get your act together, and I'll help you all I can, but you need to start paying on time or the roommate situation is over."

Is that tough love? No, it's just love.

Savings vs Pay Off

Dear Dave,
 My wife and I owe \$90,000 on our mortgage, and we have no other debt. We are able to save about \$20,000 a year, so we could have the house paid off in just over four years. She likes the idea of having lots of money saved up, but I would love to be completely debt-free. Should we pay off the house or hang on to the savings?

Dear Jason,
 Let's pretend your house is already paid for in full. Would you borrow on your home so that you had enough cash that your wife liked it? You say you wouldn't, so what's the difference? If you had a paid-for house

and you wouldn't borrow on it to have cash laying around to feel better, why wouldn't you use the cash laying around to pay off the house? It's the same thing.

The first thing you want to consider is having an emergency fund of three to six months of expenses. You also need to make sure you're putting aside 15 percent of your income for retirement. Other than that, if you have enough cash laying around to pay off your home and you don't, it's the same thing as having borrowed on your home in order to have cash laying around.

If I'm in your shoes, as soon as the emergency fund is in place — six months of expenses since your wife likes the security factor — and 15 percent is being put away for retirement, I'd take the other money and throw it at the house. Get that thing paid off as fast as you can!

Unsung Heroines Soar in Uplifting 'Hidden Figures'

The movie's opening scene is a white cop harassing three black women on the side of a road with a broken-down car. Later, white colleagues of these ladies will refuse their using the same coffee pots, water fountains and toilets at work. Career advancement for these blacks and others working at NASA? Not with the policies set by their white superiors. The movie also throws in a couple of civil rights protests to stress the segregated and prejudiced South of the 1960s. And, yet, in the entire 2-hour-plus movie, not a single "N word" is heard or a drop of blood seen.

What is this, "Cool Runnings?" While both movies address how unfairly and disgustingly bigotry oppresses black people's dreams for greatness, a PG rating, mainstream marketing and sanitized storytelling do repress their potential to deliver indelible messages for civil rights, and in the case of "Hidden Figures," equal rights as well. Picture "Schindler's List" without Jews being killed or dialogue free of anti-Semitic slurs.

But like the aforementioned 1993 comedy about the Jamaican bobsled team hoping to make the Olympics, "Hidden Figures" still inspires. Big time.

Set at NASA during America's space race with the Soviets, the Hollywoodized, yet effecting biopic follows three brilliant black female employees who, despite obstacles placed by mostly male and lily-white superiors at Langley Research Center, make significant contributions while shooting for the stars. Thanks to the movie and the book on which it's based, by Margot Lee Shetterly, these amazing women are unsung heroines no more.

Each lady gets her day in the sun, but at center is NASA mathematician Katherine Johnson (Taraji P. Henson). Without her, John Glenn wouldn't have been the first American in space, and man might not have landed on the moon as early as we did. Computer scientist Dorothy Vaughan (Octavia Spencer) does the work of a supervisor at Langley, but the glass ceiling is lowered for blacks, especially those who are also women. Engineer hopeful Mary Jackson

(Janelle Monae) also is hampered by a system that will require miracles and, like NASA's space program desperately trying to catch up with the Soviets, a series of firsts. The main actresses make the most of their roles, but only one, Henson, gets the stand-taking moment that both audiences and Oscar voters love.

The mostly white supporting cast includes Kevin Costner as a driven, compassionate NASA chief and Kirsten Dunst as Dorothy's snippy quasi-racist boss. Both are fine, which can't be said of a lackluster Jim Parsons as NASA's chief engineer. Haven't seen a key role performed so flatly since Wile E. Coyote got road-killed.

Flaws notwithstanding, and they really are just nits, "Hidden Figures" blends emotion, heart, drive and even humor to engaging effect. Its Disney-like approach, where hardly a discouraging word is heard or physical struggle shown, does allow for younger audiences. With STEM and equality so key to our country's future, maybe a movie like this being PG isn't so bad. 4 of 5 Stars ★

What If Sick People Lose Their ObamaCare?

And let's not forget how the FDA has driven the costs of drug approval sky-high, suppresses therapies that have no prospect of turning billion-dollar profits, and protects manufacturers against competition when the drug is about to go off patent. The anti-leukemia drug Gleevec, for example, cost \$26,000 per year in 2001, a price called "high but fair," considering the cost of research and the need for profits. It is \$146,000 a year today, but the introduction of cheaper generics in the U.S. is being delayed.

