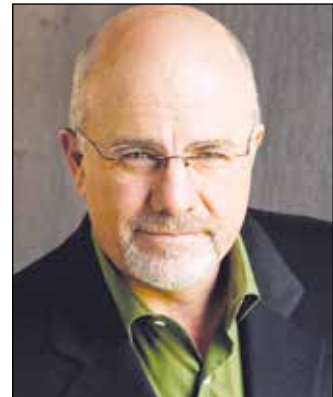

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Woodland sculptor Austin Kramer re-purposed auto tires to create art with real bite. His "Crocodile" recently won the popular choice vote in the Northern California Arts show, hosted at Sacramento Fine Arts Center.

The recent "Bold Expressions" exhibition showed 116 mixed-media works. Submissions came from all over USA and included an award winner from Ashland, Oregon. Oil painter Andy De Weerd made the journey to Carmichael to pick up his Florence Ferrario Memorial prize for a

cheerful work called "Man of Nature."

Watercolorist Steve Walters earned Best of Show ribbon. A resident of Cool, Walters painted "Far Above Sabrina" after an Inyo County mule trek. A field of sunflowers inspired "Yolo Summer" and bagged Past President's Award for Sacramento painter Rhonda Egan. The Shirley Neff Memorial Award went to Grass Valley painter John Michael Keating for a work he called "Buddhism for Cubists."

Founded in 1939, Northern Californian Arts Inc. is among the oldest active groups of West Coast artists. Its annual "Bold

Expressions" event offers \$3000 in cash and gift awards. Nearly 400 artists submitted work this year. Judge was Siskiyou County artist Stefan Baumann.

Show chairman Joan McMurray noted that entrants included artists from nine US states; as far afield as Rhode Island, Texas and Florida. "We've been doing this for 61 years," she explained. "It's a quality show to be accepted in. We're always delighted by the many artists who respond and by public interest in their work."

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Rancho Cordova's 11th Annual Veterans Day Ceremony will be held on Friday, November 11 to remember our veterans and honor the missions of the U.S. Naval Construction Forces (Seabees).

Did you serve in the U.S. Naval Construction Forces? You are cordially invited to Rancho Cordova's Veterans Day Ceremony to be recognized for your service.

The ceremony will be held in the Veterans Memorial Plaza at the Sacramento VA Medical Center, 10535 Hospital Way at Mather. Pre-program entertainment will begin at 9:30 a.m. followed by the commemoration program at 10 a.m. Music entertainment will be provided by the Rancho Cordova River City Concert Band, featuring the "Song of the Seabees."

The Seabees' motto of "We Build - We Fight" recognizes the work of the members of the U.S. Naval Construction Forces. The Seabees have a history of building bases, bulldozing and paving thousands of miles of roadway and airstrips, and accomplishing myriad other construction projects in a wide variety of military theaters dating back to World War II. The word "Seabee" comes from the initials "CB," which comes from the term "Construction Battalion."

The Seabees first became active on March 5, 1942 during World War II when U.S. involvement was expected on both the Pacific and Atlantic Oceans. More than 100,000 Seabees were trained during World War II and have continued to serve since. The Seabees now include 7,000

active personnel and 6,927 reserve personnel.

Ceremony speakers will include Congressman Ami

Bera; Senator Jim Nielsen; Assemblyman Ken Cooley; Kathryn K. Bucher, Associate Director of Patient Care Services/

Nurse Executive at VA Northern California Healthcare System; Rancho Cordova Mayor David Sander; and Rancho Cordova Council Member Robert J. McGarvey, who spearheaded the first Veterans Day and Memorial Day events in Rancho Cordova. The Vultures Row Aviation Team will provide a flyover towards the end of the ceremony.

# Reports from Sacramento Metro Fire District

## Eight Units Damaged in Apartment Fire, One Resident Injured

**Sac Metro Fire Special Report**

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Just after 1 pm on October 30th, Metro Fire crews responding to an apartment fire at 1251 Fulton Avenue in the Arden area found heavy black smoke coming from a second story apartment. The fire, which had started in a bathroom, had already spread to the attic and an adjoining apartment. Bystanders reported multiple victims, so three additional medic units were requested while firefighters initiated fire attack and began searching for victims. Crews searched and evacuated the involved units, ventilated the structure, and kept the fire from spreading to other units. One female victim was located and transported to the hospital with moderate injuries; there were no other victims from the fire.



