Neighbors Throw Party for Treasured Park

Barrett Hills residents recently celebrated a park whose establishment was likened to a Mid-West barn-raising. Five years ago, neighbors teamed with the Carmichael Park District to save a 13-acre reserve -- part of an old Carmichael farm -- from subdivision. More than 700 mixed-income families now enjoy Jan Park.

Anniversary celebrations included free hot dogs for 200 residents. The event also recognized volunteers. "We're as involved as we were five years ago," confirmed Barrett Hills Neighborhood Association president Robyn Yankie. "Volunteers walk the park every morning, picking up trash. We've had several fires; we've dealt with the homeless problem; we've painted over graffiti. Our park remains the treasure of our neighborhood."

Jan's 2011 opening crowned a tradition of co-operation between Carmichael Park District and the community it serves. Because the district lacked funds to develop Jan Park without selling part of it, district and neighbors struck a cost-sharing deal. In labor and funds, each would pay half of more than \$400,000 needed for paths, a bridge and a playground. Most of Jan's acreage remained a nature, with large woodland spaces supporting native trees and critter inhabitants. No land was sold.

Barrett Hills Association founder Joyce Carroll spearheaded a drive to raise the residents' share. Brick sales, a rummage meet, donations and thousands of volunteer hours met this goal in little more than two years. At the ribbon-cutting, Supervisor Susan Peters praised the process.

"Neighbors did everything imaginable to build this park from the ground up," she said. "Their effort illustrates the spirit of Americana that makes Carmichael such a special place to live."

With more than a mile of winding paths, Jan Park is popular for dog-walkers, joggers and nature watchers. Playground areas allow family recreation. The park is located between Jan Drive and Salmaan Avenue. It is open from dawn till dusk. For more information, call (916) 485-5322. ★



Cooley Bill to Protect Historic State Park Names Signed into Law by Governor Brown

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

The California Heritage Protection Act (AB 2249) was signed into law on September 21st by Governor Brown, Assemblyman Ken Cooley (D-Rancho Cordova) has announced. AB 2249 ensures park concessionaires in California's state parks cannot trademark historic place names simply due to their status as a concessionaire. The bill was introduced by Assemblyman Cooley and Assemblymen Frank Bigelow (R-O'Neals) and Adam Gray (D-Merced) in response to the U.S. National Park Service's controversial renaming of several landmarks at Yosemite National Park due to a dispute with their ex-concessionaire.

"This bill makes clear that trademarking of historic names in state parks by concessionaires without any independent basis for a claim is unacceptable and our state

Department of Parks and Recreation cannot sign off on the type of trademarking conduct that produced the Yosemite dispute," said Assemblyman Cooley. "With AB 2249's signature, that kind of behavior will disqualify a concessionaire from receiving a concessions contract in California, which makes the bipartisan unanimity of the Legislature especially impressive."

The Ahwahnee Hotel has been re-named the "Majestic Yosemite Hotel," Curry Village is now "Half Dome Village," the Wawona Hotel is "Big Trees Lodge" and Badger Pass Ski Area is now called "Yosemite Ski and Snowboard Area."

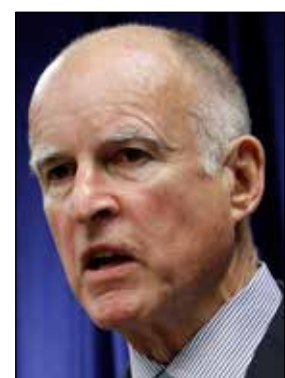
AB 2249 ensures nothing of the same kind occurs in a California state park. To keep concessionaires from co-opting state landmarks, this bill adds to state law a prohibition on concessionaires claiming

ownership of a name associated with a California state park and disqualifies a bidder from future contracts if they attempt such trademark claims.

"Our state parks are not like football or baseball stadiums, trading sponsorship deals to the highest bidder," said Assemblyman Gray. "The people of California protect and preserve these landmarks as a part of our history, and it is the people of California who own their storied names."

"I have the privilege of representing Yosemite National Park and know first-hand how treasured these landmarks are by the people of our state," said Assemblyman Bigelow. "I'm proud to co-author AB 2249 to protect historic sites up and down California."