Why can such prices be sustained? Because third parties sometimes pay them. One ObamaCare plan reportedly pays \$10,488 per month for Gleevec, from a pharmacy with which it apparently has an arrangement, although it might be available from Walgreen's for \$4,400, and from other pharmacies for still less. What would the hapless patient do if her Exchange plan went out of business (maybe because Republicans took away its subsidies or maybe because it just failed)? One option would be to go to India and buy a year's supply of a generic version of Gleevec for \$400. (The cost of manufacture is \$159.) In fact, the manufacturer might well give her the drug to buff up its image. But drug companies really love the third-party payment schemes, just like big hospitals do.

Do the designers of ACA—which would be more aptly named the Unaffordable Care Act—really care about cancer patients? Such patients may be useful props for lobbying, but they don't help achieve the reformers' stated goal of maximizing "population health." Prolonging the lives of sick people reduces the average health score. Money spent on Gleevec is diverted from reducing disparities, achieving "quality" quotas, and paying for the information technology and administrators to "document" all that (and sell the data).

The current "healthcare delivery" system, including entitlement programs (e.g. Medicare and Medicaid), is about the redistribution of wealth and the

control of medical care, which enables control of the population. The idea of comprehensive third-party payment for all medical care (all that is allowed) destroys medicine—the care of the sick—while placing unsustainable burdens on the economy.

The people who are terrified about losing their ObamaCare "coverage" are the very ones at greatest risk of losing their lives if ObamaCare is perpetuated.

Real reform would put patients back at the center and demote insurance companies to their proper function of reimbursing subscribers for the costs of unexpected catastrophes. Costs would plummet, and innovation would soar.

While the free market is building much better facilities, some patients will be caught in the transition. But we should be concerned about their actual care, not their coverage. They can be helped in many ways, without destroying arrangements that work for the 99 percent. Perhaps a dollar-for-dollar tax credit for those helping to pay for their treatment?

What if we said that those who like their government medicine can keep it? Just let the rest of us go.

Defendants Sentenced for Natomas Apartment Shooting Death Defendant Sentenced to Prison for Felony Auto Insurance Fraud National Slavery & Human Trafficking Prevention Month

DATE: January 6, 2017
CASE: Dezmon McClary & Charles Johnson (Case #15F06105)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Greene, Homicide Unit

The Honorable Marjorie Koller sentenced Dezmon McClary to 50 years to life in prison and Charles Johnson to 5 years, 8 months in prison. On December 8, 2016, a jury convicted McClary for the first-degree murder of Marcus Gonzalez. The jury also found true the allegation that McClary intentionally and personally discharged a firearm causing death. Charles Johnson was convicted of involuntary manslaughter while armed with a firearm, and felon in possession of a firearm.

McClary had been dating a resident of the Natomas Park Apartments. On October 8, 2015, McClary became aware that his ex-girlfriend was seeing a new boyfriend. The next day, McClary and Johnson went to the ex-girlfriend's apartment. McClary, who was armed with a shotgun, and Johnson, who was armed with a handgun, entered the apartment through an unlocked door. McClary located Marcus Gonzalez and believing him to be the new boyfriend, shot him with the shotgun.

suspicious and investigated the claim. Foremost denied the claim because Qadir lied during the Examination under Oath and failed to provide requested documents.

In 2016, authorities received information that parts from the allegedly stolen Harley were at Qadir's home. A search warrant was served at Qadir's residence, where officers located all of the customized painted parts as well as the alligator seat from the allegedly stolen Harley.

CASE: Juda Qadir (Case #16FE019925)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kelly Mulcahy, Insurance Fraud Unit

Juda Qadir pled no contest to felony automobile insurance fraud. The Honorable Michael Bowman sentenced Qadir to 2 years state prison and ordered him to pay \$6,335 in restitution to Foremost Insurance (subsidiary of Farmers Insurance).

In 2011, Qadir purchased a Harley Davidson motorcycle and completely remodeled it, including having customized murals painted on it and constructing the seat out of alligator skins. In July 2015, Qadir obtained a suspicious appraisal of \$47,000 for his Harley. He then obtained full coverage insurance at Foremost, which obtained a reputable appraisal valuing the Harley at no more than \$32,000. In October 2015, Qadir reported the Harley stolen to the Galt Police Department. Qadir claimed he was riding the Harley and ran out of gas. Qadir stated he called a cousin who took him to get a can of gas, and when they returned the Harley was gone.