Six engines, three trucks, and four medics were involved in caring for the injured resident, extinguishing the fire, protecting the adjacent units, and saving residents' personal belongings.



Bystanders reported multiple victims, so three additional medic units were requested while firefighters initiated fire attack and began searching for victims.

A coordinated fire attack allowed firefighters to contain the fire to the two upstairs units.

Two additional apartments sustained smoke damage, while four more sustained water damage. Six engines, three trucks, and four medics were involved in caring for the injured resident, extinguishing the fire, protecting the adjacent units, and saving residents' personal belongings. The residents of all eight units will be displaced; Red Cross was requested to assist them. No firefighters were injured in the fire. Updated damage estimate is \$75,000, with the cause of the

fire still under investigation. Our hearts go out to the resident injured in this fire, and to all the families displaced. Please take a few extra steps to lower the risk of fire hurting your family or destroying your home: test your smoke alarms, keep space heaters at least three feet from anything combustible, use flameless candles whenever possible, and always dispose of your fireplace ashes in a metal container. *Source: Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District* ★

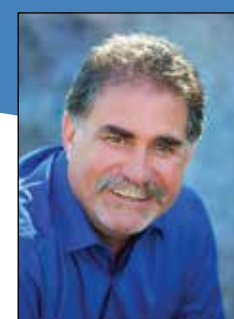

# Dare to Live Without Limits

Time goes by regardless of how it's used. Time goes by faster as you get older. Time flies when you are engaged in enjoyable activities. It drags when you are bored or hate what you are going. You can repeat the same day over and over or fill your time with new and exciting experiences.

Time is the focus of many excuses for inaction. *It takes too much time. There's not enough time. I'm too young. I'm too old.* Everyone has exactly the same amount of time each day. How it's used by you is what makes the difference.

Energy, enthusiasm, and attitude all affect time. When your energy level is low your efficiency is reduced. Therefore, it takes more time to get things done. Enthusiasm makes you more efficient. You approach things with zest and accomplish much more than you would otherwise. A positive, can do attitude enables you to start and finish tasks. Conversely, a negative attitude prevents you from even beginning.

There are a number of strategies you can utilize to make the most out of your time. First, stop worrying. Worry wastes energy that can be used for accomplishments. Lamenting anything from the past drains your vitality. Instead, study the past to discover what works and what doesn't. Don't repeat the same mistakes. Do replicate strategies that work.

The only direction that matters is forward. But don't fret about the future. Take action to prepare for it. All that matters is the action you take today. The best time managers live in the present, not the past, or future.

Ideally, the goal is to get as much done as possible in a given amount of time. However, merely being busy is not the objective. You want to be productive rather than active. You are productive when you are actively pursuing a goal. Activity is energy expended without moving toward a specific accomplishment.

Prioritize how you spend your time. Often, low priority tasks are addressed first because less effort is required. Avoid this trap. Complete your high priority tasks first. These are defined as the most important things you have to do. There are significant negative consequences when these issues are neglected.

Guard your time from distractions. Emails, texts, the internet, phone calls, chit chat, and other interruptions substantially diminish your productivity. Focus is required to address high priority issues. Multitasking dilutes your ability to concentrate. Handle one important activity at a time.

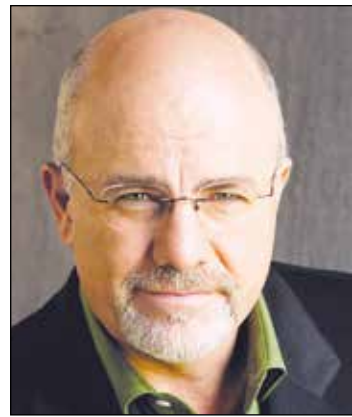
Stay focused on your goals. This process keeps you on track and prevents you from wasting time by wandering. Keeping your eye on your destination enables you to get back on course after a setback or detour.

You lose focus by doing too much at once. A laser is focused whereas a flashlight isn't. The more you attempt simultaneously, the less time there is for each one. Delegation is a great strategy when you are overloaded. If you don't have the authority to delegate or staff to delegate to, you can hire people to pick up some of your workload.

Procrastination is time's enemy. Fear, uncertainty, difficulty, lack of enthusiasm, distractions, and fatigue all contribute to procrastination. It's too easy to put off things you don't want to do. Procrastination leads to missed opportunities, stress, and frustration. A simple technique to break the procrastination logjam is spending just 15 minutes working on something you have been putting off.