California's Yosemite National Park is on the short list of America's most

magnificent parks and is filled with historic landmarks built decades ago—some date back to the 19th century. The Ahwahnee Hotel was built in the 1920s in a valley meadow with the sheer granite of Half Dome as its backdrop; its filing for the National Register of Historic Places explains its name comes from a local Native American word meaning "deep, grassy meadow." Nearby Curry Village is named after the couple who established a summer camp there in 1899. The Wawona Hotel, in the southwest corner of Yosemite National Park, was originally constructed 140 years ago, in 1876. All three were placed on the National Register of Historic Places in the 1970s.

Assembly Bill 2249 will take effect January 1, 2017.

Carmichael Champion Cathy Snow Passes

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Succumbing to an illness, community leader and real estate professional Cathryn (Cathy) Snow died on September 22. She was 74.

The activist was widely respected through membership of Carmichael Chamber of Commerce, Carmichael Kiwanis and the Carmichael Presbyterian Church. Her professional career included 20-plus years as a realtor for Coldwell Banker and Lyons Real Estate companies.

Born Cathryn Follis in Modesto, she attended Modesto High before gaining an arts degree at Modesto Junior College. During her marriage to police training planner Hal Snow, she nurtured volunteerism in their offspring. "She had me cleaning up Modesto streets when I was five," attests her son Jeff Snow. "I didn't enjoy it but mom always wanted things looking good, wherever we lived." After the family moved to Carmichael, mom became second-mom to dozens of teenagers through work as a continuation school secretary.

Snow came to the real estate profession in her 50s. Her quick success is explained by mentor/partner Clay Sigg: "Cathy was a quality realtor," he attests. "She easily won and kept people's trust. She really cared about promoting the success of realtors under her." Giving back was part of her professional ethic. A 25-year member of Carmichael Kiwanis, Snow led the group as president during 2011/2012. Among many projects, her vision caused a service club sign to be raised in Carmichael Park. "Cathy was detail-oriented; she knew what went on in all our committees," says club secretary Jan Lovejoy. "Her energy was tremendous; she actively looked for ways for Kiwanis to get out there and help others."

Carmichael Chamber of Commerce CEO Linda Melody describes Snow as a hands-on

2015 leader for the organization. "Cathy was sitting on the office carpet wrapping raffle prizes," says Melody. "A resident arrived and I made introductions. He was surprised to find our president on the floor. She never considered herself above the smallest chore."

More chores continued her life-long campaign against trash. In 2013, Snow conceived the chamber's annual Beautiful Carmichael program. "Cleaner neighborhoods enhance property values and keep businesses profitable," she reasoned. For the first years of the cleanup, the figurehead joined volunteers who pulled weeds and scooped trash from street frontages. "It really is a matter of pride," she summarized. Days before her death,

the Beautify Carmichael project mustered Chamber supporters to continue Snow's mission.

The businesswoman worshipped regularly at the Carmichael Presbyterian Church. Here members saw Snow a shining light in their ranks. "She had gracious ways," confirmed Pastor Keith DeVries. "Cathy Snow made everyone feel they were welcome; that they had a friend."

Cathryn Snow is survived by former husband Hal and children Jeff and Teri Snow. Her memorial service is Saturday, October 1; 11 am, at Carmichael Presbyterian Church. In lieu of flowers, the family requests donations to Kiwanis Family House or to the Carmichael Presbyterian Church. ★

Head-on Collision Kills Motorcyclist and Passenger on Madison

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On September 26, 2016, at 2:54 a.m., Brandon Ray Fernandez, a 28 year old male from Orangevale, was driving a 2015 silver Hyundai Elantra, eastbound on Madison Ave east of Lincoln Oaks Drive going the wrong way in the westbound #1 lane at an unknown speed. Mr. Fernandez was driving under the influence of alcohol. An unknown male was driving a

Yamaha motorcycle westbound on Madison Ave east of Lincoln Oaks Drive in the #1 lane, at an unknown speed, approaching Fernandez's location. The motorcyclist was carrying an unknown female passenger. The driver and passenger of the Yamaha were wearing motorcycle helmets. Both vehicles struck head-on causing both the driver and the passenger of the Yamaha to be ejected from the motorcycle. Both the driver and passenger of the Yamaha died at the scene.