The next day, Qadir called Foremost and started a claim for the "theft" of the Harley. Foremost became

"No child or adult should live in fear of being a victim of sexual or labor exploitation," states District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert. "I am proud of the work we are doing through the aggressive prosecution of exploiters, and collaborative programs that protect and prevent victims of human trafficking."

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert recognizes January as National Slavery & Human Trafficking Prevention Month, and is committed to prosecuting those who force victims into the commercial sex trade while leading efforts to combat human sex and labor trafficking in the Sacramento region.

In June 2015, DA Schubert announced an unprecedented partnership of roughly 30 agencies and organizations in the anti-human trafficking and exploitation coalition called "Sacramento Together." Partners include the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies, the Public Defender's Office, the Probation Department, local and state public agencies, and community based organizations. One of the goals of Sacramento Together is to increase public awareness about human trafficking.

Cases like the Elk Grove Uber driver, who reported the sex trafficking of a minor by her exploiters, is an example of how public awareness aids in the intervention and prevention of human trafficking.

The District Attorney's Office asks for the public's help to combat these crimes. A call to 911 or to the national hotline (1-888-373-7888) can make the difference.

Community awareness, education, and intervention efforts through the Sacramento Together coalition, specialized collaborative courts, and the Human Trafficking Task Force will remain a high priority for the District Attorney's Office. ★





Warm climate. Cultures dating back thousands of years. Exotic destinations known for their food and wine. Luxurious floating resorts that take you there.

What's not to like about Mediterranean cruising?

Now let's go on a journalistic jaunt to the fourth- through sixth-ranked exceptional destinations that delighted during back-to-back 10-day Mediterranean cruises aboard the resplendent Celebrity Reflection and bar-raising Carnival Vista.

#4: Barcelona

Spain's second-largest metropolis is the whole package, offering everything you want from a cruise port without need of a shore excursion or private guide. The city of Gaudi, Picasso and Miro doesn't take an expert to find spectacular sights, superb shopping, a breathtaking beach and fabulous food and drink. For cruisers, exploring is really as simple as going into town by cab, telling the driver to plop you pretty much anywhere, then walking in any direction. Chances are you'll fall in love with this luxurious and electrifying port – and its beautiful people – whether you stroll La Rambla, the three-lined pedestrian thoroughfare popular with tourists and locals alike, or the cobblestone-paved old town known as Barri Gotic (Gothic Quarter), where Pablo Picasso and Joan Miro once dwelled. No visit is complete without paying homage to Antoni Gaudi's distinctive style of Catalan Modernism. His work graces the city's architecturally rich landscape, including at his magnum opus, the Sagrada Familia. Giant cranes have been a mainstay of

2026, the centenary of Gaudi's death. There will be plenty of toasts with glasses of cava then, but why wait as just a few steps from wherever you are is likely a fantastic tapas bar or cafe pouring the local sparkling wine that pairs perfectly with the array of small plates ready to be devoured.

#5: Florence

The port of Livorno on the Etruscan Coast of Tuscany serves as the gateway to Florence and Pisa for more than 15 major cruise lines. Shore excursion desks keep busy fulfilling passengers' wishes to discover the area's famous religious sites.

Most large ships offer a "Florence & Pisa on Your Own" tour, and at \$90 for an adult ticket, \$80 for children, Carnival's excursion might actually be

saying "ciao for now" in Santa Croce Square. The roughly three hours of independent exploring are well spent checking out the Duomo with its cathedral, bell tower and Baptistery, the cherished Ponte Vecchio bridge over the Arno River, the countless leather shops, and the best pasta and gelato within walking distance according to Yelp or Trip Advisor. You're really on your own if you want to see Michelangelo's "David" statue at Accademia Gallery, but replicas of the marble masterpiece can be found elsewhere in the old city. From Florence it's a 1 1/2-hour drive to Pisa for a visit to Miracle Square and its famously leaning 645-year-old tower. Don't be shy about taking a photo of you trying to right the foundation-challenged bell tower. You're a tourist!

