

# **Beloved Critters** Immortalized by Art

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - If a mutt is man's best friend, he also might be an artist's best model.

Canines large and small -- together with giraffes, birds and felines -- are the stars of the Sacramento Fine Arts Center's most popular annual exhibition. The "Animal House" show runs at the center from January 3 to 29.

Animal art has been around since cavemen finger-painted on walls. Beasts inspired hieroglyphic devotion in Egypt. So what is it about pets and painters? "It's instinctive for artists to have their friends pose," says SFAC spokesman David Peterson. "We like to record important people in our lives and pets

are part of that. Many artists take their dogs out painting. You reach for them when you need reassurance. They're never critical of technique." Artists agree that animal portraits are no easier than human likenesses. Disinclined to be still, pets are often painted from photos but, for a loving artist, devotion allows likenesses to shine through.

The animal show is among SFAC's most popular events. "Senior homes send buses of people," says Peterson. "We also have school tours. Animal art appeals to all ages. We started the show eleven years ago. Since then, galleries as far away as Santa Cruz have copied

# Crab Health **Advisory Lifted** for CA Coast

- The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has lifted the last remaining health advisory for Dungeness crab caught along the California coast. CDPH lifted this advisory on January 11th due to recent tests showing that traces of domoic acid have declined to low or undetectable levels in Dungeness crabs caught in the area, indicating they are safe to consume.

Dungeness crabs caught along the coast are safe to consume. However, as a precaution, consumers are advised not eat the viscera (internal organs, also known as "butter" or "guts") of crabs. The viscera usually contain much higher levels of domoic acid than crab body meat. When whole crabs are cooked in liquid, domoic acid may leach from the viscera into the cooking liquid. Water or broth used to cook whole crabs should be discarded and not used to prepare dishes such as sauces, broths, soups or stews (for example, cioppino or gumbo), stocks, roux, dressings or dips.

Symptoms of domoic acid poisoning can occur within 30 minutes to 24 hours after eating toxic seafood. In mild cases, symptoms may include vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal cramps, headache and dizziness. In severe cases, the victim may experience trouble breathing, confusion, disorientation, cardiovascular instability, seizures, excessive bronchial secretions, permanent loss of short-term memory, coma or death.

Domoic acid accumulation in seafood is a natural occurrence that is related to a "bloom" of a particular single-celled plant. CDPH will continue to monitor conditions to ensure that seafood sold in California is safe to consume.







SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Just after 7:00 am on January 7th, Metro Fire crews were dispatched to the 9000 block of Folsom Boulevard for multiple callers reporting a house fire. First arriving crews found heavy fire coming from a fourplex and immediately initiated fire attack. While firefighting operations were occurring in the unit of origin, additional firefighters initiated fire attack in a second involved unit and began searching for trapped residents.





# Dissolve the LLC?

Dear Dave.

My wife and I are debt-free, plus she has a business giving music lessons. We formed an LLC last year when she had several students and was making over \$3,000 a month, but that all changed when our first baby arrived. Now, she has only a few students, and they bring in around \$700 per month. Should we dissolve the LLC?

Dear Ben,

First, congratulations on being debt-free and new parents. Happy New Year to you all!

In most states, the only upfront cost for an LLC is the money you pay for the initial set up. There may be a small fee for a business license and subsequent annual renewal, but that generally doesn't add up to much. Then, there's the money you pay for filing your tax return on the LLC once a year. Even if you live in a state where there are other fees to consider, as long as the cost of maintaining the LLC wasn't killing you, I'd recommend keeping it in place. You went to the trouble of opening it, and you just might use it again someday. Even if your wife is staying home with the baby,

# Helping dad

Dear Dave,

My dad has been really bad with money his entire life. Anytime he would get into trouble, my grandparents would always bail him out. This time he came to my wife and I, asking for \$350 to get out of overdraft at the bank. We're trying to live on a budget and get control of our finances, and \$350 would make things kind of tight at the moment. What do you think we should do?

Dear Jeremy,

I understand feeling an obligation to help your dad. But there's a lesson here that dad needs to learn, and it's something that goes much deeper than the money or helping out a family member.

You have to do the right thing, no matter how dad reacts to this. Right now, the right thing is taking care of your family and not

my answer to dad would be no. Another thing that needs to happen is for the definition of "help" to change. When you say he's been irresponsible with money his whole life, giving him \$350 won't help — and it will make you an enabler. Just handing him \$350 will actually hurt him, and it will give him the idea he can continue being dumb with money and hit you up for cash anytime.