After the collision the CHP responded to the scene and conducted an investigation. During the course of the investigation it was determined that Fernandez had been drinking alcohol. After a brief DUI investigation Fernandez was determined to be under the influence of alcohol and was arrested for 2 counts of felony DUI and 1 count of felony manslaughter. He was transported and booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail where he also submitted to a chemical test. ★

DOJ Should Block Bayer-Monsanto Merger

The proposed merger between German pharmaceutical and chemical giant Bayer and U.S. biotechnology giant Monsanto would create the world's largest supplier of seeds and agricultural chemicals. A merged company would control a quarter of the world's seed and agricultural market. This proposed merger follows two other mega-mergers in the agricultural input market. The Dow-DuPont merger and ChemChina-Syngenta deal both announced in the last year are reshaping an already highly consolidated market.

As giant transnational corporations increase their power over the market, independent farmers

are left with fewer options and suffer from less competition between input providers. Farmers have lost access to seed varieties and genetic traits while seeing the prices they pay for biotechnology traits skyrocket.

The Center believes in the power of a competitive marketplace and the role of government in guarding against unfair and anticompetitive market practices. Therefore, we're calling on the Department of Justice to block further mergers between any of the big six (quickly becoming the big four) agrichemical-seed companies. We encourage concerned citizens to stand with us and reach out to the Justice Department and your members of Congress to voice support for action to block further mergers.

Congress should also work to reverse the decades-long decline in investment in plant breeding as they take up a new farm bill in 2017.

The recent merger activity is a clarion call for the Department of Justice and Congress to act to protect a competitive market environment for independent farmers and ranchers.

- With fire season upon us and winter months approaching, there is no better time to prepare for a disaster - events that often occur with little to no warning - by registering with the mass notification system at any one of the following three URL's: Sacramento-Alert.org, Yolo-Alert.org or Placer-Alert.org.

Register now before a disaster hits, so public safety officials can call, text or email you in the event of a disaster.

Consider the state's historic drought causing elevated wild-fire danger, or winter storms and the many levees surrounding

our urban core. Both events can occur rapidly, sometimes forcing evacuations, shelter in place orders and road closures. The regional mass notification system is a critical link for you to immediately learn of required actions.

Sign up for alerts at either Sacramento-Alert.org, Yolo-Alert.org or Placer-Alert.org - it's easy and your information is protected. Officials will only text during an emergency or public safety event, or if public help is needed to find a missing child or adult.

The unique feature of the system is the ability to handle more

than one contact method for residents including cell phones, alternate numbers, text, email and even landlines. You choose the best notification method or chose them all. You can also register multiple locations, such as your work address, your parent's address or your children's school, in order to get alerts about the places that mean the most to you.

- Have transportation to and from the training class and to the polling place on Election Day.

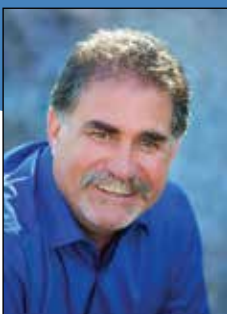

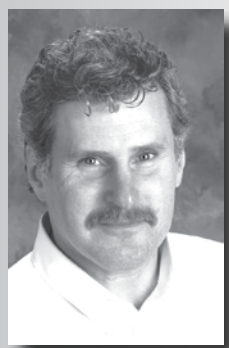

New Standards Set to Improve Quality and Safety for Child Care in California

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG) - The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Administration for Children and Families (ACF) announced new quality and safety standards aimed at providing for higher quality care and safer environments for millions of children, including our youngest learners.

The rule, which implements bipartisan legislation signed by President Obama in 2014, sets higher standards for states, territories and tribes receiving federal funds through the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) program in important areas such as health and safety requirements; training and professional development for child care providers; and eligibility rules that better support working families.

In 2016, California received \$601,597,737 in federal funding through the CCDF program, which each month serves 111,400 children (78,100 families).

