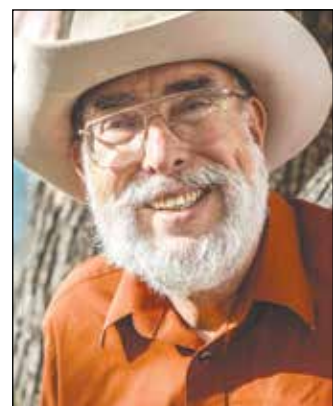

Carmichael Area Breaks Record with 21,500 Gifts for Children in Need



Although local Carmichael collections have finished for the season, there is still time to pack a gift-filled shoebox online for children suffering from poverty, natural disaster, war, terror, disease and famine. For more information on how to participate in Operation Christmas Child visit samaritanspurse.org/occ.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Carmichael and surrounding cities volunteers have collected enough gift-filled shoeboxes to reach more than 21,500 children in need through the Samaritan's Purse project, Operation Christmas Child.

This record breaking collection surpassed last year's Carmichael-area donations of 16,976 gifts. The Operation Christmas Child Sacramento Area Team is now thanking the Carmichael community for their gift donations already on their way to children in need worldwide. For many of these children, the shoebox gift delivered through this local Carmichael project will be the first gift they will have ever received.

Although local Carmichael collections

have finished for the season, there is still time to pack a gift-filled shoebox online for children suffering from poverty, natural disaster, war, terror, disease and famine. Like online shopping, visitors can browse samaritanspurse.org/occ to select gifts matched to a child's specific age and gender, then finish by uploading a photo and writing a note of encouragement to be included in the shoebox they build online. They can also follow their box to discover where in the world it will be delivered.

Participants can give a \$25 gift card to a family member or friend so they can join in the excitement of Operation Christmas Child by packing a shoebox gift online. These shoeboxes—filled with school supplies, toys,

hygiene items and notes of encouragement—are delivered to children in some of the hardest-to-reach countries around the world.

Sen. Gaines Introduces Bill to Help Vets in Repayment Fed Fiasco

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) introduced legislation on December 5th that will help California National Guard veterans caught in the bonus repayment fiasco get financial justice from the federal government.

"I'm not going to sit back and see these veterans victimized," said Senator Gaines. "The state needs to step up and make sure they get every benefit they ever earned and the respect they deserve for fighting for our freedom."

Senate Bill 14 will refund taxes paid by these veterans during the confusion of the veterans' bonus repayment scandal. The Los Angeles Times recently reported that more than 10,000 Guard members have been ordered to repay enlistment bonuses they received as a condition for enlisting or reenlisting in the Guard during the height of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, when the nation was desperate for combat soldiers to carry out its missions.

These soldiers deployed in combat roles and risked their lives in service to freedom and their fellow Americans. Now, due to incompetence and mismanagement in the enlistment bonus program, the Department of Defense (DoD) is demanding repayment from these soldiers a decade after the fact.

Although the DoD has temporarily put a halt to recovery efforts while the issue is being more fully investigated, some service members have already paid back some or all of their bonuses. Many paid taxes on the bonuses years ago and now, because of a three-year time limit on refiling state taxes, they are unable to get back the taxes they paid on the money they ultimately did not receive.

"I'll smash every bit of bureaucracy that stands in the way of justice. I want these soldiers to get the money they deserve, and I won't see them pay taxes on phantom income that is being taken away from them through no fault of their own," said Senator Gaines.

Women's Empowerment Receives \$30K in Grants

Kaiser, Bank of America, Arata Brothers Trust Show Support

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Three foundations each recently awarded \$10,000 to Sacramento nonprofit Women's Empowerment that educates and empowers women who are homeless to find a safe home, steady job and healthy lifestyle. The grant from Kaiser Permanente funds the nonprofit's support groups for women who have faced domestic violence and substance abuse. Bank of America granted funds for Women's Empowerment's job training programs, and Arata Brothers Trust provided funding for the

group's overall program.