Like I said, I understand the pull of helping out a parent. So if you feel this is something you absolutely must do, I would advise making the \$350 contingent on the fact that he begin and complete a financial counseling course. Be gentle when you talk to him, and let him know it hurts to see him struggling. But let him know, too, it's his responsibility to work through his debts and take care of his own finances!

# Recycling California's Water Supply

Kale or quinoa? Free range chicken or seasonal veggie medley? Pellegrino or...recycled water?

Californians could soon start drinking purified wastewater. In response to a five-year drought, the State Water Resources Control Board recently informed legislators that regulating recycled, drinkable water is perfectly feasible. California would be the first state in the nation to implement such regulations.

Exploring water reuse is a smart move. Policymakers have long looked to science to address water shortages -- and farmers and ranchers have long recognized the value of recycled water. As California struggles to solve its water scarcity crisis, funneling purified, recycled water to the drinkable water supply is a logical step. With the right technology, the process should be sustainable, cost-effective and completely safe.

Outside the United States, many urban centers are already relying on reused water. Israel embraced water recycling ten years ago to help address its water shortages. Today, the nation has so much water that, as one farmer put it, "[we] don't really care if it rains

Singapore has historically been classified as "water poor" by the United Nations, relying heavily on water imports from nearby Malaysia. But thanks to investments in water recycling, four water reuse plants now meet 30 percent of Singapore's water needs -- and the nation is now water independent. In fact, policymakers and urban planners are now gearing up for the city-state's water demand to double over the next 45 years.

In California, dry weather and climate change have



water. Israel embraced water recycling ten years ago to help address its water

exacerbated drought conditions, and climate experts estimate that even if it rained one inch per day in San Francisco and Oakland for 13 straight years, California's water reserves still wouldn't bounce-back to pre-drought levels.

What's more, the state's population is growing -- as is demand for its agriculture offerings. This will continue to put even more pressure on California's water supplies. This "new normal" should concern every American. Already, the average American consumes about 300 gallons of California's water every week by simply eating food from the Golden State.

Sending recycled water into the state's drinkable water supply -- a process known as direct potable reuse -- is broadly supported by the public. A new survey from Xylem found that 83 percent of Californians are open to using recycled water on a daily basis. Further, nine out of 10 state residents support continued investment

in drinkable recycled water, even if California gets more rainfall.

These numbers make sense. Virtually all the earth's water is recycled, over and over again, by nature. As Executive Director of the WateReuse Association and Water Environment & Reuse Foundation Melissa Meeker has pointed out, "It's the same water now as when dinosaurs walked the earth." And thanks to modern filtration and disinfection technology, recycled water is cleaner and safer than bottled water.

California has always spearheaded the implementation of advanced technologies and practices to create a more sustainable environment and drive economic growth. As we look toward regulations for recycled drinking water, the state has the opportunity to lead once again.

"I agree with the governor's budget approach that ensures we are prepared for the expected economic downturn.


"The governor has, along with the Republicans, opted to hold the line on our spending. We cannot be getting loose with the purse in California.

# Whatever Happened to

It seemed like a good idea. Prepare a national news broadcast that parents can watch with their children without fear of trauma, nightmares, or lewdness. If I can watch the news with my children, then I have a natural opportunity to discuss issues and problems of the day, encouraging my children to be informed consumers of current events. This experiment of family-friendly news became the policy of certain news outlets in the 1990s, but was quickly co-opted by Bill Clinton and Monica Lewinsky. The Clinton sex scandal took the national news in directions that were not family friendly—never mind the fact that there are certain subjects that I myself as an adult do not want to think about while I am eating my dinner. The "family-friendly news era" was so short that when I search for the term today, I get only 19

Of course, news has never been entirely family friendly. Television news has always covered stories of fatal airline disasters, bridge failures, devastating storms, African famines, and military conflicts.

The reality is that our world is not always family friendly, and part of my parental responsibility is to guide and teach my children about threats, dangers, and wise ways to protect

That being said, the news over the last 20 years has been far from family friendly. We've seen images of airplanes intentionally flying into buildings, Americans choosing to jump from those towering infernos, and skyscrapers collapsing before our eyes. We've seen bombings at iconic events like the Boston Marathon. We've watched live military battles in the Middle East.

Obviously, the media make many choices in which they edit harrowing images. The stories we have seen of late from Syria have been horrifying, yet only cover a small part of the actual atrocities in cities like Aleppo. The realities around us are not family friendly; neither are they adult friendly. I wish I did not need to think about the intense struggles that occur around the world and within our own cities and towns. Nevertheless, as an American adult, I need to be informed, in spite of my natural desire to just think in terms of personal peace and affluence.