Last year, the Federal government provided over \$5 billion to states, territories and tribes to help 850,000 working families pay for child care and to support quality improvements for providers that serve our neediest children. CCDF serves approximately 1.4 million children each month, a majority of whom are children under the age of five. The new rule protects the health and safety of children, helps parents make more informed consumer choices, supports early child development for our youngest learners, and enhances the quality of child care for all children.

All children in one of the

370,000 child care settings across the country that participate in the federal child care program – not just those receiving direct child care assistance from CCDBG – will benefit from new health and safety requirements, staff training requirements, and criminal background checks for staff. In addition, CCDF quality investments can benefit all children in child care regardless of whether or not they receive federal funding.

We know from U.S. Census data that nearly 12.5 million children under the age of five are in some form of child care arrangement each week. They spend an average of 36 hours per week in care. Research, particularly in neuroscience, has shown how much this time matters to our youngest children. Providing safe, high-quality environments that nurture our youngest children's healthy growth and development will help them grow, thrive, be successful in school, and even find better jobs and earn more as adults.

"Many parents rely on child care programs, and it is important that their children are cared for in safe learning environments with qualified providers," said HHS Secretary Sylvia M. Burwell. "These new standards, which are the result of bipartisan legislation, include robust safety, screening, and training procedures to boost quality, empower parents, and ensure that child care programs promote healthy and positive early childhood development."

The rule strengthens a number of new provisions in the law

and provides needed guidance to states, territories and tribes in a number of areas, including:

- requiring all staff in child care facilities have mandatory criminal background checks;
- enhancing the health and safety of children through more robust standards for CCDF providers, including requiring initial and ongoing training and professional development on 10 key topics (e.g. First Aid/CPR, medication administration, SIDS prevention) for the early childhood workforce;
- disseminating information to help parents choose child care, including through an accessible website;
- devoting more funding to improve quality across all child care settings; and
- ensuring CCDF programs are monitored at least annually so children are healthy and safe in child care programs.

"This rule continues the historic re-envisioning of the Child Care and Development Fund program and raises the bar so that low-income parents will know their children are safe, learning, and on the path to future success in school and life," said Linda Smith, deputy assistant secretary for early learning at ACF. "Child care is both an economic support for working parents and an early learning program for millions of children. It's critical to our nation's future that we get this right."

Defendants Sentenced for Charges Stemming from Massage Parlor Robbery Gang Member Sentenced for Shooting in Arden Fair Mall Parking Lot Defendant Convicted of Attempted Murder, Domestic Violence

DATE: September 16, 2016
CASE: Devonte Graham, Ira Swanson & Daquan Cooper (Case #14F08243)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Aaron Miller, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Sharon Lueras sentenced Devonte Graham to 90 years and 4 months to life in prison. Ira Swanson was sentenced to 30 years, 4 months in prison and Daquan Cooper was sentenced to 20 years in prison. On August 11, 2016, a jury convicted Graham of second-degree murder, along with an allegation that he intentionally discharged a firearm causing the victim's death. Graham and co-defendants Swanson and Cooper were also convicted of two counts of second-degree robbery, personal use of a firearm during the robbery, and being felons in possession of firearms.

On December 15, 2014, Graham, Swanson and Cooper entered a massage parlor on El Camino Avenue. All three defendants produced handguns and pointed them at two women who were working at the business. Swanson repeatedly struck one of the victims in the head with his handgun while demanding property from her. Graham struck the second victim in the head with his handgun. The defendants fled with stolen cash and property to a waiting SUV outside. When Graham didn't want to give any of the stolen money to Jemahl Loharsingh, who was in the SUV during the robbery, the two got into an argument. Graham then shot Loharsingh five times, killing him.

Graham has a prior 2011 strike conviction for residential burglary. Swanson has a prior 2012 strike conviction for robbery. Cooper was on probation for felony gun possession at the time of this offense.

CASE: John Montanez (Case #13F04910)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Timothy Carr, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

The Honorable Russell Hom sentenced John Montanez to 39 years in prison. On June 10, 2016, a jury convicted Montanez of two counts of attempted murder. The jury also found true allegations that he personally discharged a firearm and acted in furtherance of a criminal street gang.