"We rely on the community to fund our comprehensive approach to ending homelessness for women and children, and we are fortunate to live in a community that does just that," said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women's Empowerment. "We are grateful to Kaiser, Bank of America and Arata Brothers Trust for providing steadfast funding that helps women overcome the many barriers to homelessness and transform their lives."

Last year, 93 percent of graduates found homes and 83

percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. Women's Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and receives no government funding except for in-kind rent from the County of Sacramento.

State Seeks To Make Water Conservation A Way of Life

From Department of Water Resources

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Working to make water conservation a way of life, State agencies recently released a draft plan for achieving long-term efficient water use and meeting drought preparedness goals that reflect California's diverse climate, landscape, and demographic conditions.

"Californians rose to the challenge during this historic drought and recognized that conservation is critical in the face of an uncertain future. This plan is about harnessing the creativity and innovation that Californians have shown during the driest years in state history and making water conservation a way of life in the years ahead," said California Department of Water Resources Director Mark W. Cowin. "This plan will help make permanent changes to water use so California is better prepared for whatever the future brings."

The new plan's fundamental premise is that efficient water use helps all of California better prepare for longer and more severe droughts caused by climate change.

California recently suffered the driest four years in state history, with only average rainfall last year, and 75 percent of the state remains in severe drought conditions. Meanwhile, a new report from UCLA projects that the Sierra Nevada snowpack — one of California's largest sources of water supply — is likely to drop 50 percent by the end of the century due to climate change. Recognizing these risks and many others, today's plan seeks permanent changes to water use that boost efficiency and prepare for more limited water supplies. These practices will help achieve a top priority in the Governor's Water Action Plan - to "Make Conservation a California Way of Life."

Today's plan builds on the success of mandatory water restrictions during California's severe drought and develops long-term water conservation measures that will ensure all communities have sufficient water supplies. This will involve activities such as ensuring farmers plan and prepare for severe drought and permanently banning wasteful practices like hosing off sidewalks and driveways.

"The last few years provided the wake-up call of all wake-up calls that water is precious and not to be taken for granted," said Felicia Marcus, Chair of the State Water Resources Control Board. "Californians rose to the occasion collectively during the drought. We can build on that success and now prepare for a more unpredictable and disruptive future marked by a changing climate — and do it equitably and cost effectively."

Today's plan represents a shift from statewide mandates to a set of conservation standards applied based on local circumstances, including population, temperature, leaks, and types of commercial and industrial use. For example, communities in hotter and drier climate zones will receive irrigation allowances that reflect evaporation levels.

Key water conservation efforts included in today's plan include:

- Permanent bans on wasteful practices, such as hosing driveways and excessively watering lawns.
- Technical assistance and financial incentives for water suppliers to implement leak prevention, detection, and repair programs.
- Collecting information about innovative water conservation and water loss detection and control technologies.
- Requiring agricultural water suppliers to quantify water use in their service areas and describe measures to increase water use efficiency.
- Full compliance with water use targets for urban water suppliers by 2025.
- Planning and preparing for continued and future drought and water shortages.

Some of the actions described in the draft plan will require working with the Legislature on new

and expanded State authority, while others can be implemented under existing authorities. All recommendations aim to achieve the main objectives of the Governor's Executive Order B-37-16: use water more wisely, eliminate water waste, strengthen local drought resilience, and improve agricultural water use efficiency and drought planning.

In addition to taking action to implement this long-term water conservation plan, State agencies recognize the reality that most of California potentially faces a sixth year of historic drought. Therefore, in January the State Water Board will also consider whether it must extend its existing emergency water conservation regulations, as required by Governor Brown's recent executive order.



This plan will help make permanent changes to water use so California is better prepared for whatever the future brings.

The State Water Board has already taken action to maintain mandatory reductions in communities that

could not verify they have enough water supplies to withstand three more years of severe drought.