Keep track of your time. Be aware of how you're spending it. Reevaluate your strategy if you are not getting enough done. A small change to your approach can produce big results. Now is the time to become better at handling your time.

## Young, jobless and scared

Dear Dave,

I'm 23, and I lost a good job a few days ago due to layoffs. My wife has been a stay-at-home mom with our 10-month-old daughter, and we have very little in the way of savings. What can we do to keep our heads above water?

Dear Seth,

I'm really sorry you're going through this. I've been there, so I know this is a scary time for you. There are some short- and long-term goals to think about in a situation like this, but let's look at the immediate future.

Go crazy about finding some kind of income. I don't care if it's delivering pizza during the week and working at the mall on weekends. Even if it doesn't completely replace your previous income, it will give you some cash to pay bills and stay afloat. On your off days, and before and after work, you can line up and

do interviews for a more stable, full-time job. You may even have to trade off babysitting duties with your wife so she can earn some money too.

While all this is going on, have a garage sale and sell anything you don't need or want anymore. Just about anything that can be turned into income should be turned into income. In the process, prioritize your bills and other financial responsibilities. Take care of food first, then utilities, the mortgage or rent, then transportation. You guys don't need to see the inside of a restaurant for a while unless you're working there, and if things don't get better by Christmas, any gifts you give should be handmade crafts.

## Accounting 101

Dear Dave,

I've just started my own small business. As the owner and only employee, how do I determine my profits?

- Brittany

Dear Brittany,

Here's a basic Accounting 101

definition for you, regardless of how many employees you have or how big your business may be. What you take in, minus expenses — in other words, your revenues minus your expenses — equal profit. Believe it or not, it really is that simple.

Since you're just starting out, I'd strongly advise you to set up a separate checking account for your business. That's the only way to accurately tell exactly what's going on within the business. When you co-mingle business money with grocery money and things like that in your personal account, you'll never have an accurate picture of what's really happening with your business.

# No On Prop 57: Hold Politicians Accountable

Proposition 57 is not only dangerous for the residents of California, voting it into law would reinforce a precarious trend by our state's highest elected officials to transfer their failings in the prison system to the law-abiding people of California.

The popular debate regarding Proposition 57 seemingly hinges on the topic of paroling inmates and whether those inmates are violent or non-violent. Under Prop 57 guidelines, 7,000 inmates would be immediately released, according to the Associated Press, with thousands more to follow. It would release criminals who have committed domestic violence, human trafficking and sex with minors, among other deplorable crimes. But even more egregious than Prop 57 proponents trying to categorize the above offenses as "non-violent" is the deception and political bullying that has powered this ill-conceived proposition.

The Prop 57 pushers are claiming the only opposition comes from state's district attorneys who have ulterior motives. Once again, Brown and his politicians are trying to fool the general voting public with mistruths. Proposition 57 is opposed not only by district attorneys but by peace officers' associations up and down the state. The California Police Chiefs Association opposes Prop 57 as well as several individual Sheriffs who have been strong enough to stand against the Governor, despite his not-so-discreet intimidation tactics. The Southern California Alliance of Law Enforcement (SCALE) is also opposed to Proposition 57 because of its detrimental effect on public safety.

The reasons to oppose this proposition are many.

First, this proposition got

on the ballot through the convenient bending of rules and deadlines normally required to define and submit a valid proposition. Proposition 57 was originally written to apply only to juveniles, in an attempt to have more flexibility in sentencing. In a sweeping move, Gov. Brown took a juvenile proposition and completely revamped it into legislation that would release thousands of violent adult criminals and alter the Constitution of the State of California. He vastly changed the scope and spirit without resubmitting a new proposition. Voters must understand the gravity of this deceit.

Second, the disingenuously-named Proposition 57 misleads the public by claiming to be a "public safety" act intent to only affect "non-violent" criminals. However, the proposition does not define "non-violent" and the only effect it will have on "public safety" is a negative one. And finally we must oppose the practice of our elected officials to continuously push the ill-effects of their failures onto the hard-working people of this state. For the third time, state officials are attempting to transfer the state's obligation to fix its prison system to local jurisdictions and communities.

Brown enacted Assembly Bill 109 (AB109) and required individual counties to be responsible for inmates who should have been in state prison. Sheriff Departments were forced to overhaul their jail systems - systems designed to house people who were awaiting trial or were sentenced to less than year - into regional state prisons that hold multi-year, sentenced prisoners. This caused the release of thousands of inmates in already-full county correction facilities.