On July 31, 2013, Montanez and an associate gang member got into an argument with three other young men inside Arden Fair mall and agreed to fight outside in the parking lot. Once outside, Montanez pulled a handgun and fired a semiautomatic handgun at the two victims. The victims fled and were not struck, but bullets struck several parked cars.

CASE: Khot Panyanouvong (Case #15F00271)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Caroline Park, Homicide Unit

Khot Panyanouvong was convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of Choi Ian Saeteurn.

On January 15, 2015, Panyanouvong was arrested for a parole violation and resisting arrest. Panyanouvong was in custody at the Sacramento County Main Jail and shared a cell with 68-year-old Choi Ian Saeteurn, who was arrested for a probation violation. On January 16, 2015, Panyanouvong beat Saeteurn to death while the two were in their cell.

Panyanouvong has a prior 2005 strike conviction for first-degree burglary and faces a maximum potential sentence of 55 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for October 21, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 25 before the Honorable Robert Twiss.

CASE: Bobby Hogue (Case #15F07761)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Allison Dunham, Domestic Violence Unit

Bobby Hogue was convicted by a jury of attempted murder and corporal injury on a spouse or cohabitant. The jury found true the allegation that Hogue caused great bodily injury under circumstances involving domestic violence on both charges. Hogue was also convicted of mayhem.

On September 25, 2015, an anonymous caller reported that a woman at a homeless camp was badly injured. Responding firefighters found a woman on the floor of a tent with obvious head and facial trauma. She was bleeding, barely breathing, hypothermic, and close to death. The victim was taken to a hospital and underwent immediate surgery on a life-threatening head injury. The victim also suffered bruising all over her body, bite marks, a fractured nose, and broken teeth. Officers found items belonging to Hogue at the crime scene. It was discovered that Hogue had a criminal history of domestic violence beginning in 1993 until his last conviction in 2014. The 2014 case involved the same victim at the homeless camp.

The victim was hospitalized for one month before being released to an acute care facility, where she remains today. The victim can only speak in a whisper and can only say two words at a time. In addition, she can no longer walk and requires a feeding tube to eat.

Hogue faces a maximum potential sentence of 14 years in state prison. Sentencing is set for October 28, 2016, at 2:00 p.m. in Department 29 before the Honorable Timothy Frawley.

This case was prosecuted as a High Risk Domestic Violence case due to the defendant's long history of domestic violence and the serious nature of the crime. ★

State Water Board Bans 100 Tank Sites from Cleanup Fund \$20 Million to be Paid in Largest Settlement of its Kind

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As part of a settlement agreement, the State Water Resources Control Board has permanently banned 100 of Shell Oil Company's underground storage tank (UST) claims, held by a subsidiary Equilon Enterprises LLC, from the UST Cleanup Fund for allegedly claiming reimbursement through false or misleading statements on claim forms.

Disqualifying these 100 claims could save the UST Cleanup Fund up to \$150 million, significantly reducing Shell's future reimbursements from the UST Cleanup Fund. In addition, the settlement agreement required Shell to pay \$20 million to the parties to the settlement agreement. Specifically, Shell has paid the State Water Board more than \$11 million to settle the State Water Board's administrative claims and alleged False Claims Act violations.

Shell has paid an additional \$8 million in settlement moneys to the state's Office of the Attorney General and a whistleblower related to the alleged violations of the False Claims Act. The State Water Board's portion of the settlement moneys will go to the UST Cleanup Fund and be used to reimburse other UST Cleanup Fund claims.

"The UST Cleanup Fund is a critical tool the State Water Board uses to protect public health and safety and the environment," said Cris Carrigan, director of the State Water Board's Office of Enforcement. "It is imperative that claimants not engage in bad faith or fraud when accessing these vitally important public-benefit funds by submitting false or misleading statements. If they do, the State Water Board has powerful administrative authority to disqualify and take deductions against claims."

"The UST Cleanup Fund relies on accurate and truthful claimant self-reporting when issuing reimbursements," said UST Cleanup Fund Manager Lisa Babcock. "We are pleased that Shell has now complied with the requirement and recognizes the critical need for full disclosure to the UST Cleanup Fund."