A recent example comes from October, when the release of president-elect Donald Trump's lewd statements on a bus several years ago forced the national news to cover stories of selfish sexual fantasy. Jimmy Carter's 1976 quote to Playboy ("I've looked on a lot of women with lust. I've committed adultery in my heart many times") pales by comparison to some of the things being covered today.

One of the focal points on colleges and universities across America today is the issue of sexual assault. The issue is being framed as a violation of Title IX. According to a Huffington Post story, there are 315 colleges and universities under investigation for Title IX issues; many of these focus particularly on sexual assault. At the very point in time when we are trying to teach our young men dignified, mature, and legal means of interacting with young women, we are hearing news stories about lewd speech.

It just became that much harder to parent mature boys and men in our modern culture.

Where has our society come, and where is it going? Although Christianity is a strong and growing force on several continents, the secularization of America is evident in our national surveys and in our daily lives. It is unreasonable for me to expect my secular neighbors to adhere to my own moral standards and mores. In fact, as our country becomes increasingly secular, we are finding that our national morals have degraded. Carter's onceshocking 1976 admission of his private thoughts have been replaced by verbal descriptors of lewd sexual talk, creating negative role models.

Today's news is not family friendly. I hope and pray that we can take the stories of 2016 and establish more positive norms and mores of decency, civility, and love for our neighbor. We can do it but we've got our work cut out for us.





Juan Avalos was convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of Nichole Riolo. The jury also found true a personal use of a deadly weapon allegation.

On April 22, 2015, Nichole Riolo was driving in North Highlands when a pedestrian, Juan Avalos, intentionally kicked her car as she drove by so she would stop her car. Ms. Riolo drove into a parking lot on Watt Avenue and got out of the car to see if Avalos needed help. Avalos then stabbed Ms. Riolo in the neck, killing her. When Avalos was arrested a half mile from the scene, he had Ms. Riolo's phone in his pocket and her blood on his pants.

Avalos faces a maximum sentence of 26 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for January 27, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 34 before the Honorable Lawrence Brown.

DATE: January 4, 2017

**CASE:** Erin Elizabeth Hale (Case #15F07327) PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Heidi Brennan, Child Abduction Unit

Erin Elizabeth Hale pled no contest to felony deprivation of child custody or visitation. The Honorable Geoffrey Goodman sentenced Hale to 6 months county jail and 5 years probation.

On November 6, 2015, Erin Elizabeth Hale abducted her son and moved him to various areas in California before fleeing to Kentucky then New Jersey. Hale and her son arrived in New Jersey by bus. A taxi dispatcher reported her to local police after he discovered she was wanted for felony child abduction.

After a lengthy search by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Child Abduction Unit, with help from the U.S. Marshals Child Abduction Task Force and National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, Hale was arrested in New Jersey on August 24, 2016.

DATE: January 4, 2017

CASE: Damian Porter (Case #14F03935) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Timothy Carr, Special Assault & Child Abuse

The Honorable Steve White sentenced Damian Porter to 25 years to life in prison. On November 29, 2016, a jury convicted Porter for the seconddegree murder of Graeson Byrd and assault on a child resulting in death. A separate jury acquitted co-defendant Davonna Rae Byrd, the victim's mother.

On April 8, 2013, Porter was home alone with 11-week-old Graeson from early in the morning until 911 was called later that afternoon. When medical personnel arrived, Graeson was not breathing and did not have a heartbeat. The child was pronounced dead when he arrived at the hospital a short time later. Medical evidence showed Graeson had sustained a serious head injury that caused his death, and that Graeson had sustained numerous other injuries inflicted over several weeks. Among those injuries were rib, arm, and leg fractures.

**DATE:** January 6, 2017

CASE: Tiana Smith-Anderson (Case

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Satnam Rattu, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

The Honorable Kevin McCormick sentenced 30-year-old Tiana Smith-Anderson to 17 years to life in prison. On November 17, 2016, a jury convicted Smith-Anderson of the second-degree murder of Singh B. Singh. The jury also found true that Smith-Anderson used a deadly weapon in the course of the murder.