Second, voters were conned by the deceptively named Proposition

47, which touted safe neighborhoods and schools. While it has done next to nothing for any school, it has certainly made neighborhoods less safe. It is essentially impossible to punish criminals who commit the types of offenses that plague California residents such as identity theft, burglary and vehicle theft, leaving thieves free to repeatedly victimize our neighborhoods. Under Prop 47, the state did not shift its responsibility to house criminals, it downright abandoned it.

And now, with the Governor and his politicians pushing Prop 57, the good people of this state are at jeopardy of once again taking the brunt of the state's prison failures. The problem with our state prison system is a complex one. It cannot be fixed by an elusive ballot measure that attempts to disguise "solutions" as something more than what it is: the simple turning of the key for thousands, upon, thousands of criminals.

SCALE represents more than 35,000 law enforcement professionals in Southern California. We are the men and women who answer the daily calls for service. We are the men and women who leave our families each day in order to protect yours. And we share in your frustrations that there is very little we can do to protect you from repeat offenders who have gotten a free pass from AB109 and Prop 47.

We, like you, are tired of elected officials forcing the burden of their ill-conceived legislation onto law-abiding Californians. We urge you to VOTE NO on Proposition 57.

## Defendant Convicted for Murder of Transitional Housing Resident Defendant Convicted of Multiple Child Molestation Charges, Jail Inmate Sentenced for Murdering Cellmate

**DATE:** October 14, 2016  
**CASE:** Robert Taylor (Case #14F01407)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Casey Newton, Homicide Unit

Robert Taylor was convicted by a jury for the second-degree murder of Eric Pogue. The jury also found true the allegation that Taylor used a deadly weapon.

Eric Pogue was a resident at 4341 Fell Street in a transitional housing and independent living program. Robert Taylor was employed there as a live-in house manager. On February 9, 2014, Mr. Pogue returned to the Fell St. residence after the house curfew deadline. The house was locked and Mr. Pogue began yelling to be let inside. Mr. Pogue then walked into the backyard and broke one of the rear door windows in an attempt to gain entry. Taylor armed himself with a bat, confronted Mr. Pogue at the rear residence door, and hit him twice in the head with the bat. Taylor also struck Mr. Pogue on his side, which caused Mr. Pogue's lung to partially collapse. Mr. Pogue was taken to UCD Medical Center, where he died.

Taylor originally told the Sacramento Police Department he thought Mr. Pogue was a burglar and did not know it was Mr. Pogue when he hit him with the bat. Later, Taylor acknowledged knowing it was Mr. Pogue before going outside to confront him and that he was upset about Mr. Pogue breaking the house windows.

Taylor faces a maximum potential sentence of 16 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for November 18, 2106, at 11:00 a.m. in Department 19 before the Honorable Patrick Marlette.

Steven Ramos was convicted by a jury of

22 counts of child molestation charges, forcible rape, and attempted forcible rape.

In the mid-90s, Ramos began molesting two girls when they were 5 and 6 years old. In 1997, the victims disclosed the sexual abuse to El Dorado County law enforcement and charges were filed against Ramos. Due to outside pressure, both victims recanted their disclosures to law enforcement nearly a year after initially disclosing. Charges were then dropped against Ramos.

Ramos began abusing both victims again and continued to do so until the victims were 16 years old. In 2012, when the victims were then in their early 20s, they reported to law enforcement the years of continued sexual abuse at the hands of Ramos. Their motivation to report was to prevent Ramos from sexually assaulting other potential victims.

Ramos faces a maximum potential sentence of 55 years, 4 months in prison. Sentencing is set for November 18, 2016, at 10:30 a.m. in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Sweet.

The Honorable Robert Twiss sentenced Khot Panyanouvong to 55 years to life in prison. On September 20, 2016, a jury convicted Panyanouvong of the first-degree murder of Choi Ian Saeteurn.

On January 15, 2015, Panyanouvong was arrested for a parole violation and resisting arrest. Panyanouvong was in custody at the Sacramento County Main Jail and shared a cell with 68-year-old Choi Ian Saeteurn. On January 16, 2015, Panyanouvong beat his cellmate, Saeteurn, to death while the two were in their cell.