State Water Board staff had

challenged Shell's UST Cleanup Fund claims since 2007, and developed an administrative case to disqualify certain claims from seeking reimbursement. The State Water Board and the Office of the Attorney General uncovered evidence that Shell failed to disclose reimbursements it received from insurance companies for the same sites where Shell was seeking UST Cleanup Fund reimbursement. Claimants are prohibited from receiving UST Cleanup Fund reimbursement for cleanup costs that have been, or will be, reimbursed from another source. Shell UST Cleanup Fund claims were placed on hold during the dispute between Shell and government agencies. As part of the settlement, the State Water Board will process reimbursement of up to \$20 million in eligible claims subject to certain conditions set forth in the settlement.

Allegations and Settlement Agreement

On April 6, 2010, a whistleblower filed a complaint in Sacramento Superior Court against Shell alleging fraud under the California False Claims Act. The complaint alleged that when Shell submitted applications to the UST Cleanup Fund seeking reimbursement of costs at UST sites, it failed to disclose it previously had received reimbursement from a series of insurance claims, litigation, and settlements for the same sites on its Non-Recovery Certifications. This action resulted in a misrepresentation to the State Water Board as all types of moneys received from other sources must be disclosed on its Non-Recovery Certifications. Double payments are not allowed under the UST Cleanup Fund.

The whistleblower complaint stated Shell's failure to accurately report to the State Water Board the sources of other payments constituted a violation under the False Claims Act. The judicial action sought triple damages, penalties and attorney fees and costs against Shell. After the complaint was filed, the Office of the Attorney General coordinated its investigation with the State Water Board to determine

how to best pursue and potentially resolve the claims asserted in the false claims lawsuit, as well as the State Water Board's administrative claims.

Although the State Water Board was not a party to the False Claims Act litigation, it joined in the settlement negotiations arguing that it had independent administrative and litigation claims it could pursue. Shell cooperated with the State Water Board and the Office of the Attorney General in the investigation. The State Water Board's resolution of the matter was contingent upon the settlement containing both a disqualification of certain claims and a reimbursement of funds previously paid to Shell from the UST Cleanup Fund. The disqualification of certain claims sends a strong message to all UST Cleanup Fund claimants of the importance of fully disclosing all monies that have been, or will be, reimbursed from another source.

Under the terms of the False Claims Act component of the settlement agreement, Shell will pay more than \$11.3 million to the State Water Board and almost \$5 million to the Office of the Attorney General in damages. In addition, Shell will pay more than \$3.4 million to the whistleblower, in addition to reimbursing the third-party plaintiff for attorney fees and costs.

Under the terms of the Barry Keene Act component of the settlement agreement, 100 UST Cleanup Fund claims where Shell was previously qualified to receive reimbursements will now be permanently barred from the UST Cleanup Fund. These claims are no longer eligible to receive any reimbursement for cleanup costs. The UST Cleanup Fund's average reimbursement is about \$500,000 per eligible claim, but many claims use the entire \$1.5 million allotment, so the savings for the UST Cleanup Fund is between \$50 million and \$150 million.

Are You a Happiness Hoarder?

If you are a caregiver, do you find it hard asking for help when it comes to your home? If that's a problem for you, this story may help make it easier to ask for help if you need it. Incidentally, we all need help in areas we aren't competent in. We get accountants to help with our bookkeeping, and lawyers to help with legal issues and we're willing to get help with electricity and plumbing problems, but for some reason when it comes to our homes, we caregivers have

a crazy notion we should be able to take care of everything ourselves.

The whole self-help movement implies you can do everything yourself. Lord knows you've tried, but how's that working for you?

Female caregivers are usually in service-rendering businesses; teachers, doctors, nurses, and mothers (even though being a mom isn't considered a business, it really is). As a life coach, today, I worked with a lovely woman from PA who has been an RN

for thirty years. She explained how much she adores her calling because she loves to help people.

When I asked her to explain more about the feeling of helping others, she said, "When I help a patient, I feel happy knowing, because of me, that person is happier. I don't feel arrogant, just important in being part of another's well-being and happiness." Because her home was in critical condition she asked a doctor friend if he thought she had Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD). The doctor asked her these questions: "Do you get to work on time?" (Yes.) "Have you ever missed going to work?" (No.) "Do you pay your bills on time?" (Yes.) With these answers, her friend said, "No you don't have ADD. This woman was relieved (as if having Attention Deficit Disorder was some fatal disease).