Making Water Conservation a California Way of Life, Implementing Executive Order B-37-16," is the result of extensive community and stakeholder engagement across California. The plan was prepared by the Department of Water Resources, the State Water Resources Control Board, the Public Utilities Commission, Department of Food and Agriculture and the Energy Commission. 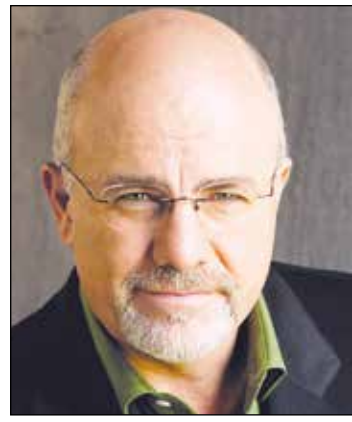

In addition to a few special toys, perhaps you could work with their parents to launch Educational Savings Accounts (ESAs) for them. This would get their college funds started, and it's what we do. We use mutual funds in their ESAs, where each

child is allowed to have up to \$2,000 contributed in their name per year.

The beauty of the ESA with the mutual fund inside is that it's growing completely tax-free. You have to name a custodian of the account until the child turns 18, and that could be you guys or their parents. Just make sure that together you don't over fund the ESAs and cause yourselves tax problems.

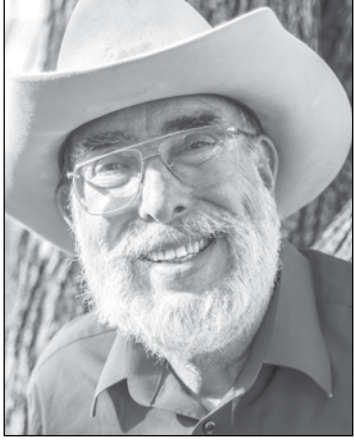

Game Plots

No Politics in Play

Games are the only artistic medium that learned to comment on themselves before commenting on the world around them. Usually the most thought-provoking games (*The Stanley Parable* comes to mind) inspire thought only about the nature of games as a medium; the relationship between player and creator, the possibility or impossibility of choice, the way that game mechanics can make the player feel like a wholly different person. Only recently has the needle started to move, with games at least attempting (sometimes succeeding, more often failing) to communicate a larger theme or message about the world they exist in. But while games like *That Dragon, Cancer* and *Life is Strange* can convey emotionally grounded ideas of loss and of helplessness, the primary topic of discussion that pervades our daily lives and our newsfeeds, politics, remains largely absent.

Of course, one could elicit a few prime examples of games with political themes. It could be argued that *Bioshock* is an attack on Libertarianism, and that *The Witcher 3: Wild Hunt* explores modern social questions about morality and sexuality. But while plenty of games have a politically-charged thematic side note (perhaps you could cite indie game *This War of Mine* in an argument on US involvement in Syria), these games are still, fundamentally, not about the political messages they convey. *Bioshock* is more about the nature of individual choice than Ayn Rand's philosophy. *Witcher* explores a vast number of themes, of which the intersection of morality and sexuality is only a small

footnote. And while *This War of Mine* clearly tries to be anti-war by simulating the struggle for survival of civilians caught in a conflict's crossfire, the fact that its war is fictional obscures connection to the real world.

The exclusion of politics seems odd, given that games increasingly aim to provoke discussion among their players. Considering that politics are so often at the forefront of our awareness of the world (especially this past year), why not go for the low-hanging fruit? The reason, it seems, is that ideas about the purpose of games is fundamentally different than in other popular art forms (which more frequently discuss political themes) like books, films, and television.

Games are thought of as escapism. While the majority of literature, movies and TV shows seem to be at least somewhat realistic comedies or dramas (nobody spontaneously flies away), nearly every major game release has some sort of twist pulled straight from sci-fi, fantasy, or the most ludicrous of action films. When the rallying cry of "Keep your politics out of my games" starts up in the gaming community, it isn't because

gamers are unwilling to confront political arguments. It's because most people play games to escape from this world and into another; a political argument could pull them right back to reality and defeat what, in the eyes of many, is the purpose of the game in the first place.