Mr. Singh and Smith-Anderson were acquaintances. On September 8, 2013, Smith-Anderson was alone with 84-year-old Singh B. Singh at his Oak Park home. Later that night, Mr. Singh's daughter returned home and went to bed. When she woke up the next morning, she went to check on her father and found him on the bedroom floor covered with a blanket and a large pool of blood. Responding officers found Mr. Singh dead on scene. Singh's autopsy revealed he had been stabbed 26 times. The Sacramento Police Department, in the follow-up investigation, located witnesses who encountered Smith-Anderson immediately after the homicide in possession of Sing's property.

**Background:** Assembly Bill 1826 requires businesses that generate a certain amount of food waste per week to recycle it! The bill also includes "green" wastes that are generated by landscaping services such as lawn clippings, tree trimming and non-hazardous wood waste. Businesses such as restaurants, bakeries, grocery stores, hotels, schools, hospitals, food processors, and landscapers are in some cases now regulated by this new law. Together these waste streams are called "organic wastes."

## What is the Technical Definition of Organic Waste?

Organic waste as defined in the bill includes the following material: food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, nonhazardous wood waste, and food-soiled paper waste that is mixed in with food waste. These materials represent the largest subset of organic wastes that are currently disposed of in California landfills.



## Key Dates & Thresholds:

January 1, 2017: Businesses that generate 4 cubic yards of organic waste per week must arrange for organic waste recycling services.

January 1, 2019: Businesses that generate 4 cubic yards or more of ANY solid waste per week must arrange for organic waste recycling services.

January 1, 2020: If the State (CalRecycle) determines that organic wastes have not been reduced by 50 percent of the 2014 amounts, they will expand the requirements to cover businesses that generate 2 cubic yards or more of commercial solid waste per

## What are the Options?

Businesses that are required to recycle their organic waste must implement at least one, or a combination, of the following actions:

- a. Separate organic waste from other waste and subscribe to organic waste recycling service that includes collection and recycling of organic waste.
- **b.** Recycle your own organic waste onsite or take it yourself for recycling.
- c. Subscribe to an organic waste recycling service that may include mixed waste processing that specifically recycles organic waste.
- **d.** Businesses sell or donate their recyclable organic waste.

## **Business Incentives - Early Adopters**

Businesses that get on board early with this new recycling requirement may also be eligible for saving on garbage service fees from their commercial waste hauler. Businesses are urged to contact their service provider for more information.

In addition, the Business Environmental Resource Center (BERC) has a recognition program through their Sustainable Business Program for businesses.

# Tax Filing Season Begins Jan. 23

IRS Special Release

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - The Internal Revenue Service has announced that the nation's tax season will begin Monday, Jan. 23, 2017 and reminded taxpayers claiming certain tax credits to expect a longer wait for refunds.

The IRS will begin accepting electronic tax returns that day, with more than 153 million individual tax returns expected to be filed in 2017. The IRS again expects more than four out of five tax returns will be prepared electronically using tax return preparation software.

Many software companies and tax professionals will be accepting tax returns before Jan. 23 and then will submit the returns when IRS systems open. The IRS will begin processing paper tax returns at the same time. There is no advantage to filing tax returns on paper in early January instead of waiting for the IRS to begin accepting e-filed returns.

The IRS reminds taxpayers that a new law requires the

IRS to hold refunds claiming the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and the Additional Child Tax Credit (ACTC) until Feb. 15. In addition, the IRS wants taxpayers to be aware it will take several days for these refunds to be released and processed through financial institutions. Factoring in weekends and the President's Day holiday, the IRS cautions that many affected taxpayers may not have actual access to their refunds until the week of

"For this tax season, it's more important than ever for taxpayers to plan ahead," IRS Commissioner John Koskinen said. "People should make sure they have their yearend tax statements in hand, and we encourage people to file as they normally would, including those claiming the credits affected by the refund delay. Even with these significant changes, IRS employees and the entire tax community will be working hard to make this a smooth filing season for taxpayers."

The IRS also reminds taxpavers that they should keep copies of their prior-year tax returns for at least three years. Taxpayers who are changing tax software products this filing season will need their adjusted gross income from their 2015 tax return in order to file electronically. The Electronic Filing Pin is no longer an option. Taxpayers can visit IRS.Gov/GetReady for more tips on preparing to file their 2016 tax return.

The filing deadline to submit 2016 tax returns is Tuesday, April 18, 2017, rather than the traditional April 15 date. In 2017, April 15 falls on a Saturday, and this would usually move the filing deadline to the following Monday – April 17. However, Emancipation Day - a legal holiday in the District of Columbia - will be observed on that Monday, which pushes the nation's filing deadline to Tuesday, April 18, 2017. Under the tax law, legal holidays in the District of Columbia affect the filing deadline across the nation.