Panyanouvong has a prior 2005 strike conviction for first-degree burglary. ★

## “Non-Violent Second-Striker” Early Release Update

**District Attorney’s Office Special Release**

In January 2015, the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) began a new parole determination process, evaluating “non-violent second-strikers” for early parole. If early release is granted, they are released after serving only 50% of their sentences. Under existing law, they would otherwise have to serve 80% of their sentences before being eligible for parole.

Upon receipt of inmate names from CDCR with a recommendation for release, the Board of Parole Hearings [BPH] conducts an administrative review to determine if the inmate should be released early from prison as a ‘non-violent second-striker.’ BPH forwards the names of these eligible inmates to District Attorneys’ offices and invites input in making their determination about the inmate’s potential early release.

Unlike parole hearings, where the prosecution, defense attorney and victim may appear, there is no public hearing for these administrative reviews. Rather, the decision is made purely by CDCR administrative staff. Additionally, prior to consideration for early release, no evidence-based “risk assessment” is conducted to determine if the inmate poses a danger to the public.

The Sacramento County District Attorney’s Office takes an active role in evaluating these cases and writes letters to the Board with an overview of the inmate’s criminal history and current commitment offense, an opinion regarding the public safety risk posed by the inmate, and the appropriateness of an offender’s early release. The Board determines whether an offender would pose an unreasonable risk to public safety based on their prior criminal history, facts behind their current commitment offense, behavior in prison,

rehabilitation efforts, whether the inmate has any medical condition which might affect his ability to re-offend, and written statements.

In November 2015, the Sacramento County District Attorney’s Office began posting on its website information about “non-violent second-strike” offenders who have been granted early release from prison.

As of October 31, 2016, 179 inmates sentenced from Sacramento County have been granted early prison releases. Given the number of violent offenders who continue to be granted early release, DA Anne Marie Schubert began monthly updates to provide the public with a sampling of the noteworthy criminals who appear to pose a risk to public safety, but are being granted early release into our community as ‘non-violent second-strikers.’

## Heritage or Way of Life?

*Native Americans Condemn the Dakota Pipeline, the Law Doesn’t*

According to environmental activists, the Dakota Access Pipeline Project crushed Native American rights, heritage -- and objections. But the federal judge presiding over the case says the pipeline company and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers have been diligent and respectful in their efforts to address Native American concerns.

I’m with the judge on this one. The pipeline will transport 470,000 barrels of domestically-produced crude oil daily 1,200 miles from the Bakken shale formation in northwest North Dakota through South Dakota and Iowa, to Illinois refineries.

The majority of the almost-complete pipeline is on private land and needs no federal permits. But it needs Corps permits where it crosses a number of waterways and sits near culturally sensitive areas.

Enter the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe -- trying to scuttle the pipeline -- aided and abetted by outside activists, including Green Party presidential candidate Jill Stein, who defaced private property for a photo-op and subsequently earned an arrest warrant.

The tribe claims the Corps didn’t consult it, but U.S. District Judge James Boasberg wrote in his September opinion that the Corps reached out to the tribe

multiple times with little to no response. “The Tribe largely refused to engage in consultations,” the judge said. Eventually, the tribe responded, but at the last-minute effort to stop all progress.

The tribe also claims the pipeline ignores Indian heritage lands. The judge disagreed, noting the company used “past cultural surveys” to avoid historic sites, and it “mostly chose to reroute” where “unidentified cultural resources... might be affected.”

The judge concluded, “the pipeline route had been modified 140 times in North Dakota alone to avoid potential cultural resources.”

That’s accommodation, not exploitation.

The Dakota Access Pipeline also intentionally parallels a natural gas pipeline that’s been around for years.

According to Judge Boasberg, “Dakota Access chose this route because it had ‘been disturbed in the past -- both above and below ground level’” making it less likely that “new ground disturbances would harm intact cultural or tribal features.”

In short, the judge rejected the tribe’s claims with well-documented reasons.

If the tribe really wanted safety, it’d embrace pipelines. Scientific American points out that 2.5 million miles of U.S. “pipelines are roughly 70 times safer than trucks when it comes to transporting fuel.”

The article notes that many of those pipelines are aging. That’s exactly why you want companies building new pipelines with the latest technology and environmental protections.

But the issue was never about safety of the protesters. Raising concerns about endangered Indian historic sites is a tactic the left is using to achieve its larger goal: ending fossil fuels.

President Obama asked the pipeline company, Energy Transfer Partners, to delay construction, but an appeals court cleared the way for continuation in limited areas -- and the company decided it would.