It's tough to see this escapist mindset as a bad thing. Though it clearly pushes creativity away in the political realm, it encourages an artistic inventiveness and imagination unmatched by any other medium. Furthermore, games are already becoming proficient in conveying legitimate artistic commentary on other areas of life that, unlike politics, gamers can unanimously agree on. Empathy for a blind child, as in *Beyond Eyes*, is a universal theme far more powerful than anything about politics. Though communicating a political viewpoint is viable, and certainly should be more accepted, ultimately games lack a political identity because they just don't need one.

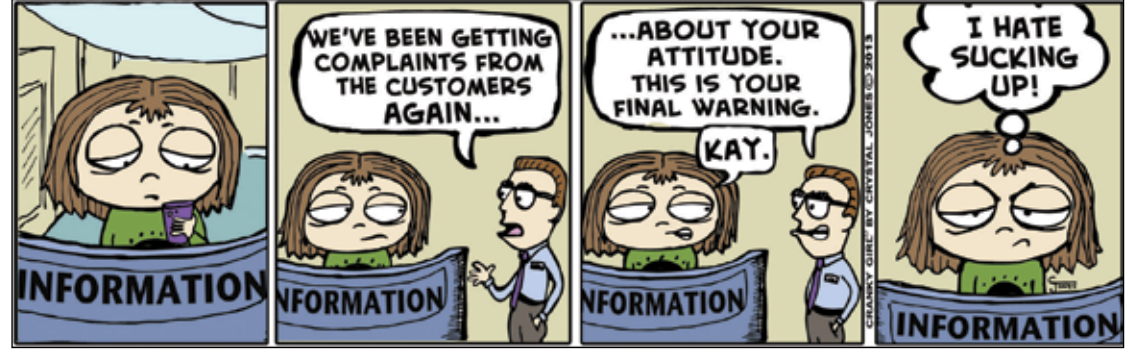

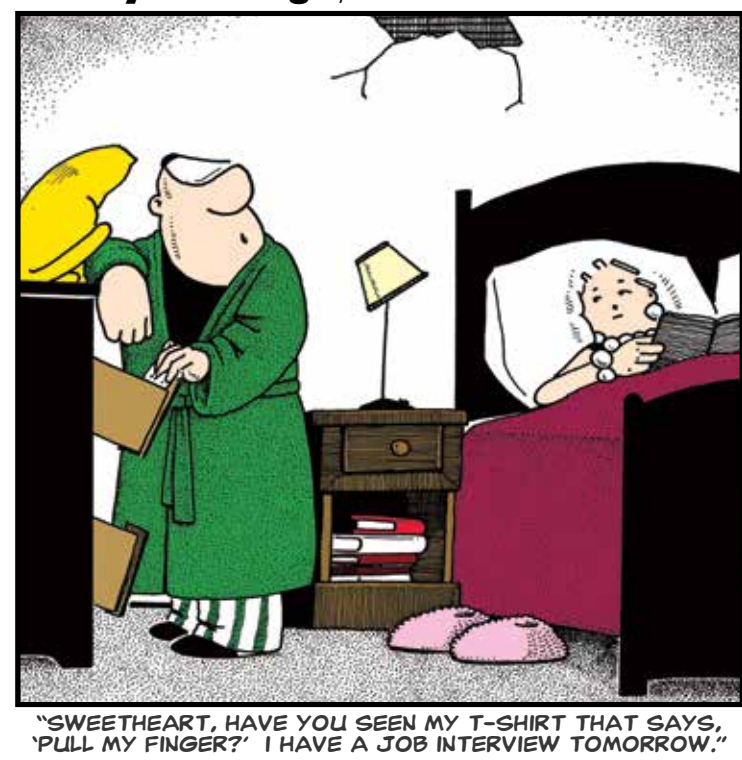

Defendants Convicted in Crime Spree Involving Multiple Robberies and Rape Defendants Convicted for Liquor Store Robberies, Shooting Defendant Convicted for Murder of Infant

DATE: November 23, 2016
CASE: Anthony Cotton, Latrale Way, Lamar Edwards & Donny Smith (Case #14F05913)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Aaron Miller, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit
Anthony Cotton was convicted by a jury of kidnapping for purposes of robbery, first-degree residential robbery, second-degree robbery, attempted robbery, residential burglary, and assault with intent to commit rape during a residential burglary. Latrale Way was convicted of two counts of kidnapping for purposes of robbery, kidnapping for purposes of rape, first-degree residential robbery, assault with intent to commit rape during a residential burglary, forcible digital penetration, forcible rape, attempted robbery, second-degree robbery, and felony sexual battery. The jury also found true several firearm allegations connected to the crimes.