After reading a lot of the material I've written about ADD, she decided to get another professional opinion. This next doctor gave her a test. She passed having ADD with flying colors, but was, at the same time devastated to think something was wrong with her brain. It was important for me to talk her into the

joy of having ADD, because it's a wonderful thing to have as long as you understand how to live with it!

When I suggested she get help with getting her home organization, she said, "Oh I'd be too embarrassed to let someone in to do that." When I explained I wasn't going to leave her alone until she agreed to bring someone in, she realized I was serious and she came up with a person's name who was actually her best friend and had been in her home and already knew of her dirty little secret.

Once she'd agreed to get help from this person, I said something to her she'd never thought about before and maybe you haven't either. "Do you realize you'll be giving your friend an opportunity to feel happy knowing because of her, you are happier? She won't feel arrogant,

just important for being part of your well-being and happiness. And just think, if you don't ask for help, you'll

be a happiness hoarder!" We don't think that we're happiness hoarders when we don't ask others for help, but really we are. By reflecting her words about how she feels helping others to apply to someone's feelings for helping her, she got excited to call her friend.

Don't be a happiness hoarder. Ask for help.

The right man to put it together is Washington's Sam Chisholm, dressed in all-black and riding a dark horse, who announces himself as the duly sworn warrant officer from Wichita, Kansas and a licensed peace officer in Arkansas, the Indian Territory and a bunch of other states.

His right-hand sidekick is Chris Pratt's Josh Faraday, a card-shark gambler with a quick draw. He loves magic tricks involving cards, whiskey and women, and not necessarily in that order. He's also got a good sense of humor (something that comes easy to Pratt).

All seven members recruited to save the town are distinct characters and personalities. This includes Ethan Hawke's Confederate sharpshooter Goodnight Robicheaux, a tortured soul wandering the West ever since the end of the Civil War.

Byung-hun Lee's expert knife thrower Billy Rocks is not only Goodnight's right-hand associate but an invaluable fighter. Vincent D'Onofrio is even more interesting as the resourceful mountain man Jack Horne, who apparently hasn't spent much time with the civilized world.

An outlaw on the run from bounty hunters, Mexican gunman Vasquez (Manuel Garcia-Rulfo) is given a second chance by Washington if he'll do right by the town.

The last one recruited is the Native American warrior Red Harvest (Martin Sensmeier), a fierce one-man army who gives the rest of the crew a second chance only after Chisholm wisely shows respect for Comanche customs.

So there you have it. Seven very disparate men with different fighting skills show up in Rose Creek and teach the somewhat reluctant townsfolk how to prepare for an ultimate battle against Bogue's army.

The first part of the battle is easy when the Seven dispatch a couple of dozen of Bogue's local enforcers. But Chisholm knows that reinforcements in ever larger numbers are coming soon from Sacramento.

"The Magnificent Seven" does not disappoint in the action department. It's like the Battle of the Alamo except there's a better result but not without a lot of bloodshed. Fans of Westerns should find this remake a satisfying addition to the canon of the genre.

TV CORNER – "LETHAL WEAPON" ON FOX

Welcome to the "TV Corner," a new feature for this regular column. The idea is to take note primarily of new programming on network and cable television, without supplanting movie reviews.

On occasion a full column may be devoted to television, often because a new film was not readily available for review. Aside from previews, this space will look at new shows that have debuted, since we can't cover the plethora of new shows that all start in the same month.

An intriguing new series of the FOX network is "Lethal Weapon," which should come as no surprise to any fan of popular culture that it is based on the iconic film series starring Mel Gibson and Danny Glover.

The most interesting character would Clayne Crawford in the role of Gibson's unhinged detective Martin Riggs, while Damon Wayans holds up his end as Glover's Roger Murtaugh, the sensible one without a death wish.

The first episode of "Lethal Weapon" establishes the tragic backstory for Riggs ending up in Los Angeles after serving in Texas law enforcement. It's a sad tale that involves a horrific traffic accident, but explains Riggs' melancholy, suicidal nature.