#6: Santorini

Whoever said "getting there is half the fun" never went to the Taj Mahal or Greece's most picturesque, dramatic and tourism-dependent island. India isn't on the Mediterranean, so we'll leave the ghastly drive from New Delhi to Agra for another story. As for Santorini, there's no getting around a tender ride and a 400-meter climb up the cliffs of a caldera to reach Fira, a pretty town in itself, but not as picturesque as Oia a half-hour cab or bus ride northwest. Almost every shore excursion begins in Fira. Your

PERIOD GANGSTERS "LIVE BY NIGHT" CAPER; "SNEAKY PETE" ON TV

Coughlin's interracial romance draws the ire of a KKK goon who happens to be the brother-in-law of the local sheriff (Chris Cooper), an uptight lawman who nonetheless seems to look the other way on the illicit trafficking of alcohol.

With the return of legal alcohol, Coughlin cooks up a new plan for a casino in a palatial hotel resort setting, but snags occur with plans to enlist public support for a plebiscite to approve gambling.

Meanwhile, back in Boston, mob chieftain Pescatore grows weary of Coughlin's scheme to promote the dicey proposition of gambling rather than focusing on more lucrative criminal enterprises.

The payoff for "Live By Night" is a climactic brutal shootout between Coughlin's crew and the Italians sent down from Boston that fans of old-school gangster films are likely to enjoy.

TV CORNER - "SNEAKY PETE" ON AMAZON

Old habits die hard, but I am still clinging to the rapidly outmoded model of watching television shows on cable as well as, gasp, networks. Yet, viewing habits of many are adjusting to the relatively new world of streaming programs that fit your schedule.

Amazon, which sells everything from auto parts to patio furniture, is in the business of streaming their own original television programs. "Sneaky Pete" is just their newest thing to alight on the Internet or mobile device of your choosing.

With a production pedigree

that could easily land the series on practically any network or premium cable outlet, "Sneaky Pete," created by multi-talented Bryan Cranston among others, is a solid crime drama starring Giovanni Ribisi as the titular character.

As explored in flashbacks, Ribisi's Marius is a petty con artist who's often out of his league as he attempts dangerous confidence games with the kind of people that would kill their own mothers to get ahead.

About to be released from prison, Marius learns from his inept brother Eddie (Michael Drayer) that a mobster named Vince (Bryan Cranston) holds Marius responsible for a \$100,000 debt that must be repaid, otherwise Eddie could start losing some fingers to a bolt-cutter.

Marius swipes the identity of a cellmate named Pete, a talkative sort who recounts an idyllic life in rural Connecticut with his grandparents. Sliding into the life of his fellow prisoner, the fake Pete heads to the country for a new life away from the pitfalls of New York City.

Currying favor with the grandparents Otto (Peter Gerety) and Audrey (Margo Martindale), the fake Pete figures that his absence for 20 years makes it possible to adapt to new surroundings with what he learned from the real Pete.

It turns out that the family business is in bail bonds, the sort of dubious enterprise where clients on the run might actually be well-connected mobsters or dangerous petty criminals that could easily put the fake Pete into a compromising position.

"Sneaky Pete" involves a delicate balancing act for the fake Pete to juggle the demands of his new family and to keep in contact with his parole officer back in the big city while also trying to stay a few steps ahead of the unforgiving Vince and his deadly goons. ★

LIVE BY NIGHT (Rated R)

Films released in January are all too often the unfortunate equivalent of a box of melted chocolates and wilted flowers delivered a week after Valentine's Day.

Where does that leave writer-director-star Ben Affleck, boasting the trifecta of cinematic endeavors, when his film "Live By Night" had a limited release in December only to be followed by a big splash in the dead zone of January?

The answer may depend on your appetite for a muscular crime drama set primarily in the Prohibition era of the 1920s when Ben Affleck's Joe Coughlin, the son of a Boston police captain (Brendan Gleeson), takes the wrong path.

Engaged in criminal acts while carrying on a risky affair with Emma (Sienna Miller), a mobster's girlfriend, Coughlin runs afoul of warring Irish mobsters and Italian mafia.

Since Emma's linked to Irish mob boss Albert White (Robert Glenister), Coughlin cuts a deal with Italian kingpin Maso Pescatore (Remo Girone) to set up shop in Florida to muscle in on White's rum-running operation.

Relocating to Ybor City in the Sunshine State with his loyal pal Dion Bartolo (Chris Messina), Coughlin makes a pact with the local Cuban gang for supplies of rum, and then falls for pretty, slinky black Cuban immigrant Graciela Suarez (Zoe Saldana).