Co-defendants Lamar Edwards and Donny Smith previously pled guilty to first-degree residential robbery with personal use of a firearm allegations.

Between June and October 2014, the defendants committed a number of crimes in the Antelope and North Highlands areas. While committing a home invasion robbery, all four defendants held a man and his children in their house at gunpoint and ransacked the house. Two of the defendants then attempted to rape the man's 27-year-old daughter, but the father was able to run outside for help and the defendants fled. In a second robbery, Latrale Way and other unidentified suspects approached a man and a woman at a park. After the group robbed the man, Latrale Way kidnapped the woman and forced her to drive to an ATM machine to get money. Way then directed the woman to a nearby neighborhood and raped her in her car. Two weeks later, Cotton and Way committed three additional armed robberies in the same park. Forensic DNA testing conducted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Crime Lab conclusively linked Latrale Way to the rape.

Cotton and Way both face multiple life sentences in prison. Edwards faces a maximum of 16 years in prison and Smith faces a maximum of 15 years in prison.

Sentencing for all defendants is set for January 6, 2017, at 10:00 a.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Michael Savage.

DATE: November 29, 2016
CASE: Demetrius Johnson & David Bell (Case #15F03124)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Samuel Alexander, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit
Demetrius Johnson and David Bell were convicted by a jury of three counts of robbery. The

jury also found true allegations that both defendants personally used a firearm and that Johnson discharged a firearm causing great bodily injury.

On May 22, 2015, Demetrius Johnson and David Bell went to a liquor store on Franklin Blvd. When Johnson and Bell tried to leave the store without paying for their items, the clerks tried to stop them. Bell then lifted up his shirt and threatened the clerks with a revolver. Ten minutes later, Johnson and Bell entered a mini mart two blocks away from the liquor store. Bell attempted to go behind the counter to take bottles of alcohol. When the clerk confronted Bell, Johnson pointed the revolver at the clerk and fired two shots as the defendants left the store with the bottles. The clerk was struck in the arm, causing a fractured bone and tissue damage. The defendants were later apprehended with the revolver and property from both robberies in their possession.

Johnson has multiple prior strike convictions for robbery, carjacking, and criminal threats as well as prior convictions for elder abuse and assault with a deadly weapon.

Johnson faces a maximum sentence of 40 years and 8 months to life in prison. Bell faces a maximum sentence of 20 years and 4 months in prison. Sentencing is set for January 20, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 10 before the Honorable Eugene Balonon.

DATE: November 30, 2016
CASE: Damian Porter (Case #14F03935)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Timothy Carr, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit
Damian Porter was convicted by a jury of the second-degree murder of Graeson Byrd and assault on a child resulting in death. A separate jury acquitted co-defendant Davonna Rae Byrd, the victim's mother, of murder and assault on a child causing death charges.

On April 8, 2013, Porter was home alone with 11-week-old Graeson from early in the morning until 9:11 was called later that afternoon. When medical personnel arrived, Graeson was not breathing and did not have a heartbeat. The child was pronounced dead when he arrived at the hospital a short time later. Medical evidence showed Graeson had sustained a serious head injury that caused his death, and that Graeson had sustained numerous other injuries inflicted over several weeks. Among those injuries were rib, arm, and leg fractures.