Regardless of who wins in the Dakota Access pipeline battle, this won’t be the last of the anti-pipeline demonstrations. The media have widely and favorably covered the protests, so protesters are targeting other pipelines. Celebrities are flying in on their private jets so they can get involved -- and photographed.

Those who believe we need fossil fuels -- at least for the foreseeable future -- to power our economy and protect us from foreign threats need to resist these radical efforts.

We’re already protecting our cultural heritage. This fight is about protecting our way of life.

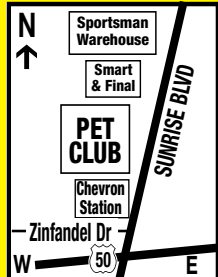

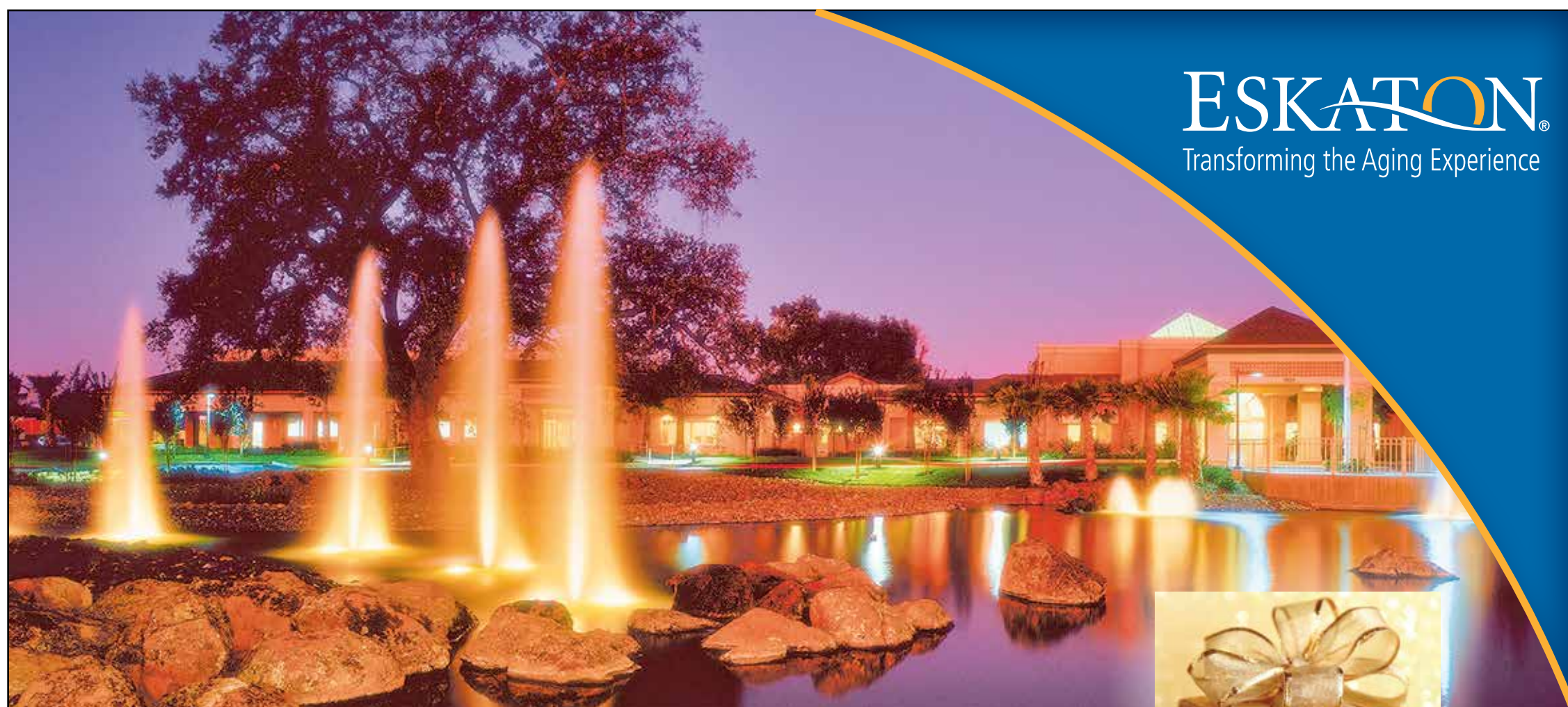