Some may question the need for the series, but the two main characters of Riggs and Murtaugh, truly polar opposites when paired up at LAPD, show great potential for developing an enjoyable wisecracking buddy cop team.

"Lethal Weapon" is definitely worth a look or two because it has some stunning action (a cop chase in the middle of a Grand Prix) and plenty of good humor. ★

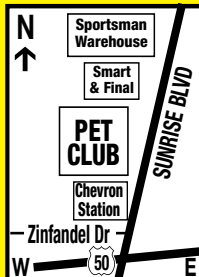

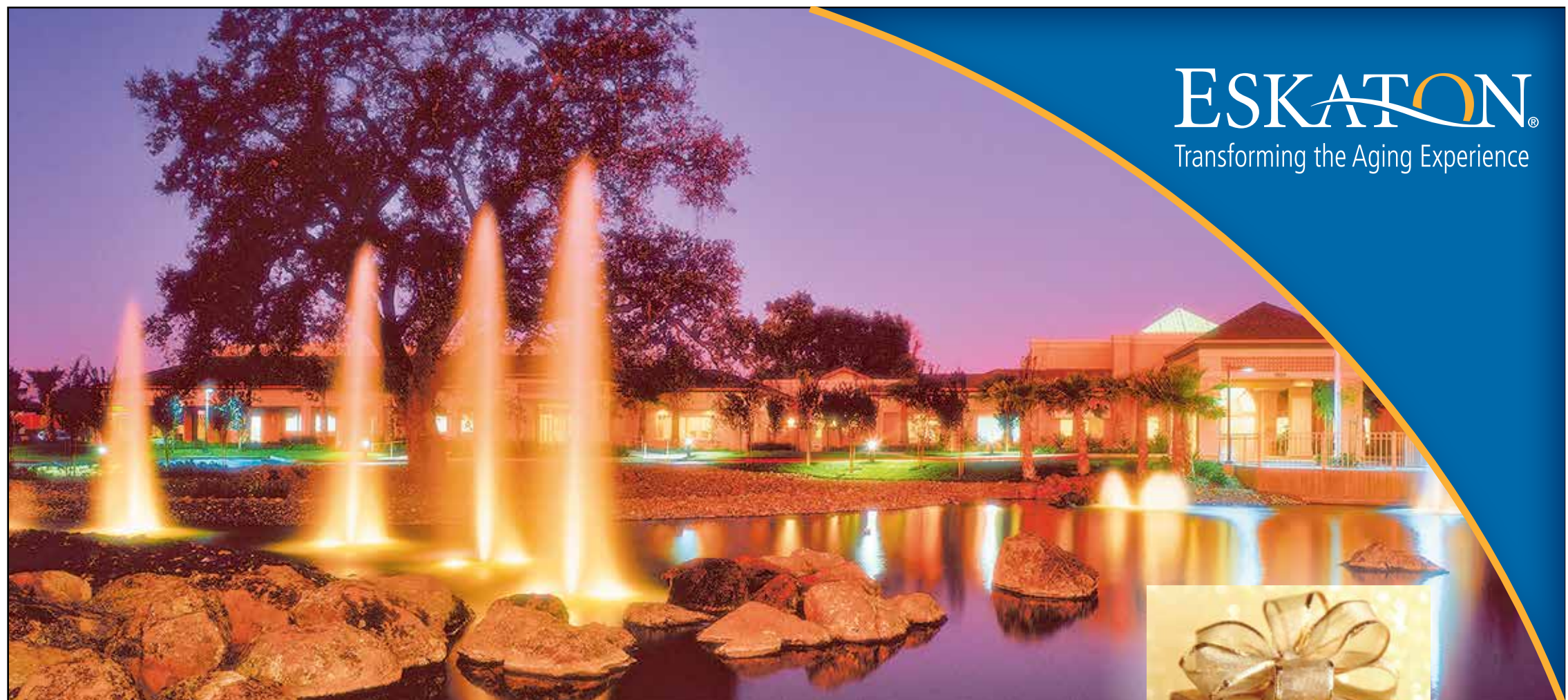