Porter faces a maximum sentence of 25 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for December 30, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 21 in front of the Honorable Steve White. ★

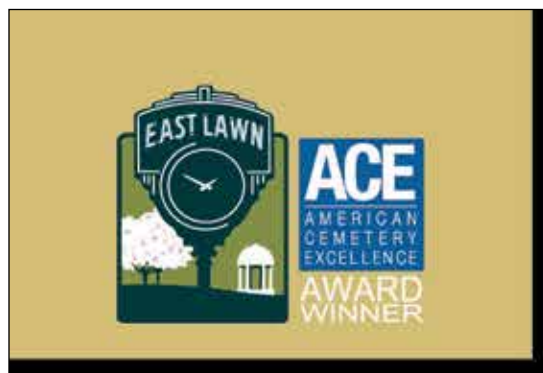

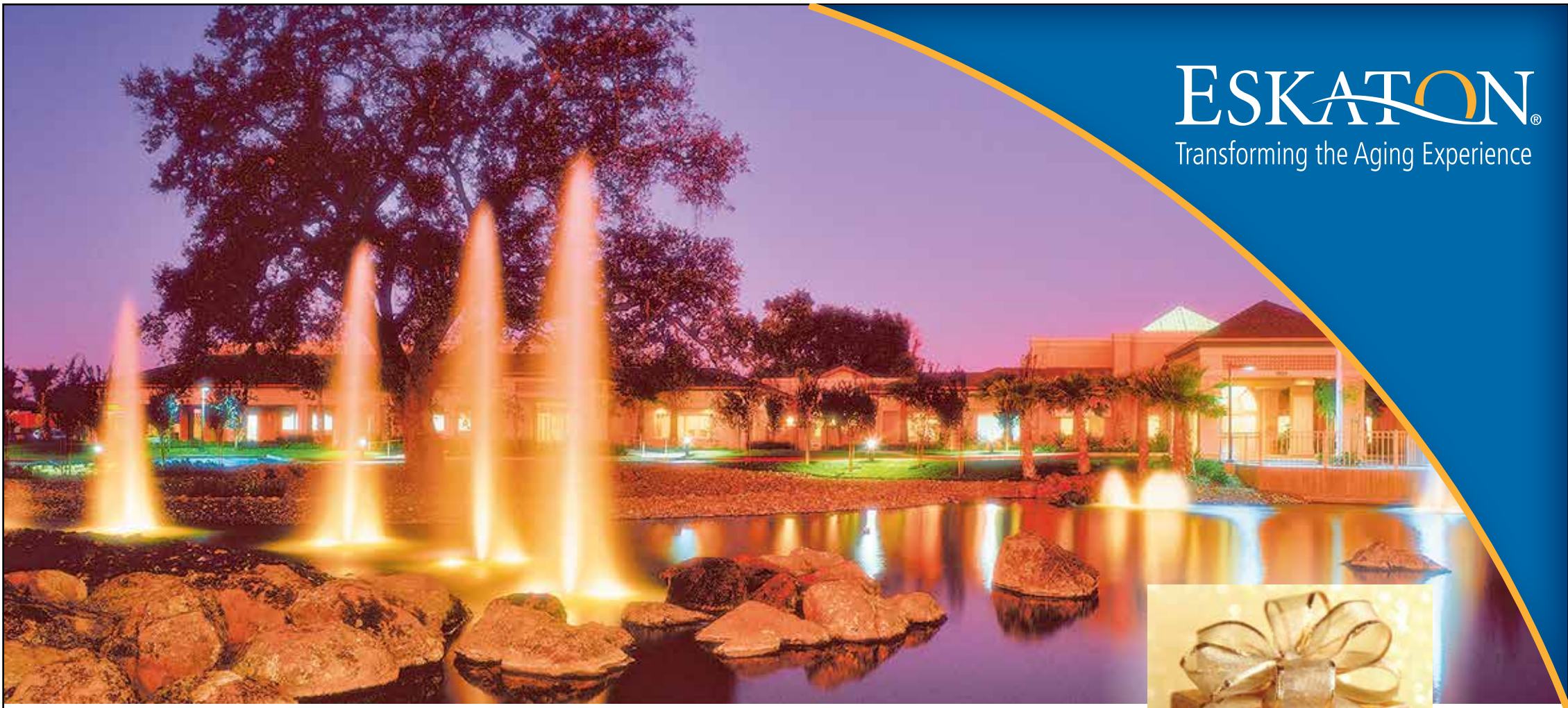
